THE CEYLON (STATE COUNCIL) ORDER IN COUNCIL, 1931.

IN the Name of His Majesty **GEORGE THE FIFTH**, by the Grace of God of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir **GRAEME THOMSON**, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon and its Dependencies.

GRAEME THOMSON.

WHEREAS by Clause (2) of Article 97 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931, it is provided that the Governor may, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, within six months after the commencement of the said Order, and provided that His Majesty's approval be previously signified to him through the Secretary of State, vary, annul, or add to any of the provisions of the said Order in order to carry out the purposes of the same:

And whereas it is desirable to make clear the powers of the Governor in relation to his assent to Bills passed by the Legislative Council and awaiting his assent at the time of the revocation of the Orders in Council of 1923 to 1930:

And whereas His Majesty's approval has been signified through the Secretary of State for the addition of the provision hereinafter contained to the provisions of the said Order:

Now know Ye that We, the Governor, do proclaim and order that it shall be lawful, and shall be deemed to have been lawful at any time after the commencement of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931, for the Governor to assent to any Bill passed by the Legislative Council notwithstanding the revocation of the Orders in Council of 1923 to 1930 and any Bill passed by the said Council which shall receive, or shall have received, the Governor's assent at any time after the commencement of the said Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931, shall be, and shall be deemed to have been from the time of such assent, of the same force and effect as though at that time the Orders in Council of 1923 to 1930 had not been revoked.

Given at Colombo in the Island of Ceylon, this Sixteenth day of June, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Thirty-one.

Local Option Rules.

Delete rules 1 (ii.) and 1 (iii.) of the Local Option Rules published in Excise Notification No. 146 in *Government Gazette* No. 7,478 of August 14, 1925, and substitute therefor the following:—

- (ii.) All male persons shall be entitled to vote who (a) have resided in the area during the 6 months immediately preceding June 30 in the year in which the list is prepared and (b) are on the register of voters for any constituency of the State Council.

WHEREAS in the schedules to Notification dated February 3, 1922, and Notification dated December 13, 1922, published in *Gazettes* Nos. 7,243 and 7,302 dated February 10, 1922, and December 22, 1922, respectively; the administrative limits of the Chilaw Urban District Council have been specified in the manner appearing in the first column of the schedule hereto :

And whereas by Order of the Governor in Executive Council dated December 14, 1925, and published in *Gazette* No. 7,504 of December 18, 1925, the limits of the said Urban District Council were varied in the manner appearing in the second column of the schedule thereto :

And whereas it is deemed expedient further to vary the said limits :

It is hereby ordered by the Governor in Executive Council, in terms of section 14 of "The Local Government Ordinance, No. 11 of 1920," that the administrative limits of the said Council shall be further varied in the manner set forth in the second column of the schedule hereto with effect from January 1, 1932.

SCHEDULE REFERRED TO.

Limits as defined in the Schedule to the Notification dated December 13, 1922.

North.—A line starting from the sea, along the eastern shore of the Chilaw lake up to the canal, and thence along the western bank of the canal up to the bridge over the canal.

North-east.—A line starting from the bridge over the canal, along the eastern side of the Wattakkaliya road, the northern boundary of lot 58702 in town plan, the path marked in town plan, thence along that path to the Puttalam road, and thence along the eastern side of Puttalam road to Lunu-odai, along Lunu-odai to lot 57311, thence along the northern and eastern boundaries of the said lot, the old gravets marked in town plan, the northern and eastern boundaries of lot 487/V 2 and the northern boundary of lot S 2, and the northern boundary of the new dhobies' tank to its eastern corner.

East.—A line along the eastern boundary of the new dhobies' tank, across Wariyapola road, along the eastern boundary of Mr. Advocate Corea's land till its south-eastern end.

