"Public Stand" means a defined space within the Urban Area reserved for the parking of omnibuses and lorries and indicated as such by a notice exhibited by the "Licensing Authority."

"Licensing Authority" for the "Urban Area" shall be the Assistant Government Agent, Matara, as appointed by regulation published in *Gazette* No. 7,869 of July 10, 1931.

2. No vehicle other than an omnibus or lorry shall be parked in a public stand.

3. All omnibuses or lorries parked in a public stand shall be halted facing the same direction one behind the other and shall be moved up as vacancies occur in front.

4. No omnibus or lorry shall enter a public stand save by the passage provided or indicated for its entrance nor leave such stand save by the passage provided or indicated for its exit.

5. The driver of each omnibus or lorry parked in any public stand shall be in attendance of such vehicle.

6. The fees mentioned in the schedule hereto shall be payable to the Licensing Authority in advance by the owner or driver of any omnibus or lorry occupying a public stand.

Schedule.

(a) Each omnibus or lorry which plies from Akuressa and occupies a public stand shall pay Rs. 2.50 per month for the use of the stand.

(b) Each omnibus or lorry plying between Galle-Deniyaya and Matara-Deniyaya, and *vice versa*, and occupying a stand shall pay 25 cents for over five minutes and up to 12 hours, and five cents for every additional 10 minutes thereafter. These charges may however be compounded on payment of Rs. 2.50 per mensem as in (a) above.

(c) The person in charge of the bus or lorry shall produce the receipt for such payments if required to do so by any person authorized by the Licensing Authority to demand it.

It shall be lawful for any such mortgagee, or for his heirs, or any one of them, or for his legal representative to pay to the Council, at any time before the sale of such property, seized as aforesaid, all arrears of rates, taxes, or charges, or the arrears in respect of which the seizure shall have been made, due by the owner or mortgagor, of such property, and upon such payment being made, the property shall be released from seizure.

4. The hours of departure of boats from the Jetty to be according to the arrival and departure of mail or other steamers.

5. 13. No tender will be considered unless in respect of it all the conditions above laid down have been strictly fulfilled.

14. No contract shall be entered into with any person whose name is on the list of Crown defaulting contractors, either individually or jointly with any other person, nor shall the contractor employ any person whose name is on the list of Crown defaulting contractors, or any other person to whom the Postmaster-General, for reasons which appear to him sufficient, objects after giving due notice of his objection in writing.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended October 10, 1931.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 216 (4 Europeans, 22 Burghers, 118 Sinhalese, 34 Tamils, 28 Moors, 5 Malays, and 5 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1931, viz., 289,150) was 39.0, as against 33.2 in the preceding week, 37.1 in the corresponding week of last year, and 32.5 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 171 (9 Burghers, 95 Sinhalese, 34 Tamils, 26 Moors, 3 Malays, and 4 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 30.8, as against 29.6 in the previous week, 21.8 in the corresponding week of last year, and 28.2 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 171 total deaths, 37 were of infants under one year of age, as against 30 in the preceding week, 31 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 32 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 20.

Principal Causes of Deaths.—1. (a) Sixteen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 6 in Maradana hospitals (including 4 deaths of non-residents), 2 each in St. Paul's, New Bazaar, and Slave Island, and 1 each in Maradana East, Maradana South, Wellawatta North, and Wellawatta South, as against 14 in the previous week, and 18 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Thirteen deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 4 in Slave Island, 3 each in St. Paul's and New Bazaar, 2 in Kotahena North, and 1 in Wellawatta South, as against 7 in the previous week, and 8 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Nine deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 2 each in Kotahena North, New Bazaar, Maradana hospitals, and Maradana North, and 1 in St. Paul's, as against 7 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.

2. (a) Eighteen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 8 in Maradana hospitals (including 4 deaths of non-residents), 4 in New Bazaar, 2 in Wellawatta North, and 1 each in Kotahena North, Maradana North, Slave Island, and Kollupitiya, as against 11 in the previous week, and 12 the weekly average for last year.

(b) One death from *Phthisis*, of a resident of Colombo Town, occurred at the Anti-Tuberculosis Hospital, Ragama, during the week.

