GRAEME THOMSON.

KNOW Ye that We, the Governor by virtue of the power vested in Us by section 85 of the Ordinance No. 17 of 1869, intituled "An Ordinance for the General Regulation of Customs in the Island of Ceylon," do by this Our Proclamation appoint the following places, namely, Colombo, Negombo, and Beruwala in the Western Province; Galle and Hambantota in the Southern Province; Batticaloa and Trincomalee in the Eastern Province; Jaffna, Kankasanturai, Point Pedro, Kayts, Valvettiturai, Talaimannar, Mullaittivu, and Mannar in the Northern Province; and Kalpitiya in the North-Western Province, to be ports in this Island, and declare their respective limits to be those set out in the schedule hereto, and We do further appoint the places set out in the said schedule to be legal quays within

such limits for the lading and unlading of goods, and declare the bounds and extent of such quays to be as set out in the said schedule for the said ports respectively of Colombo, Negombo, Beruwala, Galle, Hambantota, Batticaloa, Trincomalee, Jaffna, Kankasanturai, Point Pedro, Kayts, Valvettiturai, Talaimannar, Mullaittivu, Mannar, and Kalpitiya.

Proclamations dated October 4, 1878, November 25, 1879, June 15, 1892, November 27, 1909, September 3, 1910, July 16, 1917, February 19, 1920, February 2, 1923, October 3, 1926, February 6, 1928, October 9, 1929, and July 17, 1930, are hereby cancelled.

Schedule.

COLOMBO.

Limits.

The area included within the Municipal limits for the time being of the town of Colombo, together with the Oil Installation Depot at Kolonnawa, and the water area within the following limits:—

To the north a line drawn due west from a point on the beach 1 geographical mile north of Mutwal point to a distance of 3 geographical miles.

To the south a line drawn due west from a point on the beach 1 geographical mile south of the Flagstaff to a distance of 3 geographical miles.

To the west a line connecting the western ends of the above-named north and south limits.

To the east the shore contained between the north and south limits.

Legal Quays.

All quays and jetties on the harbour forefront between the root of the South-west Breakwater on the west and the root of the North-east Breakwater on the north-east.

All quays of the Lake to Harbour Canal.

NEGOMBO.

Limits.

To the north a line drawn due west from a point on the beach 2 geographical miles north of the court-house to the distance of 3 geographical miles.

To the south a line drawn due west from a point on the beach 1 geographical mile south of Negombo point to a distance of 3 geographical miles.

To the west a line connecting the western ends of the north and south limits.

To the east the shore contained between the north and south limits.

Legal Quays.

All quays and jetties and (a) the foreshore bounded by Customs road, Munnakkara island, and Kutiduwa.

(b) The foreshore on the preventive station, bounded by Kutiduwa, Esplanade road, and Public Works Department Office.

(c) The landing places at Grandpass, Tharakully, Piti-pane, Kutiduwa, Munnakkara, Duwa, Grand street, and Sea street, under special sufferance granted by the Sub-Collector.

BERUWALA.

Limits.

To the north a line due west from Nautukanda on the beach at Maggona to a distance of 2 geographical miles.

To the south a line drawn from Karawalagala point to Crow island.

To the east a line connecting the coast line Karawalagala point with the Customs, and the Customs with Nautukanda along the beach.

To the west a line from Crow island to meet the northern boundary at its western end.

Legal Quays.

All quays and jetties and the parapet wall opposite the Customs warehouse extending 160 feet between the eastern and western boundary walls.

GALLE.

Limits.

The Municipal limits for the time being of the town of Galle and seawards the following limits:—

To the east a line drawn from Unawatuna point on the seashore to a distance of 3 geographical miles southwards.

To the west a line drawn from Gindura point to a distance of 3 geographical miles southwards.

To the south a line connecting the southern ends of the above-named eastern and western limits.

To the north the shore between the eastern and western limits.

Legal Quays.

The foreshore from the Master Attendant's boatshed westwards along the road to a distance of 480 feet up to the Barrier Gate.

HAMBANTOTA.

Limits.

The Hambantota bay from Hambantota point on the west to Gurugodella point on the east, within a radius of 2 miles from the line of coast.

Legal Quays.

The foreshore from the jetty eastward a distance of 450 feet.

