### "THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ORDINANCE, No. 11 OF 1920."

BY-LAWS made by the Ratnapura Urban District Council, under sections 164 and 168 (10) of "The Local Government Ordinance, No. 11 of 1920," and approved by the Local Government Board, and confirmed by the Officer Administering the Government in Executive Council under section 164.

#### BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

1. No person shall sell, offer for sale, hawk about, or expose for sale any milk which contains less than the standard of cow's milk, to wit, 12 per cent. of milk solids, including not less than 3.5 per cent. of milk fat; provided, however, that when buffalo milk is sold as such it shall contain not less than 16 per cent. of milk solids, including not less than 7 per cent. of milk fat.

2. Any person committing a breach of the above by-law shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding Rs. 50 for such offence.

### "THE VEHICLES ORDINANCE, No. 4 OF 1916."

BY-LAWS made by the Officer Administering the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, under section 18 of "The Vehicles Ordinance, No. 4 of 1916," for the towns under the operation of "The Small Towns Sanitary Ordinance, 1892," in the Colombo District.

#### BY-LAWS.

1. The owner of a hackery licensed for hire shall permit any person duly empowered by the Chairman, to inspect periodically such vehicle and the animals used for drawing such vehicle.

2. The Chairman may from time to time by notice appoint places as public stands for licensed hackeries and may at any time, by notice, abolish or alter the situation of any such public stand.

3. No driver of a hackery licensed for hire shall except at a public stand leave such vehicle in any public road for longer than is necessary for loading and unloading goods and the taking up or setting down of passengers.

4. Every hackery on its arrival at a public stand shall be drawn up at the end, and be last in the line of hackeries already occupying such stand; and at every such stand all hackeries shall be arranged in single rank only.

5. The driver of a licensed hackery shall not at any time suffer the same to stand in any street (except for the purpose of setting down or taking up the passengers), or to loiter in any street nor shall he obstruct the driver of any other hackery in taking up or setting down any person, or wilfully, wrongfully, or forcibly prevent or endeavour to prevent the driver of any other licensed hackery from taking a fare.

1. *Licence to Manufacture Malt Liquor.*—This licence may be granted, subject to the approval of the Excise Commissioner, by the Government Agent on payment of an annual fee of Rs. 50 in addition to any duty that may be levied on production. The licence includes the right to bottle locally manufactured beer, ale, stout, and porter for sale.

2. *Bottling Licence.*—This licence may be issued to distillers and holders of wholesale licences for the sale of foreign liquor. The annual fee will be Rs. 100. This licence does not authorize flavouring and/or colouring but does authorize reducing and blending.

3. *Wholesale Licence for the Sale to licensed dealers only for Foreign Liquor (including locally made malt liquor) not to be consumed on the Premises.*—This class of licence must be taken out by commission agents and others who import liquor largely; and sales by them under this licence will be permitted to licensed dealers only. The annual fee for this licence will be Rs. 250 in Colombo and Rs. 200 outside Colombo.

4. *Retail Licence (for the sale of Foreign Liquor, including locally made Malt Liquor not to be consumed on the Premises).*—This licence may be issued on payment of an annual fee assessed by the Excise Commissioner on a basis of gallonage sold or business done provided that the fee shall not be less than Rs. 200 in the case of Municipal towns and Rs. 150 elsewhere. The opening hour shall not be earlier and the closing hour shall not be later than the corresponding hours fixed for foreign liquor taverns in the same town or area. The holder of a retail licence may sell medicated wines and similar preparations containing 20 per cent. and upwards but not more than 42 per cent. of proof spirit without any further licence.

5. *Tavern Licence (that is, retail Licence for the Sale of Foreign Liquor including locally made Malt Liquor to be consumed on the Premises).*—The amount to be paid for this licence will be determined ultimately by public auction, but shall until further orders be assessed by the Excise Commissioner on a basis of gallonage sold or business done, the minimum fee being Rs. 200 up to 200 gallons calculated as spirits and thereafter Re. 1 for every additional gallon. Under this licence the sale of liquor in one transaction for removal from the premises in a quantity exceeding one reputed quart is prohibited.

