BY-LAW.

BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

1. No pension, gratuity, or long service allowance shall be granted to any officer of the Dehiwala-Mount Lavinia Urban District Council without the authority of the Governor, in order to obtain which a certificate of good conduct from the Chairman setting out the length of service, age, and ground of retirement must be forwarded, together with the application for pension, gratuity, or retiring allowance, and the computation thereof, through the Commissioner of Local Government to the Controller of Establishments.

2. Subject to the provisions of by-law 1 and the following by-laws, every officer of the Dehiwala-Mount Lavinia Urban District Council on the fixed establishment drawing a salary of Rs. 360 per annum and upwards who shall have had service of ten years or more including any service

which may be reckoned under the proviso to by-law 7 may be awarded a pension as follows:—

For the first one hundred and twenty months of such service a pension equal to 120/720ths of his annual salary and for each additional completed month of service an additional 1/720th of such salary, but no officer shall be entitled to draw more than 480/720ths of his final salary as pension.

3. The above-mentioned rates shall only be granted in cases of faithful and meritorious service, but when the testimony as to fidelity, diligence, and merit is in any respect defective, a deduction from such rates may be made. Where there has been obvious negligence, irregularity, or misconduct, the grant of a pension may be altogether withheld.

4. In the case of officers on the fixed establishment of the Council drawing a salary of Rs. 360 per annum and upwards retiring on account of illness or age before completing one hundred and twenty months' gross service a gratuity may be granted calculated at the rate of one-twelfth of a month's pay of the permanent office or offices held at the time of retirement, for each completed month of service.

5. Officers of the Dehiwala-Mount Lavinia Urban District Council shall have no absolute right to any pension, gratuity, or long service allowance under these by-laws and the Dehiwala-Mount Lavinia Urban District Council retains power and authority to dismiss any such officer without any compensation.

6. No pension, gratuity, or long service allowance shall be granted to any officer of the Dehiwala-Mount Lavinia Urban District Council who shall be under fifty-five years of age except upon a certificate from the Chairman and two medical practitioners that he is incapable from infirmity of mind or body of discharging the duties of his office, nor unless he shall have discharged such duties theretofore with diligence and fidelity to the satisfaction of the Council.

7. The claim of an officer of the Dehiwala-Mount Lavinia Urban District Council to pension, gratuity, or long service allowance shall be considered to have commenced from the date of his first permanent appointment to the fixed establishment of the Council or its predecessor the Sanitary Board, Colombo.

Provided that an officer transferred from the provisional and temporary establishment to the fixed establishment may be allowed to count his provisional and temporary service when it has been continuous with his subsequent permanent service.

Service under sixteen years of age however will not count for pension.

8. The service in respect of which pensions, gratuities, or long service allowances are granted under these by-laws must in all cases be continuous, unless interrupted by abolition of office or other temporary suspension of employment not arising from misconduct or voluntary resignation of the officer.

9. The pension or gratuity shall be computed upon the salary of the permanent office held by the officer of the Council at the time of his retirement provided he shall have held such appointment for at least three years: otherwise the pension shall be calculated upon the average of salaries attached to the permanent offices held by such person during the three years next preceding the commencement of such pension.

10. In case of abolition of office, if the officer has completed 120 months' gross service, he may be granted a pension of 1/720th of his salary for each month of his service counting for pension with an addition to such service of one month for each completed period of two months' service, the addition in no case exceeding 60 months.

If the officer has not completed 120 months' gross service he may be granted a gratuity of 1/12th of a month's salary for each month of service counting for pension, plus an addition of 50 per cent. thereon. In no case shall the number of months to be added to the actual service exceed that which, if added to the age of the retiring officer, would make that age up to sixty.

11. If any person being in receipt of any pension or long service allowance from the Dehiwala-Mount Lavinia Urban District Council shall be convicted of any offence in any Court of Justice in the Island for which he shall be sentenced to death or to any terms of imprisonment with hard labour exceeding six months such pension or long service allowance shall forthwith determine and cease to be payable, unless such person shall, within three months after his conviction receive free pardon or unless the Council shall otherwise order.

