# PROCLAMATIONS BY THE GOVERNOR.

A PROCLAMATION.

GRAEME THOMSON.

W HEREAS it seems advisable to the Governor to establish in Kahapatwala village in Gannewa korale in Weudawili hatpattu of the District of Kurunegala, North-Western Province, a general cemetery for the burial or cremation of the dead within the limits hereinafter specified and defined:

And whereas the Governor may, under section 6 (3) of "The Cemeteries and Burials Ordinance, 1899," as amended by the Cemeteries and Burials Amendment Ordinance, 1931, either wholly or in part exempt any cemetery from the operation of sections 11, 16, 17, and 24:

Now know Ye that We, the Governor, by virtue of powers vested in Us by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931, do hereby under section 6 (1) of "The Cemeteries and Burials Ordinance, 1899," as amended by the Cemeteries and Burials Amendment Ordinance, 1931, establish, as from the date hereof, a general cemetery on the lands described in Schedule A hereto for the burial or cremation of the dead within the limits specified and defined in Schedule B hereto.

And We do hereby exempt the said cemeteries wholly from the operation of sections 11, 16, 17, and 24.

NOW Ye that We the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in Us by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order-in-Council, 1931, do hereby under section 6 of "The Cattle Ordinance, 1898," proclaim the regulations, in the schedule hereto, which have been

made by Us by virtue of and in exercise of the powers under sections 4 and 5 of the said Ordinance for the revenue district of Trincomalee in the Eastern Province.

#### SCHEDULE.

#### Regulations.

Regulations framed under Sections 4 and 5 of Ordinance No. 10 of 1898 regarding the Sale or Transfer of Cattle.

It shall not be lawful to transfer any head of cattle except upon a certificate in the Form A in the schedule annexed to Ordinance No. 10 of 1898, issued and signed by an officer authorized by the Government Agent to issue such certificates for the district in which the animal is transferred.

2. It shall not be lawful to acquire a head of cattle from any person in any way, except by inheritance, unless the recipient receives with the animal the certificate alluded to

The Government Agent shall appoint certain officers authorized to issue certificates subject to the regulations hereinafter laid down. Books of certificates in the authorized form shall be issued to all such officers. Such books to be in duplicate, the duplicate to be kept and returned to the Kachcheri when the book is finished, or on demand by the Government Agent; the original to be given to the purchaser or donee.

It shall be lawful for the Government Agent to appoint also a limited number of special officers, not lower in rank than a Vidane Arachchi, Korala, or Udaiyar, to issue certificates, and to relieve them from the necessity of complying with such of the regulations with reference to the issue of certificates as may appear to the Government

Agent to be desirable.

No person who has not been duly authorized by these rules shall issue a certificate, or alter, add to, deface, destroy,

or in any way tamper with a certificate.

6. If a head of cattle acquired on a certificate dies, is lost, or disappears, it shall be the duty of the owner to return the certificate either to an officer appointed to issue certificates for the district or to the Kachcheri, such return to be made within ten days of the animal's death or one month of its loss or disappearance. When cattle are slaughtered within the limits of a Municipality or Local Board, the certificates must be given to the slaughterhousekeeper; if without such limits, to such person as may be nominated by the Government Agent.

It shall be the duty of all headmen to seize all stray cattle, those with altered or defaced brandmarks, and cattle (other than those born in the owner's possession or obtained by inheritance) that may reasonably be supposed to have been acquired without a proper certificate, and to produce them before the President of the Gansabhawa, if there is one having jurisdiction over the district, or before the Chief Headman, if there is no Gansabhawa. Such President or Chief Headman shall inquire into the title of anyone who claims the animal, and shall issue a certificate to such claimants as have substantiated their claim; and if not so satisfied shall direct that the animal be sold by auction and the proceeds paid to the Communal or Local Board funds, if a Gansabhawa or Local Board has jurisdiction over the district where the animal has been kept, or to the credit of Government if there is no Gansabhawa or Local Board. Provided that before issuing such certificate such President or Chief Headman may direct the claimant to pay such sum as to such President or Chief Headman seems reasonable as expenses for the seizure, detention, and branding of such animal, and for the issue of such certificate; and if such sum is not paid within such period as may be directed by him, may order that the animal be sold, and the proceeds dealt with as laid down above.

When an animal is sold as directed in the foregoing regulations by the President of a Village Tribunal or a Chief Headman, a special brand selected by the Government Agent shall be put on the animal, and a certificate signed by the President or a Chief Headman, as the Government Agent may direct, shall be issued to the purchaser.

When cattle are imported it shall be the duty of the importer to obtain from an officer appointed by the Government Agent a certificate for each animal imported. certificate shall be issued on payment of a fee of 25 cents, and shall be in the Form A annexed to Ordinance No. 10 of 1898. In filling in the certificates the words "imported

animal" should be entered under column 2 instead of the name and residence of the seller or donor. Under column 9, instead of the signature of the seller or donor the date of

landing and the port where landed should be entered.

