The School Teachers' Pension Rules, 1927, published in *Government Gazette* No. 7,631 of February 24, 1928, are hereby amended by the deletion of Rule 9 and the substitution of the following therefor:—

Rule 9. A teacher who has continued to be in service after these rules came into force but retires before the pensionable age, shall be eligible for an annuity calculated in the manner described in Rule 6 and for commutation of pension under Rule 12 if each of the following conditions is satisfied, namely:—

(1) if his recorded service is not less than 120 months or one half the number of years that have elapsed since the date of his first registration, whichever is the longer;

(2) if at least 10 years of recorded service fall within the 15 years preceding the date of his retirement;

(3) if the Director has reported that the teacher's professional record is satisfactory;

(4) if contributions have been regularly made during the period of recorded service as required by Rule 5; and

(5) if his retirement has been declared to be necessary on the ground of infirmity of body or mind by a duly constituted Medical Board.

Rule 9A. A teacher employed in an assisted school who had retired before these rules came into force, may at the Governor's discretion be awarded, in respect of a period after August 1, 1927, an allowance at a rate not exceeding Rs. 7.50 per mensem.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended December 19, 1931.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 174 (1 European, 12 Burghers, 106 Sinhalese, 21 Tamils, 23 Moors, 5 Malays, and 6 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1931, viz., 289,150) was 31.4, as against 32.6 in the preceding week, 38.1 in the corresponding week of last year, and 32.5 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 145 (5 Burghers, 82 Sinhalese, 20 Tamils, 24 Moors, 5 Malays, and 9 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 26.1, as against 20.0 in the previous week, 28.0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 28.2 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 145 total deaths, 33 were of infants under one year of age, as against 21 in the preceding week, 35 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 32 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 17.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Nine deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 5 in Maradana hospitals (including a death of a non-resident), 1 each in St. Paul's, New Bazaar, Maradana North, and Maradana South, as against 18 in the previous week, which was also the weekly average for last year.

(b) Nine deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 3 in Slave Island, 2 in New Bazaar, 1 each in Maradana hospitals, Kotahena North, Kollupitiya, and Wellawatta North, as against 6 in the previous week and 8 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Five deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 2 in Slave Island, 1 each in Kotahena North, Kotahena South, and Kollupitiya. The number registered during the preceding week was also 5 and the weekly average for last year was 4.

2. (a) Sixteen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 11 in Maradana hospitals (including 6 deaths of non-residents), 2 in Slave Island, 1 each in St. Paul's, San Sebastian, and New Bazaar. The number registered during the preceding week was also 16 and the weekly average for last year was 12.

(b) Two deaths from *Phthisis* of residents of Colombo town occurred at the Anti-Tuberculosis Hospital, Ragama, during the week.

3. Five deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents), as against 3 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year.

4. Fourteen deaths from *Debility* were registered, 5 from *Enteritis*, 4 each from *Diarrhoea* and *Worms*, 3 each from *Accidents* and *Infantile Convulsions*, and 1 each from *Dysentery* and *Tetanus*, and 66 from *Other Causes*.

5. **Reported Cases.**—Nine cases of *Chickenpox*, 6 of *Enteric Fever*, and 2 of *Measles* were reported during the week, as against 4, 4, and nil, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 78.6°, against 79.5° in the preceding week and 79.0° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.909 in., against 29.836 in. in the preceding week and 29.964 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 4.70 in., against 2.52 in. in the preceding week and nil in the corresponding week of the previous year.

- The business of the Company shall include the several objects expressed in the Memorandum of Association and all matters incidental thereto.
- The business of the Company shall be under the control of Directors, in accordance with these regulations, but subject to the control of the General Meeting.
- All or any of the employees of the Company may be required to give security for the faithful discharge of their duties.

SHARES.

- The shares of the Company shall be under the control of the Directors, who may allot or otherwise dispose of them to persons whom they deem fit.
- Any persons taking any share in the Company shall testify his acceptance thereof by writing under his hand in such form as the Directors may from time to time specify.
- If on or before the day appointed for payment any Shareholder fails to pay the amount due from him, then such Shareholder shall become liable to pay interest for the same at the rate of 12 per cent. per annum, commencing from the date of default thereof, till payment in full. The Directors may at their discretion suspend operation of this clause till such time as they decide upon.
- The certificate of title to shares shall be issued under the seal of the Company by the Secretary, and a Director or in such manner as the Directors shall prescribe.
- Every member shall be entitled without payment to one certificate, specifying the share or shares held by him with the distinctive numbers thereof and the amount paid up thereon or to several certificates each for one or more shares.
- Lost certificates may be renewed on payment of one rupee or such less sum as the Directors may prescribe, and the person requiring the new certificate shall give such indemnity to the Company as the Directors think fit.

