### SCHEDULE.

#### *Municipal Laundries.*

By-laws framed under Section 110 (22) (f).

#### Definition :—

For the purpose of these by-laws, a Municipal Laundry shall include all land together with buildings thereon which has been set apart by the Council for the purpose of a Laundry.

#### Obstruction of Authorized Agents :—

1. Every person who shall resist, obstruct, hinder, or molest any person appointed by the Chairman to superintend any Municipal Laundry or to collect rents and fees thereof, or to enforce order and cleanliness therein whilst in the execution of his duty, shall be guilty of an offence.

2. Any officer authorized by the Chairman to superintend any laundry may expel from the laundry premises any person found drunk, begging, misconducting himself or loitering about without sufficient reason in the laundry premises.

#### Acts forbidden :—

3. (1) No laundryman or other person shall enter or remain on the premises except during the hours prescribed by the Chairman.

(2) No laundryman or other person shall misbehave or use abusive or obscene language, or create a disturbance or obstruct any officer, or interfere with or cause any damage to the property of the Council.

(3) No laundryman shall permit the accommodation allotted to him to be in an insanitary or unclean condition and the onus of proving that such condition was not permitted by him shall be upon the laundryman.

(4) No laundryman or other person shall keep any animal, or allow any animal to be kept, or cook, or sleep in the laundry premises.

(5) No laundryman or other person shall enter or leave the premises except by the gateway provided.

(6) No laundryman or other person shall throw any refuse on laundry premises except into the receptacles provided for the purpose.

(7) No person shall spit or otherwise commit nuisances within the laundry premises.

(8) No person affected with any loathsome or contagious or infectious disease shall enter or work in the laundry premises.

(9) No person shall erect any fixtures or screens or enclose any space within the laundry premises.

(10) No laundryman shall keep or permit to be kept soiled and clean clothes together, but shall keep such clothes separately in the special rooms provided for such purposes.

(11) No laundryman or other persons shall remove wet or partially laundered clothes from the laundry, other than ships' washing satisfactorily shown to be such.

(12) Every laundryman shall always before leaving the laundry for the day extinguish or cause to be extinguished every fire or light used by him, and no light or fire which is dangerous to the safety of any building or the clothes therein shall be at any time kindled or left alight.

(13) The laundry premises shall not be used for any other than laundry purposes.

#### General :—

4. No person shall occupy or do any laundry work in the laundry premises without a permit from the Chairman. Such permit may be granted, refused, suspended, or cancelled at the discretion of the Chairman.

5. The lessee of a single tank will be allowed two assistants and the lessee of a double tank twice this number. Permits for assistants above these numbers will be granted in special cases at the discretion of the Medical Officer of Health.

6. The rent shall be paid in advance on or before the 10th day of each month.

7. No laundryman or his assistants shall transfer to any person the permit issued to him.

8. No laundryman shall sublet the tanks or rooms.

9. Laundrymen shall forthwith bring to the notice of the Medical Officer of Health the occurrence of any infectious or contagious disease in their homes and shall not work in the laundry until such time as they are permitted by the Medical Officer of Health.

10. No person shall take into the laundry any clothes or other articles exposed to infection.

11. Every laundryman shall forthwith furnish a complete list of names and addresses of all or any of his customers when so required by the Medical Officer of Health.

#### Penalty :—

12. Any person committing a breach of any of the above by-laws shall be guilty of an offence, and shall on conviction be liable to a fine not exceeding Rs. 50 and in the case of a continuing breach to a fine not exceeding Rs. 10 for every day during which the breach continues after the conviction for the first breach.

Sirupokam Cultivation (Section 11 (a) and (b)).

1. A meeting of proprietors shall each year determine what proportion of each holding may be cultivated for sirupokam, having regard to the quantity of water likely to be available.

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended April 22, 1933.

**Births.**—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 195 (11 Burghers, 112 Sinhalese, 36 Tamils, 21 Moors, and 1 Malays, and 4 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1933, viz., 292,200) was 34·8, as against 25·9 in the preceding week, 27·1 in the corresponding week of last year, and 30·3 the weekly average for last year.

**Deaths.**—The total deaths registered were 163 (1 European, 6 Burghers, 94 Sinhalese, 29 Tamils, 25 Moors, 4 Malays, and 4 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 29·1, as against 24·3 in the previous week, 23·9 in the corresponding week of last year, and 24·5 the weekly average for last year.

**Infantile Deaths.**—Of the 163 total deaths, 31 were of infants under one year of age, as against 31 in the preceding week, 28 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 29 the average for last year.

**Stillbirths.**—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 22.

**Principal Causes of Death.**—1. (a) Sixteen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 4 in Kotahena North, 2 each in Kotahena South, Maradana hospitals, and Slave Island, and 1 each in Pettah, St. Paul's, San Sebastian, New Bazaar, Maradana South, and Kollupitiya, as against 15 in the previous week and 15 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Nine deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 3 each in San Sebastian and Slave Island and 1 each in St. Paul's, New Bazaar, and Maradana North, as against 6 in the previous week and 8 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Four deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 1 each in Kotahena North, Maradana hospitals, Maradana East, and Slave Island, as against 7 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

2. Eighteen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 10 in Maradana hospitals (including 6 deaths of non-residents), 2 each in St. Paul's and Wellawatta North, and 1 each in San Sebastian, Maradana North, Maradana East, and Slave Island, as against 16 in the previous week and 11 the weekly average for last year.

3. Four deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 3 in Maradana hospitals (of non-residents) and 1 in Maradana South, as against 2 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

4. Ten deaths each from *Enteritis* and *Debility* were registered, 6 from *Puerperal Septicæmia*, 4 each from *Dysentery* and *Worms*, 3 each from *Infantile Convulsions* and *Tetanus*, 2 each from *Diarrhoea*, *Smallpox*, and *Accidents*, 1 from *Suicide*, and 65 from *Other Causes*.

5. **Reported Cases.**—Twenty-seven cases of *Measles*, 19 of *Chickenpox*, 5 each of *Enteric Fever* and *Whooping Cough*, 2 of *Mumps*, and 1 of *Diphtheria* were reported during the week, as against 16, 10, 4, 1, nil, and nil, respectively, of the preceding week.

**State of the Weather.**—The mean temperature of air was 82·3°, against 81·8° in the preceding week and 81·9° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·875 in., against 29·883 in. in the preceding week and 29·910 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0·22 in., against 0·65 in. in the preceding week and 0·12 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

## MEMORANDUM OF ASSOCIATION OF THE HATTON BANK, LIMITED.

1. The name of the Company is "THE HATTON BANK, LIMITED."
2. The registered office of the Company is to be established in Hatton.
3. The objects of the Company are :—
  - (1) To purchase from Messrs.   - (9) To finance and assist railways, tramways, or other commercial undertakings, of whatsoever nature, whether on sea or on land, and also corporations, companies, associations, syndicates, firms, or persons, of all kinds or descriptions and to negotiate loans of every description with any government, state, principality, authority, or body, whether supreme, provincial, municipal, local or otherwise and with any corporation, company, association, syndicate, firm, or person.

  - (14) To enter into any arrangements with any government, state, principality, authority, or body, whether supreme, provincial, municipal, local or otherwise, or any other banks that may seem conducive to the bank's objects or any of them, and to obtain from any such government, state, principality, authority or body, or bank and thereafter to carry out, exercise, develop, and otherwise deal with, and turn to account any concessions, franchises, charters, patents, monopolies, privileges, or rights, whatsoever and wheresoever.

- (15) To receive on deposit, gratuitously or otherwise, for safe custody, transit or otherwise, money, securities for money, documents of or relating to title to property of all kinds, bullion, jewellery, pictures, plate and other articles of value, goods, chattels, movable effects, and personal property of every kind.

- (20) To establish and support, or aid in or contribute to the establishment and support, of associations, institutions, funds, trusts, and conveniences, calculated to benefit employees or ex employees of the bank or the dependants or connections of such persons; and to grant pensions and allowances and donations to any persons who have been in the employ of the bank, or to employees or ex-employees of any persons, firms, companies or corporations whose business may have been acquired by the Bank and to make payments towards insurance, and to subscribe or guarantee money for gifts or testimonials, or for national, provincial, municipal, educational, scientific, religious, charitable or benevolent objects, or for any public, general, or useful object.
- (21) To sell, improve, manage, develop, exchange, lease, mortgage, dispose of, turn to account, or otherwise deal with all or any part of the property, concessions, franchises, charters, patents, monopolies, privileges or rights of the bank for the time being, whatsoever and wheresoever.
- (22) To establish, promote, or concur in establishing or promoting any company, corporation, syndicate, or firm whose business or objects shall include the acquisition and taking over of all or any of the property, assets and liabilities of the bank, or in which the bank is interested, or which shall be in any manner calculated to advance directly or indirectly the objects or interests of the bank, and to take or otherwise acquire and hold shares in or securities of any such company, corporation, syndicate or firm, and to guarantee any payments in respect of any shares, debentures or securities (whether in the nature of capital, principal, income or interest, or otherwise) issued by any such company, corporation, syndicate or firm.
- (23) To do all or any of the above things in any part of the world, and as principal, agent, contractor, trustee or in any other capacity whatever, and by or through trustees, agents or otherwise, and either alone or in conjunction with others.
- (24) To do all such other acts and things in all parts of the world as shall seem to the bank incidental or conducive to the attainment of the above objects or any of them.

4. The liability of the Shareholders is limited.

5. The nominal capital of the Company is Three hundred thousand Rupees (Rs. 300,000), divided into 300 Cumulative Preference shares of (Rs. 100) each and 2,700 ordinary shares of (Rs. 100) each with power to increase or reduce the capital. Such preference shares shall confer the right to a fixed Cumulative Preferential dividend at the rate of six per cent. per annum on the capital for the time being paid up thereon and shall rank as regards return of capital, in priority to the ordinary shares, but shall not confer the right to any further participation in profits or assets. The shares forming the capital (original increased or reduced) of the Company other than the said Preference shares may be subdivided or consolidated or divided into such classes with any preferential, deferred, qualified, special, or other rights, privileges, or conditions attached thereto and be held upon such terms as may be prescribed by the Articles of Association and regulation of the Company for the time being or otherwise.

