Lieutenants in the Royal Navy, Captains in the Army, Flight Lieutenants in the Royal Air Force, and officers of relative rank, rank with, but before, officers of the Second Class, Ceylon Civil Service, listed below the second efficiency bar.

Sub-Lieutenants in the Royal Navy, Lieutenants in the Army, Flying Officers in the Royal Air Force, and officers of relative rank, rank with, but before, officers of the Third Class, Ceylon Civil Service.

Officers of the Royal Indian Marine in Ceylon rank with, but immediately after, Royal Naval Officers of the same rank and seniority.

Extract from the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931, relative to the precedence *inter se* of Members of the State Council :—

16. (1) Subject to the provisions of clause (5) of this Article, the Officers of State shall take precedence of the other members, and shall rank among themselves in the order in which their offices are hereinbefore mentioned.

(2) The Speaker of the Council shall take precedence next after the Officers of State.

(3) Members who are Ministers shall take precedence next after the Speaker and among themselves the first in order of precedence shall be the Minister elected by the Board of Ministers to be the Vice-Chairman thereof and the other Ministers shall rank after him in the order of the date of their appointment as Ministers, and two or more Ministers appointed on the same day shall rank in the alphabetical order of their names, provided that a Minister re-appointed as a Minister, whether to the same office or to another, shall, except in regard to the Vice-Chairman of the Board of Ministers, take precedence according to the date from which he shall have held office as a Minister without an interruption of more than one month.

(4) The Deputy Speaker shall rank next after the Ministers, and the Deputy Chairman of Committees shall rank next after the Deputy Speaker.

(5) At any meeting of the Council the Speaker, when presiding or in his absence the Deputy Speaker or other presiding member, shall have precedence over all other members of the Council.

SIR,—With reference to Mr. Amery's Circular despatch of the 19th of March, 1926, I have the honour to transmit for your information copies of an Order in Council of the 19th of May, 1931—The Arms Export Prohibition Order 1931—superseding the Order in Council of the 13th of December, 1921, together with copies of three Open General Export Licences issued thereunder by the Board of Trade.

The modification of the Order in Council of 13th December, 1921, and of the Open General Export Licences issued under it, was rendered necessary by the conclusion at Paris on the 21st of August, 1930, of the Treaty between Abyssinia, France, Italy, and the United Kingdom, for regulating the importation of arms and munitions of war into Abyssinia. The 1921 Order in Council did not cover certain articles which are included in the Treaty, and it was consequently necessary to prohibit by Order in Council the exportation of the additional articles—most of which are included under headings (XVI) to (XX) in the new Order in Council—to all destinations. The exportation without separate licences to all destinations other than Abyssinia of the goods included under headings (XVIII) and (XX) has been authorized by one of the three new Open General Licences, but it was considered desirable to take the opportunity of exercising a greater measure of control over the exportation of the remaining additional items, viz. (XVI), (XVII) and (XIX), and these articles are therefore subject to separate licences on exportation to all destinations.

An explanation of the position and the drafts of the Open General Export Licences appeared at pages 709-710 of the Board of Trade Journal of the 28th of May, 1931.

THE ARMS EXPORT PROHIBITION ORDER, 1931.

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 19th day of May, 1931.

Present :

THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY IN COUNCIL.

Whereas by Section 8 of "The Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879,"(a) it is provided that the following goods may, by Proclamation or Order in Council, be prohibited either to be exported or carried coastwise :—Arms, ammunition and gunpowder, military and naval stores, and any articles which His Majesty shall judge capable of being converted into or made useful in increasing the quantity of military or naval stores, provisions, or any sort of victual which may be used as food for man :

And whereas by Section 17 of the Finance Act, 1921,(b) it is enacted that Section 8 of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, shall extend to weapons and munitions of war of every description and firearms not being weapons of war, and ammunition for such firearms, as it applies to the goods therein mentioned, and that the said section, as so amended by this section, shall extend so as to give power to prohibit the shipment as ship's stores, whether on vessels proceeding to foreign ports or on coastwise voyages, of any of the goods to which the said section applies :

And whereas by an Order in Council dated the 13th December, 1921,(c) made in pursuance of section 8 of "the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879," the exportation from the United Kingdom of certain articles was prohibited :

And whereas it is expedient that the said Order in Council should be revoked :

And whereas it is expedient to prohibit the exportation or shipment as ship's stores on vessels proceeding to foreign ports of the articles hereinafter enumerated:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

- (1) As from the 1st June, 1931, the following articles shall be, and the same are hereby prohibited to be exported from the United Kingdom, or to be shipped as ship's stores on vessels proceeding to foreign ports, that is to say:—
- (i.) Cannon and other ordnance and component parts thereof;
 - (ii.) Carriages and mountings and accessories for mountings for cannon and other ordnance and component parts thereof;
 - (iii.) Cartridges, charges of all kinds, and component parts thereof;
 - (iv.) Explosives of every description;
 - (v.) Firearms of every description and component parts thereof;
 - (vi.) Grenades and component parts thereof;
 - (vii.) Machine guns, interrupter gears, mountings for machine guns and component parts thereof;
 - (viii.) Projectiles of all kinds (except air-gun pellets) and component parts thereof;
 - (ix.) Mines, land or sea, and component parts thereof;
 - (x.) Depth charges, apparatus for the discharge of depth charges, and component parts thereof;
 - (xi.) Bombs, bombing apparatus, and component parts thereof;
 - (xii.) Flame-throwers and component parts thereof;
 - (xiii.) Fuses and component parts thereof;
 - (xiv.) Torpedoes and component parts thereof;
 - (xv.) Torpedo tubes, or other apparatus for discharging torpedoes;
 - (xvi.) Fire-control and gun-sighting apparatus and component parts thereof;
 - (xvii.) Appliances for use with arms and apparatus exclusively designed and intended for land, sea or aerial warfare;
 - (xviii.) Bayonets, swords and lances, and component parts thereof;
 - (xix.) Tanks and armoured cars and component parts thereof;
 - (xx.) Aircraft, assembled or dismantled, and aircraft engines;
- Provided always, and it is hereby declared, that this Order shall not apply to any exportation or shipment as ship's stores which shall be expressly permitted by a licence given by the Board of Trade, and in accordance with the conditions (if any) of such licence.

