WHEREAS by a Proclamation dated October 9, 1884, published in *Government Gazette* dated October 10, 1884, a police force was established in the town of Galle, Southern Province, and the limits of the said town were therein specified and defined for the purposes of the said Ordinance, and whereas the limits of the said town were altered by Proclamation dated August 17, 1911, published in *Government Gazette* dated August 18, 1911:

And whereas it is expedient further to alter the said limits:

Now know Ye that We, the Governor in Executive Council, in exercise of the powers vested in Us by section 13 of "The Police Ordinance, 1865," do hereby so alter the limits of the said town for the purposes of the said Ordinance as to comprise the area set out and defined in the schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

North.—The southern bank of Mahamodera lake and the Keppu-ela, down the Keppu-ela to Hume road bridge, thence eastwards along an imaginary line 3 chains north of Hume road to the junction with Richmond Hill road, thence northwards along an imaginary line 3 chains west of Richmond Hill road to the junction with Kumbalwella road, thence eastwards along an imaginary line 3 chains north of Kumbalwella road to the junction of Elliot road, thence southwards along an imaginary line 3 chains east of Elliot road to the junction with Cripps road, thence along an imaginary line 3 chains north of Cripps road to the junction with Morris road.

East.—An imaginary line 3 chains to the east of the Circular road from its junction with Morris road to its junction with the Matara high road, thence along an imaginary line 3 chains on the northern side of the Matara high road to the Badal-ela, thence along the Badal-ela to the sea.

South.—The sea from Badal-ela on the east to Mahamodera river on the west.

West.—Mahamodera river.

4. The driver of any omnibus parked in a public stand shall produce the permit issued under regulation 5 when required to do so by a Police Officer or a person authorized for the purpose by the licensing authority.

5. The licensing authority may issue permits authorizing omnibuses to use a public stand and charge fees for the permits in accordance with the scale specified in the schedule hereto.

(2) The purchaser shall further agree that should any timber be left standing or lying felled within the coupe or coupes on the date of expiry, the expenses incurred by Government for their removal be defrayed from the amount deposited by him as security under clause (b) in paragraph 9 above.

He shall further agree to progress the felling in a direction parallel to the boundary along which the felling has been commenced and regulate it in such manner and in accordance with such instructions as may be issued by the Range Forest Officer, Ratnapura, from time to time.

(5) If paying by instalments, the purchaser shall pay the second instalment or in all 70 per cent. of the full purchase price within 4 months, and the third and final instalment within 7 months of the date of execution of the agreement.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended May 16, 1931.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 146 (7 Burghers, 101 Sinhalese, 21 Tamils, 13 Moors, 3 Malays, and 1 Other). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1931, viz., 282,870) was 26.9, as against 29.9 in the preceding week, 24.0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 33.9 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 98 (1 European, 3 Burghers, 65 Sinhalese, 17 Tamils, 8 Moors, 3 Malays, and 1 Other). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 18.1, as against 20.6 in the previous week, 25.0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 29.5 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 98 total deaths, 20 were of infants under one year of age, as against 18 in the preceding week, 20 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 32 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 3.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Fourteen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 9 in Maradana hospitals (including 6 deaths of non-residents), and 1 each in Kotahena North, Kotahena South, Maradana North, Maradana East, and Kollupitiya, as against 16 in the previous week, and 18 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Seven deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 2 in Maradana South, and 1 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena South, New Bazaar, Maradana hospitals (of a non-resident), and Kollupitiya, as against 10 in the previous week, and 8 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Three deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 1 each in Maradana North, Kollupitiya, and Wellawatta North, as against 4 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.

2. (a) Four deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 2 in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), and 1 each in St. Paul's and Kotahena South, as against 7 in the previous week and 12 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Three deaths from *Phthisis* of residents of Colombo town occurred at the Anti-Tuberculosis hospital, Ragama, during the week.

3. Five deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 4 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), and 1 in Slave Island, as against 7 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.

4. One death from suspected *Plague* of a resident of Colombo town occurred at the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Angoda, during the week. No deaths from *Plague* were registered within the city.