6. *Beer, Ale, Stout, and Porter Licence.*—This licence may be issued for the sale of beer, ale, stout, and porter only for consumption on or off the premises at an annual fee of Rs. 30. This licence shall be subject to the same restrictions as to hours as may be enforced for taverns in the same town or area.

7. *Hotel Licence (for the supply of Liquor in Hotels and Boarding Houses).*—No liquor shall be sold under this licence otherwise than to residents in hotels and boarding houses for their own use or that of their guests; no liquor shall be sold or given to any casual visitor except for cash and unless such person orders and pays for a meal costing at least 50 cents in addition to the liquor supplied. A daily account shall be kept in such form as the Excise Commissioner may prescribe of the proceeds from the sales of meals to casual visitors. A fee of not less than Rs. 100 to be assessed on a basis of gallonage sold or business done may be charged by the Excise Commissioner. After the closing hour no liquor shall be sold for consumption except in the private rooms of residents in the hotel.

8. *Bar Licence (Hotel).*—This licence will be issued to approved Hotel-keepers, to cover the sale of foreign liquor (including locally made malt liquor) at a bar in the hotel under the same conditions and to the same extent as a tavern licence. This licence will be issued on

payment of an annual fee assessed by the Excise Commissioner on a basis of gallonage sold or business done, provided that this fee shall not be less than Rs. 200 in the case of Municipal towns and Rs. 150 elsewhere. The Government Agent may issue free of fee one or more auxiliary bar licences for convenience of service. No liquor shall be sold under this licence to persons other than residents in the hotel except for cash payment. After the closing hour no liquor shall be sold for consumption except in the private rooms of residents in the hotel. The hours of sale under this licence are within the discretion of the Government Agent and his Advisory Committee, but the closing hour shall not be later than 11 P.M. The Government Agent may extend the closing hour on special occasions and issue "Supplementary Licence to Extend Hours of Sale."

9. *Bar Licence for place of Public Entertainment.*—This licence shall be issued to managers of approved places of public entertainment to cover the sale by the glass only of foreign liquor (including locally made malt liquor) at a bar in the place of entertainment under the same conditions and to the same extent as a tavern licence provided that no liquor shall be sold for removal from the premises. This licence will be issued on payment of an annual fee of not less than Rs. 100 for each bar, assessed by the Excise Commissioner, on a basis of gallonage sold or business done. No liquor shall be sold under this licence except for cash payment and except to persons attending the entertainment. No liquor shall be sold after the time when the entertainment ends or after 11 P.M., whichever is the earlier hour; and no liquor shall be sold for consumption on the premises after such hour, provided that when the first interval in an operatic or dramatic performance does not commence till after 10.45 P.M. the Government Agent may issue a "Supplementary Licence to Extend Hours of Sale" in form Excise F.L. 15c.

10. *Railway Refreshment Room or Dining Car Licence (issued to the Contractor or Contractors who have secured the privilege of opening Refreshment Rooms at Railway Stations or running the Dining Cars attached to Trains).*—These licences will cover the supply of foreign liquor (including locally made malt liquor) to bona fide travellers by railway only, and will be issued by the Government Agent, after consultation with the General Manager and the Excise Commissioner on payment of a fee assessed by the Excise Commissioner for each refreshment room or car. When one contractor has secured combined privileges, a consolidated fee may be charged. No liquor may be sold on these licences to any person who cannot produce on demand a current railway pass or ticket.

11. *Refreshment Room or Restaurant Licence (issued only to respectable Applicants to cover the sale of Foreign Liquor, including locally made Malt Liquor when combined with the sale of Meals).*—This licence may be issued on a fee of not less than Rs. 300 in Municipal towns and Rs. 150 elsewhere, to be assessed by the Excise Commissioner according to business done. No liquor shall be sold except for cash. No liquor shall be sold or given to any person unless such person orders and pays for a meal costing at least 50 cents in addition to the liquor supplied. A daily account shall be kept, in such form as the Excise Commissioner may prescribe, of the proceeds from the sale of meals. The opening hour shall be 8 A.M. and the closing hours shall be fixed from time to time by the Government Agent and his Advisory Committee, and shall not be later than 11 P.M. No liquor shall be consumed on the premises after the closing hour.

