Regulation 5 of the regulations in Chapter 4 of the regulations published in *Gazette* No. 7,765 of March 7, 1930, is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor:—

Rents, tolls, and fees as shown in schedule below shall be leviable for the use of the markets. Copies of this schedule in English, Sinhalese, and Tamil shall be placed in a conspicuous spot at each market, and it shall not be lawful for any person to demand or receive higher sums than those authorized by such notice.

CHAPTER XXII.

Penalties.

Whoever shall commit any breach of any of the foregoing by-laws by doing any act prohibited or declared to be an offence by any such by-laws, or by neglecting to do any act directed to be done by any such by-laws, or in any wise howsoever, shall on conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding one hundred rupees in the case of a first offence, and in the case of a second or subsequent offence, a fine not exceeding two hundred rupees, and in the case of a continuing offence, an additional fine not exceeding twenty-five rupees for every day during which the offence is continued after conviction or written notice from the Chairman of such contravention.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the week ended August 8, 1931.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 177 (1 European, 11 Burghers, 110 Sinhalese, 30 Tamils, 20 Moors, 4 Malays, and 1 Other). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1931, viz., 289,150) was 31·9, as against 23·4 in the preceding week, 26·6 in the corresponding week of last year, and 33·9 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 151 (2 Europeans, 6 Burghers, 87 Sinhalese, 26 Tamils, 25 Moors, 3 Malays, and 2 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 27·2, as against 26·9 in the previous week, 40·7 in the corresponding week of last year, and 29·5 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 151 total deaths, 42 were of infants under one year of age, as against 38 in the preceding week, 48 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 32 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 9.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Nineteen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 9 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents), 2 each in Kotahena North, New Bazaar, and Maradana South, and 1 each in St. Paul's, San Sebastian, Kotahena South, and Wellawatta North, as against 28 in the previous week, and 18 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Sixteen deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 3 each in St. Paul's, New Bazaar, and Slave Island, 2 each in San Sebastian and Kotahena South, and 1 each in Maradana hospitals, Maradana North, and Wellawatta North, as against 9 in the previous week, and 8 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Three deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 1 each in New Bazaar, Maradana hospitals, and Maradana North, as against 2 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.

2. (a) Eleven deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 7 in Maradana hospitals (including 4 deaths of non-residents), 2 in New Bazaar, and 1 each in Maradana North and Wellawatta North, as against 17 in the previous week, and 12 the weekly average for last year.

(b) One death from *Phthisis* of a resident of Colombo Town, occurred at the Anti-Tuberculosis Hospital, Ragama, during the week.

3. Four deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), as against 1 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.

4. One death from *Plague* was registered in St. Paul's, as against 3 in the previous week, and 1 the weekly average for last year.

5. Nine deaths from *Enteritis* were registered, 6 from *Debility*, 5 each from *Infantile Convulsions* and *Worms*, 3 each from *Diarrhoea* and *Dysentery*, 2 each from *Puerperal Septicæmia* and *Accidents*, 1 from *Suicide*, and 61 from *Other Causes*.

6. *Reported Cases.*—Nine cases of *Chickenpox*, 6 of *Enteric Fever* and 1 of *Plague* were reported during the week, as against 2, 3, and 4 respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 80·8°, against 81·4° in the preceding week and 80·7° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·832 in. against 29·833 in. in the preceding week and 29·880 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 2·19 in. against 1·23 in. in the preceding week and 0·02 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

A PROCLAMATION.

GRAEME THOMSON.

WHEREAS by section 4 (1) of "The Repression of Crime (Consolidation) Ordinance, 1903," it is enacted that when it appears to the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council from time to time that by reason of the existence or apprehension of crime and outrage in any District, it is desirable to quarter Police in such District, or should a Police Force have been already established there, to increase the same, he may by Proclamation, which shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, declare that for the reason aforesaid such District requires Police, or additional Police, and may order Police to be quartered in such District, or additional Police be employed there:

And whereas Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931, vests in the Governor all powers, authorities, and functions which shall be vested by any written law in the Governor in Executive Council on and after the date when the first election of Executive Committees and the first appointment of Ministers shall be complete:

And whereas the said election of Executive Committees and the said appointment of Ministers was complete on July 9, 1931:

And whereas it appears to the Governor that by reason of the existence of crime and outrage in the village defined in the schedule hereto annexed, it is desirable to quarter Police in the said village for a period of three months:

Now know Ye that I, the said Governor, by virtue of the aforesaid powers, do hereby declare that by reason of the existence of crime and outrage therein, the said village in the Jaffna District requires Police, and do hereby order that a Police Force consisting of one sergeant and six constables be quartered in the said village in the said Jaffna District as from and after the Fifteenth day of August, 1931.

And I do further hereby define the limits of the said village to be those set out in the schedule hereunto annexed.

Given at Colombo, in the Island of Ceylon, this Twelfth day of August, in the year of Our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Thirty-one.
