WHEREAS it seems advisable to the Governor to establish in Kondadeniya in Kulugammanasiya pattuwa of Harispattuwa, Kandy District, Central Province, a general cemetery for the burial or cremation of the dead within the limits hereinafter specified and defined:

And whereas the Governor may under section 6 (3) of "The Cemeteries and Burials Ordinance, 1899," as amended by the Cemeteries and Burials Amendment Ordinance, 1931, exempt any cemetery either wholly or in part from the operation of sections 11, 16, 17, and 24:

Now know Ye that We, the Governor, by virtue of the powers vested in Us by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931, do hereby, under section 6 (1) of "The Cemeteries and Burials Ordinance, 1899," as amended by the Cemeteries and Burials Amendment Ordinance, 1931, establish as from the date hereof a general cemetery on the land described in Schedule A hereto for the burial or cremation of the dead within the limits specified and defined in Schedule B hereto.

And We do hereby exempt the said cemetery wholly from the operation of sections 11, 16, 17, and 24 of the said Ordinance.

1. The Municipal Fire Brigade shall attend ordinary fires, free of charge, within the Municipal area.
2. The Brigade will only attend fires outside the limits at the discretion of the Superintendent and if, in his opinion, the work can be undertaken without risk to the City. This by-law shall also apply to ship fires in the

Harbour. The discretion of the Superintendent shall be exercised subject to the control of the Chairman or the Council.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended November 21, 1931.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 206 (3 Europeans, 11 Burghers, 127 Sinhalese, 19 Tamils, 33 Moors, 9 Malays, and 4 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1931, viz., 289,150) was 37.1, as against 39.3 in the preceding week, 34.9 in the corresponding week of last year, and 32.5 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 143 (1 European, 6 Burghers, 88 Sinhalese, 19 Tamils, 21 Moors, and 8 Others.) The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 25.8, as against 26.5 in the previous week, 29.1 in the corresponding week of last year, and 28.2 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 143 total deaths, 32 were of infants under one year of age, as against 43 in the preceding week, 40 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 32 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 16.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Five deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 3 in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident) and 2 in New Bazaar, as against 11 in the previous week and 18 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Five deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 2 in Slave Island and 1 each in Pettah, Kotahena South, and New Bazaar, as against 11 in the previous week and 8 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Four deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 3 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents) and 1 in New Bazaar. The number registered during the preceding week as also the weekly average for last year was 4.

2. (a) Twelve deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 10 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents) and 1 each in San Sebastian and New Bazaar, as against 15 in the previous week and 12 the weekly average for last year.

(b) One death from *Phthisis* of a resident of Colombo Town occurred at the Anti-Tuberculosis Hospital, Ragama, during the week.

3. (a) One death from *Enteric Fever* was registered in Maradana hospitals (of a non-resident). The number registered during the preceding week was also 1 and the weekly average for last year was 4.

(b) Two deaths from *Enteric Fever* of residents of Colombo Town occurred at the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Angoda, during the week.

4. Ten deaths from *Debility* were registered, 9 from *Enteritis*, 6 from *Worms*, 5 from *Dysentery*, 4 from *Diarrhoea*, 1 each from *Infantile Convulsions*, *Tetanus*, *Puerperal Septicæmia* and *Accidents*, and 78 from *Other Causes*.

5. *Reported Cases.*—Two cases of *Chickenpox* and 2 of *Enteric Fever* were reported during the week, as against 4 and 1, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 79.3°, against 79.5° in the preceding week and 80.5° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.900 in., against 29.927 in. in the preceding week and 29.936 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 2.64 in., against 4.30 in. in the preceding week and 0.98 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

The Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on October 17, 1931, at 9 a.m., in accordance with the notice dated October 13, 1931.

Present :—Mr. R. H. Whitehorn, Chairman ; Ratwatte Adigar ; Mr. Geo E. de Silva ; Mr. Haji M. S. Usoof Ismail ; Mr. S. A. Wijayatilake ; Mr. W. A. B. Soysa ; Dr. W. E. de Silva ; Mr. H. P. G. Young.

1. The Minutes of proceedings of the Meeting held on September 19, 1931, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted :—

- (a) Statement of receipts and disbursements from close of 1930 to September 30, 1931, on account of the Municipal Fund.
- (b) Progress report of works brought up to August 31, 1931.
- (c) Health Officer's report for September, 1931.
- (d) Statement of cases instituted by the several Inspectors and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of September, 1931.
- (e) The reservoir readings for the week ended October 17, 1931.