12. *Resthouse Licence (to Resthouses maintained under the supervision and control of the Chairman of the Provincial Road Committee or of any Urban District Council or of any other similar local Body).*—Under this licence liquor may be sold only to persons staying at the resthouse or to bona fide travellers for consumption on the premises; and no liquor shall be sold for removal from the resthouse. The fee will be assessed by the Excise Commissioner. The ordinary hours of sale will be from 8 A.M. to 11 P.M. A bill book shall be maintained from which bills must be issued to every visitor who takes liquor with or without meals. The number of the bill



shall be recorded in the resthouse collection book and in the Excise account book. This licence may be in form Excise F. L. 12 or F. L. 12A.

13. *Proprietary Club Licence.*—This licence may be issued on payment of a fee assessed by the Excise Commissioner and will cover the sale of foreign liquor (including locally made malt liquor) for consumption on the premises to members only and to friends in their company. This class of licence is issued to cover the sale of foreign liquor in a club in which the assets do not belong to all the members equally, but are the property of one or more persons who have a controlling financial interest in the club.

14. *Occasional Licence.*—This licence may be granted for the sale of foreign liquor (including locally made malt liquor) at refreshment stalls or bars in connection with race meetings, public entertainments, or other gatherings approved by the Government Agent, for periods not exceeding ten days at one time on payment of a fee to be assessed by the Excise Commissioner according to the hour of closing and nature of the occasion, and on deposit of Rs. 20 which will be refunded to the licensee on submission to the Excise Commissioner a correct statement showing the quantity of liquor sold under this licence. No sale of liquor for removal from the premises will be allowed under this licence. The hours for this licence shall be limited to the period during which the race meeting, public entertainment, or other gathering is in progress. No sale shall take place after 11 P.M., provided that the Government Agent shall have discretion to extend the closing hour where circumstances justify it. No liquor shall be sold or consumed on the premises after the closing hour.

*Note.*—This licence may not be issued for extension of closing hours of hotels, bars, and entertainment bars.

15. *Auctioneer's Licence (for the sale by recognized Auctioneers of consignments of Foreign Liquor (including locally made Malt Liquor)).*—The annual fee will be Rs. 10. The licensee may give sample bottles, and may hold the auction at places other than those specified in the licence. Liquor sold under this licence must be the property of *bona fide* residents in the Island.

15A. *Licence for the sale of Rectified Spirits.*—This licence may be issued on payment of an annual fee of Rs. 10 to such medical practitioners, chemists, druggists, apothecaries or keepers of dispensaries, and other firms or persons as are specially approved by the Government Agent. Under this licence the possession of rectified spirit in excess of forty imperial gallons (or such larger quantity as the Excise Commissioner may specially authorize) is prohibited. Rectified spirit must not be sold under this licence for other than *bona fide* medical, industrial, and scientific purposes, and the maximum limit of sale at one time to the same person is restricted to one reputed pint in the case of sale to a private individual; one imperial gallon in the case of sale for industrial purposes, or to a chemist, medical practitioner, or scientific body; and ten imperial gallons to any Government, Local Board, or Municipal hospital.

15B. *Licence for the sale of Medicated Wines and similar preparations containing 20 Per Cent. and upwards, but not more than 42 Per Cent. of Proof Spirit.*—The annual fee for this licence will be Rs. 20 when held by an authorized medical practitioner, chemist, druggist, apothecary or keeper of dispensary and Rs. 50 when held by others. The licensee may sell the medicated wines and similar preparations only as tonic or medicine and only in sealed receptacles for removal from the premises.

15C. *Supplementary Licence to extend hours of sale.*—This licence will be issued to the holders of hotel, hotel bar, and entertainment bar licences for the sale of foreign liquor including locally made malt liquor after the usual closing hours in connexion with race meetings, public entertainments, or other gatherings, whether they take place in the hotel or only in the same town.

16. *Special Licence.*—This may be granted under the orders of the Excise Commissioner on such terms and

conditions as may in each case be determined, when the circumstances are such as not to allow of the issue of licences of any of the above descriptions.

#### Forms and Conditions of Foreign Liquor Licences.

THE Governor has, under section 24 of "The Excise Ordinance, No. 8 of 1912," directed that on and after October 1, 1931, licences for the manufacture of malt liquor and for carrying out any business in foreign liquor shall be granted—

- on payment of the fees shown in Schedule I.;
- for a period of not more than one year;
- in the forms given in Schedule II.;
- and subject to the restrictions and on the conditions contained in the said forms.

