KNOW Ye that We, the Governor, by virtue of the powers vested in Us by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931, do hereby, under section 31 of "The Births and Deaths Registration Ordinance, 1895," with effect from September 1, 1931, amend the schedule to the Proclamation under the said section dated September 12, 1921, published in *Gazette* No. 7,213 of September 23, 1921, by substituting for the words therein appearing and reproduced in column I. of the schedule hereto, the words appearing in column II. of the schedule hereto.

## SCHEDULE.

## Province of Sabaragamuwa—Ratnapura District.

## Column I.

## Ratnapura Town.

*Boundaries.*—On the north, a straight line from the north-western boundary of T. P. 99,563 running eastwards direct to a point where it meets the railway line, thence southwards along the railway line to a point where it meets the railway bridge over the Katugas-ela, thence a straight line eastwards direct to a point three chains from the northern-most bend of the Outer Circular road, thence a straight line eastwards direct to a point three chains from the junction of the Mahayala estate road and Malwala road, thence a line running eastward parallel with and three chains to the north of the Malwala road to where it meets the Magurankanagina-dola; on the east, along the Magurankanagina-dola southwards to its junction with the Kalu-ganga, thence along the Kalu-ganga southwards to where it meets the Uman-dola, and along the Uman-dola to where it meets the Ehelapolawella, thence southwards along the Ehelapolawella to where it meets the Kirimeti-dola, and thence along the Kirimeti-dola to where it meets the Ketan-dola, and thence along the Ketan-dola to where it meets the We-ganga; on the south, along the We-ganga westwards to a point three chains to the south of the Karawita road, thence a line running parallel with and to the south of the Karawita road to a point where it meets the Mudduwa village boundary; on the west, along the village boundary of Mudduwa and Muwagama northwards to where it meets the Podgolly trig, thence a straight line running north-eastward direct to a point where it meets the Muwagamatotapla on the Kalu-ganga, thence along the Kalu-ganga westwards to a point where the Kotamba-ela meets the river, thence along the Kotamba-ela to a point where it meets the southern boundary of Galkaduwanukalana, thence a line following the southern and eastern boundary of Galkaduwanukalana to a point where it meets the north-western boundary of land in T. P. 99,563.

## Column II.

## Ratnapura Town.

## Boundaries.

*North.*—A line starting from the north-west corner of T. P. 99,563 running north-eastwards along the village limit of Weralupe B. S. P. P. 347 as far as the railway line; thence south-eastwards along the village limits of Weralupe to where it meets the Katugas-ela; thence along the Ekwalawella to the point where it crosses the village boundary of Godigomuwa, B. S. P. P. 346; thence along the village limits of Godigomuwa to where it meets the Magurankanaima-dola; thence southwards along the said dola to its junction with the Kalu-ganga; thence along the Kalu-ganga southwards to where it meets the Uman-dola and along the Uman-dola to the southern extremity of the western boundary of lot 67 in B. S. P. P. 15; thence along the western boundary of lot 67, northern boundary of lot 64 to where it meets the footpath lot 52½; thence along the footpath lot 52½ and the continuation of the footpath as far as it forms the northern boundary of lot 54; thence along the northern boundary of lots 54 and 55, the western and northern boundaries of lot 58 to where it meets lot 59; thence southwards along the western boundary of lot 59 until it meets the village limit of Kolandagala B. S. P. P. 31.

*East.*—From the last mentioned point along the south-eastern boundaries of lots 58 and 144, the northern and western boundaries of lot 145 to where it meets lot 149B, thence along the western boundary of lot 149B to where it meets lot 149; thence along the northern boundaries of lots 149, 149A, the western boundary of lot 149A, to where it meets lot 245; thence along the western boundary of lot 245 till it meets lot 247; thence along the northern boundary of lot 247 to where it meets lot 247c; thence westwards along the northern and western boundaries of lot 247c and the western boundary of lot 247D to where it meets the Kongaha-ela; thence along the Kongaha-ela and southwards along the Ehelapolawella to where it meets the western boundary of lot 247G; thence along the said boundary and the western boundaries of lots 247I, 247J, and 247N; thence westwards along the northern boundaries of lots 247N and 247O; thence along the western and southern boundaries of lot 247R to where it meets the western boundary of lot 247R; thence southwards along this boundary to where it meets the Ehelapolawella and along the Ehelapolawella (old) to where it meets the Ketan-dola and along the Ketan-dola until it meets the Dodangaha-ela.

