A PROCLAMATION.

GRAEME THOMSON.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 34 (1) of "The Ceylon Railways Ordinance, 1902," that it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time to declare by Proclamation any road or path which the Railway may cross to be a "minor crossing" and whether such "minor crossing" shall be closed by gates or not; and such Proclamation to alter, vary, or repeal:

And whereas by a Proclamation published in *Gazette* No. 6,047 of April 7, 1905, the roads and paths which the Ceylon Government Railway crosses between the stations of Wellawatta and Alutgama, in the Western Province, appearing in the schedule hereto, were among others declared to be "minor crossings" not closed by gates:

And whereas it is expedient to repeal the said Proclamation in so far as it applies to the aforesaid crossings:

Now know Ye that We, the Governor, in exercise of the powers in Us vested as aforesaid, do hereby repeal the said Proclamation bearing date the Fifth day of April, 1905, in so far as it relates to the roads appearing in the schedule hereto.

We do hereby in all other respects confirm the said Proclamation of April 5, 1905.

NOTIFICATION UNDER LAND SALE REGULATIONS

NOTICE is hereby given under the provisions of Land Sale and Lease Regulations Nos. 58 and 59 that an application has been received from Mr. Peter Gunawardena of Ambalantota for the lease to him, without competition, for the purpose of experimenting in improved methods of paddy cultivation, such as transplantation, cultivation of the same land only once a year, introduction of new varieties of seed paddy, use of the plough in preference to mudding, and manuring, of 4 allotments of land called Mahawewagodella, Diganekeburegodella, and Mahawewa, containing in extent 49 acres 3 roods and 25 perches, situated at Medagama in Magam pattu, Hambantota District, Southern Province, and described as lots 17, 18, 19, and 20 in final village plan No. 63.

1. The areas defined in the schedule hereto shall be reserved for buildings of a residential character:—

Schedule.

Division No. 1 (Dehiwala).

(a) The whole area between the Galle road and the sea.

Boundaries.—On the north by the Dehiwala canal, on the east by the centre line of the Galle high road, on the south by the centre line of the Dehiwala Station road, on the west by the sea.

(b) The area round the Council's Offices.

Boundaries as follows:—On the north by a line 100 yards north of Boteju lane up to the bend thereof, on the east by a line drawn from the said bend of Boteju lane due south to the point where it meets Quarry road; thence along Allan avenue up to its junction with the New Park lane, on the south by the centre line of Park lane and the Waidya crescent up to the Galle road, on the west by the centre line of the Galle high road.

Division No. 3 (Karagampitiya).

(a) The whole area between the centre line of the Galle road and the sea.

Boundaries as follows:—On the north by the centre line of the Dehiwala Station road, on the east by the centre line of the Galle High road, on the south by a line within 100 yards of the Galkissa cemetery northern boundary up to the sea, on the west by the sea.

(b) The areas 100 yards on either side of Kawdana road up to its junction with Pallidora road, with reservations up to a distance of 50 yards from the Kawdana and Pallidora junctions for commercial purposes.

(c) *Watarappola Road.*—100 yards on the northern side of the road up to a distance of 100 yards of the fields at the eastern end of the road.

Division No. 4 (Mount Lavinia).

The whole area between the Galle road and the sea.

Boundaries.—On the north by a line drawn due east within 100 yards south of Galkissa cemetery, on the east by the centre line of Galle high road to a point 100 yards

south up to its junction with Mount Lavinia Southern Station Approach road; on the south by a line drawn 100 yards parallel to the Southern Station Approach road due west from Galle road to the sea; on the west by the sea.

Division No. 5 (Watarappola).

(A) 100 yards on either side of Templar road.

(B) 100 yards on south side of Watarappola road up to a distance of 100 yards of the fields at the eastern end of the road.