6. The profits of the Company of each year which it shall from time to time be determined to distribute shall (subject to the provisions of clauses 5 and 8 hereof) be applied in the manner and order following:—

- (1) In payment of a fixed Cumulative Preferential dividend of six per cent. per annum on the capital for the time being paid up on the said Preference shares.
- (2) The balance of the remaining profits shall be divided among the holders of ordinary shares in proportion to the amount paid on the shares held by them.

7. In a winding up voluntary or otherwise the assets available for distribution amongst the Shareholders shall be applied:—

- (1) To the payment off of the capital paid up on the said Preference shares with the arrears of dividend thereon whether declared or not up to the commencement of the winding up.

## ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION OF THE HATTON BANK, LIMITED.

1. The regulations contained in Table "B" in the schedule annexed to the Joint Stock Banking Ordinance, 1897, shall not apply to this Company which shall be governed by the regulations contained in these Articles but subject to repeal, addition, or alteration by special resolution.

Table B not to apply.

2. The Company may by special resolution passed at an Extraordinary General Meeting alter and make provisions instead of or in addition to any of the regulations of the Company whether contained or comprised in these Articles or not.

Alteration of Articles.

3. None of the funds of the Company shall be employed on the purchase of or be lent on shares of the Company.

Funds of Company not to be lent on shares of the Company.

## INTERPRETATION.

4. The marginal notes hereto shall not affect the construction hereof and in the interpretation of these presents the following words and expressions shall have the following meanings, unless such meanings be inconsistent with or repugnant to the subject or context:—

Interpretation.

The word "Company" means THE HATTON BANK LIMITED, incorporated or established by or under the Memorandum of Association to which these Articles are attached.

The "Ordinance" means and includes "The Joint Stock Companies Ordinance, 1861 to 1909," "The Joint Stock Banking Ordinance, 1897," and every other Ordinance from time to time in force concerning joint stock companies which may apply to the Company.

"Extraordinary resolution" means a resolution passed by three-fourths in number and value of such Shareholders of the Company for the time being entitled to vote as may be present in person or proxy at any meeting of the Company of which notice specifying an intention to propose such resolution as an extraordinary resolution has been duly given.

"These presents" means and includes the Memorandum of Association and the Articles of Association of the Company from time to time in force.

"Capital" means the capital, for the time being, raised or authorized to be raised for the purposes of the Company.

"Shares" means the shares, from time to time, into which the capital of the Company may be divided.

"Shareholder", "Holder", or "Member" means a Shareholder of the Company.

"Life Directors" means the Life Directors of the Company for the time being or (as the case may be) the Life Directors assembled at a meeting of Life Directors.

"Ordinary Directors" means the Ordinary Directors of the Company for the time being as appointed by virtue of the provisions of these Articles.

"Directors" means the Life Directors (if any) and the Ordinary Directors (if any) of the Company for the time being or (as the case may be) such Life Directors and Ordinary Directors assembled at a Board.

"Board" means a meeting of the Directors or (as the context may require) the Directors assembled at a Board meeting, acting through at least a quorum of their body in the exercise of authority duly given to them.

"Persons" means partnerships, associations, corporations, companies, unincorporated or incorporated by Ordinance and registration, as well as individuals.

"Office" means the registered office for the time being of the Company.

"Seal" means the Common Seal for the time being of the Company.

"Month" means a calendar month.

"In writing" and "written" include printing, lithography, and other modes of representing or reproducing words in a visible form.

Words importing the singular number only include the plural, and *vice versa*.

Words importing the masculine gender only include the feminine, and *vice versa*.

"Dividend" includes bonus.

"Paid up" shall include "credited as paid up".

## BUSINESS.

5. The Company shall forthwith enter into an agreement in terms of a draft which for the purpose of identification has been signed by W. K. S. Hughes, Notary Public, for the purpose of acquiring from Archibald Robertson Aitken and Ralph Duncan Banks, the banking business now carried on by them in partnership under the style and name of the Hatton Bank and Agency Company at Hatton, in the Island of Ceylon. The Directors shall carry such agreement into effect with or without modification as they may think fit provided however that such agreement shall not include or provide for the purchase of any portion or branch of the said business of The Hatton Bank & Agency Company save, other than banking.

Seal to be affixed to Agreement.

6. The business of the Company may, subject to the provisions of the Ordinance, be commenced as soon as the Board thinks fit.

Business to commence when Board thinks fit.

7. Subject as aforesaid, any branch or kind of business which by the Memorandum of Association of the Company, or by these presents, is either expressly or by implication authorized to be undertaken by the Company may be undertaken by the Board at such time or times as they shall think fit, and further suffered by them to be in abeyance, whether such branch or kind of business may have been actually commenced or not, so long as the Board may deem it expedient not to commence or proceed with such branch or kind of business.

Company may carry on any of the business authorized by Memorandum.

## CAPITAL.

8. The nominal capital of the Company is Three hundred thousand Rupees (Rs. 300,000) divided into 300 Cumulative Preference shares of One hundred Rupees (Rs. 100) each and 2,700 Ordinary shares of One hundred Rupees (Rs. 100) each, and the said Cumulative Preference shares shall confer the right to a fixed cumulative preferential dividend at the rate of 6 per centum per annum on the capital for the time being paid up thereon and a right in a winding up to payment off of the capital and arrears of dividend, whether declared or undeclared, up to the commencement of the winding up in priority to all other shares but shall not confer any further right to participate in profits or assets.

Capital.

9. The Directors may, with the sanction of a special resolution of the Company in General Meeting, increase the Capital of the Company by the creation of new shares of such amounts per share and in the aggregate and with such special, preferential, deferred, qualified, or other rights, privileges, or conditions attached thereto as such resolution shall direct, provided, however, that such new shares shall have no preferential rights over the 300 Cumulative Preference shares above referred to.

Power to increase Capital.

How far new shares to rank with shares in original capital.

10. Except so far as otherwise provided by the conditions of issue or by these presents, any capital raised by the creation of new shares shall be considered part of the original capital, and shall be subject to the same provisions in all respects with reference to the payments of allotment money, calls and instalments, transfer, transmission, forfeiture, lien, surrender, and otherwise, as if it had formed part of the original capital.

Power to reduce capital.

11. The Directors may also with the sanction of a special resolution of the Company reduce the capital or subdivide or consolidate the shares of the Company.

#### SHARES.

Issue of balance capital.

12. The Company may issue the balance capital whenever the Directors shall think fit and may make arrangements on the issue of shares for a difference between the holders of such shares in the amount of calls to be paid, and the time of payment of such calls.

Instalments on shares to be duly paid.

13. If, by the conditions of allotment of any share the whole or part of the amount thereof shall be payable by instalments, every such instalment shall, when due, be paid to the Company by the holder of the shares.

Allotment of shares.

14. The shares, except when otherwise provided, shall be allotted at the discretion of and by the Directors, who may from time to time issue any unissued shares, and may add to such shares such an amount of premium as they consider proper. Provided that such unissued shares, except when otherwise provided, shall first be offered by the Directors to the Shareholders in proportion to the existing shares held by them, and such offer shall be made by notice specifying the number of shares to which the Shareholder is entitled, and limiting a time within which the offer, if not accepted, will be deemed to be declined, and after the expiration of such time, or on the receipt of an intimation from the Shareholder to whom such notice is given that he declines to accept the shares offered, the same shall be disposed of in such manner as the Directors may determine. Provided that the Directors may at their discretion allot such unissued shares or any portion of them to the vendor or vendors of lands, property, rights, or privileges being acquired by the Company in payment of the whole or any part of the purchase price of any such lands, property, rights, or privileges, or as remuneration for work done for or services rendered to the Company and that without offering the shares so allotted to the Shareholders.

On what conditions new shares may be issued as to Preference, &c.

15. In case of the increase of the capital of the Company by the creation of new shares, such new shares shall be issued upon such terms and conditions, and with such preferential, deferred, qualified, special, or other rights and privileges annexed thereto, as the General Meeting resolving on the creation thereof, or any other General Meeting of the Company, shall direct, and if no direction be given, as the Directors shall determine, and in particular such shares may be issued with a preferential or qualified right to the dividends, and in the distribution of the assets of the Company, and with a special or without any right of voting, provided however, that such new shares shall have no preferential rights over the 300 Cumulative Preference shares above referred to.

Allotment of new shares.

Subject to any direction to the contrary that may be given by the meeting that sanctions the increase of capital, all new shares shall be offered to the Shareholders in proportion to the existing shares held by them, and such offer shall be made by notice specifying the number of shares to which the Shareholder is entitled, and limiting a time within which the offer, if not accepted, will be deemed to be declined, and after the expiration of such time, or on the receipt of an intimation from the Shareholder to whom such notice is given that he declines to accept the shares offered, the same shall be disposed of in such manner as the Directors may determine. Provided that the Directors may, at their discretion, allot such new shares or any portion of them to the vendor or vendors of any lands, property, rights, or privileges being acquired by the Company in payment of the whole or any part of the purchase price of any such lands, property, rights, or privileges and that without offering the shares so allotted to the Shareholders.

Shares may be registered in firm name.

16. Every person taking any share in the Company shall testify his acceptance thereof by writing under his hand in such form as the Company may from time to time direct.

And in name of two persons.

17. Shares may be registered in the name of a firm or partnership and any one partner of the firm or agent duly authorized to sign the name of the firm shall be entitled to vote and to give proxies in respect of shares registered in the name of the firm.

Joint-holders.

18. Shares may be registered in the names of two or more persons jointly.

19. Any one of the joint-holders of a share, other than a firm, may give effectual receipts for any dividends payable in respect of such share; but only one of such joint-shareholders shall be entitled to the right of voting and of giving proxies and exercising the other rights and powers conferred on a sole Shareholder, and if the joint-holders cannot arrange amongst themselves as to who shall vote or give proxies and exercise such other rights and powers conferred on a sole Shareholder, the Shareholder whose name stands first on the register of shares, shall vote or give proxies and exercise those rights and powers; provided, however, that in the event of such first registered Shareholder being absent from the Island, the first registered Shareholder then resident in Ceylon shall vote or give proxies and exercise all such rights and powers as aforesaid.

