REGULATIONS REFERRED TO.

- Arrack will be issued on application at the Government Warehouse in Kandy, Kurunegala, Kalutara, or Bandarawela.
- Such application must be accompanied by a Kachcheri receipt for money paid to the Kachcheri calculated at such rate per gallon of arrack required in bulk or in sealed bottles as the Excise Commissioner may by Notification prescribe from time to time.
- Arrack may be transported from the Warehouse to the canteen only under cover of a pass issued by the Warehouse officer.
- Not less than 5 gallons of arrack will be issued from a Warehouse in any one transaction.
- On the termination of a licence for the sale of arrack in an estate canteen, the value of arrack not less than 35° underproof returned to the Warehouse, will be refunded at the rate per gallon fixed by the Excise Commissioner under rule 2 above, provided the Superintendent certifies that the quantity so delivered was the actual balance left at the time of the termination of the licence.
- Until further notice, the rates recoverable per gallon of arrack issued from a Warehouse shall be as follows:—

White 8 dram bottles	Rs. 15 per gallon
Black bottles	Rs. 14.50 per gallon

1. The contractor shall fell all trees and saplings. The fellings are to be carried out in an orderly manner from the points and in the directions given by a Forest Officer.

2. The following wood when felled or fallen shall not be cut into firewood:—

- (a) All wood insufficiently sound for fuel.
- (b) The species *etdemata*, *lunumidella*, *rukattana*, *divikaduru*, *walkaduru*, *kottan*, *erabadu*, *dadap*, *kekuna*, *amba*, and *gedumba*.

3. All trees felled except such trees as are enumerated *vide* 4 below together with every other fallen tree whatsoever, shall be converted into firewood of which each piece is to be 3 feet in length, not less than 6 inches in girth at the small end and more than 27 inches in girth at the big end. All large billets over 27 inches in girth shall be reduced by splitting to within these dimensions. All wood over 12 inches in girth to be billeted in 3 feet lengths by hand saw or cross cut saw only. All felling and splitting of logs to be completed by April 15, 1932.

4. All enumerated trees should be felled, logged, removed, and stacked neatly in the adjoining teak plantation at a site which will be pointed out by the Range Forest Officer, Puttalam Range. Any satin trees so felled must be barked before they are stacked. All logs must be stacked separately according to species. These logs will be advertised for sale later as the Conservator of Forests thinks advisable.

5. The contractor shall cut, transport, and stack the firewood at the Puttalam Railway Station Yard at the minimum rate of 200 cubic yards per mensem, and not more or less, unless required to do so by the Divisional Forest Officer, North-Western Division, commencing from the date of signing of the contract. The full supply should be completed by June 30, 1932.

6. A penalty not exceeding twenty-five cents for every cubic yard of firewood not delivered at the monthly rate will be exacted from the contractor if required by the Divisional Forest Officer.

7. The contractor shall cut all brushwood, thorns, and undergrowth in the area, heap the same together with all wood refuse in the centre of the area. He shall cause a reservation of $\frac{1}{2}$ chain in width right round the block to be kept quite clear of all wood refuse, &c., such a reservation must be maintained on all four sides of the block before the area is set fire to. This work must be completed by August 31, 1932.

7a. The contractor shall burn the area and complete burning on or before September 30, 1932. He shall root out and completely clear of green growth all patches not burnt over and have the whole area in a state of complete fitness throughout for planting by October 15, 1932. He will be held responsible for seeing that no damage by fire takes place outside his contract area.

8. The contractor is required to level and clear adequate stacking grounds. The wood should be stacked leaving sufficient space between the stacks for inspecting officers to walk round each stack.

9. The block has already been demarcated by the Range Forest Officer, Puttalam Range. Carts may be allowed within the area.

10. If any tree or sapling outside the demarcated area is felled, the contractor will be liable for the full penalty provided under Ordinance No. 16 of 1907.

11. Any firewood rejected shall be stacked separately; in lieu of such rejected firewood on equal quantity of good wood shall be cut and supplied from the aforesaid forest, free of cost, the rejected wood being sold for the benefit of Government. A sum not exceeding Rs. 50 shall be paid as penalty in each case where the rejected wood has not been stacked separately, or has been mixed up with the good wood intended for the Railway.

12. The contractor shall strictly observe the following conditions and regulations in felling, converting, and stacking wood, and in clearing felled areas:—

- (a) No tree of any description which a Forest Officer has marked may be converted into firewood but must be logged and stacked as required by condition 4 above.
- (b) No tree or plant shall be cut or in any way injured in such protective belts as may be demarcated for reservation, unless permission is first obtained from the Divisional Forest Officer.
- (c) Trees of 6 inches and under in girth to be felled within 2 inches of the ground.
Trees of 6 to 12 inches in girth to be felled within 4 inches of the ground.
Trees over 12 inches in girth to be felled within 1 foot of the ground.
- (d) All wood exceeding 36 inches in girth shall be cut into the specified lengths by means of hand saws or crosscut saws only, unless it shall be otherwise required by the Divisional Forest Officer.
- (e) Every part fit for firewood of every tree felled shall be delivered as firewood.
- (f) No wire shoots may be erected except under the supervision of a Forest Officer and with the permission of the Divisional Forest Officer.
- (g) No plantations or fences may be traversed or damaged in the removal of firewood by workmen, wire shoots, or carts.