12. Officers on the fixed establishment of the Dehiwala-Mount Lavinia Urban District Council may be required to retire on or after attaining the age of fifty-five, upon the receipt of twelve months' notice to that effect, but they

may continue in office till sixty years of age with the consent of the Council.

13. (1) Every officer who is transferred to or from the service of the Council from or to any other public service and whose aggregate service would have entitled him, had it been wholly under the Council, to a pension under these rules, shall on his ultimate retirement from service, if he has served for a period of at least 12 months under the Council, be entitled to a pension which shall bear the same proportion to that to which he would have been entitled had the whole of his service been under the Council as the *aggregate amount of the salary which he has drawn from the Council bears to the total sum made up of such aggregate amount and the aggregate of the amounts received by him in the course of his public service elsewhere than under the Council.

Provided however, that in the case of an officer who is transferred to the service of the Council after other public service in which the rules regulating pensions do not offer the same privileges to an officer transferred from the Council to such public service as are accorded under these rules to an officer transferred from such public service to the Council and whose aggregate public service under the Council and elsewhere would have entitled him, had it been wholly under the Council, to a pension under these rules, such officer may with the sanction of the Council on his ultimate retirement from public service (provided such retirement takes place from the Council and that he has served for a period of at least five years under the Council) be entitled to receive from the Council, in lieu of a pension calculated in the manner prescribed in the preceding paragraph, a pension representing the difference between the pension or pensions earned by such officer in respect of his public service elsewhere and a pension calculated as if his public service had been wholly under the Council.

(2) For the purposes of this section, the expression "public service" includes employment under the Crown or any Local Government public body or bodies.

14. Should an officer who retires on pension find after such retirement an employment under Government or under another semi-official body on a salary equal to or higher than that which he drew from the Council at the time of his retirement, his pension shall be suspended so long as such employment continues. If he draws a less salary he shall be entitled to only so much of his pension as when added to the salary of the new appointment will make his total emoluments equal to the salary last drawn by him previous to his retirement.

15. Employees on the fixed establishment of the Dehiwala-Mount Lavinia Urban District Council drawing salaries of less than Rs. 360 per annum and retiring on account of age or infirmity after serving continuously for a period of fifteen years and upwards may, if the Council be satisfied that they are unfit, owing to age or infirmity of body or mind, further to discharge efficiently the duties of their offices, be granted such long service allowances not exceeding Rs. 7.50 per mensem in each case as the Council may award. Persons in receipt of daily pay, who have completed a period of fifteen years of continuous service, retiring under similar circumstances may be awarded gratuities calculated at the rate of one-eighteenth of a month's pay drawn at the time of retirement for each completed month's service.

16. If any case not covered by these by-laws shall arise which in the opinion of the Council merits the award of a pension, retiring allowance, or gratuity, the circumstances of such cases should be reported together, with the recommendation of the Council to the Commissioner of Local Government for transmission to the General Treasury (Establishments Division) for submission to the Governor, who will decide whether any and, if so, what award shall be granted.

BY-LAWS.

The by-laws relating to dairies published by notification in the *Gazette* of August 30, 1929, are hereby amended—

- (i.) by the deletion, from the heading of the part or chapter thereof numbered II., of the words "and for sale of milk"; and
- (ii.) by the insertion, immediately after the aforesaid part or Chapter II., of the following new part or chapter:—

III.—*Regulations for Sale of Milk generally.*

1. No person who is not a licensee of a dairy as aforesaid, shall himself, or by any agent or servant, sell or deliver, or expose, keep, carry, hawk, or offer for sale, any milk within the administrative limits of the Council, save in accordance with the conditions hereinafter prescribed.

2. (i.) Every such person, whether resident within or without the limits of the Council, who desires to sell or supply for money milk in any quantity to any person or persons within the limits of the Council, shall cause himself to be registered in the books of the Council as a purveyor or supplier of milk.

(ii.) Such registration shall be free of all fees or charges.

3. Every such person shall, by proper application made for that purpose, further cause registration-cards to be issued annually by the Chairman to each servant, vendor, or agent, whether paid or unpaid, employed by him in the work of selling or delivering milk.

