WHEREAS it seems advisable to the Governor to establish in Kudalumulla village in Weligam korale of the District of Matara, Southern Province, a general cemetery for the burial or cremation of the dead within the limits hereinafter specified and defined:

And whereas the Governor may under section 6 (3) of "The Cemeteries and Burjals Ordinance, 1899," as amended by the Cemeteries and Burials Amendment Ordinance, 1931, either wholly or an part exempt any cemetery from the operation of sections 143, 16, 17, and 24:

Now know Ye that We, the Governor, by virtue of the powers vested in Us by Article 93 of the Ceylon State Council) Order in Council, 1931, do hereby under section? 6 (1) of "The Cemeteries and Burials Ordinance 1899/ as amended by the Cemeteries and Burials Amendment Ordinance, 1931, establish, as from the date hereof, a general cemetery on the land described in Schedule A hereto for the burial or cremation of the dead within the limits specified and defined in Schedule B herets.

And We do hereby exempt the said cemetery wholly from the operation of sections 11, 16, 17, and 24 of the lid Ordinance.

SCHEDULE 1.

General By-laws relating to Licences.

- 1. In these by-laws, unless the context otherwise requires—
 - "The Council" means the Municipal Council of Galle; "Chairman" means the Chairman of the Municipal Council of Galle;
 - "Licensee" means the person holding a licence, authorizing the use of any premises or place for any special purpose mentioned in the licence, issued by the Chairman in pursuance of the powers given to him by the Ordinance or any by-law made thereunder;

"Licensed Premises" means the whole of the premises or place in respect of which a licence has been issued by the Chairman;

"Licensable Trade" means a trade for which a licence is necessary under the provisions of the Ordinance or any by-law made thereunder.

2. No person shall within the limits of the Council keep any bakery, eating-house, tea and coffee boutique, dairy, or aerated water factory, without an annual licence from the Chairman.

3. A licence shall be issued by the Chairman only to persons complying with the conditions hereinafter provided

for the issue of such licence.

4. Every such licence shall remain in force until December 31, of the year in respect of which it is issued, unless it shall have been previously cancelled under the provisions of by-law No. 9 or No. 11 of this chapter

5. No licence shall be transferable.

- 6. (1) The licensee shall comply with the lawful requirements of any notice served on him by the Chairman within the time stated in such notice, or if no such time is stated in the notice then within seven days from the service of such notice.
- (2) For the purpose of this by-law any notice, posted to the address of the licensee, or delivered to any person in charge of the licensed premises, shall be deemed to have been duly served on the licensee; and the time of souh posting or delivery shall be the time of service.

7. Every licence shall be subject to such fee as may from time to time be determined by the Council under

section 233 of the Ordinance.

- 8. It shall be lawful for the Chairman, or any officer of the Council generally or specially authorized in writing thereto by the Chairman, to enter upon and inspect at all reasonable times any licensed premises and to inspect any furniture, equipment, vehicle, or utensil, which is or appears to be used for the purposes of the trade which the licence authorizes.
- 9. (1) If at any time during the period for which a licence has been issued, the licensed premises cease to conform to the conditions hereinafter laid down for its issue, the Chairman may by notice in writing direct the licensee to do all things necessary to make the premises conform to such conditions.

(2) Any licensee who fails to comply with the requirements of such notice shall be guilty of an offence and shall obe liable to the penalties specified in by-law No. 10.

- 10. Any person committing a breach of any of these by-laws shall be guilty of an offence and shall on conviction be liable (a) in the case of a first offence, to a fine not exceeding one hundred rupees; (b) in the case of second or subsequent offence, to a fine not exceeding two hundred rupees; and (c) in the case of a continuing offence, to an additional fine not exceeding twenty-five rupees for every day during which the offence is continued after conviction or after written notice from the Chairman of such contravention.
- 11. On a second or subsequent conviction of a licensee for breach of any regulation relating to his licensed premises, in addition to the penalties hereinbefore prescribed, his licence shall be liable to cancellation by the Court.

SCHEDULE II.

Chapter xvii.—Bakeries.

A bakery includes any building or part of a building used for any process connected with the baking of bread and making of cakes and biscuits for sale.

I .-- Conditions of Issue of Licence.

No person shall be entitled to a licence to keep a bakery unless the premises to be licensed comply with the following conditions:—

(1) (a) That the site is approved by the Chairman.

(b) That the premises are in good repair and well ventilated and well lighted, and that every room is provided with windows capable of being opened, the area of which when open shall be not less than one-fifteenth of the superficial floor space.

(c) That the walls of every room in every part are not less than 7 feet in height, and are built of brick, stone, or cabook, with the inside thereof lime-

plastered and limewashed.

(d) That all the eaves are at least 6 feet from the ground.

(e) That the roof is made of some permanent material.

(f) That all the woodwork is oilpainted or limewashed.
(g) That the floor is cemented throughout on a layer

of concrete of not less than 2 in. thickness.

(h) That the premises are provided with adequate drains.

(2) (a) That the room in which kneeding takes place has a superficial floor space of not less than 180 square feet (no side being less than 12 feet in length) and that the lower 4 feet of the internal surface of the walls is covered with glazed tiles or is plastered with cement.

(b) That there is a free external air space not less than 7 feet wide on at least one side of the kneading room, and that the wall on that side

has at least one door or window.

(c) That the door of the oven does not open directly

into the kneading room.

(d) That every kneading room is provided with a ceiling, made of closely fitting boards tongued and grooved and either limewashed or oilpainted or made of such other substance as may be approved by the Chairman.

(e) That the kneading room is rendered fly-proof with shutters of fine-meshed wire-netting fixed to

the windows and doorways.

(f) That all flour stored on the premises is kept in a special rat-proofed room provided with a ceiling of the typed prescribed in clause (d) above.

(g) That the kneading room is provided with spring doors which close automatically when released.

(3) (a) That the troughs, tables, and all the utensils used in the making of bread are capable of being' moved about for the purpose of cleaning the floor and the walls.

(b) That the tops of the tables used in the making of bread are fully covered with one single piece of zinc, marble, or other non-harmful impervious material.

(4) (a) That the premises are provided with a dust bin having a close fitting fly-proof cover or lid, and with sufficient latrine accommodation.

That the bakery is at least 50 feet distant from any pit-latrine, cess-pit, manure heap, rubbish heap, or open sewer.

(c) That the bakery has no internal communications with the interior of any part of a dwelling house.

II.—Regulations for Licensed Bakeries.

- 1. Every licensee of a bakery shall keep affixed in a conspicuous position on the outside of his premises a board with his name and the words "Licensed Bakery" legibly painted thereon.
- 2. Every licensee of a bakery shall cause a copy of these regulations, and of the licence, to be hung in a glass frame in a prominent place in the licensed premises, and shall also cause a list of the names and addresses of all employees (including the vendors of bread) to be kept in the bakery, so as to be available for inspection at all reasonable times by the Chairman or any person authorized by him.
- 3. Twice at least every year, that is to say in the months of June and December, or at such other time or so often as the Chairman may by notice in writing direct, every licensee of a bakery shall cause the walls of every room forming part of the bakery to be limewashed and the ceiling and woodwork to be limewashed or painted.
 - 4. Every licensee of a bakery shall cause—
 - (1) the floor and the tiled or cemented portions of the walls and the tops of all tables to be washed every day;
 - (2) every part of the bakery, furniture, utensils, and all equipment used in the making of bread, to be kept clean and in good repair, and the surroundings and the drains free from effluvia arising therefrom or from any latrine, cesspit, or other similar source on the licensed premises;

- (3) All refuse from the bakery and the rest of the premises, to be immediately placed in an impervious covered receptacle, which shall be removed from the bakery and cleared once a day, and which shall always be kept covered except when refuse is being actually placed therein.
- 5. Every licensee of a bakery shall use, for the manufacture of bread, good and wholesome flour, water, and other materials. He shall store the flour on a movable platform constructed according to the following specifications:—

The platform may be of any convenient length and breadth but shall consist of a single layer of stout planks supported on legs 3 feet high. The legs of the platform shall not be permanently fixed to the floor. The layer of planks above mentioned shall project 9 inches in each direction beyond the supporting frame underneath, so as to prevent rats crawling up the legs and round the edge to the top. There shall be no shelves or recesses under the layer of planks to provide harbour for rats. The platform shall be capable of being moved easily so as to permit of the proper cleaning of the floor underneath. It should be placed at least 9 inches away from the wall. The space beneath and around the platform shall be kept clear of all other goods and free from all obstruction.

