SCHEDULE A.

North: By a straight line running eastward from the landmark 100 yards west of the culvert on Matale-Gammaduwa road which is 195 yards north of the junction of the Matale-Gammaduwa road and Matale-Nichola-oya road, crossing the said road at the culvert and along the drain forming the northern boundary of Bulugahamulla-watta, thence in a straight line through Bulugahamulla-kumbura (paddy field) to a landmark by the edge of the paddy field in Hompalatennawatta, and thence along the edge of the paddy field to where it meets Bodikotuwa-ela.

WHEREAS in pursuance of the powers conferred on Him by the Air Navigation Act, 1920, His Majesty in Council was pleased by the Air Navigation (Colonies, Protectorates and Mandated Territories) Order, 1927, and the Air Navigation (Colonies, Protectorates and Mandated Territories) (Amendment) Order, 1929, and the Air Navigation (Colonies, Protectorates and Mandated Territories) (Amendment) Order, 1931, amending the first mentioned Order (which, as so amended, is hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Order"), to make certain of the provisions of the Air Navigation (Consolidation) Order, 1923, the Air Navigation (Amendment) Order, 1925, the Air Navigation (Amendment) Order, 1927, the Air Navigation (Amendment) Order, 1928, the Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 3) Order, 1928, the Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 4) Order, 1928, the Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 2) Order, 1929, the Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 3) Order, 1929, the Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 2) Order, 1930, and the Air Navigation (Amendment) Order, 1931, applicable to certain British Possessions and certain territories under His Majesty's protection and to registered aircraft being the property of British subjects resident or companies incorporated therein :

And whereas in pursuance of the powers conferred on Him by the said Act His Majesty has been pleased to make a further Order in Council, namely, the Air Navigation (Amendment) Order, 1932, amending the said Air Navigation (Consolidation) Order, 1923, as previously amended :

And whereas it is expedient that the Principal Order should be further amended so as to make certain of the provisions of the said Air Navigation (Amendment) Order, 1932, applicable to the British Possessions and territories mentioned in Schedules VIII and IX of the said Principal Order and to registered aircraft being the property of British subjects resident or companies incorporated therein, and otherwise in the manner hereinafter appearing :

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of all the powers enabling Him in this behalf, is pleased by and with the advice of His Privy Council to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :—

1. Sub-paragraph (i) of paragraph (1) of Article 4 of the Principal Order shall be amended by omitting the following words, that is to say, "and the name and residence of the owner affixed or". Amendments as to name and address of owner.
2. Paragraph (1) of Article 28 of the Principal Order shall be amended by inserting in proviso (a) thereto the word "accident", after the words "to have been due to". Amendment as to defence to proceedings under Order.
3. Paragraph (3A) of Article 29 of the Principal Order shall be amended by inserting the words "or cancel" after the word "vary". Power to cancel particulars entered in licences, &c.
4. The following amendments shall be made in paragraph (1) of Article 31 of the Principal Order, that is to say,—
 - (a) In the definition of "aircraft" the word "gliders" shall be inserted after the word "kites".
 - (b) At the end of the definition of "Airship" there shall be inserted the words "and means of directional control".
 - (c) After the definition of "Flying machine" there shall be inserted the words—
" "Glider" means an aircraft heavier than air, not fixed to the ground and having no means of mechanical propulsion, but having means of directional control".
 - (d) The definition of "Under way" shall be omitted.Amendments of definitions.
5. Paragraphs 7 and 8 of Schedule I to the Principal Order shall be amended by omitting the words "or the Secretary of State for Air" wherever they occur. Amendment of rules as to registration.
6. The following amendments shall be made in Schedule II to the Principal Order,—
 - (a) In paragraph 1, the words "or issued" shall be inserted after the word "validated".
 - (b) At the end of paragraph 2 there shall be inserted the words "or he may issue a fresh certificate of airworthiness in respect of the aircraft".Amendment of rules as to certificates of airworthiness.
7. The following amendments shall be made in Schedule IV to the Principal Order,—
 - (a) The provisions of the Schedule to this Order shall be substituted for the provisions of Section I.
 - (b) In paragraph 21, there shall be inserted after the words "give way", in both places where those words occur, the words "to gliders and".
 - (c) In paragraph 22 there shall be inserted after the word "shall" the words "for the purpose of the provisions of this Section of this Schedule".
 - (d) In paragraphs 25, 26 and 27 the word "mechanically-driven" shall be substituted for the word "motor-driven" wherever the last-mentioned word occurs.
 - (e) Paragraph 34 shall be omitted.
 - (f) The following paragraphs shall be substituted for paragraphs 36, 37 and 38 :—
 - " 36. If a flying machine or glider starting from, or about to land at, an aerodrome makes a circuit or partial circuit, the turning must be made clear of the landing area and must be left-handed (anti-clockwise) so that during the circuit the landing area shall always be on its left.
 37. Subject to the provisions of any special regulations in force with respect to any particular aerodrome, a flying machine or glider shall not fly over the landing area of an aerodrome at a lower height than 6,000 feet, except when departing therefrom or landing thereat.
 38. Every flying machine and glider flying outside the landing area of an aerodrome at a distance of less than 3 miles from the nearest point of that area shall, unless it is flying at a greater height than 6,000 feet, keep the landing area on its left".
 - (g) In paragraph 39 the words "and gliders" shall be inserted after the words "flying machines", and the figure and word "3 miles" shall be substituted for the figures and word "4,000 yards".
 - (h) In paragraph 41 the words "and glider" shall be inserted after the words "flying machine" in both places where those words occur.Amendments of rules as to lights and rules for air traffic.

(i) In paragraph 42 the words " or two gliders " shall be inserted after the words " two flying machines ", the words " or glider, as the case may be " shall be inserted after the words " flying machine " where those words first occur, and the words " or glider " shall be inserted after the words " flying machine " where those words secondly occur.

