REGULATIONS REFERRED TO.

Rules framed under Section 27 of Ordinance No. 1 of 1909 for Hambantota District.

1. No person shall use any net other than a registered net within the following area of the territorial waters of the Island: The Hambantota District.

2. Application for the registration of a net shall be made to the Assistant Government Agent, Hambantota, on or before the fifteenth day of September of each year. Applications received thereafter will be allowed only if the delay is explained by the applicants to the satisfaction of the Assistant Government Agent.

3. The owner of a net on its being registered shall give the following particulars to the Patabendi Arachchi of the division within which he resides, for the purpose of being recorded in the register kept by him:—Name; Registration number; and in the case of a ma-dela or hana-dela, the length of the net. A ma-dela or hana-dela shall be registered for use only in any particular port or waraya. Removal to another port or waraya must have the previous sanction of the Assistant Government Agent, Hambantota.

4. The owner of a registered net shall keep attached thereto in a convenient position a wooden tab bearing the registration number.

5. The Assistant Government Agent may limit the number of nets to be used in any waraya or port within the aforementioned area.

6. The owners of ma-del and hana-del shall use them in the warayas or ports within the aforesaid area by turns according to priority and sequence of registration numbers.

The owner whose net is highest in order of registration shall begin. All ma-del or hana-del so registered shall be cast by turns as follows:—

- (1) One between 6 A.M. and 9 A.M.
- (2) One between 9 A.M. and 12 noon.
- (3) One between 12 noon and 3 P.M.
- (4) One between 3 P.M. and 6 P.M.

The use of baru-del, visi-del, nul-del, ma-del or hana-del for the catching of the following varieties of fish so long as such fish are in the inlets or warayas or ports in the aforesaid area is prohibited:—

Koralababbu, Bolla, Ehalamuruwa, and Koramburuwa.

7. As soon as a net is drawn ashore, the turn of the owner of the net next in order of registration shall begin. If any owner of a net does not exercise his rights of casting it on the occurrence of his turn, the owner of the net next in order of registration may do so. Any owner who has failed to avail himself of his turn shall not cast his net until his next turn.

8. In between the casting of a net and its being drawn ashore no person shall cast any net within the area of such net.

9. The Assistant Government Agent or the Patabendi Arachchi may for the purpose of these regulations inspect any registered net after due notice to the owner.

The sender of a Private Telegram or of a State Telegram addressed to a person, who is not entitled to send a Free State Telegram in reply, may prepay a reply, but the amount so prepaid shall not be less than 50 cents for a reply as "Ordinary Telegram" and Re. 1 for a reply as "Urgent Telegram." The amount so prepaid for a reply must not contain any fraction of 5 cents in the case of "Ordinary" and any fraction of 10 cents in the case of "Urgent" Telegrams. The sender of a Reply-paid Telegram should write the words "Reply-paid" in the space provided on the form (rules 15 (d) and 21).

(iii.) Rule 84 is repealed and the following is substituted therefor:—

84. If the reply exceeds the amount notified in the Reply Telegram Form, the difference must be paid in cash or stamps by the sender of the reply (rule 56). If, on the other hand, the amount notified on the Reply Telegram Form exceeds that of the reply, the difference, if it be not less than Re. 1 will be refunded to the sender of the original telegram on application to the Superintendent, Telegraph Check Office, Colombo. No refund will be given on a Reply Telegram Form which has been prepaid by another Reply Telegram Form, and not by cash or stamps.

(iv.) Rule 124 (d) is repealed and the following is substituted therefor:—

124 (d). The full amount of every sum prepaid for a reply (rule 82) when the addressee has not made use of the Reply Telegram Form or has refused it (rule 86), or, when the Reply Telegram Form has been used, the difference, if it be not less than Re. 1 between the value of the Reply Telegram Form and the cost of the reply (rule 84).

The Ceylon Police Saving Association Ordinance, No. 4 of 1928.

IT is hereby notified that at a General Meeting of the members of the Ceylon Police Saving Association duly convened and held at Police Headquarters on Wednesday, February 24, 1932, at 3 P.M., the rules and the relative schedules and forms framed under Ordinance No. 4 of 1928, in pursuance of the provisions of sections 6 and 7 of the said Ordinance, duly confirmed, approved, and adopted, the rules of the Police Saving Association in substitution for and to the exclusion of all the existing rules and relative schedules.

RULES OF THE CEYLON POLICE SAVING ASSOCIATION.

(Framed under Ordinance No. 4 of 1928.)

Membership.

