## "THE GAME PROTECTION ORDINANCE, 1909."

REGULATIONS made by the Governor in Executive Council under section 27 of "The Game Protection Ordinance, 1909," for the area covered by the territorial waters adjoining the Galle Revenue District of the Southern Province.

## REGULATIONS.

The ma-del net fishing season begins on September 1 and ends on May 31 in each year.

2. All ma-del, baru-del, visi-del nets and yoth within a Patabendi Arachchi's jurisdiction shall be registered on application to the Government Agent in a book to be kept for the purpose by such Patabendi Arachchi. A tab bearing the registration number shall be attached to each ma-dela, baru-dela, or yotha in such position as may be most convenient. All ma-del, baru-del, and yoth for use in a particular boat shall bear the same registration number. The particulars to be registered in regard to such nets are the registration number and the names of the owners; in the case of a ma-dela the length of the net shall also be registered. The Government Agent shall have power, for special reasons to be given by the applicant, to register such ma-del nets after September 15.

3. In case of any dispute as regards the description and number of the nets to be registered the parties entitled to register them, or the boundaries of the warayas or ports the decision of the Government Agent shall be final.

4. The Government Agent shall have power to limit the number of ma-del, baru-del, visi-del nets or yoth to be used in each waraya or port.

5. Registered ma-del, baru-del, visi-del, or yoth shall be used in the waraya for fishing by turns in rotation calculated from October 1 in the order of the registration numbers (of which order each owner should keep himself informed). The turn of each group of ma-del and baru-del bearing the same registration number shall begin at sunrise and terminate at sunrise of the following day.

6. The Government Agent or any officer deputed by him and the Patabendi Arachchi shall have power to inspect the ma-del, baru-del, visi-del, or yoth at any time, and recommend to the Government Agent the striking off the register of any ma-del, baru-del, visi-del, or yoth the owner of which shall have been convicted of a breach of any rule in this chapter.

7. When a group of ma-del, baru-del, visi-del, or yoth bearing the same registration number has been taken off the register, the turns are calculated from the date according to the number of groups of ma-del, baru-del, visi-del, or yoth on the register existing thereafter.

8. The use of any unregistered ma-del, baru-del, visi-del, or yoth or of any other unregistered sea-fishing net is prohibited.

9. The use of ma-del, baru-del, visi-del, and yoth for the catching of Korababubu, Bolla, Ehalamuruwa, Koramuruwa shall be restricted whenever these fish come into the warayas of inlets.

10. So long as these fish swarm in the inlets or waraya they shall not be caught in nets or other appliances except *line* and *rod*, but when they are leaving the inlets altogether, the Patabendi Arachchi or any other officer authorized by the Government Agent in consultation with at least six of the fishers of the Patabendi Arachchi's division, shall appoint a date from which baru-del or visi-del nets may be used. No ma-del shall on any account be used.

## AMENDMENTS REFERRED TO.

Clause 15 (i).—Add the following sentence: "The normal period during which the school shall be in session shall be five hours a day."

Clause 16 (vii).—Add a new sub-clause as follows:—

"(vii.) A teacher who is normally employed in teaching for 20 hours a week is regarded as a full-time teacher."

Clause 40 (a) (i).—In line 3 alter "six days" to "five days."

Clause 40 (b).—In the amendment published in *Gazette* No. 7,776 of May 8, 1930, for the words "will pay" substitute "may approve."

Add the following sentences to this sub-clause:—

"The maximum amount of full pay and half pay leave is eight weeks in the twelve months preceding the end of the school year. A teacher with no previous service, joining a school during a school year, will be eligible for leave proportionate to his service in that year."

## CODE OF REGULATIONS FOR ASSISTED VERNACULAR AND BILINGUAL SCHOOLS.

## AMENDMENTS REFERRED TO.

Clause 17 (i).—Add the following sentence: "The normal period during which the school shall be in session shall be five hours a day."

Clause 18 (vii).—Add a new sub-clause as follows:—

"(vii.) A teacher who is normally employed in teaching for 20 hours a week is regarded as a full-time teacher."

Clause 54 (a) (i).—In line 3 alter "six days" to "five days."

Clause 54 (b).—Add the following:—

"The maximum amount of full pay and half pay leave is eight weeks in the twelve months preceding the end of the school year. A teacher with no previous service, joining a school during a school year, will be eligible for leave proportionate to his service in that year."

Clause 75.—In the last line after "registered" insert "or employed."