Excise Notification No. 76 published in the *Government Gazette* No. 6,953 of June 28, 1918, Excise Notification No. 141 published in the *Government Gazette* No. 7,390 of May 2, 1924, and Excise Notification No. 173 published in *Government Gazette* No. 7,642 of May 11, 1928, are hereby rescinded.

3. All operations connected with bottling must be done in the presence of an Excise Officer. Within the Municipality of Colombo notice must be given to the officer in charge of Colombo Excise Station 24 hours before bottling operations are to commence in every month except in December when 72 hours' notice must be given. Outside the Colombo Municipality 24 hours' notice must be given to the Range Inspector.

4. Flavouring or colouring is prohibited.

5. The liquor must be "proved" on each occasion of bottling or re-casking on the premises.

6. Every bottle or other receptacle must be sealed, wired, or secured by capsules, or the cork and the top of the neck covered by metallic foil.

7. No spirits shall be bottled at a strength higher than 20 degrees under London Proof or lower than 35 degrees under London Proof.

8. An account showing the different kinds of liquor received, bottled, and issued daily shall be maintained in such form as the Excise Commissioner may prescribe and produced on demand of an Excise Officer not below the rank of Inspector.

9. Whenever the Excise Commissioner shall publish by notification in the *Government Gazette* that only certain brands of spirits have been approved by him, the licensee shall, after a date which will be notified in this behalf, bottle no liquor of a brand other than liquor of brands so approved.

10. This licence will be subject to bottling rules which may be made from time to time.

11. I. The rules under section 3 of "The Buffaloes Protection Ordinance, 1920," published in *Gazette* No. 7,721 of July 5, 1920, are hereby repealed as respects the Kurunegala Revenue District.

2. No buffalo shall be slaughtered and no person shall cause or permit a buffalo to be slaughtered except under and in accordance with the terms of a permit in that behalf from the local authority. Every such permit shall be in the Form A in the schedule hereto.

3. No buffalo shall be removed or transported from the area of a local authority to any other area except under a permit in that behalf from the local authority from whose area such removal is to take place. Every such permit shall be in the Form B in the schedule hereto.

4. No buffalo meat shall be transported from the area of a local authority to any other area except under a permit in that behalf from the local authority from whose area such meat is to be transported. Every such permit shall be in the Form C in the schedule hereto.

5. The local authority may, in his discretion, refuse or issue a permit for any of the purposes of these rules, or issue such permits subject to such conditions, if any, as he may think fit to impose.

#### GENERAL CONDITIONS.

(a) Trees are to be felled within 6 inches from the ground with the saw alone. Work shall commence within one week of signing the contract.

(b) Only such trees as are marked and stamped by a Forest Officer for felling shall be felled by the contractor and logged into the longest possible lengths with saw alone, and all logs should be straight and sound throughout free from shakes, large or loose knots.

(c) The area to be worked is divided into blocks, and no felling will be permitted in more than one block at a time. Felling will not be permitted in the second block before the first block is completed. The contractor shall not commence fellings in a fresh block without the written permission of the Range Forest Officer.

(d) The contractor or his agent should point out the trees felled and logged to the Forest Officer.

(e) The contractor is required to take all necessary precautions for avoiding damage to other trees when felling and for any failure to observe this requirement the contractor shall be liable to pay fines for the damages caused or pay the royalty value of the timber so damaged or both.

(f) Logs shall be trimmed before delivery at the final delivery depot. Each end shall be sawn with a clean face at right angles to the axis of the tree. Payment will be made only on measurements taken after such operations.

(g) Rejected timber will not be paid for and will lapse to Government with all refuse wood in the area under operation. The contractor shall have no claim in respect of any material sold as rejection.

(h) The contractor will be liable to a fine of Rs. 20 for every tree not felled and logged on or before July 31, 1931. He will also be liable to a similar fine for every log undelivered at the final delivery depot by December 31, 1931.

(i) Cart tracks, where necessary, should be opened by the contractor. Cart tracks within the forest should, as far as practicable, follow the cut lines.