2. Within the limits of the residential areas only residential buildings of a type or types sanctioned by the Chairman of the Urban District Council in writing with the advice of the Council shall be erected. Such sanction shall be refused if, in the opinion of the Council, the situation or design or the use to which it is proposed to put the building would not be in keeping with its surroundings or would not preserve the amenities of the area.

6. A deposit of Rs. 20 will be required to be made either at the General Treasury, or any Kachcheri, and a receipt produced for the same before any Form of Tender is issued. (b) On payment of the full purchase amount the purchaser will be entitled to fell and remove on or before the expiry date in the manner specified below, all firewood and timber contained in the purchased coupe. Any firewood not removed by the expiry date, shall *ipso facto* revert to the Crown.

(5) Should the purchaser fell or remove timber trees in excess of the quantity specified in special condition 2, nothing in the agreement shall exempt him from being liable for illicit felling and removal under the Forest Ordinance, No. 16 of 1907.

(6) The purchaser will be required to spread the branchwood evenly over the coupe immediately after conversion, so as to leave no bare patches liable to soil erosion.

(7) The purchaser shall either exercise such personal supervision as will ensure the conditions of this agreement being efficiently executed or employed an efficient supervisor.

(8) The purchaser or his agent or his workmen shall not damage any boundary pillars or calamander plants, or block up the boundaries by depositing any brushwood or branches. All lines so blocked must be cleared by the purchaser.

(9) A general removal permit will be issued by the Divisional Forest Officer authorizing the purchaser to remove the firewood standing in one-third of the trees according to the purchase amount paid, *vide* conditions 3 and 4 in such daily quantities as will be specified in cartnotes which must accompany each and every cart track in transit. The Forest Ranger or Forest Overseer or the

Forest Guard will measure up the wood which is ready for removal twice a week between 9.30 A.M. and 3.30 P.M. and will issue the necessary cartnotes which shall accompany each and every cart in transit.

(10) The purchaser shall agree that, in the event of security money having become exhausted, it shall be within the discretion of the Divisional Forest Officer either (a) to accept a further security deposit amounting to 10 per cent. of the full tendered purchase price, or (b) to cancel the agreement and to refund to the purchaser such balance of the paid up purchase money, if any, as remains after deducting the value of firewood removed by the purchaser on the date of such cancellation. Operation 1.

All herbaceous and undergrowth other than tree growth shall be cut out. The whole area of each coupe must thus be covered including those portions, if any, which contain no tree growth.

Operation 2.

All tree seedlings and saplings which are under one inch diameter shall be coppiced out within two inches of the ground by means of sharp cutties or any other instrument authorized by the Divisional Forest Officer. This operation shall commence from and proceed to the same boundaries and in the same alignments as operation 1. Not less than three days shall have elapsed between the execution of operation 1 and the commencement of operation 2 in any portion of the area, and there shall be an interval on the ground of not less than one chain between operations 1 and 2 except where the terminating boundary is reached.

Operation 3.

All saplings which are over one inch in diameter and not exceeding eight inches diameter shall be felled within twelve inches of the ground, and on the day of felling the stools shall be coppiced by means of sharp adzes cleanly and flush with the ground. This operation shall proceed from and to the same boundaries and with the same intervals in relation to operation 2, as the latter is required to proceed with in relation to operation 1.

Operation 4.

All trees over eight inches in diameter shall be felled within two inches of the ground, and within three days of felling all the stools which are between eight inches and fifteen inches diameter shall be coppiced cleanly and to within one inch of the ground. This operation shall proceed from and to the same boundaries and with the same intervals in relation to operation 1.