13. For each infringement of any of the above conditions the contractor shall pay as penalty a sum not exceeding Rs. 100 and the value of the damage done.

14. The contractor is to be paid for firewood supplied as above and accepted. Payments are to be made monthly, and at the convenience of the Divisional Forest Officer, on production of receipts from the Railway Department, deductions being made for any fine or penalty imposed under this contract; the contractor shall further accept the decision of the Divisional Forest Officer as to the

measurement of wood delivered. No payment or certificate shall protect or be deemed to protect the contractor in the case of overpayment.

15. All trees other than those marked as standards are to be felled within 6 inches off the ground. Trees marked as standards must on no account be felled—*vide* clause (ii.) of schedule below. No lopping of branches will be allowed.

2. The firewood is to be cut up from trees felled and each billet of wood should not be more than 6 feet in length. No material of over 6 feet in length will be permitted to be removed from the area. Should any logs be transported out of the area it will be treated as a forest offence.

3. The felling should proceed systematically in rotation, one strip at a time. No felling will be allowed in the second or subsequent strips till all felling has been completed in the first strip to the satisfaction of the Divisional Forest Officer and written permission obtained to start work in a fresh strip.

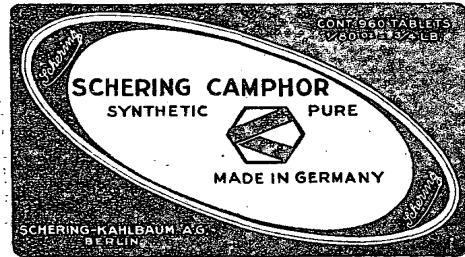

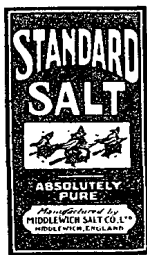

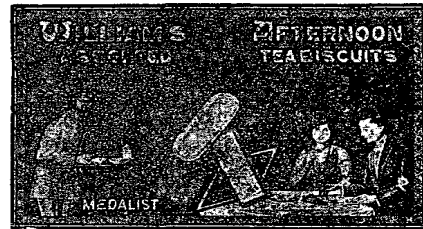

VITAL STATISTICS.**Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended August 29, 1931.**

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 168 (4 Europeans, 6 Burghers, 104 Sinhalese, 26 Tamils, 17 Moors, 8 Malays, and 3 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1931, viz., 289,150) was 30.3, as against 27.6 in the preceding week, 32.8 in the corresponding week of last year, and 32.5 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 142 (6 Burghers, 79 Sinhalese, 26 Tamils, 22 Moors, 5 Malays, and 4 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 25.6, as against 29.0 in the previous week, 27.6 in the corresponding week of last year, and 28.2 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 142 total deaths, 29 were of infants under one year of age, as against 40 in the preceding week, 24 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 32 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 13.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Nineteen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 10 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), 6 in Kotahena South, 2 in St. Paul's and 1 in Maradana North, as against 21 in the previous week and 18 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Nine deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 3 in New Bazaar, 2 in Kotahena South, and 1 each in St. Paul's, San Sebastian, Kotahena North, and Kollupitiya. The number registered during the preceding week was also 9 and the weekly average for last year was 8.

(c) Seven deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 2 each in Kotahena South and Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), and 1 each in Kotahena North, New Bazaar, and Slave Island, as against 4 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year.

2. (a) Twelve deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 6 in Maradana hospitals (including 4 deaths of non-residents), 3 in San Sebastian, 2 in St. Paul's, and 1 in Maradana East, as against 18 in the previous week and 12 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Three deaths from *Phthisis*, of residents of Colombo Town, occurred at the Anti-Tuberculosis Hospital, Ragama, during the week.

3. No deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, as against 6 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year.

4. Eight deaths each from *Worms* and *Debility* were registered, 7 from *Enteritis*, 4 from *Dysentery*, 3 each from *Diarrhoea* and *Accidents*, 2 from *Puerperal Septicaemia*, 1 each from *Infantile Convulsions*, *Tetanus*, and *Homicide*, and 57 from *Other Causes*.

5. **Reported Cases.**—Six cases of *Enteric Fever*, 3 of *Chicken-pox* and 1 of *Measles* were reported during the week, as against 6, 5, and nil, respectively of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 80.0°, against 80.0° in the preceding week and 80.5° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.889 in., against 29.863 in. in the preceding week and 29.865 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 2.82 in., against 1.58 in. in the preceding week and 0.68 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
