ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION OF THE NATIONAL NEWSPAPERS (CEYLON), LIMITED.

The regulations contained in the Table C in the schedule annexed to "The Joint Stock Companies Ordinance, 1861," shall apply in so far as they are not inconsistent with the Articles contained herein.

The following clauses in the said schedule shall not apply, to wit:—Clauses No. 2, 32, 45, 46, 47, 48, 49, 50, 87.

The Company may, by special resolution, alter and make provisions instead of, or in addition to, any of the regulations of the Company whether contained in these Articles or in any of the accepted clauses of the schedule to "The Joint Stock Companies Ordinance, 1861."

In addition to the accepted clauses of Table C in the schedule annexed to "The Joint Stock Companies Ordinance, 1861," to wit:—Clauses No. 1, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24, 25, 26, 27, 28, 29, 30, 31, 33, 34, 35, 36, 37, 38, 39, 40, 41, 42, 43, 44, 51, 52, 53, 54, 55, 56, 57, 58, 59, 60, 61, 62, 63, 64, 65, 66, 67, 68, 69, 70, 71, 72, 73, 74, 75, 76, 77, 78, 79, 80, 81, 82, 83, 84, 85, 86, the Company shall be governed by the regulations contained in the following Articles, but subject to repeal, addition, or alteration by special resolution:—

1. The Company may proceed to carry out the object or objects for which it is established, and to employ and apply its capital as soon after the registration of the Company as the Directors in their discretion shall think fit; and if the whole of the shares shall not have been subscribed, applied for, or allotted, as soon as, in the judgment of the Directors, a sufficient number of shares shall have been subscribed or applied for.

2. The nominal capital of the Company is Rupees Three hundred thousand (Rs. 300,000) divided into Sixty thousand shares of Rupees Five each.

3. The business of the Company shall be managed by the Directors either by themselves or through a Chairman or Managing Director of the Company, or with the assistance of an Agent, Manager, or Secretary of the Company to be appointed by the Directors for such time and on such terms as the Directors may determine or fix by agreement with the person or persons appointed to the office; and the Directors may impose and confer on the Chairman or Managing Director, Manager, or Secretary of the Company, any duties and powers of management and administration of the business of the Company as the Directors might think expedient for the efficient conduct of the business of the Company. If any Director shall be called upon to perform any extra services, the Directors

may arrange with such Director for such special remuneration for such services, either by way of salary, commission, or the payment of a lump sum of money, as they shall think fit.

4. The Directors shall have powers to make, and may make, such rules or regulations for the management of the business and property of the Company as they may from time to time think proper; and the Directors may carry on the business of the Company in such manner as they may deem most expedient; and the Directors in addition to the powers and authorities by any Ordinance or by these presents expressly conferred on them, may exercise all such powers, give all such consents, make all such arrangements, appoint all such agents, managers, secretaries, editors, sub-editors, correspondents, reporters, salesmen, clerks, accountants, and other officers, artisans, labourers, engravers, and other servants for such period or periods and with such remuneration, and at such salaries and upon such terms and conditions as the Directors may consider advisable, and may pay the expenses occasioned thereby out of the funds of the Company, and the Directors may from time to time remove, dismiss, or suspend all or any of the managers, agents, accountants, correspondents, reporters, salesman, officers, clerks, or other servants and employees of the Company for such reasons as they may consider fit, proper, and advisable and without assigning any cause for so doing.

5. The Directors shall have power to appoint a proctor or proctors, solicitor or solicitors, attorney or attorneys to assist in carrying on or protecting the business of the Company, on such terms, as they may consider proper, and from time to time to revoke such appointment.

6. The Directors may from time to time make such calls as they think fit upon the registered holders of shares, in respect of moneys unpaid thereon, and not by the conditions of allotment made payable at fixed times; and each shareholder shall pay the amount of every call so made on him to the persons and at the times and places appointed by the Directors, provided that at least two months' notice in writing shall be given to the shareholders of the time and place appointed for payment of each call.