*South.*—From the last mentioned point along the Dodangaha-ela until it meets the Wey-ganga; thence along the Wey-ganga westwards to a point three chains to the south of the Karawita road; thence a line drawn south-westwards through the land known as Walawita claimed by D. H. W. Tennakoon to the north-east corner of paddy field known as Lintota claimed by the heirs of G. Maddamahamy and others; thence along the northern boundaries of the above paddy field, Ekwalawella claimed by E. L. Ratanahamy and others, Ampitiya claimed by D. P. S. Samaranayaka and others; thence southwards along the Gansabhawa road to Hakamuwa to a point at the north-eastern corner of land known as Ampitiya claimed by E. L. Ratanahamy and others; thence along the northern boundaries of Ampitiya and Gamagewatta claimed by the heirs of G. Maddamahamy, north-western boundary of Angulmaduwewatta claimed by B. M. K. Thaliss and others, northern and western boundaries of Pahalawatta claimed by D. M. Baron Appuhamy, Ponnahettigewatta claimed by K. M. Dingirimahatmaya, Nindawattapahalawatta claimed by K. M. Heen Nilame Mudianse and others, western boundary of Kalawitigoda claimed by D. M. Baron

Appuhamy and others, Gamagemahakumbura claimed by D. H. W. Tennakoon and others, northern boundary of Buddagekumbura claimed by H. P. Mamimahatmaya and others, northern and western boundaries of Nindekumbura claimed by James Benderagama and others, northern boundaries of Paranadolawekumbura claimed by D. D. P. Gunasekera and others, Lindagawagederawatta claimed by D. M. P. Gunasekera and others, northern boundaries of Batuwitagewatta claimed by Elmore Jayatileke, Galpita-gahawatta claimed by B. M. Bastian Appu and others, and northern and western boundaries of Yapatigewatta claimed by B. A. M. Ranmenike and others, Angammanawatta and Welahondagahapitiyawatta claimed by Elapatage Appuhamy and others, thence southwards along the Etoya-ela up to the anicut; and thence southwards along the road to Et-oya up to a point at the north-east corner of paddy field known as Bathamure claimed by Dingirimudiyanse and others; thence along the north-western boundaries of the above-mentioned paddy field, northern boundary of Tickawila claimed by Arthur Ellawala and others, Wiharagedeniya claimed by D. H. W. Tennakoon to a point where it meets the eastern boundary of lot 71 in F. V. P. 80; thence south-eastwards along the eastern boundary of lot 71 until it meets the village limit of Et-oya F. V. P. 82; thence south-westwards along the village limits of Et-oya until it meets the village limit of Amuwala F. V. P. 81.

*West.*—Along the village limits of Amuwala F. V. P. 81 and Wadumulla F. V. P. 78, north-westwards until it meets Pothgulkanda trig station; thence a line drawn north-eastwards to Galamune-dola to its most south-western point; thence along the Galamune-dola to the north-east corner of lot 31A in F. V. P. 74; thence westwards along the northern boundaries of lots 31A, 31, 2V, south-western boundary of lot 2R and south-eastern boundary of lot 26 to the Elege-dola; thence along Elege-dola northwards to the south-west corner of lot 19A; thence along the southern boundaries of lots 19A, 19B, 19, western boundary of lot 2G, northern boundary of lots 2F, 2G, 2H, western and southern boundaries of lots 27 and 1 to Mullewatta-ela; thence along the said ela to the Kalu-ganga; thence westwards along the Kalu-ganga to where it meets Kotambe-ela; thence along the said ela to the main road to Panadure; thence along the eastern limits of Dewalegawa village F. V. P. 238, southern and eastern limits of Weralupe village B. S. P. P. 347 to the starting point of the northern boundary.

"THE CEMETERIES AND BURIALS ORDINANCE, 1899."

## CODE OF REGULATIONS FOR ASSISTED VERNACULAR AND BILINGUAL SCHOOLS.

THE following amendments to the Code of Regulations for Assisted Vernacular and Bilingual schools, which have been passed by the Board of

AMENDMENTS REFERRED TO.

Clause 20 (ii).—Alter to read as follows :—

“ A time table or time tables showing the work of each class for the following year should be approved by the Inspector either at the annual inspection or as soon as possible thereafter. A summary giving the number of teaching hours per week during which each member of the staff will be employed in the following year should also be available for inspection.”

Clause 24 (e).—(i.) In line 1 alter “ There is a practising school in which ” to “ There are adequate facilities for school practice where ”;

(ii.) In line 5 alter “ a satisfactory Infant Department ” to “ satisfactory Infant Departments.”