3. Four deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), as against 2 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.

4. One death from *Plague* was registered in Maradana hospitals as against nil in the previous week, and 1 the weekly average for last year.

5. Eighteen deaths from *Enteritis* were registered, 12 from *Debility*, 5 from *Accidents*, 4 from *Infantile Convulsions*, 3 from *Worms*, 2 each from *Tetanus* and *Puerperal Septicæmia*, 1 each from *Diarrhoea* and *Dysentery*, and 62 from *Other Causes*.

6. *Reported Cases.*—Sixteen cases of *Chicken-pox*, 7 of *Enteric Fever*, and 2 of *Plague* were reported during the week, as against 3, 5, and nil, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 81.3°, against 81.0° in the preceding week and 78.6 in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.898 in., against 29.896 in. in the preceding week and 29.947 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0.82 in. against 0.19 in. in the preceding week and 4.06 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

4. Pursuant to notice Mr. T. G. Jayewardene asked the following question which the Chairman answered.—

Q.—In view of a recent report in the Press of an explosion from spontaneous combustion of a powder magazine in Hongkong causing enormous damage, does not the Chairman consider it advisable to warn Government of the undesirable situation of the local powder magazine—in close proximity to a jail, several residential bungalows and colleges, petrol and oil tanks and a railway line constantly carrying passenger traffic and that an explosion of the magazine under these conditions would cause appalling loss of life and property? A.—I have requested the Hon. the Minister of Local Administration to forward this question for consideration to the Executive Committee of Home Affairs which is in charge of the subject of explosives. I have asked to be informed of the views of that Committee on the matter. I have not yet received a reply.

5. Pursuant to notice, Mr. M. L. M. Reyal moved—"In view of the necessity of affording some relief to the rate-payers, owing to the existing financial depression, that a Special Committee of the Council be appointed to consider and report on :—(1) What relief should be afforded the ratepayers by way of modification of the laws relating to (a) taxes, (b) buildings and drainage? (2) What further relief should be given? (3) To effect economy in the various departments of the Council? Dr. E. A. Coorey seconded.

Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando supported the motion. The Chairman stated that he was in sympathy with the motion which he put to the meeting and declared carried.

Mr. M. L. M. Reyal moved that the following members should constitute the Special Committee :—(1) The Chairman, (2) Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader, (3) Dr. E. V. Ratnam, (4) Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando, (5) Dr. E. A. Coorey, (6) Mr. T. G. Jayewardene, (7) Mr. M. L. M. Reyal, (8) Mr. W. J. Thornhill. Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando seconded.—Carried.

6. Pursuant to notice, the Chairman moved—That the Council should resolve itself into a Committee of the whole Council to consider the following extracts from the proceedings of the Committees annexed to the agenda. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried.

Council in Committee.

The following Extract from the Minutes of the Special Committee regarding the Public Library of August 1, 1931, was considered.

Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded. Mr. F. Dadabhoy moved, as an amendment, that the Council do make and assess for the Calendar year 1932, a rate of 20 per cent. of the annual value of all houses and buildings of every description and of all lands and tenements whatsoever within the Municipal limits of Colombo, as required by section 115 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910. The gratuity is based on his service of 351 months and his average monthly pay of Rs. 59·51. Registered No. 848.—Recommended.

(22) To recommend under rule 21 of the Municipal Council Pension Rules, the grant of a gratuity of Rs. 357·08 to cooly Madan, B. T. 3086 of the Municipal Engineer's Department, who is condemned by a medical board as unfit for further service. The gratuity is based on his service of 217 months and his average monthly pay of Rs. 29·62. Registered No. 846.—Recommended.

(23) To recommend under rule 21 of the Municipal Council Pension Rules, the grant of a gratuity of Rs. 281·70 to cooly Arumugam B. T. 159 of the Municipal Engineer's Department, who is condemned by a medical board as unfit for further service. The gratuity is based on his service of 192 months and his average monthly pay of Rs. 26·41. *Note.*—This cooly's service had been interrupted by breaks aggregating to 33 months in all and there is no reliable evidence as to their real cause. But they can be condoned under second proviso to rule 21 of the Municipal Council Pension Rules which runs as follows:—“It shall, however, be competent for the Council, with the consent of His Excellency the Governor, to award such gratuities in cases in which the service has not been continuous.” Registered No. 847.—Recommended.