Survivor of joint-holders.

20. In case of the death of any one or more of the joint-holders of any shares, the survivor or survivors shall be the only person or persons recognized by the Company as having any title to, or interest in, such shares.

Trusts not recognized.

21. The Company shall not be bound to recognize (even though having notice of) any contingent, future, partial, or equitable interest in the nature of a trust or otherwise in any share, or any other right in respect of any share, except any absolute right thereto in the person from time to time registered as the holder thereof, and except also the right of any person under Article 42 to become a Shareholder in respect of any share.

Liability of joint-holders.

22. The joint-holders of a share shall be severally as well as jointly liable for the payment of all instalments and calls due in respect of such share.

Members' right to certificate.

23. Every Shareholder shall be entitled to a certificate or certificates under the common seal of the Company, specifying the share or shares held by him and the amount paid thereon, provided that in case of shares registered in the names of two or more persons the Company shall not be bound to issue more than one certificate to all the joint-holders and delivery of such certificate to any one of them shall be sufficient delivery to all.

As to issue of new certificate in place of one lost, defaced, destroyed, &c.

24. If any certificate be worn out or defaced, then, upon production thereof to the Directors, they may order the same to be cancelled, and may issue a new certificate in lieu thereof; and if any certificate be lost or destroyed, then, upon proof thereof to the satisfaction of the Directors, and on such indemnity as the Directors deem adequate being given, a new certificate in lieu thereof may be given to the person entitled to such lost or destroyed certificate. A sum of fifty cents shall be payable for such new certificate.

#### CALLS.

Calls.

25. The Directors may from time to time make such calls as they think fit upon the Shareholders in respect of all moneys unpaid on their shares, and not by the conditions of allotment made payable at fixed times, provided that three months' notice at least shall be given to the Shareholders

of the time and place appointed for payment of each call; and each Shareholder shall pay the amount of every call so made to the persons and at the time and place appointed by the Directors.

26. If any Shareholder fails to pay the amount of any call due by him on or before the day appointed for payment thereof, he shall be liable to pay interest on the same at the rate of nine per centum per annum from the day appointed for the payment thereof to the time of actual payment.

27. A call shall be deemed to have been made at the time when the resolution of the Directors authorizing such call was passed.

28. The Directors shall have power in their absolute discretion to give time to any one or more Shareholder or Shareholders, exclusive of the others, for payment of any call or part thereof on such terms as the Directors may determine. But no Shareholder shall be entitled to any such extension except as a matter of grace or favour.

29. The Directors may at their discretion receive from any of the Shareholders willing to advance the same, and upon such terms as they think fit, all or any part of the moneys uncalled upon their respective shares beyond the sums actually called up; and upon the moneys so paid in advance, or upon so much thereof as from time to time and at any time thereafter exceeds the amount of the calls then made upon, and due in respect of the shares in respect of which such advances have been made, the Board may pay or allow interest at such rate as the Shareholders paying such sums in advance and the Directors may agree upon, not exceeding, however, eight per centum per annum.

#### TRANSFER OF SHARES.

30. Subject to the restrictions contained herein the shares of the Company may be transferred by a transfer in the usual common form. The instrument of transfer of any shares shall (subject to clause 31 (e) hereof) be signed both by the transferor and transferee and the transferor shall be deemed to remain the holder of such shares until the name of the transferee is entered in the Register in respect thereof.

31. (a) Save as provided by clause 34 hereof and sub-clause (f) of this Article no share shall be transferred to a person who is not a member so long as any member (or any person selected by the Directors as one whom it is desirable in the interests of the Company to admit to membership) is willing to purchase the same at the fair value.

(b) Except where a transfer is made pursuant to clause 34 hereof, and sub-clause (f) of this Article the person proposing to transfer any shares (hereinafter called the "proposing transferor") shall give notice in writing (hereinafter called a "transfer notice") to the Company that he desires to transfer the same. Such notice shall specify the sum which he fixes as the fair value and shall constitute the Company its agent for the sale of the shares to any member of the Company (or person selected as aforesaid) at the price so fixed, or, at the option of the purchaser, at a fair value to be fixed by the Auditor of the Company in accordance with these Articles. A transfer notice may include several shares and in such case shall operate as if it were a separate notice in respect of each. A transfer notice shall not be revocable except with the consent of the Directors.

(c) If the Company shall within the space of sixty days after being served with a transfer notice, find a member (or person selected as aforesaid) in the manner hereinafter provided willing to purchase the share (hereinafter called "the purchasing member") and shall give notice thereof to the proposing transferor he shall be bound, upon payment of the fair value (subject to the provisions as to payment hereinafter contained) to transfer the shares to the purchasing member. Provided however that the payment of the purchase price to be paid for any shares purchased by virtue of this clause may be postponed for a period not exceeding 9 months after the date on which the purchasing member thereof shall have been registered as the holder of such shares, but such purchase price shall carry interest at the rate of six per centum per annum from the First day of January prior to date of such registration of the purchasing member as aforesaid to the actual date of payment. In the event of the payment of the purchase price being postponed as aforesaid the purchasing member, shall arrange for the payment of such purchase price being secured to the proposing transferor to his satisfaction. Provided further that the proposing transferor shall in any event (in addition to the interest (if any) payable as hereinbefore provided) be entitled to receive and be paid any dividends or bonuses on the shares, so transferred by him under this Article, declared in respect of profits earned by the Company during the financial period ending Thirty-first day of December immediately prior to the date of such registration.

(d) In case any difference arises between the proposing transferor and the purchasing member as to the fair value of the shares the Auditors shall on the application of the purchasing member certify in writing the sum which in his opinion is the fair value and such sum shall be deemed to be the fair value, and in so certifying the Auditors shall be considered to be acting as experts and not as an arbitrator.

(e) If in any case the proposing transferor after having become bound as aforesaid makes default in transferring the shares the Company may receive the purchase money (or arrange for the payment thereof as provided by sub-clause (c) hereof) and shall thereupon cause the name of the purchasing member to be entered in the register as the holder of such shares and shall hold the purchase money in trust for the proposing transferor. The receipt of the Company for the purchase money shall be a good discharge to the purchasing member and after his name has been entered in the register in purported exercise of the power aforesaid the validity of the proceedings or the arrangements for payment of purchase price made in accordance with the terms of these Articles shall not be questioned by any person.

(f) If, within the space of 60 days after being served with a transfer notice the Company shall not find a member (or selected person as aforesaid) willing to purchase the shares and give notice in manner aforesaid the proposing transferor shall at any time within three months afterwards be at liberty, subject to clause 35 hereof, to sell and transfer the shares (or those not placed) to any person.

(g) When any member dies without having disposed of his shares in the manner provided by clause 34 hereof the Directors may at any time serve on trustee administrator, or representative of such deceased Shareholder a notice calling upon him forthwith to serve on the Company a transfer notice in respect of such shares and if such trustee, administrator, or representative shall fail to serve such transfer notice within a period of 7 days of being requested as aforesaid he shall be deemed to have served a transfer notice and the provisions of these Articles shall apply accordingly.

32. (a) When the Company is served or is deemed to have been served with a transfer notice the shares specified therein shall first be offered to the Life Directors or the surviving Life Director and if they shall not within such time as may be limited by the Directors take up such shares or shall only take up a part thereof, such shares or the balance thereof shall be offered to the ordinary Directors (whether appointed by the Life Directors or not) and if they shall not within such time as may be limited by the Directors take up such shares or shall only take up a part thereof such shares or the balance thereof shall be disposed of to such person and in such manner as the Directors may think fit.

When interest on call payable.

When call deemed to have been made.

Directors may give time for payment of calls.

Payment of calls in advance.

Transfer of shares. Execution of transfer.

Restricted right of transfer.

Notice.

Company's Power.

Payments of purchase price.

Auditors' certificate.

Default by proposing transferor.

Default by Company.

Shares of deceased member.

How shares comprised in transfer notice to be offered to members.

Offer of shares to a class.

(b) When under sub-clause (a) of this Article shares are directed to be offered to a class of persons such shares shall be offered to such persons in proportion as nearly as may be to the amount of the capital paid upon the shares held by them respectively of the same class as those then being offered, and such person shall have the option of purchasing the shares so offered to him, and if any such person waives the option in respect of the shares offered to him or any part thereof he shall forthwith give notice thereof to the Company who shall at once inform the other persons of that class all or any of whom may within seven days of such information or within the time limited for the exercise of the original option (whichever shall last happen) exercise the option so waived and if more than one person shall exercise the last mentioned option the shares so affected shall be subject to the same terms of division as are hereinbefore provided.

Power to alter rules affecting offer of shares comprised in transfer notice.

33. The Company in General Meeting may make and from time to time vary rules as to the mode in which any shares specified in any transfer notice shall be offered to the members, and as to their rights in regard to the purchase thereof, and in particular may give any member or class of members a preferential right to purchase the same.

Right to transfer to son, &c.

34. Any share may be transferred by a member to any child or other issue, father, mother, wife, or husband of such member, and any share of a deceased member may be transferred by his executors or administrators to any child, or other issue, father, mother, widow, or widower of such deceased member (to whom such deceased member may have specifically bequeathed the same), and shares standing in the name of the trustees of the will of any deceased member may be transferred upon any change of trustees to the trustees for the time being of such will.

General power to refuse transfer.

35. The Directors may refuse to register any transfer of a share, (a) where the Company has a lien on the share; or (b) where the Directors are not of opinion that it is desirable to admit the proposed transferee to membership. But paragraph (b) of this clause shall not apply where the proposed transferee is already a member (holding more than ten shares).

Register of transfer.

36. The Company shall keep a book or books, to be called "The Register of Transfers", in which shall be entered the particulars of every transfer or transmission of any share.

Transfer to be left at office and evidence of title given when transfer to be retained.

37. Every instrument of transfer must be left at the office of the Company to be registered accompanied by such evidence as the Directors may reasonably require to prove the title of the transferor, and a fee of Two Rupees and Fifty Cents or such other sum as the Directors shall from time to time determine, must be paid to the Company for the registration of every such transfer; upon payment thereof the Directors, subject to the powers vested in them under these Articles, shall register the transferee as a Shareholder and retain the instrument of transfer.