1. Any member of the Ceylon Police Force, of the Ceylon Government Clerical Service while attached to or serving in the Ceylon Police Department, of the Staff of Lecturers and Instructors attached to or serving in the Ceylon Police Training School, or of the Senior Division of the Ceylon Police Boys' Brigade may become a member of the Association as hereinafter provided.

2. Every person eligible for admission as a member of the Association and desirous of becoming a member shall apply to the Treasurer of the Association, in the form prescribed, to open one or more account, or accounts, in his name. On receipt of such application duly completed, the Treasurer of the Association shall enrol the applicant as a member and shall open the required number of accounts as from January 1 of the year immediately following that on which the application is made. Provided that no application received between December 15 and December 31 of any year shall be entertained.

3. Every applicant shall, when applying to open an account or accounts, appoint a nominee or nominees to whom all moneys due in respect of such account or accounts shall, in the event of his death, be paid. Every appointment of a nominee or nominees, so made, shall remain in force unless or until it is cancelled, and a fresh appointment made by the member in the form prescribed.

4. There shall be a fixed subscription of one rupee per mensem on each account opened. Provided that—

(1) No recruit shall be eligible for membership until he has passed out of the Ceylon Police Training School, except that in the case of a recruit who has been recruited from the Senior Division of the Ceylon Police Boys' Brigade, and who has already become a member, such recruit may continue to be a member while at the Training School.

(2) Subject to the provisions of sub-clause (3) of this rule—

- (a) A member of the Senior Division of the Ceylon Police Boys' Brigade and a Third Class Police Constable, respectively, may open one account only.
- (b) A constable other than a Third Class Constable may open three accounts.
- (c) A Sergeant may open five accounts.
- (d) A Sub-Inspector, a Lecturer, attached to or serving in the Police Training School, a Sergeant-Major or a Clerk in Class III. of the Ceylon Government Clerical Service attached to or serving in the Ceylon Police Department, respectively, may open ten accounts.
- (e) An Inspector, a European Police Sergeant, or a Clerk in or above Class II. of the Ceylon Government Clerical Service may open twenty-five accounts.
- (f) A Chief Inspector or any officer of higher rank, respectively, may open an unlimited number of accounts as desired.

(3) Provided that any member subscribing under sub-clause (2), paragraphs (a), (b), (c), (d), and (e) of this rule, may after 5 years from the date of his admission as a member open an additional account for each account to which he has subscribed for five years.

5. (a) Each member or, should he die, his nominee, next of kin or heirs-at-law shall receive all money subscribed by him plus interest as shown in the table of credit set out in Schedule A and all other moneys (if any) due to him under the rules, after deduction therefrom of any sum which such member may owe to any Government or Departmental account.

6. In the case of all or any accounts or account opened on or before December 31, 1930, any member, provided that he has subscribed to an account or accounts for at least five years, may close such account or accounts by giving notice in writing to the Treasurer of his intention to do so. Upon receipt by the Treasurer of such notice, the account or accounts shall be closed and all moneys subscribed by such member, plus interest as shown in the table of credit, and all other moneys (if any) due to him by the Association, shall be paid to him, after deduction therefrom of any sum which he may owe to any Government or Departmental account.

6A. In the case of all or any accounts or account opened on and after January 1, 1931, any member, provided that he has subscribed to an account or accounts for at least five years, may close such account or accounts by giving notice in writing to the Treasurer of his intention to do so. Upon receipt by the Treasurer of such notice—

- (a) Any account or accounts which the member shall have subscribed to for a continuous period of at least fifteen years shall be closed and all moneys subscribed by such member, plus interest as shown in the table of credit, and all other moneys (if any) due to him by the association, shall be paid to him, after deduction therefrom of any sum which he may owe to any Government or Departmental account.
- (b) Any account or accounts which the member shall have subscribed to for a continuous period of less than fifteen years shall be closed and all moneys subscribed by such member shall be paid to him, after deduction therefrom of any sum which he may owe to any Government or Departmental account, but such member shall not be entitled to any interest or other moneys whatsoever out of the fund of the Association.

6B. Where a member subscribing under rule 4 (2) (b), (c), (d), (e), or (f) reverts to a rank or appointment which would alter the number of accounts which such member may open under this rule, the Committee of Management may, on the application of the member, allow the closing of one or more of the member's accounts with payment of such interest as may be due at the time of the closing of the account or accounts.