(j) The following paragraph shall be substituted for paragraph 44 :—

" 44. At every land aerodrome the following requirements shall be complied with :—

- (1) Along the perimeter and at the approaches to the hangars a neutral zone shall be set apart for aircraft manoeuvring on the ground ;
- (2) The landing area shall be as large as possible ;
- (3) Every flying machine and glider when landing or taking off, shall do so in conformity with the provisions of paragraph 41 of this Schedule, and shall leave clear on its left any flying machine or glider which has already landed or which is at rest on the ground ;
- (4) Every flying machine and glider moving on the ground in the landing area shall do so in the direction of landing :

Provided that on aerodromes approved by the Governor for the purpose, flying machines and gliders moving on the ground may be authorised to cross the landing area subject to regulations approved by the Governor "

(k) The following amendments shall be made in paragraph 45 :—

- (i) The words " landing area " shall be substituted for the words " part reserved for departures and landings " in sub-paragraph (1), and for the words " part of the ground reserved for departures and landings " in sub-paragraph (2).
- (ii) In sub-paragraph (3) the words " or glider " shall be inserted after the words " flying machine " in every place where those words occur, and the words " or gliders " shall be inserted after the words " flying machines ".

(l) In paragraph 46 the word " land " shall be inserted after the word " every ".

(m) The following paragraph shall be inserted after paragraph 50 :—

" 50A. In conforming with the rules laid down in Section III and Section V of this Schedule—

- (a) due regard shall be had to all dangers of navigation and collision and to any special circumstances which may render a departure from those rules necessary in order to avoid immediate danger ; and
- (b) in particular it shall be borne in mind that steam vessels in narrow channels are not able to manoeuvre so as to avoid collision with aircraft "

Amendment as to licences.

8. The following amendments shall be made in Schedule V to the Principal Order—

- (a) In sub-paragraph (1) of paragraph 2 the words " in any other part of His Majesty's dominions " shall be substituted for the words " in any part of His Majesty's dominions outside Great Britain and Northern Ireland ".
- (b) The following paragraph shall be inserted immediately before paragraph 4 :—

" 3. No licence shall be granted if the Governor is not satisfied that the applicant is a fit and proper person to hold the licence."

Citation and commencement.

9. (1) This Order may be cited as the Air Navigation (Colonies, Protectorates and Mandated Territories) (Amendment) Order, 1932.

(2) This Order shall come into operation on the 1st day of January, 1933.

SCHEDULE.

PROVISIONS TO BE SUBSTITUTED FOR SECTION I OF SCHEDULE IV OF THE PRINCIPAL ORDER.

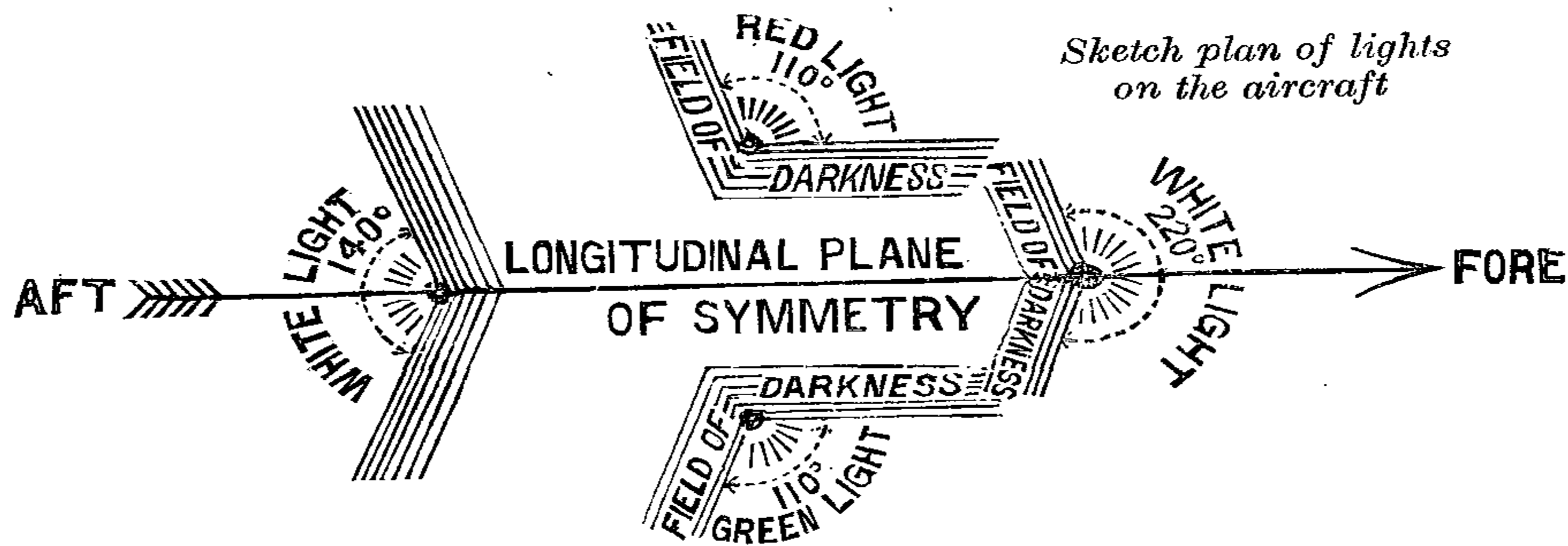
Section I.

Interpretation.