(2) The said Order in Council, dated the 13th December, 1921, is hereby revoked.

(3) This Order may be cited as The Arms Export Prohibition Order, 1931.

(b) The Arabian Peninsula, Gwadar, Syria and Lebanon, Palestine and Transjordan, and Iraq.

2.—Maritime zone.

A maritime zone, which includes the Red Sea, the Gulf of Aden, the Persian Gulf and the Gulf of Oman, and is bounded by a line drawn from and following the latitude of Cape Guardafui to the point of intersection with longitude 57° East of Greenwich and proceeding thence direct to the point at which the eastern frontier of Gwadar meets the sea.

OPEN GENERAL EXPORT LICENCE No. G.L. 112.

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the Arms Export Prohibition Order, 1931, the Board of Trade do hereby authorize and permit the exportation from any port in Great Britain or Northern Ireland to all destinations by the holder of a valid firearm certificate issued under Section 1 (1) of the Firearms Act, 1920, of the following goods, namely, the firearms and ammunition which are authorized by the said firearm certificate to be

held in Great Britain or Northern Ireland, upon the following conditions :—

- (1) That the firearm certificate shall be produced by the holder with the firearms and ammunition to the Customs Authorities at the port of departure at the time of exportation.
- (2) That this Licence shall be deemed void and of no effect in the event of non-compliance with condition (1) as set out above.
- (3) That this Licence may be modified or revoked at any time by the Board of Trade without reason given.
- (4) That nothing in this Licence contained shall affect the powers of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs and Excise under any Act relating to the Customs or to the export of prohibited goods.

And whereas it is expedient that the Principal Order should be further amended so as to make certain of the provisions of the said Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 2) Order, 1929, the said Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 3) Order, 1929, the said Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 2) Order, 1930, and the said Air Navigation (Amendment) Order, 1931, applicable to the British possessions and territories mentioned in Schedules VIII. and IX. of the said Principal Order and to registered aircraft being the property of British subjects resident or companies incorporated therein, and otherwise in the manner hereinafter appearing :

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of all the powers enabling Him in this behalf, is pleased by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :—

1. Paragraph (1) of Article 4 of the Principal Order, shall be amended :—

- (1) by inserting after the word "aircraft" in sub-paragraph (iii.) the words "shall be of the prescribed number and description and"; and
- (2) by inserting after the words "Condition (iii.)" in proviso (b) the words "in so far as it relates to certificates of competency and licences."

2. Paragraph (2) of Article 6 of the Principal Order shall be omitted.

3. Article 13 of the Principal Order shall be amended by the addition at the end of the words "and if any article other than as aforesaid drops or falls from an aircraft a contravention of this Order shall be deemed to have been committed."

4. The following Article shall be inserted after Article 13 of the Principal Order :—

"13A.—The Governor may by directions prescribe the number and description of the personnel to be carried, either in all circumstances or in certain circumstances specified in the directions, by any class or description of British Aircraft registered in the Colony :

Provided that in any case where the Convention requires that an aircraft shall carry a certain number of persons of a certain description, the number of persons of that description prescribed in that case shall not be less than the number required by the Convention."

5. Paragraph (1) of Article 22 of the Principal Order shall be amended by the insertion after the words "registration marks" of the words "preceded, in the case of a signal by radio-telephony, by the name of the owner of the aircraft."

6. Paragraph 2 of Schedule I. to the Principal Order shall be amended by inserting after the words "validly registered" the words "in any other part of His Majesty's dominions or".

7. Paragraph 20 of Schedule I. to the Principal Order shall be omitted.

8. Sub-paragraph (a) of paragraph 14 of Schedule IV. to the Principal Order shall be amended by omitting the words "constituted by its nationality letter and the last letter of its registration mark" and substituting therefor the words "composed of the first letter and the last letter of the five-letter group constituting its nationality and registration marks."

9. Paragraph 17 of Schedule IV. to the Principal Order shall be amended by omitting the words "is in distress and requires assistance" and substituting therefor the words "is threatened by grave and imminent danger and requires immediate assistance," and by omitting the words from "When an aircraft desires to signal" to the end of the paragraph.

10. The following new paragraphs shall be inserted after paragraph 17 of Schedule IV. to the Principal Order :—

"17A.—(a) Where an aircraft has a message to send stating that it is in difficulties and about to land compulsorily but does not require immediate assistance, it shall preface its call sign with several repetitions of the urgency signal PAN.

(b) Where the signal PAN is received from an aircraft without any message following, it shall signify that the aircraft has been compelled to land and is unable to transmit its intended message owing to the rapidity of the landing, but does not require immediate assistance.

(c) Where the signal PAN is sent by radio-telegraphy the three letters shall be well separated so that the signals AN are not transformed into one signal P.

"17B.—Where an aircraft has a very urgent message to send concerning the safety of the aircraft, or of any person on board, or of any ship, aircraft, vehicle or person within sight, it shall, for the purpose of indicating the urgency of the message, preface its call sign with several repetitions of the group XXX the letters of each group being clearly separated from the letters of the successive group.

"17c.—Neither the signal PAN nor the signal XXX may be transmitted except with the authority of the commander or person responsible for the aircraft.

"17d.—Where an aircraft has a message to send concerning the safety of navigation or containing important information relative to meteorological warning messages, it shall preface its call sign by the safety signal, consisting of the group TTT (transmitted with the letters well separated) followed by the word DE."

