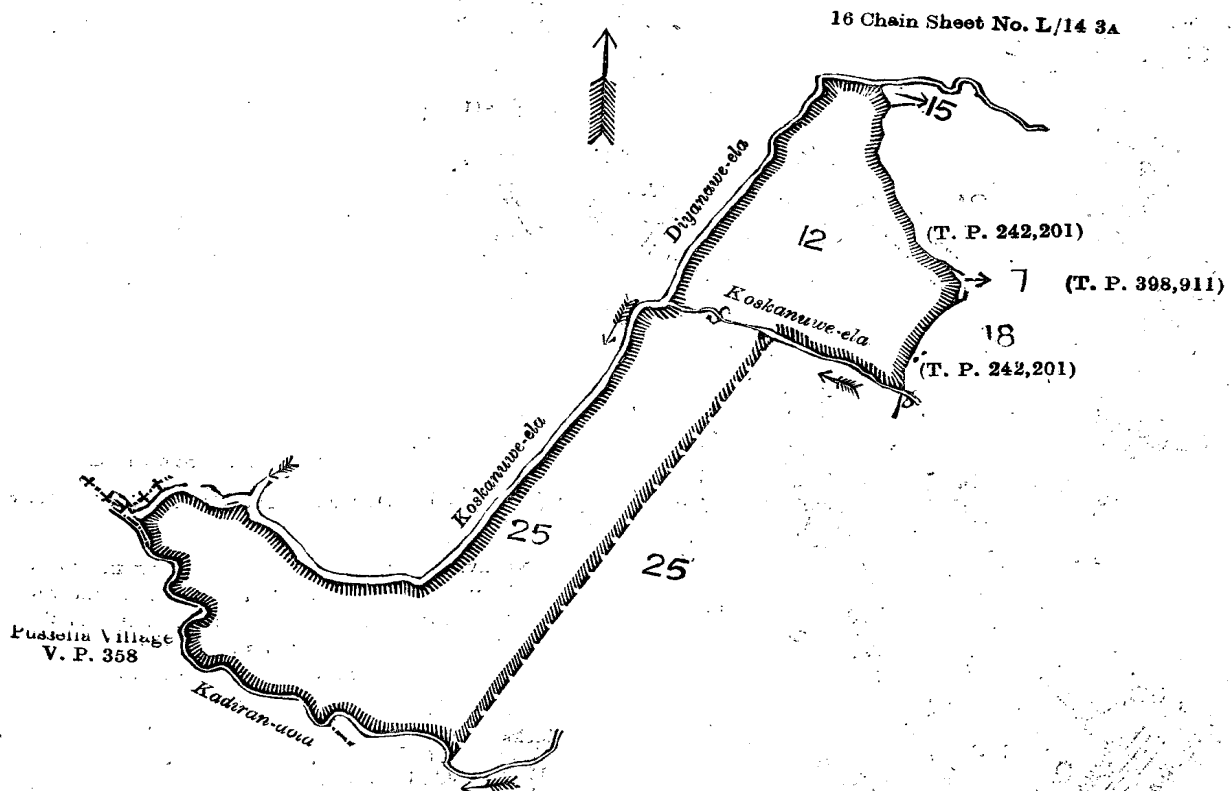

BADAHELGODAKELE (PART OF) VILLAGE IN F. V. P. NO. 365A

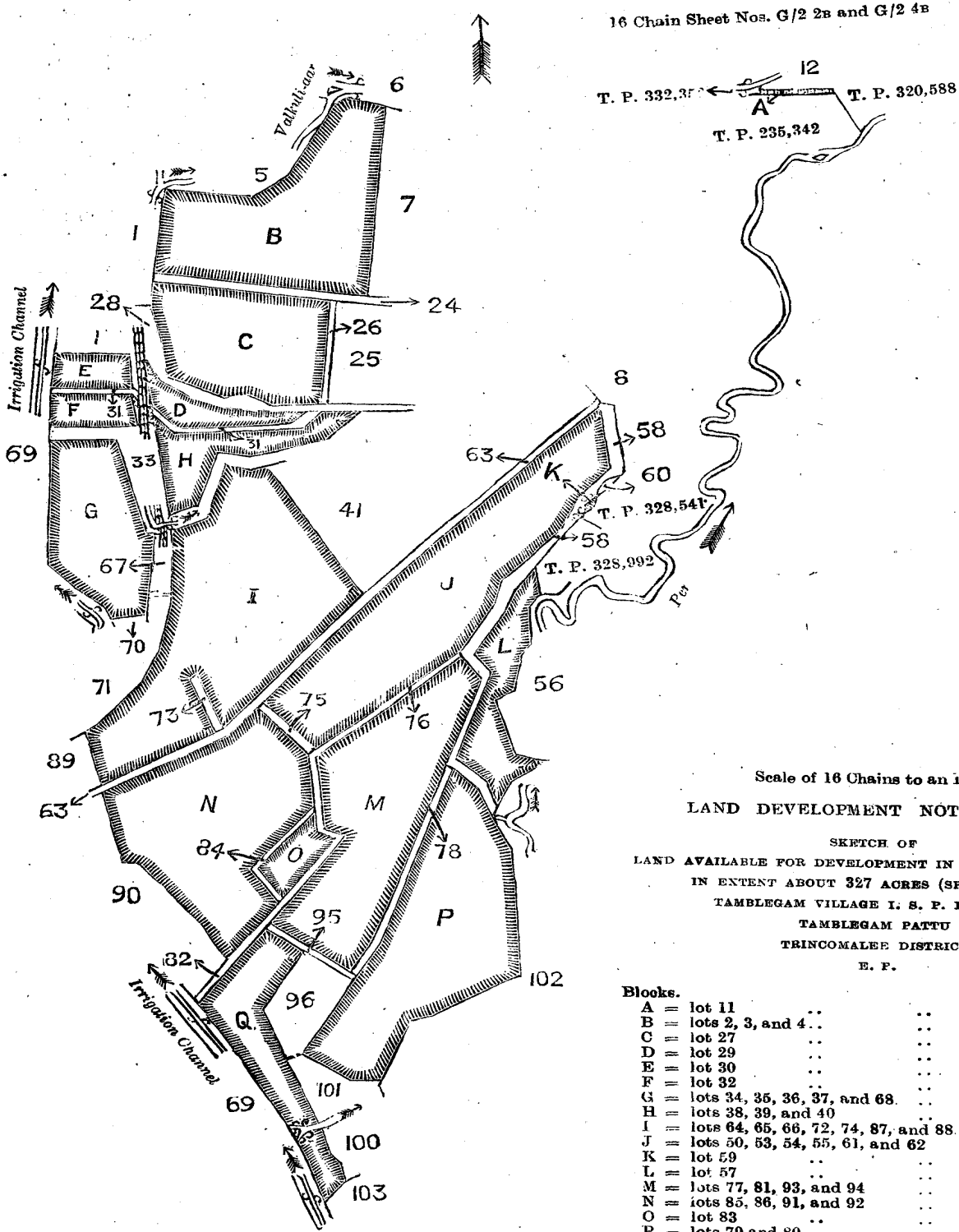
