THE PUBLIC TRUSTEE ORDINANCE, No. 1 OF 1922.

RULES under the Public Trustee Ordinance, No. 1 of 1922, as amended by the Public Trustee Amendment Ordinance, 1931, made by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 45 (1) of the Ordinance and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931.

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RULES.

1. These rules may be called the Public Trustee's Rules.
2. In these rules, unless the context otherwise requires—
 - “the Ordinance” means the Public Trustee Ordinance, No. 1 of 1922, as amended by the Public Trustee Amendment Ordinance, 1931 (No. 11 of 1931);
 - “Public Trustee” means the Public Trustee of Ceylon and includes the Deputy or deputies appointed by the Governor to assist him;
 - “Bank” means such Bank as the Financial Secretary may from time to time appoint for the purposes of the Ordinance by notification in the *Ceylon Government Gazette*.
3. In administering the estates of deceased persons, minors, and lunatics, the Public Trustee shall in all cases use his best endeavours to ascertain the wishes of the beneficiaries, the relatives of the deceased, and others interested, as to the disposal of the assets, and shall have regard to such wishes, especially in respect of specific assets to which sentimental or personal associations attach, unless he considers that such a course would be prejudicial to the due administration of the estate.

Provided that nothing in this rule shall prevent the immediate disposal of live stock or other assets subject to speedy or natural decay.
4. In discharging the duty imposed by section 24 of the Ordinance the Public Trustee shall have regard to the following directions, namely:—

If no steps have been taken in any Court of competent jurisdiction to obtain probate or letters of administration, within four months of the date of death of the deceased, the Public Trustee shall proceed to take the necessary steps to obtain administration: Provided that, when the name and address of the executor or next of kin are known to the Public Trustee, the Public Trustee shall not proceed in the administration until he has communicated with such executor or next-of-kin in order to ascertain whether he proposes to apply for administration and until a reasonable time has elapsed for the receipt of a reply to such communication; and where a reply in the affirmative has been received, until the expiration of such further time as would admit of an application for administration being made.
5. (a) On the issue of probate or letters of administration to the Public Trustee, or the transfer in his favour of the administration under section 23 (2) of the Ordinance, the Public Trustee shall publish a notice as near as may be in the following form:—

“The Public Trustee hereby gives notice that he is administering from _____ the estate of _____ deceased, late of _____ under and by virtue of (*the letters of administration or the order of Court or transfer*) and that all persons having claims against the said estate as creditors, next of kin, legatees, or in any other manner whatsoever should prefer their claims to the said Public Trustee on or before the _____ after which date he will proceed to make distribution of the assets of the said estate, and will recognize in such distribution only such claims as shall have previously been established to his satisfaction.”

(b) The notice shall be advertised in such papers and in such other manner as the Public Trustee thinks fit, provided that more than one estate may be included in the same notice. The expenses of publishing such notices shall be charged to the estates concerned.

(c) The period allowed to claimants to prefer their claims to the Public Trustee shall in no case be less than one month from the date of the publication of the said notice, and in any case in which the Public Trustee has reason to believe that claimants may be residing outside the Island, the period shall not be less than two months from the date of such publication.
6. Where a claim has been finally accepted in whole or in part it shall be entered with all necessary particulars in the proper Claim Register, and there shall be forwarded to the creditor a certificate of such registration signed by the Public Trustee showing the details of the claim as accepted.
7. Notice of rejection or disallowance in part of any claim shall be given by a letter directed to the creditor at the address given by him in his communications or other known address, and shall be served (a) personally or (b) on his agent, or (c) by registered post. In no event shall the funds of the estate be distributed, if there be any doubt as to the sufficiency thereof, until the expiration of three months from the date of the service of such notice.
8. The notice of rejection or disallowance in part of any claim, shall contain the following particulars:—
 - (a) Name of the estate.
 - (b) Name and address of the claimant.
 - (c) Particulars of the claim rejected or of the part disallowed and the reasons for such rejection or disallowance.
 - (d) Date on which notice of the claim in question was received by the Public Trustee.
 - (e) Date of the final decision of the Public Trustee rejecting the claim or disallowing it in part.

For the information of the claimant, the provisions of section 35, sub-section (3), of the Ordinance shall be cited at the foot of the notice.
9. The Public Trustee shall, for the purpose of the registration of the claims of foreign creditors, convert the sums claimed into rupees at the rate of exchange current upon the date on which any claim is registered, and shall remit the sums paid in respect of such claims at the rate current upon the date on which the remittance is made.
10. The Public Trustee shall, as provided by section 38 (1) of the Ordinance, charge in respect of his duties the fees set out in Schedule I. hereto, and such fees may be reduced or remitted as provided in these rules.
11. If in any case it appears to the Public Trustee that the circumstances of an estate or trust proposed to be administered by him are, or probably will be, such as to render his duties in relation thereto exceptionally simple, or that the trust is for a charitable purpose or for an object of general public utility, he may with the previous sanction of the Financial Secretary remit wholly or in part the fees payable.

12. In any case in which it appears to the Public Trustee that the circumstances of a trust proposed to be administered by him are, or probably will be, such as to render his duties in relation thereto exceptionally onerous, he may charge a special fee in respect of the performance of such duties, in addition to the fees payable in pursuance of these rules; and he may make the payment of, or agreement to pay, such special fee a condition of his accepting a trust. A statement of special fees charged by the Public Trustee under this rule shall be submitted to the Financial Secretary every half year.

