VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended July 11, 1931.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 136 (1 European, 10 Burghers, 86 Sinhalese, 13 Tamils, 17 Moors, 6 Malays, and 3 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1931, viz., 284,440) was 24.9, as against 26.4 in the preceding week, 31.6 in the corresponding week of last year, and 33.9 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 146 (2 Europeans, 6 Burghers, 78 Sinhalese, 26 Tamils, 28 Moors, 4 Malays, and 2 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 26.8, as against 28.0 in the previous week, 43.7 in the corresponding week of last year, and 29.5 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 146 total deaths, 28 were of infants under one year of age, as against 37 in the preceding week, 48 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 32 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 10.

Principal Causes of Deaths.—1. (a) Seventeen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 9 in Maradana hospitals (including 5 deaths of non-residents), 4 in Kotahena South, and 1 each in Maradana North, Maradana South, Slave Island, and Kollupitiya, as against 27 in the previous week and 18 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Thirteen deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 4 in Slave Island, 3 in New Bazaar, 2 in St. Paul's, and 1 each in San Sebastian, Kotahena North, Kotahena South, and Kollupitiya, as against 20 in the previous week and 8 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Seven deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 2 in Kotahena South and 1 each in New Bazaar, Maradana hospitals, Maradana North, Maradana South, and Wellawatta North, as against 8 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year.

2. Thirteen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 9 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents) and 1 each in St. Paul's, Maradana North, Kollupitiya, and Wellawatta South, as against 12 in the previous week and 12 the weekly average for last year.

3. One death from *Enteric Fever* was registered in Maradana hospitals, as against 2 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year.

4. Seven deaths from *Enteritis* were registered, 6 from *Debility*, 4 from *Dysentery*, 2 each from *Worms and Accidents*, 1 each from *Diarrhoea*, *Tetanus*, *Homicide*, and *Puerperal Septicaemia*, and 7C from *Other Causes*.

5. **Reported Cases.**—Six cases of *Enteric Fever*, 2 of *Chickenpox*, and 1 of *Measles* were reported during the week, as against 4, 1, and nil, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 81.0°, against 80.9° in the preceding week and 82.2° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.870 in., against 29.851 in. in the preceding week and 29.856 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 2.17 in., against 3.48 in. in the preceding week and 0.19 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

Code of Regulations for Assisted Vernacular and Bilingual Schools.

THE following amendments to the Code of Regulations for Assisted Vernacular and Bilingual schools, which have been passed by the Board of Education, are hereby published for general information in accordance with section 10 (2) of Ordinance No. 1 of 1920.

Amendments referred to.

Clause 20 (ii).—Alter to read as follows:—

“ A time table or time tables showing the work of each class for the following year should be approved by the Inspector either at the annual inspection or as soon as possible thereafter. A summary giving the number of teaching hours per week during which each member of the staff will be employed in the following year should also be available for inspection.”

Clause 24 (e).—(i.) In line 1 alter “ There is a practising school in which ” to “ There are adequate facilities for school practice where ”;

(ii.) In line 5 alter “ a satisfactory Infant Department ” to “ satisfactory Infant Departments ”;

(iii.) In the first sentence delete “ and under the same management ”;

(iv.) Add the following: “ The teachers of those classes in which the students practise must be at least certificated. The staffs may consist entirely of trained teachers.”

Clause 24.—Present clause 24 to be renumbered 24 (i.) Add a new sub-clause as follows:—

24 (ii.) The number of students that may be accepted by a Training School will be decided by the following conditions:—

(a) At least 20 square feet per student must be provided in the lecture rooms. There must be additional accommodation for criticism lessons;

(b) At least 16 square feet per student must be provided in the dining rooms;

(c) At least 48 square feet per student must be provided in the dormitories;

(d) Adequate equipment must be provided by the Manager;

(e) There must be adequate facilities for work and recreation out of doors;

(f) For teaching practice there must be an average attendance of at least 6 pupils for each student in training.

Clause 25 (b).—Add the following: “ Each student shall be given, under the supervision of the Training School,

staff, practice in the art of teaching for a minimum of 90 hours during each year of his course. In the case of students who are registered teachers, the minimum may be reduced to 60 hours."