1. For the purpose of this Schedule—

- (a) An aircraft shall be deemed to be on the surface of the water when any part of the aircraft is in contact with the water ;
- (b) An aircraft, being in the air or on the surface of the water, shall be deemed to be under way when it is not moored to the ground or to any fixed object on the land or in the water ;
- (c) An aircraft under way in the air or on the surface of the water shall be deemed to be making way when it has a velocity relative to the air or water respectively ;
- (d) An aircraft shall be deemed not to be under control when it is unable to execute a manoeuvre required in respect of it by the rules laid down in this Schedule or by the Regulations for Preventing Collisions at Sea ;
- (e) The expression " landing area " means that part of an aerodrome which is reserved for departures and landing of aircraft ;
- (f) The expression " visible," when used in relation to lights, means visible on a dark night with a clear atmosphere ;
- (g) The expression " plane of symmetry ", in relation to an aircraft, means the plane of symmetry passing through the longitudinal axis of the aircraft ;

- (h) The angular limits for lights laid down in the rules in Section IA of this Schedule shall be determined when the aircraft is in its normal attitude for flying on a rectilinear horizontal course, as illustrated in the following sketch plan :—



Section IA.

RULES AS TO LIGHTS AND DAY MARKINGS.

General.

2. (1) The rules as to lights in this Section of this Schedule shall be complied with by aircraft in all weathers during the period from sunset to sunrise or, in the case of aircraft being on or over the territory of a State by the law of which any other period is substituted for the period aforesaid, during the period so substituted.

(2) Throughout the period during which the rules aforesaid are to be complied with, no other lights shall be displayed which may be mistaken for the lights required to be displayed by those rules.

(3) The lights required to be displayed by the said rules shall not be dazzling.

3. (1) In the event of the failure of any light which is required by this Section of this Schedule to be displayed by aircraft in flight, the aircraft concerned shall, if the light cannot be repaired or replaced in flight, land as soon as it can do so without danger.

(2) Where, owing to the difficulty of producing lamps to meet the requirements of this Section of this Schedule as regards sector lights, an overlap of those lights is unavoidable, the overlap shall be as slight as possible; there shall be no sector in which no light is visible.

4. Nothing in this Section of this Schedule shall interfere—

- (a) with the operation of any special rules made by any State with respect to the additional station or signal lights for military aircraft or for aircraft in group formation; or
- (b) with the exhibition of recognition signals adopted by owners of aircraft which have been authorised by their respective Governments and published.

Flying Machines.

5. (1) Every flying machine in the air or on a land aerodrome shall display the following lights, that is to say :—

- (a) on the right side, a green light, fixed so as to show an unbroken light visible at a distance of at least 5 miles in a dihedral angle of 110° formed by two vertical planes, of which one is parallel to the plane of symmetry and directed dead ahead, and the other is directed to the right;
- (b) on the left side, a red light, fixed so as to show an unbroken light visible at a distance of at least 5 miles in a dihedral angle of 110° formed by two vertical planes, of which one is parallel to the plane of symmetry and directed dead ahead, and the other is directed to the left;
- (c) at the rear, a white light, fixed so as to show astern an unbroken light, visible at a distance of at least 3 miles in a dihedral angle of 140° formed by two vertical planes bisected by the plane of symmetry.

(2) In a case where, in order to comply with the foregoing provisions of this paragraph, a single light has to be replaced by several lights, the field of visibility of each of those lights shall be so limited that only one can be seen at a time.

(3) In the case of a flying machine with a maximum span of less than 65 feet, the lights required by this paragraph may be combined in one or more lamps, placed centrally, provided that the requirements of this paragraph as to colour and visibility are complied with.

6. Every flying machine under way on the surface of the water shall display lights in accordance with the following provisions of this paragraph :—

- (a) if it is under control and is not being towed, it shall display the lights required by paragraph 5 of this Schedule, and in addition, forward, a white light fixed so as to show forward an unbroken light visible at a distance of at least 3 miles in a dihedral angle of 220° formed by two vertical planes and bisected by the plane of symmetry;
- (b) if it is being towed, it shall display the lights required by paragraph 5 of this Schedule;
- (c) if it is not under control, it shall display two red lights placed where they can best be seen, one vertically over the other, not less than 3 feet apart, and both being visible, so far as practicable, all round the horizon at a distance of at least 2 miles, and it shall also display—
 - (i) if making way, the lights required by paragraph 5 of this Schedule; or
 - (ii) if not making way, the light required by sub-paragraph (1) (c) of paragraph 5 of this Schedule.

7. Every flying machine at anchor or moored on the surface of the water shall display lights in accordance with the following provisions of this paragraph :—

- (a) in every case, it shall display forward centrally where it can best be seen, a red light 3 feet vertically above a white light, both being visible all round the horizon at a distance of at least 1 mile :
- (b) in a case where the length of the flying machine is 150 feet or upwards, it shall display, in addition to any other light required by this paragraph, a white light at or near its stern at a lower height than the lights mentioned in sub-paragraph (a) of this paragraph, and visible all round the horizon at a distance of at least 1 mile :
- (c) in a case where the maximum span of the flying machine is 150 feet or upwards, it shall display, in addition to any other light required by this paragraph, a white light on each side placed in such a manner as to demarcate the maximum lateral dimension of the flying machine and visible, so far as practicable, all round the horizon at a distance of at least 1 mile.

Gliders, Balloons and Kites.

8. In all cases in which flying machines are required by this Section of this Schedule to display lights, a glide shall display a white light visible, so far as practicable, in all directions.

9. A free balloon shall display a white light placed not less than 15 or more than 30 feet below the basket and visible, so far as practicable, in all directions at a distance of at least 2 miles.

10. (1) In the case of a captive balloon or kite, lights shall be displayed in accordance with the following provisions of this sub-paragraph :—

- (a) the balloon or kite shall display two white lights placed 12 feet apart, one vertically below the other and both being visible so far as practicable in all directions at a distance of at least 2 miles, the upper light being placed not less than 15 or more than 30 feet below the basket, or, if there is no basket, below the lowest part of the balloon or kite :
- (b) in addition, from the mooring cable of the balloon or kite there shall be displayed at intervals of 1,000 feet measured from the said group of two white lights, similar groups of two white lights, and if the lowest group of lights is obscured by clouds, an additional group shall be displayed below the cloud base :
- (c) in addition, the position of the object to which the balloon or kite is moored on the ground shall be marked by a similar group of two white lights.