Fees on addition s
to Capital.

13. If after twelve months from the date of taking over by the Public Trustee of any trusts, any property (not arising from accumulation of income of the trust property) shall become subject to the trust in addition to the property comprised therein at the date of acceptance thereof, there shall be paid, in respect of such additional property, a further fee of such amount as would have been payable upon the acceptance of a trust comprising such additional property only.

Fees on
Reversionary
property.

14. Where it appears to the Public Trustee, upon accepting a trust, that the trust property consists wholly or partially, of reversionary interests or other property not in possession, and not readily realizable (all which interests and property are hereinafter referred to as the "reversionary property") he may charge an additional fee, not exceeding Rupees Fifteen, upon acceptance of the trust. When such additional fee is charged, then—

- (a) upon acceptance of the trust, the reversionary property shall be excluded from the trust property for the purpose of ascertaining the amount of the fee payable in pursuance of these rules upon such acceptance, and the said fee shall be calculated and paid as if the trust property (if any) other than the reversionary property were alone comprised in the trust; and
- (b) so far as regards the reversionary property or any part thereof, the date on which the same falls into possession or is realized shall, for the purpose of ascertaining any capital fee payable in pursuance of these rules, be deemed to be the date of the acceptance of the trust, and the fee payable upon acceptance shall be payable at the first-mentioned date.

Recovery of fees by
instalments.

15. The Public Trustee may, in his discretion, arrange that the fee payable on acceptance of a trust or on investment of any property or part thereof subject to a trust, shall be noted as a claim against the trust, and shall be recovered by him from time to time by instalments out of the income of the trust funds as the same accrues due, provided that any amount which is or remains due from any trust in respect of fees payable in pursuance of these rules shall be recovered from the trust fund before the same is withdrawn or distributed among parties entitled thereto. Save as aforesaid, all fees leviable under the foregoing rules, shall be paid by the estates when the Public Trustee takes possession or on realization of the assets, as the case may be, and no further fees shall be charged on distribution.

Fees recovered on

16. Where after an order has been made under section 27 of the Ordinance, letters of administration are subsequently granted to the Public Trustee, the fees charged by him under Head I. (c) of Schedule I. shall be deemed to be a part payment of the fees payable to the Public Trustee under Head I. (a) of the said schedule.

Valuation of
assets.

17. For the purpose of calculating the fees, assets shall be valued as follows, namely:—

- (1) The value of movable assets (other than cash) shall be—
 - (a) the price realized on sale thereof, provided the sale takes place within three months from the date of the Public Trustee becoming vested therewith; or
 - (b) if there be no such sale within the time stated the value of such assets in the open market as certified by a professional expert, within the period of three months. Provided that if in any case the value of such assets or property shall in the Public Trustee's opinion be out of proportion to the cost of obtaining expert valuation, the Public Trustee may himself place a value upon them, unless the person or persons beneficially entitled to such assets shall demand an expert valuation.
- (2) The value of immovable assets (excluding rents) shall be—
 - (a) such value as may be agreed upon between the Public Trustee and the person beneficially interested in such assets; or
 - (b) if no such agreement is arrived at, the price realized on sale of such assets, provided the sale takes place within one year from the date of the Public Trustee becoming vested therewith;
 - (c) if there be no such sale within the time specified then in accordance with the market value thereof as certified by a professional expert within the period of one year. Provided that if in any case the value of such immovable assets shall in the opinion of the Public Trustee be out of proportion to the cost of obtaining an expert valuation the Public Trustee may himself place a value on them, unless the parties beneficially interested in such assets shall demand an expert valuation.

17A. Where for the purposes of winding up an estate, the Public Trustee undertakes the management or conduct of any trade or business, there shall be recovered in addition to the fee on the assets an income fee calculated on the gross receipts of such trade or business, exclusive of any advance made by the Public Trustee for the purposes of the management or conduct thereof.

Rectification of
errors.

18. Any error made in the fees charged against any estate, by reason of the estimated value thereof proving incorrect, may be rectified at any time, when the correct value has been ascertained.

Right of
inspection.

19. No person shall be entitled to inspect the books or accounts of the Public Trustee without first satisfying the Public Trustee that he is interested in the administration of the estates, the relative accounts of which he desires to inspect.

Application to
inspect.

20. Every person desiring such inspection shall, at least one clear day before the day on which he desires inspection, apply in writing to the Public Trustee setting forth the following particulars:—

- (a) His name and address.
- (b) The name of the estate as to which inspection is desired.
- (c) The nature of his interest in such estate.
- (d) The day on which he desires inspection.

Order on
application.

21. The Public Trustee shall, if he is satisfied as to the interest of the applicant in the estate or matter in question, appoint an hour on the day named in the application for inspection by the applicant under such provision as he thinks fit. If for any sufficient reason, inspection cannot be granted on the day named by the applicant, the Public Trustee shall appoint some other hour and day convenient to the applicant.

Copies of Accounts.

22. No person shall be entitled to obtain copies of, or extracts from, the accounts of the Public Trustee, or copies of or extracts from the reports and certificates of the auditor, unless he is a person who would be entitled to inspect the accounts, under rule 19.