Clause 76.—In the last three lines alter "be appointed to teach . . . three years" to "be employed temporarily as teachers."

Clause 77.—Add the following sentence:—"From January 1, 1932, the words 'be provisionally registered for a period of three years' will be substituted for 'be registered as provisionally certificated teachers.'"

RULES GOVERNING THE SELECTION OF CEYLONESE CANDIDATES FOR APPOINTMENT AS POLICE PROBATIONERS.

## Rule.

**R**ULE 5 of the rules regarding the conditions of eligibility of Ceylonese candidates for appointment as Police Probationers, appearing in Notification dated December 17, 1930, published in *Gazette* No. 7,820 of December 19, 1930, has been revoked by the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and the following substituted therefor :—

5. *Conditions of Eligibility.*—Every candidate shall fulfil each of the following conditions :—

- (i.) He must be a natural-borne British subject.
- (ii.) His permanent home must be in Ceylon.
- (iii.) He must have been educated either in Ceylon or in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland.
- (iv.) On August 1, 1932, at least 19 years and not more than 26 years must have elapsed since the date of his birth ; provided that in the case of an Inspector or Sub-Inspector in the Ceylon Police who joined the Force as a Sub-Inspector during the period 1919–1926, on August 1, 1932, at least 19 years and not more than 30 years must have elapsed since the date of his birth.
- (v.) He must have passed the London Matriculation Examination or the Cambridge Senior Examination with exemption from the London Matriculation Examination.
- (vi.) He must be of good moral character.
- (vii.) He must be unmarried, except in the case of an Inspector or Sub-Inspector who joined the Force as a Sub-Inspector during the period 1919–1926.
- (viii.) He must be of sound constitution, and physically fit for service in any part of the Island. He must also be able to distinguish the principal colours.

*Note.*—No person will be deemed eligible as a candidate who has not furnished satisfactory proof that he fulfils each of the conditions set forth above.

2. The amended rule will apply in the case of all Ceylonese candidates for appointment in 1932 and in subsequent years.

ORDER OF HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN  
COUNCIL UNDER "THE ENEMY PROPERTY  
ORDINANCE, NO. 23 OF 1916", AS AMENDED  
BY ORDINANCE NO. 5 OF 1917.

WHEREAS at Versailles, on the 28th day of June, 1919, a Treaty of Peace was signed on behalf of His Majesty:

And whereas under Article 297 (b) of the said Treaty power is reserved to the allied and associated powers to retain and liquidate all property, rights, and interests belonging at the date of the coming into force of the said Treaty, to German Nationals within their territories, colonies, possessions, and Protectorates:

And whereas His Majesty has been pleased, under and by virtue of the powers conferred on him by the Treaty of Peace Act, 1919, to make the Treaty of Peace Order, 1919, dealing with the enforcement of certain provisions of the said Treaty in certain parts of His Dominions, including Ceylon:

And whereas by Article I. (XVI.) of the aforesaid Order, His Majesty has been pleased to declare that such property, rights, and interests and the nett proceeds of their sale, liquidation, or other dealings therewith are thereby charged with certain liabilities therein more particularly specified:

And whereas by Article I. (XVII.) of the said Order it was provided that with a view to making effective and enforcing such charge as aforesaid, the Board of Trade may by Order vest in the custodian such property, rights, and interests:

And whereas provision is made in the said Order in Council for the Legislature of any such part of His Majesty's Dominions making the necessary modifications in the said Order in Council for adapting it to the circumstances thereof:

And whereas in pursuance of the said provision of section 3 of "The Treaty of Peace (Enforcement) Ordinance, No. 7 of 1920," the Legislature of this Colony among other things has modified the expressions "Board of Trade" and "Custodian" occurring in the aforesaid Article to mean "the Governor in Executive Council" and "The Custodian of Enemy Property" appointed under "The Enemy Firms Liquidation Ordinance, No. 20 of 1916":

And whereas the Governor in Executive Council by an Order dated the 23rd day of December, 1930, and published in the *Government Gazette* No. 7,822 of January 3, 1931, vested in the Custodian of Enemy Property, the property enumerated in the schedule to the said Order and in the schedule hereto, and did in such Order state that the said property belonged to Georgina Amy Bernhard, a German National, and authorized the said Custodian to sell, manage, or otherwise deal with the same and hold the proceeds thereof until further instructions were duly issued to him:

And whereas it is deemed expedient that the said Order should be revoked:

And whereas by section 11 (a) of "The Interpretation Ordinance, 1901" the Governor in Executive Council may revoke the said Order:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor is pleased, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, to revoke his said Order of the 23rd day of December, 1930, and all acts, matters, and things

which have already been done by the Custodian of Enemy Property in connection with the said Order in Council dated the 23rd day of December, 1930.

