### AMENDMENTS REFERRED TO.

*Clause 20.*—Add a new sentence as follows: "A course of instruction up to Standard V. in the mother tongue of the pupils must be provided in each school."

Clause 30.—Insert a new clause as follows after clause 30.

" Clause 30A.—The number of teachers eligible for grant at the end of the school year shall neither be increased by any new appointments nor maintained by the appointment of any new teachers to fill a vacancy\* except under the following conditions :—

(i.) Schools which have an average attendance of not more than 90 eligible pupils for the school year will be allowed to count one teacher for every 15 units of average attendance. For the units of average attendance over 90, one teacher will be allowed for every 20 units. Fractions of over one-half the quota shall count for an additional teacher.

(ii.) In making the above calculations the following conditions will be substituted for the conditions appearing in clauses 30 (c) and 38 (a), (b), and (h) :—

(a) Schools in which there are a number of over-age pupils in the Elementary School-Leaving Certificate class, the Commercial class, or the Cambridge Senior or London Matriculation forms, will be allowed to count the attendance of these pupils for calculation of eligible staff up to ten per cent. of the average number of pupils on the roll in these classes.

(b) The attendance of the following pupils will be counted in calculating the units of average attendance :—

(i.) Pupils who are not under 5 years of age on the last day of the school year nor over 19 years of age on the first day of the school year.

(ii.) Pupils in the Infant Department who during the whole school year are not over 10 years of age.

(iii.) All pupils admitted to special classes."

Clause 49.—In the last line after "registered" insert "or employed."

Clause 50.—For the words at the end "be appointed to teach" period of three years" substitute "be employed temporarily as teachers."

Clause 51.—Add the following paragraph: "As from January 1, 1932, the words 'be provisionally registered for a period of three years' will be substituted for 'be registered as Provisionally Certificated Teachers' in line 7."

\* Special application must be made to the Director to fill a vacancy caused by the departure of a specialist teacher.

Clause 38.—Insert a new clause as follows after clause 38 :—

" Clause 38A.—The number of teachers eligible for grant at the end of the school year shall neither be increased by any new appointments nor maintained by the appointment of any new teachers to fill a vacancy\* except under the following conditions :—

*Vernacular Schools.*—Vernacular schools which have an average attendance of not more than 80 eligible pupils for the school year will be allowed to count one teacher for every 23 units of average attendance.

For the units of average attendance over 80 units, one teacher will be allowed for every 25 units of attendance for the first 100 units, and one teacher for every 30 units of the remainder.

Fractions of over one-half the quota shall count for an additional teacher.

*Bilingual (Non-boarding) Schools.*—Bilingual (non-boarding) schools which have an average attendance of not more than 100 eligible pupils for the school year will be allowed to count one teacher for every 20 units of average attendance. For the units of average attendance over 100, one teacher will be allowed for every 25 units.

The quota for English teachers included in the above staff shall be 30 units of average attendance for one full-time of part-time teacher.

Fractions of over one-half the quota shall count for an additional teacher except in the case of English teachers.

*Bilingual Girls' Boarding Schools.*—Bilingual Girls' Boarding Schools which have an average attendance of not more than 90 eligible pupils for the school year will be allowed to count one teacher for every 15 units of average attendance.

For the units of average attendance over 90, one teacher will be allowed for every 20 units.

The quota for English teachers included in the above staff shall be 30 units of average attendance for one full-time or part-time teacher.

Fractions of over one-half the quota shall count for an additional teacher except in the case of English teachers.

In making the above calculations the following conditions will be substituted for the conditions appearing in clause 52 (a) and (b) :—

The attendance of the following pupils will be counted in calculating the units of average attendance :—

(a) Pupils who are not under 5 years of age on the last day of the school year nor over 18 years of age on the first day of the school year.

(b) Pupils in the Infant Department who during the whole school year are not over 10 years of age."

