BY-LAWS.

1. For the purpose of establishing, working, and maintaining the Council's Electrical Distribution System, the Chairman or any contractor or other agent duly authorized in writing by the said Chairman, may enter upon all or any lands and cut down any tree or branch which may in any way injure or which is likely to injure, impede, or interfere with any post, standard, wire, or main of such system.

2. "THE CRIMINAL PROCEDURE CODE, 1898."

REGULATION.

Regulation 4 of the regulations under the said section dated October 17, 1927, published in *Government Gazette* No. 7,611 of October 21, 1927, is hereby revoked and the following substituted therefor:—

4. (1) No travelling allowance other than the fare shall be payable under Schedules A, B, or C for any portion of the journey to the Court-house or place where the trial or inquiry is held, which might reasonably have been performed by the railway or any regular motor, coach, steamer, or boat service.

Provided that witnesses, jurors, and assessors in Classes I. and II. of the schedules may draw mileage allowance, instead of tram or bus fare, if they have actually travelled by private or hired car or carriage.

(2) For any part of the journey which is performed on foot, travelling allowance shall be payable at the rate of 5 cents per mile subject to the limitation to fare by railway or other regular service imposed by the preceding sub-section.

(3) No batta shall be drawn under Schedules A, B, or C by any witness, juror, or assessor going by steamer if travelling in a class in which food is included in the fare payable by a passenger.

(4) Subject to any special direction by the Judge presiding at the trial, the amount payable to a witness shall be paid upon the production of a certificate from the Registrar or Secretary of the Court that there is no reason why the said amount should be disallowed. Payment of the expenses for attendance at the preliminary inquiry in the Police Court may be made on the certificate of the Magistrate after committal.

(5) Where two or more persons entitled to charge car or carriage hire under these rules use the same car or carriage on a journey, mileage shall be payable only to one person in respect of the conveyance used.

TENDERS are hereby invited for the drainage and water supply to the following buildings:—

- (a) Extensions to the Government Technical Schools, Colombo.
- (b) Quarters for 12 Sub-Inspectors and European Police Sergeants-under training, Bambalapitiya.

2. Each of the works to be undertaken on a measured lump sum contract, typed articles of agreement can be inspected with the plans, &c.

3. The specifications, quantities, plans, &c., can be seen, and all other information obtained from the Office of the Construction Engineer, Public Works Department, Torrington square, Colombo, any week day between the hours of 9 A.M. and 4 P.M. (Saturdays, 9 A.M. and 1.30 P.M.).

4. Tenders must be submitted in duplicate, duly signed and dated, and forwarded in securely sealed envelopes, the original addressed to the Construction Engineer, Public Works Department, Torrington square, Colombo, and the duplicate addressed to the Director of Public Works, Colombo, and endorsed on the outside "Drainage to Technical Schools" or "Drainage to Police Inspectors' Quarters, Bambalapitiya," as the case may be, so as to reach the offices of the foregoing officers on or before 12 noon on Wednesday, April 15, 1931.

5. Any alterations made in the quotations and rates should bear the initials of the tenderer.

6. In the event of the contractor failing to provide materials necessary for the execution of the works within the periods named by the Engineer as he may from time to time direct, Government reserves to itself the right to supply such materials at the cost as indicated in the Government Stores Price List, plus 25 per cent., and also Customs duty, transport, &c.

7. The successful tenderer may be called upon to deposit security for the due fulfilment of the contract in the Ceylon Savings Bank in the name of the Colonial Treasurer.

8. No contract shall be entered into with any person whose name is on the list of Crown defaulting contractors, either individually or jointly with any other person, nor shall the contractor employ any person whose name is on the list of Crown defaulting contractors, nor will forms of tender be issued to any person to whom the Construction Engineer, Public Works Department, Colombo, for reasons which appear to him sufficient, objects after giving due notice of his objection in writing.

9. Government does not bind itself to accept the lowest or any of the tenders submitted, nor to give all the work included in the whole scheme or any one item to any one contractor.

TENDERS are invited for the purchase of the palu trees standing enumerated in the demarcated blocks as described in the schedule below.

2. All tenders should be in duplicate and sealed under one cover, and should be addressed to the Conservator of Forests, Office of the Conservator of Forests, Kandy.

3. Tenders should either be deposited in the tender box in the Office of the Conservator of Forests, or be sent under registered cover through the post.

4. Tenders should be marked "Tender for Purchase of Palu Timber in North-Central Division" in the left hand top corner of the envelope, and should reach the Office of the Conservator of Forests, not later than midday on Tuesday, May 5, 1931.

5. Tenders are to be made upon forms which will be supplied upon application at the Divisional Forest Office Anuradhapura. No tender will be considered unless it is on the recognized form. Alterations must be initialled otherwise the tenders may be treated as informal and rejected.

6. A deposit of Rs. 50 will be required to be made either at the Treasury or Kachcheri, and a receipt produced for the same before any form of tender is issued.

