"THE FLOOD PROTECTION ORDINANCE,
No. 4 OF 1924."

IT is hereby notified that order confirming "The Colombo Flood Protection Scheme" described in the schedule hereto was made on June 18, 1931, by the Governor in Executive Council under section 6 of "The Flood Protection Ordinance, No. 4 of 1924."

SCHEDULE.

Colombo Flood Protection Scheme.

The Scheme is devised for the protection (from floods) of the low lying lands in the neighbourhood of Colombo and consists briefly of the following works:—

- (i.) A Flood Bund completely closing the Kolonnawa gap.
- (ii.) A Flood Bund and a Canal Lock in the Dematagoda gap.
- (iii.) The deviation of the Kalutara canal to pass through the Dematagoda gap.
- (iv.) The conversion of the Kolonnawa Railway Embankment into a flood bank and the provision of a canal lock on the main canal where it passes under the railway.
- (v.) A drainage tunnel from Blomendahl Swamp to the sea at a point between Fishery Harbour and the Northern arm of the Colombo Harbour.
- (vi.) A main drain from the canal at the junction of the Grandpass road and Prince of Wales avenue to the tunnel intake.
- (vii.) The construction of culverts under Prince of Wales avenue, Blomendahl road, and Alutmawata road.

2. The Scheme will protect an area of about 9,500 acres. The construction of the scheme is estimated to cost approximately Rs. 1,010,000 (exclusive of Establishment Charges) and its annual maintenance about Rs. 10,000. The capital cost of the scheme and its maintenance will be borne by Government.

3. The works to be maintained on completion of the scheme are shown in the plan of the Colombo Flood Area.

REGULATIONS.

"THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ORDINANCE,
No. 11 of 1920."

BY-LAWS made by the Matale Urban District Council under sections 164 and 168 of "The Local Government Ordinance, No. 11 of 1920," and approved by the Local Government Board and confirmed by the Governor under section 164 by virtue of the powers vested in him by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931.

BY-LAWS.

1. No animal shall be slaughtered in any slaughter-house unless 48 hours' notice of such slaughter shall have been given and until such animal has been approved as fit for slaughter by the Medical Officer, Matale, or any other officer appointed by the Urban District Council.

2. Any animal rejected as unfit for slaughter shall be immediately removed.

3. If on any animal which has been approved as aforesaid being slaughtered the carcass shall appear diseased or unfit for human food the said Medical Officer or the officer appointed by the Urban District Council shall cause the meat to be immediately destroyed or so disposed of as to prevent it being exposed for sale or used for human food.

4. The officer so appointed shall not permit the slaughter of any cattle or sheep which have not been approved as aforesaid as fit to be slaughtered for human food or the slaughter of which the said Medical Officer or the officer appointed by the Council has prohibited.

5. No person shall remove from the slaughter-house, except under the directions of the said Medical Officer or the officer appointed by the Council, any meat which has been declared to be unfit for human food.

6. In the case of sheep or goats a written permit to slaughter signed by the Medical Officer or any officer appointed by the Council shall be produced with each animal brought for slaughter.

7. No animal shall be slaughtered in the presence of other animals or until the carcass of any animal previously slaughtered shall have been removed or screened off and the premises cleansed.

8. The following fees shall be paid in advance to the Council for the use of the slaughter-house:—

For cattle	50 cents each
For sheep, goats, or pigs	25 cents each

These rates shall cover exposure in the proper place for 24 hours. The above fees shall be increased by one half for each further period of 12 hours' exposure.

9. Any person committing a breach of any one of the above by-laws shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding Rs. 50 for any one offence, and in the case of a continuing offence to an additional fine not exceeding Rs. 25 for every day during which the offence is committed after conviction or written notice from the Chairman of such contravention.

10. The by-laws relating to the slaughtering of cattle, &c., published by notifications—

REGULATIONS made by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931, under sections 53 and 70 of the Motor Car Ordinance, 1927, for the urban area of Mannar.

1. "Public Stand" means any space within the urban area which is defined and reserved for the parking of motor cabs or omnibuses or hiring cars by a notice signed by the Chairman of the Sanitary Board and exhibited at the spot.

"Board" means the Sanitary Board of Mannar.

2. The driver of any hiring car parked in a public stand shall park such car in such a manner as not to obstruct the free passage of other hiring cars entering or going out of the stand.

3. The driver of a hiring car parked in a public stand shall always be in attendance on his vehicle and shall move his vehicle when reasonably called upon to do so by other drivers of vehicles for the purpose of obtaining ingress or egress.