11. In paragraph 39 of Schedule IV. to the Principal Order the word "these" shall be omitted.

12. The last sentence of paragraph 48A of Schedule IV. to the Principal Order shall be omitted and the following substituted therefor :—

"Where any such directions are for the time being in force with respect to any aerodrome, there shall be placed horizontally in that aerodrome, near to the signal which indicates the direction of the wind, a red square panel, every side of which shall measure at least ten feet in length and shall be marked at night by red lights."

13. The following amendments shall be made in Schedule V. to the Principal Order :—

(a) In sub-paragraph (1) of paragraph 2 after the word "authority" there shall be inserted the words "in any part of His Majesty's dominions outside Great Britain and Northern Ireland or";

(b) Paragraph 3 shall be omitted.

14. The following paragraph shall be inserted at the end of the Schedule VI. to the Principal Order :—

"7.—(1) Where it is brought to the notice of the Governor—

(a) that a large number of persons is likely to gather in any district in the Colony for the purpose of witnessing some event of public interest; or

(b) that it is intended to hold in any district in the Colony an aircraft race or contest or exhibition of flying;

the Governor may by directions impose such temporary restrictions on the flying of aircraft within or in the neighbourhood of that district as he may consider expedient in the interest of public safety, and no aircraft shall fly in contravention of any such directions :

Provided that any such restrictions, in so far as they relate to aircraft other than State aircraft, shall apply to British aircraft and aircraft registered in any other Contracting State without distinction.

(2) Any directions issued under this paragraph shall specify the area or areas to which the restrictions extend and the time or times during which the restrictions are to be in force, and, in the case of restrictions applying only to aircraft of, or other than, any particular class or description, the class or description of aircraft to which the restrictions apply, or do not apply, as the case may be.

(3) Any area specified in any such directions shall, during the specified time or times, be deemed to be a prohibited area for the purposes of paragraphs 2, 3, 4 and 5 of this Schedule, but not for the purposes of any other provisions of this Order."

15.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Air Navigation^a (Colonies, Protectorates and Mandated Territories) (Amendment) Order, 1931.

(2) This Order shall come into operation on the first day of January, nineteen hundred and thirty-two.

REGULATIONS.

Regulations 2, 3, and 4 in Part I. of the Fourth Schedule to the Motor Car Ordinance, 1927, are hereby rescinded, and the following regulations are substituted therefor :—

2. *Stopping on a Highway.*—When any omnibus is stopped for any purpose on a highway, whether in an urban area or not, it shall be stopped as close to the left or near side of the highway as possible.

3. *Stopping on Highways and taking up Passengers, &c., in Urban Areas.*—No omnibus shall be stopped or allowed to stand on a highway in an urban area, except—

(1) in the event of a breakdown, and then only for so long as may be necessary to enable reasonable repairs to be effected; or

(2) on a public stand provided or allotted for that purpose and indicated as such by a notice exhibited by the licensing authority and then only on payment of such fees, and subject to such regulations for the use thereof as may be prescribed or made under the Motor Car Ordinance, 1927, and subject to the provisions of regulation 4 of these regulations; or

(3) at a stopping place indicated as such by a notice exhibited by the licensing authority, and then only for so long as is reasonably necessary for the purpose of taking up or setting down passengers or goods, and subject to the provisions of regulation 4 of these regulations; or

(4) in a parking place provided or indicated by regulations or notice under section 53 of the Motor Car Ordinance, 1927.

4. *Stopping Places and Public Stands in Urban Areas.*—Where in an urban area any notice is exhibited by a licensing authority indicating a stopping place or public stand for omnibuses, which has been provided or allotted for stopping or standing of omnibuses—

(1) no passengers or goods may be taken up, or set down from, an omnibus in the urban area, except at such stopping place or public stand;

(2) no omnibus shall after stopping at any such stopping place or public stand be driven away therefrom, except—

(a) for the purpose of continuing along its approved or permitted route; or

(b) if such stopping place or public stand is the terminus of such route, for the purpose of returning along such route; or

(c) for the purpose of proceeding without passengers to the garage or other place where it is usually kept.

REGULATIONS REFERRED TO.

1. Regulations published in *Government Gazettes* Nos. 7,692 and 7,877 of February 8, 1929, and August 28, 1931, respectively, are hereby repealed, and the following substituted therefor:—

2. In these regulations—

“Council” means the Urban District Council of Ratnapura.

“Chairman” means the Chairman of the Council.

“Public stand” means any space within the administrative limits of the Council which is defined and reserved for the parking of motor cabs or omnibuses or hiring cars by a notice signed by the Chairman and exhibited at the spot.

3. No vehicle other than a motor cab or omnibus shall be parked in or enter a public stand.

4. When a public stand or any portion of a public stand is reserved for the use of motor cabs or omnibuses or hiring cars, no motor car not belonging to the class for which the stand is reserved shall be parked in it or enter it.

5. (a) A hiring car shall not enter a public stand except by the passage provided for such entrance and shall not leave except by the passage provided for such exit.

(b) All hiring cars shall when parked in a public stand be halted facing the same direction and immediately behind each other.

(c) All hiring cars parked in a public stand shall move up in due order as vacancies occur in front.

6. The driver of the motor cab or omnibus or a person capable of driving it shall be in charge while the motor cab or omnibus occupies a public stand.

7. No motor cab or omnibus shall be parked in any public place except a public stand; and no motor cab or omnibus shall enter or remain in a public stand—

(a) Unless its driver is in possession of a valid permit in respect of it issued under rule 8, and

(b) Unless he produces it when required to do so by a Police Officer or a person authorized for the purpose by the Chairman.

8. The Chairman may issue permits authorizing motor cabs or omnibuses to use a public stand and charge fees for the permits in accordance with the scale specified in the schedule hereto.