Clause 31.—In line 2 after "conditions" insert the following: "or which ceases to provide adequate and suitable instruction as required by Clause 4."

Clause 59 (b).—Alter to read as follows:—

"The grant paid to a Training School which satisfies the conditions for registration is:—

(i.) The salary cost of the approved staff.

The staff will be approved for grant on the following basis:—

21-40 residential students	3
41-50 residential students	4

(ii.) A sum not exceeding Rs. 25 per unit of average attendance of residential students, towards the actual expenditure on the maintenance of buildings and also on the purchase of new equipment previously approved by the Director.

(iii.) In addition, a sum not exceeding Rs. 100 per unit of average attendance of residential students may be paid for the purpose of awarding scholarships to residential students."

Clause 62.—In line 4 alter "condition" to "conditions"; in line 5 alter "Clause 63" to "Clauses 61 and 63".

Clause 76.—After the words "Vernacular School-Leaving Certificate" insert the following "or the English School-Leaving Certificate with Tamil or Sinhalese or the Cambridge Junior Certificate with Tamil or Sinhalese".

Surveying and Levelling Examination.

THE examination for the Surveyor-General's licence in surveying and levelling (Ordinance No. 26 of 1909), will be held in two parts, written and practical. The written examination will begin on October 12, and the practical examination on November 9, 1931.

2. The examination will be held in Colombo only.

3. To enter for the above examination application must be made on the form prescribed by the regulations. These forms can be obtained from the Surveyor-General.

4. Candidates must pay the following fees to the Surveyor-General before the date of closing of entries, viz., September 14, 1931:—

5. The subjects of the written examination will be as follows:—

(i.) *English*—one paper.—[An exercise in composition and questions set to test the candidate's knowledge and command of English.]

(ii.) *Arithmetic and Algebra*—one paper.—[*Arithmetic.*—The principles and process of arithmetic applied to whole numbers and vulgar and decimal fractions. The metric system. Approximations to a specified degree of accuracy. Contracted methods of multiplication and division of decimals. Ratio and proportion; percentage. Averages. Practical applications of arithmetic.]

Algebra.—Symbolical expression of general results in arithmetic algebraic laws and their applications. Factors of simple binomial or quadratic expressions; Equations of the first or second degree, and problems leading thereto. Square root. Graphs of simple rational integral algebraic functions. Arithmetical and harmonical progression. Geometrical progression. Theory of indices. Logarithms and the use of logarithmic tables. Binomial theorem for a positive integral index.]

(iii.) *Geometry and Trigonometry*—one paper.

[*Geometry.*—The subjects of Euclid I.—IV., with simple deductions, including easy loci and the areas of triangles and parallelograms, of which the bases and altitudes are given commensurable lengths. (All proofs of geometrical theorems must be geometrical. Euclid's proofs will not be insisted upon.) Similar figures. Mensuration of the circle. Mensuration of the simpler solid bodies, namely, the cube, the rectangular block, the tetrahedron, the sphere, the cylinder, the wedge, the pyramid, and the cone.]

Trigonometry.—Up to and including the solution of triangles, together with the practical solutions of triangles and applications, and numerical examples involving the use of logarithmic and other tables.]

(iv.) *Surveying*—one paper.—[Chain surveying. The transit and cradle theodolites, their use and their adjustments. Theodolite and compass traverses. Curve ranging. Subtense methods and tachometry. Plane table surveying. Plane triangulation. The determination of azimuth.]

(v.) *Levelling*—one paper.—[The dumpy, Y and Cooke's reversible levels, their use and their adjustments. The practice and theory of levelling. Computation of earthwork. Road and railway surveys and setting out. Surveys for water supply works. Contours and the calculation of contents therefrom.]

The percentages of marks required for a pass will be: in papers (i.), (ii.), and (iii.) 40 per cent. in each paper and 50 per cent. in aggregate; in papers (iv.) and (v.) 60 per cent.

6. Candidates in surveying only will be required to pass in papers (i.)—(iv.) inclusive; and candidates in levelling only in paper (v.).

7. Candidates who fail in the written examination will not be required to present themselves for the practical examination.

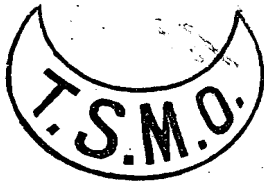