(2) By day, the mooring cable of a captive balloon shall have attached to it at intervals of not more than 300 feet measured from the basket (or, if there is no basket, from the lowest part of the balloon) tubular streamers, not less than 8 inches in diameter and 6 feet in length, and marked with alternate bands of white and red 18 inches in width.

(3) By day, the mooring cable of a kite shall be marked, either—

- (a) in the manner required by the last preceding sub-paragraph in the case of a captive balloon ; or
- (b) by streamers of stout paper attached to the cable at intervals of 150 feet measured from the lowest part of the kite, being streamers not less than 30 inches in length or one foot in width in their widest part and marked with alternate bands of white and red 4 inches wide.

Airships.

11. (1) Except as provided in the next following paragraph an airship when under way shall display the following lights :—

- (a) forward, a white light fixed so as to show forward an unbroken light visible at a distance of at least 5 miles in a dihedral angle of 220° formed by two vertical planes and bisected by the plane of symmetry ;
- (b) on the right side, a green light fixed so as to show an unbroken light visible at a distance of at least 5 miles in a dihedral angle of 110° formed by two vertical planes, of which one is parallel to the plane of symmetry and directed dead ahead, and the other is directed to the right ;
- (c) on the left side, a red light fixed so as to show an unbroken light visible at a distance of at least 5 miles in a dihedral angle of 110° formed by two vertical planes, of which one is parallel to the plane of symmetry and directed dead ahead, and the other is directed to the left ;
- (d) at the rear, a white light fixed so as to show astern an unbroken light visible at a distance of at least 3 miles in a dihedral angle of 140° formed by two vertical planes and bisected by the plane of symmetry.

(2) In a case where, in order to comply with the foregoing provisions of this paragraph, a single light has to be replaced by several lights, the field of visibility of each of those lights shall be so limited that only one can be seen at a time.

12. (1) An airship which is under way and which is not under control, or which has voluntarily stopped its engines, or which is being towed, shall display the following lights :—

- (a) the forward and rear lights required by sub-paragraphs (1) (a) and (1) (d) of the last foregoing paragraph ;
- (b) in addition, below the airship, two red lights, one placed vertically below the other 12 feet apart, the upper light being 25 feet below the control car, and both being visible so far as practicable in all directions at a distance of not less than two miles ;
- (c) in addition, if making way but not otherwise, the side lights required by sub-paragraphs (1) (b) and (1) (c) of the last foregoing paragraph.

(2) By day, an airship in the circumstances mentioned in sub-paragraph (1) of this paragraph shall display two black balls or shapes, each at least 2 feet in diameter, one placed vertically below the other 12 feet apart, and both being visible so far as practicable in all directions.

Where necessary in order to comply with the foregoing provisions of this sub-paragraph, the said group of two black balls or shapes may be duplicated.

13. (1) An airship when moored to a mooring mast shall display at or near the rear a white light visible, so far as practicable, in all directions at a distance of at least 3 miles.

(2) An airship, when moored to the ground or the surface of the water by a cable, shall display, forward, the white light required by sub-paragraph (1) (a) of paragraph 11 of this Schedule, and at the rear, the white light required by sub-paragraph (1) (d) of that paragraph, and in addition the airship and its mooring cable shall be lighted or marked in accordance with such of the provisions of paragraph 10 of this Schedule as are applicable in the case of a captive balloon.

(3) An airship while picking up its moorings shall be considered as being under way and not being under control until it is finally made fast.

VITAL STATISTICS.

PRELIMINARY REPORT ON THE VITAL STATISTICS OF CEYLON, 1932.

The salient features of the vital statistics of 1932 are as follows:—

- (a) The marriage rate, 10.1, is the lowest recorded during the last decennium with the exception of the year 1931, when it was 9.9.
- (b) The birth rate, 37.0, is the lowest after 1920.
- (c) The death rate, 20.5 is the lowest recorded since the events became reasonably accurately reported, say, by 1890.

Population.

2. The estimated population of the Island was 5,427,000 on December 31, 1932. The excess of births over deaths during the year was 88,721 and of emigrants over immigrants 28,837.

Marriages.

3. The number of marriages registered during the year was 25,317 (20,213 under the General Marriage Ordinance and 5,104 under the Kandyan), and corresponded to a rate of 10.1 per 1,000 of the population exclusive of Muslims, as against 9.9 in 1931 and 11.9 the average for the preceding decennium. Among the Muslims 1,244 marriages were registered, and the marriage rate was 6.9 per 1,000 of the Muslim population. There were 140 divorces under the General and 537 under the Kandyan Law.

Births.

4. The number of births registered was 199,373 (101,531 males and 97,842 females), and was equivalent to a rate of 37.0 per 1,000 of the estimated population as against 37.4 in 1931. There were 1,038 male to every 1,000 female births. In the principal towns there were 23,126 births which corresponded to a rate of 32.2 per 1,000 of the urban population. The birth rate in the city of Colombo was 30.5. The births registered on the estates numbered 27,036.

Deaths.

5. 110,652 deaths (55,941 males and 54,711 females) were registered in 1932. The death rate was 20.5 per 1,000 of the population and is the lowest recorded for many years. The rate for 1931 was 22.1. The improvement in mortality this year was shared by all the provinces except the Northern, Eastern, North-Central, and Uva. In the principal towns there were 19,837 deaths corresponding to a rate of 27.6 per 1,000. The rate in the city of Colombo was 24.6. There were 13,722 deaths on the estates. Compared with 1931 this number is less by 1,901.