9. The driver of a lorry shall not allow it to stand on any highway declared by regulation to be suitable for lorry traffic except—

(a) In the event of a breakdown and then only so long as may be necessary to enable essential repairs to be effected;

(b) For the purpose of loading or unloading goods and then only so long as may be reasonably necessary for the purpose.

10. All drivers and other persons in charge of hiring cars in the stand shall conduct themselves in an orderly manner.

SCHEDULE.

Scale of Charges for the Use of Public Stands.

(1) Hiring car licensed to carry not more than seven passengers, Rs. 5 per mensem or cents 25 per diem.

(2) Hiring car licensed to carry more than seven passengers, Rs. 5 per mensem or cents 50 per diem.

BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

1. The proprietor, trustee, or other person entitled to the possession of a burial ground shall apply in writing to the Chairman of the Urban District Council to have the same registered as such stating the name of the keeper (if any) of the ground, and annexing to his application a figure of survey of the premises certified by the Surveyor-General or by a duly licensed surveyor. And the person named as keeper in such application shall subscribe the same in acknowledgment of his acceptance of the office and duties of such keeper.

2. If no keeper be named, or if the keeper so named shall not have signed the application in manner aforesaid, then, and in either of such cases the person on whose application registration of a burial ground is made shall be held to be the keeper of that ground and to be responsible for any breach of regulations.

3. In the event of the death of the keeper of a burial ground or his inability from any cause to fulfil his duties the name of another keeper shall be registered, and no burial or cremation shall take place in such ground until such fresh registration shall have been effected except on the special permission of the Chairman of the Urban District Council.

4. No burial or cremation shall take place until the certificate required by section 32 of the Births and Deaths Registration Ordinance, No. 1 of 1895, has been produced to the keeper of the burial ground or to the Chairman, as the case may be, if the burial or cremation is authorized by the Chairman.

5. It shall be the duty of the keeper of every burial ground to keep a register of all burials or cremations carried out on the premises of which he is a keeper in the form prescribed by the Chairman of the Urban District Council, and within twenty-four hours after any burial or cremation to cause a true extract of the entry of such cremation or burial in his register to be delivered to the Urban District Council Office.

6. It shall be lawful for the Chairman of the Urban District Council or any person authorized in writing by the Chairman, Urban District Council, for the purpose, to visit and inspect at any time any burial ground, and to have access to all books and documents relating thereto.

7. All registered burial grounds shall be kept properly fenced and kept free from jungle and clean to the satisfaction of the Chairman of the Urban District Council.

8. No grave shall be less than 5 feet in depth or at a distance of less than 2 feet from any other grave.

The Rajah of Sarawak Fund.

A Fund has recently been established by His Highness the Rajah of Sarawak, G.C.M.G., for the purpose of assisting in the education of children of certain Colonial Civil Servants.

Candidates eligible for such assistance must be children of European descent whose parents are British subjects, one of whom is or was a higher Civil Servant (serving, retired, or deceased) of any Colony, Protectorate, or Protected State in or associated by treaty or otherwise with the British Empire, or any Mandated Territory in respect of which the Mandate is exercised by His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom, but not of self-governing Dominions nor the Indian Empire nor Protected States within that Empire.

In considering applications for assistance, account will be taken, amongst other things, of the character and general ability of the candidate and of the financial circumstances of the parents or guardian.

Preference will be given, in the first place, to suitable candidates (if any) one of whose parents is or was in the Sarawak Government Service, and, in the second place, to suitable candidates (if any) one of whose parents is or was in the Malayan Government Service, unless in the opinion of the Trustees of the Fund there be good reason in the particular case for over-riding such preference.

Except for some special reason no assistance will be granted to or for the benefit of a child under the age of 13 years.

Applications should be made in writing in the prescribed form (which will be treated as strictly confidential) addressed to

 - (f) Before directing the institution of proceedings to recover property improperly alienated, under Section 28 ;
 - (g) Before making an order on tenders for the lease of temple land, under Section 29 (1) (e) ;
 - (h) In dealing with the revision of rent under Section 29 (3) ;
 - (i) Before taking action to set aside leases under Section 31 (1) ; and
 - (j) Before ordering the prosecution of a Trustee, under Section 39.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended January 9, 1932.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 241 (1 European, 19 Burghers, 124 Sinhalese, 41 Tamils, 38 Moors, 12 Malays, and 6 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1932, viz., 291,260) was 43.3, as against 35.0 in the preceding week, 44.6 in the corresponding week of last year, and 31.1 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 148 (7 Burghers, 89 Sinhalese, 22 Tamils, 23 Moors, 5 Malays, and 5 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 26.6, as against 28.9 in the previous week, 26.2 in the corresponding week of last year, and 25.2 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 148 total deaths, 30 were of infants under one year of age, as against 38 in the preceding week, 39 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 29 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 20.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Twenty deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 14 in Maradana hospitals (including 5 deaths of non-residents), 2 in Kotahena South, and 1 each in Maradana North, Maradana East, Maradana South, and Slave Island, as against 16 in the previous week and 17 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Six deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 2 in New Bazaar, and 1 each in St. Paul's, Maradana hospitals (of a non-resident), Slave Island, and Wellawatta North, as against 7 in the previous week and 10 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Five deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 1 each in San Sebastian, Kotahena North, Maradana hospitals, Maradana North, and Wellawatta North, as against 6 in the previous week and 5 the weekly average for last year.

2. Fourteen deaths from *Rhithis* were registered, 7 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents), 2 each in Kotahena North and Maradana North and 1 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena South, and New Bazaar, as against 11 in the previous week and 12 the weekly average for last year.

3. One death from *Enteric Fever* was registered in Slave Island. The number registered during the preceding week was also 1 and the weekly average for last year was 3.

