PROCLAMATIONS BY THE GOVERNOR.

BY HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR.

A PROCLAMATION.

GRAEME THOMSON.

WHEREAS under section 3 of "The Seashore Protection Ordinance, 1911," the Governor may, with the advice of the Executive Council, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, proclaim any part of the seashore of this Island as an area from or over which no sand, stone, coral, or other substance shall be removed:

And whereas on and after the date when the first election of Executive Committees and the first appointment of Ministers in accordance with the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931, shall be complete, all powers, authorities, and functions which at the said date shall be vested by any written law in the Governor in Executive Council, howsoever the association of the said Council with the Governor may be described in any such law, shall, so far as the same shall continue in existence and be capable of being exercised after the said date, be vested in the Governor:

Know Ye that We, the Governor, do hereby, under section 3 of "The Seashore Protection Ordinance, 1911," proclaim that part of the seashore of this Island which is specified and defined in the schedule hereto as an area from or over which no sand, stone, coral, or other substance shall be removed as from July 30, 1931.

SCHEDULE.

That part of the sea and seashore between the eastern limit of the Valvedditurai Sanitary Board area and a point 100 yards east of the Point Pedro Lighthouse and adjacent to the villages of Polikandi, Alvai West, Alvai North, Puloly West, Point Pedro, Puloly East, and Thumpalai in the Vadamaradchi division of the Jaffna District; and bounded as follows:—

On the east by an imaginary straight line drawn from a point 100 yards east of the Point Pedro Lighthouse due northward to a distance of one mile and due southward as far as the Coast road.

On the south by the Coast road.

On the west by an imaginary straight line drawn along the eastern limit of the Valvedditurai Sanitary Board area and then due northward to a distance of one mile.

On the north by an imaginary straight line drawn from the seaward extremity of the western boundary line due east to meet the eastern boundary line.

BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

1. The following area is hereby declared to be the "market area" of the Urban District Council, Kurunegala, viz.:—The area bounded on the west by a line drawn from a point on the Puttalam road two chains on the north-west of its junction with the Circular road parallel with the Circular road, and at a distance of two chains from it up to the Wilgoda-ela, thence directly to a point on the Negombo road two chains to the west of its junction with the old Negombo road, otherwise called the Malkaduwa Circular, and thence to a point two chains due south of the Negombo road; on the south by a line drawn from the southern end of the western boundary parallel with the said old Negombo road or Malkaduwa Circular, and two chains distant

from it as far as the Colombo road, thence straight to a point six chains south of the 1½ milepost on the Kandy road, and from this point to the sea; on the east along this sea to a point where the sea crosses the Kandy road, and from a line drawn from this point to the 1½ milepost on the Dambulla road and thence to a point half a mile due north; on the north by a line drawn from the northern extremity of the eastern boundary to the northern-most point of the western boundary.

2. Subject to section 163 (5) of the principal Ordinance no person shall within the "market area" sell any meat, poultry, fresh fish, fruits, or vegetables at any place other than the public market or a duly licensed "private market".

3. Any person may sell fruits or vegetables at premises duly licensed by the Chairman outside a radius of one mile from the public market (situated at junction of Colombo and Kandy roads near the War Memorial Clock Tower) and such premises shall comply with the following conditions:—

- (i.) The licensee shall pay in advance to the Council for every year a fee of Rs. 6 in respect of such premises.
- (ii.) The premises should be in good repair, well ventilated, lighted, and the walls of the rooms limeplastered and lime-washed from the ceiling to within three feet of the floor. The remaining space of three feet above the floor shall be plastered with cement. The floor shall be cemented.

4. A keeper of a licensed eating-house or tea and coffee boutique within the "market area" may sell ripe plantains on the licensed premises.

5. Any person may sell young coconuts anywhere within the "market area".

6. No person shall sell meat or fish within the "market area" except at the public market.

7. Any person committing a breach of any one of the above by-laws shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding Rs. 50 for any one offence, and in the case of a continuing offence, an additional fine not exceeding Rs. 25 for every day during which the offence is committed after conviction, or written notice from the Chairman of such contravention. This clause shall not apply to persons punishable under section 162 of the principal Ordinance.

