BY-LAWS made by the Moratuwa Urban Education District Committee, under section 25 of the abovenamed Ordinance, approved by the Board of Education, and confirmed by the Officer Administering the Government in Council under the said section.

By-laws of the Moratuwa Urban Education DISTRICT COMMITTEE.

The Committee shall meet ordinarily at the Urban District Council Office, Moratuwa, every second Monday at 5 P.M. of every alternate or second month.

2. The Chairman may at any time summon a meeting of the Committee, and on a requisition signed by any three members he shall summon a meeting of the Committee. The requisition shall state the object for which the meeting is required to be summoned.

Notice of the business to be transacted at meetings, whether ordinary or special, shall be served on each member at least three days—exclusive of Sundays and Public Holidays—before each meeting.

The Chairman shall preside at each meeting, but in his absence from any meeting the members of the Committee present shall choose one of their number to be Chairman of such meeting.

5. The Chairman, or in his absence the member pre-

siding, shall maintain order, and his decision on all points of order in dispute shall be final and conclusive.

6. A record of the proceedings of meetings shall be kept in a book and copies of such record circulated among members immediately after the meeting.

Education of Children.

Definitions.- In these by-laws the following terms shall have the meanings assigned to them unless there be something repugnant in the subject or context:—

The terms "boy," girl," and "child" shall mean a boy or a girl or a child residing in the area described

in the Schedule A hereto.

The term "attendance" means an attendance for the

The term "attendance" means an attendance for the period defined by the Code as constituting a full attendance recorded in an Attendance Register in the manner prescribed by the Code.

The term "school" shall mean a school established or recognized as such by regulation under section 10 of "The Education Ordinance, No. 1 of 1920," and shall include the schools grapping of Schedule R and shall include the schools specified in Schedule B hereto and any that may hereafter be established or recognized by regulations under the said section.

Children to attend School.—The parent of every boy not less than 6 nor more than 14 years of age, and the parent of every girl of not less than 6 nor more than 12 years of age, or in the case of Muslim and Tamil girls not less than 6 nor more than 10 years of age shall cause such boy or girl to attend school unless he has made other adequate and suitable provision for the education of such adequate and suitable provision for the education of such boy or girl or unless there is a reasonable excuse for non-attendance. Provided that, in the case of girls their attendance shall not be compulsory unless a separate female teacher is provided. Provided further that no boy under 8 years of age and no girl shall be compelled to attend a school more than $\frac{3}{4}$ mile distant from his or her residence and that he have very 8 years of ore shall be residence, and that no boy over 8 years of age shall be compelled to attend a school more than 2 miles distant from his residence

And provided always that when a child between 10 and 14 years of age, being beneficially employed to the satisfaction of the Chairman, Urban Education District Committee, has received a certificate from an Inspector of Schools that he or she has passed in Reading, Writing, and Arithmetic the Fifth Standard prescribed by the Code for the time being, he or she shall not be required

to attend a school.

Time of Attendance.—The time during which every child shall attend school shall be the whole time for which the school shall be open for the instruction of children

of similar age

10. It shall not be required as a condition of any child being admitted into or continuing in a "school" that he shall attend or abstain from attending any Sunday School or any place of religious worship, or that he shall attend any religious observance or any instruction in religious subjects in the school, or elsewhere, for which observance or instruction he may be withdrawn by his parent or

guardian, or that he shall attend the school in any day exclusively set apart for religious observance by the religious body to which the parent belongs.

11. For the purpose of ascertaining the number of children from the age of 6 to 14 resident within the limits of the Urban Diction. of the Urban District Council, it shall be lawful for the Committee to cause schedules to be served on house-holders within the said area requiring each of them to fill or furnish information for the purpose of filling up of the said schedule with the name, nationality, sex, and age of every child in his or her house, together with the names of the child's parents and the name and attention of any of the child's parents and the name and situation of any school which the child attends and to return the said schedule with full particulars of all the information required within a period of 15 days from the date of service of such schedule.