5. Six deaths from *Debility* were registered, 5 from *Worms*, 3 each from *Dysentery*, *Enteritis*, and *Infantile Convulsions*, 2 from *Accidents*, 1 from *Puerperal Septicaemia*, and 42 from *Other Causes*.

6. **Reported Cases.**—Nine cases of *Chickenpox* and 5 of *Enteric Fever* were reported during the week, as against 16 and 13, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 82.6°, against 82.0° in the preceding week and 83.3° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.851 in., against 29.791 in. in the preceding week, and 29.873 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 1.63 in. against 5.44 in. in the preceding week, and 1.13 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

General Meeting

Wednesday, April 1, 1931, at 3 p.m.

The Council met this day at 3 p.m.; pursuant to notice, dated March 25, 1931.

Present :—Mr. H. E. Newham, V.D., J.P., M.A., G.C.S., Chairman; the Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader, M.L.C.; Dr. E. V. Ratnam; the Hon. Mr. R. L. Pereira, K.C., M.L.C.; Mr. W. E. V. de Rooy; Dr. E. A. Coorey; Mr. G. W. Dodds; Mr. T. G. Jayawardene, V.D., J.P.; Mr. M. L. M. Reyal; Dr. S. Muttiah; Mr. S. W. R. Dias Bandaranaike; Mr. T. C. Dyball; Mr. F. Dadabhoy, J.P.; Mr. W. J. Thornhill; Mr. J. S. Collett; and Dr. L. A. Prins.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of March 4, 1931, having been previously printed and copies thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read.

Resolved that the Minutes of the General Meeting of March 4, 1931, be confirmed.

2. Pursuant to notice, the Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader asked the following question which the Chairman answered :—

Q.—(1) Will the Chairman be pleased to inform the Council :—(a) The number of immovable properties sold under warrants issued and seizures effected for non-payment of rates from 1920 to 1931? A.—In the 11½ years specified, 4,306 properties were seized and sold. Lest these figures should give a wrong impression, it is desirable to add that in the last 5 years only 82 properties have been seized and sold. In none of these 82 cases has it been necessary to complete the sale and vest the property.

Q.—(b) The rates due in each case. A.—The rates due in each case are on record in the 231 assessment books for the period in question. It was impossible to extract the figures requested for 4,306 properties in time for this meeting.

Q.—(c) The names of purchasers? Q.—(e) The number of cases in which the properties themselves were sold and purchased by the Council and by outsiders respectively? A.—The Council purchased 4,305 of the properties. The sale was cancelled or the properties were retransferred to the owners in every case, except 26. In these 26 cases there are disputes among the claimants. Mr. J. G. Fernando purchased one property.

Q.—(d) The number of cases in which the rents and properties were sold and purchased by outsiders? A.—Rent and profits were purchased by outsiders in 11 cases, never by the Council.

Q.—(f) The number of cases in which more than one property were sold, on one and the same date, for non-payment of rates belonging to one and the same owner, according to the assessment register or registers? Q.—(g) The number of cases in which the proceeds of the first sale were enough to pay the arrears of other property or properties belonged to one and the same owner, without recourse to selling the other properties of the same owner? A.—To answer these questions it would be necessary to examine, not only the assessment books, but the 4,306 files relating to the properties sold. This cannot be done as most of the old files are no longer available.

Q.—(2) Does the Chairman aware of any case in which the Council's Officers have also sold a second property (after the sale of the first property) of which the same name of the owner appears in the assessment registers, and realization of a certain sum of money enough to cover the arrears of rates and other expenses due for the first and second properties sold? A.—No. The Council's bid is only just sufficient to cover the rates due on each property.

Q.—(3) Does the Chairman aware that the Municipal Treasurer insists as a condition precedent the payment of all arrears of rates which are often more than one quarter, to stop, suspend the confirmation or cancellation of, a sale of a property, which has been seized and sold for one quarter rates? A.—Yes: this is known to have been the practice for at least the last 12 years.

Q.—(4) Is not this practice of demanding the payment of all the other arrears for which there were no seizure and no warrant issued to stop the sale of the property which has been seized and sold for non-payment of one quarter rates, is invalid, unjust and causing lot of hardship, including the loss of the property by the sale? A.—As warrants for seizure are issued for the subsequent arrears, and as no one has as yet lost any property for non-payment of rates due since 1925, the Chairman does not consider the procedure either invalid or unjust or causing a lot of hardship or involving the loss of property.