Separate working parties shall be assigned to these four separate operations, and separate workmen shall be detailed to keep the coppicing tools invariably sharp. The purchaser shall either exercise such personal supervision as will ensure this work being executed efficiently, or employ an efficient supervisor.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended July 4, 1931.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 144 (3 Europeans, 11 Burghers, 71 Sinhalese, 33 Tamils, 14 Moors, 10 Malays, and 2 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1931, viz., 284,440) was 26.4, as against 30.8 in the preceding week, 29.5 in the corresponding week of last year, and 33.9 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 153 (8 Burghers, 91 Sinhalese, 28 Tamils, 19 Moors, 2 Malays, and 5 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 28.0, as against 30.6 in the previous week, 47.0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 29.5 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 153 total deaths, 37 were of infants under one year of age, as against 33 in the preceding week, 69 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 32 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 13.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Twenty-seven deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 16 in Maradana hospitals (including 9 deaths of non-residents), 4 each in Kotahena South and Maradana North, 2 in Kotahena North and 1 in New Bazaar, as against 38 in the previous week, and 18 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Twenty deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 4 each in Kotahena North and Slave Island, 2 each in St. Paul's, San Sebastian, New Bazaar, and Kollupitiya, and 1 each in Kotahena South, Maradana hospitals (of a non-resident), Maradana South and Wellawatta South. The number registered during the preceding week was also 20, and the weekly average for last year was 8.

(c) Eight deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 4 in Maradana North and 1 each in Kotahena North, Kotahena South, Maradana hospitals, and Maradana South, as against 3 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.

2. (a) Twelve deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 6 in Maradana hospitals (including 4 deaths of non-residents), and 1 each in Fort, Kotahena South, New Bazaar, Maradana North, Slave Island, and Kollupitiya, as against 11 in the previous week, and 12 the weekly average for last year.

(b) One death from *Phthisis* of a resident of Colombo town occurred at the Anti-Tuberculosis hospital, Ragama, during the week.

3. (a) Two deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), as against 5 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.

(b) One death from *Enteric Fever* of a resident of Colombo town occurred at the Infectious Diseases hospital, Angoda, during the week.

4. Nine deaths from *Debility* were registered, 5 from *Enteritis*, 3 from *Dysentery*, 2 each from *Worms* and *Suicide*, 1 each from *Infantile Convulsions* and *Tetanus*, and 61 from *Other Causes*.

5. **Reported Cases.**—Four cases of *Enteric Fever* and 1 of *Chickenpox* were reported during the week, as against 4, and nil respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 80.9°, against 81.7° in the preceding week and 81.1° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.851 in., against 29.825 in. in the preceding week, and 29.855 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 3.48 in., against 1.85 in. in the preceding week, and 1.91 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

Nothing of these special conditions shall render the purchaser in any way exempt from liability under the Forest Ordinance of 1907, should he be responsible for the commission of Forest Offence outside the boundaries of his purchased coupe.

11. The security to be deposited is between Rs. 50 and Rs. 200 according to the discretion of the Divisional Forest Officer.

12. Should any offer be accepted and should the successful tenderer after due notification decline or fail to pay any sum or sums stipulated for and to enter into the necessary contract within the time allowed, or in reasonable time, he will be held pecuniarily liable for any resultant loss to Government. Offers are made and received on this distinct understanding. The Conservator of Forests reserves the discretionary power to waive the terms of this clause in any decree as he may consider the circumstances justify.

Special Conditions.

On payment of the full purchase amount the purchaser will be entitled to fell and remove on or before August 31, 1931, in the manner specified below, all the firewood and timber contained in the purchased coupe. Any firewood or timber not removed by the expiry date shall *ipso facto* revert to the Crown.

(2) The purchaser shall agree to commence felling among the full length of the southern boundary of the coupe and to progress this felling line in the direction of the northern boundary, always keeping it parallel to the southern boundary along which felling commences.

(3) Should the purchaser fell or remove timber trees in excess of the quantity specified in special condition 2, nothing in the agreement shall exempt him from being liable for illicit felling and removal under the Forest Ordinance, No. 16 of 1907.

(6) The purchaser shall agree that, in the event of security money having become exhausted, it shall be within the discretion of the Divisional Forest Officer either (a) to accept a further security deposit amounting to 10 per cent. of the full tendered purchase price, or (b) to cancel the agreement and to refund to the purchaser such balance of the paid purchase money, if any, as remains after deducting the value of firewood removed by the purchaser on the date of such cancellation. For the purpose of this clause the value of each removed cubic yard of firewood shall be reckoned at full royalty rates.