4. Any contravention of, or non-compliance with, the foregoing provisions shall be an offence.

5. (1) The Chairman may in his discretion refuse to register as a purveyor or supplier of milk under the foregoing by-law 2, any person who has not been recommended for registration, after such inspection, as may be necessary, of his premises, his animals, and his utensils and equipment generally—

(a) if he is a resident within the administrative limits of the Council, by the Medical Officer of Health of the Council; or

(b) if he is resident in any area outside the limits of the Council, by the Chairman of any duly constituted local authority there may be in such area, or if there is none, by the Medical Officer of Health for the district in which such area lies.

(2) The Chairman may likewise refuse to issue any registration-cards, under the foregoing by-law 3, until a Medical Officer deputed by him has examined and found each such servant, vendor, or agent to be free from any infectious or contagious disease and from diseases of the skin.

6. The registration-cards so issued by the Chairman shall include the following particulars:—

(a) employer's name and number on register,

(b) name of vendor or servant or agent, and his thumb impression.

7. It shall be an offence for any person to deliver milk or to carry or hawk milk for sale within the limits of the Council, unless he has in his possession a registration-card for the current year duly issued as aforesaid.

8. (i.) It shall be an offence for any person delivering milk or carrying or hawking milk for sale within the limits of the Council, to refuse, or to fail for any reason, to produce for inspection a duly issued registration-card for the current year, when called upon to do so by a Sanitary Inspector or by any any person specially or generally authorized by the Chairman in that behalf.

(ii.) In the event of any person so refusing or failing to produce such card, it shall be lawful for such Sanitary Inspector or other authorized person to exercise the powers given to peace officers by section 33 (1) of the Criminal Procedure Code, 1898.

9. It shall be an offence for any person to sell or deliver or to expose, keep, carry, hawk, or offer for sale, within the limits of the Council—

(i.) any milk from which the cream has been removed, unless such milk is contained in a vessel which is distinctly and conspicuously labelled "Skimmed milk" in English, and the equivalent term in Sinhalese and Tamil, and is sold as such.

(ii.) any milk adulterated with water or any other foreign substance or liquid; provided that milk, to which tea, coffee, or cacao has been added for consumption on the premises of any tea or coffee boutique or eating-house, shall not be deemed to be adulterated for the purpose of this by-law.

10. If any person found guilty of an offence under the foregoing by-law 9 is proved to be the agent or servant, whether paid or unpaid, of any other person, such other

person shall also be liable to be punished for the same offence, unless he proves to the satisfaction of the Court that he had given all necessary instructions and used due diligence to ensure compliance, and that the offence was due to an act or default of his agent, or servant without his own knowledge, consent, or connivance.

PENSION RULES.

1. (a) No officer shall be deemed to have an absolute right to any pension, gratuity, or allowance under these rules, and the Board reserves to itself the power to dismiss an officer without compensation.

(b) No pension, gratuity, or retiring allowance shall be granted on retirement to any officer without the authority of the Governor, in order to obtain which a certificate of good conduct from the Chairman setting out the length of service, age, and ground of retirement must be forwarded together with the application for pension, gratuity, or retiring allowance, and the computation thereof, through the Commissioner of Local Government to the Controller of Establishments.

2. (1) Subject to the provisions and exceptions hereinafter contained every officer holding a permanent office in the service of the Board and drawing a salary of not less than Rs. 400 per annum may be granted a pension calculated at the rate of 1/720th of the salary of the office or offices held by him at retirement for each month of service counting for pension, provided that he has completed not less than 120 months' gross service.

(2) If such an officer retires on account of illness or age before completing 120 months' gross service, he may receive a gratuity calculated at the rate of 1/12th of a month's salary of the office or offices held by him at retirement for each month of service.

3. Any officer may be required to retire from the service of the Board on or after attaining the age of fifty-five years; but retirement shall be compulsory on his attaining the age of sixty years, unless the Governor decide that his services shall be retained.

4. No pension shall be granted to an officer retiring before he attains the age of fifty-five years, unless a Medical Board, consisting of two Medical Practitioners nominated by the Chairman, certifies that the officer is unfit to discharge the duties of his office owing to infirmity either of mind or body, and unless he shall have theretofore discharged such duties to the satisfaction of the Chairman.