Resolved that the statement (a), together with the Minutes of proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 83 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910, be forwarded to the Commissioner of Local Government for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table :—Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, standpipes, and house-service taps inspected during September, 1931.

3A. (1) Mr. de Silva drew the attention of the Chairman to the present unsatisfactory state of the Bogambara Recreation grounds and asked him to look into the matter.

(2) The Chairman made a statement with regard to the water supply scheme and added that he had invited the experts to decide on the site of intake for the Pumping Scheme.

(3) The Chairman also undertook to report what progress has been made in installing stop-cocks to various private services and to circulate a weekly report of work done by the Temporary Waterworks Inspector.

4. Petitions :—Mr. Wijayatilake presented a petition from Mr. Thuan Jr. Hasan complaining that 2 quarters' rates are demanded at once when poor people find it difficult to pay even one quarter's.

Mr. Soysa presented a petition from the Hony. Secretary of the Sadachara Baudha Kulangana Society requesting the Council to take steps for the removal of the tea kiosk established by some people near the Buddhist Girls' College.

Mr. Usoof Ismail presented a petition from the Market Stall holders asking for a reduction of rents and other concessions.

The Chairman undertook to deal with the matters referred to in the petitions.

5. Correspondence :—(1) Letter No. A376/31 of October 7, 1931, from the Commissioner of Local Government stating that the papers relating to the appointment of a successor to the present Chairman of the Council were referred by the Chief Secretary to his Executive Committee in order that the Committee should advise His Excellency the Governor on the matter, and that the Committee has tendered its advice to the Governor, who has now ordered that the next Chairman of the Council should be a Civil Servant, who should also do the work connected with the Local Boards in the Kandy District.—Read.

(2) Copy of letter No. J 80/31 of October 10, 1931, from the Chief Secretary to Mr. H. P. Kaufmann appointing him to be Chairman of the Kandy Municipal Council, Additional Assistant Government Agent and Local Authority under the Petroleum Ordinance within the limits of the Kandy Municipality with effect from October 19, 1931, for the information of the Council.—Read.

(3) Letter No. I 163/31 of October 14, 1931, from the Hon. the Chief Secretary forwarding a copy of a further letter addressed by him to Mr. H. P. Kaufmann on the subject of emoluments which he will receive as Chairman of the Council, and stating that it is intended to limit the total liability of the Municipal Council to Rs. 15,000 per annum, *i.e.*, Rs. 13,500 per annum towards Mr. Kaufmann's salary, plus the commuted rate of Rs. 125 per mensem for travelling in Kandy as Chairman of the Municipal Council.—Read.

Mr. Wijayatilake moved—"That in view of the difficulties experienced by the Council as a result of the prevalent depression and as the income of the Council is daily decreasing as a result this Council respectfully requests the Government to revert to the old arrangement of appointing the Government Agent of the Province to be the Chairman of the Council till such time as the Council is reformed; as an alternative that the Government contribute half the salary of the new Chairman."—Mr. de Silva seconded.

The motion was put to the Meeting and carried by 5 to 3.

Ayes.—Mr. Wijayatilake, Mr. de Silva, Ratwatte Adigar, Mr. Usoof Ismail, Mr. Soysa. *Noes.*—The Chairman, Dr. de Silva, Mr. Young.

Q 5A. Pursuant to notice Mr. Soysa moved—"That this Council is in accord and agreement with the resolution unanimously approved of by the Colombo Municipal Council, with regard to the attempt and uncalled for interference with the rights and privileges of the Municipal Councils by other bodies."—Mr. Usoof Ismail seconded. Carried.

6. Chairman's memo dated September 18, 1931, on the subject of Residential and Commercial areas, Zoning and Location of Dangerous and Offensive Trades.

Resolved that the proposals be published and that objections be received until November 30, 1931.

7. To sanction the consolidated rates leviable in 1932, under section 115 (1) of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, 1910.

Resolved that the same rates as at present, viz., 16 per cent. in the water served area, and 8 per cent. outside the water served area, be levied in 1932.

