And whereas by section 6 of the said Ordinance it is enacted that every order made by the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, under the provisions of section 4 thereof, imposing a charge upon a district in respect of Police, shall specify the time during which it is to be enforced, and shall be conclusive proof that the sums named in such order may be lawfully raised in the district as therein mentioned, and that the officer designated in such order, and any person lawfully acting under his authority, is authorized to cause the same to be collected:

And whereas Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931, vests in the Governor all powers, authorities, and functions which shall be vested by any written law in the Governor in Executive Council on and after the date when the first election of Executive Committees and the first appointment of Ministers shall be complete:

And whereas the said election of Executive Committees and the said appointment of Ministers was complete on July 9, 1931:

It is hereby ordered by the Governor that the said sum of Rupees Three thousand and Four hundred and Cents Twenty-nine, being the whole of the amount certified as aforesaid, shall be a charge payable by every male inhabitant above the age of 18 years, who either resides or possesses immovable property in the district of Pirampattai referred to above and that this order shall be enforced on or before January 15, 1932, and that the said charge shall be collected by the Government Agent, Northern Province.

The order dated September 20, 1931, published in the *Gazette* No. 7,883 of September 25, 1931, is hereby revoked.

Amended Rules of the Ceylon Mounted Rifles Sports and Entertainment Fund.

1. The Fund shall be called the Ceylon Mounted Rifles Sports and Entertainment Fund and shall be contributed to by all serving members of the Regiment, both active and reserve.

(b) The subscriptions of all Officers shall be paid direct to the Hony. Secretary and Treasurer and those of Other Ranks shall be collected by Troop Commanders and remitted to the Hony. Secretary and Treasurer not later than March 31 in each year.

(c) All members who have not paid their subscription by April 30 shall be reported to the Commanding Officer.

(d) Any member joining the Regiment after June 30 shall only be called upon for half the normal subscription for that year.

(e) Any member who is out of the Island for 9 months in any one year shall not be called upon for a subscription for that year.

(f) The subscription to the Sports and Entertainment Fund being compulsory on all members, in virtue of Ceylon Defence Force Regulations, Appendix A, paragraph 23, such subscription is recoverable at law.

(g) This Fund having been established, members will not be liable to contribute to any further extent in connection with the Regiment, except on a voluntary basis, to such organizations as the Regimental Polo Club, &c.

"THE PILGRIMAGES ORDINANCE, No. 13 OF 1896."

THE following rules and orders made by His Excellency the Governor, under Ordinance No. 13 of 1896, entitled "An Ordinance relating to Pilgrimages," as amended by Ordinance No. 7 of 1897, for the conduct of the Kataragama pilgrimage and festival, where special precautions have been and are necessary, are published for general information, in lieu of the rules promulgated annually for several years.

RULES.

1. For sanitary reasons the duration of the Kataragama Ilmaha Kachehi festival and of the stay of pilgrims at Kataragama shall be and it is hereby limited to three days, namely, November 23 to 25, 1931. Pilgrims arriving before the day first named or staying beyond the period here prescribed shall be guilty of an offence.

2. In the event of an epidemic breaking out at Kataragama during the festival, it shall be lawful for the officers appointed to enforce the observance of orders to declare the festival at an end, and to direct pilgrims at once to leave the village and proceed to their homes, and to prescribe the roads they have to travel.

3. The officers appointed to enforce the observance of orders shall have power on the line of march to and from Kataragama and at Kataragama—

- (a) To appoint particular places to be exclusively used by the pilgrims for washing and bathing, for drawing water and drinking, and for natural offices;
- (b) To appoint places for the occupation of each class of pilgrims;
- (c) To prescribe routes for the journey of any body of pilgrims;
- (d) To regulate the distribution of all food given to pilgrims;
- (e) To fix separate places of abode for pilgrims who fall ill, to prohibit communication with them, and to detain them if unfit to travel.

Any person disobeying an order given by the appointed officers shall be guilty of an offence.

4. For the purpose of these rules camp shall mean the area within half a mile of the Maha Dewale in every direction.

5. The Police are empowered and required to seize and destroy all food condemned as unwholesome on the march or in camp by the Medical Officer, or, if there be none, by the Chief Officer of Police; and any person resisting or obstructing the Police in the discharge of this or of any other duty prescribed by these rules shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

6. Any person bringing any cattle or cart bulls within one-quarter of a mile of the camp without a permit from the Supervising Officer or any person authorized by him to issue such permits shall be deemed guilty of an offence. The issue of such permit shall be subject to compliance by the permit-holder with such conditions as may be imposed by the Supervising Officer for the purpose of enforcing sanitation and maintaining the health of the camp.

