REGULATIONS.

1. In these regulations the expressions "Kandy-Panwila road," "Kandy-Elkaduwa road," and "Kandy-Matale road" shall mean the portions of these roads in the "Urban Area" comprised within the administrative limits of the Sanitary Board town of Wattagama as specified in the schedule hereto.

2. No person shall park a hiring car at any spot along the Kandy-Panwila road, Kandy-Elkaduwa road, Kandy-Matale road, Post Office road, Railway Station road, and Resthouse road except at a public stand provided or allotted for the purpose by the Sanitary Board of the Kandy District.

3. No person shall park a hiring car in or at any such stand unless he has in his possession a valid written permit issued by the Chairman of the said Board for the use of such stand by such hiring car.

4. Such permit shall contain the number of the hiring car in respect of which it is issued and it shall be issued upon payment of a fee of Rs. 5 per annum in the case of an omnibus or of Rs. 2.50 per annum in the case of a motor cab.

5. Such permit shall on demand by a Sanitary Board Inspector, Police Headman, or a Police Officer in uniform be produced for inspection by the person in charge of a hiring car in occupation of such stand.

6. The person in charge of a hiring car who commits a breach of regulations 2, or 3, or 5 shall be guilty of an offence.

Limit on the south the Railway crossing over the principal road from Kandy, thence on the west a line drawn 50 yards from the centre of the principal road to Elkaduwa as far as a point opposite the Gadadessapihilla and Ulpota, from the Ulpota a line drawn 50 yards from the centre of the road and parallel to it on the east as far as the Mahapihilla-ela, thence along the Mahapihilla-ela to its junction with Mr. Holloway's water-course, and from thence a straight line drawn through Franklands estate to the boundary between Franklands estate and Gonambil estate on the principal road to Panwila, thence across the principal road to Narendawela-ela and along this ela to its junction with the footpath leading to Wattagama-Bomaluwepansala, along this footpath to Banakgederawatta, thence along the western boundary of Banakgederawatta along the said

eastern boundary of Matalawegederawatta to the limit of Aluangekumbura lying below Wickragewatta, and thence along the limit between the paddy fields and Wickragewatta to the Railway line and along the Railway line to the Railway crossing forming the southern boundary.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended October 3, 1931.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 184 (3 Europeans, 9 Burghers, 117 Sinhalese, 19 Tamils, 20 Moors, 11 Malays, and 5 Others). The

birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1931, viz., 289,150) was 33.2, as against 32.3 in the preceding week, 32.4 in the corresponding week of last year, and 32.5 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 164 (7 Burghers, 97 Sinhalese, 28 Tamils, 21 Moors, 5 Malays, and 6 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 29.6, as against 24.7 in the previous week, 21.6 in the corresponding week of last year, and 28.2 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 164 total deaths, 30 were of infants under one year of age, as against 26 in the preceding week, 24 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 32 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 16.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Fourteen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 6 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents), 2 in Kollupitiya, and 1 each in Kotahena North, Kotahena South, New Bazaar, Maradana North, Maradana East, and Slave Island, as against 12 in the previous week and 18 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Seven deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 3 in Slave Island, 2 in San Sebastian, and 1 each in New Bazaar, and Maradana South. The number registered during the preceding week was also 7, and the weekly average for last year was 8.

(c) Seven deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 2 in Maradana North, and 1 each in New Bazaar, Maradana hospitals (of a non-resident), Maradana South, Kollupitiya, and Wellawatta North, as against 5 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year.

2. (a) Eleven deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 6 in Maradana hospitals (including 4 deaths of non-residents), 3 in St. Paul's, and 1 each in Kotahena North and Maradana South, as against 13 in the previous week and 12 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Four deaths from *Phthisis*, of residents of Colombo town, occurred at the Anti-tuberculosis hospital, Ragama, during the week.

3. Two deaths from *Enteric fever* were registered, 1 each in Maradana hospitals (of a non-resident) and Wellawatta North, as against 3 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year.

4. Fifteen deaths from *Enteritis* were registered, 8 from *Debility*, 5 from *Worms*, 4 from *Accidents*, 3 from *Diarrhoea*, 2 each from *Infantile convulsions*, *Homicide*, and *Puerperal Septicaemia* and 82 from *Other Causes*.

5. **Reported Cases.**—Five cases of *Enteric Fever* and 3 of *Chickenpox* were reported during the week as against 2 and 2 respectively of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 81.0°, against 81.5° in the preceding week and 80.7° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.896 in, against 29.866 in. in the preceding week and 29.891 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0.19 in. against 0.84 in. in the preceding week and 16.01 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