(iii.) In the first sentence delete “ and under the same management ”;

(iv.) Add the following : “ The teachers of those classes in which the students practise must be at least certificated. The staffs may consist entirely of trained teachers.”

Clause 24.—Present clause 24 to be renumbered 24 (i.). Add a new sub-clause as follows :—

24 (ii.) The number of students that may be accepted by a Training School will be decided by the following conditions :—

(a) At least 20 square feet per student must be provided in the lecture rooms. There must be additional accommodation for criticism lessons ;

(b) At least 16 square feet per student must be provided in the dining rooms ;

(c) At least 48 square feet per student must be provided in the dormitories ;

(d) Adequate equipment must be provided by the Manager ;

(e) There must be adequate facilities for work and recreation out of doors ;

(f) For teaching practice there must be an average attendance of at least 6 pupils for each student in training.

Clause 25 (b).—Add the following : “ Each student shall be given, under the supervision of the Training School staff, practice in the art of teaching for a minimum of 90 hours during each year of his course. In the case of students who are registered teachers, the minimum may be reduced to 60 hours.”

Clause 31.—In line 2 after “ conditions ” insert the following : “ or which ceases to provide adequate and suitable instruction as required by Clause 4.”

Clause 59 (b).—Alter to read as follows :—

“ The grant paid to a Training School which satisfies the conditions for registration is :—

(i.) The salary cost of the approved staff.

The staff will be approved for grant on the following basis :—

(ii.) A sum not exceeding Rs. 25 per unit of average attendance of residential students, towards the actual expenditure on the maintenance of buildings and also on the purchase of new equipment previously approved by the Director.

(iii.) In addition, a sum not exceeding Rs. 100 per unit of average attendance of residential students may be paid for the purpose of awarding scholarships to residential students.”

Clause 62.—In line 4 alter “ condition ” to “ conditions ”; in line 5 alter “ Clause 63 ” to “ Clauses 61 and 63.”

Clause 76.—After the words “ Vernacular School-Leaving Certificate ” insert the following “ or the English School-Leaving Certificate with Tamil or Sinhalese or the Cambridge Junior Certificate with Tamil or Sinhalese.”

Clause 38 (c).—Alter to read : In cases of illness during term time necessitating leave beyond the period provided for in (b) above, when the Director may grant full pay leave up to a maximum of six weeks in any one year provided that arrangements satisfactory to the Director can be made for the absent teacher's duties without additional expense to Government.

Delete Note (2) and substitute the following :—

(2) The authority of Government is required for the grant of full pay leave under (c) above to officers who are graded in the Civil List.

Clause 53.—After clause 53 add a new clause as follows :—

53A.—Increments to teachers in the Education Department are awarded only to those who succeed in maintaining an efficient school. In selecting teachers for increments, the work of each teacher eligible is to be reported on by the Inspector of the district, and the Director will consider the Inspector's recommendation along with the teacher's record and the performance of the school as shown in the examination reports.

#### GENERAL CONDITIONS.

1. Except as otherwise ordered all trees 12 inches and upwards in girth must be cut within 6 inches from the ground and for every stool which exceeds 6 inches in height from the ground, a fine of 25 cents will be levied.

2. Work shall proceed only in one block at a time, and all work shall be completed in block No. 1 before block No. 2 is entered, &c.

3. The contractor shall not enter a fresh block without the written permission of the Range Forest Officer.

4. The block lines shall be widened sufficiently by the contractor to form extraction paths and for the stacking of firewood and for its subsequent transport to the delivery depot. There shall be allowed only one main extraction cart track.

5. Trees which emit milky exudation such as ficus species, kaduru, &c., shall not be felled.

6. The firewood shall be in lengths of 3 feet and not less than 2 inches in diameter. All billets over 9 inches in diameter shall be split.

7. Every tree felled shall be converted into firewood, and for every log left in the area unconverted a fine of 50 cents will be imposed.

8. Stacks on railway line must be in rows convenient for loading the firewood into railway trucks. To economize ground space and to allow space between the stacks for inspection, stacks shall be either 3 feet, 4½ feet, or 6 feet in height as the Forest Officer in charge may from time to time direct. Walking space to be left between each two stacks.

9. The contractor will be responsible for the safety of the firewood when stacked in the forest or on the railway line, or when it is in transit.

10. The contractor may be required at times to increase the supplies should the railway requirements necessitate, and at times also to decrease the supplies, but the average output shall be as described in the schedule.