6c. In the event of the amount due to any member under rule 6, as hereby amended, or under rule 6A being in excess of one hundred rupees he shall not be entitled to receive payment of the amount so due until the expiration of three calendar months after notice in writing of intention to close an account or accounts shall have been received by the Treasurer.

7. In the event of the retirement, resignation, transfer, discharge or dismissal, from or the termination of his attachment to the Police Force, the Police Department, the Ceylon Police Training School, the Senior Division of the Ceylon Police Boys' Brigade, as the case may be, of any member, his account or accounts shall be closed, and he shall be paid all money subscribed by him, plus interest as shown in the table of credit, and all other moneys (if any) due to him, after deduction therefrom of any sum which he may owe to any Government or Departmental account.

8. In the event of the death of a member his account or accounts shall be closed and all money subscribed by him, plus interest as shown in the table of credit, and all other moneys (if any) due to him, shall be paid to his nominee, or if there be no nominee duly appointed, then to his heir or heirs-at-law, after deduction therefrom of any sum which such deceased member may owe to any Government or Departmental account.

9. In the case of the death of any member where the amount of his subscription, plus interest and all other moneys (if any) due to him, shall not amount to one thousand rupees and where the Committee shall be satisfied by affidavit that the member died intestate and that no letters of administration are required by law to be taken out, the Committee shall be at liberty to authorize the Treasurer to pay all moneys subscribed by such deceased member, plus interest as shown in the table of credit, and all other moneys (if any) due to him, subject to the deductions aforesaid (if any) to his nominee, or if there be no nominee duly appointed, then to any person or persons appearing to the Committee to be entitled thereto as heir or heirs-at-law of the deceased member, and such payment, when made, shall be a full discharge to the Association from all further liability in respect of the moneys so paid.

10. Where the nominee, heir or heirs-at-law of a member is a minor, the moneys to which such nominee or heir-at-law may be entitled shall be deposited in a Government Savings Bank (including the Ceylon Savings Bank or the Post Office Savings Bank) in the name of such minor.

11. In the event of a member being adjudicated, under the provisions of the Civil Procedure Code, 1889, or any subsisting statutory modification thereof, to be of unsound mind, and incapable of managing his affairs, his account or accounts shall be closed and all money subscribed by him, plus interest as shown in the table of credit, and all other moneys (if any) due to him shall be paid to the manager of his estate or to such persons as the court may direct under the provisions of sections 567 or 577 of the Civil Procedure Code, 1889, as the case may be, or any statutory modification thereof.

12. Any member of the Association being a European Police Sergeant, European Sub-Inspector, European Inspector, European Chief Inspector, Probationer, or an officer above the rank of a Probationer, who is about to take leave out of the Island shall before leaving the Island, pay the total amount of his subscriptions for the time he shall be absent from the Island on leave, otherwise his account or accounts shall be closed and all money subscribed by him shall be paid to him subject to deduction therefrom of any sums which he may owe to any Government or Departmental account, but such member shall not be entitled to any interest or other moneys whatsoever out of the funds of the Association. Such member may open a fresh account or accounts in terms of the rules on his return to the Island.

Committee of Management.

13. There shall be a Committee of Management not exceeding seven in number (all of whom must be members of the Association) consisting of (1) the Inspector-General of Police or Acting Inspector-General of Police for the time being and from time to time, who shall be *ex officio* President of the Association, (2) a Chairman of the Committee of Management, (3) a Treasurer, (4) a Secretary, and (5) three other members (two of whom must not be below the rank of Superintendent of Police) stationed in Colombo. All members of the Committee except the President of the Association shall be elected annually at the Annual General Meeting in each year and shall hold office until the following Annual General Meeting.

14. Subject to the proviso next hereinafter contained the Committee of Management may meet for the dispatch of business, adjourn, and otherwise regulate their meetings as they think fit and determine the quorum necessary for the transaction of business; until otherwise determined three members of the Committee of Management shall be a quorum. Provided always that the Committee of Management shall meet at least once in each month.

15. A member of the Committee of Management may at any time summon a meeting of the Committee.

16. All meetings of the Committee of Management shall be presided over by the President; or if he be not present at the time appointed for holding the meeting, by the Chairman of the Committee; or if he be not present at such time as aforesaid the members of the Committee shall choose one of their number to be Chairman of such meeting.

17. The Committee of Management shall cause minutes to be made in books to be provided for the purpose of the following matters, namely:—

- (a) Of all appointments of officers, clerks, assistants, and workers made by the Committee of Management.
- (b) Of the names of the Members of the Committee present at each meeting of the Committee.
- (c) Of the resolutions and proceedings of all General Meetings.
- (d) Of the resolutions and proceedings of all meetings of the Committee of Management.
- (e) Of all orders made by the Committee of Management.
- (f) Of the use of the corporate seal.