3. Pursuant to notice, the Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader moved—(1) That this Council recommends to the Chairman—(a) That if more than one property belonging to one and the same owner are advertised for sale for non-payment of rates and if by the sale of one property a sum of money is realized to cover the rates and all expenses of all the properties, the other property or properties of one and the same owner should not be sold. (b) That in such cases the Municipal Treasurer should be given instructions to ascertain the facts relating to each case before and after such sale to save properties of ratepayers. Dr. S. Muttiah seconded.

The Hon. Mr. R. L. Pereira suggested that a proviso be added to the effect that the approval of the owner of the property should first be obtained.

The Chairman suggested that the matter be referred to the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects for consideration.

Mr. S. W. R. Dias Bandaranaike moved, as an amendment, that the matter be referred to the Law Committee with the addition of the Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader. Mr. T. G. Jayawardene seconded. The amendment was put to the meeting and carried.

The following motion stood in the name of the Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader :—3. (2) That this Council recommends to the Chairman that instructions should be given to the Municipal Treasurer not to demand all arrears of rates for which no warrants have been issued as a condition precedent to stop or cancel a sale for non-payment of rates or rates.

With the permission of Council, the Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader moved that the matter be referred to the Law Committee, with the addition of the mover. The Hon. Mr. R. L. Pereira seconded.—Carried.

4. Pursuant to notice, the Chairman moved—That the Council should resolve itself into a Committee of the whole Council to consider the following extracts from the proceedings of the Committees annexed to the agenda. The Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried.

Council in Committee.

The following Extract from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of February 18, 1931, was considered.

MUNICIPAL ENGINEER'S DEPARTMENT.

(4) To consider—(a) The petition, presented through Dr. E. A. Coorey, praying that the running of huge buses on Kanatta-Narahenpitiya roads be prohibited. (b) The petition received praying that the bus service be not prohibited. Registered No. 154. (Dr. E. A. Coorey was present when this question was considered).—Recommended that His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council be requested to make the following regulation, under section 58 of the Motor Car Ordinance, 1927 :—

Regulation referred to.—The use by motor omnibuses of the following highway within the Municipal limits of Colombo is prohibited :—Narahenpitiya road, between its junction with Thimbirigasyaya road and the Kirillapone canal.

Resolution of Council of March 4, 1931.

Dr. E. V. Ratnam moved that the consideration of the matter be deferred for the next meeting of Council and that meanwhile the papers be circulated. Mr. T. G. Jayawardene seconded.—Carried.

Resolution of Council in Committee.

Mr. M. L. M. Reyal wished to know on what ground the Works Committee made its recommendation prohibiting the running buses on this section of road. The Chairman explained facts.

Mr. M. L. M. Reyal moved that the matter be deferred to the Four Standing Committees (meeting together) for reconsideration. Mr. T. G. Jayewardene seconded.

Dr. E. A. Coorey stated that he was opposed to allowing any buses to run on this section of road. The motion was put to the meeting and carried.

Collett. *Noes*.—(1) The Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader, (2) Dr. E. V. Ratnam, (3) The Hon. Mr. R. L. Pereira, (4) Mr. T. G. Jayewardene, (5) Mr. M. L. M. Reyal, (6) Mr. F. Dadabhoy, (7) Mr. W. J. Thornhill. (Dr. L. A. Prins declined to vote.)

(6) To select from the applicants and submit to the Council the names of three candidates for the post of Grade III Engineer, indicating, if the Committees think fit, the candidate whom they recommend the Council to appoint. Registered No. 218.

Resolved that the following names be submitted to Council :—(1) Mr. R. Kumaranayagam, B. Sc. 1st Class Hons. in Engineering Civil and Municipal. (2) Mr. P. Vitarana, B. Sc. Engineering (London).—with the recommendation that Mr. R. Kumaranayagam be appointed.

