WHEREAS it seems advisable to the Governor to establish in Wirapokuna village in Kiniyama korale of Katugampola hatpattu of the District of Kurunegala, North-Western Province, a general cemetery for the burial or cremation of the dead within the limits hereinafter specified and defined:

And whereas the Governor may under section 6 (3) of "The Cemeteries and Burials Ordinance, 1899," as amended by the Cemeteries and Burials Amendment Ordinance, 1931, either wholly or in part exempt any cemetery from the operation of sections 11, 16, 17, and 24

Now know Ye that We. the Governor, by virtue of the powers vested in Us by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931, do hereby, under section 6 (1) of "The Cemeteries and Burials Ordinance, 1899," as amended by the Cemeteries and Burials Amendment Ordinance, 1931, establish, as from the date hereof, a general cemetery on the land described in Schedule A hereto for the purial or cremation of the dead within the limits specified and defined in Schedule B hereto.

And We do hereby exempt the said cemetery wholly from the operation of sections 11, 16, 17, and 24 of the said Ordinance.

IT is hereby notified that the Public Service Regulations and the Appendices to the Public Service notified that the Public Service Regulations referred to below which were published by Notification dated June 30, 1931, in the Government Gazette Extraordinary No. 7,865 of June 30, 1931, have been amended as follows:—

To Public Service Regulation 60 add the following note:

Note.—" Nil" returns need not be sent; but the information that there was nothing to report for the months succeeding the date of the last return should be embodied in the next return.

Delete Public Service Regulation 108.

Delete Public Service Regulation 119 and substitute new Public Service Regulation 119:

" 119. (a) If in any case the Governor considers that the interests of the public service require that an officer should cease forthwith to exercise the powers and functions of his office he may interdict the officer from the exercise of the powers and functions of his office provided that proceedings for his dismissal are being taken or are about to be taken, or that criminal proceedings are being instituted against him.

(b) A Head of Department may interdict from duty any officer employed in the Department whose emoluments do not exceed £300 or Rs. 4,500 per annum where in the opinion of the Head of Department the interests of the public service so require, provided that proceedings for the dismissal of the officer are being taken or are about to be taken or that criminal pro-

ceedings are being instituted against him.

(c) An officer who has been interdicted shall receive from the date of interdiction one half of his salary unless the Governor orders that a greater proportion of his salary than one half shall be paid. If the proceedings against any such officer do not result in the dismissal or other punishment of the officer he will be entitled to the full amount of salary which he would have received if he had not been interdicted.

Delete the words "on Form General 140" in line 4 of section (vii.) (1) of Appendix C to the Public Service Regulations.

Add at the end of section (vii.) (1) of Appendix C to

Public Service Regulations the following:

"Form General 140 should be used for reporting changes and Form General 96 for reporting leave."

Delete the words "and where his life is actually in danger" in paragraph 4 of Appendix E to the Public Service Regulations, page 48, and substitute" and there appears to be any danger that the illness may terminate

Delete paragraph 5 of Appendix E to the Public Service Regulations and substitute new paragraph 5:—

"Further reports as to the condition of such officer should be forwarded to the Chief Secretary, whenever the condition of the patient changes and if 3 or 4 days elapse without any alteration in his condition a report should be made that there is no change in his condition. The reports referred to in this and the preceding paragraph if originating in an outstation should be sent by telegram.

To paragraph 6 of Appendix E to the Public Service Regulations add:

"If time can be saved by sending such details by air mail this should invariably be done."

THE VILLAGE COMMUNITIES ORDENANCE, No. 9 of 1924.

RVLES of Criminal Procedure for Village Tribunals and Village Committees, made by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 95 of the Village Gommunities Ordinance. No. 9 of 1924, and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931.

Rule No. 26 of the Rules of Criminal Procedure published by Notification in the Gazette of February 18, 1927, is hereby amended by the renumbering of the existing paragraphs thereof as (1) and (2) respectively, and by the

addition of the following new paragraphs thereto:—
"(3) The imprisonment which is imposed in default of payment of a fine shall terminate whenever that fine is

either paid or levied by process of law.

(4) If before the expiration of the term of imprisonment fixed in default of payment such a proportion of the fine be paid or levied that the term of imprisonment suffered in default of payment is not less than proportional to the part of the fine still unpaid, the imprisonment shall terminate.