5. The Chairman may call upon an officer, who is below the limit of age entitling him to retire on pension, to retire from the service on the ground of his inability to discharge efficiently the duties of his office. In such a case the Board may by special resolution, subject to the approval of the Governor, grant such retiring allowance or gratuity as is considered just and proper, but in no case exceeding the amount for which the length of service of the officer would qualify him.

6. In the case of the abolition of any pensionable office, the pension or gratuity grantable to the officer holding such office will be that which would have been payable to him, had he retired on grounds of ill-health.

7. No pension or gratuity granted under these rules shall be assignable or transferable.

8. (1) The service to be reckoned for pension shall be calculated from the date on which the officer commences to draw salary in respect of his first permanent appointment, whether pensionable or not. Acting service in an office carrying claims to pension shall, when continuous with permanent employment, count as service for pension, provided no other officer was earning pension for the same period in respect of the same office. The service of an officer under 16 years of age shall not in any case count for pension.

(2) An officer is entitled to reckon as service for pension the whole period of absence on vacation leave, and half the period of absence on leave with half salary. Absence without salary will not count as service for pension.

9. (1) The pension or gratuity awarded to an officer shall be computed upon the salary drawn by him, at the time of his retirement, in respect of the permanent office or offices then held by him, provided that he shall have held such office or offices, to which the same fixed salary or incremental scale of salary is attached, for at least three years, otherwise the pension or gratuity shall be calculated upon the average of the salaries attached to the permanent offices held by such officer during the three years next preceding the date of his retirement.

(2) For the purposes of these rules, salary will include, in addition to the salary of the permanent office or offices held by him, any allowance voted to him by resolution of the Board as a pensionable allowance, but no other emolument whatsoever.

10. The rates of pension, retiring allowance, and gratuity above set forth shall be granted only in cases of faithful and meritorious service. Where the testimony as to good conduct is in any way defective, a deduction may be made from the pension or gratuity, and where the misconduct of an officer has been of a serious nature, the pension or gratuity may be entirely withheld.

11. The service in respect of which pensions or gratuities are granted ought in all cases to have been continuous, unless interrupted by abolition of office or by temporary suspension of employment not arising from misconduct or voluntary resignation. Service prior to a break of service may, however, be allowed to count for pension together with service subsequent to such break, if the whole of the intervening period has been spent in some employment under Government or under another statutory local authority.

12. If any person in receipt of a pension or retiring allowance is convicted of any offence in any Court in the Island and sentenced to death or to any term of rigorous imprisonment exceeding six months, the payment of such pension or allowance shall be forthwith discontinued, unless such person shall within three months of such conviction receive an unconditional pardon, or unless the Board with the approval of the Governor in any case for special reasons otherwise decides.

13. If any person to whom a pension, annuity, or allowance has been granted under these rules becomes a bankrupt, such pension, annuity, or allowance shall forthwith cease; but it shall be lawful for the Board, with the approval of the Governor, from time to time during the

remainder of such person's life or during such shorter period or periods, whether continuous or otherwise, as may be necessary, to pay all or any part of such pension, annuity, or allowance to, or to apply the same for the maintenance and personal support or benefit of, such person and his wife and children jointly or any one or more of them exclusively, as may in the circumstances of each case be necessary or expedient.

14. (1) Every officer who is transferred to a post under Government or under another statutory local authority with the approval of the Board, shall be entitled on ultimate retirement to pension for the service rendered to the Board, provided that he retires from the latter service in circumstances which would entitle him to pension under these rules. In all such cases the amount contributed by the Board by way of pension shall be based only on the service under the Board, and the final salary drawn from the Board.

(2) An officer who has been transferred to the service of the Board from some other employment under Government or under another statutory local authority may, if he retires from the service of the Board after completing 10 years' public service in all, but before completing 10 years' service under the Board, be awarded, in lieu of a gratuity, an annuity based on service and salary under the Board, calculated in the manner prescribed by rule 2 (1).

15. No person may at any time draw from the funds of the Board an amount of pension which, when added to the amount of any pension or pensions drawn in respect of other public service, exceeds two-thirds of the highest pensionable emoluments drawn by such person at any time in the course of his service under the Board or in such other public service.