## VITAL STATISTICS.

### Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended June 27, 1931.

**Births.**—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 167 (9 Burghers, 95 Sinhalese, 27 Tamils, 20 Moors, 6 Malays, and 10 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1931, viz., 282,870) was 30.8, as against 28.6 in the preceding week, 31.8 in the corresponding week of last year, and 33.9 the weekly average for last year.

**Deaths.**—The total deaths registered were 166 (6 Burghers, 112 Sinhalese, 26 Tamils, 16 Moors, 3 Malays, and 3 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 30.6, as against 35.8 in the previous week, 36.6 in the corresponding week of last year, and 29.5 the weekly average for last year.

**Infantile Deaths.**—Of the 166 total deaths, 33 were of infants under one year of age, as against 31 in the preceding week, 40 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 32 the average for last year.

**Stillbirths.**—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 11.

**Principal Causes of Death.**—1. (a) Thirty-eight deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 23 in Maradana hospitals (including 11 deaths of non-residents), 3 each in Kotahena North and Maradana North, 2 each in New Bazaar and Kollupitiya, and 1 each in Kotahena South, Maradana East, Maradana South, Slave Island, and Wellawatta South, as against 50 in the previous week, and 18 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Twenty deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 3 each in Kotahena South, New Bazaar, and Kollupitiya, 2 each in Kotahena North, Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), and Maradana North, and 1 each in St. Paul's, San Sebastian, Maradana East, Maradana South, and Wellawatta South, as against 32 in the previous week, and 8 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Three deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 2 in Maradana South and 1 in Maradana East, as against 12 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.

2. (a) Eleven deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 6 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents), and 1 each in Kotahena North, New Bazaar, Maradana North, Maradana East, and Kollupitiya, as against 10 in the previous week, and 12 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Two deaths from *Phthisis* of residents of Colombo town, occurred at the Anti-Tuberculosis Hospital, Ragama, during the week.

3. Five deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents). The number registered during the preceding week was also 5, and the weekly average for last year 4.

4. Nine deaths from *Debility* were registered, 5 from *Worms*, 4 from *Enteritis*, 3 from *Puerperal Septicæmia*, 2 each from *Dysentery*, *Infantile Convulsions*, *Tetanus*, and *Accidents*, 1 each from *Diarrhoea* and *Stroke*, and 58 from *Other Causes*.

5. **Reported Cases.**—Four cases of *Enteric Fever*, 1 of *Measles*, and 1 of *Plague* were reported during the week, as against 10, nil, and 1, respectively, of the preceding week.

**State of the Weather.**—The mean temperature of air was 81.7°, against 82.2° in the preceding week and 81.1° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.825 in., against 29.854 in. in the preceding week, and 29.827 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 1.85 in., against 1.17 in. in the preceding week and 2.04 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

#### Ninety-Ninth Annual Report of the Ceylon Savings Bank.

*Board of Directors:* The Hon. the Controller of Revenue (*President*), The Postmaster-General, The Registrar-General, *Treasurer*, The Hon. the Colonial Treasurer.

#### REPORT FOR THE YEAR 1930.

The Ninety-ninth Annual Report of the Ceylon Savings Bank is submitted together with the statements of accounts and balance sheet for 1930, duly audited and certified by the Colonial Auditor.

It is gratifying to note that the bank continues to progress steadily and satisfactorily and is availed of as a medium of thrift by all classes.

*Deposits.*—The amount deposited during the year was Rs. 3,856,181.26, as against Rs. 3,773,830.92 in 1929. The number of deposits was 31,208 as against 32,109 in 1929.

*Withdrawals.*—The amount withdrawn during the year was Rs. 3,584,115.03, as against Rs. 3,516,808.41 in 1929. The number of withdrawals was 33,228, as against 29,463 in 1929.

*Number of Transactions.*—The total number of transactions in deposits and withdrawals was 64,436, as against 61,572 in 1929. The amount to credit of depositors on December 31, 1930, was Rs. 7,865,362.85 as against Rs. 7,593,296.62 in 1929—an increase of Rs. 272,066.23, which is due to normal growth of business.