(5) If any part of the fine is paid in the Village Tribunal or the Village Committee, the fact of such payment and the amount paid shall be endorsed, under the hand of the President or the Chairman, on the warrant committing the defendant to prison for the default in respect of the balance.

1. With respect to all forests other than reserved forests and village forests

- (i.) the Government Agent of a Province may for his province prescribe, subject to the sanction of the Governor, the fees, royalties, or other pay-ments for peat, surface soil, rocks, and minerals and the manner in which such fees, royalties, or other payments shall be levied, whether in transit, or partly in transit or otherwise.
- (ii.) the Conservator of Forests may
 - (a) prescribe subject to the sanction of the Governor, the fees, royalties, or other payments for all forests produce other than peat, surface soil, rocks, and minerals and the manner in which, such fees, royalties, or other payments shall be levied, whether in transit or partly in transit or otherwise.

 (b) whenever it appears to him desirable in the
 - public interest to expedite the removal of timber or forest produce generally, specify by Notification in the Government Gazette areas within which timber and forest produce will be available for sale at such

rates, lower than the prescribed royalties, as the Financial Secretary and the Executive Committee of Agriculture and Lands may for the purposes of each such case approve.

(c) sell by public competition the sele right to collect and remove timber or other forest produce generally or any specified class of timber or forest produce from any specified

All timber and forest produce cut, sawn, converted, collected, or removed, from any land subject to these rules, under any permit issued in that behalf, shall be subject to such royalty as may be prescribed for such produce under the foregoing rule 1; provided that the Conservator of Forests, or any officer empowered by him in this behalf, may, with the approval of the Financial Secretary and the Executive Committee of Agriculture and Lands, remit or reduce the royalty on timber which on the report of an officer not below the rank of Forest Ranger, is declared to be unservibeable or of inferior quality.

upon any house or building or likely to be dangerous to its occupants or whenever such tree, branch, fruit, or leaf overhangs any street, or touches or interferes with the Council's electric wires and apparatus, the Chairman may, by a notice in writing served on the owner or the occupier of the land upon which the tree stands, require him to cut down the tree, branch, fruit, or leaf as the case may be; and if such owner or occupier fails within twenty-four hours of receiving the notice to comply with its requirements, any officers or workmen authorized in writing by the Chairman may enterlupon such land and do what the owner or occupier was required to do by the notice.

(b) The owner or occupier who fails to comply with the requirements of a notice issued under paragraph (a) above shall be guilty of an offence punishable on conviction with a fine not exceeding twenth rupees without any prejudice to the rights of the Council to recover from him the expenses incurred in cutting down or removing such tree, branch, leaf, or fruit.

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended April 8, 1933.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 188 (I European, 10 Burghers, 123 Sinhalese, 26 Tamils, 18 Moors, 4 Malays, and 6 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated hopulation on January 1, 1933, viz., 292,200) was 33.6, as against 36.1 in the preceding week, 26.4 in the corresponding week of last year, and 30.3 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 121 (3 Burghers, 71 Sinhalese, 24 Tamils, 14 Moors, 6 Malays, and 3 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 21 6, as against 19 1 in the previous week, 21 9 in the corresponding week of last year, and 24 5 the weekly average for last year.

MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

THE COLOMBO MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

General Meeting.

Wednesday, March 1, 1933, at 3 p.m.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice, dated February 22, 1933.

Present; Mr. W. L. Murphy, B.A., C.C.S., Chairman; Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader; Dr. E. V. Ratnam; Dr. E. A. Coorey, Mr. N. R., Blande; Mr. M. L. M. Reyal; Dr. S. Muttiah; Mr. T. C. Dyball; Mr. F. Dadabhoy, J.P.; Mr. F. J. Soertsz; Lieut. Colonel N. W. Napier-Clavering, D.S.O., R.E.; Mr. Aelian W. Pereira; Mr. A. R. A. Razik; Dr. S. T. Ghnasekera; Mr. G. M. Thornhill; Mr. H. K. de Kretser; and Mr. C. S. Richards.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of February 1, 1933, having been previously printed and copies thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read.

The Chairman moved that the Minutes be confirmed subject to the deletion of the words "only the mover voted in favour of it" at the conclusion of item 2 as there had not been a division. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried.

Carried. Mr. A. E. Coonesinha, M.S.C., to present a petition from the residents of Mount Pleasant, Baseline road, praying for the installation of Gas or Electric lights on their road.

