## VITAL STATISTICS.

### Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended August 15, 1931.

**Births.**—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 168 (6 Burghers, 104 Sinhalese, 29 Tamils, 17 Moors, 5 Malays, and 7 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1931, viz., 289,150) was 30.3, as against 31.9 in the preceding week, 28.7 in the corresponding week of last year, and 33.9 the weekly average for last year.

**Deaths.**—The total deaths registered were 147 (1 European, 4 Burghers, 88 Sinhalese, 29 Tamils, 19 Moors, 3 Malays, and 3 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 26.5, as against 27.2 in the previous week, 35.6 in the corresponding week of last year, and 29.5 the weekly average for last year.

**Infantile Deaths.**—Of the 147 total deaths, 32 were of infants under one year of age, as against 42 in the preceding week, 31 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 32 the average for last year.

**Stillbirths.**—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 19.

**Principal Causes of Death.**—1. (a) Seventeen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 7 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents), 2 in Kotahena North, and 1 each in St. Paul's, San Sebastian, Kotahena South, New Bazaar, Maradana North, Maradana East, Kollupitiya, and Wellawatta North, as against 19 in the previous week, and 18 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Seventeen deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 4 in Kotahena South, 2 each in Maradana hospitals (of non-residents) and Slave Island, and 1 each in Pettah, St. Paul's, San Sebastian, Kotahena North, New Bazaar, Maradana South, Kollupitiya, Wellawatta North, and Wellawatta South, as against 16 in the previous week, and 8 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Five deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 2 in Slave Island and 1 each in Maradana hospitals, Maradana North, and Maradana South, as against 3 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.

2. (a) Fourteen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 6 in Maradana hospitals (including 4 deaths of non-residents) 3 in Kotahena South, and 1 each in Fort, St. Paul's, Kotahena North, Maradana South, and Wellawatta North, as against 11 in the previous week, and 12 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Three deaths from *Phthisis* of residents of Colombo town, occurred at the Anti-tuberculosis Hospital, Ragama, during the week.

3. Five deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 4 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents) and 1 in Slave Island, as against 4 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.

4. One death from *Plague* was registered in Kotahena South, as against 1 in the previous week, and 1 the weekly average for last year.

5. Fifteen deaths from *Enteritis* were registered, 8 from *Debility*, 7 from *Worms*, 3 each from *Dysentery* and *Infantile Convulsions*, 1 each from *Diarrhoea*, *Tetanus*, *Homicide*, *Puerperal Septicaemia*, and *Accidents*, and 47 from *Other Causes*.

6. **Reported Cases.**—Seven cases of *Enteric Fever* and 1 of *Plague* were reported during the week, as against 6 and 1, respectively, of the preceding week.

**State of the Weather.**—The mean temperature of air was 80.7°, against 80.8° in the preceding week and 80.7° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 298.62 in., against 298.32 in. in the preceding week and 299.12 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 1.43 in. against 2.19 in. in the preceding week, and 0.02 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

## MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

## General Meeting.

Wednesday, July 8, 1931, at 3 p.m.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice, dated July 1, 1931.

*Present* :—Mr. W. T. Stace, B.A., Litt. D., C.C.S., J. P., Chairman; Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader; Dr. E. V. Ratnam; Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando; Dr. E. A. Coorey; Mr. G. W. Dodds; Mr. T. G. Jayewardene, V.D., J.P.; Mr. N. R. Blande; Mr. M. L. M. Reyal; Dr. S. Muttiah; Mr. T. C. Dyball; Mr. F. Dadabhoy, J.P.; Lieut.-Colonel F. A. Ferguson, D.S.O.; Mr. G. K. Thornhill; Mr. J. S. Collett; and Dr. L. A. Prins, I.S.O.

Before proceeding to the business of the meeting, Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader, on behalf of the Council, welcomed Mr. W. T. Stace, as Mayor of Colombo, and Chairman of the Council.

Mr. Abdul Cader next paid a tribute to Mr. H. E. Newnham for his services to the Council during the seven years of his successful tenure of the post of Mayor and Chairman. He reviewed the principal achievements of the Council during that term, under Mr. Newnham's guidance, and bore witness to the strenuous and conscientious work he had done. He moved that the appreciation of the Council be recorded in the Minutes.

Dr. E. V. Ratnam, in seconding the motion, cordially endorsed the remarks made by the senior Member.

Mr. W. T. Stace thanked Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader for the kind words of welcome and associated himself with the tribute of appreciation of the services rendered by Mr. H. E. Newnham.

The motion was carried with acclamation.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of June 10, 1931, having been previously printed and copies thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read.

Resolved that the Minutes of the General Meeting of June 10, 1931, be confirmed.

2. Pursuant to notice, Dr. S. Muttiah presented a petition from certain residents of Wellawatta Ward, residing in the section between Lauries road and Dickman's road, representing the urgent necessity for widening this section of the Galle road, or at least as far as Vajira road, and requested that it be submitted to the appropriate Committee for consideration.