18. All such minutes shall be signed by the person or one of the persons who shall have presided as Chairman at the General Meeting or the meeting of the Committee of Management at which the business minuted shall have been transacted or by the person or one of the persons who shall preside as Chairman at the next ensuing General Meeting or meeting of the Committee of Management, respectively, and all minutes purporting to have been signed by any Chairman of any General Meeting or meeting of the Committee of Management, respectively, shall for all purposes whatsoever be *prima facie* evidence of the actual and regular passing of the resolutions and the actual and regular transaction or occurrence of the proceedings and other matters purporting to be so recorded and of the regularity of the meeting at which the same shall have taken place and of the chairmanship and signature of the person appearing to have signed as Chairman and of the date on which such meeting was held.

19. The office of member of the Committee of Management shall be vacated—

- (i.) If he ceases to be a member of the Ceylon Police Force.
- (ii.) If he ceases to be a member of the Association.
- (iii.) If he becomes bankrupt or insolvent or suspends payment or files a petition for the liquidation of his affairs or compounds with his creditors.
- (iv.) If he is absent from Ceylon.
- (v.) If he resigns from office.

20. The Committee of Management shall have a power at any time and from time to time to fill any casual vacancies in their number.

21. The Committee of Management shall, subject to the provisions of the Ordinance and of these rules, have full power and authority generally to administer for the purposes of the Association all property belonging to the Association and to govern and direct and decide the business and affairs of the Association and all matters whatsoever connected therewith. They shall have power to defray all expenses necessary for the working of the Association. The generality of the powers conferred by this rule on the Committee of Management shall not be limited by any rule conferring any special or expressed power. Provided that the Committee of Management shall not exercise any powers which are by the Ordinance or by the rules declared to be exercisable by the Association in General Meeting. Provided also that no rule made by the Association in General Meeting shall invalidate any prior act of the Committee of Management which would have been valid if such rule had not been made.

22. In furtherance and not in limitation of and without prejudice to the general powers conferred or implied in the last preceding rule and of the other powers conferred by these rules the Committee of Management shall have the following special powers:—

- (1) To open on behalf of the Association any account or accounts, with such bank or banks as the Committee of Management may select or appoint, and also by such signatures as it may appoint, draw, endorse, sign, and execute cheques, receipts, contracts and agreements, proxies to any Proctor or Proctors, and other documents on behalf of and to further the interests of the Association.
- (2) To arrange terms for the sale or disposal of the property of the Association both immovable and movable or any part or parts thereof upon such terms and in such manner as the Committee of Management may think fit and to do all such things as may be necessary for carrying such sale or other disposition into effect.
- (3) To appoint and dismiss all such officers, clerks, assistants, and workers as may be necessary for carrying on the affairs of the Association and to determine the remuneration to be paid to them.
- (4) To appoint an auditor or auditors, a proctor or proctors, solicitor or solicitors, and attorney or attorneys to assist in carrying on or protecting the business of the Association on such terms as to the Committee of Management may seem proper and from time to time to revoke such appointment.

- (5) To institute, conduct, defend, compound, or abandon any action, suit, prosecution, or legal proceedings by or against the Association or its officers or otherwise concerning the affairs of the Association and also to compound and allow time for payment or satisfaction of any debts due and of any claims and demands by or against the Association.
- (6) To refer any claims and demands by or against the Association to arbitration and observe and perform the awards.
- (7) To make and give receipts, releases, and other discharges for money payable to the Association and for claims and demands of the Association.
- (8) To act for the Association in all matters relating to bankrupts and insolvents.
- (9) To invest the moneys of the Association, which the Committee of Management may consider not immediately required for the purposes thereof, upon such securities and in such manner as prescribed by the Ordinance.

Meetings.

23. A General Meeting of the Association shall be held once in every year when there shall be submitted a balance sheet, a statement of assets and liabilities, and an account of receipts and disbursements during the previous twelve months. Such General Meetings shall be called Annual General Meetings, all other meetings of the Association shall be called Special General Meetings.

24. The Committee of Management may whenever they think fit call a General Meeting of the Association, and the Committee of Management shall do so upon a requisition made in writing by not less than one-tenth of the number of members entitled to vote.