6. Every licensee of a bakery shall cause all holes in floor and walls capable of harbouring rats, to be filled up with broken glass and shall plaster them with cement.

7. No person shall on any pretext whatsoever keep any

animal or bird in a bakery.

8. No person shall spit, smoke, or chew betel within the

bakery.

9. (a) No person suffering from skin disease of any kind, and until the periods of infection and of incubation have elapsed, no person suffering from, or who has recently suffered from, any infectious, or contageous disease, or has recently been in attendance on any person suffering from such disease, shall enter the licensed premises or take part in the manufacture or sale of any bread therein, or engage in the transport, sale, or delivery of any broad therefrom.

(b) No licensee of a baltery shall cause, connive at, or permit, the contravention by any person of the provisions

of the above regulation 9 (a)

10. No licensee of a bakery shall store or keep, or allow to be stored, or kept, in the room where bread is prepared or stored, or in which the materials for making bread are stored, any furniture, clothes, sleeping mats, or any articles, other than those used in the manufacture of bread.

as a sleeping place any room or part of the building, or of the floor or storey of the building, in which the bakery is situated, unless such room or part is effectually separated from the places where bread is prepared or stored, or in which the materials thereof are stored, by a partition extending from the floor to the ceiling, and unless such room or part is provided with an external window the area of which when open shall be not less than one-fifteenth of the superficial floor area of such room or part.

12. All persons employed in the preparation and making of bread, shall wash their hands before engaging in the process of making bread, and shall wear clean white aprons covering the chest and body and a clean white cap or turban.

13. Every licensee of a bakery shall provide clean water, clean towels, nail brush and soap on the premises and keep them so as to be easily accessible to those engaged in the manufacture of bread.

14. Every licensee of a bakery shall provide the licensed premises with a sufficient supply of wholesome water.

15. No licensee of a bakery shall expose, or cause to be exposed, for sale in the licensed premises any bread unless such bread is kept in clean properly constructed glass cases free from flies, dust, and vermin.

16. Every licensee of a bakery shall cause all bread, other than fancy bread, rolls, biscuits, or confectionery, to be stamped with figures denoting its correct weight, viz.:—

1 lb., 1 lb., 2 lb., or 4 lb., as the case may be.

He shall not sell or expose for sale any bread other than fancy bread, rolls, biscuits, or confectionery, which shall not have one of the aforesaid weights stamped on it or which shall be found to weigh less than the weight stamped thereon.

17. Every licensee of a bakery shall cause to be fixed in a conspicuous place in the licensed premises a beam and scales with standard weights, and, if required by any purchaser, shall weigh any bread sold or exposed for sale in the said premises.

18. No licensee of a bakery shall allow any person to transport bread or other food from his bakery for sale, unless such person is in possession of a card of registration

signed by the Chairman. The licensee shall keep a register of those to whom cards have been so issued, and shall notify the Medical Officer of Health of the dismissal, discharge, or retirement of any such person.

19. The Chairman shall on application made to him by the licensee of a bakery, issue a card of registration to every person employed by such licensee in transporting bread for sale, provided that such person has been examined and passed as free from disease by the Medical Officer of Health.

20. (1) No person shall sell, offer, hawk, or expose bread for sale unless he has in his possession a card of registration issued by the Chairman as aforesaid for the current year and unless the name of the licensee at whose request the card was issued is still on the register at the time of the sale, hawking, or exposing of the bread for sale.

(2) It shall be an offence for any person selling or hawking or exposing bread for sale, to fail or refuse to produce his card of registration for inspection on demand by a Municipal

Inspector.

(3) Any such person so failing or refusing may be arrested forthwith by such Municipal Inspector who shall convey him forthwith to the nearest Police Station, and the officer in charge of such Police Station shall deal with such person as if he had been arrested by a Police Officer without a warrant under the provisions of the Criminal Procedure Code.

21. No licensee of a bakery shall allow any bread or other preparation to be transported from his licensed premises for sale, except in a closed vehicle or a closed basket, tin, or other suitable receptacle. The licensee shall examine such vehicle, basket, tin, or other receptacle, and shall satisfy himself that it is clean and in good condition before he allows such transport.

THE IRRIGATION ORDINANCE, No. 45 OF 1917.

RULES under section 12 of the Irrigation Ordinance, No. 45 at 1917, made at a meeting duly held on August 27, 1932, by the prescribed majority of the proprietors within the arrigable area of Okkampitive-els irrigation work in the District of Badulla, Province of Uva, and approved The Governor by virtue of the powers vested in Man by section 19 of the said Ordinance and by Article 93 of the Zeylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931.

Rules Referred to.

The cultivation of fields under the Okkapitiya-ela shall be confined to one season.

2. (a) Cultivation shall take place between January 1

and September 30 each rear.

(b) The first ploughing of the fields shall be completed by February 28 each year.

(c) The ridging and second ploughing of the fields shall be

completed by March 31 each year.

(d) The sowing of fields shall be completed by April 30 each year.

3. During the period resetved for general repairs and maintenance of the works, viz. from October I to December 31, inclusive each year, no water shall be taken or used for irrigation or for any purpose other than that of drinking.

4. No person other than the officer in charge of the work or some person deputed by him, shall open or interfere with the sluices of the irrigation work or channels or issue

water therefrom. 5. The manager of fields shall furnish the irrigation headmen, within 15 days before commencing cultivation. with a list of persons who have been employed as goiyas,

showing the extent which each goiya cultivates. 6. It shall be the duty of the vel-vidanes to make written application to the irrigation officer for water stating the area requiring water, and they shall take action to prevent

any waste of the water issued thereupon.

7. It shall be the duty of each of the proprietors whose lands are irrigable from any Government channel to construct, in accordance with the directions and specifications given in that behalf, such part of the subsidiary channels required to irrigate the lands as may be marked out by the officer in charge of the work as the share proportionate to the holding of such proprietor.

8. All field channels shall be maintained in good order by the proprietors whose lands are irrigable thereby, and it shall be their duty to have their channels cleared before every cultivation, and to maintain them clear during the cultivation, and in the event of any default it shall be lawful for the Government Agent to cause the work to be done and to recover the cost thereof from the defaulter.

9. No person shall construct any dam across any channel except on instructions from the officer in charge of

the work.

10. Each cultivator shall erect a proper watch hut adjoining the field cultivated by him before sowing has commenced, and shall watch regularly until the crop is reaped and gathered, although his own paddy may have

been reaped earlier.

11. It shall be the duty of each of the proprietors and cultivators of the lands irrigated by any water-course, to which any sudden or unforeseen damage has accidently been caused, on being given reasonable notice thereof by the officer in charge of the work through the vel-vidane, by beat of tom-tom or otherwise, to attend at the place indicated and to contribute labour towards the repair of such damage, in person or by substitute, until the work is completed.

12. It shall be the duty of the irrigation headmen elected or appointed under section 20 of the Ordinance to regulate the use of any water issued by the irrigation officer from the Government channels or other sources, to supervise the cultivation of lands under the work and generally

to enforce the observance of these rules.