4. All drivers and other persons in charge of hiring cars in the stand shall conduct themselves in an orderly manner.

5. No hiring car shall be left or permitted to remain in any highway other than a public stand or parking place except for such time as shall be necessary only for the taking up or setting down of passengers.

6. The fees specified in the schedule are hereby imposed and shall be recovered in respect of the use of public stands by hiring cars.

7. All such fees shall be paid to the Chairman of the Board or to any person authorized in writing to recover such fees in advance by the owner or the driver or the conductor of a hiring car.

8. On payment of such fees a permit containing the following particulars shall be issued to the person paying any of the said fees:

- The date of issue of the permit.
- The number of the hiring car in respect of which the permit is issued.
- The amount of the fee paid.
- The period for which the permit will be in force.

9. Such permit shall always be carried in the hiring car in respect of which it is issued and shall be produced by the driver for inspection on demand by a Police Officer or by any person authorized by the Chairman of the Board.

10. No hiring car shall be used on a public stand unless a permit has been duly issued in respect of such hiring car and is in force at the time of such use.

REGULATIONS.

1. In these regulations—

"Council" means the Urban District Council of Matale.

"Chairman" means the Chairman of the Council.

"Public Stand" means any space within the administrative limits of the Council which is defined and reserved for the parking of motor cabs or omnibuses or hiring cars by a notice signed by the Chairman and exhibited at the spot.

2. No vehicle other than a motor cab or omnibus shall be parked in or enter a public stand.

3. When a public stand or any portion of a public stand is reserved for the use of motor cabs or omnibuses, no motor car not belonging to the class for which the stand is reserved shall be parked in it or enter it.

4. (a) A hiring car shall not enter a public stand except by the passage provided for such entrance and shall not leave except by the passage provided for such exit.

(b) All hiring cars shall when parked in a public stand be halted facing the same direction and immediately behind each other.

(c) All hiring cars parked in a public stand shall move up in due order as vacancies occur in front.

5. The driver of a motor cab or omnibus or a person capable of driving it shall be in charge while the motor cab or omnibus occupies a public stand.

6. No motor cab or omnibus shall be parked in any highway except a public stand; and no motor cab or omnibus shall enter or remain in a public stand—

(a) unless its driver is in possession of a valid permit in respect of it issued under regulation 7, and

(b) unless he produces it when required to do so by a Police Officer, or a person authorized for the purpose by the Chairman.

7. The Chairman may issue permits authorizing motor cabs or omnibuses to use a public stand and charge fees for the permits in accordance with the scale specified in regulation 9 hereto.

8. The driver of a lorry shall not park such lorry on any highway declared by regulation to be suitable for lorry traffic except—

(a) in the event of a breakdown and then only so long as may be necessary to enable essential repairs to be effected;

(b) for the purpose of loading or unloading goods and then only so long as may be reasonably necessary for the purpose.

9. (i.) No public stand shall be used by any person for a hiring car without a written permit from the Chairman, Urban District Council, which shall be granted for the day, month, or quarter as the case may be upon payment of the fees specified in the following scale of charges:—

(a) For a hiring car licensed to carry not more than 7 passengers—10 cents a day, or Re. 1 a month, or Rs. 2 a quarter.

(b) For a hiring car licensed to carry more than 7 passengers—25 cents a day, Rs. 3 a month, or Rs. 7.50 a quarter.

(ii.) No person shall park any motor car other than a hiring car in respect of which there is a valid permit in force issued under these regulations at any such public stand.

10. The regulations published in *Government Gazette* No. 7,723 of July 19, 1929, are hereby repealed.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended September 26, 1931.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 179 (9 Burghers, 106 Sinhalese, 25 Tamils, 24 Moors, 6 Malays, and 9 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1931, viz., 289,150) was 32.3, as against 32.6 in the preceding week, 29.5 in the corresponding week of last year, and 32.5 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 137 (7 Burghers, 88 Sinhalese, 19 Tamils, 19 Moors, 2 Malays, and 2 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 24.7, as against 28.3 in the previous week, 23.4 in the corresponding week of last year, and 28.2 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 137 total deaths, 26 were of infants under one year of age, as against 35 in the preceding week, 17 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 32 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 14.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Twelve deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 9 in Maradana hospitals (including 5 deaths of non-residents), and 1 each in Kotahena North, Kotahena South, and Wellawatta North, as against 17 in the previous week and 18 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Seven deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 2 each in Kotahena North and Slave Island, and 1 each in St. Paul's, San Sebastian, and Kollupitiya, as against 11 in the previous week and 8 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Five deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 1 each in San Sebastian, Kotahena South, New Bazaar, Maradana hospitals, and Slave Island, as against 4 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year.

