And We do hereby exempt the said cemetery wholly from the operation of sections 11, 16, 17, and 24 of the said Ordinance.

BY-LAW.

Preaching or holding Meetings on Thoroughfares prohibited.

No person shall preach or address any assembly or crowd or hold any meeting on any thoroughfare within the limits of the Kolonnawa Urban District Council area, except in pursuance of a permit from the Chairman of the Urban District Council, and within the times and limits specified in such permit. Any person who shall commit a breach of this by-law shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding fifty rupees.

BY-LAWS.

1. All householders shall deposit or cause to be deposited the dust, ashes, sweepings, rubbish, and other refuse from their premises in cylindrical galvanized wrought iron bins which they shall provide, and they shall place these bins daily on the edge of the road outside their premises between the hours of 6 A.M. and 6.30 A.M., and remove them or cause them to be removed within the space of half an hour after the same shall have been emptied by the scavengers.

2. The bins shall—

- (a) be constructed in such a manner and be of such weight that the whole receptacle with its contents can be easily lifted and emptied into the scavenging cart;
- (b) they shall be provided with covers and convenient handles;
- (c) they shall have the owner's name or tenement number painted outside; and
- (d) they shall be kept clean by the owners.

3. No person shall place or cause to be placed dust, ashes, sweepings, rubbish, or refuse on any part of a road, except in bins as aforesaid, at the times specified, provided that the Chairman may authorize a householder to use instead of a bin as aforesaid such other covered receptacle as may be approved by him, if he is satisfied that, owing to poverty, the immediate provision of such a bin would press harshly on the householder.

4. Any person committing a breach of the above by-laws shall be guilty of an offence and shall on conviction be liable to a fine not exceeding Rs. 10, and in the case of a continuing offence to an additional fine not exceeding Rs. 5 for every day during which the offence is committed after conviction or written notice from the Chairman of such contravention.

(a) Whenever any tree within the administrative limits of this Council or the branch, fruit, or leaf of such a tree is in the opinion of the Chairman either likely to fall upon any house or building or likely to be dangerous to its occupants, and whenever such tree, branch, fruit, or leaf overhangs any street, the Chairman may, by a notice in writing served on the owner or the occupier of the land upon which the tree stands, require him to cut down the tree, branch, fruit, or leaf, as the case may be; and if such owner or occupier fails within twenty-four hours of receiving the notice to comply with its requirements, any officers or workmen authorized in writing by the Chairman may enter upon such land and at the expense of the owner or occupier do what the owner or occupier was required to do by the notice.

(b) The owner or occupier who fails to comply with the requirements of a notice issued under paragraph (a) above shall be liable on conviction to a fine of fifty rupees.

1. This Committee shall be called the Village Committee, Meda pattu, Kuruwiti korale.
2. The meetings of this Committee shall be of two kinds, viz. :—

- (a) Ordinary and
- (b) Special.

3. Ordinary meetings shall be held on the first Saturday of every month at 9 A.M. at the Kiriella Village Tribunal Court.

4. At least one week before the date of each ordinary meeting the Chairman shall forward to each member a copy of the agenda.

5. Special meetings shall be convened by the Chairman whenever he deems them necessary by giving the other members at least four days' notice thereof in writing.

6. Any duly convened meeting may be adjourned to a specified day, time, and place, if a majority of the members present and voting so decides.

7. Eight members shall form a quorum for any ordinary meeting and four including the Chairman for a special meeting.

8. The business of the Committee shall be taken in the following order, viz. :—

- (a) The minutes of the previous meeting shall be read and confirmed after such correction as may be necessary, the Chairman signing such confirmation.
- (b) Memorials, petitions, complaints, and communications addressed to the Committee, or to its Chairman, shall be laid before the Committee and necessary action taken thereon.
- (c) Questions of which previous notice has been given shall be asked.
- (d) Motions shall be made.
- (e) Any other matter that comes before the Committee shall be considered. Provided that the Committee may, if it see fit, deviate from the order herein prescribed.

9. (1) Notice of motions, resolutions, or questions shall be sent to the Chairman ten clear days before the date of the meeting at which they are to be taken up: Provided that when the matter is specially urgent or important six days' notice shall be deemed to be sufficient.

(2) The Chairman may in his discretion refuse to place any motion, resolution, or question on the agenda, and shall in every such case give his reasons for such refusal in writing.

(3) If any matter so rejected by the Chairman is referred to him again over the signature of not less than four members, the Chairman shall convene a special meeting to consider such matter.

10. As soon after the hour appointed for any meeting as a quorum shall assemble, the business shall begin. Should a quorum not be present at the expiration of forty-five minutes from the time appointed for the meeting the meeting shall not be held.

11. No member shall bring before the Committee any motion which is not set down in the agenda for the meeting, provided however that any member may, with the permission of the Chairman, bring a motion of which no notice has been given previously.

12. No member shall present any petition or communication which is not respectful in tone throughout.

13. Every member while speaking shall address the Chair, and shall stand while so doing.

14. In discussing any motion no member shall speak more than once, except on a point of order or of personal explanation.

15. (1) Any member wishing to oppose a resolution or an amendment shall do so only after it has been seconded.

(2) No remarks touching an original resolution shall be offered while an amendment on it is before the Committee.

16. In debate only the mover of a resolution or amendment shall have the right of reply.

17. (1) Until an amendment duly proposed and seconded has been put to the vote and declared lost, no further amendment shall be proposed.

(2) The original motion shall be put to the vote only after all the amendments proposed have been declared lost.

(3) The Chairman may in his discretion close the discussion on any amendment, motion, or resolution by putting it to the vote.