23. A fee calculated at the rate of 36 cents per folio of 120 words shall be levied in respect of every copy or extract granted. Fees Leviable.
24. The fee leviable under rule 23 shall be paid to the Public Trustee in advance by the person liable to pay the same. Fees payable in advance.
25. All fees realized by the Public Trustee shall be credited by him to the public revenue once a month. Fees to be credited to revenue monthly.
26. When the realized assets of an estate are so small in value that the estate is practically indivisible amongst the beneficiaries or creditors entitled thereto, or when after division of an estate a balance remains which, by reason of the number of the beneficiaries or creditors and the small amount of the balance is practically indivisible amongst such beneficiaries or creditors, the accounts of such estate shall be closed and such assets or balance shall be transferred to the Closed Estates Accounts. Should any further assets of any estate so closed be realized, they shall be credited to such estate in the Closed Estates Account, and if the total credit of such closed estate be practically capable of division amongst the beneficiaries or creditors entitled thereto, the account of such closed estate shall be reopened in the Ledger Accounts of Estates, and the sum credited to such estate in the Closed Estates Account shall be transferred to the account so reopened, and shall be distributed amongst the parties entitled thereto. Provided that when the balance of an estate has been transferred to the Closed Estates Account, and no further assets have been credited to such estate in the Closed Estates Account for a period of twelve years from the date of such transfer, the amount standing to the credit of such estate in the Closed Estates Account shall be transferred to the public revenue, as if it were a sum transferable to such public revenue under the provisions of section 36 of the Ordinance. The Closed Estates Account.
27. (1) There shall be maintained in the Office of the Public Trustee a room which shall be provided with iron safes in which shall be deposited all such valuables, and valuable securities as are not directed by the Public Trustee to be deposited in the Bank. The Custody of Valuables.
- (2) The door of such room shall be secured by two locks the key of one of which shall be kept by the Public Trustee, and the key of the other by the Chief Accountant of his Department.
- (3) The keys of the safes shall be held by the Chief Accountant.
28. Where the Public Trustee is authorized to make payment to the Bank, Proctor, or other agent of a person entitled, the receipt of such Bank, Proctor, or other agent shall be a sufficient discharge to the Public Trustee. Receipt of Agent.
29. The Public Trustee may at any time require such evidence as he may think sufficient that a person is alive and is the person to whom any money or property is payable or transferable and may refuse payment or transfer until such evidence is produced. Evidence of identity.
30. When a person appearing to be beneficially entitled to any sum of money under a trust in the hands of the Public Trustee or to be interested in the trust property cannot be found, or it is not known whether he is living or dead, the Public Trustee may apply to the Court for directions as to the course to be taken with reference to such person, and until the Order of the Court is made shall retain any sum payable to such person, and may invest the same and accumulate the interest thereof subject to the provisions of section 36 of the Ordinance. Where a Beneficiary cannot be found.
31. When the Public Trustee has been appointed trustee under any will, the executor of the will or the administrator of the estate concerned, after obtaining probate or letters of administration with the will annexed, shall notify the appointment to the Public Trustee in writing, and, if so required by the Public Trustee, shall supply him with a copy of the will and of any trust instrument or other document affecting the trust, and such particulars as the Public Trustee may call for. On receipt of such information the Public Trustee shall decide whether the trust shall be accepted or refused, and shall give notice to the executor or administrator of such acceptance or refusal, and in case of acceptance shall notify in writing his consent to act in the trust and the terms upon which his consent is given. In case of appointment under a Will.
32. In so far as it is consistent with the conditions of the trust in each case, whenever the cash balance to the credit of the general account of any estate, after providing for ascertained current demands and outgoings, amounts to or exceeds Rs. 500 it shall be invested. But this rule is not to be interpreted as in any way prohibiting the investment of smaller balances. Investment of Cash balances.
33. When any assets in the hands of the Public Trustee are to be transferred to the credit of the public revenue under section 36 of the Ordinance, they shall, so far as they consist of movable property except cash, be first converted into cash. Where any such assets consist of immovable property, the Public Trustee shall make a special report of the matter to the Financial Secretary, and shall act in accordance with such orders as may be given by the Governor through the Financial Secretary. Transfers to Government.
34. The Public Trustee shall not at any time retain in his hands a larger cash balance than five hundred rupees; any excess above that sum shall, at the earliest day possible, be lodged to the credit of his account at the Bank. Office Cash Balance.
35. The interest declared on the Public Trustee's Account at the Bank shall, as far as possible, be allocated to the several estates represented on the current account and any unallotted balance shall be credited to revenue. Allocation of interest accruing.
36. The account of each estate or trust in regard to the income fees payable shall be adjusted at half-yearly intervals, and in regard to the capital fees at yearly intervals, computed from the date on which such estate or trust is taken over by the Public Trustee. Adjustment of fees.
37. The Public Trustee shall keep the accounts, statements, and records specified in Schedule II. Accounts and Records.
38. The accounts of the Public Trustee shall be subject to a continuous audit by the Auditor-General or any officer or officers on his staff authorized by him in that behalf; and for the purposes of such audit they shall be given access at all times to all books, records, or papers relating to the accounts, and to all valuables and securities held by the Public Trustee. Audit.
39. The Public Trustee shall prepare in respect of each financial year a statement showing all expenditure incidental to the working of the Ordinance and all fees received under the Ordinance. This statement shall be submitted to the Attorney-General after it has been certified as correct by the Auditor-General, and a copy of it shall be sent to the Deputy Financial Secretary. Annual Statement of Accounts.
40. Any person who is summoned under section 41 of the Ordinance by the Auditor-General shall be entitled to be paid his travelling and other reasonable expenses, which upon being certified by the Auditor-General shall be paid by the Public Trustee and debited to the estate concerned. Expenses of witnesses.
41. Except as provided in the foregoing rules regarding inspection and the furnishing of certified copies of accounts, and except as may be necessary for the purposes of the audit hereinbefore prescribed or of any inquiry or trial in a court of competent jurisdiction, the Public Trustee, his Deputy, and all other officers and servants of his department shall at all times observe strict secrecy in respect of all trusts accepted and administered by him. Public Trustee and his Staff to observe secrecy.