4. (a) One death from *Plague* was registered in Maradana hospitals, as against nil in the previous week and 1 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Three deaths from *Plague*, of residents of Colombo town, occurred at the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Angoda, during the week.

5. Eleven deaths from *Debility* were registered, 6 from *Puerperal Septicaemia*, 5 from *Diarrhoea*, 4 each from *Enteritis*, *Worms*, and *Accidents*, 2 from *Dysentery*, 1 from *Tetanus*, and 64 from *Other Causes*.

6. **Reported Cases.**—Twenty-seven cases of *Chickenpox*, 9 of *Enteric Fever*, and 4 of *Plague* were reported during the week. No cases were reported during the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 79.4°, against 78.4° in the preceding week and 80.4° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.983 in., against 29.946 in. in the preceding week and 29.883 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was nil, against 1.17 in. in the preceding week and 0.14 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

VITAL STATISTICS.

(Continued from page 87)

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended January 16, 1932.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 256 (3 Europeans, 12 Burghers, 159 Sinhalese, 38 Tamils, 28 Moors, 9 Malays, and 7 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1932, viz., 291,260) was 46.0, as against 43.3 in the preceding week, 44.6 in the corresponding week of last year, and 31.1 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 163 (4 Burghers, 95 Sinhalese, 33 Tamils, 18 Moors, 6 Malays, and 7 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 29.3, as against 26.6 in the previous week, 21.8 in the corresponding week of last year, and 25.2 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 163 total deaths, 39 were of infants under one year of age, as against 30 in the preceding week, 23 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 29 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 10.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Seventeen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 11 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), 2 each in New Bazaar and Maradana South, and 1 each in St. Paul's and Maradana North, as against 20 in the previous week and 17 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Eight deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 3 in New Bazaar and 1 each in Pettah, St. Paul's, Kotahena South, Maradana North, and Slave Island, as against 6 in the previous week and 10 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Fourteen deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 3 in Kotahena South, 2 each in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), Maradana South, Wellawatta North, and Wellawatta South and 1 each in Kotahena North, New Bazaar, and Maradana East, as against 5 in the previous week and 5 the weekly average for last year.

2. (a) Fourteen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 6 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), 2 each in St. Paul's and New Bazaar, and 1 each in Kotahena North, Kotahena South, Maradana North, and Maradana East. The number registered during the preceding week was also 14 and the weekly average for last year was 12.

(b) Two deaths from *Phthisis*, of residents of Colombo town, occurred at the Anti-Tuberculosis Hospital, Ragama, during the week.

3. Two deaths from *Enteric Fever* (of non-residents) were registered in Maradana hospitals, as against 1 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

4. Fourteen deaths from *Debility* were registered, 10 from *Enteritis*, 4 from *Worms*, 3 from *Dysentery*, 2 each from *Diarrhoea* and *Accidents*, 1 each from *Infantile Convulsions*, *Homicide*, and *Puerperal Septicaemia*, and 70 from *Other Causes*.

5. **Reported Cases.**—Nineteen cases of *Chickenpox*, 4 of *Enteric Fever*, 1 of *Measles*, and 1 of *Plague* were reported during the week, as against 27, 9, nil, and 4, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 79.5°, against 79.4° in the preceding week and 79.7° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 30.007, against 29.983 in the preceding week and 29.906 in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was nil, against nil in the preceding week and 3.52 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

General Meeting.

Wednesday, December 2, 1931, at 3 p.m.

The Council met this day at 3 p.m., pursuant to notice, dated November 25, 1931.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of November 4, 1931, having been previously printed and copies thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read.

Resolved that the Minutes of the General Meeting of November 4, 1931, be confirmed.

2. Pursuant to notice, Dr. S. Muttiah presented a petition from the unlicensed female fish vendors of Colombo.

3. Pursuant to notice, Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader presented a petition from Mr. M. L. M. Ghouse of Pettah regarding the conduct of the Revenue Inspector, Pettah, who was sent by the Municipal Treasurer, on October 3, 1931, for inspection of premises No. 186, Main street, in connection with an application for remission of rates on the ground of non-tenancy.

4. Pursuant to notice, Dr. E. A. Coorey presented a petition from the owners of lime kilns praying that the licence fee for lime kilns be reduced, in view of the present depression, and moved that the petition be referred to the Works and Finance Committees, with the Ward Member. Mr. J. S. Collett seconded.—Carried.

5. Pursuant to notice, the Chairman moved—That the Council should resolve itself into a Committee of the whole Council to consider the following extracts from the proceedings of the Committees annexed to the agenda. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried.

Council in Committee—

The following Extract from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Sanitation and Markets of October 20, 1931, was considered.

(3) To consider the suggested amendments to Rule 7, Chapter XIV., of the Municipal Council By-laws regarding the issue of printed cards to registered dairymen. Registered No. 977.—Recommended that the By-law be amended as suggested.

The amended by-law, with the amendments shown in italics:—

Rule 7. Printed and numbered cards, in such form as the Chairman shall, from time to time, direct and signed by the Secretary, shall be issued annually to every milk vendor employed by a registered dairyman on an application made by such a dairyman. No person shall sell, hawk, or expose milk for sale, unless he has in his possession a card issued for the current year in his own name and unless the name of the dairyman under whom he is employed is still on the register at the time of the sale, hawking, or exposing of the milk for sale. Should such person fail to produce, on demand by any Municipal or Police Officer, such a card for inspection, he shall be guilty of an offence, and such officer may at once arrest him, and shall convey him forthwith after arrest to the nearest Police Station, and the Officer in charge of such Police Station shall deal with him as if he had been arrested by a Police Officer without a warrant under the provisions of the Criminal Procedure Code.

Resolution of Council of November 4, 1931.

The Chairman moved that the consideration of the matter be deferred as the Law Committee requested a further report from the Medical Officer of Health on certain points. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried.

