GOVERNMENT NOTIFICATION.

081/4 (SB)

IT is hereby notified that under section 11 of Ordinance No. 17 of 1869 the State Council did at its session on March 15, 1932, pass the following resolution, and that the resolution has been duly sanctioned by His Excellency the Governor :—

That on and after the date on which the sanction of the Secretary of State to this Resolution shall be notified in the *Government Gazette*—

(a) the duty levied upon tea exported from this Island shall be altered to a duty of Rs. 2·37 per 100 pounds whereof a sum of 15 cents shall be the amount imposed as duty under section 28 of “The Medical Wants Ordinance, No. 9 of 1912” :

Nothing herein contained shall affect the export duty of 14 cents per 100 pounds levied under the Tea Research Ordinance, 1925 (as amended by Ordinance No. 12 of 1930), which shall be collected in addition to the aforesaid duty of Rs. 2·37 per 100 pounds, so that the aggregate amount of the export duty levied on tea shall be Rs. 2·51 per 100 pounds.

(b) the duty levied on cacao exported from this Island shall be altered to a duty of 75 cents per 100 pounds whereof a sum of 15 cents shall be the amount imposed as duty under section 28 of “The Medical Wants Ordinance, No. 9 of 1912” .

It is further notified that the said resolution has been submitted to and sanctioned by the Secretary of State for the Colonies with effect from midnight of March 31/April 1, 1932.