- Destruction of papers and records. 42. The books and papers enumerated hereunder may be destroyed or disposed of by the Public Trustee at the times mentioned therein or as soon thereafter as may be convenient.
- (a) Private papers, bills, receipts, account books, memoranda, and other similar documents of no permanent value received by the Public Trustee along with an estate, and which have not in the meantime been claimed by the next-of-kin or any other person entitled thereto, one year from the date of taking charge.
- (b) Correspondence relating to any estate two years after the estate is finally wound up.
- Repeal. 43. The rules published by Notification in the *Gazettes* of December 4, 1931, and July 22, 1932, respectively, are hereby repealed.

SCHEDULE I.

I.—Capital Fees.

(a) Fees payable in cases where the Public Trustee has obtained Probate or Letters of Administration, in Curatorship Cases and Managership Cases of the Estate of Lunatics and persons sentenced to imprisonment.

The scale of fees shall be as follows :—

- (1) Where the gross value of assets taken possession of or realized does not exceed Rs. 25,000, a fee of 3 per cent., with a minimum fee of Rs. 15.
- (2) Where the gross value of the assets exceeds Rs. 25,000 but does not exceed Rs. 50,000, a fee of 3 per cent. on Rs. 25,000 and of 2½ per cent. on the excess.
- (3) Where the gross value of assets exceeds Rs. 50,000 but does not exceed Rs. 100,000, a fee of 2½ per cent.
- (4) Where the gross value of assets exceeds Rs. 100,000 but does not exceed Rs. 200,000, a fee of 2 per cent.
- (5) Where the gross value of assets exceeds Rs. 200,000 but does not exceed Rs. 500,000, a fee of 1½ per cent.
- (6) Where the gross value of assets exceeds Rs. 500,000 but does not exceed Rs. 1,000,000, a fee of 1 per cent.
- (7) Where the gross value of assets exceeds Rs. 1,000,000, a fee of ¾ per cent.

(b) Fees payable in cases of all other Trusts.

The scale of fees chargeable shall be as follows :—

- (1) Where the gross value of the trust property or funds does not exceed Rs. 25,000 in value a fee of 2 per cent., with a minimum fee of Rs. 10.
- (2) Where the gross value of such trust property or funds exceeds Rs. 25,000 but does not exceed Rs. 50,000 in value a fee of 2 per cent. on Rs. 25,000 and of 1½ per cent. on the excess.
- (3) Where the gross value of such trust property or funds exceeds Rs. 50,000 but does not exceed Rs. 100,000 in value a fee of 1½ per cent.
- (4) Where the gross value of such trust property or funds exceeds Rs. 100,000 but does not exceed Rs. 500,000 in value a fee of 1 per cent.
- (5) Where the gross value of such trust property or funds exceeds Rs. 500,000 but does not exceed Rs. 1,000,000 in value a fee of ¾ per cent.
- (6) Where the gross value of such trust property or funds exceed Rs. 1,000,000 in value a fee of ½ per cent.

Provided that where the Public Trustee is appointed custodian Trustee the fee shall be one-half of the above and provided further that the amount payable as Capital Fees in the cases of assets falling in any class under groups (a) and (b) shall in no case be less than the maximum payable in respect of the class next lower in value.

(c) Fees payable in cases where the Public Trustee is in charge under an order made under section 27 of the Ordinance.

- (1) A fee of 1 per cent. on the value of assets taken possession of, collected, realized or sold.

II.—Income Fees.

Fees payable in respect of all estates under administration by the Public Trustee.

The fees payable and chargeable in respect of income realized and dealt with in due course of administration shall be as follows :—

(1) In respect of income on movable assets including investments—

- (a) a fee of 3 per cent. on all income as and when realized if such income does not exceed Rs. 3,000 per half year;
- (b) a fee of 2 per cent. in respect of any excess over and above the said sum of Rs. 3,000 per half year.

Provided that—

the minimum fee per half year shall be Rs. 2·50.

(2) In respect of income arising out of immovable property which shall include leasehold property—

- (a) a fee of 5 per cent. when such income does not exceed Rs. 6,000 per half year;
- (b) a fee of 3 per cent. when such income exceeds Rs. 6,000 per half year on any excess over the said sum of Rs. 6,000.

Provided that—

the minimum fee shall be Rs. 5 per half year. The fees chargeable on appointment as Attorney for the purpose of receiving and paying money shall be the same as the income fees on movable assets.

III.—Investment Fees.

- (1) On all capital moneys or trust funds invested by him a fee of ¼ per cent. on the amount of the investment.

IV.—Custody Fees.

In respect of every Last Will of any living person, of which the Public Trustee accepts the custody under the provisions of section 32c of the Ordinance, a fee of Rs. 5.

SCHEDULE II.