18. All questions and resolutions shall be determined by a majority of the votes of those present and voting. The Chairman shall have the right to vote; and in the event of an equality of votes in any matter, he shall have a casting vote in addition.

19. Written replies shall be read at the meeting by the Chairman to questions entered in the agenda. In case the questioner is not satisfied with such reply he may further explain the question concisely or in that connection put a further question. On the Chairman's reply to the further explanation or question the matter shall be deemed to have been disposed of.

20. The Chairman shall preserve order at meetings and decide on all points of order. His decision in all such matters shall be final and conclusive.

21. It shall be the duty of the retiring Chairman to hand over charge of all Minute Books, Accounts, Records, Furniture, and other property of the Committee, either personally or by a duly authorized person to the new Chairman within forty-eight hours of his receiving a notice from the new Chairman. 4. The Chairman shall preserve order at meetings of the Committee and his decision on any disputed point of order shall be final.

5. The quorum shall be $\frac{1}{3}$ of the total number of the Committee or six whichever is greater.

6. *Commencement of Meetings.*—As soon after the hour appointed for any meeting as a quorum shall assemble, the business shall begin. Should a quorum not be present at the expiration of forty-five minutes from the time appointed for the meeting, the meeting shall not be held.

7. *Motions.*—No member shall bring before the Committee any motion which is not set down in the agenda for the meeting, provided however that any member may, with the permission of the Chairman, bring up a motion of which no notice has been given previously.

8. No motion shall be set down in the agenda for any meeting, unless written notice of such motion has been received by the Chairman at least 10 clear days before the date of such meeting.

9. A motion negatived at a meeting shall not again be brought forward until after the expiration of at least three months; and no motion, in any way contrary to one already passed by the Committee at a meeting, shall be brought forward until after the expiration of the same period.

10. *Voting*.—All questions and resolutions shall be determined by a majority of the votes of those present and voting. The Chairman shall have the right to vote; and in the event of an equality of votes in any matter, he shall have a casting vote in addition.

Improvements in dry cells.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of
Colombo for the Week ended April 1, 1933.

Births.—The total births registered in the City of Colombo in the week were 202 (13 Burghers, 186 Sinhalese, 25 Tamils, 18 Moors, 7 Malays, and 3 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1933, viz., 292,200) was 36.1, as against 34.1 in the preceding week, 26.9 in the corresponding week of last year, and 30.8 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 107 (7 Burghers, 63 Sinhalese, 22 Tamils, 6 Moors, 5 Malays, and 4 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 19.1, as against 28.9 in the previous week, 27.1 in the corresponding week of last year, and 24.5 the weekly average for last year.

Infant Deaths.—Of the 107 total deaths, 22 were of infants under one year of age, as against 34 in the preceding week, 29 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 29 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 14.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Eleven deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 8 in Maradana hospitals (including 5 deaths of non-residents), and 1 each in New Bazaar, Maradana North, and Slave Island, as against 17 in the previous week and 15, the weekly average for last year.

(b) Three deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 1 each in Kotahena North, Kotahena South, and New Bazaar, as against 8 in the previous week and 8 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Three deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 1 each in San Sebastian, Maradana hospitals (of a non-resident), and Maradana North, as against 5 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

2. (a) Six deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 3 in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), 2 in Maradana North, and 1 in Kotahena South, as against 12 in the previous week and 11 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Two deaths from *Phthisis* of residents of Colombo town, occurred at the Anti-Tuberculosis Hospital, Ragama, during the week.

3. One death from *Enteric Fever* was registered in Maradana hospitals, as against 5 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

4. Six deaths from *Debility* were registered, 5 each from *Enteritis* and *Worms*, 3 each from *Suicide* and *Puerperal Septicaemia*, 2 each from *Diarrhoea* and *Homicide*, 1 each from *Dysentery* and *Infantile Convulsions*, and 55 from *Other Causes*.

5. **Reported Cases.**—Forty-three cases of *Chickenpox*, 42 of *Measles*, 8 of *Enteric Fever*, 6 of *Whooping Cough*, 3 of *Diphtheria*, 2 of *Mumps*, and 1 of *Plague* were reported during the week, as against 64, 46, 8, nil, 1, 3, and 1, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 81.5°, against 81.5° in the preceding week and 81.3° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.899 in., against 29.875 in. in the preceding week and 29.886 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0.23 in., against 1.39 in. in the preceding week and 1.28 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

Department of Labour.

THE INDIAN LABOUR ORDINANCE, NO. 27 OF 1927.

Notification No. 94.

NOTICE is hereby given under section 10 (1) of the Indian Labour Ordinance, No. 27 of 1927, that the minimum rates of wages approved by the Governor

and set forth in the schedule to this Department's Notification No. 93 of April 7, 1933, will take effect from May 10, 1933.

2. The notice of all persons concerned is drawn to the fact that the said rates of wages have been fixed on the following understanding :—

- (1) That on all estates to which the rates are applicable clean unblended rice of good quality will be issued to each working Indian estate labourer at a rate not exceeding Rs. 4 per bushel. The issue of rice will be at a rate per month not less than seven-eighths of a bushel for a man, six-eighths of a bushel for a woman, and five-eighths of a bushel for a child; provided a sufficient sum shall have been earned within the month to cover its cost.
- (2) That on all estates to which the rates are applicable clean unblended rice of good quality will also be issued free of cost at the rate of one-eighth of a bushel per month to each working man and that rice will also be issued at a similar rate to each widow employed who has one or more non-working children; provided that instead of the free issue of rice herein referred to employers may, with the consent of the Controller of Labour previously obtained and unless and until such consent be withdrawn, provide one good and unstinted meal of rice and curry daily to each and every Indian child under ten years of age resident on their estates and related to the Indian labourers employed thereon.