Dr. S. Muttiah stated that he was submitting the petition with the approval of the Ward Member.

3. Pursuant to notice, Dr. E. V. Ratnam asked the following questions which the Chairman answered :—

(1) Q.—Whether the further information on the improvement of sewage treatment, which the Municipal Engineer was promised from India, as recorded in Chairman's minute of August 9, 1929, in the file of papers No. 6,164B on the subject, has been received and what action has been taken to effect improvements in the treatment works at Madampitiya in the light of such information. If this information has not yet been received, will the Chairman be pleased to explain why the same has not been obtained so long? A.—Further information was received early in 1930, and a plan has been prepared for making a trial of sewage treatment in Colombo on the Simplex system. The cost of making such a trial would be about 2 lak s of rupees. This proposal was included in the works submitted for consideration to the Four Standing Committees in dealing with the Budgets for 1930 and 1931, but no funds were voted. The matter was not pressed because of the other and more urgent drainage work then under consideration by the Committees. As soon as the money is voted, the plans and estimates can be completed and the work can be taken up.

(2) Q.—Why has the Municipal Council's Amendment Ordinance, No. 12 of 1931, which provides for allowing monthly remission of rates on untenanted buildings, not been given effect as from October 1, 1930, as per resolution of Council of October 1, 1930? A.—The Ordinance, as passed by the Legislative Council, is not retrospective. Immediately it received the Governor's assent, a notice was published in the Press informing the ratepayers of the possibility of remissions from July 1, 1931.

4. The following motion stood in the name of Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando :—That the sale of vested properties on which no taxes are due to the Council be postponed for one year, as at the present time of depression such properties will not fetch anything like their true marketable value.

With the permission of the Council, Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando moved that the motion be referred to the Standing Committees on Municipal Works and Finance (meeting together). Mr. M. L. M. Reyal seconded.—Carried.

5. The following motion stood in the name of Mr. M. L. M. Reyal :—“That provision be made, under section 117 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, to enable owners of properties to obtain an alteration of annual values after the latter have been approved, provided proof is supplied that the rentals subsequent to the acceptance of the annual values had fallen.”

With the permission of Council, Mr. M. L. M. Reyal moved that the motion be withdrawn. Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando seconded.—Carried.

6. Pursuant to notice, the Chairman moved—That the Council should resolve itself into a Committee of the whole Council to consider the following extracts from the proceedings of the Committees annexed to the agenda. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried.

*Council in Committee—*

*The following Extract from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Sanitation and Markets of March 17, 1931, was considered.*

MUNICIPAL ENGINEER'S DEPARTMENT.

(9) To consider a memorandum of the Chairman, dated December 19, 1930, regarding flooding near Manning place, suggesting that the Council should determine, under section 188 (d) of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, that the natural water-course, shown in blue in plan D 1,198 of December 2, 1930, into which rainwater has heretofore been discharged, shall remain open for the reception of such rainwater. Registered No. 79.—Recommended.

*Resolution of Council in Committee.*

Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader opposed the recommendation of the Standing Committee. The Chairman detailed the facts in connection with this matter.

Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader moved that the recommendation of the Standing Committee be not accepted. Mr. M. L. M. Reyal seconded. The motion was put to the meeting and lost.

*The following Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Sanitation and Markets of June 22, 1931, were considered.*

WATERWORKS DEPARTMENT.

(2) To consider—(a) The question of improvements to filters and the estimate of Rs. 4,243 from the Jewell Export Filter Co., for the necessary plant. This estimate does not include Customs duty, landing, and transport. The full cost will be met from Advance Account, Stores, Waterworks, in the first instance, and then debited to estimate K-24 when the plant is drawn for use. (b) The tender, dated April 11, 1931, from the Imperial Chemical Industries (India), Ltd., sole distributors in the East, for the supply of chemicals in steel cylinders at the rate of 50 cents per lb. for which provision is made in item No. 2 of Estimate K-24, Rs. 4,000. Registered No. 597.—Recommended (a) and (b).

## VETERINARY DEPARTMENT.

(3) To select from the applicants and submit to the Council the names of 6 candidates for the 2 posts of Veterinary Inspectors, indicating, if the Committee think fit, the candidates whom they recommended Council to appoint. Registered No. 595.—Recommended that Mr. A. P. Selvaretnam, G.B.V.C., and Mr. K. N. Subramaniam, G.B.V.C. be appointed, and that the other officers of the Department, on the Sub-Inspectors' grade of pay, should receive special consideration when they reach the maximum pay of their grade.

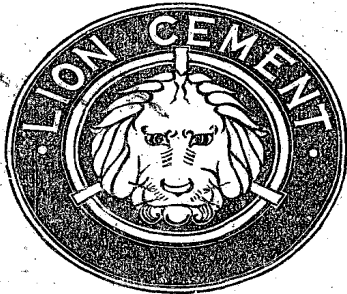