2. (a) Thirteen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 8 in Maradana hospitals (including 6 deaths of non-residents), and 1 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena South, New Bazaar, Maradana North, and Maradana East, as against 17 in the previous week and 12 the weekly average for last year.

(b) One death from *Phthisis*, of a resident of Colombo town, occurred at the Anti-Tuberculosis Hospital, Ragama, during the week.

3. Three deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 2 in Maradana hospitals (of non-residents) and 1 in Slave Island, as against 1 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average or last year.

4. Thirteen deaths from *Enteritis* were registered, 5 each from *Diarrhoea* and *Debility*, 4 from *Dysentery*, 3 each from *Infantile Convulsions*, *Worms*, and *Tetanus*, 2 from *Puerperal Septicæmia*, and 59 from *Other Causes*.

5. **Reported Cases.**—Two cases of *Chickenpox* and 2 of *Enteric Fever* were reported during the week, as against 10 and 3 respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 81.5°, against 80.6° in the preceding week and 80.1° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.866 in., against 29.861 in. in the preceding week and 29.915 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0.84 in., against 0.42 in. in the preceding week and 1.70 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

The Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on August 15, 1931, at 8.30 a.m. in accordance with the notice dated August 11, 1931.

Present :—Mr. R. H. Whitehorn, Chairman; Ratwatte Adigar; Mr. Geo. E. de Silva; Mr. Haji M. S. Usoof Ismail; Mr. W. A. B. Soysa; Dr. W. E. de Silva; Mr. H. P. G. Young.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on July 18, 1931, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted :—

- (a) Statement of receipts and disbursements from close of 1930 to July 31, 1931, on account of the Municipal Fund.
- (b) Progress report of works brought up to June 30, 1931.
- (c) Health Officer's report for July, 1931.
- (d) Statement of cases instituted by the several Inspectors and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of July, 1931.
- (e) The reservoir readings for the week ending August 15, 1931.

Resolved that the statement (a) together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 83 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910, be forwarded to the Commissioner of Local Government for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table :—Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, standpipes, and house service taps inspected during July, 1931.

3A. With the permission of the Council, Mr. de Silva made a statement with regard to the recent prohibition of sale of articles in streets made by the Chairman under section 203 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance. He pointed out that while the Council's intention was merely to prohibit sale of foodstuffs under insanitary conditions and in unsightly hovels a few designing persons at a recent public meeting had misrepresented the purpose of the prohibition.

The Chairman agreed with Mr. de Silva's remarks and added that a notice was sent out by him and distributed at the public meeting giving the true intentions of the Council and the position was now clear to the public.

4. Petitions :—Mr. de Silva presented a petition (1) from the Secretary, Ratepayers' Association asking for the supply of water to residents in lower Malabar street ; and (2) from Messrs. Kanthimathi & Co., and Assan Abdul Cader praying that the cases instituted against them for storing kapok be withdrawn.

The Chairman undertook to deal with the matters referred to in the petitions.

5. Correspondence :—(1) Letter No. C 572 of August 1, 1931, from the Secretary to the Minister for Local Administration stating that the Executive Committee for Local Administration, at its meeting held on July 31, 1931, resolved that His Excellency the Governor should not be requested to sanction the resolution of the Council of May 16, 1931, relative to the reduction of rates.—Read.

(2) Letter No. I 163/31 of July 31, 1931, from the Assistant Chief Secretary stating that, in connection with the proposal to appoint a retired Civil Servant as Chairman, Municipal Council, Kandy, the Chief Secretary would be glad to be informed, as early as possible, whether the Council is prepared to suggest a suitable individual for appointment or not.—Read. Proposed by Mr. de Silva and seconded by Mr. Young the Council went into Committee to consider the matter.

In Committee, Ratwatte Adigar moved that the name of Mr. W. L. Kindersley be suggested for appointment. Mr. Usoof Ismail seconded.

Mr. de Silva moved as an amendment that the Government Agent should be asked to act as Chairman, without remuneration from the Council, as formerly. Mr. Soysa seconded.

The Chairman ruled the amendment as out of order as it was inconsistent with a resolution passed at the July meeting on the same subject.