BATTICALOA.

Limits.

To the north-west a line drawn north-east to a distance of 2½ nautical miles from a point on the seabeach 1½ nautical miles to the north-west of the flagstaff.

To the south-east a line drawn north-east to a distance of 2 nautical miles from a point on the seabeach 1½ nautical miles to the south-east of the flagstaff.

To the north-east a line connecting the eastern ends of the north-west and south-east limits.

To the south-west the seabeach contained between the north-west and south-east limits, and also the Batticaloa lake from its mouth to the south end of Pulyantivu.

Legal Quays.

The Customs Jetty at Pulyantivu and the Customs Jetty at Batticaloa Bar.

TRINCOMALEE.

Limits.

The Inner Harbour and Back Bay, Outer Bay, Tangle-gam Lake, and China Bay and shall extend seaward to a line drawn from Foul Point to Elizabeth Point.

Legal Quays.

Inner Harbour a distance of 488 feet on the east of the Customs Jetty and 1,100 feet on the west of it.

Back Bay a distance of 270 feet along the foreshore opposite to the Back Bay Customs extending from the petroleum store to the first lane on the north side of the Northern Warehouse.

China Bay a distance of 870 feet on the north of the Customs Jetty and 450 feet on the south of it.

The Wharves within the limits of the wall of the Royal Naval Yard.

The Wharves within the limits of the wall of the Royal Naval Armament Depot (also known as Puget's Wharf).

The pier and foreshore enclosed by the railings of the Naval Oil fuel installation at China Bay.

JAFFNA.

Limits.

To the north the coast line between the south-west bastion of Jaffna Fort and Kalmunai point.

To the east a line drawn due south from Kalmunai point to the point of intersection of the south limit.

To the west a line drawn due south from the south-west bastion of Jaffna Fort to Mandaitivu.

To the south a line drawn due west through the north point of Palaitivu from the east limit to Mandaitivu, and the shore of Mandaitivu from that point to the western limit.

Legal Quays.

The quay shall extend for 1,413 feet from the 4th Cross street east of the Custom-house to the Customs watch-hut west of the Custom-house, viz. :—

On the east from the 3rd Cross street to the drain opposite the 4th Cross street and 125 feet south of the road, and on the west from the 3rd Cross street all that land south of the Beach road extending to the Customs watch-hut south of the Esplanade road, including the jetty and excluding all portions of the roads and the railway line.

KANKESANTURAI.

Limits.

The limits shall extend from a point on the beach 1 mile east of the Custom-house to a point on the beach 2 miles west of it and seaward to 3 miles.

Legal Quays.

The whole of the space within the old Fort walls, excluding the road past the Custom-house.

POINT PEDRO.

Limits.

The limits shall extend from Point Palmyra on the west to Mukenturai on the east and seaward to 3 miles.

Legal Quays.

The whole of the beach extending from the ramp at the Custom-house, 643 feet west and 264 feet east.

KAYTS.

Limits.

To the west a line drawn from Urundaimunai in Velanai island to the west of Fort Hammanheil, and thence to the south-west point of Karaitivu.

To the east a line drawn north from Viraddemunai in Velanai island to Karaitivu.

Legal Quays.

On the Velanai shore, from the minor road leading to the beach on the west to the lane on the east of the old burying ground and bazaar, in length 1,056 feet, excluding jetty and road.

On the Karaitivu shore, 368 feet on the east of the jetty and 260 feet on the west of it.

VALVETTITURAI.

Limits.

On the east a line drawn ¼ a mile to seaward from the eastern boundary of the resthouse or Chultry at Oorany Maddoo.

On the west a line drawn ¼ a mile to seaward from the western boundary of the American Mission premises at Oorikadoo.

Legal Quays.

The whole of the ground in front of the Government buildings at Valvettiturai, 460 feet in length, as shown in a survey plan, copy of which is filed in the Custom-houses of Jaffna and Valvettiturai; bounded on the east by a line drawn to the sea from the eastern side of a lane, on the east of the Health Officer's residence, and on the west by a line drawn to the sea from the western side of the road leading to the beach from the main road.

TALAIMANNAR.

Limits.

To the east a line drawn from a point on the seashore 2 miles east of the railway pier to a distance of 3 geographical miles northwards and 1 mile southwards.