Clause 36 (d).—In line 4 for the words "for every" substitute "provided there are at least." In the last sentence omit "Where the number of units of average attendance is less than 80, proportionate."

(a) Every teacher will ordinarily be required to serve at least two years in any school to which he is appointed. He will not be entitled to a refund of his travelling expenses if transferred on his own application before the expiration of that period.

(b) A teacher who is transferred on account of the necessities of the Department either before or after he has completed two years in any one school may claim a refund of his travelling expenses.

(c) No teacher will be entitled to a refund of his travelling expenses if he is transferred on account of his own misconduct or for unsatisfactory work.

(d) A teacher on first appointment is entitled to transport expenses in terms of the travelling regulations but is not entitled to subsistence allowance or incidental expenses.

The pattern of die to be used with effect from January 1, 1932, for the stamping or sealing of weights and measures under section 9 of "The Weights and Measures Ordinance, 1876," shall be one which will leave an impression of the letters "G R" above the letter "C" within a circle (the letters "G R" being above, and the letter "C" below, the diameter thereof) with the letter "A" immediately underneath the circle and parallel to the diameter drawn between the letters "G R" and "C" as illustrated in the following diagram, viz:—



2. The die shall be of any of the following 4 sizes, viz:—  
(i.) the circle in the diagram referred to in the preceding paragraph being approximately  $\frac{1}{8}$ ths of an inch;

Tenderers should satisfy themselves by inspection before tendering, as to the acreage and contents of the demarcated coupes referred to in the annexed schedule, as the figures given therein are estimated only, and their correctness is in no way guaranteed. The boundaries of each coupe will be pointed out by the Range Forest Officer, Kumburupiddy Range, Trincomalee.

8. The successful tenderer will be required to execute a purchase agreement in respect of each coupe. A copy of this agreement can be seen at the Office of the Divisional Forest Officer, Eastern Division, Batticaloa.

9. Before execution of the agreement, the purchaser will be required to pay the full purchase amount and to deposit as security for efficient and punctual fulfilment of the agreement, 5 per cent of the full purchase amount tendered by him.

10. After payment of the purchase amount, deposit of security, and execution of the agreement, the purchaser will be entitled on application to the refund of Rs. 50 deposited by him for tender form.

11. Tenderers should make separate offers, written both in words and figures, for the timber contained in each coupe described in the annexed schedule.

12. No tender will be considered unless the procedure laid down above has been strictly complied with. The Conservator of Forests reserves to himself the right, without question, of rejecting any or all tenders and of accepting any portion of a tender.

13. The special rules for felling, conversion, and removal, which the agreement will require to be observed, are specified in the special conditions advertised below. Nothing in these special conditions shall render the purchaser in any way exempt from liability for punishment, under the Forest Ordinance of 1907, should he or any of the workmen in his employ be responsible for the commission of a Forest Offence outside the boundaries of his purchase coupe or coupes.

14. Should any tender be accepted, and should the successful tenderer, after due notification, decline or fail to pay any sum or sums stipulated for and to enter into the necessary agreement within 14 days of receiving notice in writing from the Divisional Forest Officer, Eastern Division, Batticaloa, or in reasonable time, the tenderer will be held pecuniarily liable for any resultant loss to Government and his tender form deposit forfeited to the Crown. Tenders are made and received on this distinct understanding. The Conservator of Forests, however, reserves the discretionary power to waive the terms of this clause in any degree as he may consider the circumstances justify.

15. The estimated *in situ* value of the timber in the coupes is Es. 7,921.25 and any bid or offer below this figure is liable to rejection. This will however not prejudice the Conservator of Forests' right to reject any offers even though they may be above *in situ* value.

#### SPECIAL CONDITIONS.

(1) On payment of the full purchase amount the purchaser shall be entitled to fell and remove on or before March 31, 1932, in the manner specified below, all the enumerated timber contained in the purchased coupe or coupes. Any timber not removed by the date of expiry of agreement shall revert to the Crown.