South-east.—A line from the south-eastern corner of Mr. Advocate Corea's land, along its southern boundary, and along the southern boundary of Mr. De Mel's estate, eastern and southern boundaries of lot 487/U 3, eastern and southern boundaries of lot 487/5, southern boundary of lot 5/39, eastern boundaries of lots L 1230, M 1230, N 1230, southern boundaries of lots N 1230, M 1230 to Colombo road, thence along the eastern side of Colombo road to a point opposite the northern corner of lot 1079 across the road, along the northern and western boundaries of the said lot to the railway line, thence along the eastern side of the railway line to lot Y marked in town plan, thence across the railway line, along the southern boundaries of lots X and Y in the said plan, and along the southern boundaries of lot V 214 and lot W 214 to the Chilaw lake, thence along the eastern shore of the Chilaw lake to the north-west corner of lot 13233, thence a line across the lake to the north-eastern corner of lot L 1194, along the northern boundary of the said lot L 1194, along the road marked in the town plan to the north-eastern corner of lot 205394 in town plan.

South.—A line starting from the north-east corner of lot 205394, along the northern and western boundaries of the said lot 205394, southern boundaries of lots 205421 and 316, and thence a straight line starting from the north-east corner of the general cemetery along its southern boundary to the sea.

West.—The sea.

Limits as defined by this Notification.

North.—Starting from the northern extremity of lot 2 in the Chilaw Town Survey Sheet 1 6/51 3 southwards along the western edge of the lake as far as the eastern extremity of lot 1 in the Chilaw Town Survey Sheet 1 6/59 1 West, thence a line drawn due south-east across the lake to the eastern edge of the lake, thence southwards along the eastern edge of the lake until it meets the canal, thence northwards along the western bank of the canal as far as the Meti-odai bridge thence across the bridge and southwards along the eastern boundary of Wattakkaliya road and thence eastwards along the northern boundary of lot 4 in Chilaw Town Survey Sheet 1 6/59 1 East and southwards along the eastern boundary of the said lot and lot 5 in the Chilaw Town Survey Sheet 1 6/59 3 East, thence eastwards along the northern boundary of lot 1 in the Chilaw Town Survey Sheet 1 6/59 4 as far as the western extremity of the northern boundary of the Manor premises (lot 1 in the Chilaw Town Survey Sheet 1 6/59 2), thence along the northern and eastern boundaries of the said premises as far as the Puttalam road, thence eastwards along the Puttalam road as far as a point 4 chains to the east of the 51½ milepost.

East.—From the last-mentioned point southwards along the eastern boundary of title plan No. 402,253 across the railway and along the eastern boundaries of lots 16 and 25 in preliminary plan No. 6,414, thence along the southern and western boundaries of T. P. 402,253 across the railway to a point ½ a chain to the south of the Puttalam road from its centre thence south-westwards along the Puttalam road parallel to it and at a distance of ½ a chain from the centre of it as far as Lunu-odai thence eastwards along Lunu-odai and the northern and eastern boundaries of lot 5 in the Chilaw Town Survey Sheet 1 6/59 4 eastern boundaries of lots 1 and 2 in the Chilaw Town Survey Sheet 1 11/3 2 West eastern and northern boundaries of lot 3 and the eastern boundary of lot 14 in the same sheet, northern and eastern boundaries of lot 1 in the Chilaw Town Survey Sheet 1 11/3 2 East, thence westwards along the Kurunegala road and then southwards along the eastern boundary of lot 15 in the Chilaw Town Survey Sheet 1 11/3 2 West, eastern and southern boundaries of lot 8 in the Chilaw Town Survey Sheet 1 11/3 4 West, the southern boundaries of lot 10 and the general cemetery (lot 11) in the same sheet up to the Colombo road, thence southwards along the Colombo road until it meets the southern boundary of lot 14 in the Chilaw Town Survey Sheet 1 11/3 4 West, thence westwards along the southern boundary of the said lot 14 and the southern boundary of lot 151 in the Chilaw Town Survey Sheet 1 11/3 3 East until it meets the railway line, thence north-westwards along the eastern boundary of the railway until it meets the southern boundary of lot 139 in the last-mentioned sheet, thence westwards across the railway along the southern boundary of said lot and the southern boundary of lot 146 in the same sheet until it meets the lake, thence southwards along the eastern edge of the lake to a point due north-east of the north-eastern corner of lot 3 in the Chilaw Town Survey Sheet 1 11/11 3 West, thence across the lake and along the eastern boundaries of lots 3, 4, 6, 7, and 8 in the said sheet to the south-eastern corner of lot 8.