To the west a line drawn from a point on the seashore 2 miles west of the railway pier to a distance of 3 geographical miles northwards and 1 mile southwards.

To the north a line connecting the northern ends of the above-named eastern and western limits.

To the south a line connecting the southern ends of the above-named eastern and western limits.

Legal Quays.

The quays and jetties and seashore within the limits of the port.

MULLAITTIVU.

Limits.

From Vettuvaykal-aar on the north to the fishing villages of Sidavatte on the south and seaward to 3 miles.

Legal Quays.

The foreshore from the road at Kovil-Kudiyiruppu on the north to Periathampimadam on the south.

MANNAR.

Limits.

From the western limit of Jawakadu to the northern limit of Vankalai and seaward between these points to 3 miles on the south side, and on the north side from San Pedro, in a line east by south to the main land and seaward of this line to 3 miles, and all the navigable channels and flats between these limits.

Legal Quays.

The foreshore from the jetty to the causeway on the west and to Ponthaipiddy on the east.

KALPITIYA.**Limits.**

To the west the foreshore of the lake between the fish market 200 yards from the Custom-house on the north to the woodapple tree at Sack street 196 yards from the Custom-house on the south.

To the south a line drawn due west of the said woodapple tree to a distance of 3 geographical miles.

To the north a line drawn due west of the fish market to a distance of 3 geographical miles.

To the east a line connecting the ends of the north and south limits.

Legal Quays.

The foreshore extending 396 yards distance between the fish market on the north and the woodapple tree on the south.

"THE EDUCATION ORDINANCE, No. 1 OF 1920."

BY-LAWS made by the Kurunegala Urban Education District Committee, under section 25 (1) of the above-named Ordinance, approved by the Board of Education, and confirmed by the Governor in Executive Council.

By-Laws.

1. The committee shall meet ordinarily at the Kurunegala Kachcheri or any other place provided by the Chairman once every two months on such dates as the committee shall decide upon.
2. The Chairman may at any time summon a meeting of the committee, and on a requisition signed by any three members he shall summon a meeting of the committee. The requisition shall state the object for which the meeting is required to be summoned.
3. Notice of the business to be transacted at meetings, whether ordinary or special, shall be served on each member at least three days—exclusive of Sundays and Public Holidays—before each meeting.
4. The Chairman shall preside at each meeting, but in his absence from any meeting the members of the committee present shall choose one of their number to be Chairman of such meeting.
5. The Chairman, or in his absence the member presiding, shall maintain order, and his decision on all points of order in dispute shall be final and conclusive.
6. A record of the proceedings of meetings shall be kept in a book and copies of such record circulated among members immediately after the meeting.

II.—EDUCATION OF CHILDREN.

7. *Definitions.*—In these by-laws the following terms shall have the meanings assigned to them unless there be something repugnant in the subject or context :—
The term "boy," "girl," and "child" shall mean a boy or a girl or a child residing in the area described in Schedule A hereto.

The term "attendance" means an attendance for the period defined by the Code as constituting a full attendance recorded in an Attendance Register in the manner prescribed by the Code.

The term "school" shall mean a school established or recognized as such by regulations under section 10 of "The Education Ordinance, No. 1 of 1920," and shall include the schools specified in Schedule B hereto and any that may hereafter be established or recognized by regulation under the said section.

8. *Children to attend School.*—The parent of every boy not less than 6 nor more than 14 years of age, and the parent of every girl not less than 6 nor more than 12 years of age, or in the case of Muslim and Tamil girls not less than 6 nor more than 10 years of age shall cause such boy or girl to attend school unless he has made other adequate and suitable provision for the education of such boy or girl or unless there is a reasonable excuse for non-attendance. Provided that, in the case of girls, their attendance shall not be compulsory, unless a separate female teacher is provided. Provided further that no boy under 8 years of age and no girl shall be compelled to attend a school more than $\frac{1}{2}$ mile distant from his or her residence and that no boy over 8 years of age shall be compelled to attend a school more than 2 miles distant from his residence. And, provided always that when a child between 10 and 14 years of age, being beneficially employed to the satisfaction of the Chairman, Urban Education District Committee, has received a certificate from an Inspector of Schools that he or she has passed in Reading, Writing, and Arithmetic the Fourth Standard prescribed by the Code for the time being, he or she shall not be required to attend a school.