Power to register transfers without meeting of Directors.

38. The Directors may, by such means as they shall deem expedient, authorize the registration of transferees as Shareholders, without the necessity of any meeting of the Directors for that purpose.

Directors not bound to inquire into validity, &c., of any transfer.

39. In no case shall the Directors be bound to inquire into the validity, legal effect, or genuineness of any instrument of transfer produced by a person claiming a transfer of any share in accordance with these Articles; and whether they abstain from so inquiring, or do so inquire and are misled, the transferor shall have no claim whatsoever upon the Company in respect of the share, except for the dividends previously declared in respect thereof, but only if at all, upon the transferee.

When register may be closed.

40. The register of transfers may be closed at such times and for such period as the Directors may from time to time determine, provided always that it shall not be closed for more than twenty-one days in any year.

#### TRANSMISSION OF SHARES.

Deceased shareholder.

41. The executors, or administrators, or the heirs of a deceased sole Shareholder shall be the only persons recognized by the Company, as having any title to the shares of such Shareholder.

As to transfer of shares of deceased, bankrupt, &c., members.

42. Any guardian of any infant Shareholder, or any committee of a lunatic Shareholder or any person becoming entitled to shares in consequence of the death, bankruptcy, or liquidation of any Shareholder, or in any other way than by transfer, shall, upon producing such evidence that he sustains the character in respect of which he proposes to act under this Article, or of his title, as the Directors think sufficient, may with the consent of the Directors (which they shall not be under any obligation to give) be registered as a Shareholder in respect of such shares; or may, subject to the regulations as to transfers hereinbefore contained, transfer such shares.

Rights of persons entitled to shares on death or bankruptcy, but not registered.

43. A person becoming entitled to a share by reason of the death, bankruptcy, or insolvency of the holder shall be entitled to the same dividends and other advantages to which he would be entitled if he were the registered holder of the share, except that he shall not before being registered as a member in respect of the share, be entitled in respect of it to exercise any right conferred by membership in relation to meetings of the Company.

#### SURRENDER AND FORFEITURE OF SHARES.

Company may accept a surrender of shares.

44. The Directors may accept, in the name and for the benefit of the Company, and upon such terms and conditions as may be agreed a surrender of the shares of Shareholders who may be desirous of retiring from the Company provided such acceptance is properly legalized.

Notice on member failing to pay call.

45. If any Shareholder fails to pay any call or instalment on or before the day appointed for the payment of the same, the Directors may at any time thereafter, during such time as the call or instalment remains unpaid, serve a notice on such Shareholder requiring him to pay the same together with any interest that may have accrued, and all expenses that may have been incurred by the Company by reason of such non-payment.

What notice shall contain.

The notice shall name a day (not being less than one month from the date of the notice) on, and a place or places at, which such call or instalment and such interest and expenses as aforesaid are to be paid. The notice shall also state that, in the event of non-payment at or before the time and at the place appointed, the shares in respect of which the call was made or instalment is payable will be liable to be forfeited.

If notice not complied with Board may forfeit shares.

If the requisition of such notice as aforesaid be not complied with, every or any share or shares in respect of which such notice has been given may at any time thereafter, before payment of calls or instalments, with interest and expenses due in respect thereof, be declared forfeited by a resolution of the Board to that effect.

Arrears to be paid notwithstanding forfeiture.

46. Any Shareholder whose shares have been so declared forfeited shall notwithstanding be liable to pay and shall forthwith pay to the Company all calls, instalments, premia, interest, and expenses owing upon or in respect of such shares at the time of the forfeiture, together with interest thereon from the time of forfeiture until payment at nine per centum per annum, and the Directors may enforce the payment thereof if they think fit.

Forfeited share to become the property of the Company.

47. Every share surrendered or so declared forfeited shall be deemed to be the property of the Company, and may be sold, reallocated, or otherwise disposed of upon such terms and in such manner as the Board shall think fit.



48. The surrender or forfeiture of a share shall involve the extinction of all interest in, and also of all claims and demands against the Company in respect of the share and the proceeds thereof and all other rights incident to the share, except only such of those rights (if any) as by these presents are expressly saved. Effect of forfeiture
49. A certificate in writing under the hands of one of the Directors and of the Secretary or Secretaries that a share has been duly surrendered, or forfeited, stating the time when it was surrendered or forfeited, shall be conclusive evidence of the facts therein stated as against all persons who would have been entitled to the share but for such surrender or forfeiture, and such certificate and the receipt of the Company for the price of such share shall constitute a good title to such share and a certificate of proprietorship shall be delivered to any person who may purchase the same from the Company, and thereupon such purchaser shall be deemed the holder of such share, discharged from all calls due prior to such purchase; and he shall not be bound to see to the application of the purchase money, nor shall his title to such share be affected by any irregularity in the proceedings in reference to such forfeiture or sale. Certificate of surrender or forfeiture.
50. The Directors may in their discretion remit or annul the forfeiture of any share within six months from the date thereof upon the payment of all moneys due to the Company from the late holder or holders of such share or shares, and all expenses incurred in relation to such forfeiture, together with such further sum of money by way of redemption money for the deficit as they shall think fit, not being less than nine per centum per annum on the amount of the sums wherein default in payment had been made, but no share *bona fide* sold or reallocated, or otherwise disposed of under Article 47 hereof, shall be redeemable after sale or disposal. Power to remit or annul forfeiture.
51. The Company shall have a first charge or paramount lien upon all the shares of any holder or joint-holders for all moneys for the time being due to the Company by such holder or by all or any of such joint-holders respectively, either in respect of such shares or of other shares held by such holder or joint-holders or in respect of any other debt, liability or engagement whatsoever and whether due from any such holder individually or jointly with others, including all calls which the Directors shall have resolved to make, although the times appointed for the payment thereof shall not have arrived; and where any share is held by more persons than one, the Company shall be entitled to the said charge or lien in respect of any money due to the Company from any of such persons. And the Directors may decline to register any transfer of shares subject to such charge or lien. Company's lien on shares.
52. Such charge or lien may be made available by a sale of all or any of the shares subject to it, provided that no such sale shall be made except under a resolution of the Directors, and until notice in writing shall have been given to the indebted Shareholder or his executors or administrators, or the assignee or trustee in his bankruptcy, requiring him or them to pay the amount for the time being due to the Company, and default shall have been made for twenty-eight days from such notice in paying the sum thereby required to be paid. Should the Shareholder over whose share the lien exists be in England or elsewhere abroad, sixty days' notice shall be allowed him. As to enforcing lien by sale.
53. The nett proceeds of any such sale shall be applied in or towards satisfaction of such debts, liabilities, or engagements, and the residue (if any) paid to such Shareholder or his representatives. Application of proceeds of sale.
54. A certificate in writing under the hands of one of the Directors and of the Secretary that the power of sale given by Article 52 has arisen and is exercisable by the Company under these presents, shall be conclusive evidence of the facts therein stated. Certificate of right of sale.
55. Upon any such sale two of the Directors may execute a transfer of such share to the purchaser thereof, and such transfer, with the certificate last aforesaid, shall confer on the purchaser a complete title to such share. Directors may execute transfer.
- PREFERENCE SHARES.**
56. Any shares from time to time to be issued or created may from time to time be issued with any such right or preference, whether in respect of dividend or of repayment of capital, or both, or any such other special privilege or advantage over any shares previously issued or then about to be issued (other than shares issued with a preference), or at such a premium, or with such deferred rights as compared with any shares previously issued or then about to be issued, or subject to any such conditions or provisions, and with any such right or without any right of voting, and generally on such terms as the Company may from time to time by special resolution determine, provided that no such shares shall have any preference over the 300 Cumulative Preference shares above referred to. Creation of preference shares.
57. If at any time by the issue of preference shares or otherwise the capital is divided into shares of different classes, then the holders of any class of shares may by an extraordinary resolution passed at a meeting of such holders, consent, on behalf of all the holders of shares of the class, to the issue or creation of any shares ranking equally therewith, or having any priority thereto, or to the abandonment of any preference or priority or of any accrued dividend or the reduction for any time or permanently of the dividends payable thereon, or to any scheme for the reduction of the Company's capital affecting the class of shares; and such resolution shall be binding upon all the holders of shares of the class, provided that this Article shall not be read as implying the necessity for such consent in any case in which but for this Article the object of the resolution could have been effected without it. The provisions of this Article shall extend to the 300 Cumulative Preference shares above referred to. Modification of rights.
58. Any meeting for the purpose of the last preceding clause shall be convened and conducted in all respects as nearly as possible in the same way as an Extraordinary General Meeting of the Company, provided that no member not being a Director, shall be entitled to notice thereof or to attend thereat, unless he be a holder of shares of the class intended to be affected by the resolution, and that no vote shall be given except in respect of a share of that class, and that at any such meeting a poll may be demanded in writing by any members personally present and entitled to vote at such meeting. And meetings.
- EMPLOYEES SHARES.**
59. The Directors may remunerate any employee of the Company by means of a share of the profits of the Company, or by remuneration varying with the profits earned or the dividends declared, or with the output or turnover of the Company, and such remuneration may be in addition to the ordinary remuneration of such employee, and may be either in cash or by way of allotment of shares fully or partly paid as the Directors think fit. And the Directors may establish such schemes for remuneration of employees in manner aforesaid as the Directors may in their absolute discretion think fit; and the Directors may from time to time vary any such schemes and may attach to any shares allotted to employees such special rights, privileges, conditions, or restrictions as they think fit, provided always that any shares which shall be issued to any employee of the Company by way of remuneration or share of profits as aforesaid shall be called "employee shares", and shall be subject to the provisions hereinafter contained relating to employee shares:— Employees shares and rights attaching thereto.
- (a) Each of the employees' shares shall, whilst it is held by an employee of the Company, rank for dividend as if it were an ordinary share of Rs. 100 fully paid up; (and whilst not held by an employee of the Company it shall not carry the right to any dividend).

