The by-laws made by the Kandy Municipal Council under sections 109 and 110 of "The Municipal Councils Ordinance, 1910," and published in the *Ceylon Government Gazette* No. 7,745 of November 15, 1929, as amended by Proclamations dated February 13, 1932, and August 30, 1932, published in *Government Gazettes* Nos. 7,907 of February 19, 1932, and 7,942 of September 2, 1932, respectively, are further amended by the addition of the following proviso to existing by-law 298:—

"Provided, however, that the term "bakery" shall not be deemed to include—

- (a) any private residence, or any other place, where any process connected with the baking of bread or the making of cakes or of biscuits, takes place, not for sale but for the purpose of consumption on the premises; or
- (b) any place where any process connected with the baking of bread or the making of cakes or of biscuits takes place, and where the bread or cakes or biscuits so made are sold mainly, if not wholly, for consumption on the premises.

Provided also, that in the latter case it shall be lawful for the Chairman to authorize the use of such premises for the baking of bread or the making of cakes or of biscuits, and to cancel such authorization if the bread or cakes or biscuits so made are not sold mainly for consumption on the premises."

BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

1. No pension, gratuity, or long service allowance shall be granted to any officer of the Matale Urban District Council without the authority of the Governor, in order to obtain which a certificate of good conduct from the Chairman setting out the length of service, age, and ground of retirement must be forwarded, together with the application for pension, gratuity, or retiring allowance, and the computation thereof, through the Commissioner of Local Government to the Controller of Establishments.

2. Subject to the provisions of by-law 1 and the following by-laws, every officer of the Matale Urban District Council on the fixed establishment drawing a salary of Rs. 360 per annum and upwards who shall have had service of ten years or more including any service which may be reckoned under the proviso to by-law 7 may be awarded a pension as follows:—

For the first one hundred and twenty months of such service a pension equal to $120/720$ ths of his annual salary and for each additional completed month of service an additional $1/720$ th of such salary, but no officer shall be entitled to draw more than $480/720$ ths of his final salary as pension.

3. The above-mentioned rates shall only be granted in cases of faithful and meritorious service, but when the testimony as to fidelity, diligence, and merit is in any respect defective, a deduction from such rates may be made. Where there has been obvious negligence, irregularity, or misconduct, the grant of a pension may be altogether withheld.

Where service of peculiar and extraordinary merit has been rendered by an officer distinctly outside the duties in respect of which his salary is paid, a special rate of pension may be recommended for sanction, but in ordinary cases the maximum pension or retiring allowance grantable to an officer under these by-laws, or to an officer entitled to pension also in respect of service not under the Council from all services combined, shall not exceed two-thirds of the highest salary drawn by such officer at any time in the course of his service.

4. In the case of officers on the fixed establishment of the Council drawing a salary of Rs. 360 per annum and upwards retiring on account of illness or age before completing one hundred and twenty months' gross service a gratuity may be granted calculated at the rate of one-twelfth of a month's pay of the permanent office or offices held at the time of retirement, for each completed month of service.

5. Officers of the Matale Urban District Council shall have no absolute right to any pension, gratuity, or long service allowance under these by-laws, and the Matale Urban District Council retains power and authority to dismiss any such officer without any compensation.

6. No pension, gratuity, or long service allowance shall be granted to any officer of the Matale Urban District Council who shall be under fifty-five years of age, except upon a certificate from the Chairman and two medical practitioners that he is incapable from infirmity of mind or body of discharging the duties of his office, nor unless he shall have discharged such duties theretofore with diligence and fidelity to the satisfaction of the Council.

7. The claim of an officer of the Matale Urban District Council to pension, gratuity, or long service allowance shall be considered to have commenced from the date of his first permanent appointment to the fixed establishment of the Council after January 1, 1923, or its predecessor the Matale Local Board.

Provided that an officer transferred from the provisional and temporary establishment to the fixed establishment may be allowed to count his provisional and temporary service when it has been continuous with his subsequent permanent service.

Service under sixteen years of age however will not count for pension.

8. The service in respect of which pensions, gratuities, or long service allowances are granted under these by-laws must in all cases be continuous, unless interrupted by abolition of office or other temporary suspension of employment not arising from misconduct or voluntary resignation of the officer.

9. The pension or gratuity shall be computed upon the salary of the permanent office held by the officer of the Council at the time of his retirement provided he shall have held such appointment for at least three years: otherwise the pension shall be calculated upon the average of salaries attached to the permanent office held by such person during the three years next preceding the commencement of such pension.

10. In case of abolition of office, if the officer has completed 120 months' gross service, he may be granted a pension of $1/720$ th of his salary for each month of his service counting for pension with an addition to such service of one month for each completed period of two months' service, the addition in no case exceeding 60 months.

