AMENDED FRANKING MINUTE.

IN pursuance of the authority conferred on the Governor by the 46th and 67th sections of "The Ceylon Postal and Telegraph Ordinance, 1892," His Excellency the Governor has, with the advice of the Executive Council, made the following rules for regulating the transmission of official letters through the post:—

I.—His Excellency the Governor and his personal staff, the Lieutenant-Governor, and Colonial Secretary are entitled to frank and receive free all official letters sent by them to officials and private individuals, or received by them from officials or private individuals.

II.—The several Public Officers and the Heads of Departments specified in schedule A hereto annexed are entitled to frank official letters addressed to Public Officers named in schedules A, B, and C.

III.—All official letters addressed by Public Officers in schedule A to private individuals or to officers of the Public Service not mentioned in one of the afore-mentioned schedules, must be prepaid.

IV.—The several Public Officers specified in schedule B are entitled to frank official letters to officers of their own Department and to Public Officers directly associated with them in transacting their official duties.

V.—Public Officers specified in schedule B will furnish to the Postmaster-General a list of the officers with whom such official letters will be exchanged, and will prepay postage on official letters addressed to private individuals or Public Officers not entered in the afore-mentioned list.

VI.—Schedule C includes all classes of native headmen, who will be privileged to frank official letters addressed to other headmen and to a limited number of Public Officers, provided their official rank and residence, the post offices they will use, and the official designations and residences of the persons with whom it may be necessary for them to address official letters is furnished by the Government Agents to the Postmaster-General.

VII.—Communications addressed by private persons to Public Officers, except as provided in clause I. of this Minute, must in all cases be prepaid. Returns sent to a Public Official on printed forms in compliance with the provisions of any Ordinance are exempted from postage.

VIII.—All postal packets exceeding 1 lb. in weight must be prepaid.

IX.—The term "official letters" in this Minute shall mean any postal packet on public business sent by any Public Department of the Island or an authorized official thereof.

Now therefore Her Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the power by the aforesaid Act in Her Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the 20th section of "The Finance Act, 1894," shall apply to Ceylon, Hongkong, the Straits Settlements, and the Bahama Islands.