(j) The contractor shall observe the provisions of by-law 9 (a) under section 18 of Vehicles Ordinance, No. 4 of 1916, which runs as follows:—

"It shall not be lawful to any person to do any of the following acts:—

(a) To load a cart with timber or other substance of more than 20 feet in length without having one end thereof secured to another or sling cart."

(k) Nothing in this contract shall preclude the Divisional Forest Officer from taking action in accordance with the provisions of the Forest Ordinance (No. 16 of 1907), against the contractor for felling or allowing his coolies to fell any tree within or outside his area of contract which should not be felled in accordance with the conditions of the said contract or without the necessary permit prescribed by the said Ordinance.

## VITAL STATISTICS.

### Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended April 4, 1931.

**Births.**—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 142 (15 Burghers, 83 Sinhalese, 14 Tamils, 23 Moors, 3 Malays, and 4 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1931, viz., 282,870) was 26·2, as against 31·5 in the preceding week, 36·0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 33·9 the weekly average for last year.

**Deaths.**—The total deaths registered were 119 (5 Burghers, 59 Sinhalese, 25 Tamils, 18 Moors, 8 Malays, and 4 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 21·9, as against 24·0 in the previous week, 22·9 in the corresponding week of last year, and 29·5 the weekly average for last year.

**Infantile Deaths.**—Of the 119 total deaths, 18 were of infants under one year of age, as against 24 in the preceding week, 19 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 32 the average for last year.

**Still Births.**—The number of still births registered during the week was 12.

**Principal Causes of Death.**—1. (a) Thirteen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 6 in Maradana hospitals (including 5 deaths of non-residents), 3 in Kotahena South, and 1 each in Pettah, Kotahena North, Maradana South, and Kollupitiya, as against 11 in the previous week and 18 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Nine deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 4 in St. Paul's and 1 each in Pettah, San Sebastian, New Bazaar, Maradana hospitals (of a non-resident) and Slave Island, as against 6 in the previous week and 8 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Seven deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 3 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents) and 1 each in Maradana North, Maradana East, Maradana South and Kollupitiya, as against 4 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year.

2. Twelve deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 9 in Maradana hospitals (including 5 deaths of non-residents) and 1 each in Maradana North, Kollupitiya and Wellawatta South, as against 14 in the previous week and 12 the weekly average for last year.

3. One death from *Enteric Fever* was registered in Maradana hospitals, as against 5 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year.

4. Five deaths from *Entericis* were registered, 4 from *Puerperal Septicæmia*, 3 each from *Worms* and *Debility*, 2 each from *Diarrhoea* and *Accidents*, 1 from *Tetanus* and 57 from *Other Causes*.

5. **Reported Cases.**—Thirteen cases of *Chickenpox*, and 6 of *Enteric Fever* were reported during the week, as against 24 and 3 respectively, of the preceding week.

**State of the Weather.**—The mean temperature of air was 82·8°, against 82·5° in the preceding week and 81·4° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·916 in., against 29·922 in. in the preceding week and 29·905 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0·15 in., against 0·05 in. in the preceding week and 0·75 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

**REGULATIONS FOR THE JUNIOR AND SENIOR COMMERCIAL EDUCATION CERTIFICATE  
EXAMINATIONS OF THE LONDON CHAMBER OF COMMERCE, 1932.**

1. *Date and Place of Examination.*—These examinations will be held in Colombo, commencing on April 25, 1932.

2. *Eligibility\*.*—For the Junior examination candidates must either (a) be members of an approved Commercial Class and have been in attendance in such a class for at least a year or (b) be over 17 years of age. For the Senior examination candidates must either (a) be over 17 years of age or (b) have passed the Junior examination. Application for the approval of Commercial Classes must be made to the Director of Education at least 3 months before applications for entry are submitted.

3. *Entries.*—Entry forms duly filled in must be forwarded so as to reach the Director of Education not later than November 30, accompanied by a Bank receipt for the fees credited† to the Examination Fund Account of the Director of Education in the Chartered Bank of India, &c., Colombo, at the rate of Rs. 15 for a Junior examination or Rs. 3 for a single Junior subject, and Rs. 20 for a Senior examination or Rs. 5 for a single Senior subject. A candidate taking a Modern Foreign Language or French Shorthand must pay an additional fee of Re. 1.

