RULES.

Rules for the grant of pensions and gratuities to officers and servants of the Kandy Municipality published by Notification dated April 12, 1912, in *Government Gazette* No. 6,499 of April 19, 1912, as amended by the Notifications specified in the schedule hereto, shall be further amended in the following manner:—

1. The following shall be inserted immediately after rule 2:—

2A (1) An officer to whom a pension or annuity is granted under these rules may, at his option exercisable as hereinafter provided, be paid, in lieu of such pension, a pension at the rate of three-fourths of such pension, together with a gratuity equal to ten times the annual value of the reduction so made in the pension.

(2) The option referred to in sub-section (1) shall be exercisable—

- (a) In the case of an officer who, if he had been retired on grounds of ill-health, on November 12, 1930, might have been granted a pension under these rules, not later than August 16, 1932.
- (b) In the case of any other officer, within one month after the earliest date on which, if retired on grounds of ill-health, he might be awarded a pension or annuity under these rules, or not later than August 16, 1932, whichever shall be the later date for exercising the option.

Provided always—

- (i.) That an officer, who has previously had the opportunity of exercising the option, but has not done so and who is still in the service of the Council or in any other public service, may apply within one month of his subsequent marriage for permission to exercise the option, which

permission may be granted at the Council's discretion after examination of the officer by a Medical Board.

(ii.) That the date of the exercise of the option shall be deemed to be the date of the receipt of his written notification addressed to the Chairman; or in any case falling under the preceding proviso, the date on which the Council grants permission to exercise the option; and

(iii.) That, if an officer has exercised the option, his decision shall be irrevocable so far as concerns any pension ultimately to be granted to him under these rules.

(3) In the case of an officer who retired on or after November 12, 1930, and has died before August 16, 1932, without exercising the option, leaving a widow, or child, or children, or a near relative, or near relatives, who may have been dependent upon him, the Council may direct that such officer shall be deemed to have exercised the option and may grant to the widow, or to such person as it may approve for the benefit of the dependents as aforesaid, a gratuity calculated in accordance with sub-section (1) of rule 2A of these rules, less one-quarter of the aggregate pension drawn or due to the officer up to the date of his death.

Provided that nothing in this sub-section shall prevent the Council from authorizing the payment of a death gratuity under sub-section (3) of rule 2A of these rules instead of a gratuity under this sub-section; if it shall appear to the Council that such action is more favourable to the beneficiaries.

(4) Where a person is granted, under these rules, both a gratuity and a pension, the amount of such pension shall be deemed to be the amount of the unreduced pension which might have been granted if the option of commutation had not been exercised for the application of the proviso to sub-section (1) of rule 18 to the calculation of the Council pension of a transferred officer.

(5) For the purposes of this rule, the word “pension” is to be interpreted as including a long service allowance grantable under rule 21.

2B (1) If an officer confirmed in a pensionable post who has completed 5 years' public service (as defined in rule 18 (2) and including any period of service on probation or agreement), has died on or after November 12, 1930, or shall die hereafter, while in the service of the Council, the Council may grant to such person as it may approve for the benefit of the dependents of the deceased officer a gratuity of an amount not exceeding one year's pensionable emoluments.

(2) In the case of an officer dying while seconded for service with the Council from any other public service, the Council may grant a death gratuity in the manner aforesaid. Should such officer be eligible for a gratuity under the Imperial Superannuation Acts, the higher of the two gratuities shall be payable by the Council.

(3) On the death of any person to whom a pension has been granted which has not been reduced under the provisions of rule 2A of these rules; the Council may grant to such person as it may approve for the benefit of the dependents of the deceased pensioner a death gratuity not exceeding the sum, if any, by which the total of the aggregate pension drawn and due falls short of the death gratuity which would have been payable if the deceased pensioner had been in service at the date of his death.