Resolution of Council in Committee.

It was resolved that the matter be considered in connection with the recommendation of item No. 2 of the extracts from the minutes of the Law Committee of November 28, 1931.

The following Extract from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Sanitation and Markets of November 17, 1931, was considered.

(3) To consider a memorandum of the Municipal Treasurer, dated October 21, 1931, recommending that the rent of the three fish stalls at the Bambalapitiya Market, which have been vacant for several months and have, therefore, been converted into 3 vegetable stalls, be fixed at Rs. 3 each per month. Dr. E. V. Ratnam moved, as an amendment, that the motor cab stand fees be reduced by one rupee. Mr. T. G. Jayewardene seconded.

The Chairman stated that a reduction had been urged in Committee. If the present application were allowed from the taxi-cab drivers, the bus drivers, too, would press for a similar concession, as they had made a similar application in November, 1930, which was refused by the Council. He thought the fee of Rs. 5 was not excessive in view of the advantages derived by the taxi-cab drivers.

Dr. E. A. Coorey and Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando supported the motion.
Mr. N. R. Blande supported the recommendation of the Standing Committees.
Mr. M. L. M. Reyald spoke to the amendment.
The amendment was put to the meeting and lost.
The motion was then put to the meeting and carried.

T. 3,952 of the Municipal Engineer's Department, who is condemned by a medical board as unfit for further service. The gratuity is based on his service of 197 months and his average monthly pay of Rs. 36·60. Registered No. 1,363.—Recommended.

(29) To recommend, under Rule 21 of the Municipal Council Pension Rules, the grant of a gratuity of Rs. 184·64 to Cooly Rengan, B. T. 200 of the Municipal Engineer's Department, who is condemned by a medical board as unfit for further service. The gratuity is based on his service of 133 months and his average monthly pay of Rs. 24·99. Registered No. 1,364.—Recommended.

Resolution of Council in Committee.

Dr. E. V. Ratnam moved that the assessments revised under section 123 during the current year for the year, to which exception has been taken, be cancelled and that the annual values which they replaced be restored for the year 1931. Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando seconded.

Mr. T. G. Jayewardene and Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader supported.

Dr. E. A. Coorey and Mr. F. J. Soertsz opposed the motion.

The Chairman detailed the history of this question and the reasons which led to the recommendation of the Committees.

Dr. E. V. Ratnam replied.

The motion was put to the meeting and declared lost.

Dr. E. V. Ratnam called for a division, and the Council divided as follows :—

The dissent is annexed to the Minutes.

The following Extract from the Minutes of the Four Standing Committees (meeting together) of November 28, 1931, was considered.

2. To consider a memorandum of the Chairman, dated November 12, 1931, on the subject of Unemployment and distress in Colombo. Recommended—(1) That the Council approve the proposals contained in the Chairman's memorandum of November 12, 1931, but that the scheme for the filling and levelling of Kirillapone Cemetery, and adjoining Municipal land, as described in Chairman's memorandum of November 21, 1931, and the Municipal Engineer's memorandum of November 27, 1931, be substituted for the levelling of the Government Factory Housing Scheme site. (2) That work be begun on these, leaving the question of quarry pits for further investigation. The Municipal Engineer to report, in due course, on the proposal to fill quarry pits within Municipal Council limits instead of the quarry pits referred to in his memorandum of November 27, 1931. (3) That supplementary provision of Rs. 100,000 be voted for the scheme, and that if the Emergency Reserve Fund (*vide* recommendation of the Four Standing Committees, dated November 6, 1931), is hereafter constituted by the Council, the money be paid out of that Fund. (4) That this vote is subject to the condition that the Government agrees to contribute a further sum of Rs. 50,000 towards the scheme, agrees at once to take the necessary steps for the introduction at the earliest possible date of a Poor Law, as outlined in paragraphs 8 and 11 of the Chairman's memorandum of November 12, 1931, and agrees to the conditions laid down in paragraphs 46 and 47 of that memorandum. (5) That in order to avoid delay, the Chairman is authorized, notwithstanding paragraph 3 of these recommendations, to spend immediately a sum not exceeding Rs. 3,000 on necessary preliminaries, such as the erection of sheds, the purchase of tools, the institution of inquiries, as provided in paragraphs 46 and 47 of the Chairman's memorandum of November 12, 1931, on the condition that he first obtains from the Minister of Labour, Industry and Commerce, an assurance that he approves the scheme and will endeavour at once to obtain the assent of the Government and the provision of the necessary funds. (6) That the Council appoint a Special Committee on Unemployment, as suggested in paragraph 42 of the Chairman's memorandum of November 12, 1931, the Committee to consist of the Chairman, Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando, Dr. E. A. Coorey, Mr. G. W. Dodds, and Dr. S. Muttiah. (7) That details of expenditure under recommendation (5) be placed before the Special Committee on Unemployment and subsequently before the Finance Committee for covering approval.

The following Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects of November 28, 1931, were considered.

PUBLIC HEALTH DEPARTMENT.

2. To consider the suggested amendments to Rule 7, Chapter XIV. of the Municipal Council By-laws regarding the issue of printed cards to registered dairymen. Registered No. 977.

Recommended that the following words be added, after the word "dairyman" at the end of the first sentence in line 3. "*Such cards shall bear a photograph of the vendor and a copy of such photograph shall be deposited with the Chairman.*"

And that the following words be added at the end of the by-law. "*Such cards may be cancelled at any time by the Chairman if it appears to him to be necessary in the interests of the public health.*"

The by-law as further amended to read :—*Rule 7. Printed and numbered cards, in such form as the Chairman shall, from time to time direct, and signed by the Secretary, shall be issued annually to every milk vendor employed by a registered dairyman on an application made by such a dairyman. Such cards shall bear a photograph of the vendor and a copy of such photograph shall be deposited with the Chairman. No person shall sell, hawk, or expose milk for sale, unless he has in his possession a card issued for the current year in his own name and unless the name of the dairyman under whom he is employed on demand by any Municipal or Police Officer, such a card for inspection, he shall be guilty of an offence, and such officer may at once arrest him, and shall convey him forthwith after arrest to the nearest Police Station, and the Officer in charge of such Police Station shall deal with him as if he had been arrested by a Police Officer without a warrant under the provisions of the Criminal Procedure Code. Such cards may be cancelled at any time by the Chairman if it appears to him to be necessary, in the interests of the public health.*

Reconveyance of a Property, vested in the Council.

