MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

COLOMBO MUNICIPALITY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held at the Town Hall on Friday, February 8, 1895, at 3 p.m.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated February 2, 1895.

Present:—Mr. C. E. D. Pennycuik, Mayor and Chairman; Hon. Sir John J. Grinlinton; Dr. W. R. Kynsey, C.M.G.; Major L. F. Knollys, C.M.G.; Capt. F. Bayley; Mr. M. Finlay; Hon. A. de A. Seneviratna; Mr. M. I. M. Haniffa; Mr. C. Perera; Hon. P. Coomaraswamy; Mr. C. P. Dias; Mr. Walter Pereira; Mr. R. H. Morgan; Mr. C. M. Fernando; and Mr. A. Alvis.

The Minutes of January 11, 1895, having been printed and a copy sent to each Member of the Council, were taken as read.

Resolved,—That the Minutes of January 11, 1895, be confirmed.

1. Pursuant to notice, Mr. C. Perera moved "that the attention of Government be called to the wall built between the reclamation road and the sea from opposite the Racquet court to St. John's latrine, which obstructs free passage of air and access to the seashore, and is otherwise prejudicial to the health of the locality, and that Government be requested to remove such obstruction."

This motion was, by leave of Council, withdrawn for the present.

2. Statements of Receipts and Disbursement from January 1 to December 31, 1894, and for January, 1895, and Progress Reports of Work done during December, 1894, and January, 1895, were laid on the table.

3. A recommendation from the Standing Committee as regards payment of horse allowance to the Chief Municipal Inspector, and modification of the resolution of Council of July 19, 1876, was laid before the Council. (See Standing Committee's Minutes of January 25, 1895, paragraph 3.)

Resolved,—That the recommendation of the Standing Committee be adopted.

4. The report (dated January 18, 1895) of the Special Committee re-appointed on January 11, 1895, on the question of additional remuneration to officers of the Municipality, was laid before the Council, having been previously printed and circulated.

Mr. C. Perera moved the adoption of the report.

Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.

Hon. P. Coomaraswamy moved as an amendment that an increase of 10 per cent. be made to the salaries of all the officers of the Municipality.

Mr. R. H. Morgan seconded.

Hon. A. de A. Seneviratna moved as a further amendment that the report of the Special Committee be adopted substituting in line 3 of paragraph 4 "fifteen years in the service of the Municipality, or on completion of fifteen years' service" for "twenty years in the service of the Municipality," and deleting the words "and who have had no special increase of salary (irrespective of promotion)."

Mr. C. M. Fernando seconded.

Hon. P. Coomaraswamy's amendment was then put :—

Mr. C. Perera having, by leave of Council, withdrawn his motion in favour of Hon. A. de A. Seneviratna's amendment, that amendment was then put and carried unanimously.

5. Papers relating to the admission of a smallpox patient from the ss. Khedive into the Passenger Ward of the Civil Hospital were laid before the Council (letter No. 3 of January 21 from the Chairman to the Principal Civil Medical Officer, letter No. 104 of January 22 from the Principal Civil Medical Officer to the Chairman, Municipal Council, &c.).

The matter was discussed and a statement made by Dr. Kynsey, Principal Civil Medical Officer.

Mr. C. P. Dias gave notice that he would make a motion on the above subject at the next Meeting of Council.

6. The report of the Sanitary Officer for the fourth quarter of 1894 was laid before the Council, having been previously printed and circulated.

7. The Auditor-General's remarks on the accounts for September, 1894, received with letter No. 1 of January 18, 1895, were laid on the table.

8. The City Analyst's report dated February 5 on the town water for January, 1895, was laid on the table, having been previously printed and circulated.

9. Reports of Inspectors on licensed carriages and kerosine, poison, and gunpowder shops for February, 1895, were laid on the table, except Mr. Inspector Casie Chitty's report on carriages.

10. A letter No. 6 of January 31, 1895, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, with reference to the stamp duty on declarations connected with proctors' and notaries' certificates was laid before the Council with connected papers.

Resolved,—That the surcharge be admitted, and that the amount required to meet the surcharge be provided in the next Supplemental Budget ; and that it be pointed out to Government that the stamp duty on declarations is really part of the larger item of stamp duty on certificates issued to proctors and notaries, and that Government be requested to make provision for the payment of the stamp duty on declarations to the Municipal Council in the Ordinance about to be passed amending the Municipal Councils' Ordinance.

11. Papers relating to a recent case of cholera in the Fort were laid on the table, viz. :—A report dated January 28, 1895, from the Sanitary Officer ; Letters Nos. 290 and 345 dated February 2 and 6, 1895, respectively, from the Inspector-General of Police, &c.