(24) To recommend under rule 21 of the Municipal Council Pension Rules, the grant of a gratuity of Rs. 403·21 to cooly Sandanam, B. T. 3701 of the Municipal Engineer's Department, who is condemned by a medical board as unfit for further service. The gratuity is based on his service of 220 months and his average monthly pay of Rs. 32·99. *Note.*—This cooly's service had been interrupted by breaks aggregating to 9 months in all and there is no reliable evidence as to their real cause. But they can be condoned under second proviso to rule 21 of the Municipal Council Pension Rules, which runs as follows:—“It shall, however, be competent for the Council, with the consent of His Excellency the Governor, to award such gratuities in cases in which the service has not been continuous.” Registered No. 849.—Recommended.

(25) To recommend under rule 2A (i.) of the new Pension Rules, the grant of gratuity of Rs. 855·73 as computed below and a reduced pension, with effect from August 1, 1931, of Rs. 290·62 to Mrs. E. Raymond, late Health Visitor of the Public Health Department, who retired on pension on June 1, 1930, at the age of 57 years:—Pension granted per annum, Rs. 387·50; $\frac{1}{4}$ commuted at 10 years' purchase, Rs. 968·75; less $\frac{1}{4}$ of pension drawn from date of retirement to July 31, 1931, viz. Rs. 452·08; Rs. 113·02; balance due to be paid, Rs. 855·73. Registered No. 851.—Recommended.

(26) To recommend under rule 21 of the Municipal Council Pension Rules, the grant of a gratuity of Rs. 932·56 to the widow of late cooly M. Raman, B. T. 50 of the Municipal Engineer's Department, who died on May 22, 1931. The gratuity is based on his service of 214 months and his average monthly pay of Rs. 78·44. *Note.*—The above cooly M. Raman died on May 22, 1931, and his wife makes application for the gratuity which may be paid to the widow under third proviso to rule 21 of the Municipal Council Pension Rules, which runs as follows:—“In the case of a daily paid employee who dies whilst in service or on leave and who at the time of his death would if he had retired have been eligible for a gratuity under this rule, the gratuity that would in the ordinary course have been paid to him had he retired may be paid to his widow or next of kin.” The only proof that the applicant is the widow of the late cooly M. Raman is an affidavit and in the past affidavits have been accepted as proof of marriage. Registered No. 850.—Recommended.

APPLICATION FOR AN ADVANCE.

(27) To consider—(a) An application from Mr. G. de Silva, Stock Inspector, Veterinary Department, for an advance of Rs. 200 to enable him to purchase a rickshaw for official duties. (b) The recommendation of the Municipal Treasurer that the advance be granted on the usual terms, viz., that the amount be repaid in twelve equal monthly instalments and that 5 per cent. per annum be charged as interest on the balances outstanding from time to time. Registered No. 09,736.—Recommended.

LEAVE.

(28) To recommend under section 6 of the Municipal Council Leave By-laws, the grant of excess leave of 26 days over 42 days to Mr. C. A. Woutersz, Assistant to Microbiologist. Registered No. 09,269.—Recommended.

(29) To recommend under section 17A (ii.) of the Municipal Council Leave By-laws, the grant of half pay to cooly Caruppiah, B. T. 743 of the Municipal Engineer's Department, for the 33 days he was absent from work on account of illness arising out of an accident that took place while on duty and not due to his own culpable carelessness. Registered No. 09,863.—Recommended.

WRITE OFF OF ARREARS OF RATES.

(30) To consider a report of the Municipal Treasurer, dated August 12, 1931, recommending that arrears of rates amounting to Rs. 147·61, as per list attached to his report, be written off. (11 cases, 6 on grounds of poverty and 5 irrecoverable). Registered No. 09,728.—Recommended.

The following Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects of July 1, 1931, was considered.

MUNICIPAL TREASURER'S DEPARTMENT.