TRANSFER OF SHARES.

- Only fully paid up shares can be the subject of transfer, and no Shareholder shall be entitled to the privileges of a Shareholder until his name shall have been entered in the register of Shareholders.
- No transfer made by a Shareholder who is indebted to the Company will be valid.
- If any person becomes entitled to a share or shares by an operation of the law he must forthwith inform the same to the Company and have his name entered in the Company's register.
- The executors, administrators, or heirs of a deceased Shareholder shall be the only person recognized by the Company as having any title to his share, provided that the heirs of the deceased Shareholder take out letters of administration if the law so requires it.

CALLS.

- If any Shareholder fails to pay any call or instalment due, the Company may after serving on him a written notice appointing a day before which the amount should be paid, forfeit at its discretion his share or shares, as the case may be, and any share so forfeited will become the absolute property of the Company.

15. Any Shareholder whose shares have been forfeited shall, notwithstanding, be liable to pay to the Company all calls owing upon such share at the time of forfeiture.

INCREASE OF CAPITAL.

16. The Directors may, with the sanction of the Company previously given in a General Meeting, increase its capital by the creation of new shares.

BORROWING POWERS.

17. The Directors may from time to time borrow from Bankers or others for the temporary purposes of the Company by way of bills, overdrafts, cash credits, on the security of goods or produce by any other usual means of obtaining trading accommodation, such sum or sums of money as they in their discretion shall consider necessary or desirable for the proper and convenient administration of the Company's finances.

18. In addition to the money so borrowed under the preceding clause the Directors may from time to time at their discretion, raise or borrow money from the Directors or other persons for the purpose of the Company, and may secure the repayment of the same by mortgage or charge of the whole or any part of the assets and property of the Company (present or future) including its uncalled or unissued capital, but so that the whole amount borrowed or raised and outstanding at any one time, under the provisions of this clause shall not, without the consent of the Company in General Meeting, exceed the amount of the share capital of the Company for the time being issued, or agreed to be issued, nevertheless no lender or other person dealing with the Company shall be concerned to see or inquire whether the limit is observed.

GENERAL MEETING.

19. The Annual General Meeting shall be held in the month of December in each year, unless otherwise decided upon by the Directors for good reasons.

20. The above-mentioned meetings shall be called Ordinary General Meetings, and all other General Meetings shall be called Extraordinary.

21. The Secretary shall, upon a written requisition by three Directors, or any number of Shareholders, holding in the aggregate not less than one-tenth part of the shares of the Company, convene an Extraordinary General Meeting within thirty days of such requisition. All such requisition shall express the object of the meeting proposed to be called.

22. Twenty-one days' notice at least, specifying the place and hour of meeting, and the purpose for which any General Meeting is to be called shall be given in such manner as may be prescribed by the Directors.

23. Any Shareholder shall be entitled to move any resolution in any of the above-mentioned meetings, provided he has given a copy of the resolution to the Secretary seven days before such meeting.

24. If within half an hour from the time appointed for the meeting a quorum of Shareholders is not present and such quorum not be less than fifteen members present personally or by proxy or attorney the meeting shall be dissolved.

25. The Chairman, if any, of the Board of Directors shall preside at every meeting of the Company. If there be no such Chairman, or if at any meeting he is not present, the Shareholders present shall choose one of the members to be the Chairman of the meeting.

26. Every Shareholder shall have a vote, but persons owning more than twenty-five shares shall have an addition vote for every such twenty-five shares.

27. Votes may be given either personally or by proxy at the General Meetings.

28. No person shall be appointed a proxy who is not a Shareholder and the instrument or mandate appointing him shall be deposited at the registered office of the Company not less than twenty-four hours before the time of holding the meeting at which he proposes to vote, but no instrument or mandate appointing a proxy shall be valid after the expiration of two months from the date of its execution.

29. A proxy must bear a six-cent stamp (No. 3 of 1890, Schedule B).

30. If any Shareholder is a lunatic or idiot or prodigal, he may vote by his curator, and if any Shareholder is a minor, he may vote by his guardian, or any of his guardians, if more than one.

DIRECTORS.

31. The number of Directors shall never be more than five nor less than three, but this clause shall be construed as being directory only and the continuing Directors may act notwithstanding any number of vacancies.

32. The qualification of a Director shall be his holding fifty shares in the Company whether fully paid up or partly

paid up. In the case of partly paid up shares all calls or instalments for the time being shall have been paid.

33. The first Directors shall be Messrs. Alfred Lloyd Seneviratne, J. Gerald Fernando, Joseph Fernando, Justinian P. Mendis, and Premadasa Weeratunga Wagista, who shall hold office (subject to clause 34) till the first ordinary General Meeting of the Company when they shall retire but shall be eligible for re-election.