13. Each of the proprietors of the lands under sultivation shall pay a huwandiram to the vel-vidane at the rate of 6 kurunies for each amunam sown: and the vel-vidane shall make over to the maha-ela vidane one quarter of the foregoing rate, that is to say, one and a half kurunies out of the huwandiram recovered by him in respect of each amunam sown.

Provided that in any case where the Government Agent has disallowed any portion of the huwandiram due to any vel-vidane or maha-ela vidane who has been guilty of neglect of duty, only the remaining portion shall be payable by each proprietor to such vel-vidane, or by the vel-vidane to such maha-ela vidane.

14. Such huwandiram shall be paid, and a receipt obtained therefor, by each proprietor before any part of

his harvest is removed from the threshing-floor.

15. The question of constructing any new channel that may be required shall be decided by the majority of the proprietors, subject to the right of the minority to appeal to the Village Council: and in the event of such an appeal, the decision of the Council shall be final.

16. If any new channel or any part thereof, decided upon as aforesaid, has to pass through the fields of one or more of the proprietors, it shall be the duty of each such proprietor to open and construct that part of the channel

which falls within his field.

17. If any new channel or any part thereof, decided upon as aforesaid, falls outside the fields under cultivation, it shall be the duty of each of the proprietors to contribute, towards the construction of it, labour proportionate to his holding.

18. Except for agricultural purposes no cattle shall be admitted into or allowed to remain in the area under cultivation until the crop has been reaped and removed.

THE IRRIGATION ORDINANCE, No. 45 of 1917.

RULES under section 11 of the Irrigation Ordinance, No. 45 of 1917, made by the prescribed majority of the proprietors within the irrigation districts of Maritime pattus, Vavuniya South, and Vavuniya North in the Northern Province, at meetings duly held on December 6, 12, and 14, 1932, respectively, and approved by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 19 of the said Ordinance and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931.

Ministry of Agriculture and Lands, Colombo, February 13, 1933.

Rules made under Section 11 of Ordinance No. 45 of 1917 by the Proprietors of the Irrigation Districts of Vavuniya South, Vavuniya North, and Maritime Pattus in Mullaittivu District, Northern Province.

1. The term "irrigation work" in the following rules shall include all Crown tanks and Crown springs the water

of which is utilized for irrigation.

2. Subject to the terms of any schemes framed and sanctioned under Chapter VI. of the Ordinance, each of she proprietors of the lands irrigated by an irrigation work thall be entitled to a share of the water in proportion to his holding.

3. (1) Kama Vidanes elected or appointed under Chapter IV. of the Ordinance shall hold office for two years.
(2) At the expiry of their terms of office they shall be

eligible for re-election or reappointment.

4. (1) The Kama Vidane appointed for the area under any tank shall be entitled to a commission of 1½ per cent.

of the crop raised by each proprietor of lands in that area, and this commission shall be paid at the threshing-floor before any paddy is removed.

(2) The Kama Vidane appointed for any area under any irrigation work other than a tank shall be entitled only

to 1 per cent. commission.

(3) The whole or any portion of this commission may be withheld if, in the opinion of the Assistant Government Agent, the duties of the Kama Vidane concerned have not been properly performed and may be paid to any person who has acted for the Kama Vidane if the Assistant Govern-

ment Agent so orders.

5. For the purpose of the restoration and maintenance of the irrigation work or of such parts of it as are not under the immediate care and management of the Director of Irrigation, every proprietor of paddy land under the irrigation work shall, in respect of the land owned by him, be liable to contribute annual labour at the rate of two days' labour for each of the first five units of land owned by him and at the rate of one day's labour for each additional unit, the unit being defined as the extent of land on which one bushel of paddy is ordinarily sown, and any fraction of a unit being reckoned as a unit for the purposes of this rule.

6. A day's labour shall be considered to be 8 hours of work, viz., from 7 A.M. to 11 A.M. and from 1 P.M. to 5 P.M. One cube of earthwork shall be considered equivalent to 2 days' labour unless the Assistant Government

Agent in any special case decides otherwise.

7. On the publication of a notice issued in that behalf by the Assistant Government Agent, it shall be the duty of each of the proprietors liable to contribute labour to commence on such date, and to complete within such period, as may be specified in the notice, any share of the work that may be marked out and apportioned to him by the Irrigation Sub-Inspector or the Udaiyar.

8. Within one month of the date fixed for the commencement of the labour any proprietor may commute any labour to which he may be liable for a money payment, at a rate fixed in the notice in accordance with the rate prevailing

in the district at the time.

9. In addition to the ordinary annual labour as above provided for, whenever the Assistant Government Agent shall consider it necessary to call out labour to perform an urgent work of repair or of prevention of impending damage, uncommutable labour either in person or by substitute shall at once be furnished by every proprietor and continued daily until the completion of the work.

10. In any case of default under rule 5 or rule 9 the equivalent money value of the work in default shall be recovered from the defaulter, in addition to any fine that may be imposed on him under section 29 and 31 of the Ordinance, and shall be disposed of in the same manner

as the commutation money.

11. When the bund, bund reservation, and spills of the tank, or any dam or anicut, have been marked out and assigned proportionately to their holdings among the proprietors, each proprietor shall keep the portion assigned to him free from jungle, brushwood, and overgrowth of every description, and from white ants' nests, and shall carry out the necessary work twice a year in the months of February and September:

Provided that this rule shall not apply to any part of any irrigation work the maintenance of which is for the time being in the hands of the Director of Irrigation.

12. Any proprietor may apply to the Assistant Government Agent to exempt his land from all liability in respect of annual labour for any sufficient reason.

13. No person shall in any way interfere with an irrigation work or any part thereof, except with the permission of or under the orders of the Assistant Government Agent or any officer acting under his orders.

14. The spill of a tank shall not be blocked without the

permission of the Assistant Government Agent.

15. No cut or breach shall be made in any bund without the permission of the Assistant Government Agent, except in urgent cases where such action is necessary for the prevention of damage to some more vital spot. In all such cases any action taken shall be reported to the Assistant Government Agent at once.

16. (1) Water from an irrigation work shall not be allowed to flow from field to field but channels shall be constructed through the fields in such a way as to enable each proprietor to lead water direct from the work to his share or field.

(2) Such channels shall be called main channels.

17. Subsidiary channels shall be constructed to take the water from the main channels to each bed of a field, except where owing to the situation or size of the land to be irrigated the Assistant Government Agent is satisfied that no waste of water will result from allowing the water from the main channel to flow from bed to bed.

18. The construction and repair of each channel shall be carried out by the proprietors benefited by the channel, each of whom shall be responsible for the portion of the channel passing through his field, and, in addition, to such portion of the channel outside the fields or passing through the fields not benefited, as may be allotted to each by the Kama Vidane in proportion to his holding under that channel:

Provided that this rule shall not apply to any channel maintained for the time being by the Director of Irrigation.

19. Where the Assistant Government Agent has ordered the construction of a channel for the irrigation of any land, no water shall be issued from the work for the irrigation of that land until such channel has been constructed.

20. Where irrigation from bed to bed is allowed, no person shall wilfully prevent the share of water due to the fields below his own from flowing to those fields.

21. Where it is necessary, for the prupose of irrigating the lands below, to open a channel through the land of a proprietor who will not be benefited thereby, such proprietor shall be bound to allow the construction of such channel without compensation.

22. (1) All channels shall be properly cleared and repaired before water is issued through them, and shall be

so maintained throughout the cultivation.

(2) In the event of any default in this respect the Kama Vidane may refuse to issue water or may himself cause the work to be done and recover the cost under section 29 (2) of the Ordinance.

(3) Water may be refused to lands on which in the opinion of the Udaiyar the ridges are not in a proper

state of repair.

