### BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

The by-laws dated April 6, 1923, and published in the *Government Gazette* No. 7,323 of April 12, 1923, are hereby cancelled and the following substituted therefor:—

1. The areas defined in the schedule hereto are hereby declared to be commercial areas.

2. The remainder of the area within the limits of the Board of Improvement, Nuwara Eliya, is hereby declared to be a residential area.

3. Within the limits of the residential area, no range or block of buildings wholly or mainly adapted to be inhabited in tenements by persons of the poorer or labouring classes, and no building intended for commercial purposes or for any other purpose than that of a dwelling house shall be erected or re-erected without the special sanction in writing of the Chairman. Such sanction shall be refused if, in the opinion of the Board, the situation or design or the use to which it is proposed to put the building would not be in keeping with its surroundings or would detract from the amenities of the town.

### Schedule.

(a) Old Bazaar commercial area bounded as follows:—

On the north by Lady McCallum's Drive from the junction near Pedro View Hotel up to its junction with Hill street.

On the east by Hill street up to its junction with Chislehurst path, Chislehurst path up to its junction with Police Station road, and Police Station road from its junction with Chislehurst path to its junction with Uda Pussellawa road.

On the south by Uda Pussellawa road from its junction with Police Station road up to the bridge over the Talagala-oya near Hill street, the Talagala-oya from the bridge near Hill street up to its junction with the Nanu-oya.

## RULES.

*Rules for the Protection of the Walawe-ganga Right Bank Irrigation Work and for the Conservation of Water.*

1. No person shall obstruct, divert, cut the sides of, damage, or interfere in any way with any irrigation or drainage channel, or other water-course comprised in the “irrigation work”.
2. No person shall encroach upon any irrigation or drainage channel, or other water-course comprised in the “irrigation work”.
3. No person shall interfere with or in any way damage any sluice, dam, or regulating work comprised in the “irrigation work”.
4. No person shall obstruct or interfere with or in any way damage any road or path comprised in the “irrigation work”.
5. No person shall waste, or cause any other person to waste, water supplied from the “irrigation work”.



6. No person other than the Director of Irrigation or a person authorized by him shall control or distribute water in the "irrigation work" or interfere with the distribution or flow of water.

7. For the purpose of inspection and effecting repairs to the "irrigation work" the issue of water for distribution to the fields may be suspended each year (a) between the 5th day of February and the 6th day of March and (b) between the 31st day of July and the 19th day of September.

8. The issue of water from any channel, sluice, or regulator may be suspended by the Director of Irrigation at any time after consultation with the Assistant Government Agent should such suspension be necessary in order to carry out repairs urgently needed for the safety of any part of the "irrigation work".

Clause 60 (b) (i).—The first line to read: "The salary cost of the approved staff".

Add the following: "Not more than half the staff may be recognized for purposes of grant as teachers with English qualifications".

Clause 60 (b) (ii).—Add: "When this expenditure on maintenance and equipment in any year exceeds the grant of Rs. 25 per unit of average attendance, the surplus expenditure may be carried forward to the following year to be taken into account when that year's grant is calculated".

Clause 60 (b) (iii).—Delete.

Clause 60 (d)—Second paragraph.—Alter to read: "The scale of salaries for assistants holding English qualifications shall be that for teachers under Scale B in English schools, according to qualifications. The scale of salaries for Head Teachers (or Principals) holding English qualifications shall be that for teachers under Scale A in English schools, according to qualifications. The grant to the school for teachers with English qualifications in Vernacular Training schools shall be the approved salaries of such teachers".

NOTE.—The above amendments shall come into force for all Training schools at the beginning of the school year in 1933, provided that any Manager may adopt these rules as from the beginning of the school year in 1932.

## VITAL STATISTICS.

### Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended March 19, 1932.

*Births.*—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 155 (2 Europeans, 10 Burghers, 91 Sinhalese, 23 Tamils, 19 Moors, 5 Malays, and 5 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1932, viz., 291,260) was 27·8, as against 28·5 in the preceding week, 28·2 in the corresponding week of last year, and 31·1 the weekly average for last year.

*Deaths.*—The total deaths registered were 129 (6 Burghers, 76 Sinhalese, 22 Tamils, 20 Moors, 3 Malays, and 2 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 23·2, as against 27·8 in the previous week, 21·9 in the corresponding week of last year, and 25·2 the weekly average for last year.

*Infantile Deaths.*—Of the 129 total deaths, 42 were infants under one year of age, as against 30 in the preceding week, 20 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 29 the average for last year.

*Stillbirths.*—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 8.

*Principal Causes of Death.*—1. (a) Nineteen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 12 in Maradana hospitals (including 6 deaths of non-residents) and 3 in Kotahena North, 2 in Kotahena South, 1 each in New Bazaar and Wellawatta South, as against 9 in the previous week and 17 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Nine deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 3 in Kotahena North, 2 in Slave Island, and 1 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena South, New Bazaar, and Kollupitiya, as against 7 in the previous week and 10 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Six deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 3 in New Bazaar, 2 in Maradana hospitals, and 1 in St. Paul's, as against 3 in the previous week and 5 the weekly average for last year.

2. (a) Twelve deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 7 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents), 2 in St. Paul's, and 1 each in Maradana North, Maradana East, and Slave Island, as against 14 in the previous week and 12 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Four deaths from *Phthisis* of residents of Colombo town occurred at the Anti-Tuberculosis Hospital, Ragama, during the week.

3. Two deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 1 each in Pettah and Slave Island, as against 11 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

4. One death from *Plague* was registered in New Bazaar. The number registered during the preceding week as also the weekly average for last year was 1.

5. Thirteen deaths from *Debility* were registered, 10 from *Enteritis*, 5 from *Worms*, and 1 each from *Infantile Convulsions*, *Puerperal Septicaemia* and *Accidents*, and 49 from *Other Causes*.

6. *Reported Cases.*—Fifty cases of *Chickenpox*, 7 of *Enteric Fever*, 4 of *Whooping Cough*, 3 of *Measles*, and 1 of *Plague* were reported during the week, as against 42, 7, 7, 3, and 1, respectively, of the preceding week.

*State of the Weather.*—The mean temperature of air was 81·0°, against 81·0° in the preceding week and 82·0° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·893 in., against 29·905 in. in the preceding week and 29·959 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0·08 in., against 0·71 in. in the preceding week and 0·06 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