9. *Time of Attendance.*—The time during which every child shall attend school shall be the whole time for which the school shall be open for the instruction of children of similar age. Provided that no child below Standard II. will be required to work for more than 3 hours a day.

10. It shall not be required as a condition of any child being admitted into or continuing in a "school" that he shall attend or abstain from attending any Sunday school or any place of religious worship, or that he shall attend any religious observance or any instruction in religious subjects in the school or elsewhere, for which observance or instruction he may be withdrawn by his parents or guardian, or that he shall attend the school on any day exclusively set apart for religious observance by the religious body to which the parent belongs.

11. For the purpose of ascertaining the number of children from the age of 6 to 14 resident within the limits of the Urban District Council, it shall be lawful for the committee to cause schedules to be served on householders within the said area requiring each of them to fill or furnish information for the purpose of filling up of the said schedule with the name, nationality, sex, and age of every child in his or her house, together with the names of the child's parents and the name and situation of any school which the child attends and to return the said schedule with full particulars of all the information required within a period of 15 days from the date of service of such schedule.

12. Every parent who shall not observe, or shall neglect or violate these by-laws or any of them shall, upon conviction, be liable to a fine not exceeding Rs. 5 and an additional fine not exceeding Re. 1 per day in case of a continuing offence.

13. No school shall be kept open for the purpose of giving instruction to pupils for more than 6 hours a day including intervals for meals, &c. The hour at which the school work should commence may be left to the discretion of the Managers or Headmasters, but no school should open earlier than 8 A.M. or later than 10 A.M. The school time table should be approved by the Inspector of Schools.

14. No school shall, except with the permission of the Divisional or District Inspector of Schools, be kept open for school work on more than 5 days a week or less than 180 days a year.

15. Efficient provision has been made for elementary education within the area whose limits are specified in Schedule A hereto:—

“THE EXCISE ORDINANCE, No. 8 OF 1912.”

Excise Notification No. 221.

THE following rules made by the Governor in Executive Council, under section 31 of “The Excise Ordinance, No. 8 of 1912,” are hereby declared by the Governor in Executive Council by virtue and in exercise of the powers conferred by the proviso to section 31 (1) of the aforesaid Ordinance to be in force from May 29, 1931.

The Local Option Rules, 1928 (Excise Notification No. 146 published in *Gazette* No. 7,478 of August 14, 1925, as amended by Excise Notification No. 180 published in *Gazette* No. 7,661 of August 31, 1928, Excise Notification No. 194 published in *Gazette* No. 7,764 of February 28, 1930, Excise Notification No. 202 published in *Gazette* No. 7,806 of September 19, 1930, and Excise Notification No. 211 published in *Gazette* No. 7,825 of January 23, 1931), are further amended as follows :—

1. Rule 10 is hereby rescinded and the following is substituted therefor :—

10. For local option polls in Colombo, the voting area shall be a ward; for polls in urban areas other than Colombo, the whole of the area administered by each Municipality, Urban District Council, Local Board, or Board of Improvement shall be the voting area.

Provided that when the population of the area administered by any Municipality, Urban District Council, Local Board, or Board of Improvement, according to the latest census report exceeds 10,000, the Excise Advisory Board may divide such area into two or more portions so that no portion may contain more than 10,000

or less than 5,000 inhabitants. Each such portion shall be a separate voting area for polls for the grant, abolition, or regrant of any ballotable licence within such portion.

For the purpose of these rules the term "urban area" shall mean an area administered by a Municipality, Urban District Council, Local Board, or Board of Improvement.

2. Rule 11 is hereby rescinded and the following is substituted therefor:—

11. In rural areas the voting area shall be, in the case of a single tavern, hotel, or place licensed to sell beer or porter, as nearly as practicable the whole area within a radius of two miles from the licensed premises in question. Where the circumference of the resultant circle cuts a village into two parts, the whole of such village shall be excluded unless more than half of it falls within the said circumference; but where in any area there is more than one tavern, hotel, or place licensed to sell beer or porter, provided no two of them are more than one mile apart from each other, the voting area for all such taverns, hotels, or places shall be one and the same, but the circle comprising such voting area shall have its centre at as central a point as possible.