16. If any person in receipt of a pension or retiring allowance from the Board returns to the service of the Board, he may be allowed to retain his pension or retiring allowance during the period of his re-employment, in which case he shall receive on his ultimate retirement no award whatever under these rules; or he may be required to forego the pension or retiring allowance then drawn by him, in which case he shall receive on his ultimate retirement a pension or retiring allowance based on his aggregate service and the highest salary drawn by him at any time during that service. The Chairman shall decide the terms on which a former servant of the Board may be re-employed in any particular case.

17. Any employee of the Board drawing a salary of less than Rs. 400 per annum, retiring on account of illness after serving continuously for a period of 15 years and upwards may, if the Board be satisfied from the report of a Medical Board that he is unfit to discharge efficiently the duties of his office owing to infirmity of body or mind, be awarded such long service allowance not exceeding Rs. 750 per mensem as the Board may think just and proper. In the case of employees who retire after attaining the age of 55 years or over, no Medical Board need be appointed. Any employee in receipt of daily pay, who has completed not less than 20 years' service, retiring in similar circumstances, may be awarded a gratuity calculated at the rate of 1/36th of a month's pay for each month's service.

18. In the event of any officer or servant, whether in a pensionable or non-pensionable office or on daily pay, dying while in the service of the Board, it shall be competent to the Board, subject to the approval of the Governor, to grant to the widow or next-of-kin of such officer or servant a gratuity not exceeding three months' pay, and in addition one month's pay for each minor child.

19. If any case not covered by these rules shall arise which in the opinion of the Board merits the award of a pension, retiring allowance, or gratuity, a report setting out the circumstances of such case, together with the recommendation of the Board, shall be forwarded through the Commissioner of Local Government and the Controller of Establishments, General Treasury, to the Governor for his decision as to the nature and the amount of the compensation, if any, that may be awarded.

Felling, Burning, and Clearing of 2,500 Acres of Land under Minneriya Tank.

TENDERS are invited for clear-felling* of all jungle, burning and clearing of irrigable and high lands under Minneriya Tank, situated between the Yoda-ela and Minneriya-oya from the main road to the Railway line. The extent of land to be given to contractors selected under this notice will be decided after peasant allottees have been selected and the blocks to be cleared by them have been allocated. It is proposed to select a number of contractors for the work and to limit if convenient the extent to a maximum of 200 acres per contractor.

2. All tenders should be in duplicate and sealed under one cover and should be addressed to the Government Agent, North-Central Province, Anuradhapura.

3. Tenders should either be sent through the post under registered cover or handed over to the Government Agent, North-Central Province, or his Office Assistant at Anuradhapura. Every tender should be accompanied by a receipt for Rs. 35 deposited at the General Treasury or a Kachcheri.

4. Tenders should be marked "Tender for clearing Land under Minneriya Development Scheme" on the left hand top corner of the envelope and should reach me not later than 12 noon on March 24, 1933.

5. There is no standard form to tender upon, but the tenders should contain the following particulars:—

- A combined rate for felling, burning, and clearing per acre.

Contractors will be allowed to utilize the timber and firewood from the clearings at such concession royalty rates as may be sanctioned by Government provided they agree to supply a number of posts (to be specified) for use for buildings in connection with the scheme. Arrangements have been made for the sale of a limited quantity of firewood to the Railway at the Hatamunc Halt and any contractor who wishes to supply firewood accordingly must so state in the tender.

11. Contracts may not be assigned, subject, or otherwise transferred without the previous written sanction of the Government Agent, North-Central Province. No defaulting contractor should be employed on any service connected with the contracts or the tenders.

12. The Government Agent may, for reasons which may appear to his sufficient, give notice in writing of his objection to the employment by the contractor of any person specified in such notice and no such person shall be employed by the contractor.

13. Contractors will be required to construct dwellings for their labourers only on sites selected for the purpose and in accordance with plans and specifications approved by me. They and their employees shall comply with all sanitary and anti-malarial measures which the Medical Officer in charge may consider necessary at any time.

14. The successful tenderers may be required to furnish security not exceeding 5 per cent. of the value of their contract for the due performance of the contract to the satisfaction of the Government Agent, North-Central Province.