12. Every parent who shall not observe, or shall neglect or violate these by-laws or any of them shall, upon conviction, be liable to a fine not exceeding Rs. 5 and an additional fine not exceeding Re. 1 per day in the case of a

continuing offence.

13. No school shall be kept open for the purpose of giving instruction to pupils for more than 6 hours a day including intervals for meals, &c. The hour at which the school work should commence may be left to the discretion of the Managers or Head Masters, but no school should open earlier than 7 A.M. or later than 10 A.M. The school time table should be approved by the Inspector of Schools.

14. No school shall, except with the permission of the Divisional or District Inspector of Schools, be kept open for school work on more than 5 days a week or on less than 180 days a year.

15. Efficient provision has been made for elementary education within the area whose limits are specified in the

schedule hereto.

"THE CEMETERIES AND BURIALS ORDINANCE, 1899." BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

The proprietor, trustee, or other person entitled to the possession of a burial ground shall apply in writing to the Chairman of the Urban District Council to have the same registered as such stating the name of the keeper (if any) of the ground, and annexing to his application a figure of survey of the premises certified by the Surveyor-General or by a duly licensed surveyor. And the person named as keeper in such application shall subscribe the same in acknowledgment of his acceptance of the office and duties of such keeper.

2. If no keeper be named, or if the keeper so named shall not have signed the application in manner aforesaid, then, and in either of such cases the person on whose application registration of a burial ground is made shall be held to be the keeper of that ground and to be responsible for any

breach of regulations.

3. In the event of the death of the keeper of a burial ground or his inability from any cause to fulfil his duties the name of another keeper shall be registered, and no burial or

name of another keeper shall be registered, and no burial or cremation shall take place in such ground until such fresh registration shall have been effected except on the special permission of the Chairman of the Urban District Council or in his absence of the Vice-Chairman, if any.

4. No burial or cremation shall take place until the certificate required by section 32 of the Births and Deaths Registration Ordinance, No. 1 of 1895, has been produced to the keeper of the burial ground or to the Chairman or Vice-Chairman, as the case may be, if the burial or cremation Vice-Chairman, as the case may be, if the burial or cremation is authorized by the Chairman or Vice-Chairman under

rule 3.
5. It shall be the duty of the keeper of every burial ground to keep a register of all burials or cremations carried out on the premises of which he is a keeper in the form prescribed by the Chairman of the Urban District Council, and within twenty-four hours after any burial or cremation to cause a true extract of the entry of such cremation or burial in his register to be delivered to the Urban District Council Office.

6. It shall be lawful for the Chairman of the Urban District Council or any person authorized in writing by the Chairman, Urban District Council, for the purpose, to visit

and inspect at any time any burial ground, and to have access to all books and documents relating thereto.

7. All registered burial grounds shall be kept properly fenced and kept free from jungle and clean to the satisfaction of the Chairman of the Urban District Council.

8. No grave shall be less than 5 feet in depth or at a distance of less than 2 feet from any other grave.

THE CEYLON CHAMBER OF COMMERCE

"THE CEYLON CHAMBER OF COMMERCE ORDINANCE, 1895."

WITH reference to the rules of the Ceylon Chamber of Commerce and relative appendices published on pages 135 et seg of Part I st the Ceylon Government Gazette No. 7,624, dated January 13, 1928, it is hereby notified that at a General Meeting of the Chamber duly convened and held at their rooms on Monday, Margha 1935:—

(1) Bye-laws und Conditions of Sale Description, after the word "re-sale" at the end of the third sentence thereof:—

"and the buyer so defaulting shall be precluded from building at the next subsequent sale, and if settlement has not been made, at any following sale until such time as settlement has been made.