34. The services of Mr. A. Lloyd Seneviratne shall be retained for at least three years as Managing Director and of Mr. Justinian P. Mendis as Secretary for at least the first year.

35. As remuneration for their services the Directors, except the Managing Director and the Secretary, shall be entitled to a payment of Rs. 10.50 for each meeting or adjournment thereof they attend. The Company in General Meeting may at any time alter the amount of such remuneration.

36. Remuneration for the services of the Managing Director and the Secretary may be fixed at a meeting of the Directors.

37. Subject to clause 34 herein the Board of Directors may appoint one or more Directors to act as Managing Director or Managing Directors and one or more Secretary or Secretaries for such time and on such terms as the Board may determine or fix.

38. The Office of Director shall be vacated, if he is an uncertificated bankrupt. If he is a lunatic. If he ceases to hold the required number of shares. If he does not attend three consecutive meetings without sufficient cause.

39. Any casual vacancy in the Directorate shall be filled up by the Directors themselves.

40. A resolution in writing signed by all the Directors shall be as valid and effectual as if it had been passed at a meeting of the Directors duly called and constituted.

41. The Managing Director and the Secretary shall carry out the Company's business and shall exercise such powers as may be conferred upon them by the Directors.

42. The seal of the Company shall not be used or affixed to any deed or instrument except in the presence of the Managing Director and the Secretary or of one Director and the Managing Director or Secretary of the Company who shall attest the seal thereof.

43. No money can be drawn from the Bank except on the Joint-order of the Managing Director and Secretary.

DIVIDENDS.

44. The Directors may with the sanction of the Company in General Meeting, declare a dividend to be paid to the Shareholders in proportion to their shares.

45. No dividend shall be payable except out of the profits arising from the business of the Company and with the sanction of the Directors.

46. The Directors may before recommending any dividend set aside out of the profits of the Company such sum as they think proper as a reserve fund to meet contingencies.

47. The Directors may deduct from the dividends payable to any Shareholder all such sums of money as may be due from him to the Company on account of calls or otherwise.

48. Notice of any dividend that may have been declared shall be given to each Shareholder or sent by post or otherwise to his registered place of abode.

49. The Directors shall cause true accounts to be kept of the moneys received and expended by the Company and of all matters in respect of which such receipts and expenditure take place and of the property, assets, credits, and liabilities of the Company. But no member shall have any right to insist on the inspection of any account book or document of the Company except as conferred by the Ordinance or authorized by the Directors or by a resolution of the Company in General Meeting.

50. Once at least in every year the Directors shall lay before the Company in General Meeting a statement of the income and expenditure for the past year, made up to date also showing a summary of the property and liabilities of the Company.

AUDIT.

51. The accounts shall be examined and the balance sheet ascertained by one or more Auditors to be selected by the Company in General Meeting.

52. The Auditors need not be Shareholders in the Company. No person is eligible as an Auditor who is interested otherwise than as a Shareholder in any transaction of the Company, and no Director or other officer of the Company is eligible during his continuance in office.

53. The selection of Auditors shall be made by the Company at their first General Meeting in each year.

54. If any casual vacancy occurs in the office of Auditor, the Directors shall forthwith call an Extraordinary General Meeting for the purpose of supplying the same.

55. Every Auditor shall be supplied with a copy of the balance sheet, and it shall be his duty to examine the same with the accounts and vouchers relating thereto.

56. The Auditors shall make a report to the Shareholders upon the balance sheet and accounts at the Annual General Meeting.

NOTICES.

57. Notices requiring to be served by the Company upon the Shareholders may be served either personally or by leaving the same or sending them through post at their registered places of abode.

58. Every Shareholder shall give an address which shall be deemed his place of abode and shall be registered as such in the books of the Company.

59. Any notice sent by post shall be deemed to have been served at the time when the letter containing the same is posted.

used in any such business as aforesaid or required by any customers of or persons having dealings with the company either by wholesale or retail.

- (4) To carry on business as proprietors, printers and publishers of newspapers, journals, magazines, books, periodicals and other literary works and undertakings.
- (5) To cultivate and carry on the business of cultivators of the lands and property of the Company and of makers and dealers in the produce of the cultivation of the Company's lands and property and to carry on any other business (manufacturing or otherwise) which may seem to the Company capable of being conveniently carried on in connection with any of the defined objects or calculated directly or indirectly to enhance the value of or render profitable any of the property or rights for the time being of the Company.

VITAL STATISTICS.