15. No tender will be considered unless in respect of it all the conditions above laid down have been strictly fulfilled. Every selected tenderer will be required to attend this Kachcheri and enter into an agreement in

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended February 18, 1933.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 217 (1 European, 10 Burghers, 130 Sinhalese, 39 Tamils, 24 Moors, 6 Malays, and 7 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1933, viz., 292,200) was 38.7, as against 41.6 in the preceding week, 34.3 in the corresponding week of last year, and 30.3 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 179 (3 Europeans, 9 Burghers, 98 Sinhalese, 34 Tamils, 26 Moors, 5 Malays, and 4 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 31.9, as against 34.6 in the previous week, 25.3 in the corresponding week of last year, and 24.5 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 179 total deaths, 44 were of infants under one year of age, as against 31 in the preceding week, 27 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 29 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 14.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Fourteen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 8 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents), 2 in New Bazaar, and 1 each in Pettah, St. Paul's, Kotahena North, and Maradana South, as against 18 in the previous week and 15 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Eleven deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 3 each in New Bazaar and Slave Island and 1 each in St. Paul's, San Sebastian, Kotahena North, Kotahena South, and Kollupitiya, as against 6 in the previous week and 8 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Eight deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 3 in Kotahena North and 1 each in Kotahena South, New Bazaar, Maradana hospitals (of a non-resident), Maradana North, and Kollupitiya. The number registered during the preceding week was also 8 and the weekly average for last year was 3.

2. Fourteen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 5 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents), 3 in Wellawatta North, and 1 each in St. Paul's, San Sebastian, Kotahena North, Kotahena South, Maradana North, and Maradana South, as against 20 in the previous week and 11 the weekly average for last year.

3. Four deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 2 in Maradana hospitals and 1 each in San Sebastian and Kotahena North, as against 9 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

4. (a) One death from *Plague* was registered in Maradana hospitals (of a non-resident). The number registered during the preceding week as also the weekly average for last year was 1.

(b) Two deaths from *Plague*, of residents of Colombo town, occurred at the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Angoda, during the week.

5. Twelve deaths from *Enteritis* were registered, 10 from *Debility*, 5 from *Diarrhoea*, 4 from *Accidents*, 3 each from *Infantile Convulsions* and *Worms*, 2 from *Dysentery*, 1 from *Puerperal Septicaemia*, and 87 from *Other Causes*.

6. *Reported Cases.*—Sixty-seven cases of *Measles*, 62 of *Chickenpox*, 12 of *Enteric Fever*, 3 of *Smallpox*, and 1 each of *Diphtheria*, *Mumps*, and *Whooping Cough* were reported during the week, as against 24, 27, 5, 17, 2, 1, and 3, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 77.7°, against 78.7° in the preceding week and 77.9° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.881 in., against 29.918 in. in the preceding week and 29.960 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was nil, against 0.65 in. in the preceding week and 1.29 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