(2) Tonna Appendix "A.":-Tonnage Scale.—The following additions were made to the tonnage scale under

(3) Appointment of Chamber Representatives by the Corporation, Powers of the Board (Chamber ttee):—The following new rules were substituted for rules 11 and 40, respectively, of the Committee) :schedule :-

"It shall be lawful for the Corporation, by resolution passed in General Meeting, to appoint any member or members of the Board of Directors or any other person or persons as agent or agents for the management of the affairs of the Corporation and the accomplishment of its objects (including the appointment of any person or persons as representative or representatives or agent or agents of the Corporation for the purpose of representing commercial interests in the Legislative Council of Ceylon, or State ouncil of eylon, if any or elsewhere in Ceylon and to likewise appoint any person or persons as representative or representatives to visit any country or countries abroad in the interests of commerce or trade)."
"The Board shall have the following powers:—

"(a) To make rules or regulations for the management of the property of the Corporation,

- "(b) To appoint officers, clerks, and servants with such remuneration and at such salarieand on such conditions as they may consider advisable and to pay the expense occasioned thereby, as well as the current expenses for periodicals, rent or otherwise out of the funds of the Corporation; and should such expenses exceed the amount of the annual income of the Corporation, the deficit shall be borne by the members of the Corporation in equal proportions. Provided that the contribution of each member towards such deficit shall not exceed the sum of one hundred rupees in any one year, every such contribution being exclusive of the liability of each member of the Corporation under section 12 of Ordinance No. 10 of 1895.
- "(c) To establish and support Provident Funds for the benefit of the officers, employees or servants of the Corporation upon such terms and conditions and subject to suchs rules as the Board may think fit.
- " (d) To remunerate as the Board may think fit the services of and to pay any expense of the Chairman and/or Vice-Chairman and/or Deputy Chairman and/or any other member or members of the Corporation and/or any representative or representatives and/or agent or agents referred to in Rule 11 and/or any representatives visiting any country or countries abroad in the interests of commerce or trade and from time to time to fix and vary the amount of such remuneration.
- "(e) From time to time to remove or to suspend all or any of the officers, clerks or servants for such reasons as the Board may think proper and advisable and without assigning any cause. Provided that the said Board shall not exercise any powers which are by Ordinance No. 10 of 1895, or by any rule or rules for the time being of the Corporation declared to be exercisable by the Corporation in General Meeting.

-The additional powers provided by this amendment are contained in sub-sections (c) and (d) thereof and the remainder of the rule suggested is a re-arrangement of the provisions of the present rule."

(4) Bye-laws and Conditions of Sale of Fertilizers.—The following Bye-laws and Conditions of sale of Fertilizers were adopted as Appendix "Q" to this Chamber Rules and Regulations:—

Bye-laws and Conditions of Sale of Fertilizers.

Whereas in the United Kingdom the seller of a fertilizer is required to guarantee only the total percentage of the various plant foods it contains and not the percentages in each of its ingredients the practice in Ceylon is for the buyer to specify the ingredients of the mixture, such ingredients being individually of guaranteed analysis. The buyer is, therefore, entitled to protection against ingredients being used other than those he specified and it becomes necessary for the analyst to state not only the total percentages of plant food found, but also what ingredients are present and if in the correct proportions, and to give an opinion in so far as his methods of examination made this possible, as to whether or not the mixture has been made up in conformity with the invoice.

It was the intention of Government to introduce a new Fertilizer Ordinance in place of the present Ordinance No. 12 of 1901 in which the above requirements would have been provided cior but in view of the uncertainty as to when the proposed new Fertilizer Ordinance will be introduced the following Bye-laws and Conditions of sale have been framed to regulate the sale of fertilizats between Members of the Chamber.

1. No article shall be sold as a fertilizer which is not guaranteed by the seller to contain in some form or combination, available as plant food, nitrogen, phosphoric or potash.

2. All fertilizers sold shall be invoiced as prescribed in Form A in the appendix hereto showing the analyses guaranteed, and such invoice shall have effect as a warranty by the seller of the statement contained therein.

3. The invoice in addition to stating the weight sold and the price per ton shall state also the proportions and/or weights and analysis of each fertilizing ingredient comprising a mixture. Only the minimum guarantee of the essential constituent or constituents of ingredients shall be stated on the invoice.