The original motion was then put to the meeting and carried by 5 to 2, the voting being as follows :—

Ayes.—Ratwatte Adigar, Mr. Usoof Ismail, Dr. de Silva, Mr. Young, and Chairman.

Noes.—Mr. de Silva, Mr. Soysa.

The Council resumed and the resolution made in Committee was adopted by 5 to 2, the voting being the same as in Committee. Mr. de Silva said that he would send in his written dissent.

6. Papers *re* the application from the Sadachara Baudha Kulangana Society to cut and remove timber from Municipal land, free of charge, for building the new Buddhist Girls' College.

The Chairman moved that the application be not considered as it was wrong in principle to make concessions to any particular society.

Mr. de Silva moved as an amendment that tenders be invited for the sale of the timber trees at Nittawela. Mr. Usoof Ismail seconded.

The amendment was put to the meeting and declared lost and the original motion was carried by 5 to 2, the voting being as follows :—

Ayes.—Ratwatte Adigar, Mr. Soysa, Dr. de Silva, Mr. Young, the Chairman.

Noes.—Mr. de Silva, Mr. Ismail.

7. To approve of the amended conditions for the supply of electrical energy and to define big consumers as those consuming over 1,000 units per mensem and to amend the new schedule of rates by substituting 1,000 for 2,000 units.

Resolved that the amendments and definition be approved.

8. To sanction the confirmation of Mr. T. H. Cox in his appointment as Fire Brigade Officer and Superintendent of the Council's mechanical vehicles.

Resolved that he be confirmed in his appointment.

At this stage Mr. Soysa left the meeting with the concurrence of the Chairman.

9. Recommendations of Standing Committees :—

Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation held on July 18, 1931.

(1) Memo. No. H/G/217 of July 7, 1931, from the Medical Officer of Health submitting proposals for the introduction of the bored hole latrine system to rural areas, and suggesting that a sum of Rs. 2,000 be set apart from the vote for sanitary improvements to rural areas, to meet the cost of the necessary boring outfit and of the slabs to cover the holes, to be supplied at the Council's expense.—Recommended to vote Rs. 15 for the purchase of the boring outfit only.

(2) Letter dated July 11, 1931, from Messrs. B. H. Dunuville and H. Ranasinghe, occupiers of premises Nos. 568 and 570, Peradeniya road, complaining that the ambalam in Peradeniya road which adjoins their premises has become a danger to public health owing to its pollution by the inmates in the absence of a latrine, and suggesting its demolition.—Recommended to provide a bored hole latrine and to inquire if for Rs. 5 per mensem anyone will undertake to keep the ambalam clean and sanitary.

(3) Petition from Mr. M. Carrim asking for a plot of ground in the market premises to erect an establishment for repairing tennis racquets.—Recommended to reply regretting that no more buildings should be put up on the market grounds.

Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment held on July 18, 1931.

(4) To obtain a supplementary vote of Rs. 780 under Head 1A—Other Charges—Stamps, to meet the expenditure on stamps during the year.—Recommended.

(5) Letter from Mr. G. H. P. de Silva asking that the balance of Rs. 8.18 due by him on account of Hælloluwa Ferry Rent and interest thereon be written off in view of the poor rebate of Rs. 63 allowed to him by the Council on the loss of Rs. 275 incurred by him as a result of the Council not having supplied him with a ferry boat till July 7, 1931.—Recommended.

Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works held on August 7, 1931.

(6) Papers *re* inquiries made by the Chairman from the Works Department as to the possibility of the track metalling work on the road to Nittawela Trenching Ground being done departmentally.—Recommended that this work be not done departmentally.

(7) Memo. dated August 3, 1931, from the Medical Officer of Health stating that Nuisance Watchers will not be able to cope with the large crowds on the bund of the lake during the Perahera and suggesting that the services of four Police Constables be secured for duty on the bund to prevent the pollution of lake water.—Recommended the employment of four Police Pensioners during the Perahera period at Re. 1 per diem for each, special instructions being given to them to prevent people sitting on the lake wall.

(8) Plan of the proposed car park at Palle Mahaiyawa.—To be reconsidered. Recommended that the acquisition of the land by Ellen Hall for a playground be proceeded with.

(9) Letter dated July 22, 1931, from Mr. Geo. E. de la Motte complaining that Mr. C. Ahamado had misrepresented facts to obtain a permit to build on premises No. 64, Katugastota road, and that no proper road access exists to these premises.—Recommended not to recall the permit.