25. Any requisition made under the provisions of rule 24 shall express the object of the meeting proposed to be called, shall be addressed to the Committee, and shall be sent to the office of the Association for the time being. Upon receipt of such requisition the Committee of Management shall forthwith proceed to convene a Special General Meeting to be held at such time and place as they shall determine. If they do not proceed to convene the same within seven days from the delivery of the requisition the requisitionists may themselves convene a Special General Meeting to be held at such place and at such time as the members convening the meeting may themselves fix.

26. Any member may on giving not less than ten days' previous notice of any resolution submit the same to a meeting. Such notice shall be given by leaving a copy of the resolution at the office of the Association for the time being.

27. Seven days' notice at least of every General Meeting, annual or special, and by whomsoever convened, specifying the place, date, hour of the meeting, and the objects and business of the meeting shall be given by advertisement in Part II. of the "Ceylon Police Gazette".

28. Every Annual General Meeting shall be competent without special notice having been given of the purposes for which it is convened or of the business to be transacted thereat to receive and discuss any reports and accounts presented thereto by the Committee of Management and to pass resolutions in approval or disapproval thereof; to elect the Chairman of the Committee of Management, Treasurer, Secretary, and the three unofficial members of the Committee of Management for the ensuing year, and if necessary to fix the remuneration of the Treasurer, and Secretary and to enter upon, discuss, and transact any business whatever of which special mention shall have been made in the notice or notices upon which the meetings was convened.

29. With the exceptions mentioned in the foregoing rule as to the business which may be transacted at Annual General Meetings without notice, no General Meeting, annual or special, shall be competent to enter upon, discuss, or transact any business which has not been specially mentioned in the notice or notices upon which it was convened.

30. No business shall be transacted at any General Meeting unless there shall be present in person at the commencement of business not less than twenty members comprising at least three members of the Committee, and one officer above the rank of Inspector, one Inspector, one European Police Sergeant, one Sub-Inspector, one clerk, one sergeant, and one constable.

31. If at the expiration of half an hour from the time appointed for the meeting the required number of persons shall not be present at the meeting, the meeting shall be dissolved.

32. The President or, if he be not present within 15 minutes after the time appointed for the meeting, the Chairman of the Committee of Management shall be entitled to take the Chair at every General Meeting, whether annual or special; but if there be no Chairman, or if at any meeting he shall not be present within 15 minutes after the time appointed for the meeting or if he shall refuse to take the Chair, the members present shall choose an officer above the rank of Inspector present at the meeting to be Chairman.

33. Minutes of the proceedings of every General Meeting whether annual or special shall be entered in a book to be kept for the purpose and shall when so entered be signed as soon as practicable by the Chairman of the same meeting or by that Chairman of the succeeding meeting and the same when so entered and signed shall be evidence of all such proceedings and of the proper election of the Chairman.

34. At any meeting every resolution shall be decided by a show of hands upon which every member present shall have one vote only. In case there shall be an equality of votes the Chairman at such meeting shall be entitled to give a casting vote in addition to the vote to which he may be entitled as a member. A declaration by the Chairman that a resolution has been carried and an entry to that effect in the Minute Book of the Association shall be sufficient evidence of the fact without proof of the number of votes recorded in favour of or against such resolution.

Profits.

35. Any profits accruing to the Association shall in the discretion of the Committee of Management be used or applied for all or any of the following purposes:—

- (1) Defraying the expenses of the Association.
- (2) Forming a reserve fund.
- (3) Declaring a bonus.

36. All bonuses declared shall, subject to the proviso next hereafter following, be added to the amount to be paid to a member or to his nominee or heir or heirs-at-law in terms of rules 7, 8, and 9; provided that no member who is dismissed from the Police Force or who closes his account or accounts under rule 6 or rule 6A hereof or whose accounts or accounts shall be closed under rule 12 hereof shall be entitled to be paid any bonus. All bonuses not paid under this present proviso shall be treated as profits of the Association.

37. The Committee of Management may from time to time apply the whole or any portion of the reserve fund and the income arising therefrom to the same purposes as are hereinbefore provided in the case of profits.

Accounts.

38. (a) The Treasurer shall keep a Register in such form as to the Committee of Management shall seem fit, in which the name of every person who at the date of passing the Ordinance is a member of the Association and of every person thereafter duly enrolled a member of the Association shall be inscribed.

(b) The Register shall contain the following particulars:—

- (i.) Rank and regimental number (if any) of each member.
- (ii.) The year in which any person was enrolled as a member.
- (iii.) The date at which any person ceased to be a member.
- (iv.) The number of accounts opened by each member.