4. The guarantee of the seller does not apply where incompatibles have been mixed on the instructions of the purchaser.

Reasons of Rules.

Fertilizers must contain plant food.

- 5. All fertilizers shall be sold ex warehouse or works packed in sound merchantable bags on packages securely fastened, each bag or package to bear the distinctive mark shown on the invoice-
- 6. The buyer of any fertilizer or fertilizer mixture shall be entitled to have such fertilizer or fertilizer mixture analysed by one or more of the analysts appointed by the Ceylon Chamber of Commerce and to receive from him a certificate of his analysis and, in the case of a mixture, a statement of the proportion of the various ingredients which such analysis or examination has shown to have been incorporated together with an opinion as to the correctness of the proportions.
- 7. The certificate of the analyst shall be as prescribed in Form B in the Appendix hereto, state the Nitrogen Phosphorus Pertoxide (P_2O_3) and Potassium Monoxide (K_2O_3) and shall be substantially as prescribed.
- 8. The sample to be submitted for analysis shall be taken in the manner prescribed in No. 12 of these Bye-laws and Conditions of sale, viz., other:
 - (a) Before dispatch (i.e. at the Works, premises or Mills of the Seller) or
 - (b) After dispatch (i.e. at the Railway premises or Buyers store, shed or any convenient place specified).
- 9. If the purchaser elects to have samples taken before dispatch he or his representative shall have power to enter the sellers works, premises or mills at any reasonable time for that purpose on advice by the Seller that the consignment is ready for sampling.
- 10. If the purchaser elects to have samples taken after dispatch he shall give due notice in writing to the seller not later than 3 days following the receipt of the seller's dispatch note, and giving the seller five days notice of such sampling, with particulars of place, date and hour so that he or his representative may be present.
- 11. The sample for analysis may be drawn by the purchaser, his agent or official sampler-Samples must be drawn in accordance with Bye-law No. 12 and the sampler shall sign a declaration in triplicate as prescribed in Form C in the Appendix hereto. Where the sample is drawn by the purchaser in the presence of the seller the declaration shall be signed by the latter as well as by the buyer. One copy of the declaration shall accompany each sample and the sample sent to the analyst and shall be accompanied by a certified copy of the invoice with the name of the seller omitted.

Should the sample be drawn by an analyst appointed by the Chamber or his agent, he shall be considered to act for both parties and shall sign the necessary declaration on their behalf.