7. The Directors shall have power to open from time to time on behalf of the Company any account or accounts with such bank or banks as they may select or appoint, and also by such signature or signatures as they may appoint to draw, accept, make, endorse, sign, and execute cheques, bills of exchange, promissory notes, bills of lading, notarial instruments, receipts, contracts, agreements, bonds, mortgages, and proxies to any proctor or proctors, and other documents on behalf of and to further the interest of the Company.

8. The Directors may from time to time borrow from bankers or others for the temporary purposes of the Company by way of bills, overdrafts, cash credits, on the security of goods, stock, or property of the Company, or by any other usual means of obtaining trading accommodations, such sum or sums of money as they in their discretion shall consider necessary or desirable for the proper and convenient administration of the Company's finances.

9. In addition to the moneys borrowed under the preceding clause the Directors may, with the approval of an Extraordinary General Meeting of the Company, from time to time at their discretion raise or borrow money from the Directors or other persons for the purposes of the Company, and may secure the repayment of the same by mortgage or charge upon the whole or any part of the assets and property of the Company.

10. It shall be lawful for the Directors, if authorized so to do by a special resolution of the Company in General Meeting, to arrange terms for the amalgamation of the Company with any other company or companies, or individual or individuals, or for the sale or disposal of the business, estates, and effects of the Company, or any part or parts, share or shares thereof, respectively, to any company or companies or persons, upon such terms and in such manner as the Directors may think fit, and the Directors shall have power to do all such things as may be necessary for perfecting such amalgamation, sale, or other disposition in accordance with the laws and regulations governing such transactions and in conformity with the terms of the special resolution of the Company in General Meeting. In case any terms so arranged by the Directors include or make necessary the dissolution of the Company, the Company shall be dissolved to that end.

11. The qualification of a Director shall be his holding not less than fifty shares in the Company, whether fully paid up or partly paid up. In the case of partly paid up shares all calls for the time being shall have been paid.

12. The number of Directors shall never be more than 11 nor less than 5, but this clause shall be construed as being directory only, and the continuing Director or Directors

may act for the directors notwithstanding any number of vacancies. Three shall form a quorum at a meeting of Directors.

13. The office of Director shall, *ipso facto*, be vacated—

- (a) If he resigns his office.
- (b) If he becomes bankrupt or insolvent or suspends payment or files a petition for the liquidation of his affairs.
- (c) If by reason of mental or bodily infirmity he becomes incapable of acting.
- (d) If he ceases to hold the required number of shares to qualify him for the office, or do not acquire the same within six months of his appointment or election.
- (e) If he ceases to ordinarily reside in Ceylon.

Provided that until an entry of his office having been so vacated be made in the minutes of the Board of Directors his acts as a Director shall be as effectual as if his office were not vacated.

14. A Director may hold any other office or position under the Company in conjunction with his Directorship (other than that of Auditor) and on such terms with respect to remuneration and otherwise as the Directors shall determine, and a Director may by himself or his firm act in any professional capacity (other than that of Auditor) for the Company, and shall be entitled to remuneration as if he were not a Director.

15. The Company may, by a special resolution, remove any Director before the expiration of his period of office, and may, by an ordinary resolution, appoint another person in his stead. The Director so appointed shall hold office only during such time as the Director in whose place he is appointed would have held the same if he had not been removed.

16. Every Director, every officer, every servant, of the Company, and their heirs, executors, and administrators shall be indemnified by the Company from all losses and expenses incurred by them in the discharge of their respective duties, except such as happen from their respective wilful acts or defaults; they shall be indemnified and protected from and against all actions, costs, charges, losses, and damages which they or anyone of them shall or may incur by reason of any contract entered into or by reason of any act done on behalf of the Company or in the discharge of their duties in the conduct of the business of the Company, except those that happen by or through their own wilful neglect or default; and no Director, officer, or servant of the Company, nor the heirs, executors, or administrators of any Director or officer or servant of the Company shall be liable for the acts of any other Director or officer or servant of the Company; and no Director or officer or servant of the Company, nor his heirs, executors, and administrators shall be liable for any loss or expense happening to the Company by the insufficiency or deficiency of title to any property acquired for or on behalf of the Company, or for the insufficiency or deficiency of any security in or upon which any of the moneys of the Company shall be invested, or for any loss or damage arising from bankruptcy, insolvency, or tortious act of any person with whom any moneys, securities, or effect shall be deposited, or for any other loss, damage, or misfortune whatsoever which shall happen in the execution of the duties of his office or in relation thereto, unless the same otherwise happen through his own wilful act or default.