4. *Withdrawals.*—Fees cannot be returned. If notice of withdrawal is received in the Education Office more than sixteen days before the commencement of the examination, a voucher will be sent entitling the candidate, or (on application from an approved school) another pupil of the school to count towards a subsequent examination the Chamber's fee already paid. The Chamber do not undertake to grant a voucher if the full sixteen days' notice has not been given. Applications made later will, however, be considered if accompanied by a medical certificate stating that the candidate is physically unfit to take the examination, provided that such applications reach this Office by Wednesday of the examination week, and that the candidate has not actually sent up answers to any of the papers. No voucher may be presented on more than one occasion, nor can a second voucher be issued in respect of the same fee. Candidates who hold vouchers and who wish to enter for the subsequent examination must send to the Director of Education on or before November 30 fresh forms of entry together with the Bank receipts for the local fee payable by them. 50 per cent. for a pass and 65 per cent. for a pass with distinction.

6. *Scheme of Examination.*—There will be two Junior Certificate Examinations and two Senior Certificate Examinations. In order to obtain a certificate awarded on the results of these examinations candidates must pass in all the subjects of the particular examination at one and the same time, except as provided in paragraph 8. Candidates will not be permitted to enter for single subjects except as provided in paragraphs 7, 8, and 9.

(a) *Junior General Commercial Certificate*—

English, Arithmetic, Elements of Commerce, Commercial Geography, Bookkeeping.

(b) *Junior Certificate for Shorthand Typists*—

English, Arithmetic, Elements of Commerce, Shorthand, Typewriting.

(c) *Senior General Commercial Certificate*—

English, Commerce and Finance, Commercial Arithmetic, Bookkeeping and Accountancy.

(d) *Senior Certificate for Shorthand Typists*—

English, Commerce and Finance, Shorthand, Typewriting.

7. *Single Subjects.*—Candidates who hold these certificates will be allowed at subsequent examinations to enter for examination in single supplementary subjects of the same grade.

8. (a) *Exemptions.*—Candidates who hold certificates in single subjects are allowed exemptions from examination in these subjects at the examination for Full Certificates.

(b) Candidates who hold Full Certificates in one section will be awarded Full Certificates in the other section of the same Grade on passing in the subjects not already included in the Certificates which they hold.

9. *Reference.*—If a candidate for the Junior or the Senior examinations fails in not more than one subject he may be referred in that subject. In that case he may be permitted to take that subject within the next two years and on passing will be awarded a full certificate.

11. *Detailed Syllabuses of Junior Subjects*—

**Arithmetic.**—The practical application of Arithmetic to Percentages, Rates and Taxes, Profit and Loss, Simple Interest, Bankruptcies, and simple graphs of statistics, prices, &c. The Metric System.

Accuracy will be tested by examples in the simple rules, the use of contracted, prime factors, averages and statistics mensuration of areas and simple volumes. (Graph paper is supplied with the work book.)

**Bookkeeping.**—General principles of Bookkeeping by Double Entry and knowledge of commercial terms. The use and order of the Subsidiary books and Ledgers in the system of Commercial Bookkeeping to enable a correct Trial Balance to be extracted.

Arithmetical accuracy and neatness, and the use of sectional ledgers, will ensure extra marks.  
Erasure and untidiness will generally cause failure.

*Note.*—A student may pass if his work is sufficiently good, by using a general ledger only, but the use of sectional ledgers will earn additional marks.

**Commercial Geography.**—The Commercial and Industrial Geography of the World with special reference to the British Empire. A thorough knowledge of maps showing, (i.) the location of the chief cities, seaports, and producing centres; (ii.) the chief sea routes and railway lines; (iii.) the distribution of the most important raw materials, food stuffs, and manufactured articles.

\* Candidates who are not British subjects will not be admitted.

† All payments to the Bank must accompany the form giving particulars of payment. This form can be obtained from the Education Office, Colombo.

A precise acquaintance with the commerce and industry of the British Isles including the main articles of trade between the British Isles and the various parts of the Empire. The general conditions of climate and vegetation of the world as a basis for acquiring knowledge of its chief productions.