39. The Treasurer shall further keep true accounts of all sums of money received and expended by the Association and of the matters in respect of which such receipt and expenditure shall take place, and of the assets, credits, and liabilities of the Association; and the accounts shall be kept in such books and in such manner at the office of the Association as the Committee of Management think fit and shall be open at all reasonable times to the inspection of the members.

40. At the Annual General Meeting in every year the Committee of Management shall lay before the Association a financial statement showing the position of the Association for the preceding financial year and a balance sheet containing a summary of the property and liabilities of the Association made up as at the end of the same period.

41. Every such statement shall be accompanied by a report as to the state and condition of the Association, and as to the amount which they recommend to be credited out of the profits by way of bonus to the accounts of the members, and the financial statement, report, and balance sheet shall be signed by all the members of the Committee of Management.

42. A copy of such balance sheet shall, at least seven days previous to such meetings, be published in Part II. of the "Ceylon Police Gazette".

43. At least once in every month the Treasurer shall lay before the Committee of Management a statement showing money invested, number of accounts subscribed to, money received on such accounts, money owing to members or their nominees or heirs-at-law in respect of closed accounts, money paid to members, expenditure incurred, cash in hand and at the bank.

Interpretation.

44. In the interpretation of these rules the following words and expressions shall have the following meanings, unless such meanings be inconsistent with, or repugnant to, the subject or context :—

Association.—The word Association means "The Ceylon Police Saving Association," incorporated under the Ceylon Police Saving Association Ordinance, No. 4 of 1928.

Ordinance.—The word "Ordinance" means the said The Ceylon Police Saving Association Ordinance, No. 4 of 1928, and any statutory modification thereof.

Member.—The word "member" means a person duly admitted as a member of the corporation in accordance with the rules of the corporation for the time being in force.

Rules.—The word "rules" means the rules of the corporation from time to time in force.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended February 27, 1932.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 184 (2 Europeans, 9 Burghers, 113 Sinhalese, 30 Tamils, 23 Moors, 4 Malays, and 3 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1932, viz., 291,260) was 33.0, as against 34.3 in the preceding week, 30.5 in the corresponding week of last year, and 31.1 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 139 (3 Burghers, 84 Sinhalese, 16 Tamils, 28 Moors, 4 Malays, and 4 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 25.0, as against 25.3 in the previous week, 23.2 in the corresponding week of last year, and 25.2 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 139 total deaths, 26 were of infants under one year of age, as against 27 in the preceding week, 30 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 29 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 9.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Twenty-one deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 12 in Maradana hospitals (including 5 deaths of non-residents), 2 each in Kotahena North and New Bazaar and 1 each in St. Paul's, San

Sebastian, Maradana South, Slave Island, and Wellawatta North, as against 20 in the previous week and 17 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Six deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 2 each in New Bazaar and Slave Island and 1 each in San Sebastian and Kollupitiya, as against 8 in the previous week and 10 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Four deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 1 each in St. Paul's, Maradana hospitals (of a non-resident), Maradana North, and Slave Island, as against 3 in the previous week and 5 the weekly average for last year.

2. (a) Nine deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 3 in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), 2 in Slave Island, and 1 each in San Sebastian, Kotahena North, New Bazaar, and Wellawatta South, as against 14 in the previous week and 12 the weekly average for last year.

(b) One death from *Phthisis*, of a resident of Colombo town, occurred at the Anti-Tuberculosis Hospital, Ragama, during the week.

3. (a) Two deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), as against 3 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

(b) One death from *Enteric Fever*, of a resident of Colombo town, occurred at the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Angoda, during the week.

4. One death from *Plague* was registered in St. Paul's. The number registered during the preceding week as also the weekly average for last year was 1.

5. Six deaths each from *Debility* and *Puerperal Septicæmia* were registered, 4 each from *Enteritis*, *Infantile Convulsions*, and *Worms*, 2 each from *Dysentery* and *Tetanus*, 1 each from *Diarrhoea* and *Accidents*, and 66 from *Other Causes*.

6. **Reported Cases.**—Sixty-four cases of *Chickengpox* (including 1 in Port), 8 of *Enteric Fever*, 6 of *Whooping Cough*, 4 of *Measles*, and 1 of *Plague* were reported during the week, as against 33, 8, 11, 1, and 1, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 79.3°, against 77.9° in the preceding week and 81.4° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.954 in., against 29.960 in. in the preceding week and 29.920 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 2.26 in., against 1.29 in. in the preceding week and nil in the corresponding week of the previous year.