- 12. The method of taking samples shall be as follows:-
 - (a) When the fertilizer is in bulk all lumps shall be broken up and scattered over the heap: equal portions of the fertilizer shall be taken from the base, top and middle of the heap totalling five per cent. of the weight of the whole up to a maximum of 5 cwt. and shall be bulked together in a separate heap. This heap shall be sampled as under (b).
 - (b) When the fertilizer is in bags, five per cent. of the number of bags shall be selected up to a maximum of twenty bags, except in the case of small bags containing 100 lb. or less when the maximum shall be increased to 30 bags. The contents of the selected bags shall be emptied on to a clean dry floor, all lumps broken up, the whole turned over once, quartered and opposite quarters taken. These two quarters shall be mixed, quartered again, and opposite quarters taken and mixed as before. This procedure shall be continued until a heap of about 10 lb. is obtained. This shall be divided into three portions of about three lb. each: the three portions are the samples.
 - (c) As an alternative method where neither the seller nor the buyer signifies objection thereto, fertilizers in bags may be sampled by means of a sampling spear, which shall not be less than 2 in. in diameter and twenty-four inches in length and the spear should be introduced to its full length and the bag sampled. The total quantity so abstracted for each sampling shall not be less than 5 lb. where the quantity of the fertilizer does not exceed five tons, and not less than 10 lb. where the quantity exceeds five tons, and shall be drawn from ten per cent. of the bags.
 - (d) The process of sampling shall be continuous and as expeditious as is consistent with due care, so that the samples obtained represent the consignment.
 - (e) The samples shall be placed in a clean dry container which can be made secure. Tinwood or glass containers with close covers are recommended so that the sample will not be exposed to outside agencies. The junction of container and lid shall be sealed with a distinctive mark and the container labelled, and the whole shall be wrapped in a stout cover sealed at the flaps with a distinctive mark and shall be labelled in such a manner that the particulars so marked can be seen without breaking the seal or seals. The wrapped up container shall be placed in an outer wrapper for post or other transport.
- 13. The samples shall be marked with the description and approximate weight of the consignment and with the place of sampling. They shall be signed and dated by the sampler and by the seller or his representative if present.
- 14. One of the three samples drawn in the prescribed manner shall be handed or sent to the analyst, one to the seller and the third shall be retained by the buyer.
- 15. All costs incidental to the drawing of samples and the obtaining of any analysis, as provided in these Bye-laws and Conditions of Sale, shall be borne by the seller or the purchaser in accordance with the results of the analysis or analyses.
- 16. If the seller or purchaser objects to the certificate of the analyst, one of the samples selected may at the request of the party objecting be submitted with a certified copy of the invoice to the Government Test House, Alipore, Calcutta, for purpose of analysis and the result of such analysis shall be final and binding upon both parties.
- 17. Claims may be made by the purchaser against the seller if there are any deficiencies in the ingredients of a mixture as shown by analysis and/or if the total percentage of the various plant foods are not of guaranteed analysis.
- 18. There are variations incidental to the analysis of fertilizers which are partly due to the operator and partly inherent in certain methods employed. In addition owing to the difficulty of obtaining samples of fertilizer mixtures which are accurately representative of the bulk, it is necessary to allow for errors due to sampling and mixing. It is customary to combine the errors from all sources and to lay down "Limits of Error" defining the extremes within which the analytical figures must lie if they are to be accepted.

In Ceylon as a result of experience, vendors of fertilizers have fixed the minimum analysis guaranteed for unmixed fertilizers to allow for these limits of error, and for the purpose of these

9. A press as claimed in Claim 5, in which the upper portion of the spiral element has its convolutions of less diameter than the remainder, so that it may pass the shaft of the heating apparatus without interference therewith.

10. A press as claimed in Claim 1, wherein the rotating means for the spiral element embodies a friction element. Two sheets of drawings.

Improvements in presses.

A bed frame supports a pair of horizontally disposed ways upon which rests a shell composed of two separable sections movable upon the said ways and secured together transverse bolts. The claims are :

A press of the type described in which there is provided a bed frame supporting a pair of spaced horizontally disposed ways upon which rests a divided shell.

2. A press in accordance with Claim 1, wherein the shell is composed of two separable sections mounted for lateral movement upon said ways toward and from each other, means being provided for securing said sections together.

3. A press in accordance with Claim 1 or Claim 2 wherein the sections of the shell are secured together in working relation by means of transversely extending bolts.

4. A press in accordance with Claim 1 or Claim 2, wherein one of the ways is disposed adjacent the intake end and the other adjacent the discharge end of the pres the line of division between the two sections of the lying in a plane extending longitudinally and vertically of the press.

5. A press in accordance with Claim 1 or Claim 2, wherein each section of the shell comprises a series of vertically disposed spaced ribs, each rib having a recess formed in its inner face, and a series of bars seated upon

and secured against the face of the said recess.

6. A press in accordance with Claim 5, wherein longitudinally extending bars bear against the outer faces of the ribs at their upper and lower ends.

7. A press in accordance with Claim 1, Claim 2, or Claim 3, wherein a shaft is carried in bearings supported by the frame, and has a series of worms mounted thereon, the sections of the shell being movable in a right line toward and from each other and to and from the axis of the shaft. and from each other and to and from the axis of the shaft.