For the purposes of these rules the term "rural area" shall include any area which is not an "urban area."

3. Rule 12 is hereby rescinded and the following is substituted therefor—

12. Provided that—

(i.) No part of an urban area shall be included in the voting area for polls for the grant, abolition, or regrant of any licence in a rural area or in any other urban area, and that no part of a rural area shall be included in the voting area for polls for the grant, abolition, or regrant of any licence in an urban area.

(ii.) When the area as determined under rule 11 includes a portion of an adjacent revenue district such portion shall be excluded from the voting area.

(iii.) In exceptional cases, when a voting area as defined by rule 11 is divided into two parts by a large unbridged river or other permanent geographical feature which makes inter-communication between the two parts difficult, the Excise Advisory Board may exclude from the voting area that part which does not contain the licensed premises in respect of which the poll is held.

4. Rule 13 is hereby amended by the addition of the words "in accordance with the provisions of rules 10, 11, and 12" immediately after the words "the exact boundaries of any area."

4. A Money order for Rs. 10 for each lot payable to the Divisional Forest Officer should accompany each offer. 4. To report the purchase on behalf of the Council of No. 68 B, Ettiligoda, sold for default in the payment of rates for the 3rd quarter, 1930.—Resolved that the owner be allowed another fortnight in which to pay the arrears.

5. To consider tenders for building a drain along Front Cross street:—(1) Six tenders were received. (2) Resolved that the tender of A. J. Perera Rs. 891.75, being the lowest, be accepted, provided he undertakes to complete the work within two months of the date of signing the agreement. Failing him, that the tender of No. 6 be accepted.

The following extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committees on Municipal Works, and Finance and Assessment of March 28, 1931, were laid before the Council:—

(2) To consider the following estimates:—(a) Rs. 700 for repairing buildings in the Infectious Diseases Hospital.—Recommended that repairs to the roofs of the buildings be carried out, the other items to be considered with the question of improvements recommended by the Medical Officer of Health. (b) Rs. 3,500 for the maintenance of the Hiyare Service road.—Recommended by 3 against 1. (c) Rs. 700 for raising to surface level 25 manholes of the Fort sewers.—(1) Recommended, (2) resolved that two of the covers should be of cement concrete, as an experiment. (d) Rs. 540 for 6 weedings of the catchment area of Bikke.—Recommended; the work to be carried out on contract. (e) Rs. 600 for 6 weedings of the circuit of Hiyare Reservoir within one chain of the margin.—Recommended; the work to be carried out on contract. (f) Rs. 425 for opening a back lane from Fish market street to Sea street.—Recommended. (g) Rs. 700 for repairing drains along portions of Middle street and Rampart street.—Recommended that the estimate be reduced to Rs. 685 and that the curbs be carried out in cement mortar at Rs. 50 per cube. (h) Rs. 500 for repairs to the covered drains along Middle street.—Recommended that the estimate be reduced to Rs. 495. (i) Rs. 350 for repairing drains along Talbot Town Middle street.—Recommended; the curbs to be carried out in cement mortar. (j) Rs. 800 for repairing drains along Havelock road.—Recommended; all curbs to be carried out in cement mortar instead of lime mortar. (k) Rs. 300 for repairing drains along Havelock lane.—Recommended. (l) Rs. 275 for re-building a culvert along Wakwella road.—Recommended.

(3) To consider in detail road maintenance estimates for 1931.—Recommended (i.) that the following items be amended:—(a) Rs. 1,000 for Kumbalwella, cut out; (b) Kitulampitiya road, reduced to 10 feet width, estimate reduced; (c) Bope road, estimate reduced; (d) Hume road, estimate reduced; (e) Kong tree road, estimate reduced; (f) Steele road, Rs. 2,050 omit and recast; (g) Market roads, Rs. 2,300 omit and recast; (h) Elliott road, Rs. 1,500 omit; (i) Overseerage, reduced by 25 per cent. (ii.) That a second coat of tar is necessary on the roads which have been tarred once. (iii.) That particulars be obtained re cost of tar plant. (iv.) That contract rates be obtained for supply of tar.

(4) To consider 7 applications for water service.—Recommended.

Resolution.