(3) To consider the following question of Mr. M. L. M. Reyal, M.M.C., in Council on June 10, 1931:—In view of local financial stringency, will the Chairman bring before the Committees of the Council the desirability of a reduction of the warrant charge of 10 per cent. now levied? (Mr. M. L. M. Reyal was present when this item was discussed.)

In view of the cost of collecting the arrears, the Committee was not in favour of reducing the warrant charge of 10 per cent.

The following Extract from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects of July 25, 1931, was considered.

(3) To consider a memorandum of the Chairman, dated July 18, 1931, with regard to amendments to Pension Rules. Registered No. 662.—Recommended that the suggested amendments in the Pension Rules be adopted (vide annexure B).

ANNEXURE B.

Existing Rules.

2. The following sub-section shall be inserted immediately after rule 14 :—

14. (1) If any officer to whom a pension has been granted under these rules is appointed to another office in the service of the Council, then during his tenure of such office so much only (if any) of his pension from the Council shall be paid to him per annum as, together with—

- (a) The annual emoluments of such office ; and
- (b) Where the officer receives in respect of his previous service with the Council both a gratuity and a pension, and annual amount equal to the difference between the reduced pension actually received and the full unreduced pension which he might have been granted if he had not been granted both a gratuity and a pension, make up an amount not greater than the annual salary of the appointment from which he retired.

Provided that—

- (i.) Where the officer retired or was transferred from the service of the Council prior to January 1, 1924, the salary of the appointment from which he retired shall, for the purpose of this section, be deemed to be the salary to which the salary last drawn by him would have been converted under the Salaries Scheme brought into force from January 1, 1924, had he been drawing it on that date;
- (ii.) Any bonus or temporary increase whether on pension or on the salary of the new office, granted in respect of the high cost of living, shall be added to such pension or salary, as the case may be, for the purpose of this section.

(2) In the event of an officer's re-employment with the Council, the original pension will be altogether cancelled if the officer on re-employment attains a rate of salary not less than that on which he first retired, and the ultimate pension will on final retirement be based on his final salary and the total length of his service as though the whole has been continuous ; but if the salary received during the second period of service is less than that on which he first retired, the original pension will be revived on his ultimate retirement and a distinct pension will be grantable for the second period of service at the rate of 1-720th of his final salary for each month of such service, less any number of months that may have been previously added in respect of abolition of office, and without any addition for climate bonus already computed in the first pension.

(3) A re-employed officer shall be deemed to have exercised, or not to have exercised, in respect of his service subsequent to re-employment, the option provided for in section 2A of these rules, according as he exercised, or did not exercise, such option in respect of his previous service. Where a revised pension based on final salary and the total length of his service is calculated on his ultimate retirement, the gratuity to be paid on such ultimate retirement to an officer who has exercised his option in favour of a gratuity and reduced pension shall be reduced by the amount of the gratuity already paid ; but if a distinct pension is granted to such an officer for the second period of service he will draw a separate and distinct gratuity and a reduced pension for the second period of service.

2B. (1) If an officer holding a pensionable post who has completed five years, public service (as defined in section 18 (2) and including any period of service on probation or agreement) has died on or after January 1, 1928, or shall die hereafter, while in the service of the Council, the Council may grant to such person as it may approve for the benefit of the dependents of the deceased officer a gratuity of an amount not exceeding one year's pensionable emoluments.

24. In the event of an officer or servant dying while in the service of the Municipal Council it shall be competent to the Municipal Council to grant to the widow or next of kin of such officer or servant a gratuity not exceeding three months' pay of the office ; and it shall be competent to the Council to grant, in addition, one month's pay for each minor child.

Amendments proposed.

(a) The words "The following sub-section shall be inserted immediately after rule 14" be deleted.

(b) The following be inserted :—

"The following section shall be substituted for rules 14 and 14A."

2B. The word "holding" in the first line of the rule be deleted and the words "confirmed in" be inserted.

24. The words "other than an officer or servant confirmed in a pensionable post who has completed 5 years' public service (as defined in section 18 (2) and including any period of service on probation or agreement" be inserted between "servant" and dying in the first line.