The Chairman stated that as Mr. A. E. Goonesinha was not able to attend that meeting he wished this item to remain until the next meeting of Council.

3. Pursuant to notice, Dr. S. Muttiah, asked the following questions which the Chairman answered:

(1) Q:—Will the Chairman state what steps, if any, have been taken by the Municipality or the Ministry of Health for an early introduction of a "Food and Drugs Ordinance" for the Island since my questions of November 7, 1928?

A.—Since the last question on the subject asked by Dr. S. Muttiah at the Municipal Council Meeting of November 7, 1928, and the replies given thereto, I have received a communication, dated August 3, 1932, from the Hon. the Minister of Health stating that a Pure Foods and Drugs Ordinance necessitates public health laboratories for the chemical examination and analysis of samples. Such laboratories do not at present exist in Ceylon and the Department of Medical and Sanitary Services has a scheme for public health laboratories, but no funds are at present available for the purpose. Although a complete Pure Foods Ordinance cannot be introduced at present the Executive Committee of Health has under consideration the preparation of a Milk and Dairies Ordinance, which is now in the hands of the Attorney-General. A letter from the Ministry of Health, dated February 2, states that "the drafting of the Ordinance is held up by priority of necessity of other legislative measures.

(2) Q.—Does the Chairman acknowledge the great risk there is of Ceylon being the dumping ground for inferior food stuffs and drugs which the laws of other countries have made unsaleable? A.—Yes, very emphatically.

(3) Q.—Will the Chairman state what quantity of food or drugs have been confiscated by the Food Inspector or the Sanitary Inspectors during the last half year? A.—A statement of the foods stuffs seized and condemned by the Food Inspector and Sanitary Inspectors during the last half year is as follows:—Rice, 95½ lb.; sugar, 23 cwt.; potatoes, 1 bag; meat, 67½ lb.; fish, 111 lb.; dry fish, 6,608 lb.; vegetables, 20 lb.; tin food, 79 tins; pickles, 20 bottles; cooked liver, 3 dishes.

Pursuant to notice, Mr. A. R. A. Razik, asked the following questions which the Chairman answered:-

(1) Q.—What sum did the Council pay to its Lawyers during the years 1930, 1931, and 1932? A.—The total amounts paid to Lawyers during 1930, 1931, and 1932, are as follows:—1930, Rs. 8,851·06*; 1931, Rs. 9,038·50; 1932, Rs. 14,737·80.

(2) Q.—What sum did the Council's Lawyers earn from the members of the public by reason of their being Council's Lawyers during 1930, 1931, and 1932? A.—It is assumed that the question refers to fees for reconveyance of properties vested in the Council; on that assumption the answer is:—Nil in 1930; Rs. 343·14 in 1931; Nil in 1932.

(3) Q.—What sum was paid to Counsel by the Council for 1930, 1931, and 1932? A.—The amounts paid on account of Counsel are as follows:—1930, Rs. 3,688; 1931, Rs. 3,158·25; 1932, Rs. 6,814·65. These amounts are, of course, included in the statement given in reply to the first question.

Pursuant to notice, the Chairman moved :-That the Council should resolve itself into a Committee of the whole Council to consider the following extracts from the proceedings of the Committees annexed to the agenda. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried. Council in Committee

The following Extract from the Minutes of the Relief of Distress Committee of February 3, 1933, was considered.

(5) To consider a memorandum from the Chairman on the subject of a request from the Friend in Need Society for a grant towards their relief works and of a further request to transfer a certain number of unemployed from the Friend-in Need Society works to the Municipal Schemes. Registered No. 193.—Recommended that the Council should take over from the Friend-in-Need Society the relief work now being carried on at the Buller's road swamp and continue it as a Municipal Relief Work, and that a sum of Rs. 25,850, i.e., half the total contributions already made by the Central Government to the Friend-in-Need Society towards the Timbirigasyaya and Buller's Road Relief Works, he expended on this scheme out of the money provided for the Relief of Unemployment. (Vote I.-110 of the 1933 Budget, Relief of Unemployment Rs. 200,000).

The following Extracts from the Minutes of the Special Committee regarding the Public Library of February 11, 1933, were considered.

(b) A report of the Municipal Engineer. Registered No. 2,199.—Recommended that the recommendation of the Works and Finance Committees (item No. 5) of February 15, 1933, be adopted. (Vide resolution of Council in Committee on page 157 of these minutes in connection with the recommendation of item No. 5 of the extracts from the minutes of the Works and Finance Committees of February 15, 1933) 15, 1933).