- (b) An employee's share shall not confer the right to vote, or to attend at general meetings.
- (c) An employee's share shall not be transferable except as provided by paragraph (d) of this clause.
- (d) Whenever an employee's share is allotted or pursuant to this clause is transferred to any employee of the Company, such employee shall be entitled to retain and hold the same so long as he remains an employee of the Company; and if by death, resignation, withdrawal, dismissal or otherwise, he cease to be an employee of the Company, he or his executors, or administrators, shall be bound upon the request in writing of the Directors, to transfer such share to such person as the Directors may nominate; and, if such person is not an employee of the Company, such person shall at any time, on the request of the Directors, transfer such share to any employee of the Company.
- (e) If any person who ought in conformity with the last preceding paragraph of this clause, to transfer any shares makes default in transferring the same, the Directors may by writing under the common seal, appoint any person to make the transfer on behalf of the person in default, and a transfer by such appointee shall be as effective as if it were duly executed by the person so in default. A certificate under the common seal that such power of appointment has arisen shall be conclusive for all purposes.
- (f) In this Article "employee of the Company" means and includes any foreman, clerk, or storekeeper but the term does not include Directors or Auditors.

#### BORROWING POWERS.

Power to borrow.

60. The Directors shall have power from time to time at their discretion to borrow or raise from the Directors or other persons any sum or sums of money for the purposes of the Company, provided that the money so borrowed or raised and owing at any one time shall not without the sanction of a General Meeting exceed Rupees One hundred thousand (Rs. 100,000).

General Meeting may increase borrowing powers.

61. With the sanction of a General Meeting, the Board shall be entitled to borrow such further sum or sums and at such rate of interest as such meeting shall determine. A certificate under the hands of one Director and the Secretary, or of two Directors to the effect that in taking any loan the Directors are not exceeding their borrowing powers, shall be sufficient and binding on the Company and all concerned, and shall be conclusive evidence thereof in all questions between the Company and its creditors.

Conditions on which money may be borrowed.

62. For the purpose of securing the repayment of any such money so borrowed or raised, or for any other purposes the Directors may grant, create, execute, and issue any mortgages, cash credits, debentures, debenture stock, bonds, or obligations of the Company, charged upon all or any part of the undertaking, revenue, lands, property, rights, and assets of the Company both present and future, including uncalled capital or unpaid calls, or may make, accept, or endorse on behalf of the Company any promissory notes or bills of exchange.

Securities may be issued at a discount, &c., or with special privileges.

63. Any such securities may be issued either at par or at a premium or discount and may from time to time be cancelled, discharged, varied, or exchanged as the Directors may think fit, and may contain special privileges as to redemption, surrender, drawings, allotment of shares or otherwise.

Securities may be assignable free from equities.

64. Every debenture or other instrument issued by the Company for securing the payment of money may be so framed that the moneys thereby secured shall be assignable free from any equities between the Company and the person to whom the same may be issued.

#### GENERAL MEETINGS.

First General Meeting.

65. The First General Meeting shall be held at such time not being more than twelve months after the incorporation of the Company and at such place as the Directors may determine.

Subsequent General Meetings.

66. Subsequent General Meetings shall be held once in every year, at such time and place as may be prescribed by the Company in General Meeting, and if no time or place is so prescribed then at such place and at such time as soon after the first day in each year as may be determined by the Directors.

Ordinary and Extraordinary Meetings.

67. The General Meetings mentioned in the last preceding clause shall be called Ordinary General Meetings; all other meetings of the Company shall be called Extraordinary General Meetings.

When Extraordinary Meeting to be called.

68. The Directors may, whenever they think fit, call an Extraordinary General Meeting of the Company, and the Directors shall do so upon a requisition made in writing by not less than one-eighth of the number of Shareholders of the Company for the time being or by any Shareholder or Shareholders holding in the aggregate one-eighth part of the shares of the Company for the time being subscribed for.

Requisition.

69. Any requisition so made shall express the object of the meeting proposed to be called, shall be addressed to the Directors, and shall be sent to the registered office of the Company.

Upon the receipt of such requisition the Directors shall forthwith proceed to convene an Extraordinary General Meeting, to be held at such time and place as they shall determine. If they do not proceed to convene the same within seven days from the delivery of the requisition, the requisitionists may themselves convene an Extraordinary General Meeting, to be held at such place and such time as the Shareholders convening the meeting may themselves fix.

Notice of intention to submit resolution.

70. Any Shareholder may, on giving not less than five days' previous notice of any resolution, submit the same to a meeting.

How given.

71. Such notice shall be given by leaving a copy of the resolution at the registered office of the Company.

Notice of meetings.

72. Seven days' notice at least of every General Meeting, Ordinary or Extraordinary, and by whomsoever convened, specifying the place, date, hour of meeting, and the objects and business of the meeting, shall be given by notice sent by post or otherwise served as hereinafter provided but so that a General Meeting may, with the consent in writing of all the Shareholders for the time being be convened on a shorter notice than seven days or without written notice. Notice of an adjourned meeting shall not be requisite in any case. Where it is proposed to pass a special resolution the two meetings may be convened by one and the same notice and it is to be no objection to such notice that it only convenes the second meeting contingently upon the resolution being passed by the requisite majority at the 1st meeting.

As to omission to give notice.

73. The accidental omission to give notice of any meeting to or the non-receipt of such notice by any of the Shareholders shall not invalidate any resolution passed at such meeting.

Business of ordinary meeting.

74. Every Ordinary General Meeting shall be competent, without special notice having been given of the purposes for which it is convened, or of the business to be transacted thereat, to receive and discuss any report and any accounts presented thereto by the Directors, and to pass resolutions in approval or disapproval thereof, and to declare dividends, and to elect Directors and Auditors in place of those retiring by rotation, and to fix the remuneration of the Auditors; and shall also be competent to enter upon, discuss, and transact any business whatsoever of which special mention shall have been given in the notice or notices upon which the meeting was convened.

75. With the exceptions mentioned in the foregoing Articles as to the business which may be transacted at Ordinary General Meetings without notice, no General Meeting, Ordinary or Extraordinary, shall be competent to enter upon, discuss, or transact any business which has not been specially mentioned in the notice or notices upon which it was convened except resolutions submitted under Article 70.

Notice to be given of special business.

76. No business shall be transacted at any General Meeting, except the declaration of a dividend recommended by a report of the Directors or election of a Chairman, unless there shall be present or represented at the commencement of the business three or more Shareholders entitled to vote.

Quorum to be present when business commenced.

77. If at the expiration of half an hour from the time appointed for the meeting the required number of Shareholders shall not be present at the meeting, the meeting, if convened by or upon the requisition of Shareholders, shall be dissolved, but in any other case it shall stand adjourned to the same day in the next week at the same time and place; and if at such adjourned meeting a quorum is not present, those Shareholders who are present shall be a quorum, and may transact the business for which the meeting was called.

When if quorum not present meeting to be dissolved.

78. The Chairman (if any) of the Directors shall be entitled to take the Chair at every General Meeting, whether Ordinary or Extraordinary; or if there be no Chairman, or if at any meeting, he shall not be present at the time appointed for holding such meeting, or if he shall refuse to take the Chair, the Shareholders shall choose another Director as Chairman; and if no Directors be present, or if all the Directors present decline to take the Chair, then the Shareholders present shall choose one of their number to be Chairman.

Chairman of meetings.

79. No business shall be discussed at any General Meeting, except the election of a Chairman, whilst the Chair is vacant.

Chairman to be present before commencement of business.

80. The Chairman may, with the consent of the meeting, adjourn any meeting from time to time and from place to place, but no business shall be transacted at any adjourned meeting other than the business left unfinished at the meeting from which the adjournment took place unless due notice thereof shall be given.

Power to adjourn meetings.

#### VOTING AT MEETINGS.

81. At any meeting every resolution shall be decided by a show of hands and in case there shall be an equality of votes, the Chairman at such meeting shall be entitled to give a casting vote in addition to the vote to which he may be entitled as a Shareholder; and unless a poll be immediately demanded by at least five Shareholders present in person or by attorney or by a Shareholder or Shareholders holding or representing by proxy or entitled to vote in respect of at least one-eighth part of the issued capital represented at the meeting, a declaration by the Chairman that a resolution has been carried, and an entry to that effect in the Minute Book of the Company, shall be sufficient evidence of the fact without proof of the number or proportion of votes recorded in favour of or against such resolution. The power of demanding a poll conferred by this clause may be exercised by the attorney of any Shareholder duly appointed in that behalf, provided however that the holders of the said Cumulative Preference shares shall only be entitled to demand a poll on any resolution in respect of which they are under the terms of these articles entitled to vote.

How questions to be decided.

Casting vote.

Power to demand a Poll.

82. If at any meeting a poll be demanded as aforesaid the meeting shall, if necessary, be adjourned, and the poll shall be taken at such time and place and in such manner as the Chairman shall direct, and in such case every Shareholder shall have the number of votes to which he may be entitled as hereinafter provided; and in case at any such poll there shall be an equality of votes, the Chairman of the meeting at which such poll shall have been demanded shall be entitled to a casting vote in addition to any votes to which he may be entitled as a Shareholder or proxy or attorney, and the result of such poll shall be deemed to be the resolution of the Company in such meeting.

Poll.

83. The demand of a poll shall not prevent the continuance of a meeting for the transaction of business other than the question on which a poll has been demanded.

Business may proceed notwithstanding demand of poll.

84. No poll shall be demanded on the election of a Chairman of the meeting or on any question of adjournment.

No poll on election of Chairman.

85. A Shareholder shall not be entitled to vote unless he shall hold ordinary shares in the Company and the said Cumulative Preference shares shall only confer on the holders the right to vote at a General Meeting upon some one or more of the following questions, that is to say, as to the reduction of capital; as to the adoption of the Annual Report and Balance Sheet; as to the appointment and remuneration of Auditors; as to the adjournment of meetings and the election of a Chairman at any meeting; on any matter dealing with pensions; as to the winding up of the Company; as to the sanctioning of the sale of the undertaking or as to altering the regulations of the Company so far as they affect directly the rights of preference Shareholders but subject as aforesaid the following provisions shall have effect, that is to say:—

Votes of members.