11. A penalty of 10 cents for every cubic yard of firewood not stacked or delivered at the monthly rate stipulated will be exacted from the contractor.

12. Nothing in this contract shall preclude the Divisional Forest Officer from taking action in accordance with the provisions of the Forest Ordinance, No. 16 of 1907, against the contractor for felling or allowing his coolies to fell any tree within or outside his area of contract which should not be felled in accordance with the conditions of the said contract or without the necessary permit prescribed by the said Ordinance.

#### SCHEDULE.

*Service A, Palugama.*—To fell every tree other than teak above 12 inches in girth standing in the under-mentioned three blocks at Palugama plantation in Nuwaragam Range. *Service C, Madawachchi.*—To fell every tree above 12 inches in girth (excepting teak trees marked by a Forest Officer as trees to be retained or teak trees standing in Block A), standing in a block of 75 acres at Madawachchi in Nuwaragam Range, to cut and split into firewood every tree so felled and every fallen tree whatsoever in the area so as to yield 4,000 cubic yards of firewood (more or less) with the least amount of wastage, to transport such firewood and deliver it neatly stacked at Madawachchi Railway Station Yard, not further than 30 feet from the nearest rail, at an average rate of 360 cubic yards per month. The remainder of the 90 acre block will be clearfelled and converted into firewood, no valuable species being retained.



*Special Condition.*

(i.) A reservation of 33 feet will be left unfelled along the Madawachchi-Mannar main road.

*General Conditions.*

(i.) (b) Except in Service A (i.), all undergrowth, creepers, and other growth must be cut within 6 inches of the ground.

(c) In Service A (iii.), B (i.), B (ii.), and C, a reservation will be left for 1 chain along the main and Local Board roads.

(d) In cases where standing teak trees in Service A, B, or C are accidentally damaged by the felling of trees in wind belts, the teak trees so damaged shall be left intact for inspection by a Forest Officer.

(e) No carts shall enter any young or old teak plantation, the wind belts or boundary lines being used exclusively for carting when such wind belts have been cleared.

### VITAL STATISTICS.

#### Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended August 22, 1931.

**Births.**—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 153 (1 European, 8 Burghers, 103 Sinhalese, 21 Tamils, 18 Moors, 1 Malay, and 1 Other). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1931, viz., 289,150) was 27·6, as against 30·3 in the preceding week, 32·9 in the corresponding week of last year, and 33·9 the weekly average for last year.

**Deaths.**—The total deaths registered were 161 (3 Burghers, 95 Sinhalese, 30 Tamils, 28 Moors, 3 Malays, and 2 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 29·0, as against 26·5 in the previous week, 31·0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 29·5 the weekly average for last year.

**Infantile Deaths.**—Of the 161 total deaths, 40 were of infants under one year of age, as against 32 in the preceding week, 37 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 32 the average for last year.

**Stillbirths.**—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 9.

**Principal Causes of Death.**—1. (a) Twenty-one deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 10 in Maradana hospitals (including 4 deaths of non-residents), 2 each in St. Paul's, and New Bazaar, and 1 each in San Sebastian, Kotahena North, Kotahena South, Maradana East, Slave Island, Kollupitiya, and Wellawatta South as against 17 in the previous week, and 18 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Nine deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 2 each in Kotahena South, and New Bazaar, and 1 each in St. Paul's, San Sebastian, Maradana North, Kollupitiya, and Wellawatta North, as against 17 in the previous week, and 8 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Four deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 2 in Maradana North and 1 each in New Bazaar and Maradana hospitals (of a non-resident), as against 5 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.

(b) One death from *Enteric Fever* of a resident of Colombo town, occurred at the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Angoda, during the week.

4. Thirteen deaths from *Debility* were registered, 7 from *Enteritis*, 4 from *Tetanus*, 2 each from *Diarrhoea*, *Dysentery*, *Homicide*, and *Accidents*, 1 each from *Infantile Convulsions*, *Worms*, and *Puerperal Septicaemia*, and 68 from *Other Causes*.

5. **Reported Cases.**—Six cases of *Enteric Fever*, 5 of *Chicken-Pox*, and 1 of *Plague* were reported during the week, as against 7, nil, and 1 respectively, of the preceding week.

**State of the Weather.**—The mean temperature of air was 80·0°, as against 80·7° in the preceding week and 81·0° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·863 in., against 29·862 in. in the preceding week and 29·868 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 1·58 in. against 1·43 in. in the preceding week and 0·28 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

Alterations must be initialled, otherwise the offers may be treated as informal and rejected.