(27) Audit Query No. 1 M. of September 11, 1931, inquiring whether the allowance of Rs. 75 per mensem paid to Mr. J. R. Jayatileke in connection with Town Improvement work done by him is payable when he is away from the Island on leave.—Recommended that as the Officer has proceeded on leave with the expectation of the allowance, it should be continued, but in future the practice should cease.

(28) Draft by-laws to enable the collection of Conservancy Fees with the rates.—Recommended subject to any remarks Ratwatte Adigar may wish to make at the General Meeting of the Council.

(29) Estimates from the Municipal Engineer:—(a) for Rs. 822 for altering the chimney stack in the Power Station into a tower for drying fire hose; (b) for Rs. 690 for rebuilding a portion of the Mahaiyawa General Cemetery boundary wall; (c) for Rs. 265 for converting the existing dog pound in Mahaiyawa into a store-room and night muster shed for coolies; (d) for Rs. 25 for providing a notice board and a halting place for buses near the Small Market; (e) for Rs. 165 for enlarging the room occupied by the Shroff's Department to permit of larger accommodation.—(a) was recommended subject to modifications and subject to cost not exceeding Rs. 750. (b), (c), (d) and (e) were recommended.

(30) Papers *re* improvements proposed to be carried out to the open drain behind the Power Station at a cost of Rs. 5,550.—Recommended to pass the estimate only in so far as it refers to the covering of the open drain marked A-B, and of the Meda-ela marked C-D in the plan, for the present.

(31) Report dated August 24, 1931, from the Municipal Engineer on his inspection of the various waste detection meters installed in the town, and on the measures which he proposes to adopt for an efficient waste detection campaign.

Resolved to introduce restriction as recommended by Mr. Garment when the reservoir falls to 5 ft. below spill level.—Recommended to enforce the provision of ball-valves in all cisterns, after reporting the number required, and after giving occupants due notice.

Recommended to refer the repealed by-law 157 to the Law Committee with a view to its re-imposition.

(32) Papers *re* alternative schemes submitted by the Railway Department for widening the blind corners in the Approach road to Mavimada level crossing at the Council's expense.—Not recommended, but warning notices to be posted.

(33) Papers *re* inquiries made from the Empire Theatre, Lawn Club, and A. C. C. Garage, as to whether they would contribute a *pro rata* share of the estimated cost of Rs. 90 for repairing the culvert on the approach road to their respective premises.—Recommended to write to the A. C. C. and ask that they maintain their length of the road and contribute to the cost of repairing the culvert as a consideration for the continuance of the lease on the present favourable terms.

(34) Letter dated September 25, 1931, from Mr. T. J. M. Fernando asking for a water service for building purposes, to premises No. 4, Cemetery road, and suggesting that permanent pipes be laid to the premises at the same time, so that they may obtain a water service, for domestic purposes, on completion of the building.—Recommended that he can have the service and pay for it, metered, for building purposes, but that the domestic supply cannot be guaranteed unless the building proves to be assessed at the annual value of Rs. 1,200.

(44) Municipal Electrical Engineer's letter No. 3,085 of September 1, 1931, making suggestions for encouraging the use of electrical energy more extensively.—Recommended to prepare draft leaflets, (1) *re* instalment payment for fittings, (2) *re* power installations.

Resolved that the recommendations be adopted with the exceptions of items (1), (2), (3), (23), (27), and (28).

Items (1) and (23) were referred to the Markets Committee.

Items (2) and (3) were referred to a Special Committee consisting of the Members of the Finance Committee and Messrs. de Silva and Soysa to consider the question of collecting conservancy fees.

As regards item (27), the payment of the allowance was approved until December 31, 1931. Mr. de Silva dissented as regards recommendations (8) and (9).

As regards item (36), it was decided to circulate a statement of the amount of work done and the amounts earned and different rates per cube.

9. Application dated September 28, 1931, from the Manager, Touring Electric Bioscope, for a space of ground at Bogambara for a Bioscope Show.—Resolved that the application be allowed.

10. Estimate for Rs. 227,480 for building Model Tenements at Deyannawela.—Resolved that the scheme be passed subject to revision of estimate which should be referred to the Provincial Engineer.

11. Ratwatte Adigar moved that this Council do place on record its sense of appreciation of the valuable services rendered by Mr. R. H. Whitehorn during his tenure of office as Chairman for the last four years.—Mr. de Silva seconded and the motion was unanimously carried.

The Chairman thanked the Members for the appreciation shown.