- (1) Upon a show of hands every member holding ordinary shares present in person or by attorney shall be entitled to one vote.
- (2) Upon a poll every member holding ordinary shares present in person, by proxy, or by attorney shall have one vote for every ordinary share held by him.
- (3) As regards any question on which any preference Shareholder is entitled to vote each such Shareholder present in person or by attorney shall have one vote on a show of hands and on a poll each such Shareholder present in person, by proxy, or by attorney shall have one vote for every preference share held by him.
- (4) When voting on a resolution involving the winding up of the Company every Shareholder present in person, by proxy, or by attorney shall have one vote for every share held by him but no such resolution shall be deemed to be carried unless passed by three-fourths in number and value of such Shareholders of the Company for the time being entitled to vote as may be present in person or by proxy or by attorney at any meeting of which notice specifying the intention to propose such a resolution has been given.

86. The parent or guardian or curator of an infant Shareholder, the committee or other legal guardian or curator of any lunatic Shareholder, and the executor or administrator of any deceased Shareholder, or any one of such persons as aforesaid, if more than one, shall not be entitled to vote in the place of such infant, lunatic, female, or deceased Shareholder, unless such person shall have been registered as a Shareholder.

Votes in respect of deceased, &c., members.

87. Votes may subject to the provisions herein contained be given either personally or by proxy or by attorney.

Proxies permitted.

No member entitled to vote, &c., while call due to Company.

88. No Shareholder shall be entitled to be present or to vote either personally or by proxy or attorney at any meeting unless all calls due from him on his shares have been paid, and no Shareholder, other than the trustee or assignee of a bankrupt or representative of a deceased Shareholder, shall be entitled to be present or to vote at any meeting held after the expiration of three months from the registration of the Company, in respect of any share which he has acquired by transfer, unless he has been registered as the holder of the share in respect of which he claims to vote at least three months previous to the time of holding the meeting at which he proposes to vote.

Who may be appointed proxy.

89. No person shall be entitled to hold a proxy who is not a Shareholder in the Company, but this rule shall not apply to a power of attorney.

Instrument appointing proxy to be in writing.

90. The instrument appointing a proxy shall be printed or written and shall be signed by the appointor (whether a Shareholder or his attorney) or if such appointor be a company or corporation, it shall be under the common seal of such company or corporation.

Form of proxy.

91. The instrument appointing a proxy shall be deposited at the registered office of the Company not less than forty-eight hours before the time appointed for holding the meeting at which the person named in such instrument proposes to vote.

The instrument appointing a proxy may be in the following form :—

Validity of votes.

92. No objection shall be made to the validity of any vote (whether given personally or by proxy or by attorney) except at the meeting or poll at which such votes shall be tendered, and every vote (whether given personally or by proxy or by attorney) to which no objection shall be made at such meeting or poll shall be deemed valid for all purposes of such meeting or poll whatsoever.

Personal interest of members not to preclude him from voting.

93. No Shareholder shall be prevented from voting by reason of his being personally interested in the result of the voting.

Life Directors.

LIFE DIRECTORS AND DIRECTORS.

94. (a) The Life Directors of the Company shall be Archibald Robertson Aitken and Ralph Duncan Banks and each of them and any other Life Directors that may from time to time be appointed as in these Articles provided shall be entitled, subject to Article 102 hereof, to retain office so long as he shall hold not less than 30 per cent. of the ordinary shares of the Company for the time being issued and whilst holding office by virtue of this provision shall not retire by rotation but shall be entitled to remain as a Director for his life subject to the provisions of this Article and of Article 102 hereof.

(b) A Life Director may retire from active management of the business of the Company in Ceylon and shall not thereby cease to be such Life Director and may continue to exercise the powers hereby conferred on him.

Appointment of additional Life Directors.

95. The Life Directors or the majority of them or all the Life Directors for the time being if there shall be less than 3 may at any time appoint any person with the necessary qualification as provided by Article 94 hereof to be a Life Director and any person so appointed shall have all the rights and privileges and be subject to the same duties and obligations and the terms of these Articles as if he had been originally appointed.

Appointment of ordinary Directors by Life Directors.

96. The Life Directors or the majority of them or if there shall be less than 3 of them all the Life Directors for the time being may at any time or times by instrument in writing appoint any person to be an ordinary Director and may in like manner remove any such person so appointed. Every such appointment shall be recorded in the Company's minute book.

Appointment of ordinary Directors by Company.

97. The Company shall have no power to appoint ordinary Directors while and so long as there shall be a Life Director of the Company but if at any time there shall be no Life Director of the Company ordinary Directors may be appointed by the Company at a General Meeting.

Number of ordinary Directors.

98. The number of ordinary Directors which may at any time be appointed by the Company shall not exceed six and shall not be less than two.

Directors to devote whole time to business.

99. Every Director whilst resident in Ceylon and drawing remuneration from the Company shall, except with the consent of the Board, devote the whole of his time and attention to the business of the Company.

Remuneration of Directors.

100. As remuneration for their services, each of the Directors shall be entitled to receive out of the funds of the Company such annual sum as may be determined.

Power to fill casual vacancy amongst ordinary Directors.

101. Any casual vacancy occurring (after there shall cease to be any Life Directors) in the number of ordinary Directors or provisional Directors arising from death, resignation, or otherwise, may be filled up by the Directors, but any person appointed to fill such vacancy shall retain his office so long only as the vacating Directors would have retained the same if no vacancy had occurred. The continuing Directors may act notwithstanding any vacancy in their body, but so that if the number falls below the minimum above fixed, the remaining Director or Directors shall not commit the Company to any new business so long as the number is below the minimum.

When office of Director to be vacated.

102. The office of the Director shall be vacated :—

- (a) If he, without the sanction of a General Meeting, accept or hold any other office under the Company except that of Chairman, Managing Director, Managing Secretary, Manager, or Trustee.
- (b) If he become bankrupt, or suspend payment, or compound with his creditors.
- (c) If (not being a Life Director) he absents himself from the meetings of the Company for a period exceeding three months at any one time without the consent of the other Directors.
- (d) If he be found lunatic or become of unsound mind.
- (e) If (not being a Life Director or an ordinary Director appointed by the Life Directors) he be called upon by all the other Directors to resign his office.
- (f) If by notice in writing to the Company he resign his office.

When vacation of office takes effect.

103. Until an entry of the vacating of office by the Director under one of the sections of this Article shall be entered in the minutes of the Board of Directors his acts as a Director shall be effectual.

104. A Director or intending Director shall not be disqualified by his office from entering into a contract or arrangement with the Company, either as vendor, purchaser, manager, agent, broker, or otherwise, and no such contract or arrangement or any contract or arrangement entered into, by, or on behalf of the Company with any person, firm, or company, of or in which any Director shall be in any way interested, shall be avoided, nor shall any Director so contracting or being so interested be liable to account to the Company for any profit realized by any such contract or arrangement by reason of such Director holding the office of Director or of the fiduciary relation thereby established. Any Director so contracting or being so interested as aforesaid shall disclose at the Board Meeting at which the contract or arrangement is determined upon the nature of his interest, if his interest then exists, or in any other case at the first Board Meeting after the acquisition of his interest, and a Director shall not as a Director vote in respect of any contract or arrangement in which he is so interested as aforesaid, and if he do so vote his vote shall not be counted but this prohibition shall not apply to any contract by or on behalf of the Company to give to the Directors or any of them security by way of indemnity or of security for advances or to a settlement or set off of cross claims, and it may at any time or times be suspended or relaxed by a General Meeting. A general notice that a Director is a member of any specified firm or company, and is to be regarded as interested in any transaction with such firm or company, shall be sufficient disclosure under this Article, and after such general notice it shall not be necessary to give any special notice relating to any particular transaction with such firm or company as aforesaid.

Directors may contract with Company.

Safeguards.

#### ROTATION OF DIRECTORS.

105. No ordinary Director appointed by the Life Directors under Article 96 shall retire by rotation, but shall be entitled to remain in office subject to the terms of these Articles. Provided however that ordinary Directors appointed by the Life Directors shall retire as provided by these Articles after there shall cease to be Life Directors.

Rotation and retirement of ordinary Directors.

106. At the first ordinary General Meeting of the Company after there shall cease to be Life Directors all the ordinary Directors shall retire from office and at the first ordinary General Meeting in every subsequent year one of the ordinary Directors for the time being shall retire from office as provided in Article 107.

When all ordinary Directors to retire.

107. The ordinary Directors to retire from office at the second ordinary General Meeting after there shall cease to be Life Directors shall, unless the ordinary Directors otherwise arrange among themselves, be determined by ballot; in every subsequent year the ordinary Directors to retire shall be those who have been longest in office.

Which Directors to retire.

108. In case any question shall arise as to which of the ordinary Directors who have been the same time in office shall retire, the same shall be decided by the Directors by ballot.

In case of dispute to be decided by ballot.

109. Retiring Directors shall be eligible for re-election.

Retiring Directors eligible for re-election.

110. The ordinary General Meeting at which ordinary Directors retire or ought to retire by rotation, shall appoint successors to them, and in default thereof such successors may be appointed at a subsequent ordinary General Meeting.

Appointment of successors.

111. A General Meeting may from time to time after there shall cease to be Life Directors increase or reduce the number of Directors, and may also, determine in what rotation such increase or reduced number is to go out of office.

Power of General Meeting.

112. If at any meeting at which an election of an ordinary Director ought to take place the place of a retiring Director is not filled up, the retiring Director may continue in office until the first ordinary General Meeting in the next year, and so on from meeting to meeting until his place is filled up, unless it shall be determined at such meeting to reduce the number of Directors.

Retiring Directors to remain in possession till successors appointed.

113. A Director may at any time give notice in writing of his intention to resign by delivering such notice to the Secretary or by leaving the same at the registered office of the Company, or by tendering his written resignation at a meeting of the Directors, and on the acceptance of his resignation by the Directors, but not before, his office shall become vacant.

Retirement of Directors.

114. The Company may, by a special resolution, remove any Director (other than a Life Director or an ordinary Director appointed by the Life Directors) before the expiration of his period of office, and may, by an ordinary resolution, appoint another person in his stead. The Director so appointed shall hold office only during such time as the Director in whose place he is appointed would have held the same if he had not been removed.