With regard to item (2) (b) Mr. T. Amarasuriya moved that the estimate be referred back to the Standing Committee for reconsideration. Mr. J. E. Perera seconded, but said he would have no objection to the item if the Provincial Engineer approved of the estimate after an inspection of the road.

Mr. P. R. Gunasekera supported the motion.

Mr. A. J. R. Scharenguivel said the quantity of metal estimated for was not excessive, but that he would inspect the road and report.

The Chairman explained that the estimate was for improvement, not entirely maintenance.

The mover in replying said that if the road is to be improved it should have a proper foundation.

The motion was put to the meeting and carried.

With regard to item (3) (h) Mr. P. R. Gunasekera asked why the estimate for Elliot road was omitted. The Chairman explained that it was not an item of road maintenance, but that the work should be estimated for under a separate heading, if required.

The recommendations of the Standing Committee with regard to the remaining items were adopted.

7.—*Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment of March 28, 1931.*

(2) List of demolished buildings in Ward 4 E, 5, and 5 A.—Recommended that the rates be struck off.

(3) To re-vest in the Crown lots 2, 3, 4, 5, 11, and 13 in preliminary plan 11,139, which were acquired by the Council and paid for, for opening conservancy lanes, but never taken over in full.—Recommended that they should be re-vested in the Crown.

(4) Application for a reduction of rent from the tenants of Council's boutiques in the Fish market.—Recommended that the rent be reduced to Rs. 25 per mensem from April 1, 1931.

Resolution.

Resolved that the above recommendations of the Standing Committee be adopted.

8. To submit the report of the Retrenchment Committee:—

The Chairman moved Council into Committee to consider the report.

Council in Committee—The Chairman said the only way to consider the report would be paragraph by paragraph.

Paragraph 1.—The recommendation was agreed to, provided that the age limit is not to apply to officers already in the service of the Council.

The Chairman stressed the advantage of having a whole-time Chairman.

At this stage Mr. H. M. Macan Markar moved that the consideration of the report be deferred until the next meeting, so that members may have more time to study it. This was agreed to.

When Council resumed the Chairman moved that the consideration of the report of the Retrenchment Committee be deferred until the next General Meeting of the Council.—Carried.

MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on April 18, 1931, at 8.30 a.m., in accordance with notice dated April 15, 1931.

Present :—Mr. R. H. Whitehorn, Chairman; Ratwatte Adigar; Mr. Geo. E. de Silva; Dr. G. P. Hay; Mr. Haj. M. S. Usoof Ismail; Mr. S. A. Wijayatilake; Dr. W. E. de Silva; Mr. H. P. G. Young.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on March 21, 1931, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and a copy thereof, furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted :—

- (a) Statement of receipts and disbursements from close of 1930 to February, 1931, on account of the Municipal Fund.
- (b) Progress report of works brought up to the same date.
- (c) Health Officer's report for March, 1931.
- (d) Statement of cases instituted by the several Inspectors and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of March, 1931.
- (e) The reservoir readings for March, 1931.

Resolved that the statement (a) together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 83 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table :—Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, standpipes, and house service taps inspected during March, 1931.

4. Correspondence :—(1) Letter dated April 1, 1931, from the elected Members of the Council requesting that no action be taken on the notice served on the tea-kiosk keepers in the market grounds to give up their business by March 31, 1931, in terms of the resolution passed by the Council in November, 1930, pending the full discussion of the matter at the meeting of the Council on April 18, 1931.—Tabled.

Mr. Geo. E. de Silva moved—“That the tea-kiosk keepers in the temporary boutiques of the Market grounds be allowed an extension of time to carry on the tea-kiosk business till the end of this year.” Mr. S. A. Wijayatilake seconded. Ratwatte Adigar supported the resolution.

The Chairman put the resolution to the house, and it was defeated by his casting vote.

The voting was as follows :—

As :—J. C. Ratwatte Adigar, Mr. Geo. E. de Silva, Mr. S. A. Wijayatilake, Mr. Haji M. S. Usoof Ismail.

Against :—Dr. G. P. Hay, Mr. H. P. G. Young, Dr. W. E. de Silva, the Chairman.