*N.B.*—Candidates will be expected to draw sketch maps freely.

*NOTE.*—From 1932, the type of question paper will be modified as follows:—

- (a) Old Sections A and B will be combined as Section A, with three questions, viz., one on the British Isles, one on the British Empire excluding the British Isles, and one on the World excluding the British Empire. Candidates must answer two of these three questions.
- (b) An additional question involving a broad knowledge of Geographical principles will be set in Section B (old Section C).

**Commercial History.**—The outline of the History of the commercial and industrial development of England from the earliest times to the present, with special reference to:—(1) The Merchant Companies; (2) Exploration and Colonial Expansion; (3) Finance and Banking; (4) The Industrial Revolution; (5) Poor Law Problems; (6) The Present as the last link in a continuous historical chain of events.

**Elementary Mathematics: ALGEBRA.**—Easy simplifications of algebraical expressions. Interpretation of formulae. Simple equations. Simultaneous equations of the first degree. Quadratic equations. Problems involving such equations. Easy factors. Graphs of statistics and of simple algebraical equations. Use of four figure logarithm tables in simple problems.

**GEOMETRY.**—The substance of Euclid, Books I. to III. Logical geometrical proofs of the theorems and problems will be accepted, whether Euclid's or not. Deductions. Simple loci. Applications of arithmetic and algebra to geometrical theorems and problems.

*Note.*—The use of logarithm tables is allowed.

**Elements of Commerce.**—The divisions of trade—manufacturer or producer, wholesale dealer, and retailer; development of the merchant business. Agents of production—labour and capital. Business organization and management—the functions of the various departments in a business house—the correlation of each department in the scheme of organization. The organization of the commercial side of the business of a manufacturer or producer, sole trader, business on consignment, commission, agency business, joint accounts. The wholesale trade, organization of wholesale warehouse, transactions in wholesale trade. The retail trade—retail transactions—multiple shop system—departmental stores, co-operative trading. Gross profits, net profits, buying and selling, costing, working expenses, advertising. Banking system—relation of banker to customer. The Bankers' Clearing House, the services of banks. Current and deposit accounts, transfer of money, supply of credit to customers, &c. The remittance of money—General Post Office services, cheques, bills of exchange, &c. The credit system. Forms of transport—carriers, canals, rivers, railways, motor, aerial, ships. Collection and delivery of goods. Warehousing of goods, functions, operations, bonded warehouses, transfer of ownership of warehoused goods. Organization of foreign trade—export and import trade, markets and exchanges, importation of raw produce and the marketing, transactions in the import and export trade. Financing of foreign trade.

**English.**—Dictation, Essay, Analysis, and simple Précis. Questions are set dealing with Direct and Indirect Speech, and testing the candidate's Vocabulary. Students are expected to be able to paraphrase a piece of English prose or verse and write efficiently a simple business letter. Questions will be set on general English Literature, but not more than 25 per cent. of the questions will be devoted to this section. There are no set books or periods, but a sufficiently wide choice of questions will be given to cover an elementary survey of English Literature generally. Handwriting is taken into account in the marking of papers.

*Note.*—In this subject candidates must satisfy the Examiner in English Reading and Conversation.

**Handwriting.**—Copying a letter, a tabular statement or printed matter, &c. Copying and ruling up, where necessary, arithmetical examples, items of an invoice, a statement, a receipt, a telegram or other commercial form of document in general use, and the displaying of headings, or other matter by different sizes of writing. Addressing envelopes of various sizes, as a test of writing without lines. Simple lettering with the pen, and without the use of the pencil.

The Committee does not encourage Script writing.

*Note.*—Special attention is called to this subject, and no pains should be spared in seeking to meet the requirements of commercial houses with regard to handwriting. The old-fashioned copy book style of penmanship, thick in the down-strokes, almost invisible in the up-strokes, and abounding in flourishes should be avoided. The characteristics desired are simplicity, and uniformity of size, style, slope, and spacing. Each letter should, therefore, be clearly and accurately formed, so that its identity may be distinguished apart from its position in the word—the u's distinguished from the n's, &c.—and the turnings should be round and not angular. The slope should be slightly forward.