- 23. The distribution of water from the work through the fields shall be under the control of the Kama Vidane, and no person shall issue, distribute, cut off, divert, or use the water in any manner except under the direction of, or with the consent of, the Kama Vidane.
- 24. Except where distribution gates are provided and maintained by Government, the proprietors benefited shall erect and maintain the necessary dams for the distribution of water.
- 25. (1) Each proprietor shall be allowed to take water by turns, at such intervals and for such number of hours as may be determined by the Kama Vidane in consultation with the proprietors.

(2) If any proprietor fails to utilize the water during his turn he shall forfeit that turn.

26. No proprietor shall allow the water to run to waste or misappropriate his neighbour's water through the ridges.

27. Without the sanction of the Assistant Government Agent first had and obtained, it shall not be lawful (1) for any person to issue the water of one tank for any cultivation under any other tank; or (2) for the proprietors of lands cultivated under one tank to utilize for their cultivation the water of any other tank.

28. The proprietors of lands cultivated under one tank who require for their cultivation a supply of water from another tank, shall make their application to the Assistant Government Agent, who after due inquiry may grant permission therefor, and may at his discretion call upon the applicants to deposit to the credit of the tank from which the water is to be issued such sum as he may specify as value of the water drawn off.

29. Where it is necessary to bale the water from the tank, all the proprietors shall join in the work, even though some have already had their turn of water without baling.

- 30. Before the commencement of each season it shall be decided by a majority of proprietors, as defined in the Ordinance, at a meeting to be held for the purpose and presided over by the Chief Headman or Udaiyar, what lands under the work are to be cultivated and by what date cultivation should be completed.
- 31. All high lands and lands situated at a distance from the irrigation work and all lands not fully asweddumized shall be cultivated for Kalapokam: if they are not so cultivated, they may not be cultivated for any other season during the year without the permission of the Assistant Government Agent which shall be granted only on adequate grounds.
- 32. The arrangements for cultivating each of the several tracts under the work shall be determined at a special meeting to be held for that purpose; and such meeting shall decide also upon the kind of paddy to be sown and the dates by which ploughing, sowing, and all cultivation duties are to be completed, provided that it shall not have the power to postpone the date fixed for completion of cultivation by the general meeting held under rule 30.

33. (1) No tank bed shall be cultivated without a

permit.

(2) If the majority at the general meeting held under rule 30 decide to cultivate the tank bed, and a permit in that behalf has been issued to them by the Assistant

Government Agent, each proprietor shall be entitled to a share of such tank bed in proportion to his share of improved land under the tank.

(3) Such proprietors shall be entitled to a permit only if the Irrigation Sub-Inspector certifies that they have either performed or commuted the labour due from them in respect of the tank for the year.

- (4) To prevent damage to any crop cultivated in the tank bed as aforesaid, water shall not be let out from the tank except with the special permission of the Assistant Government Agent first had and obtained. Provided that in cases of great emergency when reference to the Assistant Government Agent is impracticable special permission given by the Chief Headman shall be deemed to be sufficient.
- 34. The bed of any Major Tank in charge of the Director of Irrigation shall be cultivated only under permits obtained in accerdance with General Order 1166.

-35. (1) For the Kalapokam season every proprietor shall be entitled to cultivate his land and to obtain water so long as a sufficient supply is available in the tank.

- (2) Any proprietor who cultivates land which it was decided at the meeting not to cultivate or in respect of which no meeting was held, shall be deemed to do so at his own risk; and the other shareholders shall not be bound to assist him in the performance of his cultivation duties, and it shall be lawful for the Kama Vidane to refuse to issue water to him after the rains are over, if it appears that such issue will cause a shortage of water for any cultivation commenced in accordance with the decision of the meeting.
- 36. (1) If after the Kalapokam rains have ceased it appears that there is insufficient water for the whole area cultivated in accordance with the decision of the meeting the proprietors shall, at a meeting duly convened by the Udaiyar, decide what lands are to be abandoned; and the proprietors of the abandoned lands shall thereupon be given a share in the crop off the rest of the land in proportion to the portion abandoned, and they shall continue to be liable for their share of the cultivation duties for that season.

(2) In the event of the proprietors not coming to a decision, the Chief Headman shall decide what lands are to be abandoned.

- (3) Any proprietor aggrieved by the decision of the majority of the proprietors or of the Chief Headman may appeal to the Assistant Government Agent, whose decision shall be final.
- 37. (1) It any proprietor fails to cultivate his share for Kalapokam it may be cultivated by any other proprietor, or if no proprietor is willing to undertake cultivation, by a non-proprietor with the written permission of the Chief Headman.
- (2) Such cultivators shall perform the cultivation duties during the season, but shall not be liable to pay any rent to the owner or to perform annual labour.
- 38. (1) If at the time of the meeting for the Idaipokam or Sirupokam cultivation there appears to be insufficient water to irrigate the whole land under the work, it shall be lawful for the proprietors at such meeting to select a block or blocks of land in one or more tracts for cultivation for that season.
- (2) Every proprietor who at the meeting expresses his willingness to join in the cultivation shall be entitled to a share in such cultivation in proportion to his holding of improved land under the tank.
- (3) No other proprietor shall have any share in such cultivation, nor shall any other land be cultivated, except with the permission given at a specially convened meeting of the majority of the proprietors who at the original meeting undertook the cultivation:

Provided that in the Sinhalese district, a proprietor shall be entitled to have a share of the cultivation only. in the tract in which he owns a share of land, and that where it has been decided to cultivate a tract or tracts in which any proprietor owns no land, such proprietor shall not be entitled to any share in the cultivation.

Provided further that in the Maritime pattus division, each proprietor shall cultivate only his own land and shall not be entitled to claim any share in the crop raised on any other lands.

39. No proprietor shall be entitled to object to the use of any land for cultivation as laid down in rule 38.

40. (1) If any land has been cultivated otherwise than in accordance with the dates and description of paddy decided on at the meetings held under rules 30 and 32 and consequently water is issued to that land for Kalapokam cultivation after the commencement of Idaipokam cultivation in other parts of the same tract, no share in the Idaipokam cultivation shall be given to the proprietor in respect of such land.

(2) Similarly, no share in Sirupokam cultivation shall be given in respect of lands to which water for Iadipokam crops has been issued after the commencement of the Sirupokam cultivation.

41. (1) Except as provided for in rule 38, for the Kalapokam cultivation all the proprietors shall be liable to perform cultivation duties, whether they cultivate their own lands or not.

(2) For the Idaipokam and Sirupokam cultivation only

those who join in the cultivation shall be liable.

42. All the proprietors shall continue to perform the cultivation duties until all the paddy in the field has been reaped, provided that the decisions as to dates arrived at the meeting have not been infringed by those whose crop is late.

43. If a proprietor sows a kind of paddy which takes longer to mature than the kind which it was decided at the meeting to sow, or if he has sown later than the time fixed at the meeting, the other cultivators shall not be bound to perform the cultivation duties for a longer period

than 14 days after their crop is reaped.

44. (1) All proprietors shall complete their sowing and all cultivation duties by the dates fixed at the meeting, or such later dates as may have been fixed by the Chief Headman in special cases with the approval of the Assistant

Government Agent.
(2) If any proprietor has sown his share by the date

fixed at the meeting, no extension of the time fixed for fencing the field shall be allowed.

(3) If, after an extension of time has been allowed, it is necessary to abandon any cultivation under rule 36, any proprietor who has sown his share before the date originally fixed shall be entitled to his full share of the water and shall not be bound to allow the late cultivators any share in his crop.

45. (1) Each proprietor who employs Varakkudis or cultivators shall deliver to the Kama Vidane, before the date for the completion of the sowing, a list of the Varakkudis or cultivators whom he proposes to employ during

that season.