2. Rule 14 shall be revoked and the following substituted therefor:—

14 (1) If any officer to whom a pension has been granted under these rules is appointed to another office in the service of the Council, or in any other public service then during his tenure of such office so much only (if any) of his pension from the Council shall be paid to him per annum as, together with—

- (a) the annual emoluments of such office, and
- (b) any annual amounts received on account of pension in respect of other public service; and
- (c) where the officer receives in respect of some period of public service both a gratuity and a pension, an annual amount equal to the difference between the reduced pension actually received and the full unreduced pension which he might have been granted if he had not been granted both a gratuity and a pension,

make up an amount not greater than the annual salary of the appointment from which he retired.

Provided that—

- (i.) Where the officer retired or was transferred from the service of the Council prior to January 1, 1923, the salary of the appointment from which

he retired shall, for the purpose of this rule, be deemed to be the salary to which the salary last drawn by him would have been converted under the Salaries Scheme brought into force from January 1, 1923, had he been drawing it on that date;

- (ii.) Where an officer in whose case an abatement of pension falls to be made under this rule has been granted a pension or pensions in respect of other public service, the amount of the pension to be drawn from the funds of the Council shall be determined with due regard to the amount of any pension or pensions similarly to be drawn in respect of other public service; and
- (iii.) Any bonus or temporary increase whether on pension or on the salary of the new office, granted in respect of the high cost of living, shall be added to such pension or salary, as the case may be, for the purpose of this rule.

(2) If any officer's re-employment be with the Council, the original pension will be altogether cancelled: if the officer on re-employment attains a rate of salary not less than that on which he first retired, and the ultimate pension will, on final retirement, be based on his final salary and the total length of his service as though the whole had been continuous, but if the salary received during the second period of service is less than that on which he first retired, the original pension will be revived on his ultimate retirement and a distinct pension will be grantable for the second period of service at the rate of 1/720th of his final salary for each month of such service, less any number of months that may have been previously added in respect of abolition of office, and without any addition for climate bonus already computed in the first pension.

(3) A re-employed officer shall be deemed to have exercised, or not to have exercised in respect of his service subsequent to re-employment, the option provided for in rule 2A of these rules, according as he exercised or did not exercise such option in respect of his previous service. Where a revised pension based on final salary and the total length of his service is calculated on his ultimate retirement, the gratuity to be paid on such ultimate retirement to an officer who has exercised his option in favour of a gratuity and reduced pension shall be reduced by the amount of the gratuity already paid; but if a distinct pension is granted to such an officer for the second period of service he will draw a separate and distinct gratuity and a reduced pension for the second period of service.

3. Rule 18 (1) shall be amended by the insertion in brackets of the words "(see also rule 2A (4))" at the end thereof.

4. The following shall be inserted immediately after rule 18:—

18A (1) Whenever an officer entitled to a pension under these rules is also entitled to a pension or pensions in respect of other public service, he may be granted the full pension for which he is eligible in respect of his service with the Council, but no person may at any time draw from the funds of the Council an amount of pension which, when added to the amount of any pension or pensions drawn in respect of other public service, exceeds two-thirds of the highest pensionable emoluments drawn by such person at any time in the course of his service with the Council or in other public service; and in no case shall he be permitted to reckon service with the Council for a period that would make his total public employment in excess of 40 years.

(2) In a case falling under the limitation laid down by sub-section (1) of this rule, the amount of pension to be drawn from the funds of the Council shall be determined with due regard to the amount of any pension or pensions similarly to be drawn in respect of other public service (see also rule 2A (4)).

5. Rule 24 shall be amended by the insertion of the following immediately after the word "servant" in the first line thereof:—

"not confirmed in a pensionable post, who has completed five years' service";

6. Rule 26 shall be revoked and the following substituted therefor:—

26 (i.) The following are the rates of exchange for payment of pensions in England:—

(1) For officers and servants on Sterling Salary 1s. 4d. to the rupee.