*Number of Accounts.*—The number of accounts remaining open at the end of the financial year was 55,843, as against 54,143 in 1929. The number of accounts opened during the year was 3,823, and the number of accounts closed was 2,123 leaving a nett increase of 1,700 accounts.

*Interest Paid to Depositors.*—The rate of interest payable to depositors was the same as in the preceding year:—4 per cent. on sums not exceeding Rs. 1,000 and 3 per cent. on sums exceeding Rs. 1,000.

The amount paid as interest to depositors for 1930 was Rs. 247,284.65, as against Rs. 242,408.80 for 1929—an increase of Rs. 4,875.85.

*Investments on House Property.*—The amount lent during the year under review on 21 fresh mortgages on house property within the Municipal limits of Colombo was Rs. 321,550, as against 40 mortgages in 1929 amounting to Rs. 672,700 a decrease of Rs. 351,150 due to the fact that the bank stopped giving loans from May 29, 1930, as a precautionary measure in view of the depression. However, loans are now granted.

*Investments on Colonial Government Securities.*—Of the sum of £41,361. 0s. 6d. War Loan Stock 1920-1947 held by the Crown Agents on behalf of the Bank, £15,056. 12s. 3d. worth of Stock has been sold by them in 1929 and £16,859. 2s. 10d. worth of stock in 1930, and invested as under:—

*Refund of Income Tax on Indian Government Paper 3½ Per Cent.*—A sum of Rs. 32,368.19 was obtained from the Mercantile Bank of India, Ltd., in June, 1930, being refund of Income Tax on 3½ per cent. Indian Government Paper.

*Profits realized by the Sale and Reinvestment of Sterling Securities.*—A sum of Rs. 24,957.53 has been realized by the sale of War Loan Bonds 5 per cent. and Queensland Stocks and the reinvestment of the proceeds of these stocks.

*Cost of Maintaining the Bank.*—The expenses of the management of the Bank during the year amounted to Rs. 63,700.62 an increase of Rs. 5,306.75 due partly to the annual increments to officers and partly to the payment for Postal Services.

*Profits.*—The nett profit after providing for interest to depositors, expenses of management, rent of premises, &c., was Rs. 121,922.95. This abnormal increase is due to refund of Income Tax by the Indian Government and the profit on the sale of Sterling Securities—leaving these two items aside the year's own nett profit is Rs. 64,527.23 which surpasses all previous records.

The nett profit of Rs. 121,922.95 will as usual be added to the Reserve Fund. Notwithstanding the world-wide depression in trade and the consequent set back in the Ceylon Produce Market, the result of the year's working must be considered highly satisfactory in every way.

## Sale Coupes, Western Division.

WRITTEN offers are invited for the purchase of all timber and firewood, standing or fallen, within the boundaries of the demarcated coupes described in the annexed schedule.

2. Offers should be made by letter, under sealed and registered cover, addressed to the Divisional Forest Officer, Western Division, Colombo, and posted to reach the Office of the Divisional Forest Officer, Colombo, not later than midday on July 31, 1931, the envelope being marked on the left hand top corner "Offer for the Purchase of Timber and Firewood, Western Division," and signed by the tenderer. Alterations must be initialled, otherwise the offers may be treated as informal and rejected.

3. A deposit of Rs. 20 for each of the coupes is required and should be forwarded with the offer by a money order in favour of the Divisional Forest Officer, Colombo.

4. The tenderers should satisfy themselves by inspection before tendering as to the acreage and contents of the demarcated coupes referred to in the annexed schedule, as the figures given therein are estimated only and their correctness is in no way guaranteed. The boundaries of each coupe will be pointed out by the Forest Ranger, Waga.

5. The successful tenderer will be required to execute a purchase agreement in respect of each coupe. A copy of this agreement can be seen at the Office of the Divisional Forest Officer, Colombo.

6. Before execution of the agreement the purchaser will be required to pay the full purchase amount.

7. After payment of the purchase price, deposit of the security, and execution of the agreement, the purchaser will be entitled on application to refund of his tender deposit. Should the successful tenderer fail to carry out the requirements of clauses 5 and 6 of this notice, within 14 days of receiving notice in writing from the Divisional Forest Officer, that his tender has been accepted, the Rs. 20 deposited for each coupe will be forfeited to the Crown. The successful tenderer will be entitled to a refund of the amount deposited by him on application to the Divisional Forest Officer concerned.