7. Any person exposing commodities of any description for sale in camp in any other place than that assigned for the purpose by the officer in charge of the camp shall be deemed guilty of an offence, and any person selling food condemned as unwholesome by the Medical Officer, or in his absence, by the Chief Officer of Police, shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

8. Any person who shall, during the occupation of the camp, use any other place for offices of nature than that provided for the purpose by Government, or failing to cover the deposit with earth or sand, and any person who shall during the same period bathe in, or enter the river above the spot appointed by the officer in charge of the camp, shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

9. Any person suffering from an infectious or a contagious disease, and not reporting the same to the Medical Officer, or in his absence, to the Chief Officer of Police, and any person abetting or assisting in the concealment of such disease, shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

10. All persons shall take up the quarters assigned to them by the Chief Officer of Police at the halting places and in the camp, and any person declining or neglecting to do so shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

11. No person shall construct any booth or extend any building so as to encroach on the main streets of the camp without the previous sanction of the Supervising Officer.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended October 31, 1931.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 196 (15 Burghers, 109 Sinhalese, 35 Tamils, 29 Moors, 4 Malays, and 4 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1931, viz., 289,150) was 35.3, as against 37.0 in the preceding week, 37.5 in the corresponding week of last year, and 32.5 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 146 (1 European, 9 Burghers, 80 Sinhalese, 30 Tamils, 24 Moors, 1 Malay, and 1 Other). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 26.3, as against 21.8 in the previous week, 25.1 in the corresponding week of last year, and 28.2 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 146 total deaths, 39 were of infants under one year of age, as against 28 in the preceding week, 29 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 32 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 15.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Thirteen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 7 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents), 2 in Kotahena North, and 1 each in Maradana North, Maradana South, Slave Island, and Kollupitiya, as against 8 in the previous week and 18 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Eleven deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 4 in Slave Island, 2 in New Bazaar, and 1 each in Pettah, San Sebastian, Kotahena South, Maradana South, and Wellawatta South, as against 3 in the previous week and 8 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Eight deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 2 each in Maradana South and Slave Island, and 1 each in Kotahena South, Maradana hospitals, Maradana North, and Wellawatta North, as against 3 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year.

2. (a) Fourteen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 11 in Maradana hospitals (including 4 deaths of non-residents), 2 in Kotahena South and 1 in Kotahena North. The number registered during the preceding week was also 14 and the weekly average for last year was 12.

(b) One death from *Phthisis* of a resident of Colombo town, occurred at the Anti-Tuberculosis hospital, Ragama, during the week.

3. Twelve deaths from *Debility* were registered, 10 from *Enteritis*, 8 from *Diarrhoea*, 4 from *Worms*, 2 each from *Infantile Convulsions*, *Tetanus*, *Puerperal Septicaemia*, and *Accidents*, 1 from *Dysentery* and 57 from *Other Causes*.

4. **Reported Cases.**—Sixteen cases of *Chickenpox* and 3 of *Enteric Fever* were reported during the week, as against 9 and 5, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 79.9°, against 80.6° in the preceding week and 79.1° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.876 in., against 29.898 in. in the preceding week, and 29.898 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 1.15 in., against 4.85 in. in the preceding week and 5.19 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION OF WIGMORE INVESTMENTS, LIMITED.

1. The regulations contained in the Table marked "C" in the Schedule to the Companies Ordinance, No. 4 of 1861, (hereinafter called Table "C") shall apply to the Company and be deemed to be incorporated herewith except so far as they are herein expressly or by implication modified or excluded or declared not to apply and in the construction of these presents words importing the masculine gender only shall include the feminine gender and words importing the singular number only shall include the plural number and *vice versa* and words importing persons shall include corporations.

2. Regulation 2 of Table "C" is expressly excluded and the following regulation substituted therefor namely:

7. Regulations 45 and 46 of Table "C" are expressly excluded and the following regulations substituted therefor:—

45A. The number of Directors shall be not less than three nor more than five.

45B. The first Directors shall be T. C. Dyball, H. J. Hutchings, and L. E. Heal, all of Colombo.

8. The following new regulations shall be added after Regulation 46 of Table "C" namely:—

46A. A Director may with the consent of his co-directors be absent from the meetings of the Directors for such period or periods as he shall think fit.

46B. Each Director shall have the power to appoint in writing any person whether a Shareholder of the Company or not to act as a Deputy Director in his place during his absence or inability to act as Director and at his discretion to remove such Deputy Director.

No Director shall be disqualified by reason of his holding office from contracting with the Company either as vendor purchaser or otherwise nor shall any such contract or any contract or arrangement entered into by or on behalf of the Company with any Director or with any company or partnership of or in which any Director shall be a Director or a member or be in any way interested be avoided nor shall any Director so contracting or being such a Director or member or so interested nor any company or partnership of or in which he shall be a Director or member or be in any way interested be liable to account to the Company for any profit realized by any such contract or arrangement by reason of such Director holding that office or of the fiduciary relation thereby established. Any Director or any company or partnership of which a Director is or hereafter may be a Director or member or in which he is or hereafter may be in any way interested may enter into contracts or arrangements with this Company and any Director of this Company may vote as a Director or Shareholder in respect of any contract or arrangement mentioned in this Article and retain for his own use or for the use of such company or partnership profits made by him under any such contract or arrangement. Provided always that he must disclose his interest to his co-Directors before the contract or arrangement is entered into by the Directors unless the nature of the Director's interest appears on the face of the contract or arrangement.

No Director shall be disqualified from holding office by reason of entering into any contract with or doing any work for the Company or by reason of his being a member of any corporation, company, or firm which has entered into any contract with, or done any work for the Company or by reason of his being agent, or secretary, or solicitor, or being a member of a firm who are agents, or secretaries, or solicitors of the Company; nevertheless, he shall disclose to the Directors his interest in any contract work or business in which he may be personally interested, and shall not vote in respect of any matters connected with any such contract, work, or business.

11. Regulation 64 of Table "C" is expressly excluded and the following substituted therefor namely:—