3. A deposit of Rs. 20 for the coupe is required and should be forwarded with the offer by a money order in favour of the Divisional Forest Officer, Kurunegala.

4. (a) The tenderers should satisfy themselves by inspection before tendering as to the acreage and contents of the demarcated coupe referred to in the annexed schedule, as the figures given therein are estimated only and their correctness is in no way guaranteed. 7. After payment of the purchase price, deposit of the security, and execution of the agreement, the purchaser will be entitled on application to refund of his tender deposit. Should the successful tenderer fail to carry out the requirements of clauses 5 and 6 of this notice, within 14 days of receiving notice in writing from the Divisional Forest Officer, that his tender has been accepted, the Rs. 20 deposited for the coupe will be forfeited to the Crown. The successful tenderer will be entitled to a refund of the amount deposited by him on application to the Divisional Forest Officer concerned.

8. Tenderers should make offers, written both in words and figures, for the timber and firewood contained in the coupe.

9. No tender will be considered unless the procedure laid down has strictly been complied with. The Conservator of Forests reserves to himself the right, without question, of rejecting any or all tenders, and of accepting any portion of a tender.

10. The special rules for felling, conversion, and removal which the agreement will require to be observed are specified in the special conditions advertised below. Nothing of these special conditions shall render the purchaser in any way exempt from liability under the Forest Ordinance of 1907, should he be responsible for the commission of Forest Offence outside the boundaries of his purchased coupe.

11. The security to be deposited is between Rs. 50 and Rs. 200 according to the discretion of the Divisional Forest Officer.

12. #### Special Conditions.

On payment of the full purchase amount the purchaser will be entitled to fell and remove on or before July 31, 1932, in the manner specified below, all the firewood and timber contained in the purchased coupe. Any firewood or timber not removed by the expiry date shall *ipso facto* revert to the Crown.

(2) The purchaser shall agree to commence felling among the full length of the southern boundary of the coupe and to progress this felling line in the direction of the northern boundary, always keeping it parallel to the southern boundary along which felling commences.

(3) Should the purchaser fell or remove timber trees in excess of the quantity specified in special condition 2, nothing in the agreement shall exempt him from being liable for illicit felling and removal under the Forest Ordinance, No. 16 of 1907.

(6) The purchaser shall agree that, in the event of security money having become exhausted, it shall be within the discretion of the Divisional Forest Officer either (a) to accept a further security deposit amounting to 10 per cent. of the full tendered purchase price, or (b) to cancel the agreement and to refund to the purchaser such balance of the paid purchase money, if any, as remains after deducting the value of firewood removed by the purchaser on the date of such cancellation. For the purpose of this clause the value of each removed cubic yard of firewood shall be reckoned at full royalty rates.

(7) The purchaser shall have right of appeal to the Conservator of Forests in the event of enforcement of any of the penalties specified in these conditions, and the purchaser shall agree to accept the Conservator's decision as final and binding.

(8) The purchaser shall be required to cut all material in the coupe by three distinct operations as follows:—

**Operation 1.**—All herbaceous and undergrowth other than tree growth and creepers shall be cut out. **MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.**

The Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on July 18, 1931, at 8.30 a.m., in accordance with notice dated July 14, 1931.

Present :—Mr. R. H. Whitehorn, Chairman ; J. C. Ratwatte, Adigar ; Mr. Geo. E. de Silva ; Mr. Haji M. S. Usoof Ismail ; Mr. S. A. Wijayatilake ; Mr. W. A. B. Soysa ; Dr. W. E. de Silva ; Mr. H. P. G. Young.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on July 4, 1931, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted :—

- (a) Statement of receipts and disbursements from close of 1930 to June 30, 1931, on account of the Municipal Fund.
- (b) Progress report of works brought up to May 31, 1931.
- (c) Health Officer's report for June, 1931.
- (d) Statement of cases instituted by the several Inspectors and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of June, 1931.
- (e) The reservoir readings for the week ending July 18, 1931.

Resolved that the statement (a), together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 83 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910, be forwarded to the Commissioner of Local Government for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table :—Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, stand pipes, and house-service taps inspected during June, 1931.

(a) The Chairman in explaining the present situation with regard to water supply brought to the notice of members the excessive waste of water in the Town at normal times as indicated by a daily consumption of 900,000 gallons which works out at 30 gallons per head per diem. He added that he would give his attention to detection of waste and he would also consider framing by-laws penalising offenders.

