PASSED ORDINANCES.

081/4 (S.B.)

Ordinance enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice and consent of the State Council thereof.

No. 24 of 1931.

An Ordinance to validate an Order made by the Governor in Executive Council on the 28th day of May, 1931, directing the Principal Collector of Customs to cease temporarily to levy certain customs duties imposed by law.

GRAEME THOMSON.

Preamble.

WHEREAS on the 29th day of May, 1931, by virtue of Ordinance No. 17 of 1869 and various resolutions thereunder, certain customs duties were leviable on the export from the Island of desiccated coconut, fresh coconuts, copra, poonac, coconut oil and rubber:

And whereas in view of the prevailing depression in the coconut and rubber industries it appeared to the Governor in Executive Council to be expedient to give relief to the said industries by a remission of the said customs duties from the date last aforesaid:

And whereas on the said date no such remission could be given in the manner prescribed by law, the Legislative Council having been then dissolved and the State Council not being then constituted:

And whereas the Governor in Executive Council, considering that the grant of the said remission should not be postponed, did make, on the 28th day of May, 1931, the Order set forth in the schedule hereto:

And whereas the customs duties which the Order aforesaid did direct the Principal Collector of Customs not to levy were removed by resolution passed by the State Council on the 29th day of July, 1931, and taking effect on the 31st day of July, 1931, and it is expedient to validate the said Order:

Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of Ceylon with the advice and consent of the State Council thereof as follows:—

Short title.

1 This Ordinance may be cited as The Emergency Remission of Customs Duties (Validation) Ordinance, 1931.

Validation of Order of the Governor in Council dated 28th May, 1931, and indemnity.

2 (1) The Order of the Governor in Council made on the 28th day of May, 1931, and set forth in the Schedule hereto shall be deemed to have been valid and effectual for all purposes according to the tenour thereof.

(2) No claim, penalty or forfeiture of whatsoever nature shall be maintainable or enforceable against any person whomsoever in respect of failure to levy and demand during the period beginning on the 29th day of May, 1931, and ending on the 31st day of July, 1931, the customs duties which by the said Order the Principal Collector of Customs was directed to cease to levy and demand, or in respect of the exportation during the said period of desiccated coconut, fresh coconuts, copra, poonac, coconut oil or rubber without payment of the said duties.

SCHEDULE.

Order by His Excellency the Governor in Council.

Whereas it is expedient that immediate relief should be granted to the Rubber and Coconut industries in Ceylon in view of the present depressed state of those industries, I, Graeme Thomson, Governor, do hereby, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, order that as from and including the 29th May, 1931, the Principal Collector of Customs shall cease to demand and levy the export duties on Rubber, Desiccated coconut, Fresh coconuts, Coconut oil, Copra and Poonac payable under Ordinance 17 of 1869 or any Ordinance amending the same.

This Order shall remain in force pending a decision by the State Council as to whether action should be taken to rescind or vary such duties in accordance with the procedure prescribed by section 11 of the aforesaid Ordinance.

Nothing in this Order shall affect the collection of export duties leviable for the purposes of the Medical Wants Ordinance No. 9 of 1912, the Coconut Research Ordinance 1928 and the Rubber Research Ordinance 1930.

1 This Ordinance may be cited as the Local Loans and Development Amendment Ordinance 1931.

2 Section 14 of the principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the repeal of sub-section (3) thereof, and the substitution of the following sub-section therefor :—

“(3) The Commissioners may, if they think fit, in the case of any society registered under the Co-operative Societies Ordinance No. 34 of 1921 dispense with any security other than an obligation binding upon the Society and its members.”

(a) Section 17 is renumbered section 17 (1) and the words “ except the purpose specified in paragraph (d) thereof ” are added at the end.

(b) After section 17 (1) as amended by the preceding sub-section the following is added as sub-section (2) :—

“(2) All rules which by virtue of this section were valid and in force on the eighth day of September, 1931, shall continue to be valid and in force until varied, altered, amended or repealed.”

An Ordinance to amend the School Teachers' Pension Ordinance, No. 6 of 1927.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice and consent of the State Council thereof, as follows:

Short title.

1 This Ordinance may be cited as The School Teachers' Pension (Amendment) Ordinance, 1931.

Amendment of section 1 of the principal Ordinance.

2 Section 1 of the principal Ordinance is hereby amended by substituting the words "first day of August 1927" for the words "on a day to be fixed by the Governor by Proclamation in the Government Gazette".

3 The principal Ordinance shall be generally construed as if from the time of its passing section 1 thereof had read as amended by the last preceding section, and particularly therefore—

Construction of the principal Ordinance.

- (a) the said Ordinance shall be deemed to have come into operation on the first day of August 1927 ;
- (b) all rules which purport to have been duly made under the said Ordinance before the passing of this Ordinance shall be deemed to have been validly made as from the date of their making ;
- (c) all pensions gratuities and allowances granted in accordance with the said rules shall be deemed to have been validly and properly paid on and from the time at which they were paid ; and
- (d) all other acts and things that purport to have been done by virtue of the provisions of the said Ordinance or rules shall on and from the time at which they were so done be deemed to have been validly and properly done, and such acts and things shall in all respects be as valid and effectual as if the said Ordinance had come into operation on the first day of August 1927.

