WHEREAS it seems advisable to the Governor to establish, in Tibbotuwawa, Kohonsiya pattuwa, Matale South in the District of Matale in the Central Province, a general cemetery for the burial or cremation of the dead within the limits hereinafter specified and defined:

And whereas the Governor may under section 6 (3) of "The Cemeteries and Burials Ordinance, 1899," as amended by the Cemeteries and Burials Amendment Ordinance, 1931, exempt any cemetery either wholly or in part from the operation of sections 11, 16, 17, and 24:

Now know Ye that We, the Governor, by virtue of the powers vested in Us by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931, do hereby, under section 6 (1) of "The Cemeteries and Burials Ordinance, 1899," as amended by the Cemeteries and Burials Amendment Ordinance, 1931, establish, as from the date hereof, a general cemetery on the land described in Schedule A hereto for the burial or cremation of the dead within the limits specified and defined in Schedule B hereto.

And We do hereby exempt the said cemetery wholly from the operation of sections 11, 16, 17, and 24 of the said Ordinance.

MERCHANT SHIPPING.

Passenger Steamer Certification.

THE MERCHANT SHIPPING (INDIAN CERTIFICATES FOR PASSENGER STEAMERS) ORDER, 1931.

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 1st day of October, 1931.

Whereas by section 284 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, (a) (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act) it is enacted that, where the legislature of any British Possession provides for the survey of, and grant of certificates for, passenger steamers, and the Board of Trade report to His Majesty The King that they are satisfied that the certificates are to the like effect, and are granted after a like survey, and in such manner as to be equally efficient with the certificates granted for the same purpose in the United Kingdom under that Act, His Majesty in Council may,—

- (1) declare that the certificates granted in the said British possession shall be of the same force as if granted under that Act; and
- (2) declare that all or any of the provisions of Part III of that Act which relate to passenger steamers' certificates shall, either without modification or with such modifications as to His Majesty may seem necessary, apply to the certificates granted in the said British possession; and
- (3) impose such conditions and make such regulations with respect to the certificates, and to the use, delivery, and cancellation thereof, as to His Majesty may seem fit, and impose fines not exceeding fifty pounds for the breach of those conditions and regulations.

And whereas by the Indian Merchant Shipping Act, 1923, as amended by the Indian Merchant Shipping (Amendment) Act, 1928, (hereinafter referred to as the Indian Merchant Shipping Acts) the Indian legislature constituted by the Government of India Act provided for the survey of, and grant of certificates for, passenger steamers in British India:

And whereas the Board of Trade have reported to His Majesty that they are satisfied that the certificates for foreign-going passenger steamers granted under the Indian Merchant Shipping Acts are to the like effect, and are granted after a like survey, and in such manner as to be equally efficient with the certificates granted for the same purpose in the United Kingdom under the principal Act:

And whereas there are in force two Orders in Council relating to certificates for passenger steamers granted in British India, that is to say, the Order made on the 26th day of June, 1884, (b) respecting certificates granted in Bombay, and the Order made on the 17th day of October, 1884, (c) respecting certificates granted in Bengal; and by virtue of section 745 of the principal Act those Orders continue in force as if they had been made under that Act:

And whereas by section 738 of the principal Act, it is (amongst other things) provided that where His Majesty has power under that Act to make an Order in Council, His Majesty may from time to time by Order in Council revoke any Order so made:

And whereas it is expedient that the said recited Orders in Council should be revoked:

And whereas the provisions of section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, (d) have been complied with:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the powers vested in Him by the principal Act, and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to declare as follows that is to say:—

1. Certificates of survey for foreign-going passenger steamers granted in British India under the Indian Merchant Shipping Acts by the proper authority shall be of the same force as if granted under the principal Act.

2. All the provisions of Part III of the principal Act which relate to passenger steamers' certificates shall, without modification, apply to such certificates as are referred to in Article 1 of this Order.

3. The Orders in Council relating to certificates for passenger steamers granted in Bombay and Bengal, dated respectively the 26th day of June, 1884, and the 17th day of October, 1884, are hereby revoked.

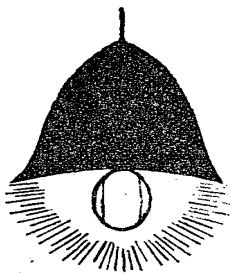

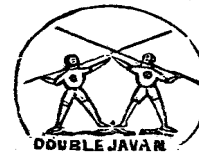

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended January 30, 1932.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 202 (6 Europeans, 12 Burghers, 113 Sinhalese, 35 Tamils, 27 Moors, and 9 Malays). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1932, viz., 291,260) was 36·3, as against 33·7 in the preceding week, 31·0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 31·1 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 156 (7 Burghers, 95 Sinhalese, 21 Tamils, 22 Moors, 6 Malays, and 5 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 28·0, as against 29·3 in the previous week, 27·2 in the corresponding week of last year, and 25·2 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 156 total deaths, 30 were of infants under one year of age, as against 36 in the preceding week, 28 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 29 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 13.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Eighteen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 8 in Maradana hospitals (including 5 deaths of non-residents), 2 each in Kotahena North and Maradana South, and 1 each in Kotahena South, New Bazaar, Maradana North, Maradana East, Slave Island, and Wellawatta North, as against 26 in the previous week and 17 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Seven deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 2 in New Bazaar and 1 each in St. Paul's, San Sebastian, Kotahena North, Maradana North, and Slave Island, as against 9 in the previous week and 10 the weekly average for last year.

(c) One death from *Bronchitis* was registered in Wellawatta North, as against 4 in the previous week and 5 the weekly average for last year.

2. (a) Nineteen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 10 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents), 2 each in Kotahena South and Wellawatta North, and 1 each in Pettah, St. Paul's, Maradana East, Maradana South, and Kollupitiya, as against 20 in the previous week and 12 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Four deaths from *Phthisis* of residence of Colombo town occurred at the Anti-Tuberculosis Hospital, Ragama, during the week.

3. Four deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents), as against 1 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

4. Ten deaths from *Worms* were registered, 9 from *Debility*, 7 from *Enteritis*, 5 from *Dysentery*, 2 each from *Diarrhoea*, *Puerperal Septicaemia*, and *Accidents*, 1 from *Tetanus*, and 69 from *Other Causes*.

5. **Reported Cases.**—Twelve cases of *Chickenpox*, 5 of *Whooping Cough*, 4 of *Enteric Fever*, and 3 of *Measles* were reported during the week, as against 31, nil, nil, and 1, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 82·0°, against 80·7° in the preceding week and 78·9° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·917 in., against 29·967 in. in the preceding week and 29·975 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was nil, against nil in the preceding week and nil in the corresponding week of the previous year.