Letter No. B. M. K. 1 (e) of April 8, 1931, from the Provincial Engineer, Central Province (North), Kandy, at Estimate No. D 804 of April 7, 1931, for Rs. 700 for the maintenance of the Temporary Infectious Diseases Hospital, Kandy, during the current financial year, has been sanctioned by the Government, and asking that Rs. 350 be allocated to the Director of Public Works, as the Council's contribution towards the maintenance of the Hospital.—

Resolved that a supplementary vote of Rs. 50 be allowed, in addition to the Rs. 300 provided in the Budget for the year, to make up the balance of the sum applied for.

The following motion stood in Mr. de Silva's name :—“That the present rates levied by this Council under the following headings—Consolidated Rates, Conservancy, Light, Police, be reduced by 2 per cent. during the next financial year and that the Chairman be requested to effect retrenchment in the various Departments in order to meet the present crisis.”

Mr. de Silva obtained the leave of the Council to defer the introduction of this motion for the next meeting of the Council. He understood that the Chairman would be submitting a report to the Council shortly, on his investigations into the various Departmental objections.

Mr. de Silva also desired the Chairman to investigate, in the same connection, the possibility of adopting a general percentage for the reduction of assessment values, in consideration of the fact that house rents in the town had fallen owing to the prevailing depression.

Papers *re* the giving of the conservancy and scavenging services on contract.—Tabled.

Resolved that a meeting of the Special Committee be called to consider this matter.

Resolved to approve the adoption of Colombo Municipal Regulation 14 relating to Waterworks under which the service of the street main up to and including the stop tap becomes the property of the Municipal Council.

Resolved that the regulation be adopted with necessary amendments making it applicable to the Kandy Municipality.

Recommendations of Standing Committees :—

From the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects held on March 21, 1931.

Letter dated March 12, 1931, from the Principal, Trinity College, stating that it is out of the question for the College to give up one of the three playing plots at the College for the use of another school.—Recommended that the Principal of the College be informed that one of the plots be given up with effect from July 1, 1931.

Memorandum dated February 20, 1931, from the Council's Lawyer on the subject of the Council's claim against Mr. A. Fernando, and his counter claim.—Recommended that the claims be set against each other, if the Administration consents to withdraw the action against the Council altogether, as suggested by the Council's Lawyer.

From the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation held on March 21, 1931.

Resolved to allocate Rs. 60 from the Medical Officer of Health for procuring 500 copies of Type-plan for dry earth for the purpose of the health department.—Recommended.

Application from Mr. D. J. Wikremasinghe for permission to convert the existing building at premises No. 19c, Market Street, into a milk room and dairy for two cows.—Recommended.

Application dated February 17, 1931, from Mr. K. M. Mohamadu Assen asking that his brother, Mr. K. M. Mohamadu, be registered as his partner in the business carried on in Space No. 22, Small Market.—Recommended.

Application dated January 30, 1931, from Mr. K. S. Hamidu Usoof asking for a reduction of the rent charged for the use of Space No. 9, Public Market, which is being used by him as a storeroom.—Recommended the reduction of the rent to Rs. 100 per annum.

Application dated December 23, 1930, from Mr. K. M. Haniffa asking for permission to transfer his half share of the Public Market to his co-partner, Mr. Abdul Cader, who desires to use it as a tea-kiosk. The transfer of the half share for the purpose of a tea-kiosk not recommended.

Application from Mr. K. M. Assen, the Licensee of Stall No. 84, Public Market, to transfer his half share of the stall to his brother, Mr. Abdul Careem.—Recommended.

Papers re permits for roadside stalls.

Amendments laid down by the Medical Officer of Health for the issue of permits recommended, with the amendment (c) dealing with height to read “Height not to exceed 6 feet from ground level to the hood.”

Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment held on March 21, 1931.

- (10) To sanction the refund of a further sum of Rs. 49·28 to Government in respect of grant in lieu of rates overpaid on Military Buildings.—Recommended.
- (11) To obtain a vote of Rs. 132 to meet the increment and house allowance due to Mr. L. B. Amunugama for this year consequent on his passing the Efficiency Bar Examination.—Recommended.
- (12) To sanction a vote of Rs. 120 for the purchase of a set of drain cleaning rods, with fittings, for cleaning the effluent pipe of the Septic Tank.—Recommended.
- (13) To sanction the payment of a gratuity of Rs. 162·58 to Ramen *alias* Sinniah, Cooly, Works Department, who has been condemned by a Medical Board.—Recommended.
- (14) To sanction a vote for Rs. 71·10 for felling 237 dadap trees in the catchment area of the reservoir.—Recommended.
- (15) Application dated February 18, 1931, from the Supervisor of Scavenging for an advance of Rs. 500 for the purchase of a motor cycle.—Not recommended in present circumstances.