(2) Should the purchaser fell or remove trees from any area of the coupe he has not paid for, or from any area of forest outside the demarcated boundaries of his coupe nothing in the agreement shall exempt him from liability to punishment for illicit felling and removal under the provisions of the Forest Ordinance, No. 16 of 1907, and of the rules framed thereunder. For the purpose of special conditions it shall be presumed that the purchaser has, previous to entering into the agreement, satisfied himself as to the position of the lines demarcating his coupe, and that the purchaser has further agreed that he shall not in the event of any dispute, put forward a plea of ignorance of the limits or extent of his coupe.

(3) The purchaser or his agent or any of his employees shall not block up the boundaries by depositing any brushwood or branches. Should the lines become blocked due to unavoidable circumstances, such lines should be at once cleared by the purchaser.

(4) The purchaser shall, not for the purpose of removing timber from his own coupe enter into any other area of forest not paid for by him, except with the permission of the Range Forest Officer, and along paths permitted by him.

(5) The purchaser or his agent or any of his employees shall not prevent any other purchaser of timber in the adjoining coupe from entering into the coupe paid for by the former, either in person or by his agent, or by his employees or from bringing in any animal for purpose of effecting easy removal of timber, provided such entry is made with the permission of the Range Forest Officer, Trincomalee, in writing.

(6) Cart notes for removal of timber must be obtained from the Forest Officer in charge of timber exploitation, in respect of all forest produce before removal of any such produce to depôts outside the area of the coupe, and any removal of any forest produce without the authority of such cart notes will be considered an infringement of this rule and punished as provided hereunder. All such cart notes must be retained to be produced before the Range Forest Officer, Trincomalee, before removal permits can be issued for removal of such produce from such depôt to any final destination. For the purpose of this clause the purchaser shall select for his purpose, with the approval of the Range Forest Officer, Trincomalee, a plot of ground outside the limits of the coupe for a depôt. The site of such depôt shall not be changed without permission.

(7) The purchaser shall agree that for each and every infringement of the above condition he shall become liable

to a fine of an amount not exceeding Rs. 100, to be imposed in writing by and at the discretion of the Divisional Forest Officer, Batticaloa, and this fine will be recovered from the tenderer's security deposit.

(8) The purchaser shall also agree that in the event of security money having become exhausted, it shall be within the discretion of the Divisional Forest Officer, either (a) to accept a further security deposit amounting to 5 per cent. of the full purchase price, or (b) to cancel the agreement and to refund the purchaser such balance of the paid purchase money, if any, as remains after deducting the value of all timber removed by the purchaser of the date of such cancellation. For the purpose of this clause the value of each cubic foot of timber removed shall be fixed at full royalty rates.

(9) The purchaser shall be allowed timber free of royalty for building cooly lines and other purposes in connection with the extraction of trees on his agreement and such material shall be taken only from the area of exploitation.

(10) The purchaser shall have the right of appeal to the Conservator of Forests in the event of an enforcement of any of the penalties specified in these conditions, and the purchaser shall agree to accept the Conservator of Forests decision as final and binding.

#### Schedule.

The area of each coupe to be exploited is one square mile block in Kanthalai Reserved Forest near the village of Pankulam in the Kumburupiddy Range. The distance of transport from the coupes to the Trincomalee Railway Station is 20 miles by Trincomalee-Anuradhapura road. The Irrigation Department is opening a road from Galmetiyawewa and the timber in the coupes can be extracted and transported to Trincomalee or Tanglegam Railway Stations by Trincomalee-Kandy road. The distance of transport by Galmetiyawewa track is 12 miles. The coupe contains approximately the following timber:—

## VITAL STATISTICS.

### Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended May 30, 1931.

**Births.**—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 150 (1 European, 10 Burghers, 91 Sinhalese, 21 Tamils, 22 Moors, 4 Malays, and 1 Other). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1931, viz., 282,870) was 27.7, as against 27.3 in the preceding week, 26.5 in the corresponding week of last year, and 33.9 the weekly average for last year.