VETERINARY DEPARTMENT.

(9) To consider:—(a) Reports of the Municipal Veterinary Surgeon and the Municipal Treasurer, dated November 6, 1932, and January 20, 1933, respectively, regarding the licensing of cattle galas. (b) A memorandum thereon of the Chairman. Registered No. 162.—Recommended that, subject to any observation the Government Agent may wish to make, Government be requested, under section 17 of Ordinance No. 25 of 1909, to delegate to Chairman, Municipal Council, Colombo, authority, as provided in part IV. of the regulations published in Government Gazette No. 7,448 of February 27, 1925, to licence galas within the Municipal limits of Colombo.

The following Extract from the Minutes of the Special Committee regarding Housing and Town Improvement of February 20, 1933, was considered.

PUBLIC HEALTH DEPARTMENT.

(2) To consider what policy the Council should adopt in dealing with applications for opening dairies within the Municipal limits. Registered No. 2,182.—Recommended that the establishment of new dairies within Municipal limits be prohibited and that the necessary powers be obtained to enable the Council to give effect to this recommendation, and also powers enabling the Council to exercise supervision over dairies outside the city from which milk is supplied for consumption in the city.

Resolution of Council in Committee.

Dr. E. V. Ratnam moved that the question of opening dairies within Municipal limits be referred back for further consideration and that in the meantime the Medical Officer of Health be asked for a reoprt on definite lines of what control this Council should have and what provision is obtainable in the suburbs as regards water supply, drainage, &c. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.

Dr. S. Muttiah, Mr. F. Dadabhoy, and Dr. E. A. Coorey supported the motion and suggested that the matter be placed before the Four Standing Committees.

The mover and the seconder of the motion having agreed to the suggestion, the motion that the matter be placed before the Four Standing Committees, was put to the meeting and carried.

The following Extract from the Minutes of the Special Committee regardin Relief to Ratepayers of January 30, 1933, was condsidered.

(2) To consider:—(a) The reports of the Investigating Officer on his Investigations in the Departments of the Colombo Municipal Council. (b) The comments of the Heads of Departments. Registered No. 2,166. Office Hours.—Recommended that Government Office hours be adopted, i. e., 9 A.M. to 2 P.M., on Saturdays and from 9 A.M. to 4.30 P.M., on other working days.

Resolution of Council in Committee.

It was agreed at the Chairman's suggestion that the recommendation of the Special Committee be put into operation as from April 1, 1933.

The following Extract from the Minutes of the Special Committee Regarding Relief to Ratepayers of February 23, 1933, was considered.

(2) To consider:—(a) The reports of the Investigating Officer on his Investigations in the Departments of the Colombo Municipal Council. (b) The comments of the Heads of Departments. Registered No. 2,166. (1) The Municipal Veterinary Department.—Recommended that two Stock Inspectors be retired by giving 3 months' notice and that their posts be abolished.

Dr. E. A. Coorey spoke to the motion.

Mr. N. R. Blande moved, as an amendment, that the recommendation of the Standing Committees be adopted. Mr. F. Dadabhoy seconded.—Carried.

The amendment was then put to the meeting as the substantive motion and carried.

Fire Brigade.

(9) To consider a letter, dated November 24, 1932, from the Council's London Agents forwarding the first monthly report from the Chief Officer, Sheffield Fire Brigade, regarding the training of Mr. B. E. Weerasinghe in Fire Brigade duties and also requesting authority to re-imburse the Chief Officer and Mr. Weerasinghe their reasonable travelling expenses in connection with visits to works of firms manufacturing fire appliances. Registered No. 2,273.—Recommended that a sum not exceeding £20 be paid for which supplementary provision is necessary.

MUNICIPAL TREASURER'S DEPARTMENT.

Clerk was stated as Rs. 600, whereas it should have been Rs. 900 as according to the Salary Scheme of 1924, the salary of Rs. 600 and temporary increase was increased to Rs. 900. Had he, therefore, continued as such he would be at the present moment on the maximum salary on scale II., i. e., Rs. 1,320 a year. He moved that the recommendation of the Committees be adopted subject to the substitution of the amount "Rs. 1,320 per annum" for the amount "Rs. 1,140 per annum." Dr. E. A. Coorey seconded.—Carried.
