STATISTICS. VITAL

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended November 7, 1931.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 193 (4 Europeans, 12 Burghers, 115 Sinhalese, 22 Tamils, 32 Moors, 5 Malays, and 3 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1931, viz., 289,150) was 34.8, as against 35.3 in the preceding week, 39.2 in the corresponding week of last year, and 32.5 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 129 (2 Burghers, 75 Sinhalese, 14 Tamils, 24 Moors, 8 Malays, and 6 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 23 3, as against 26 3 in the previous week, 24.3 in the corresponding week of last year, and 28 2 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 129 total deaths, 30 were of infants under one year of age, as against 39 in the preceding week, 33 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 32 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 17.

Principal Causes of Death.-1. (a) Ten deaths from Pneumonia were registered, 3 in Maradana North, 2 each in Kotahena North and Maradana hospitals (including I death of a non-resident), and I each in San Sebastian, Kotahena South, and Maradana South, as against 13 in the previous week and 18 the weekly average for last year.

- (b) Ten deaths from Influenza were registered, 4 in Slave Island, 2 each in St. Paul's and San Sebastian, and 1 each in Kotahena South and New Bazaar, as against 11 in the previous week and 8 the weekly average for last
- (c) Three deaths from Bronchitis were registered, 1 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena North, and Maradana North, as against 8 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year.
- (a) Thirteen deaths from Phthisis were registered, 2. (a) Thirteen deaths from Finness were registered, 7 in Maradana hospitals (including 5 deaths of non-residents) and 1 each in San Sebastian, New Bazaar, Maradana South, Slave Island, Wellawatta North, and Wellawatta South, as against 14 in the previous week, and 12 the weekly average for last year.
- (b) Two deaths from Phthisis of residents of Colombo town, occurred at the Anti-Tuberculosis Hospital, Ragama, during the week.
- 3. One death from *Enteric Fever* was registered in Maradana hospitals, as against nil in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year.
- 4. Ten deaths from Debility were registered, 7 from Enteritis, 6 from Worms, 3 each from Diarrhoea and Puerperal Septicaemia, 2 each from Dysentery, Infantile Convulsions, and Accidents, 1 each from Suicide and Homicide, and 55 from Other Causes.
- Reported Cases.—Seven cases of Chickenpox and 5 of Enteric Fever were reported during the week, as against 16 and 3 respectively of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 80.0° against 79.9° in the preceding week and 79.6° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.898 in. against 29.876 in the preceding week, and 29.944 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 2.73 in. against 1.15 in. in the preceding week and 3.68 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

ANNEXURE, B.

Ambulance Service in Colombo.

Three Motor Ambulances are kept at the Fire Station, Reclamation road, in charge of the Superintendent, Fire Brigade (Telephone 1 or 2) for the following services:

(a) To remove to any medical institution free of charge all accident cases occuring in Colombo, including the Harbour premises and ships in the Harbour, and also all accident cases brought by train to Colombo.

(b) To remove to any medical institution from any part of Colombo as above, free of charge, at the request of

a Government or Municipal Officer, indigent persons and minor Government or Municipal employees who require such removal owing to accident or serious sickness.

(c) To remove to any medical institution all medical and surgical cases landed from ships in the Harbour on

payment of Rs. 10 a journey or Re. 1 a mile whichever is greater.

(d) To remove to or from any medical institution private medical or surgical cases, as described in paragraph 3 below, if the Superintendent, Fire Brigade, is satisfied that the Ambulance kept at the General Hospital has been applied for and is not available, at a charge of Rs. 10 a journey or Re. 1 a mile whichever is

Infectious Diseases.—Four Motor Ambulances are kept at the Ambulance Station in Destructor road in charge of the Ambulance Station Officer (Telephone 1157), two for cases of infectious diseases, one for contacts and one for dead bodies found in streets, suicides and drowning fatalities, &c. These transport all such from within Colombo and the

Doubles found in streets, suicides and drowning fatalities, &c. These transport all such from within Colombo and the Harbour. No charge is made for cases taken to the Infectious Diseases Hospital at Angoda, except for cases from ships in the Harbour, and no charge is made for removing dead bodies.

For all infectious and contact cases from ships, and for all infectious and contact cases in Colombo taken to destinations within the city, the charge is Rs. 10 a journey or Re. 1 a mile whichever is greater.

3. Private Medical or Surgical Cases (other than infectious or accidents).—One Motor Ambulance is kept at the General Hospital belonging to the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services (Telephone 1280) for these private cases from the City (except from the Harbour) and for these private cases arriving by train.