(2) This list shall be signed by the proprietor and by the Varakkudis or cultivators in the presence of two witnesses.

(3) From the date of delivery of this list the Varakkudis or cultivators as well as the proprietor shall become liable to perform cultivation duties during that season.

46. (1) The Kama Vidane shall measure up the total length of fence to be erected and shall apportion the share to be erected by each proprietor in proportion to his holding whether the fence adjoins the field of such proprietor or not.

Provided (i.) that in the Vavuniya North and Maritime pattus divisions, the proprietor of each land shall erect only that portion of the fence which adjoins his own land, and no responsibility for fencing shall lie on the proprietor of any land which does not adjoin the fence; (ii.) that in the Sinhalese district each proprietor shall be responsible for the erection and the maintenance of the portion of the boundary fence adjoining his share; (iii.) that wherever the proprietor at either end of the field holds an additional strip of land called Elapata, in consideration of the extra fencing that he is required to provide, such proprietor shall be solely responsible for the end or Elapata fence; and that where it is not customary to allow such an additional strip of land, the fence at each end of the field shall be divided between the proprietors of the respective halves of the field; (iv.) and that in the Tamil division wherever it is customary for the shareholders of the land adjoining the fence to erect and maintain the fence adjoining their share, such shareholders shall be bound to continue the fencing duties, unless at a duly constituted meeting of the shareholders it is decided to introduce the provisions of this rule.

(2) Proprietors shall erect the fence of stakes or thorns as ordered by the Kama Vidane, and shall maintain it until after the crop is reaped.

47. Outside the portion of the fence maintained by him, each proprietor shall keep clear a path for the passage of cattle.

48. (1) Where there is a common fence between two velies the proprietors of both velies shall join in erecting it, if both velies are cultivated.

(2) If only one veli is cultivated, the proprietors of that veli shall erect the fence and may remove it after the harvest, unless the proprietors of the other veli wish to retain it and are prepared to pay half the cost.

49. (1) The Kama Vidane shall arrange for the erection

of watch huts according to custom.

(2) Every proprietor shall be bound to erect a watch hut and to keep regular watch; but in the case of small holdings the Kama Vidane may make arrangements to enable the proprietors to share this duty.

(3) In the case of large holdings the Kama Vidane is empowered to order the proprietor to erect as many watch huts as may be necessary for the protection of the field.

50. Watching shall commence as soon as the sowing is over: the hours for watching are from 6 P.M. to 5 A.M. unless otherwise arranged at the meeting under rule 30 or 32 by the majority of the shareholders.

51. Each proprietor shall have a share in one of the

threshing-floors in accordance with custom.

52. The threshing-floor shall be kept fenced and watched until all the stacks have been threshed; and each proprietor shall be responsible for his share of these duties.

53. No proprietor shall permit jungle to grow or to remain on land belonging to him within any tract of fields

under an irrigation work.

54. If any proprietor neglects to carry out any irrigation duty within the time specified at the meeting, the Chief Headman may order the Kama Vidane or Udaiyar to have the necessary work done by hired labour and may recover the cost under sections 28 and 29 of the Ordinance.

55. No paddy shall be removed from the field until the share due to the Kama Vidane under rule 4 has been paid to him, or three days' notice of such removal has been

given to the Kama Vidane.

56. Except when the fields are in crop, each proprietor shall be entitled to a right of way through the lands of other proprietors, so far as is necessary for the passage of cattle for ploughing and of carts for removing paddy and straw.

57. (1) Any public cart track running through or adjoining any field or any reservation set apart for such track, not maintained by the Public Works Department, the Irrigation Department, the Provincial Road Committee, the District Road Committee or the Village Committee, shall be constructed, repaired, and maintained by the proprietors of the fields to be benefited thereby.

(2) In the event of any dispute the decision of the Assistant Government Agent as to who are the proprietors

benefited, shall be final and conclusive.

58. (1) All buffaloes shall be driven to a reasonable distance from the field during the cultivation season, and shall have wooden bells attached to their necks, and all known fence breakers or dangerous animals shall be yoked with others.

(2) All neat cattle, goats, and sheep shall be herded during the day and folded during the night outside the fields, and if in any village a place has been selected and appointed for the purpose after due inquiry by the Assistant Government Agent, no proprietor shall during the cultivation season fold his buffaloes, cattle, goats, or sheep in any place nearer to the tank, field, or village than that so selected and appointed.

(3) Proprietors of buffaloes, neat cattle, goats, and sheep shall not suffer their cattle, goats, or sheep to trespass on the fields of any neighbouring village, nor shall they fold their cattle or drive them to pasture near the fields, or within the limits, of any neighbouring village during the cultivation season.

59. Rules 5, 7, 8, 9, 10, 12, 14, 15, and 22 shall not apply to any irrigation work, or part thereof, in charge of

the Director of Irrigation.

60. When the foregoing rules are applicable to any irrigation work in the Sinhalese division, "Korala" shall be read for "Udaiyar," "Vel-Vidane" for "Kama Vidane," "Maha" for "Kalapokam," "Meda" for "Idaipokam," and "Yala" for "Sirupokam".

(b) by any omnibus or lowry with a special permit issued by the Chairman for the purpose of removing furniture or household goods to or from a house standing on such road;

(c) by any service lorry not exceeding 1 ton in weight when fully loaded and equipped, a service lorry for the purpose of these regulations being defined as a lorry maintained and employed by any trading firm or shop solely for the purpose of delivering parcels of goods to customers;

(d) by any service lorry, exceeding 1 ton but not exceeding 1½ tons in weight, in respect of which an annual fee of Rs. 25 has been paid and a permit in that behalf obtained from the Chairman.

3. No omnibus or lorry shall be driven at a greater speed than 12 miles per hour on any street, road, or thoroughfare within this urban area.

4. Motor cars, other than omnibuses or lorries, shall not be driven at a greater speed than 15 miles per hour on any street road, or thoroughfare within this urban area.

The General Regulations for Air Mails published by Notification dated December 18, 1931, in Government Gazette No. 7,899 of December 23, 1931, are hereby amended by the deletion of rule 4 and the note subjoined and the substitution therefor of the following:—

4. In addition to postage, at the rate applicable to the class of article, an air fee is payable on articles for the air mail. No article, other than an article addressed to the United Kingdom, on which the full air fee is not prepaid shall be transmitted by air. Double the postage, or deficiency on account of postage, shall be collected from the addressee in the case of an article for which postage is not prepaid or is insufficiently prepaid.

(a) Articles for transmission by air mail, addressed to the United Kingdom, shall be so transmitted even though the air fee and postage are not prepaid at all, but double the deficiency shall be collected from the addressee on

delivery of the article.

(b) Senders of insufficiently prepaid or unpaid articles shall pay double the deficiency if for any reason such articles are returned as undeliverable.

Note.—The air fee varies according to the route and country of destination. The fee for any particular/country or route can be ascertained from the "Post Office Guide" or the Air Mail leaflet.

MUNICIPAL COUNCIL. COLOMBO THE

General Meeting.

Wednesday, January 11, 1933, at 3 p.m.

THE Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice, dated January 4, 1933.

Present:—Mr. W. L. Murphy, B.A., C.C.S., Chairman; Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader; Dr. E. V. Ratnam; Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando; Dr. E. A. Corey; Mr. N. R. Blande; Mr. M. L. M. Reyal; Dr. S. Muttiah; Mr. T. C. Dyball; Mr. F. Dadabhoy, J.P.; Mr. F. J. Soenszi; Liew.-Colonel N. W. Napier-Clavering, D.S.O., R.E.; Mr. A. E. Goonesinha, M.S.C.; Mr. Aelian W. Pereira; Mr. A. B. A. Razik; Mr. G. K. Thornhill; Mr. H. K. de Kretser; and Mr. C. S. Richards.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of December 7 and of the Special Meeting of December 14, 1932, having been previously printed and copies thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read.