17. The Chairman of the Board of Directors, with the approval of a majority of the Board, shall be at liberty to appoint one or two Directors from the Editorial or the Administrative Staffs and to remove from the Office of Director any person so appointed and upon the removal or retirement of any such person to appoint any other person in his place. The Directors so appointed shall be *ex officio* Directors within the meaning of these presents. General Meeting

Wednesday, February 1, 1933, at 3 p.m.

The Council met this day at 3 p.m., pursuant to notice, dated January 24, 1933.

1A. With the permission of Council, Mr. A. E. Goonesinha presented a petition, signed by certain residents of Wellawatta Ward, residing in the section between Lauries road and Wellawatta bridge, regarding the widening of this section of Galle road, and asked that it be submitted to the appropriate Committee for consideration.

2. Pursuant to notice, Mr. A. R. A. Razik moved—"That this Council is of opinion, considering the past record of Mr. Caldera, that in the interest of this Council and the ratepayers, the present arrangements made for carrying on the work of the Secretary are not satisfactory." Mr. M. L. M. Reyal seconded.

Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando, Mr. Aelian W. Pereira, and Mr. A. E. Goonesinha opposed the motion.

The Chairman explained facts, and deprecated the introduction of the motion.

Dr. E. A. Coorey moved, as an amendment, that the matter be referred to the Four Standing Committees for consideration and report. Dr. E. V. Ratnam seconded.

The amendment was put to the meeting and lost.

3. Pursuant to notice, the Chairman moved—"That the Council should resolve itself into a Committee of the whole Council to consider the following extracts from the proceedings of the Committees annexed to the agenda. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried.

Council in Committee—

The following Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Sanitation and Markets of January 16, 1933, were considered.

PUBLIC HEALTH DEPARTMENT.

(3) To consider a report of the Municipal Treasurer, dated November 28, 1932, regarding the payment of travelling allowance to the Acting City Microbiologist. Registered No. 2,138.—Recommended that a travelling allowance of Rs. 50 a month be paid to Mr. C. A. Woutersz while acting as the City Microbiologist.

VETERINARY DEPARTMENT.

(19) To consider :—(a) An application from the Staff Officer "A" Military Headquarters, for permission for the duties of Civilian Veterinary Surgeon to the horses and mules on the strength of the Regular Army in Ceylon, to be carried out by Capt. D. H. Rylands, Municipal Veterinary Surgeon, for a period of 6 months subject to the conditions mentioned in the application. (b) A memorandum of the Chairman. Registered No. 0,106.—Recommended that permission be granted on the usual terms.

The Chairman, Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando, Mr. M. L. M. Royal, and Mr. Aelian W. Pereira dissented.

(2) Recommended that the Aden licences be allocated at the discretion of the Chairman to :—(a) Mr. T. Suby, (b) Mr. Victor Casie Chetty.

Resolution of Council in Committee.

With regard to part (1) of the above recommendation regarding Indian licences, the Chairman stated that if the parties are agreeable he would like to issue licences in favour of one of the applicants in each group (b) and (c), the number of goats imported to be divided amongst themselves.

The Council agreed to this suggestion.

It was resolved that the above recommendation of the Standing Committees be adopted.

With regard to part (2) of the recommendation regarding Aden licences, Dr. E. A. Coorey moved that the matter be referred back to the Four Standing Committees for re-consideration. Mr. A. R. A. Razik seconded.

Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader opposed the motion and moved, as an amendment, that the recommendation of the Standing Committees be adopted. Mr. M. L. M. Royal seconded.

Mr. Aelian W. Pereira supported the amendment.

Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando supported the motion.

Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader spoke again.

The Chairman explained facts.

The amendment was put to the meeting and carried.

The amendment was thereafter put to the meeting as the substantive motion and carried.

The following Extracts from the Minutes of the Four Standing Committees (meeting together) of January 25, 1933, were considered.

PUBLIC HEALTH DEPARTMENT.

(4) With regard to the charges framed against Mr. W. F. Fonseka, Sanitary Inspector, to consider :—(a) The recommendation of the Sanitation Committee that Mr. Fonseka be dismissed. (b) The reference by Council on December 7, 1932, that the question of the punishment be considered by the Four Standing Committees. Registered No. 2,073.—Recommended that Mr. W. F. Fonseka revert to the Clerical Service on a reduced salary on the occurrence of a suitable vacancy and that in the meanwhile he be granted whatever half-pay leave may be available.

MUNICIPAL ENGINEER'S DEPARTMENT.

(8) To re-consider a plan and a detailed estimate amounting to Rs. 4,900 from the Municipal Engineer (supported by the Municipal Treasurer) for improving the acoustics of the Council Chamber. Registered No. 1,167.—Recommended.

The following Extracts from the Minutes of the Special Committee regarding Housing and Town Improvement of January 27, 1933, were considered.

(11) To consider a report of the Engineer, Buildings (supported by the Municipal Engineer), requesting sanction to lay street lines at No. G 461 (4), Havelock road (marked A—B on street line plan No. 1,404A, dated October 22, 1929, and signed by Mr. H. L. de S. Kulatileka, Engineer, Buildings) in order to allow an application to build. Note.—The owner has thrown all land within the said line free of compensation. Registered No. 2,345.—Recommended.

(12) To consider a report of the Municipal Engineer, dated December 23, 1932, requesting sanction to lay street lines off Chapel lane (first) (marked A and B on the street line plan No. 1,793, dated February 26, 1932, and signed by Mr. H. Wijenathan, Municipal Engineer). Registered No. 8.—Recommended.

(14) To consider :—(a) The petition, dated October 18, 1932, from certain Muslim residents of Colombo, praying that a motor bus halting place be allowed opposite Maradana Mosque. (b) A report thereon of the Municipal Engineer. Registered No. 2,146.—Recommended that two bus halting places be allowed, as shown in the tracing attached to papers, *i.e.*, one adjoining the entrance to the Mosque premises that is nearest to the present car stand and one on the opposite side of the road in front of the former Police Headquarters.

Resolution of Council in Committee.

Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader opposed the recommendation of the Committee and moved that it be referred back to the Committee for re-consideration. Dr. E. A. Coorey seconded.—Lost.

Resolved that the recommendation of the Special Committee be adopted.

4. The Chairman moved in Committee :—That the Council do resume. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried.

5. The Chairman moved in Council that the resolutions of Council in Committee, and the recommendations of the various Committees, subject to any amendments of such recommendations by the Council in Committee, be adopted. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.

Mr. Aelian W. Pereira moved, as an amendment, that the motion of the Chairman be accepted subject to the deletion of the parts (1) (a) and (c) of the recommendation of the Special Meeting of the Four Standing Committees (meeting together) of January 19, 1933. Mr. A. E. Goonesinha seconded.—Lost.

Aelian W. Pereira moved, as a further amendment, that the motion of the Chairman be accepted subject to the deletion of part (1) (a) of the recommendation of the Special Meeting of the Four Standing Committees (meeting together) of January 19, 1933. Mr. A. E. Goonesinha seconded.—Lost.

Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader moved, as an amendment, that the motion of the Chairman be accepted subject to the exclusion of item No. 14 of the extracts from the minutes of the Special Committee regarding Housing and Town Improvement of January 27, 1933, which should be referred to the Four Standing Committees or to the Special Committee regarding Housing and Town Improvement for re-consideration and report. Dr. E. V. Ratnam seconded.

Mr. A. E. Goonesinha urged that the recommendation of the Special Committee on this item be accepted.