[Continued from page 11]

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended December 26, 1931.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 136 (1 European, 8 Burghers, 84 Sinhalese, 20 Tamils, 21 Moors, 1 Malay, and 1 Other). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1931, viz., 289,150) was 24.5, as against 31.4 in the preceding week, 31.5 in the corresponding week of last year, and 32.5 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 130 (5 Burghers, 75 Sinhalese, 27 Tamils, 21 Moors, 1 Malay, and 1 Other). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 23.4, as against 26.1 in the previous week, 27.6 in the corresponding week of last year, and 28.2 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 130 total deaths, 30 were of infants under one year of age, as against 33 in the preceding week, 26 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 32 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 14.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Nineteen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 11 in Maradana hospitals (including 6 deaths of non-residents), 2 in St. Paul's and 1 each in Kotahena South, Maradana East, Maradana South, Slave Island, Kollupitiya, and Wellawatta North, as against 9 in the previous week and 18 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Eight deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 2 each in St. Paul's and Kotahena North and 1 each in Kotahena South, New Bazaar, Maradana hospitals (of a non-resident) and Maradana South, as against 9 in the previous week and 8 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Three deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 2 in Wellawatta North, and 1 in Maradana hospitals, as against 5 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year.

2. Thirteen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 8 in Maradana hospitals (including 6 deaths of non-residents) and 1 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena North, Slave Island, Kollupitiya, and Wellawatta North, as against 16 in the previous week and 12 the weekly average for last year.

3. (a) Two deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 1 each in Maradana hospitals and Slave Island, as against 5 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Two deaths from *Enteric Fever* of residents of Colombo town, occurred at the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Angoda, during the week.

4. Twelve deaths from *Debility* were registered, 5 from *Accidents*, 4 from *Worms*, 2 each from *Enteritis*, *Infantile Convulsions* and *Puerperal Septicaemia*, 1 each from *Diarrhoea*, *Dysentery*, and *Tetanus*, and 55 from *Other Causes*.

5. **Reported Cases.**—Eleven cases of *Chickenpox*, and 2 of *Enteric Fever* were reported during the week, as against 9 and 6 respectively of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 78.6°, against 78.6° in the preceding week and 79.2° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.867 in., against 29.909 in. in the preceding week 29.937 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 4.24 in., against 4.70 in. in the preceding week and nil in the corresponding week of the previous year.

On being informed by the Assistant Superintendent of Excise, whether he approves any or all of the trees mentioned in the application, the applicant shall pay to the Kachcheri on the trees approved by the Assistant Superintendent of Excise a sum as tree tax calculated at the following rates for each month or part of a month during which he holds a licence to tap these trees:—

The tree tax shall be payable by the 20th of the month preceding that for which it is due. Failure to pay such tax shall be deemed to cancel the licences issued for the tapping of the trees for which the tax is payable.

3. He shall forward to the Assistant Superintendent of Excise, the Kachcheri receipt for the tax payable for the first month during which the trees are to be tapped.

4. On receipt of the Kachcheri receipt the Assistant Superintendent of Excise shall issue a licence in Form Excise T 2A (prescribed by Notification in *Gazette* No. 6,707 of April 1, 1915) to tap the trees, and have the trees marked.

5. No tree shall be tapped, and no toddy shall be drawn therefrom until it has been licensed and marked in the manner aforesaid.

6. The Assistant Superintendent of Excise shall issue a pass in Form Excise T 3 (prescribed in *Gazette* No. 6,707 of April 1, 1915) for the transport of the toddy to the estate canteen, when the toddy is not accompanied by the tapping licence on which it was drawn.

Fees for Burials, &c., at Cemeteries other than the General Cemetery at Mahaiyawa.

ADDITIONAL regulations made by the Municipal Council of Kandy, under sections 18 and 23 of "The Cemeteries and Burials Ordinance, No. 9 of 1889," in continuation of the regulations published in the *Ceylon Government Gazettes* of March 2, 1917; December 21, 1928; March 22, 1929; and November 6, 1931, and applicable to cemeteries other than the Mahaiyawa General Cemetery.

16. All applications for graves are to be made to the keeper of the cemetery at least six hours before the time fixed for the burial of the person for whom the grave is wanted.

17. The keeper of the cemetery must intimate the line to be followed by a funeral party on arriving at the cemetery, and if more than one funeral party come at the same time, the order in which they are respectively to move to the graves.

18. Should it be necessary for the purpose of preventing the disturbance of one funeral party by another, and not otherwise, the keeper of the cemetery may require that one burial service should be concluded before another is commenced.

19. The keeper of the cemetery shall be entitled to keep order within the cemetery and his directions are to be obeyed.

20. No grave shall be less than 6 feet in depth, or at a distance of less than 4 feet from any other grave.

21. No grave shall be re-opened within a year, nor vault within six months, from the last interment therein, except for post mortem examinations for the purposes of the criminal law.

22. The keeper of the cemetery shall send weekly to the Registrar of Births, Deaths, and Marriages, a copy or transcript of the burials, as the same are registered in the register book.