8. Tenderers should make offers, written both in word and figures, for the timber and firewood contained in each of the coupes.

9. No tender will be considered unless the procedure laid down has strictly been complied with. The Conservator of Forests reserves to himself the right, without question, of rejecting any or all tenders, and of accepting any portion of a tender.

10. The special rules for felling, conversion, and removal which the agreement will require to be observed are specified in the special conditions advertised below. Nothing of these special conditions shall render the purchaser in any way exempt from liability under the Forest Ordinance of 1907, should he be responsible for the commission of Forest Offence outside the boundaries of his purchased coupe or coupes.

11. The security to be deposited is between Rs. 50 and Rs. 200 according to the discretion of the Divisional Forest Officer.

12. Should any offer be accepted and should the successful tenderer after due notification decline or fail to pay any sum or sums stipulated for and to enter into the necessary contract within the time allowed, or in reasonable time, he will be held pecuniarily liable for any resultant loss to Government. Offers are made and received on this distinct understanding. The Conservator of Forests reserves the discretionary power to waive the terms of this clause in any decree as he may consider the circumstances justify.

13. The estimated *in situ* value of the timber and firewood described in the services given below as is follows:— Service "A" Rs. 735, Service "B" Rs. 540, and Service "C" Rs. 60, and any offers below these figures are liable to rejection. This will, however, not prejudice the Conservator of Forests right to reject any offers even though they may be above *in situ* value.

14. For any further information application should be made to the Divisional Forest Officer, Colombo.

## Special Conditions.

On payment of the full purchase amount the purchaser will be entitled to fell and remove on or before February 15, 1932, in the manner specified below, all the firewood and timber contained in the purchased coupe or coupes. Any firewood or timber not removed by the expiry date shall *ipso facto* revert to the Crown. Under no circumstances will extension be granted.

(2) The purchaser shall agree to commence felling along the full length of the southern boundary of each coupe and to progress this felling line in the direction of the northern boundary, always keeping it parallel to the southern boundary along which felling commences.

(3) Should the purchaser fell or remove timber trees in excess of the quantity specified in special condition 2, nothing in the agreement shall exempt him from being liable for illicit felling and removal under the Forest Ordinance, No. 16 of 1907.

(4) The purchaser of the coupe or coupes must obtain removal permits or timber cart notes for all material to be removed from the coupe.

(5) The purchaser shall agree that for each and every infringement of the above conditions he shall become liable to a fine not exceeding Rs. 100, to be imposed by the Divisional Forest Officer in writing at his discretion, and to be recovered from the purchaser's security money.

(6) The purchaser shall agree that, in the event of security money having become exhausted, it shall be within the discretion of the Divisional Forest Officer either (a) to accept a further security deposit amounting to 10 per cent. of the full tendered purchase price, or (b) to cancel the agreement and to refund to the purchaser such balance of the paid purchase money, if any, as remains after deducting the value of firewood removed by the purchaser on the date of such cancellation. For the purpose of this clause the value of each removed cubic yard of firewood shall be reckoned at full royalty rates.

(7) The purchaser shall have the right of appeal to the Conservator of Forests in the event of enforcement of any of the penalties specified in these conditions, and the purchaser shall agree to accept the Conservator's decision as final and binding.

(8) The purchaser shall be required to cut all material in the coupes by three distinct operations as follows:—

*Operation 1.*—All herbaceous and undergrowth other than tree growth and creepers shall be cut out. This operation shall commence along the full length of one boundary of each coupe and proceed in a straight line to the opposite boundary of that coupe. The whole area of each coupe must thus be covered, including those portions, if any, which contain no tree growth.

*Operation 2.*—All saplings and poles which are under 24 inches in girth shall be felled within 6 inches of the ground. This operation shall commence from and proceed to the same boundaries as in operation 1.

Operation 3.—All trees whether utilizable or otherwise and unless marked for retention as standards which are over 24 inches in girth shall be felled within 12 inches of the ground. This operation shall commence from and proceed to the same boundaries as in operation 1.

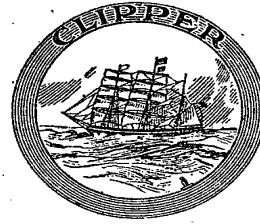

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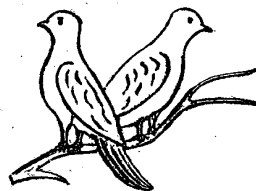