(7) The purchaser shall have right of appeal to the Conservator of Forests in the event of enforcement of any of the penalties specified in these conditions, and the purchaser shall agree to accept the Conservator's decision as final and binding.

(8) The purchaser shall be required to cut all material in the coupe by three distinct operations as follows:—

Operation 1.—All herbaceous and undergrowth other than tree growth and creepers shall be cut out. This operation shall commence along the full length of one boundary of each coupe and proceed in a straight line to the opposite boundary of that coupe. The whole area of the coupe must thus be covered, including these portions, if any, which contains no tree growth.

Operation 2.—All saplings and poles which are under 24 inches in girth shall be felled within 6 inches of the ground. This operation shall commence from and proceed to the same boundaries as in operation 1.

Operation 3.—All trees whether utilizable or otherwise and unless marked for retention as standards which are over 24 inches in girth shall be felled within 12 inches of the ground. This operation shall commence from and proceed to the same boundaries as in operation 1.

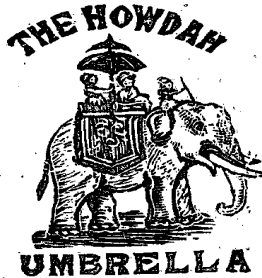

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on May 16, 1931, at 8.30 a.m., in accordance with Notice dated May 12, 1931.

Present :—Mr. R. H. Whitehorn, Chairman ; Ratwatte Adigar ; Mr. Geo. E. de Silva ; Mr. Haji M. S. Usoof Ismail ; Mr. S. A. Wijayatilake ; Mr. W. A. B. Soysa ; Dr. W. E. de Silva ; Mr. H. P. G. Young.

The meeting congratulated Ratwatte Adigar on his election for the Balangoda seat in the State Council.

Ratwatte Adigar thanked the Members for their good wishes.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on April 18, 1931, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted :—

- Statement of receipts and disbursements from close of 1930 to April, 1931, on account of the Municipal Fund.
- Progress report of works brought up to the same date.
- Health Officer's report for April, 1931.
- Statement of cases instituted by the several Inspectors and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of April, 1931.
- The reservoir readings for April, 1931.

Resolved that the statement (a), together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 83 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table :—Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, standpipes, and house-service taps inspected during April, 1931.

4. Petitions :—(1) Mr. Soysa presented a petition from the Merchants in Colombo street, stating that the Police are prosecuting bus drivers who halt their buses for loading and unloading of goods opposite business places in spite of the Council's recommendation of February 21, 1931.—Resolved to refer the petition to the Superintendent of Police, Central Province, for report.

- (2) Mr. Wijayatilake presented a petition from Mr. A. C. M. Haniffa applying for the beef and fish stalls at Mahaiyawa. The Chairman undertook to consider the application.
- (3) Mr. Wijayatilake also presented a petition from S. Mohideen objecting to the assessment of 33 and 33B, Deyannawela. The Chairman undertook to look into the complaint.
- (4) Ratwatte Adigar drew the attention of the Chairman to undesirables loitering in the Park near Military Hospital and asked the Chairman to take steps.
5. Pursuant to notice, Mr. de Silva was to move—"That the present rates levied by this Council under the following headings: Consolidated Rates, Conservancy, Light, Police, be reduced by 2 per cent. during the next 9 months in this year and that the Chairman be requested to effect retrenchment in the various Departments in order to meet the present crisis."
- With the leave of the Council Mr. de Silva moved the motion amended as follows:—"That the present consolidated rates be reduced by 2 per cent. to take effect from 3rd quarter, 1931." Mr. Wijayatilake seconded.
- The Chairman spoke opposing the motion.
- The motion was put to the meeting and carried by 5 to 3.
- Ayes.*—Mr. de Silva, Mr. Wijayatilake, Ratwatte Adigar, Mr. Soysa, Mr. Ismail.
- Noes.*—The Chairman, Dr. de Silva, Mr. Young.
6. The Chairman's Administration report for the year 1930.—Resolved that the report be submitted to the Governor as required by section 102 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance.
7. Recommendations of Standing Committees and Special Committees:—

Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation held on April 18, 1931.