If the officer has not completed 120 months' gross service he may be granted a gratuity of $1/12$ th of a month's salary for each month of service counting for pension, plus an addition of 50 per cent. thereon. In no case shall the number of months to be added to the actual service exceed that which, if added to the age of the retiring officer, would make that age up to sixty.

11. If any person being in receipt of any pension or long service allowance from the Matale Urban District Council shall be convicted of any offence in any Court of Justice in the Island for which he shall be sentenced to death or to any terms of imprisonment with hard labour exceeding six months such pension or long service allowance shall forthwith determine and cease to be payable, unless such person shall, within three months after his conviction, receive free pardon or unless the Council shall otherwise order.

12. Officers on the fixed establishment of the Matale Urban District Council may be required to retire on or after attaining the age of fifty-five, upon the receipt of twelve months' notice to that effect, but they may continue in office till sixty years of age with the consent of the Council.

13. (1) Every officer who is transferred to or from the service of the Council from or to any other public service and whose aggregate service would have entitled him, had it been wholly under the Council, to a pension under these rules, shall on his ultimate retirement from service, if he has served for a period of at least 12 months under the Council, be entitled to a pension which shall bear the same proportion to that to which he would have been entitled had the whole of his service been under the Council as the *aggregate amount of the salary which he has drawn from the Council bears to the total sum made up of such aggregate amount and the aggregate of the amounts received by him in the course of his public service elsewhere than under the Council.

Provided however, that in the case of an officer who is transferred to the service of the Council after other public service in which the rules regulating pensions do not offer the same privileges to an officer transferred from the Council to such public service as are accorded under these rules to an officer transferred from such public service to the Council and whose aggregate public service under the Council and elsewhere would have entitled him, had it been wholly under the Council, to a pension under these rules, such officer may with the sanction of the Council on his ultimate retirement from public service (provided such retirement takes place from the Council and that he has served for a period of at least five years under the Council) be entitled to receive from the Council, in lieu of a pension calculated in the manner prescribed in the preceding paragraph, a pension representing the difference between the pension or pensions earned by such officer in respect of his public service elsewhere and a pension calculated as if his public service had been wholly under the Council.

(2) For the purposes of this section, the expression “public service” includes employment under the Crown or any Local Government public body or bodies.

14. Should an officer who retires on pension find after such retirement an employment under the Council or under the Government or under another semi-official body on a salary equal to or higher than that which he drew from the Council at the time of his retirement, his pension shall be suspended so long as such employment continues. If he draws a less salary he shall be entitled to only so much of

* The term “aggregate” salary is to be interpreted as the amount of the aggregate salary of the substantive post held by an officer in the course of his career, disregarding extra emoluments such as duty allowances, and regarding leave on half pay or without pay as leave on full salary.

his pension as when added to the salary of the new appointment will make his total emoluments equal to the salary last drawn by him previous to his retirement.

15. Employees on the fixed establishment of the Matale Urban District Council drawing salaries of less than Rs. 360 per annum and retiring on account of age or infirmity after serving continuously for a period of fifteen years and upwards may, if the Council be satisfied that they are unfit, owing to age or infirmity of body or mind, further to discharge efficiently the duties of their offices, be granted such long service allowances not exceeding Rs. 7.50 per mensem in each case as the Council may award. Persons in receipt of daily pay, who have completed a period of fifteen years of continuous service, retiring under similar circumstances may be awarded gratuities calculated at the rate of one-eighteenth of a month's pay drawn at the time of retirement for each completed month's service.

16. If any case not covered by these by-laws shall arise which in the opinion of the Council merits the award of a pension, retiring allowance, or gratuity, the circumstances of such case should be reported together with the recommendation of the Council to the Commissioner of Local Government for transmission to the General Treasury (Establishments Division) for submission to the Governor, who will decide whether any and, if so, what award shall be granted.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended January 28, 1933.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 195 (9 Burghers, 138 Sinhalese, 25 Tamils, 15 Moors, 6 Malays, and 2 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1933, viz., 292,200) was 34.8, as against 45.3 in the preceding week, 36.3 in the corresponding week of last year, and 30.3 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 180 (1 European, 4 Burghers, 112 Sinhalese, 29 Tamils, 24 Moors, 6 Malays, and 4 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 32.1, as against 32.1 in the previous week, 28.0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 24.5 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 180 total deaths, 41 were of infants under one year of age, as against 47 in the preceding week, 30 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 29 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 10.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Twenty-two deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 11 in Maradana hospitals (including 8 deaths of non-residents), 4 in Kotahena South, 3 in Kotahena North, 2 in New Bazaar, and 1 each in San Sebastian and Maradana East, as against 21 in the previous week and 15 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Eleven deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 4 in Slave Island, 2 each in Kotahena South and New Bazaar, and 1 each in St. Paul's, San Sebastian, and Kollupitiya, as against 10 in the previous week and 8 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Four deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 2 in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), and 1 each in St. Paul's and Maradana South, as against 7 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

2. (a) Thirteen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 9 in Maradana hospitals (including 7 deaths of non-residents), 3 in Maradana North and 1 in Kotahena North, as against 11 in the previous week and 11 the weekly average for last year.