1. *Cash Book*.—This book shall contain full particulars of all daily receipts and payments distinguishing receipts and payments on Capital Account from those on Income Account.
2. *Journal*.—This book shall contain all the other daily transactions not recorded in the Cash Book.
3. *Ledgers*.—Separate Ledger Accounts shall be kept in respect of each estate, the postings to such accounts being made from the Cash Book and from the Journal. Each Ledger account shall clearly distinguish transactions on Capital Account from those on Income Account.
4. *Fees Ledger*.—This Ledger shall contain particulars of all fees recovered under the Ordinance and of credits thereof to General Revenue.
5. *Audit Account Ledger*.—This book shall contain particulars of all amounts recovered from estates on account of the cost of audit and of credits thereof to General Revenue.
6. *Register of Cash, Cheques and Money Orders, &c.*—A register shall be maintained in the manner prescribed by the Financial Regulations of Government for recording the receipt and disposal of money received under cover.
7. *Receipt Book*.—In respect of every sum paid to the Public Trustee receipts shall be issued from a numbered counterfoil receipt book in the form and manner prescribed by the Financial Regulations of Government.
8. *Asset Register Part I*.—This register shall contain in respect of each estate particulars of all assets, whether movable or immovable forming the capital of the Estate. In respect of movable assets, only the total value shall be entered in this book. This book shall also keep a record of all realizations of such assets and of their final disposal in distribution or winding up.

9. *Asset Register Part II.*—This book shall contain in respect of each estate a detailed list of all movable assets of which the total value only shall be entered in the Asset Register Part II. This book shall also keep a record of all realizations of such assets and of their final disposal in distribution or winding up.

10. *Title Deeds and Mortgage Bond Register.*—A separate register shall be maintained for recording the movement of title deeds and mortgage bonds which come into the hands of the Public Trustee.

11. *Claim Register Part I.*—This book shall contain in respect of each estate particulars of all debts accrued due at date of death and funeral expenses, &c., which are chargeable against the capital of the estate. It shall also record particulars of settlement of such debts.

12. *Claim Register Part II.*—This book shall contain in respect of each estate particulars of all debts other than those recorded in Claim Register Part I. of which the Public Trustee has notice and which cannot be settled immediately. It shall also record particulars of settlement of such debts.

13. *Rent Register.*—This book shall contain in respect of each estate particulars of all rents due and their receipts and also the amount and date of payment of M. C. Taxes if any.

14. *Investment Register.*—This book shall record in respect of each estate particulars of all investments and the receipts therefrom.

15. *Beneficiaries Register.*—This book shall contain in respect of each estate full particulars relating to all the beneficiaries of such estate.

16. *Case Register.*—This book shall be in the nature of a general index and shall contain a record of all estates, trusts, &c., which are taken over by the Public Trustee.

17. *Recoveries Register.*—This book shall contain a record of all advances made to estates from moneys under the control of the Public Trustee, the interest payable thereon and the repayments of such advances and interest thereon. In it shall also be recorded the advances, if any, made to beneficiaries to be recovered later from their prospective shares.

18. *Wills Register.*—This book shall contain the names and addresses of all persons depositing Will with the Public Trustee and shall indicate those in which the Public Trustee is appointed Executor and also the date of payment of the fee in respect of the deposit.

RULES.

1. The Superintendent of the estate, or his nominee to whom an estate canteen licence has been issued, or to whom the issue of a licence has been recommended, shall submit to the Assistant Superintendent of Excise of the Circle an application in Form Excise T 1 asking that trees be licensed.

2. On being informed by the Assistant Superintendent of Excise, whether he approves any or all of the trees mentioned in the application, the applicant shall pay to the Kachcheri on the trees approved by the Assistant Superintendent of Excise a sum as tree tax calculated at the following rates for each month or part of a month during which he holds a licence to tap these trees:—

	Per Month.
	Rs. c.
For each coconut tree ..	1 50
For each kitul tree ...	4 0

The tree tax shall be payable by the 20th of the month preceding that for which it is due. Failure to pay such tax shall be deemed to cancel the licences issued for the tapping of the trees for which the tax is payable.

3. He shall forward to the Assistant Superintendent of Excise, the Kachcheri receipt for the tax payable for the first month during which the trees are to be tapped.

4. On receipt of the Kachcheri receipt the Assistant Superintendent of Excise shall issue a licence in Form Excise T 2A (prescribed by Excise Notification No. 214 published in *Gazette* No. 7,834 of March 13, 1931) to tap the trees, and have the trees marked.

5. No tree shall be tapped, and no toddy shall be drawn therefrom until it has been licensed and marked in the manner aforesaid.

6. The Assistant Superintendent of Excise shall issue a pass in Form Excise T 3 (prescribed by Excise Notification No. 239 published in *Gazette* No. 7,963 of January 20, 1933) for the transport of the toddy to the estate canteen, when the toddy is not accompanied by the tapping licence on which it was drawn.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council held at the Municipal Office, on Saturday, December 10, 1932, at 9.30 a.m., pursuant to notice dated December 6, 1932.

Present : Mr. J. D. Brown, Chairman ; Mr. C. E. de Vos ; Mr. J. E. Perera ; Mr. C. L. Wickremasinghe ; Mr. T. Amarasuriya ; Mr. P. R. Gunasekara ; Mr. A. J. R. Scharenguivel ; Mr. A. M. Saheed ; and Mr. H. E. Ekanayaka.

The Chairman moved an amendment in item 17 (8) of the Minutes of the General Meeting of November 19, 1932 by substituting the word "January" for the word "Quarter" and by inserting the words "per mensem" after "Re. 1." This was agreed to.

The Minutes of the General Meeting, as amended, were taken as read, and confirmed.