Infant Mortality.

6. The total number of deaths of infants under one year of age was 32,326 or about 29 per cent. of the total deaths registered. The infant mortality rate was 162 per 1,000 births, and is 4 more than the rate for 1931 and 17 less than the average rate for the preceding decennium. The death rate of infants on estates was 194 and in the towns 178 per 1,000 births. In the city of Colombo the rate was 171.

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended February 25, 1933.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 205 (12 Burghers, 130 Sinhalese, 25 Tamils, 28 Moors, 7 Malays, and 3 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1933, viz., 292,200) was 36.6, as against 38.7 in the preceding week, 33.0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 30.3 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 160 (8 Burghers, 96 Sinhalese, 32 Tamils, 18 Moors, 4 Malays, and 2 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 28.6, as against 31.9 in the previous week, 25.0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 24.5 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 160 total deaths, 36 were of infants under one year of age, as against 44 in the preceding week, 26 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 29 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 9.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Eighteen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 8 in Maradana hospitals (including 4 deaths of non-residents), 2 each in Maradana East and Wellawatta North, and 1 each in St. Paul's, San Sebastian, Kotahena North, Maradana North, Maradana South, and Kollupitiya, as against 14 in the previous week and 15 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Seven deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 3 in St. Paul's, 2 in San Sebastian, and 1 each in Kotahena North and Slave Island, as against 11 in the previous week and 8 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Seven deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 3 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), 2 in Maradana South, and 1 each in St. Paul's and New Bazaar, as against 8 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

2. Seven deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 4 in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident) and 1 each in St. Paul's, Maradana North, and Slave Island, as against 14 in the previous week and 11 the weekly average for last year.

3. (a) Three deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), as against 4 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

(b) One death from *Enteric Fever* of a resident of Colombo town, occurred at the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Angoda, during the week.

4. (a) Two deaths from *Plague* were registered, 1 each, in Kotahena South and New Bazaar, as against 1 in the previous week and 1 the weekly average for last year.

(b) One death from *Plague* of a resident of Colombo town, occurred at the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Angoda, during the week.

5. Sixteen deaths from *Enteritis* were registered, 11 from *Debility*, 6 from *Diarrhoea*, 4 each from *Infantile Convulsions*, *Worms* and *Puerperal Septicaemia*, 3 each from *Dysentery* and *Accidents*, 1 each from *Tetanus* and *Homicide*, and 63 from *Other Causes*.

6. *Reported Cases.*—Fifty-six cases of *Measles*, 54 of *Chickenpox*, 6 of *Enteric Fever*, 4 of *Diphtheria*, 3 each of *Smallpox* and *Plague*, and 1 each of *Mumps* and *Whooping Cough* were reported during the week, as against 67, 62, 12, 1, 3, nil, 1, and 1, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 80.1°, against 77.7° in the preceding week and 79.3° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.891 in., against 29.881 in. in the preceding week and 29.954 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0.84 in., against nil in the preceding week and 2.26 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

THE ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION OF THE THIRUNELVELY OTTUMAI NITHI, LIMITED.**Regulations for the Management of the Nithi.**

1. THE regulations contained in Table "C" of the schedule annexed to the Joint Stock Companies Ordinance, No. 4 of 1861, shall not apply to this Company which shall be governed by the regulations contained in these articles of association, subject to amendment as occasion arises.
2. *Capital.*—The nominal capital of the Nithi shall be Rupees Five hundred thousand divided into Twenty thousand shares of rupees twenty-five each.
3. The Board of Directors shall have power to increase the capital of the Nithi with the authority of a resolution at a meeting of the Shareholders.
4. *Business.*—The business of the Nithi shall be carried on under the administrative authority of a Board consisting eleven Directors elected from among the Shareholders, if sixty per cent. of the meeting of Shareholders supports the election.
5. The Nithi shall proceed to carry on business, as soon after the registration thereof, as the Directors shall think fit, and they shall do so, when, in their judgment, a sufficient number of shares shall have been subscribed, or applied for, or allotted.

6. The business of the Nithi shall be conducted in Tamil.

7. The Nithi shall be open daily for transaction of business from 8 A.M. to 5 P.M. except on authorized holidays.

8. *Shareholders.*—All persons of either sex may become Shareholders on any day and month of a year.

Any vacancy caused during the interval shall be filled up by the Directors among themselves, subject to confirmation by the General Meeting. Vacancy among Directors and Auditors shall be filled up by the Board of Directors in office under the recommendation of the Secretary, subject to confirmation by the General Meeting. Three of the senior Directors shall retire every year. In the absence of the President one of the Directors present shall preside and decide matters by a majority of not less than sixty per cent. present.

22. All matters are decided according to these articles. By-laws for the management of different establishments may be made as occasion arises provided that they do not contravene these articles of association.

23. The Secretary shall convene all meetings that may be required. Proceedings of all meetings shall be recorded in a book kept for the purpose and signed by the Secretary and confirmed by the Chairman at the next meeting.

24. The Directors may delegate any of their powers to any member or members of the Board competent to do any special work assigned to it in the interest of the Nithi. If the Nithi can afford to pay for such work remuneration be given according to the amount of work done.

25. The Directors may open branch offices in any part of Ceylon or abroad with the consent of the General Meeting.

26. The Managers shall be personally and pecuniarily responsible for the administration and control of the establishments of the Nithi taken charge of by them. They shall have power to fine, suspend or dismiss the employees of the Nithi under their control with the approval of the Secretary, who will circularize the Directors, subject to appeal to the Board of Directors. Filling up of all vacancies shall be made under the recommendation of the Manager concerned, with the approval of the Secretary and with the advice of the Board of Directors.