- (1) Draft by-laws for the control and effective supervision of burial grounds in charge of the Municipal Council.—Recommended. By-law 3 to be amended limiting it to public burial grounds, as suggested by the Chairman in his memo. of April 10, 1931.
- (2) Letter of March 13, 1931, from S. Madar Saibo asking that the name of Mr. A. Cader Meera Saibo, whom he has taken into partnership in the business carried on at Stall No. 13, Public Market, be entered in the licence as joint licensee of this stall.—Recommended.
- (3) Papers *re* the licensing of Kapok as a Dangerous and Offensive Trade, and its storage.—Recommended not to vary the resolution of the Council.
- (4) Draft of a regulation to be added to regulation 5 of the regulations made under sections 4 and 5 of "The Quarantine and Prevention of Diseases Ordinance, 1897," so as to provide for the renewal of licences in respect of keeping, storing, or possessing more than five bags of grain.—Recommended.
- (5) Letter No. 2,123 of March 26, 1931, from the Provincial Surgeon, Central Province, *re* case of a market stall employee suffering from leprosy detected by him, on a casual visit to the market, and suggesting the desirability of detailing a wholtime Sanitary Inspector for the effective sanitary supervision of the market.—Recommended that the Ward Sanitary Inspector be required to give closer attention to the market and that the question of a wholtime Revenue and Sanitary Inspector for the whole market be brought up before the next Budget Meeting.
- (6) Draft of proposed addition to by-law 300 of the Council's by-laws *re* eating-houses to permit of the control of ovens in eating-houses, &c., by the roadside.—Recommended. No preparation of food by baking or cooking to be carried on in the front portion of any eating-house or tea kiosk.

- (10) Papers *re* the claim of the Halloluwa Ferry Renter for compensation for the loss sustained by him owing to the Council not having supplied him with a ferry boat till July 7, 1930.—Recommended that the renter be allowed a rebate of Rs. 63.
- (11) Accountant's report dated March 31, 1931, regarding fees amounting to Rs. 1,041 outstanding from the public in respect of the upkeep and maintainance of graves for 1929 and 1930.—Recommended to write to those who have not paid for upkeep, that the Council will not maintain such graves.

(28) Papers *re* the suggestion made by the Audit that minimum rates should be imposed on consumers of electrical energy, as done in Colombo and Galle.—Not recommended at present.

(29) Estimate for Rs. 50 from the Municipal Electrical Engineer for providing additional spouts for males and females at the bathing place near the Power Station.—Recommended.

(30) Application from the new occupier of premises No. 14 A, Ward street (Rental No. 183) for restoration of lights, which were cut off in August, 1930, for default of a fine of Rs. 100 imposed on the then occupier for unauthorized connection to adjoining boutique and for theft of current.—Recommended not to give lights unless the fine is paid, but to write to the owner explaining the position.

Resolved that the recommendations be adopted with the exception of items (12) and (19) deferred for next meeting.

8. Recommendations of the Special Committee appointed to consider the details as to how and when the conservancy and scavenging of the town should be given on contract.

(1) That there should be prepared for the Council's consideration a draft specification for hiring lorries required for the two services.

(2) That there should be prepared for the Council's consideration a draft specification for scavenging of the Peradeniya Area, with a view to invite tenders, the carts and coolies required to be found by the Contractor.

Resolved that the recommendations be adopted.

9. The Chairman moved the Council into Committee and informed the Members of His Excellency Sir Graeme Thomson's intended visit to Kandy, on May 21 and of the arrangements made for the Chairman and Members to receive him.