4. Petitions :—Mr. Geo. E. de Silva presented a petition—(1) from Babahamy of No. 68M in the Mahaiyawa Model Tenements asking that the decision to eject her from the tenement be reconsidered ; Mr. S. A. Wijayatilake presented a petition—(2) from P. H. Simon Silva of the Small Market asking that the rents of spaces in the market be reduced owing to the trade depression, and (3) from the residents of Leula asking that more wells be constructed ; Rawatte Adigar presented a petition—(4) from Major Pain asking that D. P. K. Charles Appuhamy be given a mutton stall ; Mr. W. A. B. Soysa presented a petition—(5) from Mahanayake Thero of Asgiriya asking for electric lights on the road leading to the temple, and for a gate.

The Chairman undertook to deal with the matters referred to in the various petitions.

5. Correspondence :—Letter No. U 186/31 of July 8, 1931 from the Chief Secretary asking the Council to obtain the advice of their Legal Advisers as to the legality of the motion passed at the meeting on May 16, 1931, relative to the reduction of consolidated rates.—Read.

Mr. Young proposed that the resolution to reduce rates be referred back to Government, informing them at the same time that the Council's Legal Adviser is of opinion that the proposal is not legal. Mr. Ismail seconded.—Carried.

Mr. de Silva did not vote.

6. To consider the desirability of requesting Government to appoint a retired Government Servant as Chairman of the Council, and the terms of such appointment.

The Council went into Committee to consider the item and on resuming Mr. Wijayatilake proposed—(1) That Government be informed that this Council is prepared to offer Rs. 500 per mensem as salary and Rs. 125 per mensem as travelling allowance for the services of a retired Civil Servant to act temporarily as Chairman, terminable on three months' notice on either side, and (2) that the Chairman of the Council be requested in future to give suitable security. Mr. Ismail seconded.—Carried.

## 7. Recommendations of Standing Committees :—

*Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects held on July 4, 1931.*

(1) Application from the Librarian, Kandy Municipal Free Library, for authority to impose fines under rule 23 of the Library Rules on members who do not return periodicals borrowed by them within the time prescribed in rule 15.—Recommended that the rules be altered accordingly.

(2) To adopt revised form for the Tickets of Occupancy to be issued to the public in connection with the lease by them of Municipal Lands.—Recommended.

(3) Draft of letter which the Chairman proposes to address the Kandy Sports Club, embodying the conditions for a new agreement to be entered into with them in connection with the maintenance and upkeep of Bogambara Gorund.—Recommended with amendment *re* liability for rates and taxes.

(4) Papers *re* the proposal to amend by-law 32 of the Council's Leave By-laws to permit of officers being granted "Lieu" leave in respect of work done by them on all statutory holidays.—Recommended.

(5) To consider the desirability of employing a substitute for Sunday duty at the Municipal Free Library, in order to permit of the permanent Library Peon having one day off in the week.—Recommended.

(6) Papers *re* Nuisances in the Park near the Military Hospital.—Recommended to have a notice board prohibiting games by children over 12 years of age.

*Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation held on July 6, 1931.*

(7) Draft specifications prepared by the Medical Officer of Health for (a) calling for tenders for lorry service for conservancy and scavenging work and (b) calling for tenders for the scavenging of the Peradeniya section.—Recommended to call for tenders experimentally.

(8) Papers *re* the proposal to prohibit roadside stall vendors Nos. 26, 27 and 28 in the list of roadside stall vendors furnished by the Ward Sanitary Inspector on May 6, 1931, from continuing trade, and to allow No. 29 therein, to continue, if he provides a wheeled moving cart and observes other sanitary requirements laid down.—Recommended to licence only No. 29, Peena Mohideen and to notice 26, 27, and 28 that they must find sites elsewhere, if possible, subject to Medical Officer of Health's approval.

(9) To approve of the provision of a 'bus stand and Notice Board near the Small Market.—Recommended a halting place and a notice at the place indicated.

(10) Papers *re* request made by the Hon. Secretary of the Maternity and Child Welfare Committee that the fee of Rs. 2.50 fixed by the Council as being payable to a resident trained midwife for Watarentena, Dodanwela, Leula, and Halloluwa, only where the parties availing themselves of the services of the midwife are too poor to pay, be made to apply to all cases irrespective of the circumstances of the parties, as otherwise there will be no inducement for any midwife to take up cases in these villages.—Recommended that the Council should adhere to its previous decision in this matter.

(11) Papers *re* the objection raised by the Hindu residents of Mahaiyawa to the sale of mutton in close proximity to beef at the Mahaiyawa Stalls.—Recommended to try the lease of the stall for the sale of mutton experimentally, and if the present proposed licensee does not take it, to auction the privilege.