27. Vacancies in the office of Manager of any establishment shall be filled up by the Board of Directors under the recommendation of the Secretary, the Senior Officer of the particular Establishment shall have preference if his ability to hold such office is favourably supported. If no officer is competent enough an outsider may be selected.

28. One day's leave may be allowed to the officers by the Manager at one time during one month; and in case of the Manager such leave shall be given by the Secretary. Applications for leave of absence for any further period shall be submitted to the Secretary with the recommendation of the Manager and in the case of the Manager with that of the Secretary, to the Board of Directors, for approval with pay or otherwise as the case may be.

29. The Secretary shall have remuneration in addition to the Directors' fee, as decided by the Board of Directors, according to the profit of the Nithi, when the Nithi can afford to do so.

30. The fixed salaries of officers shall be paid monthly on the certificate of the Manager on or after the 1st day of the month following.

31. Any other expenditure such as printing, stationery, furniture, and any other special item shall have the previous approval of the Board of Directors. The postage and urgent petty charges may be incurred by the Manager.

32. The Manager shall submit to the monthly meeting of the Board of Directors a statement of accounts of all receipts and payments of the previous month through the Secretary.

33. Daily collections shall be deposited every day or as ordered by the Board of Directors with the Jaffna Mutual Benefit Fund, Limited, or with any of the Bank or Banks in Ceylon with the express permission of the Board of Directors who will advise these transactions from time to time according to the status of the Bank. All branches or establishments of the Nithi shall deposit their daily collections with the Head Office of the Nithi every working day.

34. Sums of money for daily transactions required to be with the Manager or any officer of the Nithi shall be fixed by the Board of Directors from time to time.

35. All payments shall be by cheques as far as practicable. Cash payments are allowed when it is found in experience that payment by cheque causes inconvenience to customers or when demanded by them.

36. Withdrawal of deposits in the Banks shall be by cheque. Cheques shall be drawn by the Manager and Accountant and any sum exceeding Rupees One thousand shall be countersigned by the Secretary.

37. The Manager shall see that the Cash Book is balanced daily and initialled by a responsible officer in addition to himself.

38. No erasing or alteration in figures in any account book of the Nithi shall be allowed. Any wrong entry occurring shall be crossed in red ink and the correct figures written above and initialled by the Manager.

39. On the last day of each month accounts are closed and reconciliation statement of Bank balances entered in the Cash Book.

40. All records, account books, and other valuables shall be kept under custody. Any loss shall be made good by the Manager. He shall obtain receipts in a book kept for that purpose from the officers concerned for safeguard.

41. He shall see that proper records of all stationery, printed forms, cheque books, receipt books and other valuables are kept. The recipient shall initial in the stock book for every issue of articles of stationery and other things.

42. The Directors shall cause true accounts be kept of all receipts and payments by the Nithi. For this purpose the following books, as may be required, shall be made use of, viz. :—

- (1) Cash Book.
- (2) Receipt Book.
- (3) Voucher Book for payments.
- (4) Shareholders Register.
- (5) Pass Book.
- (6) Personal Ledger.
- (7) Summary Ledger.
- (8) Stock Book.
- (9) Pawn Register.

(10) Register of letters, &c., received.

(11) Postage Book, and
Any other books and forms as may be required from time to time.

43. Every year the Directors shall cause to be made up a statement of all receipts and disbursements made up to a date not more than three months before the Annual General Meeting. This shall be arranged in the order of items as shown in the form of the balance sheet appended to these rules. This balance sheet shall be printed with the report of the Directors, and delivered or sent by messenger or sent by post to the address of every Shareholder at least ten days before the date of Annual General Meeting.

44. The accounts of the Nithi shall be examined and the correctness certified by one or more auditors to be elected among the Shareholders at the Annual General Meeting. The Auditors elected shall not be the relatives of, or interested in any capacity in the Manager and Accountant of the Nithi. If no Shareholder is capable of being elected, qualified public auditors may be elected on a remuneration agreed upon. No auditor shall be interested in any transaction of the Nithi otherwise than as a Shareholder.

45. All books referred to in rule 42, orders from the Secretary and all other particulars required for accurate audit shall be supplied to the auditors with a list of books, &c. supplied, which shall follow the report of the auditors who are required to certify the accounts so as to exhibit the true position of the Nithi.

46. The Auditors and Surprise Examiners at all reasonable times shall have access to the books and accounts of the Nithi. Any officer who has been reported against is liable for immediate suspension from duty before inquiry.

47. A Verification Committee shall be appointed after the Annual Audit to report to and advise the Directors' meeting on the true state of the Nithi's affairs. The Committee shall consist of three efficient Shareholders who are not otherwise interested in the Nithi than as a Shareholder. The Remuneration of the Auditors and Surprise Examiners shall be fixed by the General Meeting and Board Meeting respectively at the time of their election.

48. When the Nithi can afford to pay bonuses to all paid officers according to their *bona fide* services during the year, the amount so paid shall not exceed two months salaries, and this payment shall be subject to the amount of realized net profit and recommendations of the Board of Directors.

49. The payments under rules 47 and 48 shall entirely depend on the satisfactory report of the Verification Committee.

50. At the end of every financial year in addition to the paid up subscription the following sums may be entered in the shareholders books to form part of the paid up capital in respect of every share, viz. :—

51. Fixed Deposits, Current, Deposits, Reserve Fund, and other liabilities if any, shall be set aside with due interest before the balance of the actual income can be distributed among the Shareholders as dividend, which shall be added to the credit of the Shareholders in their pass books and paid with the matured share money.

LOANS AND INVESTMENTS.