**Modern Foreign Languages.**—(French, German, Italian, Portuguese, Spanish.)

(1) Translations from and into the foreign language with grammatical questions.

(2) A short essay or simple letter in the foreign language.

(3) Dictation in the foreign language.

(4) The candidates' ability to express themselves verbally will be tested by conversation in the foreign language.

Candidates *must pass* in conversation as well as in the written portion of a language in order to obtain a certificate.

Foreign candidates taking the examination in their own language must satisfy the examiner in English.

**Shorthand.**—Writing in Shorthand (any system), from passages dictated at the rate of 60, 70, or 80 words per minute for a period of five minutes. Transcription of any one of the above passages for which the candidate is allowed time at the rate of 7 words per minute.

Spelling, punctuation, and neatness of writing in transcription will be taken into account in judging the candidate's work.

*N.B.*—Any one of the three speeds may be chosen by the candidate. *A speed of at least 60 words per minute is required for the certificate.*

Papers will be set in Shorthand in any Modern Foreign Language if a sufficient number of entries is received.

**Typewriting.**—Copying commercial letters, other matter, and tabular statements from typed and manuscript copy. Candidates are expected to be able to type correspondence invoices, easy balance sheets and statement of accounts, tabulated lists, elementary shipping documents, &c.

Special attention must be paid to accuracy, correct spelling, syllabification, punctuation, and general intelligence. Candidates will be allowed to use any make of machine they choose. *They should bring their own machines if possible; otherwise they will be expected to typewrite on the machine provided, irrespective of make or model.*

The money market—Bank rate and market rate—The Bank return—The "Money Article"—Bankers and borrowers—Bank balance sheets.

The relation between money, credit, and prices—The effect of the gold discoveries—Financial crises—The function and limits of speculation—The Stock Exchange.

**Note.**—Candidates will be required to have a knowledge of the various forms of Accident Policies and Prospectuses applicable to the foregoing classes of Insurance. Questions may also relate to Claims, Policy Conditions, Days of Grace, Good Faith, Insurable Interest, Moral and Physical Hazards, Renewals, and Subrogation.

Candidates must be acquainted with, but a detailed knowledge will not be required of the Law of Negligence, the Law of Nuisance, the Employers' Liability Act, 1880, the Fatal Accident Acts, 1846–1864, the Workmen's Compensation Acts, 1925–6, and the returns under the Assurance Companies Act, 1909.

**Commerce and Finance : Organization of Business.**—The Nature and Constitution of Business Firms. Limited Companies. Public and Private Companies. Co-operative Societies. Combines and Trusts. The Capital of the Firm, Stock, Shares, and Debentures. The Capital owned by the Firm. The relations between Gross Profits, Net Profits, Overhead Expenses and Turnover.

**Note.**—The use of logarithm tables will be allowed.

(2) *Literature*.—There are no set books or periods, but a reasonable standard of proficiency in English Literature generally is expected. Candidates will be required to show that they have read widely, and are capable of appreciating what they have read.

*Note*.—In this subject candidates must satisfy the Examiner in English Reading and Conversation.

**The History, Geography, and Economic Resources of the Empire**.—History of the growth of the Empire, from the Elizabethan Age to the present day, and the manner in which different parts have been added whether by right of discovery, conquest, or otherwise. The political development of the various portions and their status from Crown Colonies to Dominions.

Geographical conditions of the different parts of the Empire with regard to (1) Size, position, and population, (2) Physical relief, (3) Climatic conditions, temperature and rainfall, with special regard to seasonal variations and their influence, (4) River systems, (5) Centres of population, (6) Communications by river, road, and rail.

Economic resources, with special reference to their production and exchange between different parts of the Empire. Food products, such as meat, fish, corn crops, fruits, tea, coffee, cocoa, rice and sugar. Wool, cotton, silk, flax, hemp, and other fibres. Timber, rubber, tobacco, oilseeds, ivory, leather, and paper-making materials. Minerals, such as coal, iron, copper, lead, tin, zinc, gold, silver, precious stones, and petroleum; and other products.

The principal trade routes between the component parts of the Empire, for both steamers and sailing ships.

**Life Insurance**.—Principles and Practice of Life Insurance—The Contract—Insurable Interest—Policy Conditions. Compound Interest Tables—Mortality Tables.