Resolved that the Minutes of the General Meeting of December 7 and of the Special Meeting of December 14, 1932, be confirmed.

- 2. Pursuant to notice, Mr/A. E. Goonesinha presented a petition from Mr. S. Sivagurunathan, Draughtsman, Assessing Department, whose services were discontinued, owing to ill-health, praying that he be reinstated in the place rendered vacant by the death of Mr. G. paniel, and moved that it be placed before the Finance Committee for consideration.
- 3. Pursuant to notice, Mr. Al R. A. Razik presented a petition from his constituents of Urugodawatta, praying that the name "Urugodawatta road ' be altered to either "Stace Place" or "Stace road" in memory of the previous Mayor of Colombo, and moved that it be referred to the appropriate Committee for consideration.
- 3A. The Chairman made the following statement regarding the outbreak of smallpox in the City:—Before we proceed with the agenda, I wish, with the permission of the House, to make a brief statement on the present position as regards the smallpox epidemic in the city. A report has been received from the Council's Health Officers tracing in detail the course of the epidemic and describing the action taken to combat it, and copies of this report have been tabled for members' information. It will be seen that the disease was introduced from India about 2 months ago. The first case brought to the notice of the Health Authorities was reported by Dr. Ratnam, who had been called in to attend on the patient, a new arrival from India. Thanks to the action taken only two persons were infected from this particular case. Meanwhile, a separate focus of infection, presumably started by some other case from India, that was not reported, had been established in the neighbourhood for the Fish Market. House to house investigation was at once started in this area and several cases were detected. Many of these cases were vagrants with no fixed abode, and as some of them were in an advanced stage of the disease it was realized that the infection had in all probability been fairly widely disseminated and an intensive campaign of vaccination and house to house inspection was commenced throughout the city. As a result several fresh centres of infection were discovered. Up to date cases have occurred in about 20 different localities and 17 cases have been reported in persons of no fixed abode. The total number of city cases so far has been 59 in 1932, and 14 in 1933, making 73 in all. The mymber of vaccinations, including those roughly estimated at about 15,000 carried amount of reluctance to being vaccing ted has been encountered in certain localities, but on the whole the response has been very good and the press has been particularly helpful in this direction. The present position may be regarded as fairly satisfactory; there have been nothers ases in the last four days; but it would be premature to assume that further outbreaks may not occur owing to the concealment of cases and as in the case of vagrants, of whom several have been affected, it is impossible to trace all contacts. There can, therefore, be no relaxation of precautionary measures and anyone who has not yet been successfully vaccinated is strongly advised to have it done at once. The bulk of the vaccination work has, of course, been carried out by the Government Medical Department, on which this duty is laid under the Vaccination Ordinance of 1886. And anyone can obtain free vaccination by applying at any of the city vaccine stations or at the Port Surgeon's Office. Free vaccination is also carried out at present by the Medical Officers in charge of the various Municipal Dispensaries where the Medical Officers are now on duty between 7.30 and 11 a.m., and in the afternoon between I and 4. House to house vaccination in the infected areas is being done by the Manicipal staff with a few assistants lent by the Medical Department. The Medical Officer of Health and his staff have had to cope with a serious situation, and I think the Council may congratulate them on the capable way in which they are handling it.
- Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando moved that the Chairman's statement re smallpox be placed before the Four Standing Committees for consideration. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried.
 - 4. Pursuant to notice, Mr. Aelian W. Pereira asked the following questions which the Chairman answered:—
- (1) Q.—Was a monopoly to import goats and sheep granted to the agent of the Madura Company? A.—Sole licences to import goats and sheep from India were granted to the Agent of the Madura Company.
 - (2) Q.—If so, on whose authority was it done? A.—On the Chairman's authority.
- (3) Q.—Had the Agent of the Madura Company imported goats and sheep from India before the restriction of (1) importation was introduced? A.—No.
 - (4) Q.—If not, on whose recommendation and for what reasons was a licence given to him and to him only? A.—On the recommendation of the Municipal Veterinary Surgeon, as a workable arrangement and one likely to cause least inconvenience to the trade.
 - (5) Q.—Was the attention of the Chairman drawn to the existence of certain others represented by Mr. J. A. Perera, Proctor, who claimed to be importers? A.—Mr. J. A. Perera made subsequent representations on behalf of others claiming to be importers after the licences for December had been granted.
 - (6) Q.—Were the claims of these others investigated by the Chairman? A.—They have been investigated.
 - (7) Q.—Did the Chairman satisfy himself that these others were not importers? A.—No, I am not satisfied that they are not importers.
 - (8) Q.—Why was the resolution of the Four Standing Committees of this Council passed on December 5, 1932, Frecommending the grant of licences to bona fide importers, not given effect to in respect of the licences for the month of January, 1933? A.—Numerous applications were received from different persons claiming to be bonu fide importers. namely, the dealers, the 4 importing agencies, and even butchers, and in view of the difficulty of deciding to which set of applicants licences should be issued in terms of the resolution of the Four Standing Committees, it was decided as a purely temporary measure to continue the December arrangement pending further reference to the Committees.
 - (9) Q.—On whose authority was the following notice published by the Municipal Veterinary Surgeon on December 22, 1932 :---

NOTICE.

To Applicants for Licences to Import Goats.

On instructions received, the licences for the importation of Indian goats for the month of January, 1933, has been issued to the Madura Company, Tuticorin, who will import goats as previously.

Regarding the February supply information will be given at a later date.

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A.—On the Chairman's authority.