(b) One death from *Phthisis* of a resident of Colombo town, occurred at the Anti-Tuberculosis Hospital, Ragama, during the week.

3. Three deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), as against 4 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

"The Dog Registration Ordinance, 1901."

BY-LAWS made by the Nawalapitiya Urban District Council, under sections 5 and 6 of the Dog Registration Ordinance, No. 25 of 1901, and section 245 of the Local Government Ordinance, No. 11 of 1920.

BY-LAWS.

1. In respect of every dog or bitch kept within the limits of the Urban District Council of Nawalapitiya, the person having custody or possession of it shall pay an annual registration fee of 75 cents for every dog and Re. 1.50 for every bitch. For the purpose of this rule a year shall be computed from April 1 of one year to March 31 of the year following.

2. The occupier of every house within the town shall, before January 31 in each year, furnish to the person appointed by the Chairman of the Urban District Council to collect the registration fee (hereinafter called the Collector), particulars required in the annexed Form A in respect of each dog or bitch kept within such house or its premises.

3. A certificate of registration in the Form B shall be issued on payment of the prescribed fee to the aforesaid Collector or to the Secretary of the Urban District Council.

4. The Collector or Secretary (1) may refuse to issue a certificate of registration for any dog or bitch—(a) which, in his opinion, is so diseased as to be a source of infection to other dogs, or (b) which, by reason of age, illness, or injury, is in his opinion unfit to live; or (2) the Collector or Secretary may issue such certificate subject to any conditions he may consider suitable. Any owner dissatisfied with such refusal or conditions may appeal to the Chairman, Urban District Council, who may confirm, modify, or cancel the same.

5. Every certificate of registration shall have the following conditions printed on it, viz.:

This certificate is liable to be cancelled by the Chairman of the Urban District Council, Nawalapitiya—

- Should the dog become so maimed or diseased as to be in the opinion of the Chairman unfit to live; or
- Should the Chairman be satisfied that the dog is habitually ill-treated or neglected by its owner; or
- Should the dog be permitted by its owner to associate with dogs belonging to others at a time when it is suffering from any infectious or contagious disease.

6. The person having the custody or possession of a dog or bitch in respect of which (a) a certificate is refused or (b) its certificate is cancelled because a condition attached thereto has not been complied with, shall, on being noticed to do so, produce the dog at the Urban District Council Office, at the time stated in the notice, and there deliver it to an Officer of the Urban District Council authorized to take charge of it. Such dogs shall then be dealt with in the manner determined by the Chairman.

7. The by-laws made by the Local Board of Nawalapitiya under the Dog Registration Ordinance, No. 25 of 1901, dated July 7, 1913 (*Gazette* No. 6,571 of July 11, 1913), are repealed.

The Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on December 17, 1932, at 8.30 a.m. in accordance with the Notice dated December 12, 1932.

Present : Mr. H. P. Kaufmann, Chairman ; Ratwatte Adigar ; Mr. S. A. Wijayatilake ; Mr. W. A. B. Soysa ; Mr. Walter Beven ; Dr. L. C. Wijesinha.

1. The minutes of proceedings of the meetings held on November 19, 1932, and on December 10, 1932, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and copies thereof furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted :—

(a) Statement of receipts and disbursements from close of 1931, to November 30, 1932, on account of the Municipal Fund.

(b) Progress report of works brought up to the same date.

(c) Health Officer's report for November, 1932.

(d) Statement of cases instituted by the several Inspectors and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of November, 1932.

(e) The reservoir readings for the week ended December 17, 1932.

Resolved that the statement (d), together with the minutes of proceedings of this meeting, as required by section 83 of "The Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910," be forwarded to the Commissioner of Local Government for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table :—

Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, standpipes, and house service taps inspected during November, 1932.

4. Petitions :—

Mr. Soysa presented—(1) Petition signed by K. O. A. Mohideen Adumay and several others praying for a reconsideration of the decision to refuse renewal of licences for the sale of rice in rat-proof bins in certain areas. (2) Petition signed by A. N. Aliyar on the same subject. (3) Petition signed by W. M. John Perera on behalf of the petty traders occupying the market area outside the leased area praying that they be allowed to continue to trade.

Mr. Wijayatilake presented—(4) Petition signed by Mrs. E. Thomasz and Miss L. Jansz asking that the drain passing by premises No. 111A be built by the Council. (5) Petition signed by D. A. Alwis Perera, Collector, asking that his commission be not reduced as per recent order. (6) Petition signed by C. Ranasinghe applying for a piece of land in Reservoir road on lease.