(7) To consider the recommendations of the Drainage Engineer that the tenders of (1) Mr. M. H. N. Marikar of No. 44, Piachaud's lane, Maradana amounting to Rs. 1,153.05 be accepted for the aided drainage of premises No. 80 (1-6), Molawatte lane. Registered No. 02,997. (2) Messrs. Samarakone Bros., of Kinross avenue, Wellawatta, amounting to Rs. 1,490, be accepted for the aided drainage of premises No. 9, "Welida," Charlemont road, Wellawatta. Registered No. 03,217.—Recommended (1) and (2).

(8) To consider the site selected for the proposed public lavatory at Layard's Broadway. Registered No. 140.—Recommended that lavatories should first be built (1) on the south side of Silversmith street, between Vincent street and Hulsdorp street or in that area. (2) At the entrance to Chapel place.

Resolution of Council in Committee.

Mr. T. G. Jayewardene moved that the above recommendation of the Works and Finance Committees be adopted. Mr. M. L. M. Reyal seconded.

The Hon. Mr. R. L. Pereira moved, as an amendment, that the recommendation of the Sanitation Committee (item No. 7 of March 17, 1931) be adopted, and that thereafter any surplus on the vote should be utilized in providing lavatories in areas specified in the recommendation of the Works and Finance Committees. Dr. S. Muttiah seconded. The Chairman explained the facts. The amendment was put to the meeting and carried.

Fernando of Sri Wickrama road, Wellawatta, praying for (1) Compensation for damage alleged to have been caused to No. 53, Sri Wickrama road, as a result of the pumping operations carried out by the Council for laying out a soil sewer. (2) A demand for further compensation for No. 55, Sri Wickrama road, which Council on June 4, 1930, decided to acquire for Rs. 15,000. (b) The reports of the Municipal Engineer and the Municipal Treasurer thereon. Registered No. 153. (Mr. S. W. R. Dias Bandaranaike, M. M. C., through whom the petition was presented, was present when this item was considered).—Recommended :—(1) That the Council cannot accept any liability for damage alleged to have been caused to No. 53, Sri Wickrama road. (2) That the Council cannot accept any further liability for compensation for No. 55, Sri Wickrama road.

Resolution of Council in Committee.

Mr. S. W. R. Dias Bandaranaike moved that the matter be referred to the Four Standing Committees (meeting together) for re-consideration. Dr. E. A. Coorey seconded.—Carried.

(10) To consider plans and a detailed estimate of Rs. 34,000 from the Municipal Engineer (supported by the Municipal Treasurer) for the opening of a 30 feet width carriageway with earth sides connecting General's Lake road to Alston place. *Note.*—Funds are provided under I. 76 "Improvement to General's Lake road" (link). Registered No. 210.—Recommended.

(11) To consider—(a) The quotations received (with samples) for the supply of 400 cubic feet of halmilla in logs not less than 12 feet in length and 38 inches in girth. (b) The recommendation of the Mechanical Engineer (supported by the Municipal Engineer and the Municipal Treasurer) that the quotation of Mr. D. S. Weerasinghe at Rs. 2:90 per cubic foot be accepted. *Note.*—The Mechanical Engineer (supported by the Municipal Engineer) in this connection states that out of the 3 samples received the lowest in price is quoted for at Rs. 2:20 and as this sample is not good he recommends the next at Rs. 2:90 quoted for by Mr. D. S. Weerasinghe. (b) A memorandum thereon of the Municipal Treasurer suggesting that each be supplied with two Peperill drill overall coats as and when required, but not annually as in the case of uniforms. *Note.*—The approximate cost of a coat is Rs. 5. The proposal will require the sanction of Council as the list already sanctioned will be affected. Registered No. 274.—Recommended.

9. Pursuance to notice, the Chairman moved that Lieut.-Colonel F. A. Ferguson, who was absent from the two previous General Meetings of Council and thereby ceasing to be a member in consequence of having failed to attend three consecutive General Meetings, be restored to office, under provisions of section 30 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910. The Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried.

Abstract.—The tea falls from a hopper into a chamber fitted with a booster fan at one end and a suction fan at the other. As it falls by gravitation the air current separates it and grades it according to size ; dust is carried into a collecting box or discharged through a duct.