2. To consider 4 applications for water service :—Resolved that the applications be allowed.

3. List of demolished buildings in Ward 4w :—Resolved that the rates be struck off.

4. Application from Mr. R. C. Mc Heyzer, Auctioneer, for a reduction of the licence fee of Rs. 50 paid by him in respect of his Auctioneer's licence for 1932 :—Resolved that the application be refused.

5. To consider the question of having fixed rates for the sale of meat and mutton :—Mr. J. E. Perera moved that the matter be referred to the Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation for consideration early next year. Mr. A. M. Saheed seconded.—Carried.

6. Letter from the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services suggesting the payment of a commuted rate of Rs. 30 per quarter in lieu of a charge by meter, for water supplied to the paying wards of the Government Hospital :—The Chairman moved that the offer made by the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services to pay a commuted rate of Rs. 30 per quarter, in lieu of a charge by meter, be accepted. Mr. C. L. Wickremasinghe seconded.—Carried.

7. To sanction the expenditure of a sum of Rs. 2,198.75 being the cost of 112 cubes of 1" metal and 41½ cubes of 1½" metal incurred under vote 41A in connection with the Pettigalawatta Drainage Scheme :—Resolved that the expenditure be sanctioned.

8. To consider the question of fixing a sliding scale of charges for current supplied for (a) lighting, (b) power, and (c) temporary lighting.

Resolved that, with effect from January 1, 1933, the following scale of charges be adopted :—

(a) *Lighting.*—

For the first 200 units per month at 45 cents per unit.

For 201 to 300 units per month at 40 cents per unit.

For over 300 units per month at 35 cents per unit.

(b) *Power.*—

For the first 100 units per month at 20 cents per unit.

For 101 to 200 units per month at 18 cents per unit.

For 201 to 300 units per month at 15 cents per unit.

For over 300 units per month at 12 cents per unit.

(c) With regard to charges for temporary lighting it was resolved that the following rules be adopted :—

(1) In the case of non-consumers that a charge of Re. 1 per unit be made with a minimum charge of Rs. 5; a connection fee of Rs. 5 to be charged provided the applicants bring in the mains to the nearest supply pole, as instructed by the Superintendent of the Electricity Department. The maximum length of time for which current is required to be ten days and any extension of time to be at the discretion of the Chairman.

(2) In the case of permanent consumers that a temporary load of not more than 20 per cent. of the load originally applied for be allowed on application made to the Chairman or the Superintendent of the Electricity Department.

Any load in excess of this amount to be subject to a connection fee of Rs. 5. The charge for current to be according to the scale fixed for lighting.

9. Arising out of the last item, and with the permission of the Council, Mr. C. L. Wickremasinghe moved that, as a special case, the rate of 25 cents per unit previously quoted for lighting the Galle Lighthouse be renewed and that the Superintendent of Coast Lights be informed accordingly. Mr. P. R. Gunasekara seconded.—Carried.

10. To consider the question of fencing the Esplanade :—Resolved that a temporary fence 1,000 feet in length be erected on the eastern side of the Esplanade and that sum of Rs. 50 be voted for this purpose.

Resolved further, that a sum of Rs. 80 be voted for the erection of four notice boards on the esplanade prohibiting the use of it as a public thoroughfare.

11. The recommendation of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment and Markets and Sanitation of October 22, 1932, on Mr. P. R. Gunasekara's motion of October 12, 1932, viz., that steps be taken to appoint a trained Sanitary Inspector in place of the Inspector who resigned a few months ago, was taken up for consideration at this stage.

The recommendation of the Standing Committee to the effect that the Chairman's selection of an Inspector to fill the present vacancy be not restricted in the manner suggested.

Mr. P. R. Gunasekara moved, as an amendment, that a trained Sanitary Inspector be appointed to fill the vacancy. Mr. J. E. Perera seconded.

The amendment was put to the meeting and declared lost.

Resolved that the above recommendation of the Standing Committees be adopted.

12. To sanction a vote of Rs. 300 as the remuneration to be paid to a temporary officer for examining and destroying old office records and investigating the present system of filing :—(1) Sanctioned. (2) Resolved that no documents be destroyed without the previous sanction of the Council.

13. Application from Dr. G. A. H. Arndt, Medical Officer of Health, for a loan of five months' salary for the purchase of a motor car :—Resolved that no departure be made from the existing rules and that the loan be restricted to three months' salary to be repayable in not more than 18 monthly instalments and 2½ per cent. interest charged on the amount outstanding.

14. Filling of the circus grounds of the Esplanade :—Resolved that the work be done by the unemployed.

15. At the conclusion of the meeting the Chairman said he desired to express his own personal regret that the Council was breaking up chiefly on account of some of the senior members having decided to retire. He referred especially to Messrs. C. E. de Vos and C. L. Wickremasinghe, who had been very old members of the Council, and said he appreciated very much their assistance to him in all matters that came up before the Council and the sound advice which they had always given, especially when legal points were raised. He would miss them very much in the New Council. He would also miss the presence of Messrs. P. R. Gunasekara and T. Amarasuriya, both of whom had been very keen critics, and whose work he very much appreciated.

He moved that they do place on record their grateful appreciation of the very valuable services rendered to the Council by these retiring members.

Mr. J. E. Perera in seconding, said it was very distressing to think that they were losing four colleagues at the same time. The wisdom and experience of Messrs. de Vos and C. L. Wickremasinghe especially in legal matters had been invaluable to the Council, and the Council was poorer by their retirement. They were also sorry to lose Messrs. P. R. Gunasekara and T. Amarasuriya, who had done much useful work in the Works Committee.