8. In a press in accordance with Claim 1, the provision of a trough underlying the shell to receive liquid forced from the material therein and a rotary conveyor lying in the bottom of the trough, said conveyor acting through its motion to keep the foots carried by the liquid in a suspended condition and likewise acting to discharge the liquid and foots from the trough, substantially as described.

9. A press in accordance with Claim I, in which a shaft extends through and outwardly beyond the discharge end of the shell and has a series of spaced worms rotating therewith within the shell means located adjacent the intake end of the shell for driving the shaft, and a thrust bearing associated with that end of the shaft which extends beyond the discharge end of the press.

10. A press in accordance with Claim 9, wherein both thrust and radial bearings are associated with that end of the shaft which extends beyond the discharge end of the

shell.

11. A press in accordance with Claim 9 wherein a feed hopper is located at the inlet end of the shell and an

adjustable choke at the discharge end thereof.

12. A press in accordance with Claim 9 in which the shaft extends beyond each end of the shell, a separate connection being provided between one end of the shaft and the driving means therefor and a demountable support being provided for the thrust bearing at the other end of

the shaft substantially as described.

13. A press in accordance with Claim 9 or Claim 11 wherein a sleeve having a worm mounted thereon is secured to the shaft adjacent the hopper, a series of spaced worms being secured to the shaft between said sleeve and the discharge end of the shell, means shielding the shaft against wearing action of the cake extruding from the shell, being interposed between the thrust bearing and the outermost worm.

14. A press for expressing liquids from materials, constructed and adapted to operate substantially as hereinbefore described and shown in the accompanying:drawing.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended March 28, 1931.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 171 (2 Europeans, 9 Burghers, 103 Sinhalese, 21 Tamils, 22 Moors, 9 Malays, and 5 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1931, viz., 282,870) was 31·5, as against 28·2 in the preceding week, 38·7 in the corresponding week of last year, and 33·9 the weekly average for last year average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 130 (4 Euro-

peans, 2 Burghers, 75 Sinhalese, 21 Tamils, 20 Moors, 1 Malay, and 7 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 24·0, as against 21·9 in the previous week, 24·6 in the coreesponding week of last year, and 29·5 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths .-- Of the 130 total deaths, 24 were of infants under one year of age, as against 20 in the preceding week, 18 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 32 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during

the week was 11.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Eleven deaths from Pneumonia were registered, 4 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), 3 in Kotahena South, and 1 each in St. Paul's New Bazaar, Maradana North, and Maradana East, as against 17 in the previous week and 18 the weekly average for last year.

against 7 in the previous week and 8 the weekly average

(b) Six deaths from Influenza were registered, 1 each in San Sebastian, Kotahena South, Maradana hospitals, Maradana North, Slave Island, and Wellawatta North, as for last year.

(c) Four deaths from Bronchitis were registered, 2 in Maradana North and 1 each in Maradana East and Wellawatta North, as against 4 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year.

2. (a) Fourteen deaths from Phthisis were registered,
5 in Maradana hospitals (of non-residents), 3 each in
St. Paul's and New Bazaar, and 1 each in San Sebastian,
Kotahena South, and Slave Island, as against 16 in the previous week and 12 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Four deaths from *Phthisis*, of residents of Colombo

town, occurred at the Anti-Tuberculosis Hospital, Ragama,

during the week.

3. Five deaths from Enteric Fever were registered, 4 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents) and I in Slave Island, as against 4 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year.

One death from Plague was registered in Kotahena South, as against 3 in the previous week and 1 the weekly

average for last year.

5. Seven deaths from Debility were registered, 5 each from Diarrhoea and Enteritis, 4 from Worms, 3 from Accidents, 2 from Puerperal Septicaemia, and 63 from Other Causes.

6. Reported Cases .- 24 cases of Chickenpox, 3 of Enteric Fever, and 3 of Plague were reported during the week, as

against 35, 4, and 4, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was
82.5°, against 82.0° in the preceding week and 82.0° in
the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean
atmospheric pressure was 29.922 in., against 29.959 in.
in the preceding week and 29.892 in. in the corresponding