Power to remove Directors.

115. Every Director or officer of the Company, and his heirs, executors, and administrators shall be indemnified by the Company from all losses and expenses incurred by him in or about the discharge of his duties, except such as happen from his wilful acts or defaults; and no Director or officer shall, nor shall the heirs, executors, or administrators of any Director or officer, be liable for the acts or defaults of any other Director or officer, or for any loss or expenses happening to the Company by the insufficiency or deficiency of title to any property acquired for or on behalf of the Company, or for the insufficiency or deficiency of any security in or upon which any of the moneys of the Company shall be invested, or for any loss or damage arising from the bankruptcy, insolvency, or tortious act of any person with whom any moneys, securities, or effects shall be deposited, or for any other loss, damage, or misfortune whatsoever which shall happen in the execution of the duties of his office or in relation thereto unless the same happen through his own wilful act or default.

Indemnity to Directors.

116. No contribution shall be required from any present or past Director or Manager exceeding the amount, if any, unpaid on the shares in respect of which he is liable as a present or past Shareholder.

No contribution from Directors.

#### PROCEEDINGS OF DIRECTORS.

117. The Directors shall meet together for the dispatch of business at such times and at such places as they think fit and adjourn and otherwise regulate their meetings and proceedings, as they think fit and two Directors shall be a quorum for the transaction of business, one of whom shall be a Life Director while there are any such Life Directors surviving and in Ceylon.

Meetings of Directors and quorum.

118. A Director may at any time convene a meeting of the Directors. It shall not be necessary to give notice of a meeting of Directors to any Director who is not for the time being resident in Ceylon. Questions arising at any meeting shall be decided by a majority of votes but in case of an equality of votes the Chairman shall have a second or casting vote.

Calling of meetings and notice.

119. The Directors may elect a Chairman of their meetings and determine for what period he shall hold office, and all meetings of Directors shall be presided over by the Chairman if one has been elected and is present; but if there be a vacancy in the office of Chairman or if at any meeting of Directors the Chairman be not present at the time appointed for holding the same, then and in that case the Directors present shall choose one of their number to be Chairman of such meeting. Provided however that no ordinary Director shall be elected Chairman or be capable of presiding at any meeting at which a Life Director is present and willing to act as such Chairman.

Chairman of Directors.

- Powers of quorum.** 120. A meeting of the Directors for the time being at which a quorum is present shall be competent to exercise all or any of the authorities, powers, and discretions by or under the Articles of the Company for the time being vested in or exercisable by the Directors generally.
- Power to appoint Committees and to delegate.** 121. The Directors may from time to time delegate any of their powers to committees consisting of such member or members of their body as they think fit and may from time to time revoke such delegation. Any Committee so formed shall in the exercise of the powers so delegated, conform to any regulations that may from time to time be imposed upon it by the Directors.
- Proceedings of Committee.** 122. The meetings and proceedings of any such Committee consisting of two or more members, shall be governed by the provisions herein contained for regulating the meetings and proceedings of the Directors so far as the same are applicable thereto, and are not superseded by any regulations made by the Directors under the last preceding Article.
- When Committee may meet.** 123. The Directors or any Committee may meet at such place as they may determine, in the Island of Ceylon.
- When acts of Directors or Committee valid notwithstanding defective appointment, &c.** 124. All acts done by any meeting of the Directors or by a Committee of Directors or by any person acting as a Director shall notwithstanding that it shall afterwards be discovered that there was some defect in the appointment of such Directors or persons acting as aforesaid, or that they or any of them were disqualified be as valid as if every such person had been duly appointed and was qualified to be a Director.
- Resolutions without Board Meeting valid.** 125. A resolution in writing signed or initialled by all the Directors for the time being in Ceylon (not being less than two Directors and one of whom shall, so long as there are any Life Directors, be a Life Director) shall be as valid and as effectual as if it had been passed at a meeting of Directors duly called and constituted.
- Power to remunerate Director for additional services.** 126. If any Director being willing shall be called upon to perform extra services or to make any special exertions in going or residing away from Hatton for any of the purposes of the Company or in giving special attention to the business of the Company as a member of a Committee of Directors the Company may remunerate the Director so doing either by a fixed sum or by a percentage of profits or otherwise as may be determined by the Directors and such remuneration may be either in addition to or in substitution for his or their share in the remuneration above provided for the Directors.
- Minutes to be kept.** 127. The Directors shall cause minutes to be made in a book or books to be provided for the purpose—
- (1) Of all appointments of (a) officers and (b) Committees made by the Directors.
  - (2) Of the names of the Directors present at each meeting of the Directors.
  - (3) Of the names of the members of the Committee appointed by the Board present at each meeting of the Committee.
  - (4) Of all orders made by the Directors.
  - (5) Of all resolutions and proceedings of all General Meetings of the Company.
  - (6) Of all resolutions and proceedings of all meetings of the Directors.
  - (7) Of all resolutions and proceedings of all meetings of Committees appointed by the Board.
- Minutes to be signed by Chairman and to be evidence of passing resolution.** 128. All such minutes shall be signed by the person who shall have presided as Chairman at the General Meeting, the Board Meeting or Committee Meeting at which the business minuted shall have been transacted, or by the person who shall preside as Chairman at the next ensuing General Meeting, or Board Meeting, or Committee Meeting, as the case may be; and all minutes purporting to have been signed by any Chairman of any General Meeting, Board Meeting, or Committee Meeting, respectively, shall, for all purposes whatsoever, be *prima facie* evidence of the actual and regular passing of the resolutions, and the actual and regular transaction or occurrence of the proceedings and other matters purporting to be so recorded, and of the regularity of the meeting at which the same shall appear to have taken place, and of the Chairmanship and signature of the person appearing to have signed as Chairman, and of the date on which such meeting was held.

#### POWERS OF DIRECTORS.

- General powers of Company to be vested in Directors.** 129. The control of the Company and of the business of the Company shall be vested in the Directors who in addition to the powers and authorities by these presents or otherwise expressly conferred upon them may exercise all such powers and do all such acts and things as may be exercised or done by the Company and are not hereby or by statute law expressly directed or required to be exercised or done by the Company in General Meeting but subject nevertheless to the provisions of any statute law and of these presents and to any regulations from time to time made by the Company in General Meeting provided that no regulation so made shall invalidate any prior act of the Directors which would have been valid if such regulation had not been made.
- As to purchase of property and rights and payment therefor.** 130. The Directors shall have power to purchase or otherwise acquire on behalf of the Company any property or rights which the Company may purchase or acquire and generally on such terms and conditions as may be thought fit and to pay for the same either wholly or partially in cash or in shares, bonds, debentures, or other securities of the Company and any such shares may be issued either as fully paid up or with such amount credited as paid up thereon as may be agreed upon and any such bonds, debentures, or other securities may be either specially charged upon all or any part of, the property of the Company and its uncalled capital or not so charged, to sell or otherwise dispose of, deal with, or abandon the whole or any part or parts of the Company's present or future property or rights upon such terms and conditions as may be thought fit, and to enter into any arrangement with any company, firm, or person carrying on business similar to that of this Company for mutual concessions or for any joint working or combination or for any restriction upon competition or for any pooling of business or profits that may seem desirable and to carry the same into effect and generally may exercise all such powers and do all such acts and things as may be exercised or done by the Company in General Meeting and are not hereby or by statute law expressly directed or required to be exercised or done by the Company in General Meeting.
- Specific powers of Directors.** 131. Without prejudice to the general powers conferred by the last two preceding Articles and other powers conferred by these presents it is hereby expressly declared that the Directors shall have the following powers, that is to say, power :—
- (1) To take such steps as they think fit to carry into effect the agreement mentioned in Article 5 hereof.
  - (2) To pay the costs, charges, and expenses preliminary and incidental to the promotion, formation, establishment, and registration of the Company.
  - (3) To appoint and in their discretion to remove or suspend such agents, managers, secretaries, officers, clerks, and servants for permanent, temporary, or special services as they may from time to time think fit, and to determine their powers and duties and fix their salaries or emoluments and to require security in such instances and to such amount as they think fit.
  - (4) To appoint any person or persons (whether incorporated or not) to accept and hold in trust for the Company any property belonging to the Company or in which it is interested or for any other purposes and to execute and do all such deeds, documents, and things as may be requisite in relation to any such trust and to provide for the remuneration of such trustee or trustees.



- (5) To institute, conduct, defend, compound, or abandon any legal proceedings by or against the Company or its officers or otherwise concerning the affairs of the Company and also to compound allow time for payment or satisfaction of any debts due and of any claims or demands by or against the Company.
- (6) To act on behalf of the Company in any matters relating to bankrupts and insolvents.
- (7) To refer any claims or demands by or against the Company to arbitration and observe and perform the awards.
- (8) To execute in the name and on behalf of the Company in favour of any Director or other person who may incur or be about to incur any personal liability for the benefit of the Company such mortgages of the Company's property (present and future) as they think fit and any such mortgage may contain a power of sale and such other powers, covenants, and provisions as may be agreed.
- (9) To give any person employed by the Company a commission on the profits of any particular business or transaction or a share in the general profits of the Company and such commission or share of profits shall be treated as part of the working expenses of the Company.
- (10) From time to time to make, vary, and repeal by-laws for the regulation of the business of the Company, its officers and servants.
- (11) To enter into all such negotiations and contracts and rescind and vary all such contracts and execute and do all such acts, deeds, and things in the name and on behalf of the Company as they may consider expedient for or in relation to any of the matters aforesaid or otherwise for the purpose of the Company.
- (12) To establish, maintain, support, and subscribe to any charitable or public object and any institution, society, and club which may be for the benefit of the Company or its employees or may be connected with any town or place where the Company carries on business; to give pensions, gratuities, and charitable aid to any person or persons who have served the Company or to the wives, children, or dependents of such person or persons that may appear to the Directors just and proper whether any such person, his widow, children, or dependents have or have not a legal claim upon the Company.
- (13) Before recommending any dividend to set aside portions of the profits of the Company to form a fund to provide for such pensions, gratuities, or compensation, or to create any Provident or Benefit Fund in such or any other manner as to the Directors may seem fit.
- (14) To make and alter rules and regulations concerning the time, manner of payment of the contributions of the employees and the Company respectively to any such Fund and the accrual, employment, suspension, and forfeiture of the benefits of the said Fund and the application and disposal thereof and otherwise in relation to the working and management of the said Fund as the Directors shall from time to time think.
- (15) To delegate all or any of the powers hereby conferred upon them to agents as they may from time to time think fit.