**Deaths.**—The total deaths registered were 118 (7 Burghers, 67 Sinhalese, 19 Tamils, 20 Moors, 4 Malays, and 1 Other). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 21.8, as against 25.4 in the previous week, 26.3 in the corresponding week of last year, and 29.5 the weekly average for last year.

**Infantile Deaths.**—Of the 118 total deaths, 29 were of infants under one year of age, as against 31 in the preceding week, 27 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 32 the average for last year.

**Stillbirths.**—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 11.

**Principal Causes of Death.**—1. (a) Nineteen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 7 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), 3 in Kotahena North, 2 each in San Sebastian, Kotahena South, Slave Island, and Wellawatta South, and 1 in St. Paul's, as against 18 in the previous week, and 18 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Seventeen deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 5 in New Bazaar, 3 in Slave Island, 2 each in San Sebastian, Kotahena South, and Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), and 1 each in Pettah, St. Paul's, and Maradana South, as against 12 in the previous week, and 8 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Two deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 1 each in New Bazaar and Maradana North, as against 3 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.

2. (a) Fourteen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 7 in Maradana hospitals (including 5 deaths of non-residents), 3 in Slave Island, and 1 each in Kotahena North, New Bazaar, Maradana North, and Maradana East. The number registered during the preceding week was also 14, and the weekly average for last year was 12.

(b) Two deaths from *Phthisis* of residents of Colombo town, occurred at the Anti-Tuberculosis Hospital, Ragama, during the week.

3. (a) Three deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), as against 10 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.

(b) One death from *Enteric Fever* of a resident of Colombo town, occurred at the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Angoda, during the week.

4. Five deaths from *Debility* were registered, 3 each from *Diarrhoea* and *Accidents*, 2 each from *Enteritis*, *Infantile Convulsions*, *Worms*, and *Puerperal Septicæmia*, 1 each from *Dysentery*, *Tetanus*, and *Homicide*, and 41 from *Other Causes*.

5. **Reported Cases.**—Seven cases of *Chickenpox*, 7 of *Enteric Fever*, and 1 of *Plague* were reported during the week, as against 13, 8, and nil, respectively, of the preceding week.

**State of the Weather.**—The mean temperature of air was 81.2°, against 83.6° in the preceding week, and 83.2° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.862 in., against 29.881 in. in the preceding week, and 29.854 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 3.55 in., against 0.33 in. in the preceding week, and 1.89 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

**Infantile Deaths.**—Of the 148 total deaths, 28 were of infants under one year of age, as against 29 in the preceding week, 24 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 32 the average for last year.

**Stillbirths.**—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 10.

**Principal Causes of Death.**—1. (a) Thirty-one deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 18 in Maradana hospitals (including 8 deaths of non-residents), 4 in Kotahena South, 3 each in Kotahena North and Wellawatta South, 2 in Slave Island, and 1 in Maradana North, as against 19 in the previous week, and 18 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Fourteen deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 3 in St. Paul's, 2 each in Kotahena North, Kotahena South, and New Bazaar, and 1 each in San Sebastian, Maradana hospitals, Slave Island, Wellawatta North, and Wellawatta South, as against 17 in the previous week, and 8 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Nine deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 2 each in New Bazaar, Maradana hospitals (of non-residents), and Maradana North, and 1 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena South, and Maradana East, as against 2 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.

2. (a) Ten deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 4 in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), and 1 each in Pettah, St. Paul's, New Bazaar, Maradana North, Maradana East, and Wellawatta North, as against 14 in the previous week, and 12 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Three deaths from *Phthisis*, of residents of Colombo town occurred at the Anti-Tuberculosis hospital, Ragama, during the week.

3. (a) Four deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 2 in Maradana hospitals (of non-residents), and 1 each in Maradana East and Wellawatta South, as against 3 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.

(b) One death from *Enteric Fever* of a resident of Colombo town occurred at the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Angoda, during the week.