- (17) Papers *re* encroachments by the Queen's Hotel in Ward street and Trincomalee street.—Recommended to enter into a fresh lease for three years, but not to alter the amount of rent now paid, in present circumstances.
- (18) To approve the writing off of a sum of Rs. 2,540·17, representing irrecoverable consolidated rates for 1928 and 1929, in respect of vacant premises, demolished houses, &c.—Recommended.
- (19) Application from the Council's Inspectors for brass buttons and badges in place of silver ones supplied to them.—Not recommended at present.
- (20) Petition dated February 6, 1931, from traders in the Retail Rice Granaries in Jail road begging that the rent of these granaries be reduced.—Not recommended.
- (21) Quotations received from Firms in Colombo for the supply of an iron safe for the Shroff's Department.—Recommended that the matter be left in the hands of the Chairman.
- (22) Papers *re* Council's claim for Rs. 420 against Mrs. Mary R. Peiris in respect of licence duty on Motor Vehicle C 4016 for the years 1928, 1929, and 1930.—Recommended that the amount of the claim be written off.
- (23) Papers *re* temporary boutiques Nos. 33 and 42.—Proposals made by the Accountant in his memo. of March 18, 1931, recommended, but the Committee desires to have a report on the question of arrears accrued.

- (26) Estimate for Rs. 702·63 from the Municipal Engineer for building the drain by the public well in Madawela road.—Recommended. The work to be put in hand at once.
- (27) Papers *re* the proposal to purchase a new eight-day clock to replace the old town clock on the turret of St. Paul's Church.—Not recommended.
- (28) Application dated October 18, 1930, from Mr. M. A. S. T. Selliah for an independent water service to premises No. 15, Trincomalee street.—Separate connection recommended.
- (29) Chairman's memo. dated March 23, 1931, regarding proposals for the lease of a portion of the Catchment area of the reservoir for cultivation or building.—Not recommended. The right to collect the produce only to be leased as heretofore.

Recommended that Blocks I, J, E, and F should be exempted from this requirement.
- (32) Application from Surambapannikaya to build a kitchen at premises No. 13, Nittawela.—Recommended to insist on windows in the kitchen only.

- (36) Draft form of application to be filled in by a person applying for the supply of electrical energy, and draft agreement forms proposed to be entered into with prospective consumers of electrical energy for prompt payment of charges before fittings and installation work is undertaken in premises.—Recommended.
- (37) To sanction excess of expenditure over the estimates in respect of certain Electricity Department votes amounting to Rs. 993·80.—Recommended.
- (38) Papers *re* the Council's claim of Rs. 437·71 against Messrs. M. M. P. R. Servai & Co., for electric current consumed at premises No. 21, Colombo street.—Recommended that the sum of Rs. 250 be accepted in full settlement of the claim, as advised by the Council's Lawyer.

Resolved that the recommendations be adopted.

9. Papers *re* application to effect alterations to the Queen's Hotel.

Order by His Excellency the Governor in Council.

Whereas, it is expedient that immediate relief should be granted to the Rubber and Coconut industries in Ceylon in view of the present depressed state of those industries, I, Graeme Thomson, Governor, do hereby, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, order that as from and including May 29, 1931, the Principal Collector of Customs shall cease to demand and levy the export duties on Rubber, Desiccated coconut, Fresh coconuts, Coconut oil, Copra, and Poonac payable under Ordinance 17 of 1869 or any Ordinance amending the same.

This Order shall remain in force pending a decision by the State Council as to whether action should be taken to rescind or vary such duties in accordance with the procedure prescribed by section 11 of the aforesaid Ordinance.

Nothing in this Order shall affect the collection of export duties leviable for the purposes of the Medical Wants Ordinance, No. 9 of 1912, the Coconut Research Ordinance, 1928, and the Rubber Research Ordinance, 1930.