(2) For officers and servants on rupee salary—

(a) If appointed not later than February 19, 1897, 1s. 10½d. to the rupee;

- (b) If appointed after February 19, 1897, but not later than December 31, 1904, 1s. 6d. to the rupee.
- (c) If appointed on or after January 1, 1905, 1s. 4d. to the rupee.

(ii.) Gratuities paid in part commutation of pensions are payable at the rates of exchange at which such pensions are payable. All other gratuities are payable at 1s. 4d. to the rupee.

7. In rule 31 add the words "or gratuity" after the word "pension".

8. The following shall be inserted immediately after rule 34:—

35. In any reference to "pension" in these rules, the gratuity referred to in rule 2A will also be considered as being included where applicable.

## VITAL STATISTICS.

### Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended February 6, 1932.

*Births.*—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 193 (2 Europeans, 9 Burghers, 115 Sinhalese, 27 Tamils, 25 Moors, 8 Malays, and 7 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1932, viz., 291,260) was 34.6, as against 36.3 in the preceding week, 37.4 in the corresponding week of last year, and 31.1 the weekly average for last year.

*Deaths.*—The total deaths registered were 132 (2 Europeans, 3 Burghers, 76 Sinhalese, 22 Tamils, 18 Moors, 3 Malays, and 8 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 23.7, as against 28.0 in the previous week, 25.1 in the corresponding week of last year, and 25.2 the weekly average for last year.

The Officer conducting the sale may, at his discretion, require any bidder to deposit such sum of money as he considers necessary as security for completion of purchase and such bidder, if and when called upon to do so, shall immediately comply with this requirement. On failure to do so, his bid though it may be the highest is liable to be rejected.

4. Buyers will be allowed to have the logs weighed at the depot premises, if so required, the cost of reweighing to be borne by such buyers. If any difference is found between the depot weight and the weight ascertained after reweighing, a certificate will be issued by this department showing the actual weight at the time of reweighing, provided the buyers require such certificate for export purposes. But no allowance will be made for any shortage when making payment, the logs being sold by auction at a rate per lot and not per ton.

5. Sale of Satinwood.

AN auction sale of the undermentioned satinwood will be held at the Central Timber Depot, Kew road, Slave Island, Colombo, on Saturday, March 19, 1932, at 9 A.M., subject to the following conditions:—

1. The timber will be put up in lots to suit buyers at a rate per cubic foot, and no advance of less than 25 cents per cubic foot will be accepted.

2. The highest bid will be accepted, subject to the approval or disapproval of the Conservator of Forests. The highest bidder will be required by the officer conducting the sale to sign the sale book kept for the purpose directly a lot has been knocked down to him.

3. The Officer conducting the sale may, at his discretion, require any bidder to deposit such sum of money as he considers necessary as security for completion of purchase and such bidder, if and when called upon to do so, shall immediately comply with this requirement. On failure to do so, his bid though it may be the highest is liable to be rejected.

4. Depot measurements must be accepted, but previous to date of auction any prospective bidder is at liberty to check the measurements recorded in the notice and to represent any differences promptly.

5. No timber shall be removed before payment of the full price bid, and all timber sold must be removed from the depot within ten days of date of notification of acceptance by the Conservator of Forests of such bid, and will be at the risk of the purchasers until removed. If any logs are not removed by

the purchaser within the above specified period, a ground rent of cents 25 per log per diem will be payable and removal of such logs will not be permitted until such dues have been paid.

6. Should any person to whom a lot is knocked down refuse to take it over at the full price bid, or refuse or fail to sign the sale book and to pay such sum of money as required by the officer conducting the sale by way of security or refuse or fail duly to complete the purchase and also to pay any ground rent due and remove the timber as provided for in clause 5 above, the lot will again be put up for auction, and the original purchaser or bidder will be held liable for any loss to Government owing to a lower price being realized at the resale, while, if an enhanced price is realized at such resale, he shall, however have no claim to the profit, which shall accrue to Government.