(12) Letter dated May 30, 1931, from the residents of Mulgampola requesting that Mr. D. L. James of Pinwatte be permitted to open a fish stall to serve the needs of the residents of the locality, as a number of beef stalls have been established in the locality, and they find it difficult to get fresh fish.—Not recommended.

(13) Letter dated June 3, 1931, from Mr. D. D. Stephen stating that he has made over his half share in the business carried on at stall No. 12B, Public Market, to the Joint Licensee, Mr. S. M. Adumay, and asking that the half share be transferred in favour of the latter.—Recommended.

(14) To obtain sanction for the transfer of temporary boutique No. 19, Market Grounds, to Mr. Muna Kandavanam.—Recommended.

(15) Papers *re* mutton stalls Nos. 71 and 72, Public Market. When this item was discussed there were present Mr. C. Coomaraswamy representing Mr. Abdul Majeed, and Mr. K. Kumaraswami representing Mr. Kandasamy. After the lawyers had stated the cases of their clients the Committee came to the following conclusions.—Recommended to give the stall to Kandasamy and to Pandara Nadar as Co-Licensee on payment of the premium.—Recommended also to consider the re-arrangement of the mutton stalls for 1932, and the question of making them all the same size.

*Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment held on July 4, 1931.*

(16) To obtain a vote for Rs. 51.10 to meet the bill submitted by Messrs. John & Co. for prints of photographs and sketches furnished by them during the plague outbreak in 1927.—Recommended.

(17) Papers *re* the application from Nuisance Watchers for Uniforms.—Not recommended.

(18) To obtain a vote for Rs. 36 for the purchase of two sets of die of the pattern approved by Government for the stamping and sealing of weights and measures under section 9 of "The Weights and Measures Ordinance, No. 8 of 1876."—Recommended.

(19) To obtain a vote for Rs. 31 to meet Surveyor-General's bill of cost for the survey and demarcation of land required for the extension of the Contact Camp at Deyannewela.—Recommended.

(20) To obtain formal sanction for the appropriation, by the clerks concerned, of the fees levied from the public for searching and copying documents applied for by them, and to consider a scale of fees therefor.—Recommended the following rate of fees, which are the rates sanctioned in the Colombo Municipal Council, to be adopted and a fee book to be kept :— (a) for searching the records of one year or under, 50 cents; (b) for each additional year, 25 cents; (c) for searching a register, sale list, or ledger for one year, Rupee 1; (d) for each additional year, 50 cents; (e) for copying each document not exceeding a folio of 120 words, 36 cents.

(21) To obtain authority for payment of overtime to Waterworks Inspector Christiansz in connection with work done by him in chlorinating lake water for public consumption.—Recommended.

(22) To sanction the excess expenditure over the votes in respect of certain estimates for 1930, amounting to Rs. 8,200.41.—Recommended.

(23) To decide on a basis for refund of a part of the payments made by the Dalada Maligawa since 1st quarter, 1929, on account of water consumed by the fountain, as the water has been jointly served to the fountain and Maligawa kitchen by a common meter.—Recommended refund of Rs. 84.13 on the basis of 25,000 gallons' consumption on the fountain.

(24) To obtain a vote for Rs. 25 to meet Surveyor-General's bill of cost of survey and demarcation of land required for a public latrine at Lewella.—Recommended.

(25) Papers *re* the restoration for public use of a footpath in Watapulawa.—Recommended vote for Rs. 50 to clear the path.

(28) Estimate for Rs. 400 from the Municipal Engineer for converting the store room at the entrance to the Town Hall into offices for the Examiner of Motor Cars, Revenue Inspectors, and Rat Destruction Department.—Recommended.

(29) Report dated June 11, 1931, from the Chairman on the application from the Manager, Suisse Hotel, to construct dhobies' tanks and soakage pits at the Hotel premises.—Recommended.

*Extract from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Electricity Committee held on July 3, 1931.*

(30) To obtain a supplementary vote for Rs. 55 for the erection of a Karri Timber pole to support the overhead wire in Katugastota road.—Recommended.

(31) Estimate for Rs. 237 from the Municipal Electrical Engineer for extending the electric main along Peradeniya Bridge, to permit of the supply of electrical energy to premises beyond.—Recommended.

(32) To sanction estimate for Rs. 110 from the Municipal Electrical Engineer for lighting the covered vegetable pavement in the Market premises, and a vote for Rs. 20 to meet the difference in cost involved in replacing the existing two old lamp standards outside the pavement by a lamp standard of better type.—Recommended.