Messrs. de Vos, Wickremasinghe, Gunasekara, and Amarasuriya in turn thanked the Chairman and Mr. J. E. Perera for all the kind sentiments expressed.

Mr. P. R. Gunasekara pointed out that the Council spent annually about Rs. 10,000 as commission on the collection of rates and conservancy fees. He said the figures appeared to be too high and he moved that it be reduced by 15 per cent.

The Chairman undertook to place the matter before the Finance and Assessment Committee of the New Council and Mr. Gunasekara thereupon withdrew his motion.

Mr. A. M. Saheed suggested the inclusion of a sum of Rs. 100 under Head K.—Miscellaneous—for the supply of books to poor children. This was agreed to.

Mr. A. M. Saheed said that two accounting clerks and two criers for the Fish Auction Shed appeared to be unnecessary. He moved that the services of one clerk and one crier be dispensed with.

The Chairman undertook to bring the matter up before the Markets and Sanitation Committee of the New Council and Mr. Saheed thereupon withdrew his motion.

The Chairman moved that the Budget, as amended, be adopted, and that the taxes enumerated on page 11 be imposed and enforced.

Present :—Mr. J. D. Brown, Chairman ; Mr. J. E. Perera ; Mr. A. J. R. Scharenguivel ; Mr. A. M. Saheed ; Dr. H. E. Ekanayaka ; Mr. F. Magdon Ismail ; Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka ; Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya ; Mr. E. A. Paulas ; Mr. E. M. Karunaratna ; and Mr. R. L. Ephraums.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting and of the Special Meeting of December 10, 1932, copies thereof having been furnished to each member, were taken as read, and confirmed.

2. Arising out of the Minutes of the Special Meeting of December 10, 1932, Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka inquired what the Council proposed to do with the Rs. 10,400 which had been set apart for the relief of the unemployed. The Chairman explained that the Council had voted that sum at the last meeting for the purpose of providing work for the unemployed. The arrangement was that the Council should spend Rs. 200 a week and that the unemployed should be paid at the rate of 50 cents per diem. Works to be done were to receive the sanction of Council.

3. Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka next presented a petition from the latrine labourers of the Municipality for an increase of pay. The petition was tabled and the Chairman said that it would be inquired into.

4. The following motion stood in the name of Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka :—(1) That a temporary levy on the salaries of the officers of the Municipality be made as from January 1, 1933, in the following scale :—25 per cent. on Rs. 4,800 to Rs. 5,000 ; 33½ per cent. on Rs. 5,001 to Rs. 6,000 ; 40 per cent. on Rs. 6,001 and over. (2) That commuted allowances of all officers of the Municipality be reduced by 50 per cent. as from January 1, 1933. (3) That the commission and allowance paid to collectors on the collection of rates and conservancy fees be reduced by 50 per cent. as from January 1, 1933. (4) That seven collectors be appointed to collect rates and conservancy fees in the seven wards of the Municipality, on condition that they reside in their respective wards.

Mr. Dahanayaka asked the leave of Council to withdraw these motions on the undertaking given him by the Chairman that they will be considered by the Four Standing Committees.

With the permission of Council the Chairman then moved :—“That the question of the salaries and allowances of the Municipal Staff be considered at a meeting of the Four Standing Committees to be held on Saturday the 21st instant and that this meeting be immediately followed by an emergency meeting of the Council to confirm the recommendations made by the Four Standing Committees.” Mr. J. E. Perera seconded.

The motion was put to the meeting and carried unanimously.

5. To elect, by ballot, members to form the four Standing Committees for the year 1933 :—A ballot was taken and the Chairman declared that the following members had been elected :—

(1) Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment :—Mr. J. E. Perera, Mr. E. M. Karunaratna, and Mr. R. L. Ephraums.

(2) Standing Committee on Municipal Works :—Mr. J. E. Perera, Mr. A. J. R. Scharenguivel, and Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka.

(3) Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects :—Mr. A. M. Saheed, Mr. E. M. Karunaratna, and Mr. F. Magdon Ismail.

(4) Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation :—Mr. A. M. Saheed, Dr. H. E. Ekanayaka, and Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya.

6. Letter from Mr. P. H. E. Austin on behalf of the “Committee, Indian Soccer Team,” requesting permission to enclose the soccer ground on the Esplanade for the evening of January 30, 1933 :—

The Chairman moved that permission be given to enclose the soccer ground on the esplanade on payment to Council of the usual fee of Rs. 10. Mr. E. M. Karunaratna seconded.—Carried.

1. *Extracts from the Minutes of the Four Standing Committees on Law, Sanitation, Finance, and Municipal works, of January 21, 1933.*

(2) To consider the Chairman's motion at the General Meeting of January 14, 1933, viz., “That the question of the salaries and allowances of the Municipal Staff be considered at a Meeting of the Four Standing Committees to be held on Saturday, the 21st instant, and that this meeting be immediately followed by an emergency meeting of the Council to confirm the recommendations made by the Four Standing Committees”.—Recommended (1) that, with effect from January 1, 1933, a temporary levy on the salaries of the Municipal Staff be made according to the following scale :—(a) 10 per cent. on the net salaries of officers in receipt of salaries of Rs. 4,800 per annum and over ; (b) 7½ per cent. on the net salaries of officers in receipt of salaries less than Rs. 4,800, but not less than Rs. 1,800 ; (c) 5 per cent. on the net salaries of officers in receipt of salaries less than Rs. 1,800, but not less than Rs. 900. (2) That no levy be made in the case of the daily paid staff ; (3) that the levy be in force for one year ; and (4) that the pensions of officers be not affected by this levy.