7. Flowered logs, if not so advertised, shall be excluded from the lots advertised in the list, and shall be put up separately, at the discretion of the Assistant Conservator of Forests, after consulting the wishes of prospective purchasers.

8. Agents bidding for others will be required to produce a written authority from the firm or person for whom they bid, such authority will be retained by the Assistant Conservator of Forests, and will hold good only at the particular sale at which it is produced.

9. Fractions of a cubic foot less than .5 will be ignored, and anything over will be counted as one cubic foot in calculation of value of each log.

10. The description of the logs appearing in the remarks column of the following list is entered merely for the guidance of the intending purchasers who, as usual, should satisfy themselves as to its correctness before purchasing the logs:—

## General Meeting.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice, dated January 6, 1932.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of December 2, and of the Special Meeting of December 9, 1931, having been previously printed and copies thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read.

Resolved that the Minutes of the General Meeting of December 2, and of the Special Meeting of December 9, 1931, be confirmed.

1A. Before proceeding to the business of the meeting, the Chairman stated that he wished to lay before the Council the facts relating to the most recent developments in regard to the question of relief work to the unemployed owing to the closing down by the Government of the relief works at Angoda and at the flood bund at Kolonnawa. He pointed out that there had been difficulties in transferring men from the Government Scheme to the Municipal Scheme. He stated that about 600 men had suddenly presented themselves for work at Kirillapone, and as they had not furnished themselves with the necessary tickets entitling them for employment on the Council's Relief Scheme, he had directed them to go to the Charity Commissioner and obtain such tickets. They proceeded to Price Park and their numbers had been considerably increased *en route*. The Charity Commissioner was ready to deal with those entitled to tickets and would be working till late to pass as many of those as possible. He had been informed by the Controller of Labour that the work for the unemployed at Angoda would finish on the previous day. He, therefore, asked the Controller of Labour to cause an announcement to be made to the men at Angoda that those who had applied for work under the Municipal Scheme, but not yet received work cards, should call as soon as possible at the Charity Commissioner's Office. With regard to those who were not qualified under the Municipal Scheme, he had been in communication with the Minister of Labour and arranged that those applicants who had been rejected by the Municipality were to be given cards merely stating that they were not qualified for work under the Municipal Scheme and they were to call at the Demetagoda Park on Saturday morning when they would be informed of the intentions of the Government.

In this connection he referred to the Flood Protection Scheme of Government and the offer made by the Municipal Council, after the floods of 1930, to contribute towards the strengthening and maintenance of the Flood Protection Works. The Government had put forward a Scheme together with plans and estimates which would cost about 4 lakhs and the Government wished to know what amount the Council would contribute. The Council's Engineers, who were asked by the Council to report on the Government Scheme, were of opinion that the Scheme was quite sound provided the work were satisfactorily carried out, but too expensive and elaborate. The point at issue was that the Government proposed to raise the flood bund to a level of 4 feet free board above the theoretical level of the 1930 floods, while the Municipal Engineers were of opinion that 2 feet free board was amply sufficient. He had just received a letter from the Secretary to the Ministry of Agriculture and Lands stating that the Director of Irrigation was "definitely of the opinion that nothing less than the security represented by a 4 feet free board was justifiable and that he is unable to consider any compromise on this question". He brought up the matter before the Council that afternoon because he understood from the Minister of Agriculture that morning that he was anxious about it from the point of view of unemployment relief. He wished to know whether the amount to be contributed by the Council could be determined that afternoon, or whether the question should be considered by the Four Standing Committees and the Council meeting of next month. As regards the financial aspect of the matter, he pointed out that a sum of Rs. 100,000 had been set apart as a reserve fund for purposes of Flood Protection and the Council could vote the whole or a part of that reserve fund without any financial difficulty.

A discussion ensued in which Dr. E. A. Coorey, Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader, Mr. A. E. Goonesinghe, Mr. Aelian W. Pereira, and the Chairman took part.