4. Nine deaths from *Enteritis* were registered, 7 from *Debility*, 4 each from *Infantile Convulsions* and *Accidents*, 3 from *Worms*, 2 from *Homicide*, 1 from *Tetanus*, and 50 from *Other Causes*.

WRITTEN offers are invited for the purchase of timber, firewood, &c., described in the annexed schedule.

2. Offer should be made subject to the following conditions by letter, preferably under sealed and registered cover, addressed to the Divisional Forest Officers concerned and posted or handed over personally not later than midday on Monday, July 20, 1931, the envelope being marked on the left hand top corner "Offer for Purchase of Timber, &c.", and signed by tenderer.

3. Lump sums offers should be made for each item in the schedule and be written both in words and figures. Offers may be made for more than one item in the same letter, but should be quoted for each item separately.

4. In the case of offers which in the aggregate exceed Rs. 20, tenderers may remit Rs. 5 either with their offers or within two days of their offers to the Divisional Forest Officer of the Division concerned. This sum will be returned if their offers are rejected. The purchaser will be given credit for the amount in the final payment for the timber. Where the *bona fide* of any tenderer are in the opinion of the Divisional Forest Officer or the Conservator of Forests doubtful, his tender may not be entertained unless the required money deposit is made, if and when demanded by the Divisional Forest Officer.

5. The species, measurements, cubic contents, &c., of the material appearing in the schedule are to be regarded as only approximate, and intending tenderers are presumed to have inspected the timber before they make their offers and they should bring to the notice of the Divisional Forest Officer any serious discrepancies which they may notice. They should also satisfy themselves by personal inspection as to the condition of the timber they offer for.

6. Any tenderer whose offer is accepted shall, within three days of notification of acceptance of his offer, pay the full purchase amount in the case of offers aggregating to Rs. 20 and as follows in the case of offers exceeding Rs. 25 in the aggregate :—

Over Rs. 20 up to Rs. 100, 50 per cent; and over Rs. 100, 25 per cent.; the balance being paid within a fortnight of the previous payment. In the event of failure to complete the purchase, all amounts previously paid shall be forfeited and the timber, &c., revert to the Crown, and be liable for resale at the risk of the original purchaser.

Should any successful tenderer decline or fail to pay any sum or sums as above stipulated for, he shall further be pecuniarily liable for any resultant loss to Government.

The Conservator of Forests reserves however the discretionary power to enforce, modify, or waive any of the provisions in this clause to such extent as he may consider the circumstances justify.

7. The Conservator of Forests reserves to himself the right, without question, of rejecting any or all offers and of accepting any offer.

8. All materials shall be removed by purchaser within one month of completion of purchase when a permit for removal will be issued. Extension of time will not be granted except under exceptional circumstances.

9. All materials purchased shall be at the risk of the purchaser until its removal by him on a permit.

10. The buyer, his agent, or his representative shall be liable for punishment under the Forest Ordinance for commission of any Forest Offence in the course of completing the transaction.

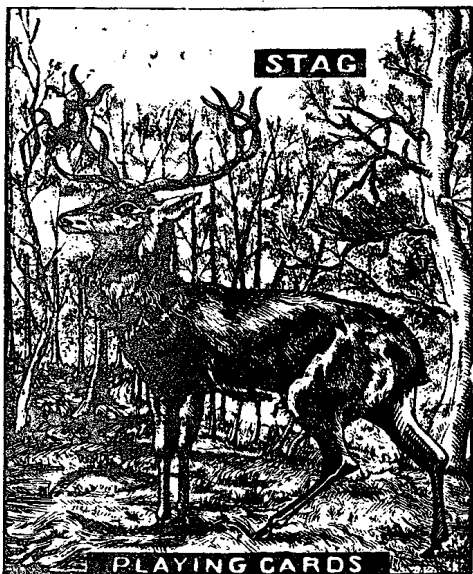