Dr. E. A. Coorey supported the amendment. The amendment was put to the meeting and lost.

The motion of the Chairman was then put to the meeting and carried.

ANNEXURE A.

ORDINANCE No. , 1932.

An Ordinance to amend the Municipal Councils Ordinance, 1910.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice and consent of the State Council thereof, as follows :—

Short title.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Municipal Councils (Amendment) Ordinance, 1932.

Repeal of section 121 of Principal Ordinance and substitution of new section.

2. Section 121 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, 1910, is hereby repealed and the following is substituted therefor :—

Remission of rates in case of non-tenancy.

121 (1) If any building, other than a building containing furniture, is or remains untenanted, a proportionate remission of the rates and taxes payable in respect of such building may be allowed for the period during which the building is or remains untenanted.

(2) If any building containing furniture and registered with the Chairman as a building intended to be let as a furnished building is, or remains untenanted a proportionate remission of one-half of the rates and taxes payable in respect of such building may be allowed for the period during which such building is or remains untenanted.

(3) The period for which remission or proportionate remission of rates and taxes may be allowed shall be computed from the date on which a written notice, stating the fact that such building is untenanted and an address to which all communications arising out of such notice may be posted, is received by the Chairman, and no remission shall be allowed unless such written notice shall have been given to the Chairman.

(4) When any building which has been untenanted is re-occupied, written notice of the fact that such building is re-occupied shall be given to the Chairman. In the event of such notice not

being given within three days of re-occupation, the right to a proportionate remission of the rates and taxes shall be forfeited for a period of one month preceding the date on which such building became re-occupied.

(5) When with reference to any claim for remission under this section a dispute arises regarding the occupation of any building during any particular period, the decision of the Chairman thereon shall be notified in writing to the address given in the notice required under sub-sections (3) and (4) hereof; and such decision shall be final, unless a written application for revision of such decision be presented to the Chairman within seven days of the date upon which notice of such decision was posted or left at such address, when such decision shall be subject to revision, by the Council.

ANNEXURE B.

An Ordinance to amend the Municipal Councils Ordinance, 1910.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice and consent of the State Council thereof, as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as The Municipal Councils (Amendment) Ordinance, 1933.

2. Section 147 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, 1910, is amended as follows:—

(a) Sub-section (2) is repealed and the following is substituted therefor:—

“(2) Any surplus accruing from any such sale and conveyance (whether made and executed before or after the enactment of this sub-section) shall after deducting the amounts and costs specified in sub-section (5) be paid on demand (a) to the *fidei commissary* where the land or immovable property is subject a *fidei commissum* and (b) to the person entitled to the land or immovable property in all other cases.

(b) Sub-section (3) is renumbered as sub-section (4) and the word “ten” is substituted for the word “six” in line 1 thereof.

(c) Sub-section (4) is renumbered sub-section (5).

(d) The following is inserted as sub-section (3):

“(3) No such surplus shall be so paid unless the said demand is made within ten years of the date of the sale and conveyance. Provided that where the surplus is payable either to a *fidei commissary* who is not entitled to possession at that date or to a person who is then a minor, the said period shall not commence to run until the right to possess accrues or majority is attained respectively.”

(e) The following is inserted as sub-section (6):

“(6) After any payment is made in accordance with this section no further claim in respect of such surplus shall be allowed against the Council at the instance of any person whomsoever. Provided that nothing herein contained shall affect the liability of any person who may receive the whole or part of any such surplus to pay the same to the person lawfully entitled thereto.”

(f) The following is added as new sub-section (7):

“(7) In this section the expressions “*fidei commissary*” and “person entitled” shall mean the persons respectively who would have occupied such position in respect of the land or immovable property sold and conveyed, but for the title thereto vesting in the Council under the last preceding section.”

BY-LAWS.

1. In respect of every dog or bitch kept within the limits of the Urban District Council of Trincomalee, the person having custody or possession of it shall pay an annual

registration fee of Re. 1. For the purpose of this rule a year shall be computed from April 1 of one year to March 31 of the year following.