The Chairman agreed to consider the matters referred to in the petitions.

5. Recommendations of Standing Committees :—

Extract from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects held on November 19, 1932.

(1) Proposed amendments to By-law 298 to permit of a private residence, or any other place where bread, cakes, and biscuits are manufactured for consumption on the premises being exempted from licence duty.—Recommended.

Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation held on November 19, 1932.

(2) Papers regarding the proposal to increase the rent of the Grain Shed at the Katukele Model Tenements from Rs. 7.50 to Rs. 17.50.—Recommended to fix the rent at Rs. 17.50 and to auction the Grain Shed.

(3) Papers *re* the proposal to give the next Beef Stall which may fall vacant to Mr. S. M. Mohideen in view of his claim for prior consideration to Beef Stall No. 86, already given to Bastian's widow.—Recommended that the next vacancy be given to Mr. Mohideen in view of his claim for prior consideration in respect of Stall No. 86.

Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment held on November 19, 1932.

(4) To obtain sanction for transfers of votes as follows :—(i.) Rs. 100 from the vote "Legal Expenses" and Rs. 250 from the vote for "Survey of Lands Purchased by the Council" to meet excess on vote for "Lighting the Town Hall and Municipal Offices", Rs. 100; and "Sundry Charges" Rs. 250.—Recommended.

(ii.) Rs. 650 from the vote for "Printing" to meet possible excesses on the vote for "Stationery," Rs. 250; and the vote for "Advertising," Rs. 400.—Recommended.

(5) Papers *re* the claim of the late Sanitary Inspector Abeykoon's mother to a sum of Rs. 218.24, representing the unpaid salary of the deceased for the period June 21 to August 31, 1932.—Recommended.

(6) To obtain sanction for the sum of Rs. 22,871.68 written off in 1930 and 1931 on account of remissions of rates allowed on vacant premises, reductions made as a result of objections to assessment, and refund of excess rates recovered.—Recommended.

(7) Papers relative to the proposal to appoint Mr. Edward Hope as Overseer in succession to Mr. Van Twest on the Permanent Establishment, and memo from Accountant pointing out the necessity to create the post of Overseer by a resolution of Council in terms of section 59 (1) of "The Municipal Councils Ordinance."—Recommended that Mr. Hope be made Head Overseer, but that he be not placed in the Permanent Establishment.

Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works held on December 10, 1932.

(8) Tenders received for breaking, piling, and supplying metal and chips from the Municipal Metal Quarry at Bogambara.—Recommended that Siyatu's tender be accepted.

(9) Application from Mr. D. Hassanally for a water service for premises Nos. 18/19, Castle Hill street.—Not recommended.

(10) To sanction a vote for Rs. 1,500 to meet expenses connected with the sinking of a well and the erection of a temporary tagaram office and store at the site of intake in Peradeniya estate, in connection with investigations of the River Pumping Scheme.—Recommended.

(11) Report dated December 1, 1932, by the Municipal Engineer, on the point raised by Mr. Wijayatilake as to the possibility of reopening the alternate standposts now closed.—Not recommended at present in view of the fact that the reservoir is just spilling.

Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Electricity Committee held on December 10, 1932.

(12) Papers *re* the proposal to waive meter rent for periods during which meters are found to be faulty and for periods during which premises are vacant and the supply of electrical energy to them has been cut off.—Recommended.

(13) Petition from Messrs. K. A. M. P. Meera Saibo & Bros., asking for a reduction of the rate charged from them for each unit of electrical energy consumed at their premises.—Recommended that the writer be informed of the existing scale of charges.

(14) Papers *re* the suggestion made by the Minister for Local Administration on his recent inspection of the Kandy Electric Installation that electric cookers and other power consuming devices intended for domestic use should be given out on small rents covering their depreciation value only.—Recommended that the Municipal Electrical Engineer be authorized to make arrangements with suppliers of electric cookers, &c., to display such apparatus at the Electric Station for sale, the Electricity Department not to be responsible for depreciation.

(15) To obtain sanction for the transfer of a sum of Rs. 1,500 from the vote for "Work Done for Customers—Labour", to the vote for "Work Done for Customers—Materials" to meet possible excesses of expenditure on that vote.—Recommended.

(16) To obtain a vote for Rs. 6.04 to meet Messrs. E. B. Creasy & Co.'s claim in connection with the bonded warehouse charges from August 23 to 31, 1932, paid by them for a package of Bestorite Jointings shipped for the Electricity Department.—Recommended.

Resolved that the recommendations be adopted with the exception of item (9) which was deferred to enable the Chairman to make a personal inspection of the premises.

6. On the Chairman's suggestion the Members agreed to inspect the completed blocks of the Deyannawela Tenements on December 23, at 5 P.M.