52. The Board of Directors have power to invest the Reserve Fund as they find fit, on establishing manufactories to suit the amount available and appoint different Committees, consisting of not less than five Shareholders, from time to time, as the Nithi may afford, to advise and recommend to fulfil the objects of the Nithi, viz. :—

- (1) Farming (Co-operative).
- (2) Spinning and Weaving (Jointly and Severally).
- (3) Wholesale and retail stores in rice, paddy, foodstuffs, cotton goods, &c. (as far as practicable in Ceylon Products.)
- (4) Industries :—Jaggery making, cigars and cigarettes making, fruit preserving, industries out of palmyra products.
- (5) Encouraging the study and practice of Siddha and Ayurveda Medicines and the study of customs and manners, traditions, arts and culture of our ancestors.

(6) Investment of money on interest specially on Pawns of jewels, &c., preferably gold-made.

53. Loans may be made from paid up capital under the following conditions:—

- (a) Loans to Shareholders on Promissory Notes shall be not more than 50 per cent. of the paid up subscriptions and dividends, bearing interest at 9 per cent. per annum. These loans shall be redeemed within one year under penalty of losing the privileges of being a Shareholder. From the paid up capital, the principal and interest shall be deducted and the balance paid at the end of eighty months from the date of original admission. Repayment is allowed in any sums not less than rupee one with due interest for the period lapsed. Renewal of promissory notes may be allowed on payment of interest.
- (b) Loans on pawns of jewels, &c., are allowed bearing not more than 12 per cent. interest per annum. If they are not redeemed after a year and seven days they may be sold by public auction. The surplus amount, if any over the principal, interest, and other charges out of the realized sum, shall be remitted to the owner on presentation of the Pawn Ticket held by him.
- (c) Loans on mortgage of lands shall be recovered through Law Courts after two years from the date of failure to pay interest at 12 per cent. per annum, either monthly or annually.
- (d) Loans on instalment system, either daily or monthly, under security of Mortgage Bond may be allowed, on condition that failure to pay any agreed instalment without proper reason will cause legal action to be taken for the recovery of the full amount on the S. M. Bond.

54. No individual loan shall under any case exceed One thousand. All other applications for higher sums shall be approved by the full Board of Directors.

55. Applications for loans addressed to the Manager are only entertained according to the date of receipt in each month, if the collections will permit. Shareholders shall have the first claim. Dates of admission as Shareholder, and application may be taken into consideration. All documents executed for loans of every kind, and security bonds shall be at the expense of borrowers.

56. Interest on all loans paid monthly shall be at the rate of 9 per cent. per annum. This rule shall be suspended or enforced according to the circumstances at the discretion of the Board of Directors.

DEPOSITS.

57. The Shareholders and others are allowed to deposit in the Nithi any sum not less than rupee one:

- (a) Fixed deposits to earn interest for periods stated at the time of deposit. In this case unless the deposit is renewed at maturity and the deposit is rupees twenty-five or less, it shall carry no interest.
- (b) Fixed deposits for more than one year for purpose of drawing interest monthly. These are allowed on agreement of rate of interest at the time of deposit.
- (c) Saving deposits to be drawn on demand. These may be allowed to bear interest, provided the amount exceeds rupees fifty and remains with the Nithi not less than three months.
- (d) Current deposits to be drawn by cheques. Interest is allowed on monthly balances, provided the balance is not less than rupees one hundred during the month.

58. The rate of interest on different deposits shall vary according to the amounts and periods from 3 per cent. to 9 per cent. per annum, as may be decided by the Board of Directors from time to time.

59. For refusal of any application for loan no reason shall be assigned.

MEETINGS.

60. A General Meeting of the Shareholders shall be held once at least every year, not later than three months from the close of the financial year of the Nithi. The date of meeting and the place shall be notified by the Board of Directors.

61. The business transacted at this meeting shall be acceptance of Balance Sheet and accounts with the Directors' report, declaration of dividends to Shareholders, approval of honorarium to the Secretary, Directors fees, and bonuses to officers, election of office bearers for the ensuing year, confirmation of appointments by the Board of Directors and giving advice and suggestions for the prosperity of the Nithi.

62. Extraordinary General Meeting as may be decided by the Board or upon the requisition of 60 per cent. of the Directors or the holders of 50 per cent. of the total paid up shares shall be called by the Board of Directors within one month from the date of resolution or date of requisition.

63. Fourteen days' notice shall be given specifying the place, date, and hour of meeting to the Shareholders, but non-receipt of such notice by any member shall not invalidate the proceedings at any General Meeting.

64. The quorum for commencement of General Meetings shall be 12 and for the Board Meetings not less than 5 Directors.

65. Extraordinary General Meetings convened upon requisition, shall conduct the business, if in addition to the quorum all the requisitionists are present within one hour from the appointed time. Otherwise such meetings shall be adjourned *sine die*.

66. Ordinary General Meetings shall be presided over by the President, or one of the Directors present, and Extraordinary General Meetings shall be presided over by any Shareholder who is not a party to either side, elected at the time of meeting proposed and accepted by the holders of not less than 60 per cent. of the total paid up shares.

67. No business which is not in the agenda, or of which notice has not been given to the Secretary not less than 5 working days before the meeting or in the agenda shall be proposed or considered. No new items can be considered at any adjourned meetings.

68. Every member shall have one vote for every five shares held, which shall be given personally or by proxy. Evidence as to the number of votes shall be by production of pass books, subject to a maximum of five votes.

69. Notices requiring to be served by the Company upon the Shareholders and borrowers may be served either personally or by sending them through post to the addresses registered in the books of the Nithi.

70. Every Shareholder and borrower shall give an address which will be deemed as his or her place of abode and shall be registered in the books of the Company. Subsequent changes shall be notified.

71. Any notice sent by post shall be deemed to have been served at the time, when the letter containing the same is posted.

72. The respective Managers of different Establishments of the Nithi shall have full power to represent the Nithi when action is taken in the Law Courts.