- (10) Q.—Why was a licence granted to the Madura Company for importation during January, 1933, in spite of the recommendation of the Four Standing Committees to the contrary? A.—See answer to (8).
- (11) Q.—Is it true that the Municipal Veterinary Surgeon is determined to grant licences to the Madura Company or their nominees, the four firms who form the Cattle Brokers Association, on the only ground, in the case of the latter, that their names appear in the Customs Registers as Importers? A.—No. The Municipal Veterinary Surgeon will, of course, conform to with whatever instructions are given to him.
 - (12) Q.—Are these four firms in fact importers? A.—Yes.
- (13) Q.—Did they not call themselves, in a communication addressed to the Minister of Agriculture, the accredited agents of the importers? A.—Actually they described themselves as the accredited agents of the traders.
- (14) Q.—Is the Municipal Veterinary Surgeon aware that these four firms called themselves the accredited agents for the importers? A.—See reply to (13).
 - (15) Q.—Have these four firms made applications in writing for licences? A.—Yes.
- (16) Q.—If not, why this anxiety on the part of the Municipal Veterinary Surgeon to procure licences for them ? A.—In view of the answer to the previous question this question does not arise.
- (17) Q.—Was a list of bona fide importers and the volume of their importations during the past 24 months, prepared by the Superintendent of the Cattle Mart? A.—A list of importers was prepared by the Superintendent, Cattle Mart, but I understand that the stocks shown against each man's name in that list were all imported by the four importing agencies.
 - (18) Q.—Is there any reason to doubt the correctness of this list? A.—No.
- (19) Q.—If not, why was not the resolution of the Four Standing Committees carried out on the basis of that list? A.—See answer to (8).
 - 5. Pursuant to notice, Mr. A. R. A. Razik asked the following questions which the Chairman answered:—
- (1) Q.—In terms of contract, are not the Gas Company bound to enlarge from time to time, and lay sufficiently large mains in the city at their expense, in order to maintain the contracted pressures in districts? A.—No.
- (2) Q.—What was the necessity for a 6-inch hain, recently laid, between Galle road, Bambalapitiya, and Thurston road? A.—The Gas Company were required by the Municipality to provide a 6-inch main in the Buller's road extension for the better lighting of this important link than would have been possible with a 3-inch main.
- (3) Q.—Was not the surprise pressure test taken at my request in Pashetal road, Mutwal, a novel and expensive method; the road having been trenched, the gas main tapped, and a fresh pipe inserted? A.—No.
- (4) Q.—Could the Municipal Engineer and the Mechanical Engineer assure me that this was actually a surprise test (the latter attempting to make me believe so), and that the Gas Company were unaware of the proceedings? A.—No.
- (5) Q.—Was the night watcher at this testing place a man from the Gas Works or a Municipal man? A.—A gas works employee.
- (6) Q.—In terms of clause 19 of contract, has the Gas Company maintained their testing apparatus at all times in proper order? A.—Yes.
- (7) Q.—If not, why were they not penalized, in terms of clause 15 of contract? A.—The question does not arise (8) Q.—In terms of contract, have the Gas Company painted all street lamp columns, brackets and lanterns one a year. If so, have records been kept? A.—Yes.
- (9) Q.—Why does Council pay an extra sum of Rs. 800 annually to the Gas Company for the lamps in Galle Face? A.—The Council does not do so.
- (10) Q.—Why does Council pay an extra sum of Rs. 1,200 annually for lighting and extinguishing of street lamps, when contract rates, as per clause 7, cover this cost ? A.—The Council does not do so.
- (11) Q.—In which countries of the world are gas undertakings, under statutory authority, allowed to sell the one quality of gas at two different rates to the general public, for lighting and cooking? A.—I cannot say.
- (12) Q.—Which gas undertakings in the world, operating under statutory authority, other than the Colombo Gas Company, have issued bonus shares to its shareholders? A.—I cannot say.
- (13) Q.—By what authority has the Council empowered the Gas Company, under clause 11 of contract, to demand deposits from consumers, when in England, this authority is obtained by legislation, while at the same time, the law requires gas undertakers to pay interest on deposits? A.—No specific authority has been granted to the Council to embody this provision in its contract.
- (14) Q.—Should not certain terms and conditions of gas supply to the general public, as embodied in the contract, be made known to them, by ordering the Gas Company to have such clauses printed on their monthly bills? A.—This is now done by the Company.
- (15) Q.—Should not the Council order the Gas Company to discontinue forthwith all sub-meter installations as they are disadvantageous to consumers in point of registration? A.—The report of the Gas Committee which deals inter alia with the question of sub-meters is at present under reference to the Your Standing Committees.
- (16) Q.—How many million cubic feet of gas have escaped monthly from gas mains, service pipes and meters, during the past five years? A.—I cannot say.
- (17) Q.—Has the Council's gas staff seen whether the Company periodically inspect their mains for leakage, in order to protect the city from the danger of gas explosions? A.—No.
- (18) Q.—Have consumers been charged meter rent for the period during which meters have been out of order; if so, is this not an illegal levy? A.—Yes. When a meter has been out of order for part of a month, the rent is recovered for the whole month. This arrangement is not provided for either under the Gas Ordinance or the Council's contract. Whether it is a legal charge or not I am not prepared to say.
- (19) Q.—Has the Council's gas staff ever tested the Company's station meter which records the quantity of gas manufactured; if so, when ? A.—No.
- (20) Q.—At the gas inquiry, Mr. Barker Johnson, maintained that 20,000 cubic feet and more of coal gas of the quality contracted, could and was obtained by the Company, per ton of coal, while Mr. Gerald Pereira stated that 15 to 16,000 cubic feet was about the maximum yield in gas works practice, and as I am in possession of documents from two independent authoritative sources to the effect that Mr. Pereira is right, please obtain information on the point from the City Analyst, the Mechanical Engineer, or any other authority in Ceylon? A.—If the Four Standing Committees who are considering the report of the Gas Committee desire this information, a report can be obtained.
- (21) Q.—What is the meaning conveyed in clause 13 of the contract regarding consumption of burners, and has the Municipal Gas Staff seen to the observance of this clause by the Company, during the past 25 years? A.—Clause 13 was inserted in the interests of any consumers who desire to convert the flat gas flame to incandescent mantle type. As very few people require this, the deletion of the clause is contemplated in the next contract.
- (22) Q.—Why were overseers and clerks of the Council, who had no qualification nor practical knowledge, appointed as Gas Inspectors, from about 1907, when such a position was held by qualified Europeans specially brought out for the purpose? A.—In accordance with the policy of the Council as then constituted.
- (23) Q.—Does not the English law stipulate penalties from £10 to £20 on those who assume the important duties of Meter Inspector, without practical knowledge and a certificate of competence? A.—I cannot say.

- (24) Q.—Please request the Four Standing Committees to consider the advisability of a complete reorganization of the Council's gas staff, with competent and adequate supervision for the observance of the Gas Ordinance, Meter Ordinance, and the Municipal contract? A.—This matter is already before the Four Standing Committees.
- (25) Q.—What is the cause of so much delay in replying Mr. Gerald Pereira with regard to his claims against the Gas Company, on behalf of several gas consumers, for overcharges aggregating thousands of rupees? A.—The report of the Committee appointed to investigate these alleged overcharges is still under consideration by the Four Standing Committees.
- (26) Q.—What is the cause of so much delay in submitting to me shipping documents and Customs papers of Calorimeter which I have been asking from time to time since June 26, 1932? A.—All the available documents have already been shown to the Member for New Bazaar.
- (27) Q.—Please obtain a full report from the City Analyst on the quality (illuminating and heat values), purity, and pressure of gas at the last street lamp in Old Kolonnawa road, Mary's lane in Mattakkuliya, and the Council's market meter at the end of tram line in Grandpass? A.—I regret I am unable to comply with this request.
- (28) Q.—In view of the irregularities and absurdities in the existing gas contract, resulting from the Mechanical Engineer's recommendations, please obtain the opinion of the Council's Lawyers as to a better form of contract, in keeping as near as possible to the regulations in the English Gas Acts? A.—This is a metter for the Four Standing Committees.
- (29) Q.—Has the Council the power to impose a tax upon the Gas Company for using the Council's roads and for the extensive profitable operations carried out by them in the city? A.—No.
- (30) Q.—In terms of section 4 of the Gas Ordinance, and in view of the inordinate profits made by the Gas Company, should not the Council control the profits of this Company (as done in England), and for this purpose regulate the price of gas, instead of merely contracting as has been done in the past? A.—The question has been considered by the Gas Committee whose report, as already stated, is under consideration by the Four Standing Committees.
- 6. Pursuant to notice, Mr. Aelian W. Pereira moved—"That licences to import goats and sheep be granted to the following:—(1) S. V. P. Sodalamani Nadar, (2) A. S. U. Punnavana Nadar, (3) M. P. Thangavelue Nadar, (4) V. P. H. Vellaya Nadar, (5) A. Kovilpulle Nadar, (6) A. Mal Nadar, (7) A. Doraisamy Nadar, (8) V. P. N. Pal Nadar, (9) S. M. Seeni Pitche, (10) G. S. Mohammadu Sultan, (11) Nazir Mohamed Sahib, (12) N. S. Sinnasamy Nadar, (13) S. A. Palaya Nadar, in proportion to their importations during the past 24 months." Mr. A. E. Goonesinha seconded.
- Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader moved, as an amendment, that the whole question of importation of goats be referred to the Four Standing Committees. Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando seconded.
 - Mr. N. R. Blande spoke to the amendment.
 - Mr. A. R. A. Razik wished the question of the importation of goats from Aden be also considered.

The Chairman explained the position.

The amendment was put to the meeting and carried.

"The Dog Registration Ordinance, 1901."

BY-LAWS made by the Hatton-Dikoya Urban District Council under sections 5 and 6 of the Dog Registration Ordinance, No. 25 of 1901, and section 245 of the Local Government Ordinance, No. 11 of 1920.