(6) To recommend reconveyance of the premises, vested in the Council, mentioned in the annexed list (as per Annexure A) to the parties named, on payment of all rates and costs which would have been due up to the quarter in which the reconveyance may be signed, had the property not been vested in the Council.—Recommended.

6. The Chairman moved in Committee :—That the Council do resume. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried.

7. The Chairman moved in Council that the resolutions of Council in Committee and the recommendations of the various Committees, subject to any amendments of such recommendations by the Council in Committee, be adopted. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried.

8. The Chairman submitted, in terms of section 96 of Ordinance 21 of 1929, a Budget containing :—(a) An estimate of the available Municipal income. (b) Details of proposed expenditure for 1932.

9. The following documents were also laid on the table :—

(1) Statements of Receipts and Disbursements from January 1 to October 31, and Progress Reports showing expenditure for October, 1931.

DISSENT.

At the General Meeting of the Council of December 2, 1931, the following item came up for consideration :—

Extracts of Minutes of Four Standing Committees (meeting together) on November 20, 1931. Recommended that no further action be taken in the matter—the matter being the recommendation that all revisions under section 123 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, shall not be enforced, as regards payment of rates, as from July 1, 1931.

The Member for St. Paul's Ward moved—"that the assessments revised under section 123 during the year, for the year, to which exception has been taken, be cancelled and that the "annual values which they replaced, be restored for the year 1931." The Member for Kotahena Ward seconded and the Members for Pettah and New Bazaar Wards spoke in support of it, while the Member for Wellawatta Ward opposed it.

The motion was put to the meeting and lost, 5 voting for and 9 against, including 3 elected Members. The recommendation of the Committees was then put to the meeting and carried by a majority.

For the following among other reasons, we dissent from the decision of the majority :—

The assessment of property, the division and consolidation of assessment and the revision of assessment are all regulated by the provisions contained in sections 115, 117, 119, 120, 122, 123, and 124 of the Municipal Council's Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910. Any act done, or course of action taken which is not in strict conformity with these provisions is *ultra vires*, illegal and not binding.

To take only the provisions material to the consideration of the question at issue : Section 120 lays down the procedure for assessment of the annual value of any houses, buildings or lands liable to be rated.

Section 117 provides, *inter alia*, for (a) service of notice of assessment, (b) written objections to assessment within a month of the service of notices, (c) disposal of objections, and (d) determination of finality of assessments.

Section 122 enables the Council to do away with the necessity to prepare a new assessment every year and adopt the assessment of one year for the succeeding year with such alterations as may, in particular cases, be necessary.

These sections read with section 116 which provides for division and consolidation of assessments, subject, however, to the condition that the assessed annual value for the year shall in no way be altered, raised or reduced, point clearly and unequivocally to legislature having contemplated that an assessment, after it has become final, shall not be altered during the course of a year on any account.

After these clear, emphatic and unambiguous provisions, there has been introduced that very dubious section 123, which appears to vest the Chairman of the Council with practically autocratic powers to revise assessments at any time of the year, with the only safeguard of an appeal to the Council.

This section read as follows :—"The Chairman shall have power and authority, subject to appeal to the Council, at any time to revise any assessment, increasing or decreasing the same as he shall see fit, and to fix the date upon which the revised assessment shall come into force. It stands by itself, detached, and is distinctly opposed to the spirit and trend of the provisions of the other sections which govern assessments. It does not provide for service of notices or for objections as laid down in section 117.

There is a divergence of opinion, lay and legal, with regard to the right interpretation of this section.

The present Chairman and his predecessor in office have stated that with the advice of their Executive Officers they construed this section to apply to and have, from as far as back as 1925, applied it to revise assessments only, in cases of physical alterations, which had not entered into the calculation of the annual value for a particular year. Two of the most eminent legal luminaries of the Island have expressed it as their considered opinion, that this section has been introduced without any definite aim or purport and is inconsistent with the clear provisions of the other sections of the Ordinance, herein before mentioned.

It seems to us that an impartial and unbiased mind should agree with this view. We maintain that if there existed any doubt with regard to the right application of this fortuitous provision the benefit of it should be given to the rate payers, the majority of whom stand to be affected by it, rather than it should be used to oppress them, as is proposed in this decision of Council.

In the revisions of assessments, which this illogical decision seeks to uphold, are included cases utterly indefensible, legally, morally, or according to constitutional procedure.

This leads us to the necessity, which we deplore, of characterizing a statement made publicly by two of the Chairmen of this Council as misleading and incorrect, but we are compelled to do so in the interests of the integrity of the Council and in consideration of the far reaching effects such loose statements have on the morality of the officers of the Council.

The case which came within our notice, of premises No. 13 and 15, Prince street, demonstrates clearly, how misleading is the statement made by the Chairman that section 123 has been used to revise assessments only in cases of physical alteration.

Facts are that no physical alterations had been made in the case of these premises. An increase in rent, due purely to competition, was brought to the notice of the Municipal Assessor, apparently some time in October, 1930. At any rate he knew of it by November 10, 1930, and he could have, in 1930, altered the assessment of the premises under section 122 and served notice. He failed to do so. Instead, he adopted the assessment in force for 1930, for the ensuing year 1931, and served notice under section 117 on December 6, 1930. No objection having been taken before January 6, 1931, this assessment became final for the year 1931.