(33) Estimate for Rs. 90 from the Municipal Electrical Engineer for supplying and fixing two public lamp brackets to existing lamp standards in Upper Hermitage road.—Recommended.

(34) Estimate for Rs. 88 from the Municipal Electrical Engineer for erecting an additional lamp standard for Lady Gordon's road.—Recommended.

Resolved that the recommendations be adopted.

As regards item (11) it was agreed that the stall should be auctioned for the sale of beef if there is no demand for mutton, and that prices should be endorsed on the licence.

As regards item (15) Mr. Kandasamy was summoned before the meeting, who agreed to have the licence on condition that the sale price of mutton should be 70 cents per lb. with bones, and 80 cents per lb. without bones; the rates be sanctioned in the licence.

8. To restore to the office of Councillor, Dr. G. P. Hay who has been absent from three consecutive general meetings. Resolved that Dr. Hay be restored to Office.

9. Chairman's report of inquiries made from the Municipal Engineer, Colombo, as regards 10 feet rear space and other matters connected with the application of the Colombo Commercial Co. to build workshops in their premises in Peradeniya road.

Resolved to request them to apply for permission to construct their road in the first instance.

10. To consider letter dated July 14, 1931, from Mr. J. S. Garment, Municipal Engineer, on the subject of his confirmation and salary.

Resolved to reply that it is regretted that the resolution of the Council cannot be varied.

**Sale of Arrack Rents, 1931-32, Batticaloa District.**

**T**ENDERS are hereby invited for the exclusive privilege of selling arrack for a period of 12 months from October 1, 1931, to September 30, 1932, in the taverns mentioned in the schedule hereto attached marked "A" subject to the General Conditions applicable to all Excise Licences published in *Government Gazette* No. 7,798 of August 15, 1930, the Arrack Rent Sale Conditions and the Conditions contained in Excise Notification No. 216 published in *Government Gazette* No. 7,837 of March 20, 1931, and the amendments to the Sale Conditions published in *Government Gazette* No. 7,858 of June 5, 1931, and *Government Gazette (Extraordinary)* No. 7,872 of July 29, 1931.

2. Every tender shall be made on the prescribed form which may be obtained from this Kachcheri, and shall have affixed to it an uncanceled revenue stamp of Rs. 10. The value of the stamp will not be refunded whether the tender is accepted or not.

3. Tenders are to be made on forms which will be supplied at this Kachcheri on the production of the Kachcheri or Treasury receipt for Rs. 500 deposited for each tender form for each tavern. No person shall submit more than one tender form in respect of one tavern.

4. Tenders which must be in sealed envelopes super-scribed "Tender for \_\_\_\_\_ Arrack Tavern, No. \_\_\_\_\_" and must reach the Office of the Government Agent, Eastern Province, not later than 10 A.M. on September 1, 1931. The tenderers must be present at the Kachcheri at that time. Every tender shall be made by the tenderer in his own name. No tender will be accepted if made through an agent.

5. The Government Agent shall have power in his discretion to refuse to accept any tenders subject to which power the highest tenderer shall be the grantee of the rent and shall conform to and perform all the conditions under which the privilege is sold. The grantee shall, immediately on being granted the privilege, sign the conditions of sale and pay to the Government Agent as a security deposit a sum equivalent to six weeks' rent of the privilege.

6. The Government Agent shall be empowered to refuse to accept the tenders or bids of former renters or licencees who are in arrears to Government as regards Excise Revenue or whose conduct has been unsatisfactory, or who have been guilty of serious breaches of the conditions of their licence or of persons who have been convicted by a criminal court for such offences as in the opinions of the Government Agent render them undesirable holders of licences.

7. Every person tendering or bidding is advised to produce at the time of sale a certificate from the Chief Headman of his division that he is a person eligible to bid or tender.

8. The privilege will, subject to conditions 5 and 6 above, be sold to the person offering the highest rent (exclusive of duty, cost price, and value of bottles.)

9. Duty, cost price, and value of bottles chargeable and the names of warehouses from which arrack is to be obtained, and all other details are mentioned in the Arrack Rent Sale Conditions above referred to.

10. Taverns Nos. 1 to 6 named in the schedule referred to shall open at 8 A.M., and close at 7 P.M. Tavern No. 7 shall open at 8 A.M., and close at 6.30 P.M.

11. Any further particulars can be obtained on application at this Kachcheri.