Dr. E. V. Ratnam moved that a Special Meeting of the Four Standing Committees be held to-morrow, Thursday, January 14, at 3.30 P.M. and that, after transaction of the business of the Agenda of this Council Meeting, the Council do adjourn till 3.30 P.M. on Friday, January 15, 1932, to consider the Council's position with regard to the Government Flood Protection Scheme. Dr. E. A. Coorey seconded. Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando supported. The motion was put to the meeting and carried.

46. (c) That during the six years prior to his application, the applicant shall have been employed within Colombo Municipal limits for periods amounting in the aggregate to at least three years, or

(d) That if the total period intervening between the date of the applicant's first regular employment and the date of his application is less than six years, then, at least, half of that period shall have been spent in employment within Colombo Municipal limits.

(2) That paragraph 46 (i) be deleted and the Special Committee on Unemployment be allowed full discretion to deal with each case, subject to the general application of the rules.

(i) That the Special Committee on Unemployment shall have no discretion except as given by these rules or any other rules framed from time to time by the Council.

(3) That paragraph 46 (k) be deleted, as it becomes unnecessary if the Committee is given full discretion.

46. (k) That if within six months from the first meeting of the Special Committee at which applications are dealt with, any exceptional case, not falling within the rules, is nevertheless considered by the Special Committee on Unemployment to be one which should be relieved, they may report the facts and their recommendation to the Council who may order relief.

(4) That paragraph 46 (f) be retained, but that the Committee shall, in its discretion, allow work to persons who would otherwise be excluded under this condition. Such cases should, however, be reported to the Societies or Bodies which are granting relief, if known, with the suggestion that they should cease granting relief. If they do not do so, the applicant's name will be struck off the Council's work register.

46. (f) That the applicant is not in receipt of regular monetary relief or pension from any official source of charitable organization.

Reyal as to what the cost of the whole Scheme would be, the Chairman stated that the position was that Government's estimate of the cost of the Scheme was about 4 lakhs. The Council's engineers were of the opinion that a smaller scheme at a cost of about 1½ lakhs would be sufficient. Government, however,

did not accept that and they wished to proceed with their Scheme. The feeling of the Committees was that the Council should make its contribution on the basis of what the Council's engineers thought right. It was not important to the Council how much more Government was spending on the Scheme. As to what the actual cost of the Scheme would be, nobody knew. Government had estimated it at about 4 lakhs. They might be able to carry out the work for 3 lakhs. Whatever the cost of the Scheme, the Council would pay 25 per cent. and the maximum amount to be paid be limited to Rs. 100,000.

Dr. E. A. Coorey and Mr. A. E. Goonesinghe spoke.

On the suggestion of Dr. E. A. Coorey, it was decided to make it clear that the maximum amount to be paid by the Council was not to exceed Rs. 100,000 and the resolution was amended to read as follows:—That the Government be informed that the Council is prepared to contribute twenty-five per cent. of the actual cost of the Scheme, the maximum amount to be paid by the Council, however, not to exceed Rs. 100,000.

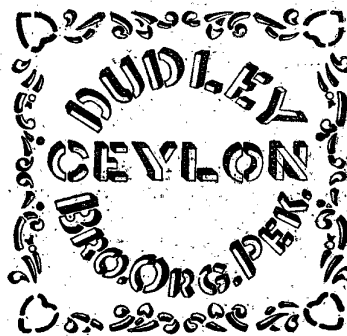

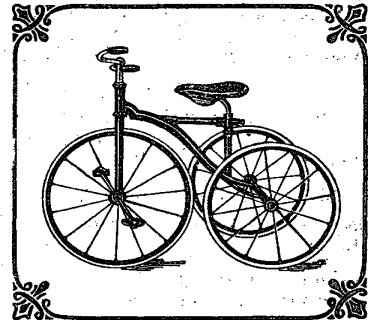