10. Duplicates of certificates certified to be correct by the Government Agent or his Assistant shall have the validity of the certificates themselves, and shall be issued only to the persons to whom the originals were issued, or their representatives, on proving satisfactorily that the originals were lost or stolen.

#### Permits of Removal.

11. It shall not be lawful for any one to remove an acquired animal (that is, an animal not born in the owner's possession or obtained by inheritance) to any place beyond the jurisdiction of the officer appointed by the Government Agent to issue certificates for the district in which the animal is kept, unless the person so removing has with him the certificate issued to the owner of the animal. If the animal does not belong to the person so removing, he must have in addition a written pass signed by the owner, stating where the animal is going to and for what purpose it is being removed.

12. If the animal be a pinfold one (that is, born in the owner's possession or obtained by inheritance) the person removing the animal shall have with him a permit for

removal in the form prescribed in rule 14.

The fees payable to officers authorized to issue vouchers shall be as follows:—

For a voucher of transfer: 50 cents. For a voucher of ownership: 25 cents. For a voucher of removal: 25 cents.

provided, however, that these rates are in no case payable to the owners or superintendents of estates or to the owners or managers of dairies authorized under rule 13 (a) to issue

removal permits for estate or dairy cattle.

13. (a) The Government Agent at his discretion may appoint in writing the resident owner or superintendent of any estate not less than 100 acres in extent or the owner or manager of any registered dairy keeping not less than 15 cows, not being of pure native breed, for dairy purposes, to issue permit in the Form C prescribed in rule 14 for the removal of any head of cattle not being of pure native breed and not being an acquired animal, and may likewise revoke such authorization. Such authorization shall apply only to the removal of such cattle from one estate or dairy to

another under the same general management.

(b) It shall be the duty of every such owner, superintendent, or manager to enter all the particulars required in the counterfoils of the Form C prescribed in rule 14 before the foils of permits are issued, and when all the foils in a book of permits have been used forthwith to return to the Kachcheri from which it was received the book of permits with all the counterfoils complete. In the event of the privilege being withdrawn from any such owner, superintendent, or manager, he shall forthwith return to the Kachcheri all the foils and counterfoils of permits in his possession.

(c) The book of permits issued to any such owner, superintendent, or manager shall be open to the inspection of any police officer or headman either generally or specially

authorized to hold such inspections.

(d) The fee payable by such owner, superintendent, or manager shall be recovered in advance at the rate of 25 cents for each permit contained in the book of permits. In the event of the privilege of issuing such permits being withdrawn by the Government Agent, such owner, superintendent, or manager shall have no claim to have the whole or any part of the fees paid by him in advance refunded to him.

(a) The permit for the removal of a head of cattle other than under rule 13 (a) shall be in the Form B.

13. (b) It shall be the duty of every such owner, superintendent, or manager to enter all the particulars required in the counterfoils of the Form C prescribed in rule 14 before the foils of permits are issued, and when all the foils in a book of permits have been used forthwith to return to the Kachcheri from which it was received the book of permits with all the counterfoils complete. All householders shall deposit or cause to be deposited the dust, ashes, sweepings, rubbish, and other refuse from their premises in galvanized wrought iron bins which they shall provide and they shall place these bins daily on the edge of the road outside their premises between the hours of 6 A.M. and 6.30 A.M. and remove them or cause them to be removed within the space of half an hour after the same shall have been emptied by the scavengers.

The bins shall-

(a) be constructed in such a manner and be of such weight that the whole receptacle with its contents can be easily lifted and emptied into the scavenging cart

(b) they shall be provided with covers and covenient handles

(c) they shall have the owner's name or tenement number painted outside, and

(d) they shall be kept clean by the owners.

3. No person shall place or cause to be placed dust, ashes, sweepings, rubbish, or refuse in or on the edge of any read except in bins as aferesaid, at the times specified.

Provided that the Chairman may authorize a householder to use instead of a bin as aforesaid a wooden box provided with a loose lid approved by him, if he is satisfied that owing to poverty, the immediate provision of such a bin would press harshly on the householder.

4. Any person committing a breach of the above by-laws shall be guilty of an offence and shall on conviction be liable to a fine not exceeding Rs. 10 and, in the case of a continuing offence, to an additional fine not exceeding Rs. 5 for every day during which the offence is committed after conviction or written notice from the Chairman of such contravention.

ORDER UNDER SECTION 6 OF ORDINANCE No. 3 of 1903.

And whereas Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931, vests in the Governor all powers, authorities, and functions which shall be vested by any written law in the Governor in Executive Council on and after the date when the first election of Executive Committees and the first appointment of Ministers shall be complete:

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 181 (4 Europeans, 13 Burghers, 108 Sinhalese, 23 Tamils, 24 Moors, 5 Malays, and 4 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1931, viz., 289,150) was 32 6, as against 30 8 in the preceding week, 30 4 in the corresponding week of last year, and 32 5 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 57 (4 Burghers, 104 Sinhalese, 21 Tamils, 21 Moors, 5 Malays, and 2 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 28.3, as against 23.6 in the previous week, 25.4 in the previous week of last year, and 28.2 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 157 total deaths, 35 were of