2. The occupier of every house within the town shall, before January 31 in each year, furnish to the person appointed by the Chairman of the Urban District Council to collect the registration fee (hereinafter called the Collector) particulars required in the annexed form A in respect of each dog or bitch kept within such house or its premises.

3. A certificate of registration in the Form B shall be issued on payment of the prescribed fee to the aforesaid collector or to the Secretary of the Urban District Council.

4. The Collector or Secretary (1) may refuse to issue a certificate of registration for any dog or bitch (a) which, in his opinion, is so diseased as to be a source of infection to other dogs, or (b) which, by reason of age, illness, or injury, is in his opinion unfit to live; or (2) the Collector or Secretary may issue such certificate subject to any conditions he may consider suitable. Any owner dissatisfied with such refusal or conditions may appeal to the Chairman of the Urban District Council, who may confirm, modify, or cancel the same.

5. Every certificate of registration shall have the following conditions printed on it, viz. :—

This certificate is liable to be cancelled by the Chairman of the Urban District Council,—

- Should the dog become so maimed or diseased as to be in the opinion of the Chairman unfit to live; or
- Should the Chairman be satisfied that the dog is habitually ill-treated or neglected by its owner; or
- Should the dog be permitted by its owner to associate with dogs belonging to others at a time when it is suffering from any infectious or contagious disease.

6. The person having the custody or possession of a dog or bitch in respect of which (a) a certificate is refused or (b) its certificate is cancelled because a condition attached thereto has not been complied with, shall, on being noticed to do so, produce the dog at the Urban District Council Office, at the time stated in the notice, and there deliver it to an officer of the Urban District Council authorized to take charge of it. Such dogs shall then be dealt with in the manner determined by the Chairman.

7. The by-laws made by the Local Board of Trincomalee under the Dog Registration Ordinance, No. 25 of 1901, dated July 2, 1903 (*Gazette* No. 5,930 of July 3, 1903), are repealed.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended March 11, 1933.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 228 (3 Europeans, 16 Burghers, 122 Sinhalese, 36 Tamils, 32 Moors, 9 Malays, and 10 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1933, viz., 292,200) was 40.7, as against 38.0 in the preceding week, 28.5 in the corresponding week of last year, and 30.3 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 144 (8 Burghers, 82 Sinhalese, 18 Tamils, 26 Moors, 3 Malays, and 7 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 25.7, as against 27.7 in the previous week, 27.8 in the corresponding week of last year, and 24.5 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 144 total deaths, 25 were of infants under one year of age, as against 38 in the preceding week, 31 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 29 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 17.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Ten deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 6 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), and 1 each in St. Paul's, San Sebastian, Kotahena South, and Slave Island, as against 13 in the previous week and 15 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Four deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 2 in Slave Island and 1 each in St. Paul's and New Bazaar, as against 10 in the previous week and 8 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Six deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 2 each in Kotahena North, Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), and Slave Island, as against 2 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

2. Six deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 3 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), and 1 each in Kotahena South, Maradana South, and Kollupitiya, as against 14 in the previous week and 11 the weekly average for last year.

3. Four deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 2 in Maradana hospitals (of non-residents), and 1 each in Kotahena South and Maradana North, as against 2 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

4. Nine deaths from *Debility* were registered, 5 each from *Diarrhoea and Worms*, 4 each from *Enteritis* and *Accidents*, 2 each from *Dysentery*, *Infantile Convulsions*, and *Homicide*, 1 each from *Tetanus*, *Suicide*, and *Puerperal Septicaemia*, and 78 from *Other Causes*.

5. *Reported Cases.*—Fifty-nine cases of *Chickenpox*, 47 of *Measles*, 3 each of *Enteric Fever* and *Mumps*, 2 of *Whooping Cough*, and 1 of *Diphtheria* were reported during the week, as against 52, 61, 4, nil, 2, and nil respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 79·2°, against 79·1° in the preceding week and 81·0° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·881 in., against 29·894 in. in the preceding week and 29·905 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was nil, against 1·10 in. in the preceding week and 0·71 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