Hatten, January 21, 1933.

By-LAWS

J. A. Aiyaner Ar, Chairman.

1. In respect of every dog or batch kept within the limits of the Urban District Council of Hatton-Dikoya, the person having custody or possession of it shall pay an annual registration fee of 75 ceases and Re. 1.50 respectively. For the purpose of this rule year shall be computed from April 1 of one year to March 11 of the year following.

2. The occupie of every house within the town shall,

2. The occupie of every house within the town shall, before January 31) in each year, furnish to the person appointed by the chairman of the Urban District Council to collect the registration fee (hereinafter called the collector) particulars required in the annexed form A in respect of each dog or bitch kept within such house or its premises.

3. A certificate of registration in the Form B shall be issued on payment of the prescribed fee to the aforesaid Collector or to the Secretary of the Urban District Council.

4. The Collector or Secretary (1) may refuse to issue a certificate of registration for any dog or bitch (a) which, in his opinion, is so diseased as to be a source of infection to other dogs, or (b) which, by reason of age, illness, or injury is in his opinion unfit to live; or (2) the Collector

or Secretary may issue such certificate subject to any conditions he may consider suitable. Any owner dissatisfied with such refusal or conditions may appeal to the Chairman of the Urban District Council, who may confirm, modify, or cancel the same.

5. Every certificate of registration shall have the

following conditions printed on it, viz.:—

This certificate is liable to be cancelled by the Chairman of the Urban District Council—

- (a) Should the dog become so maimed or diseased as to be in the opinion of the Chairman unfit to live; or
- (b) Should the Chairman be satisfied that the dog is habitually ill-treated or neglected by its owner; or
- (c) Should the dog be permitted by its owner to associate with dogs belonging to others at a time when it is suffering from any infectious or contagious disease.
- The person having the custody or possession of a dog or bitch in respect of which (a) a certificate is refused or (b) its certificate is cancelled because a condition attached thereto has not been complied with, shall, on being noticed to do so, produce the dog at the Urban District Council Office, at the time stated in the notice, and there deliver it to an officer of the Urban District Council authorized to take charge of it. Such dogs shall, then be dealt with in the manner determined by the Chairman.

7. The by-laws made by the Local Board of Hatton-Dikoya under the Dog Registration Ordinance, No. 25 of 1901, dated July 7, 1913 (Gazette No. 6,571 of July 11, 1913),

are repealed.

By-laws relating to Dogs, Anuradhapura. "The Dog Registration Oxdinance, 1901."

BY-LAWS made by the Ahuradhapura Urban District Council, under sections 5 and 6 of the Dog Registration Ordinance, No. 25 of 1901, and section 245 of the Local Government, Ordinance, Nov 11 of 1920.

Urban District Council Office, Anuradhapura, January 23, 1933.

S. NATARAJA, Chairman.

1. In respect of every dog or bitch kept within the limits of the Urban District Council of Aduradhapura the person having custody or possession of it shall pay an annual registration fee of Re. 1. For the purpose of this rule a year shall be computed from April 1 of one year to March 31 of the wear following

the year following.

2. The occupier of every house within the town shall, before January 31 in each year, furnish to the person appointed by the Chairman of the Urban District Council to collect the registration fee (hereinafter called the collector) particulars required in the annexed form A in respect of each dog or bitch kept within such house or its premises.

3. A certificate of registration in the Form B shall be issued on payment of the prescribed fee to the aforesaid collector or to the Secretary of the Urban District Council.

- 4. The collector or Secretary (1) may refuse to issue a certificate of registration for any dog or bitch, (a) which, in his opinion, is so diseased as to be a source of infection to other dogs, or (b) which, by reason of age, illness, or injury, is in his opinion unfit to live; or (2) the collector or Secretary may issue such certificate subject to any conditions he may consider suitable. Any owner dissatisfied with such refusal or conditions may appeal to the Chairman of the Urban District Council, who may confirm, modify, or cancel the same.
- 5. Every certificate of registration shall have the following conditions printed on it, viz.:—

This certificate is liable to be cancelled by the Chairman of the Urban District Council—

- (a) Should the dog become so maimed or diseased as to be in the opinion of the Chairman unfit to live; or
- (b) Should the Chairman be satisfied that the dog is
- habitually ill-treated or neglected by its owner; or (c) Should the dog be permitted by its owner to associate with dogs belonging to others at a time when it is suffering from any infectious or contagious disease.
- 6. The person having the custody or possession of a dog or bitch in respect of which (a) a certificate is refused or (b) its certificate is cancelled because a condition attached thereto has not been complied with, shall, on being noticed to do so, produce the dog at the Urban District Council Office, at the time stated in the notice, and there deliver it to an officer of the Urban District Council authorized to take charge of it. Such dogs shall then be dealt with in the manner determined by the Chairman.

7. The by-laws made by the Local Board of Anuradhapura under the Dog Registration Ordinance, No. 25 of 1901, dated December 2, 1902 (Gazette No. 5,899 of January 9, 1903), are repealed.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended February 11, 1933.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 233 (1 European, 11 Burghers, 149 Sinhalese, 27 Tamils, 31 Moors, 9 Malays, and 5 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1933, viz., 292,200) was 41 6, as against 39 6 in the preceding week, 32 5 in the corresponding week of last year, and 30 3 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 194 (9 Burghers, 113 Sinhalese, 36 Tamils, 27 Moors, 4 Malays, and 5 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 34.6, as against 33.7 in the previous week, 29.6 in the corresponding week of last year, and 24.5 the weekly

average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 194 total deaths, 31 were of infants under one year of age, as against 41 in the preceding week, 39 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 29 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during

the week was 16.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Eighteen deaths from Pneumonia were registered, 7 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), 6 in Kotahena South, and 1 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena North, New Bazaar, Slave Island, and Kollupitiya, as against 31 in the previous week and 15 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Six deaths from Influenza were registered, 3 in New Bazaar, 2 in Kollupitiya, and 1 in Wellawatta South, as against 7 in the previous week and 8 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Eight deaths from Bronchitis were registered, 3 each in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), and Maradana North, and 1 each in New Bazaar and Maradana South, as against 4 in the previous week and 3

the weekly average for last year.

2. (a) Twenty deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 10 in Maradana hospitals (including 5 deaths of non-residents), 3 in Maradana North, 2 in Kotahena South, and 1 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena North, New Bazaar, Slave Island, and Kollupitiya, as against 9 in the previous week and 11 the weekly average for last year.

(b) One death from *Phthisis* of a resident of Colombo town occurred at the Anti-Tuberculosis Hospital, Ragama,

during the week.

3. (a) Nine deaths from Enteric Fever were registered, 5 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents), and 1 each in New Bazaar, Maradana North, Maradana East, and Kollupitiya, as against 1 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

(b) One death from Enteric Fever of a resident of Colombo town occurred at the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Angoda,

during the week.

4. One death from *Plague* was registered in Pettah, as against nil in the previous week and 1 the weekly

average for last year.

5. Ten deaths each from Enteritis and Debility were registered, 6 each from Diarrhoea, Worms, and Puerperal Septicaemia, 4 from Accidents, 1 each from Dysentery, Tetanus, Smallpox, Suicide, and Homicide, and 85 from Other Causes.

6. Reported Cases.—Twenty-seven cases of Chickenpox, 24 of Measles, 17 of Smallpox, 5 of Enteric Fever, 4 of Plague, 3 of Whooping Cough, 2 of Diptheria, and 1 of Mumps were reported during the week, as against 31, 52, 18, 3, 2, 5, nil, and 3, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 78.7°, against 79.9° in the preceding week and 77.0° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.918 in., against 29.894 in. in the preceding week and 29.949 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0.65 in., against 1.81 in. in the preceding week and 0.04 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