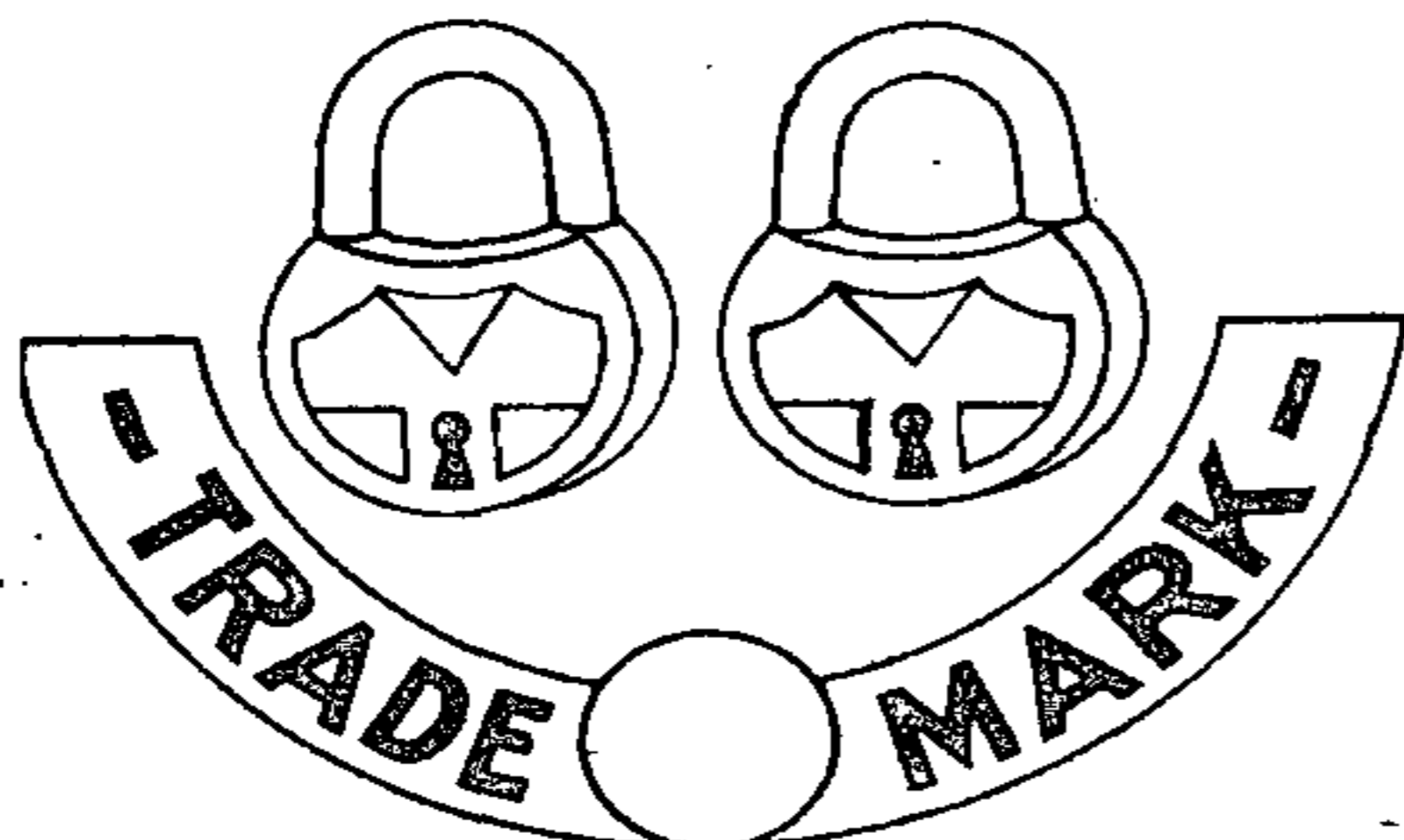

KANDY MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

The Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on January 21, 1933, at 8 a.m., in accordance with the notice dated January 16, 1933.

Present:—Mr. H. P. Kaufmann, Chairman; Ratwatte Adigar; Mr. Hadji M. S. Usoof Ismail; Mr. S. A. Wijayatilake; Mr. W. A. B. Soysa; Dr. J. W. S. Attygalle; Mr. Walter Beven; Mr. T. H. Leader; Dr. L. C. Wijesinha; Mr. G. E. de Silva.

1. The Minutes of proceedings of the Meeting held on December 17, 1932, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted:—

- (a) Statement of receipts and disbursements from close of 1931 to December 31, 1932, on account of Municipal fund.
- (b) Progress report of works brought up to the same date.
- (c) Health Officer's report for December, 1932.
- (d) Statement of cases instituted by the several Inspectors and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of December, 1932.
- (e) The reservoir readings for the week ended January, 21 1933.

Resolved that the statement (a), together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 83 of "The Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910," be forwarded to the Commissioner of Local Government for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table:—Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, standpipes, and house-service taps during December, 1932.

3A. The Chairman tabled—(1) Report from the Medical Officer of Health stating steps taken as preventive measures against smallpox and the number of vaccinations done, and (2) report from the Municipal Engineer on the progress made in investigations connected with the minor river pumping scheme.

4. Petitions:—Dr. Attygalle presented (1) Petition signed by the Secretary of the Balabhiwardiwardana Society applying for a lease of Municipal land in Malabar street for putting up a building for the use of the Society.

(2) Petition signed by the Secretary, Kandy Tamils Association, applying for a lease of land in Wace park for putting up a building for the use of the Association.

