Short title.

1 This Ordinance may be cited as the Ceylon Railways Amendment Ordinance, 1932.

Repeal of section 5A of the principal Ordinance.

2 Section 5A of the Ceylon Railways Ordinance, 1902 (hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Ordinance"), is repealed.

Amendment of Schedule of Rates of Railway Fares in principal Ordinance.

3 The Schedule of "Rates of Railway Fares" to the principal Ordinance is amended as follows:—

(a) The portion entitled "Passengers" by adding the following words at the end:—

"Any fractional part of 5 cents which is below 2½ cents will not be reckoned or charged for. Every fractional part of 5 cents equal to or above 2½ cents will be reckoned and charged for as 5 cents. Every fractional part of a mile will be reckoned and charged for as a mile."

(b) The portion entitled "Goods"—by deleting the words "passenger and" in line 21.

Repeal of Schedule of special rates in principal Ordinance.

4 The Schedule of "Special Rates chargeable for conveyance of goods and passengers over the Nanuoya-Ragalla Section" of the principal Ordinance is repealed.

The following Draft of a proposed Ordinance is published for general information:—

0613/1 (S.B.)

An Ordinance to amend The Stamp Ordinance, 1909.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice and consent of the State Council thereof, as follows:—

Short title and commencement.

1 This Ordinance may be cited as The Stamp (Amendment) Ordinance, 1932, and shall come into force on a date to be fixed by the Governor by Proclamation in the Gazette.

Amendment of Schedule B of the Principal Ordinance.

2 Schedule B of The Stamp Ordinance 1909 is amended as follows:—

(a) Part I is amended in item 15 by adding the words "Bail bonds in criminal proceedings" at the end of the portion thereof headed "Exemptions from the preceding and all other Stamp Duties" which occurs between sub-item 15 (i) and sub-item 15 (j).

(b) Part II is amended (i) in the column headed "In the District Courts.—In Civil Proceedings" by inserting the words "Order staying sale.—" in line 23 between the words "Notice to the decree-holder.—" and the words "Order for delivery of possession to purchaser.—" therein; and (ii) in the column headed "In the Courts of Requests" by inserting the words "Order staying sale.—" in line 21 between the words "Notice to decree-holder.—" and the words "Order confirming sale.—" therein.

(c) Part III is amended in column 1 (i) by inserting the words "order absolute" at the end of line 6 between the words "order nisi" and the words "interlocutory order" therein and (ii) by adding the words "Bond—Duty ad valorem as on a mortgage Bond under Part I" at the end of the column.

Objects and Reasons.

The purpose of this Bill is to require the stamping of certain orders of court that are not now liable to stamp duty and to cure the inconvenience and loss of revenue resulting from the decision of the Supreme Court in *The Hon. the Attorney-General v. Mount* (32 New Law Reports 49).

2. In the first of the above classes fall "Orders staying sale" in execution and "Orders absolute" in testamentary cases. No good reason exists for exempting these orders considering the nature of the orders in respect of which stamp duty is already leviable, and the necessary provision to make their stamping essential is contained in clauses 2 (a) and 2 (c) (ii).

3. One result of the decision in the above mentioned case is to make it necessary to stamp bail bonds. The exemption from stamp duty that these bonds were till now considered to enjoy is now specifically provided for in the amendment in clause 2 (a).

4. Another result of the same decision is that the amendment introduced by the Stamp Ordinance, No. 19 of 1927, made bonds in testamentary proceedings liable to only a ten rupee stamp duty and not to an *ad valorem* stamp duty as recommended in paragraph 24 of the Second Interim Report of the Commission appointed to consider generally the Question of Taxation and its Incidence (Sessional Paper XX.—1927). The amendment in clause 2 (c) (ii) seeks to give effect to this recommendation.

The following Draft of a proposed Ordinance is published for general information:—

An Ordinance to amend the Societies Ordinance, 1891.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice and consent of the State Council thereof, as follows:—

1 This Ordinance may be cited as The Societies (Amendment) Ordinance, 1932.

Short title.

2 Section 2 of The Societies Ordinance, 1891 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Ordinance") is amended by substituting the following for the definition of the term "Registrar" therein:—

Amendment of section 2 of the principal Ordinance.

"Registrar" means the Registrar-General and includes any officer in the Registrar-General's Department to the extent to which he may be authorized by general or special order of the Governor to discharge the duty of the Registrar under this Ordinance.

3 Section 6 (3) of the principal Ordinance is amended in line 7 by substituting for the words "in the Government Gazette" therein the words "in a newspaper published in the Island".

Amendment of section 6 of the principal Ordinance.

4 Section 8 (1) of the principal Ordinance is amended as follows:—

Amendment of section 8 of the principal Ordinance.

(a) In paragraph (g) by substituting therefor the following:—

"(g) Keep a copy of the last balance sheet for the time being together with the report of the auditor always hung up in a conspicuous place at the registered office of the society."

(b) After paragraph (g) by adding the following new paragraph (h):—

"(h) Within a period of six months of its registration hold a general meeting of the members of the society and thereafter hold once at least in every calendar year a general meeting of its members."

5 Section 22 of the principal Ordinance is amended as follows:—

Amendment of section 22 of the principal Ordinance.

(a) Immediately after paragraph (d) thereof by adding as new paragraph (e) the following:—

"(e) If a registered society or branch of an officer or member thereof fails either to give any notice or to send any return, statement or document, or to do or allow to be done anything which the society, branch, officer or member is by this Ordinance required to give, send, do or allow to be done;"

(b) At the end of the section by adding as a new proviso the following :—

“ Provided further that in respect of the offences described in paragraph (e) the Registrar may instead of instituting proceedings in a court of law, in composition of the offence committed accept from the society or branch or officer or member liable to punishment such sum of money not exceeding one hundred rupees as the Registrar may consider proper ; and where composition is so accepted no other proceedings in respect of such offence shall be taken or continued against such society or branch or officer or member.”

Insertion of new section 23 in the principal Ordinance.

Persons liable for offences by society.

6 After section 22 of the principal Ordinance the following is added as new section 23 :—

“ 23. Where a registered society is guilty of an offence under this Ordinance every officer of the society bound by the rules thereof to fulfil any duty whereof the offence is a breach or if there is no such officer then every member of the committee unless that member is proved to have been ignorant of or to have attempted to prevent the commission of the offence shall be liable to the same penalty as if he had committed the offence.”

Objects and Reasons.

The purpose of this Bill is to introduce certain amendments in The Societies Ordinance, 1891, which are designed to render the management of societies registered under the Ordinance less expensive and more efficient.

2. The publication in the Gazette of certain matters connected with such societies are made unnecessary by the amendments in clauses 3 and 4 (a) because such publication is expensive but does not in fact always reach those really concerned with the doings of the societies.

3. Clause 4 (b) by providing for a minimum number of meetings of the members of the society endeavours to give the members a more effective voice in the affairs of the society than they at present possess.

4. On pain of a fine or imprisonment clauses 5 and 6 provide for the proper performance of their duties by the officers and members of a society.

5. The new definition of “ Registrar ” in clause 1, which follows the definition of that term in recent legislation, is more convenient for working the Ordinance than the existing definition.