73. A common seal for the Nithi shall be kept with the Manager of the Main Establishment.

74. The Directors shall have full power to use the seal in execution of powers vested on them. The Manager shall use the seal in the presence of the Secretary.

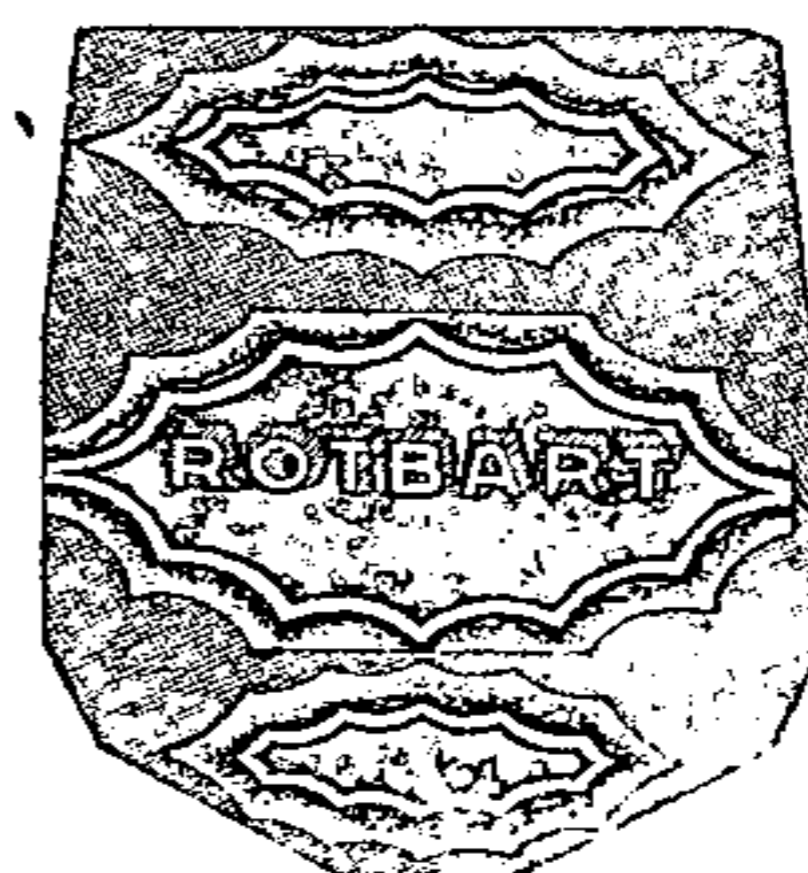

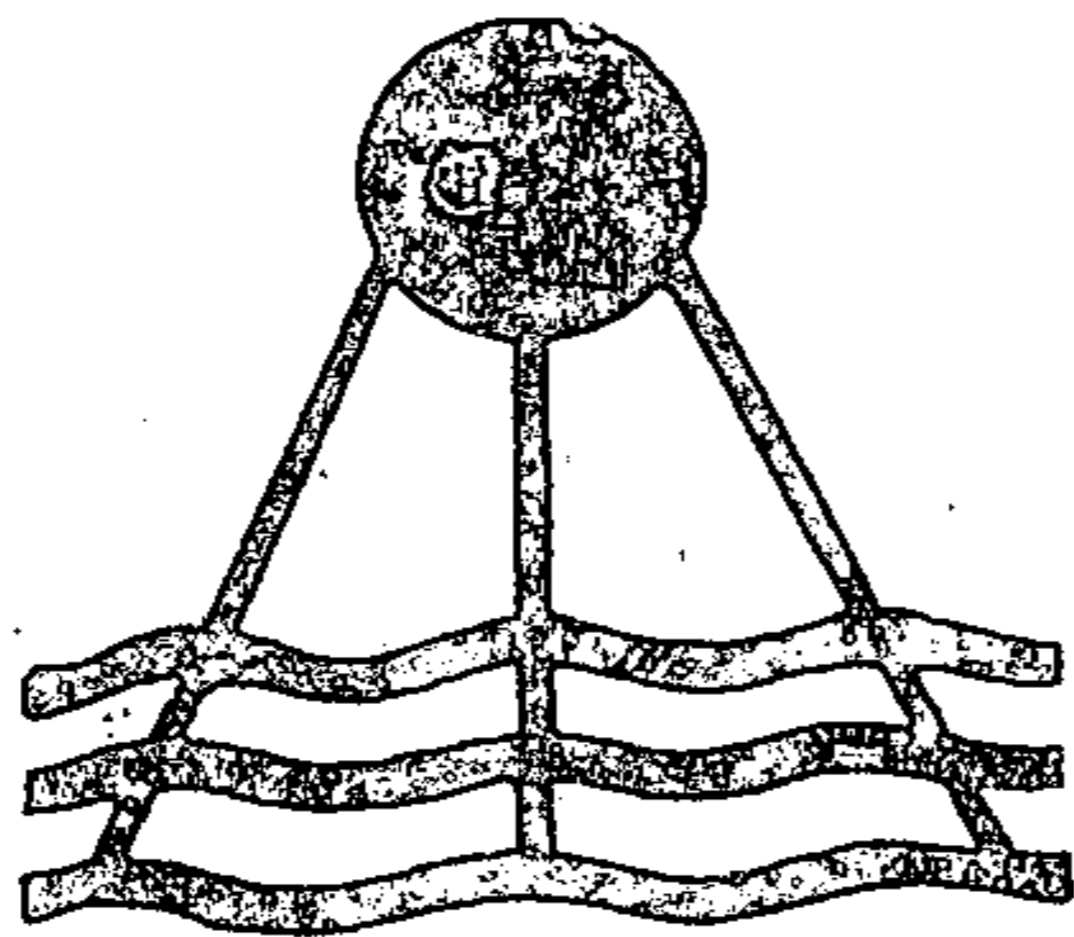