7. The Divisional Forest Officer in no way guarantees the accuracy of the yield in the area, and tenderers should satisfy themselves as to the quality and quantity of trees, the distance and conditions of transport, &c. The forest will be pointed out by the Range Forest Officer Kekirawa, and if desired before inspection of the forest tenderers are at liberty to see the list of trees in the Divisional Forest Office, Anuradhapura, on any work day between the hours 9 A.M. and 4 P.M. on week days, 9 A.M. and 1.30 P.M. on Saturdays.

8. Tenderers should make a lump sum offer, written both in words and figures, for all the enumerated palu trees in the five blocks and not for each block or per cubic foot of timber.

9. The estimated *in situ* value of the timber is Rs. 1,880/70, and any bid or offer below this figure is liable to rejection. This will however not prejudice the Conservator of Forests' right to reject any offers even though they may be above *in situ* value.

10. No tender will be considered unless the procedure set forth above has been complied with, and the Government reserves to itself the right, without question, of rejecting all tenders and of accepting any tender.

11. The successful tenderer will be required to execute the purchase of the palu trees wherein the conditions enumerated in the tender will be complied, but before execution of the agreement the purchaser will be required to deposit as cash security Rs. 500 to the Conservator of Forests for the punctual fulfilment of the agreement.

12. The purchaser, after the purchase and executing the necessary agreements, will be entitled, on application, to request the Conservator of Forests and he will be permitted to commence work.

13. Should any tender be accepted and should the successful tenderer, after due notification, decline or fail to pay any sum or sums stipulated in the tender and to enter into the necessary agreement within 15 days of receiving notice in writing from the Divisional Forest Officer, North-Central Division, Anuradhapura, or in reasonable time, the tenderer will be held pecuniarily liable for any resultant loss to Government and his tender form deposit forfeited to the Crown. Tenders are made and received on this distinct understanding. The Conservator of Forests, however, reserves the discretionary power to waive the terms of this clause in any degree as he may consider the circumstances justify.

14. Any further information may be obtained at the Divisional Forest Office, Anuradhapura, or at the Range Forest Office, Kekirawa.

Special Conditions.

Payment of the purchase amount will ordinarily be required to be made in full immediately on acceptance of the tender, and if, however, the successful purchaser is desirous of paying the amount by instalments, he will be allowed to pay in three equal instalments, the first instalment being paid immediately on acceptance of the tender and the other two instalments at the end of one and two months respectively from the date of first payment.

2. If payment is made by instalments, the purchaser will be allowed, on payment of each instalment, to cut and remove $\frac{1}{3}$ of the total number of trees in respect of which the agreement is concluded, provided, however, the quantity to be so cut and removed should represent the value of each instalment paid.

3. The purchaser shall commence work only on issue of a felling permit duly signed by the Range Forest Officer, Kekirawa. Felling should proceed systematically in one direction straight across the area from north to south, and no trees will be allowed to be removed without cart-notes duly signed by the Forest Officer in charge of felling.

4. All trees must be stamped by a Forest Officer before felling and all sawn timber or logs must be again stamped before removal from the area. Felling and removal of the material from the area should be completed within twelve months from the date of signing the agreement, and any tree not felled or any material not removed outside the area before the agreement expires shall *ipso facto* revert to the Crown, and the purchaser shall have no claim in respect of such materials or to any refund of his purchase amount.

5. If it is found that the purchaser has been actually unable to remove all his material by the expiry date, due to circumstances beyond his control, then and in that case only the question of extending the duration of the agreement with or without the usual extension fees shall entirely rest with the Conservator of Forests to whom the Divisional Forest Officer shall make his due recommendation.

6. The purchaser shall either exercise such personal supervision as will ensure the conditions of this agreement being efficiently carried out, or employ an efficient supervisor whose name shall be furnished in writing and approved of by the Divisional Forest Officer. The purchaser shall not employ any person whose name is on the list of the Crown defaulting contractors or any other person to whose

employment the Divisional Forest Officer for reasons which appear to him sufficient objects after giving due notice of his objection in writing. The purchase agreement may not be assigned or sublet without the authority of the Conservator of Forests previously obtained in writing.

7. The purchaser shall agree that, for each and every infringement of the conditions laid down herein, he shall become liable to a fine not exceeding Rs. 50 to be imposed by the Divisional Forest Officer, at his discretion, and to be recovered from the cash security deposited or in any other manner whatsoever. Provided, however, that in the event of the purchaser committing any act which infringes any section of the Forest Ordinance, the Divisional Forest Officer may, at his discretion, take action under such section and claim compensation thereunder or a fine not exceeding Rs. 50 as described above whichever is greater. In the event of two such irregularities being proved to the satisfaction of the Conservator of Forests or failure to pay any instalment when due the agreement is liable to cancellation as from the date of such second irregularity with forfeiture of all moneys paid up to date by the purchaser and the latter shall not be entitled to any compensation in such an event.

Schedule.

For the purchase of 351 palu standing trees (more or less) enumerated in five blocks of about 200 acres each in extent defined by cut lines and situated in the Yodi-ela Proposed Reserve Forest of the Kalawewa Range. The distance from the area of exploitation to the nearest Railway Station, Talawa is about 5 miles, i.e., about 2 miles by forest track and about 3 miles by the Talawa-Kekirawa road.