(3) Travelling allowances and commission and allowances to collectors.—Recommended that these questions be deferred for full consideration at another meeting of the Four Standing Committees to be held on Saturday, February 4, 1933.

Resolution.

Resolved that the above recommendations be adopted.

2. Resolved that the February Meeting of Council be held on Saturday, February 18, at 9.30 A.M.

BY-LAWS made by the Puttalam Urban District Council, under sections 5 and 6 of the Dog Registration Ordinance, No. 25 of 1901, and section 245 of the Local Government Ordinance, No. 41 of 1920.

BY-LAWS.

1. In respect of every dog or bitch kept within the limits of the Urban District Council of Puttalam, the person having custody or possession of it shall pay an annual registration fee of Re. 1. For the purpose of this rule a year shall be computed from April 1 of one year to March 31 of the year following.

2. The occupier of every house within the town shall, before January 31 in each year, furnish to the person appointed by the Chairman of the Urban District Council to collect the registration fee (hereinafter called the collector) particulars required in the annexed form A in respect of each dog or bitch kept within such house or its premises.

3. A certificate of registration in the form B shall be issued on payment of the prescribed fee to the aforesaid collector or to the Secretary of the Urban District Council.

4. The collector or Secretary (1) may refuse to issue a certificate of registration for any dog or bitch, (a) which, in his opinion, is so diseased as to be a source of infection to other dogs, or (b) which, by reason of age, illness, or injury, is in his opinion unfit to live; or (2) the collector or Secretary may issue such certificate subject to any conditions he may consider suitable. Any owner dissatisfied with such refusal or conditions may appeal to the Chairman of the Urban District Council, who may confirm, modify, or cancel the same.

5. Every certificate of registration shall have the following conditions printed on it, viz.:—

This certificate is liable to be cancelled by the Chairman of the Urban District Council—

- Should the dog become so maimed or diseased as to be in the opinion of the Chairman unfit to live; or
- Should the Chairman be satisfied that the dog is habitually ill-treated or neglected by its owner; or
- Should the dog be permitted by its owner to associate with dogs belonging to others at a time when it is suffering from any infectious or contagious disease.

6. The person having the custody or possession of a dog or bitch in respect of which (a) a certificate is refused or (b) its certificate is cancelled because a condition attached thereto has not been complied with, shall, on being noticed to do so, produce the dog at the Urban District Council Office, at the time stated in the notice and there deliver it to an officer of the Urban District Council authorized to take charge of it. Such dogs shall then be dealt with in the manner determined by the Chairman.

7. The by-laws made by the Local Board of Puttalam under the Dog Registration Ordinance, No. 25 of 1901, dated August 26, 1926 (*Gazette* No. 7,543 of August 27, 1926), are repealed.

VITAL STATISTICS.**Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended March 4, 1933.**

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 213 (4 Burghers, 136 Sinhalese, 38 Tamils, 26 Moors, 7 Malays, and 2 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1933, viz., 292,200) was 38.0, as against 36.6 in the preceding week, 32.0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 30.3 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 155 (1 European, 5 Burghers, 94 Sinhalese, 24 Tamils, 24 Moors, 5 Malays, and 2 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 27.7, as against 28.6 in the previous week, 26.0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 24.5 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 155 total deaths, 38 were of infants under one year of age, as against 36 in the preceding week, 37 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 29 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 6.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Thirteen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 5 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), 3 in Kotahena South, 2 in Kotahena North and 1 each in New Bazaar, Wellawatta North and Wellawatta South, as against 18 in the previous week and 15 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Ten deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 2 each in New Bazaar, Slave Island, and Wellawatta North, and 1 each in St. Paul's, San Sebastian, Kotahena North, and Kollupitiya, as against 7 in the previous week and 8 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Two deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 1 each in Maradana East and Maradana South, as against 7 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

2. Fourteen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 11 in Maradana hospitals (including 4 deaths of non-residents), 2 in New Bazaar and 1 in St. Paul's, as against 7 in the previous week and 11 the weekly average for last year.

3. (a) Two deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered in Maradana hospitals (of non-residents), as against 3 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

(b) One death from *Enteric Fever* of a resident of Colombo town occurred at the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Angoda, during the week.

4. Two deaths from *Plague* of residents of Colombo town occurred at the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Angoda, during the week. No deaths were registered within the city.

5. Twenty deaths from *Enteritis* were registered, 12 from *Debility*, 4 from *Worms*, 3 each from *Diarrhoea* and *Dysentery*, 2 from *Infantile Convulsions*, 1 each from *Tetanus*, *Chickenpox*, *Puerperal Septicaemia*, and *Accidents*, and 66 from *Other Causes*.

6. Sixty-one cases of *Measles*, 52 of *Chickenpox*, 4 of *Enteric Fever*, 2 each of *Whooping Cough* and *Plague*, and 1 of *Smallpox* were reported during the week, as against 56, 54, 6, 1, 3, and 3 respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 79.1°, against 80.1° in the preceding week and 78.9° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.894 in., against 29.891 in. in the preceding week and 29.977 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 1.10 in., against 0.84 in. in the preceding week and nil in the corresponding week of the previous year.