On January 19, 1931, a subordinate officer brings the failure to raise the assessment, according to the rent which had risen up from the preceding August, to the notice of the Assessor. An assistant to the Assessor makes an order on January 21, 1931, to increase (the assessment) from January 1, 1931. The order is carried out on March 9, 1931, and a fresh notice is served on March 14, 1931, 9 weeks after the assessment for the year 1931, had become final. This we maintain is grossly irregular and illegal.

Yet the Chairman still insists that there was nothing irregular, although at one time he was inclined to the view that, as the second notice was not served until March, it was not, as a matter of fact, in order. He glosses over the defection of his officials by stating: "On November 21, the Assessor received information from the Registrar of Lands that the property had been leased from August 1, 1930, at Rs. 450 per month. The Assessor thereupon issued a further E notice for that value which was not served, however, until March, 1931."

The fact is that the assessment was actually not revised until March 9, 1931.

It is cases of this kind of illegal and irregular revisions of assessments which the motion of the Member for St. Paul's Ward was intended to remedy and which the decision of the majority frustrated.

In the interest of justice, fairplay, truth, and rectitude, the Council should not hesitate to rectify an error. It should consider the far reaching effect, even a seeming departure from strict rectitude, would have on its large staff rather than concern itself with the prestige of its higher officers.

These reasons should be sufficient to set aside the decision and adopt a course more legal, consistent and fair, both to the Council and to the ratepayers.

Special Budget Meeting.

Wednesday, December 9, 1931, at 3 p.m.

The Council met this day at 3 p.m., pursuant to notice, dated December 2, 1931, to consider finally the Budget for the year 1932, in accordance with the provisions of section 98 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, as amended by Ordinance No. 21 of 1929.

Present :—Mr. W. T. Stace, B.A., Litt. D., C.C.S., J.P., Chairman; Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader; Dr. E. V. Ratnam; Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando; Dr. E. A. Coorey; Mr. G. W. Dodds; Mr. T. G. Jayewardene, V.D., J.P.; Mr. N. R. Blande; Mr. A. H. G. Dawson; Dr. S. Muttiah; Mr. T. C. Dyball; Mr. F. Dadabhoy, J.P.; Mr. W. J. Thornhill; Mr. J. S. Collett; Dr. L. A. Prins, I.S.O.; and Lieut.-Colonel N. W. Napier-Clavering, D.S.O., R.E.

(Mr. G. H. N. Saunders, Municipal Treasurer, was also present).

Pursuant to notice, the Chairman moved the following motion and alluded, in terms of appreciation, to the services rendered by each of these Members during their term of service on the Council :—

That this Council do place on record its appreciation of the services of the Hon. Mr. Justice R. L. Pereira, K.C., Mr. T. G. Jayewardene, V.D., J.P., and Mr. S. W. R. Dias Bandaranaike, M.S.C., who have been the Members for the Colpetty Ward, New Bazaar Ward, and Maradana Ward, respectively, during the following periods :—(1) The Hon. Mr. Justice R. L. Pereira, K.C., from January, 1921, to December, 1931. (2) Mr. T. G. Jayewardene, V.D., J.P., from September, 1925, to December, 1931. (3) Mr. S. W. R. Dias Bandaranaike, M.S.C., from January, 1927, to December, 1931. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader cordially seconded.—Carried unanimously.

Mr. T. G. Jayewardene thanked the Chairman, the seconder and the Council for their kind appreciation of his services.

The Chairman moved that the Council should resolve itself into a Committee of the whole Council. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried.

Council in Committee—

The Chairman said that before proceeding to the consideration of the Budget he wished, with the permission of the Council, to obtain the Council's views on a matter of great urgency in reference to the vote of Rs. 100,000, which the Council had at its last meeting, on certain conditions, passed towards unemployment relief work. These conditions had been considered by the appropriate Ministers and Committees of the Government, and he, the Chairman, had been given to understand by the Chief Secretary that the Board of Ministers are quite willing to ask the State Council immediately to vote the necessary Rs. 50,000 and accept all the conditions laid down by the Council, but find it difficult to agree to the condition regarding the establishment of a Poor Law. The Chairman added that the matter was urgent because there were about 1,500 to 2,000 men working on the Kolonnawa relief works, which work would come to an end, he understood, at the end of that week. Therefore, if he did not get a decision from the Council at that meeting there would be a long gap till January during which the unemployed would be without work. He, therefore, wished to have the Council's opinion on the matter.

Dr. S. Muttiah and Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando were of opinion that the terms of the Government offer, as stated by the Chairman, should be accepted, that the condition as regards a Poor Law may be held over for discussion at a future date and that the relief scheme suggested by the Chairman and adopted by the Council should be proceeded with as soon as possible.

Mr. N. R. Blande and Dr. E. A. Coorey spoke on the subject.

The Chairman moved that with reference to its resolution of December 2, 1931, on extract No. 2 of the Minutes of the Four Standing Committees (meeting together) dated November 28, 1931, this Council waives the condition regarding the Poor Law and agrees to proceed with the scheme on the other conditions laid down in that resolution, but that though the Council takes this action in the desire to help in the present unemployment crisis, the Council does not admit any responsibility for dealing with the question of unemployment and desires to press upon the Government the necessity of introducing a Poor Law. Dr. E. V. Ratnam seconded.—Carried.

A Budget for 1932 containing :—(a) An estimate of the available Municipal income; (b) Details of proposed expenditure for 1932; having been circulated among the Councillors and submitted to the Council, according to the provisions of section 97 (1) and after compliance with section 96, respectively, of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, as amended by Ordinance No. 21 of 1929, was finally considered by the Council, in terms of section 98 of that Ordinance.
