REGULATIONS.

1. In these regulations the expressions "Peradeniya-Deltota road," "Galaha-Pupuressa road," and "Galaha-Galantenne road" mean the portions of these roads in the "urban area" comprised within the administrative limits of the Sanitary Board town of Galaha as specified in the schedule hereto.

2. No person shall park an omnibus at any spot along the Peradeniya-Deltota road, Galaha-Pupuressa road, or the Galaha-Galantenne road except at a public stand provided or allotted for the purpose by the Sanitary Board of the Kandy District.

3. No person shall park an omnibus in or at any such stand unless he has in his possession a valid written permit issued by the Chairman of the said Board for the use of such stand by such omnibus.

4. Such permit shall contain the number of the omnibus in respect of which it is issued and it shall be issued upon payment of a fee of Rs. 5 per annum.

5. Such permit shall on demand by a Sanitary Board Inspector or a Police Officer in uniform be produced for inspection by the person in charge of an omnibus in occupation of such stand.

6. The person in charge of an omnibus who commits a breach of regulations 2 or 3 or 5 shall be guilty of an offence.

Limits of the Sanitary Board town of Galaha:—

North.—150 feet from the centre of the Public Works Department road running through Galaha town.

South.—Elehenamalakandura and culvert No. 284.

East.—150 feet from the centre of the Public Works Department road running through Galaha town.

West.—17th milestone on the side of the Kandy-Hindagala-Deltota Public Works Department road.

Clause 15 (i).—Add the following sentence: "The normal period during which the school shall be in session shall be five hours a day."

Clause 16 (vii).—Add a new sub-clause as follows:—

"(vii.) A teacher who is normally employed in teaching for 20 hours a week is regarded as a full-time teacher."

Clause 40 (a) (i).—In line 3 alter "six days" to "five days."

Clause 40 (b).—In the amendment published in *Gazette* No. 7,776 of May 8, 1930, for the words "will pay" substitute "may approve."

Add the following sentences to this sub-clause:—

"The maximum amount of full pay and half pay leave is eight weeks in the twelve months preceding the end of the school year. A teacher with no previous service, joining a school during a school year, will be eligible for leave proportionate to his service in that year."

Clause 17 (i).—Add the following sentence: "The normal period during which the school shall be in session shall be five hours a day."

Clause 18 (vii).—Add a new sub-clause as follows:—

"(vii.) A teacher who is normally employed in teaching for 20 hours a week is regarded as a full-time teacher."

Clause 54 (a) (i).—In line 3 alter "six days" to "five days."

Clause 54 (b).—Add the following:—

"The maximum amount of full pay and half pay leave is eight weeks in the twelve months preceding the end of the school year. A teacher with no previous service, joining a school during a school year, will be eligible for leave proportionate to his service in that year."

Clause 75.—In the last line after "registered" insert "or employed."

Clause 76.—In the last three lines alter "be appointed to teach three years" to "be employed temporarily as teachers."

Clause 77.—Add the following sentence:—"From January 1, 1932, the words 'be provisionally registered for a period of three years' will be substituted for 'be registered as provisionally certificated teachers.'"

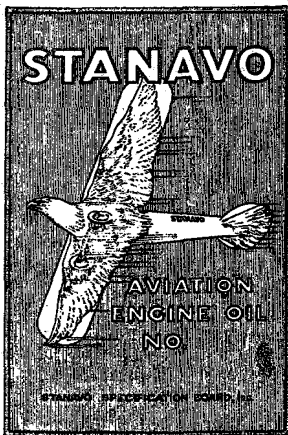

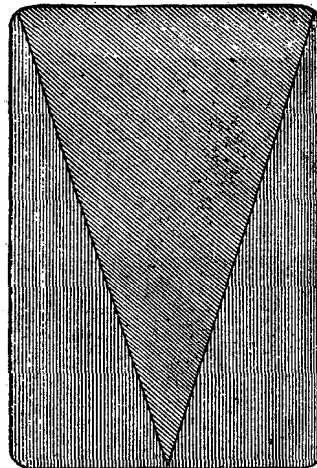

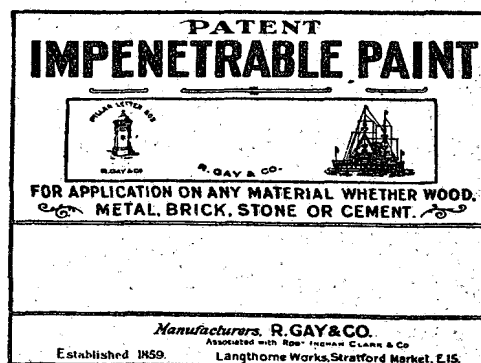