An Ordinance for making provision for the Public, Railway and Colombo Electricity Supply services for the financial year 1931-32.

GRAEME THOMSON.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the State Council thereof, as follows :—

1 This Ordinance may be cited as the Appropriation Ordinance of 1931.

Short title.

2 Without prejudice to any other law authorizing any expenditure, sums not exceeding eighty-two million two hundred and sixty-seven thousand seven hundred and sixteen rupees, twenty-five million five hundred thousand rupees, and two million one hundred and fifty thousand rupees are hereby declared to be payable for the service of the financial year beginning on October 1, 1931, and ending on September 30, 1932, out of the revenue and other funds of the Island, the Ceylon Government Railway, and the Colombo Electricity Supply respectively; and the said sums may be expended as specified in the schedules to this Ordinance.

Insertion of new section 187A in the principal Ordinance.

Power to paint names of streets and houses on private property.

9 Immediately after section 187 of the principal Ordinance the following new section 187A is inserted:—

“ 187A (1) It shall be lawful for the Council to name or rename any street and to paint up or otherwise mark the name of any street and the number of any house or tenement on any private property and any person who without the authority of the Council removes or alters any such name or number shall be guilty of an offence.

(2) For the purposes of this section and of section 45 (1) (e) the word “street” shall include any road, footway or passage used or intended to be used as a means of access to two or more houses or sites of houses whether the public have a right of way thereover or not and any side-walk and reservation at the side thereof.”

Amendment of section 236 of the principal Ordinance.

10 Section 236 of the principal Ordinance is amended by adding at the end the words “provided that in respect of an offence under section 120 the complaint may be made at any time within twelve months next after its commission”.

Amendment of Schedule D of the principal Ordinance.

11 Schedule D of the principal Ordinance is amended by inserting between the word “wheelbarrows” and the word “and” in line 13 the words “hand carts used for trade purposes solely within private premises”.

Objects and Reasons.

The purpose of this Bill is to make various alterations in The Municipal Councils Ordinance, 1910, which experience has shown to be necessary for its proper working.

2. Clause 2 lowers the minimum number of votes which a candidate must receive before he can be elected a Councillor.

3. Clause 3 permits a Council to expend money on the establishment and maintenance of public libraries.

4. Clause 4 extends the topics on which a Council may make by-laws.

5. Clause 5 increases the penalty for a breach of the offence under section 120, and clause 11 limits the period within which a prosecution can be filed in respect of such an offence.

6. Clause 6 entitles a Council to revise at any time the annual assessment, if since the assessment for the year was made the premises have been subjected to a change which has altered the annual value.

7. Clause 7 removes the requirement that a sale of lands and buildings belonging to a Council shall be by public auction.

8. Clause 8 authorizes the erection of sunshades encroaching over any street or lake if this is done with the permission of the Chairman of the Council.

9. Clause 9 empowers a Council to name roads whether public or private and to mark such roads with names and to mark houses and tenements with numbers.

10. Clause 11 exempts from tax hand carts used for trade within private premises.

The following Draft of a proposed Ordinance is published for general information:—

An Ordinance to amend “The Colombo Municipal Council Waterworks Ordinance, 1907.”

BE it enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice and consent of the State Council thereof, as follows:—

Short title and commencement.

1 This Ordinance may be cited as the Colombo Municipal Waterworks (Amendment) Ordinance, 1931, and shall come into operation on such date as the Governor may by proclamation published in the Gazette appoint.

Amendment of section 8 of the principal Ordinance.

2 Section 8 of the Colombo Municipal Waterworks Ordinance, 1907, (hereinafter referred to as “the principal Ordinance”) is amended in line 3 by inserting between the word “Government” and the word “which” therein the words “and of His Majesty’s Forces”.

Repeal of section 9 of the principal Ordinance.

3 Section 9 of the principal Ordinance is repealed.

Objects and Reasons.

The Municipal Waterworks Amendment Ordinance, 1930, was passed to give effect to Government's new financial arrangement with the Colombo Municipality regarding the supply of water for the use of Government; but at the time this arrangement was made it was not noticed that under section 9 of the Ordinance a sum of Rs. 12,500 per annum is payable by the War Department to the Colombo Municipality for supply of water to military buildings.

2. Since the Government has undertaken to pay a contribution in lieu of rates on naval and military buildings, and since the greater proportion of the water supplied to military buildings would be covered (as being water used for domestic purposes) by this contribution, the Municipality has agreed that the new arrangement should apply to military buildings as well, and that section 9 of Ordinance No. 18 of 1907 should be repealed. This Bill therefore seeks to make the amendments necessitated by this new agreement.