South.—From the last-mentioned point westwards along the southern boundaries of lots 8, 9, and the general cemetery (lot 5) in the Chilaw Town Survey Sheet 1 11/11 3 West up to the sea.

“THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ORDINANCE,
No. 11 of 1920.”

WHEREAS by Order in Executive Council dated February 3, 1922, and published in the *Gazette* of February 10, 1922, the Governor did constitute the Chilaw Urban District Council, the administrative limits whereof were specified in the schedule thereto:

And whereas by order of the Governor in Executive Council, under section 26 of “The Local Government Ordinance, No. 11 of 1920,” published in *Gazette* No. 7,255 of May 5, 1922, the administrative area of the said Urban District Council was divided into the electoral divisions set out in the schedule to the said order:

And whereas by order of the Governor in Executive Council under section 26 of the said Ordinance the electoral divisions of the said Urban District Council were redefined in the manner set forth in the schedule to the Notification dated December 14, 1925, appearing in *Gazette* No. 7,504 of December 18, 1925:

And whereas it is desired further to readjust and redefine the said electoral divisions:

It is hereby ordered by the Governor in Executive Council, by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 26 of the said Ordinance, that the administrative area of the said Urban District Council shall be divided into six electoral divisions, and that the limits of the said divisions shall be those set out in the schedule hereto, with effect from January 1, 1932.

MISCELLANEOUS DEPARTMENTAL NOTICES.

Regulations regarding Bonded Warehouses.

REGULATIONS regarding bonded warehouses made by the Collector for the Port of Colombo under section 57 of Ordinance No. 17 of 1869.

1. The owner of every private bonded warehouse shall provide for the use of the Collector a set of padlocks, in addition to any padlocks which he may desire to provide for himself. The keys of the padlocks provided for the use of the Collector shall be kept in his custody.

2. No one shall enter a bonded warehouse except for the purpose of transacting legitimate business. Owners of bonded goods may inspect their own goods on production of the Store Warrant or other title, but no other person shall examine such goods or make a list thereof.

3. The Locker's Register shall not be examined or referred to by any person other than an officer of Customs duly authorized in that behalf by the Principal Collector.

4. The Auditor-General or any officer duly authorized by him in writing may enter any bonded warehouse within the usual hours of business, and examine the register and other books, make a survey of the contents of the warehouse and weigh, measure, or examine any packages lying therein or the contents of such packages.

5. No one shall smoke in any part of a bonded warehouse or use any naked light therein. All lights which may be necessary shall be enclosed in lanterns or other properly protected lamps.

6. No goods shall be received into a bonded warehouse except on the production to the Locker of a warehouse entry or an advice note signed by the Landing Waiter of the Suffrance Warehouse.

7. All packages in bonded warehouses shall be arranged at the expense of the owner, according to the marks and numbers shown in the entry, and a warehousing label shall be attached to each package.

8. All the packages described in each warehousing entry shall be piled as far as possible together. If disarranged by the removal of any portion, the remaining packages shall be at once rearranged at the expense of the owner of the warehouse, or in the case of a Queen's Warehouse at the expense of the party responsible for such disarrangement.

9. Packages shall be placed at least 6 inches away from the walls, and may be placed on the ground if the floor is cemented and is dry; otherwise, they shall be placed on wooden stands or blocks of wood, in order to protect them from damage.

10. No package shall be removed from the warehouse except on the production to the Locker of a Locker's order signed by the Warehouse Keeper.

11. No duty-paid goods shall be placed or remain in a bonded warehouse. No duty-free goods shall be placed in a bonded warehouse unless they form part of the contents of packages containing dutiable goods. This regulation may be relaxed in the case of unopened packages declared merely to contain merchandise and removed under section 60A of the principal Ordinance to Bonded Warehouse No. B. 2.