(10) Estimate for Rs. 375 from the Municipal Engineer for providing a footbridge over the stream in Talatu-oya road with detailed site plan.—Recommended.

(11) To consider the confirmation of Mr. R. Gopalswamy Pillai in his appointment as Waterworks Inspector.—Deferred.

(12) Estimate for Rs. 5,850 from the Municipal Engineer for building a pavilion at Bogambara ground, and design thereof.—Deferred.

(13) Papers re requirements to be carried out for making a portion of the land being acquired at Gohagoda fit for trenching.—Recommended to call for tenders for the contour survey.

(14) Estimate for Rs. 218 from the Municipal Engineer for constructing a new silt trap on the bund of the lake near Mr. Kindersley's bungalow.—Recommended experimentally, subject to a report on its working.

(15) To obtain a vote for Rs. 900 for building a new well, at the Council's expense, in premises owned by Mr. Ukku Banda in Mavilmada and for meeting the amount of compensation proposed to be paid to him in respect of the closure of the existing well.—Recommended. Tenders to be called for for building the new well.

(16) To consider the desirability of having a plan of the Mahaiyawa General Cemetery prepared at a cost of Rs. 300 in accordance with the requirement in section 24 of the Cemeteries Ordinance, No. 9 of 1899.—Recommended.

(17) Application from Mr. M. B. Warakaulle for permission to obtain access to the stable at premises No. 2, Hal-loluwa road, which he proposes to convert into rooms, through the space which will be rendered vacant by the demolition of the room attached to the ambalam.—Recommended, reserving the Council's rights as a tenant-at-will.

(18) Estimate for Rs. 175 from the Municipal Engineer for providing a dwarf wall and a door for the Municipal rice depôt at Mahaiyawa occupied by Mr. S. N. Segu Abdul Cader.—Recommended.

(19) Letter dated July 21, 1931, from the President, The All Ceylon Indian Estate Labour Federation for permission to use the Victoria Esplanade, free of charge, on the 9th instant for their monthly meeting.—Not recommended.

(20) Application from Messrs. The Colombo Commercial Co., for a water service for domestic purposes only, to their new premises in Peradeniya road.—Recommended.

(21) Programme for further restriction of the reservoir water supply with effect from August 8, 1931.—Recommended no further restriction, provided the consumption is controlled and is within 375,000 gallons daily.

(22) To discuss the present position regarding water and make any necessary recommendations.—Recommended the temporary appointment of an additional Waterworks Inspector on a salary of Rs. 50 per mensem to deal with waste only.

Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Electricity Committee held on August 7, 1931.

(23) Papers regarding the investigations made into the application from the Department of Agriculture, Peradeniya, for a continuous day supply of electrical energy.—Recommended 24 hours' supply till further notice.

(24) Draft of the notice which the Municipal Electrical Engineer proposes to issue to consumers of electrical energy with a view of encouraging them to use electric fans and thereby increase the day load.—Recommended that the amended notice be approved.

(25) Estimate for Rs. 45 from the Municipal Electrical Engineer for supplying and fixing 12-inch diameter guards to electric wires in all rat-proof granaries in the town.—Recommended.

(26) To sanction a vote for Rs. 147.34 for improving the lighting of Victoria Drive, by fixing one additional lamp standard and shifting the position of an existing lamp standard.—Recommended, subject to the details being approved by the Provincial Engineer, Central Province (North).

Resolved that the recommendations be adopted with the exception of items (2), (3), and (8).

As regards item (2), it was agreed to sanction the bored hole latrine only.

On item (3), it was resolved to give the applicant a vacant boutique on the authorized rent if there is one which cannot be pulled down.

Item (8) was deferred pending consideration of a different scheme for providing the car park.

Sanction of item (22) was subject to reconsideration at the end of 3 months.

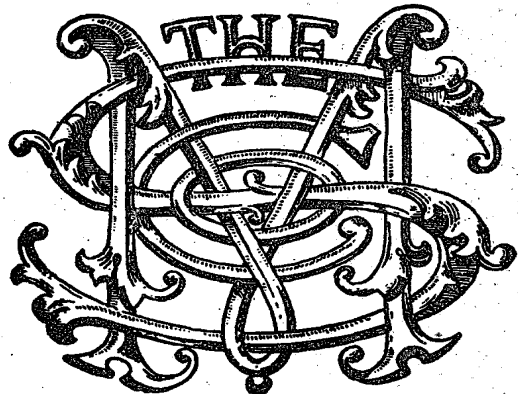