3. No person shall wash or cause to be washed any cattle, horse, goat, sheep, dog, pig, or any other animal, or any clothes, mats or other thing at or near any public well or at any place set apart as a public bathing place, or shall lead, drive, or take any such animal into any such public bathing place for any purpose whatsoever.

4. No person shall in any manner pollute the precincts of any public well or public bathing place.

5. Any person committing a breach of any of the above by-laws shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding Rs. 50, and in the case of a continuing offence, to an additional fine not exceeding Rs. 25 for every day during which the offence is committed after conviction.

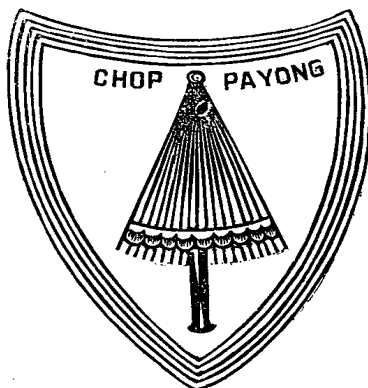

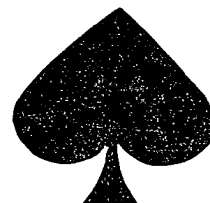

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended August 1, 1931.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 130 (1 European, 11 Burghers, 74 Sinhalese, 22 Tamils, 17 Moors, 2 Malays, and 3 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1931, viz., 289,150) was 23·4, as against 27·7 in the preceding week, 27·5 in the corresponding week of last year, and 33·9 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 149 (4 Burghers, 86 Sinhalese, 32 Tamils, 16 Moors, 4 Malays, and 7 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 26·9, as against 27·3 in the previous week, 38·7 in the corresponding week of last year, and 29·5 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 149 total deaths, 38 were of infants under one year of age, as against 29 in the preceding week, 46 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 32 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 8.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Twenty-eight deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 14 in Maradana hospitals (including 5 deaths of non-residents), 4 each in Kotahena South and New Bazaar, 2 in Kollupitiya and 1 each in San Sebastian, Kotahena North, Maradana North, and Wellawatta South as against 9 in the previous week and 18, the weekly average for last year.

(b) Nine deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 4 in Slave Island, 2 each in New Bazaar and Wellawatta South and 1 in Kotahena North as against 18 in the previous week and 8, the weekly average for last year.

(c) Two deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 1 each in New Bazaar and Maradana North, as against 8 in the previous week and 4, the weekly average for last year.

2. (a) Seventeen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 11 in Maradana hospitals (including 7 deaths of non-residents), 2 in New Bazaar and 1 each in Kotahena South, Maradana North, Maradana East, and Wellawatta South, as against 8 in the previous week and 12, the weekly average for last year.

(b) One death from *Phthisis* of a resident of Colombo Town, occurred at the Anti-Tuberculosis Hospital, Ragama, during the week.

3. One death from *Enteric Fever* was registered in Maradana hospitals, as against 3 in the previous week and 4, the weekly average for last year.

4. Three deaths from *Plague* were registered in St. Paul's, as against 1 in the previous week and 1, the weekly average for last year.

5. Eleven deaths from *Enteritis* were registered, 5 each from *Diarrhoea* and *Debility*, 4 each from *Dysentery* and *Worms*, 2 from *Accidents*, 1 from *Infantile Convulsions* and 57 from *Other Causes*.

6. *Reported Cases.*—Three cases of *Enteric Fever*, 2 of *Chicken-Pox*, and 4 of *Plague* were reported during the week, as against 3, 5, and 1 respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 81·4°, against 79·7° in the preceding week and 80·3° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·833 in., against 29·871 in. in the preceding week and 29·863 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 1·23 in., against 3·97 in. in the preceding week and 0·78 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