12. No goods shall be removed for exportation from a warehouse outside the Customs premises except on delivery to the Warehouse-keeper of a bond under section 76 of the principal Ordinance; nor shall any such goods be removed without a shipping pass and unless they are accompanied by a Tide Waiter.

13. No goods which bear an offensive smell or which are deleterious to other goods in the vicinity or which are of an inflammable or dangerous nature shall be bonded in the same warehouse as general merchandise.

14. All goods for which a warehousing entry has been passed shall forthwith be placed inside the warehouse and no entry will be accepted in respect of goods which by reason of their size or nature cannot be placed inside the warehouse.

15. No spirits, other than those appearing in the list of brands approved by the Excise Commissioner for sale, shall be bonded in a Queen's Warehouse.

16. No public sales shall be held in any bonded warehouse.

17. The owner of every bonded warehouse shall keep such books as the Principal Collector may require, in which shall be entered particulars of all goods received in or delivered from the warehouse. Such books shall be at all times open to the inspection of the Principal Collector or any officer duly authorized by him in that behalf.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended June 13, 1931.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 160 (2 Europeans, 10 Burghers, 95 Sinhalese, 28 Tamils, 16 Moors, 2 Malays, and 7 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1931, viz., 282,870) was 29.5, as against 27.5 in the preceding week, 30.6 in the corresponding week of last year, and 33.9 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 160 (2 Europeans, 8 Burghers, 93 Sinhalese, 31 Tamils, 15 Moors, 7 Malays, and 4 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 29.5, as against 27.3 in the previous week, 28.9 in the corresponding week of last year, and 29.5 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 160 total deaths, 31 were of infants under one year of age, as against 28 in the preceding week, 29 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 32 the average for last year.

Still Births.—The number of still births registered during the week was 16.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Thirty-seven deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered—21 in Maradana hospitals (including 5 deaths of non-residents), 5 in Kotahena North, 2 each in Kotahena South, Maradana North, and Maradana East, and 1 each in St. Paul's, San Sebastian, Maradana South, Kollupitiya, and Wellawatta South—as against 31 in the previous week, and 18 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Twenty-one deaths from *Influenza* were registered—2 in Maradana hospitals, 5 in Slave Island, 4 in San Sebastian, 3 in New Bazaar, 2 each in St. Paul's and Kotahena South, 1 each in Kotahena North, Maradana South and Kollupitiya—as against 14 in the previous week and 8 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Nine deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered—3 in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), 2 each in Maradana North and Maradana South and 1 each in Kollupitiya and Wellawatta North—as against 9 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.

2. (a) Nine deaths from *Phthisis* were registered—6 in Maradana hospitals (including 4 deaths of non-residents), 2 in Slave Island and 1 in Maradana East—as against 10 in the previous week, and 12 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Three deaths from *Phthisis* of residents of Colombo town occurred at the Anti-Tuberculosis Hospital, Ragama, during the week.

3. (a) Four deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered—4 in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident)—as against 4 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.

(b) One death from *Enteric Fever* of a resident of Colombo town occurred at the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Angoda, during the week.

4. One death from suspected *Plague* of a resident of Colombo town occurred at the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Angoda, during the week. No deaths from plague were registered in the city.

5. Nine deaths from *Debility* were registered, 7 each from *Enteritis* and *Worms*, 3 from *Dysentery*, 2 each from *Diarrhoea* and *Accidents*, 1 each from *Infantile Convulsions*, *Tetanus*, and *Puerperal Septicaemia*, and 47 from *Other Causes*.

6. *Reported Cases.*—Eleven cases of *Chickenpox* and 7 of *Enteric Fever* were reported during the week, as against 6 and 5 respectively of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 81.6°, against 81.2° in the preceding week and 80.2° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.861 in., against 29.841 in. in the preceding week and 29.885 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 2.36 in., against 3.91 in. in the preceding week and 5.36 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