(3) Mr. Usoof Ismail presented—Petition signed by M. S. Sekkappa Chettiar applying for a private water service to premises No. 24, Trincomalee street.

(4) Mr. Wijayatilake presented—Petition signed by the Honorary Secretary of the Sri Sasanalankara Baudha Sahodara Samitiya protesting against the removal of earth from the Wahalawela burial ground.

(5) Petition signed by K. A. M. P. Meera Saibo & Bros., applying for a long lease of a piece of land in the market grounds.

The Chairman undertook to deal with the matters referred to in the petitions.

5. Correspondence:—Letter No. H 55 of December 20, 1932, from the Minister of Local Administration intimating that the Governor has increased the number of nominated members of the Kandy Municipal Council to 4, varying his previous decision conveyed to the Council on September 9, 1890, by which the number was fixed at 3.—Read, together with letter of September 9, 1890, referred to therein.

5B. Copy of letter No. H. 55 of December 20, 1932, from the Secretary to the Minister for Local Administration to Messrs. T. H. Leader, Geo. E. de Silva, Walter Beven, and Dr. L. C. Wijesinha intimating that they have been nominated as Members of the Kandy Municipal Council for the years 1933 to 1935, for the information of the Chairman.—Read.

6. Pursuant to notice Dr. Attygalle moved:—"This Council do record its sense of disapproval of the deviation from the long established principle of nomination to the Municipal Council of Kandy." Ratwatte Adigar seconded.

Mr. Beven supported the motion and offered to resign his seat as a nominated member if the elected members so desired.

Mr. Wijayatilake spoke in support of the motion while Mr. de Silva spoke against the motion.

The Chairman whilst sympathizing with the motion suggested that though on paper the nominated element had been strengthened in practice, in view of the "personnel" of the nominated members the popular element remained in a majority. The motion was put to the house and carried by 6 to 2, the voting being as follows:—

For.—Dr. Attygalle, Ratwatte Adigar, Mr. Usoof Ismail, Mr. Wijayatilake, Mr. Soysa, Mr. Beven. Against.—Mr. de Silva, The Chairman.

Mr. Leader and Dr. Wijesinha did not vote.

At this stage, after a consultation among the elected members, Ratwatte Adigar announced—That it was the unanimous desire of the elected members that Mr. Beven should continue to be a member and that this town should have the benefit of Mr. Beven's advice.

6A. Pursuant to notice Mr. de Silva was to move—"That this Council is of opinion that the area covered by the Kandy Municipality be divided into twelve electoral districts in view of the forthcoming reform of the constitution."

The motion was dropped on the understanding that the Chairman would bring the matter up as soon as the Draft Ordinance for amendment of the constitution of the Colombo Municipal Council was published.

7. Recommendations of Standing Committees:—

Extract from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects held on December 17, 1932.

(1) To approve of the proposed definitions of wholesale and retail firewood depôts so that they may accord with the new conditions which were adopted in 1930.—Recommended.

Extract from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation held on December 17, 1932.

(2) Letter dated November 10, 1932, from Mr. P. K. Abdul Cader requesting that the half share which he holds in stall No. 32, Public Market, be transferred to his co-partner in the business, Mr. P. M. Masthan.—Recommended.

Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment held on December 17, 1932.

(3) To obtain formal sanction for sums of Rs. 2,955 and Rs. 2,440·10 paid to Messrs. Walker, Sons & Co., Ltd., and the Colonial Storekeeper respectively for 250 barrels cement and 100 barrels tar purchased from them by the Works Department.—Recommended.

A method for treating materials capable of undergoing dispersion in water and for obtaining aqueous dispersions therefrom.

Abstract.—The viscosity of aqueous dispersions is said to be controlled by the relative osmotic pressures of the disperse and the continuous phase. The viscosity may be increased by the addition to the material which will form the disperse phase substances which have a higher O. P. than the continuous phase: on dispersion these will withdraw water from the continuous phase and so give the same effect on the viscosity as would be produced by a

higher concentrate of the disperse phase. Lyophile colloids may be used with similar effect. The viscosity may be reduced by the addition of similar substances to the continuous phase.