#### ALTERNATE DIRECTORS.

132. Any Director may at any time appoint any other Director or any other person to act as alternate for him and may at any time cancel such appointment. A Director or such other person appointed alternate for a Director shall be entitled to perform all the functions of his appointor (including the functions of the Chairman of the Board). A Director appointed as alternate Director shall have an extra vote at all meetings for each Director whom he represents in addition to his own vote as a Director.

Alternate Directors

Any alternate Director shall *ipso facto* cease to be an alternate Director if his appointor ceases for any reason to be a Director.

All appointment and removals of alternate Directors shall be effected by writing under the hand of the Director making or revoking such appointment left at the office.

#### LOCAL MANAGEMENT.

133. The following provisions shall have effect :—

- (1) The Directors may from time to time provide for the management of the Company outside the Island of Ceylon (or any special locality in Ceylon) in such manner as they shall think fit and the provisions contained in the next following five sub-clauses shall be without prejudice to the general powers conferred by this sub-clause.
- (2) The Directors from time to time and at any time may establish any local boards or agencies for managing any of the affairs of the Company outside the Island of Ceylon or in any specified locality in Ceylon and may appoint any persons to be members of such local board or any managers or agents and may fix their remuneration.
- (3) The Directors from time to time and at any time may delegate to any person so appointed any of the powers, authorities, and discretions for the time being vested in the Directors, other than the power of making calls and may authorize the members for the time being of any such local board or any of them, to fill up any vacancies therein and to act notwithstanding vacancies and any such appointment or delegation may be made on such terms and subject to such conditions as the Directors may think fit; and the Directors may at any time remove any person so appointed and may annul or vary any such delegation.
- (4) The Directors may at any time, and from time to time by power of attorney under the seal, appoint any persons to be the attorneys of the Company for such purposes and with such powers, authorities, and discretions not exceeding those vested in or exercisable by the Directors under these presents and for such period and subject to such conditions as the Directors may from time to time think fit be made in favour of the members or any of the members of any local board established as aforesaid or in favour of any company or of the members, Directors, nominees, or managers of any company or firm or otherwise in favour of any fluctuating body of persons whether nominated directly or indirectly by the Directors and any such power of attorney may contain such provisions for the protection or convenience of persons dealing with such attorneys as the Directors think fit.
- (5) Any such delegates or attorneys as aforesaid may be authorized by the Directors to sub-delegate all or any of the powers, authorities, and discretions for the time being vested in them.
- (6) The Directors may comply with the requirements of any local law which in their opinion it shall in the interests of the Company be necessary or expedient to comply with.

Local management.

## DIVIDENDS, BONUS, AND RESERVE FUND.

Declaration of dividends and bonus.

134. The Directors may with the sanction of the Company in General Meeting, from time to time, declare a dividend to be paid, and (or) pay a bonus to the Shareholders in proportion to the amount paid on their shares, but no dividend or bonus shall be payable except out of nett profits.

Interim dividends.

135. The Directors may, if they think fit, determine on and declare an interim dividend to be paid, or pay a bonus to the Shareholders provided the Directors are satisfied that the nett profits of the Company will be sufficient to justify such interim dividend or bonus.

Reserve Fund.

136. The Directors may, before recommending any dividend or bonus, set aside out of the profits of the Company such a sum as they think proper as a reserve fund and may invest the same in such securities as they may select, or place the same on fixed deposit in any bank or banks, and may from time to time deal with and vary such investment and apply such reserve fund or such portion thereof as they think fit, to meet contingencies or for special dividends or for equalizing dividends, or for working the business of the Company, or for repairing or maintaining or extending the buildings and premises of the Company, or for the repair or renewal or extension of the property or plant of the Company or any part thereof, or for any other purposes connected with the interest of the Company that they may from time to time deem expedient without being bound to keep the same separate from the other assets.

As to mode of payment of dividend or bonus.

137. Any General Meeting may direct payment of any dividend or bonus declared at such meeting or of any interim dividends or bonuses which may subsequently be declared by the Directors, wholly or in part by means of drafts or cheques on London, or by the distribution of specific assets, and in particular of paid-up shares, debentures, or debenture stock of the Company or of any other company, or in any other form of specie, or in any one or more of such ways and the Directors shall give effect to such direction and when any difficulty arises in regard to the distribution they may settle the same as they think expedient and in particular may issue fractional certificates and may fix the value for distribution of such specific assets, or any part thereof and may determine that cash payments shall be made to any Shareholder upon the footing of the value so fixed in order to adjust the rights of all parties, and may vest any such specific assets in trustees upon such trusts for the persons entitled to the dividend or bonus as may seem expedient to the Directors.

Unclaimed dividends not to carry interest against the Company.

138. No unclaimed dividend or bonus shall ever bear interest against the Company.

No payment to member owing money, &c., to the Company.

139. No Shareholder shall be entitled to receive payment of any dividend or bonus in respect of his share or shares whilst any moneys may be due or owing from him (whether alone or jointly with any other person) to the Company in respect of such share or shares, or otherwise howsoever.

Debts may be deducted.

140. The Directors may deduct from the dividend or bonus payable to any Shareholder all such sums of money as may be due from him (whether alone or jointly with any other person) to the Company, and notwithstanding the fact that such sums or any of them are not payable until after the date when such dividend or bonus is payable.

Notice of declaration of dividend.

141. Notice of any dividend that has been declared, or of any bonus to be paid, shall be given to each Shareholder entitled thereto, and any dividend or bonus unclaimed by any Shareholder for three years after notice thereof is given may be forfeited by the Directors for the benefit of the Company, and, if the Directors think fit, may be applied in augmentation of the Reserve Fund.

Payment to firms.

142. Every dividend or bonus payable in respect of any share held by a firm may be paid to, and an effectual receipt given by, any partner of such firm or agent duly authorized to sign the name of the firm.

Payment to joint-holders.

143. Every dividend or bonus payable in respect of any share held by several persons jointly other than a firm, may be paid to, and an effectual receipt given by, any one of such persons.

Evidence.

## EVIDENCE.

144. On the trial or hearing of any action or suit brought or instituted by the Company against any Shareholder or his representatives to recover any debt or money claimed to be due to the Company in respect of his shares, it shall be sufficient to prove that the name of the defendant is or was, when the claim arose, on the Register of Shareholders of the Company as a holder of the number of shares in respect of which such claim is made, and that the amount claimed is not entered as paid in the books of the Company; and it shall not be necessary to prove the registration of the Company, nor the appointment of the Directors who made any call, nor that a quorum of Directors was present at the Board at which any call was made, nor that the meeting at which any call was made was duly convened or constituted, nor any other matter whatsoever, but the proof aforesaid shall be conclusive evidence of the debt.

The seal.

## THE SEAL.

145. The Directors shall provide for the safe custody of the seal, and the seal shall never be used except by the authority of the Directors, or a Committee of the Directors, previously given, and in the presence of one Director at least, who shall sign every instrument to which the seal is affixed, and every such instrument shall be countersigned by another Director or by the Secretary or some other person appointed by the Directors.

Books of account to be kept.

## BOOKS AND DOCUMENTS.

146. The Directors shall cause true accounts to be kept of the sums of money received and expended by the Company and the matters in respect of which such receipt and expenditure takes place and of the assets, credits, and liabilities of the Company.

Books of account to be kept at the office.

147. The books of account shall be kept at the office or at such other place or places as the Directors think fit.

Inspection of books by members.

148. The Directors shall from time to time determine whether and to what extent and at what times and places and under what conditions or regulations the account books and documents of the Company or any of them shall be open to the inspection of the members and no member shall have any right of inspecting any account or book or document of the Company except as conferred by statute or authorized by the Directors or by a resolution of the Company in General Meeting.

Balance Sheet to be prepared.

## ACCOUNTS AND BALANCE SHEETS.

149. (1) At each ordinary meeting the Directors shall lay before the Company a Balance Sheet containing a summary of the property and liabilities of the Company made up to a date not more than ten months before the meeting from the time when the last preceding account and Balance Sheet were made up or in the case of the first account and Balance Sheet from the incorporation of the Company. Every such Balance Sheet shall be certified and signed by the Directors or any three of them in accordance with the terms of the Ordinance in that behalf and by the Secretary or Manager, if any, and also by the Auditor or Auditors.

(2) The Auditor's report (to be prepared in accordance with the provisions of clause 155 of these Articles) shall be attached to the Balance Sheet or there shall be inserted at the foot thereof a reference to the report, and the report shall be read before the Company in General Meeting and shall be open to inspection by any Shareholder.

Auditor's Report to be laid before Annual General Meeting.

150. A copy of such Balance Sheet together with the reports of the Auditors shall, at least seven days previously to the meeting, be sent to the registered address of every member of the Company and a copy shall also be deposited at the registered office of the Company for the inspection of members of the Company during a period of at least seven days before the meeting.

Balance Sheet and Report to be sent to members.

151. After the Balance Sheet has been laid before the Company at the General Meeting a copy thereof signed and certified by the Directors or any three or more of them shall be filed with the register at the same time as the copy of the annual list of members and summary prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Ordinance in this behalf.

Copies of Balance Sheet, &c., to be filed.

#### AUDIT.

152. Once at least in every year the accounts of the Company shall be examined and the correctness of the Balance Sheet ascertained by one or more Auditor or Auditors.

Accounts to be audited annually. Audit provisions.

153. The Company at the first ordinary meeting in each year shall appoint an Auditor or Auditors to hold office until the first ordinary meeting in the following year and the following provisions shall have effect, that is to say:—

- (1) A Director or officer of the Company shall not be capable of being appointed Auditor of the Company.
- (2) The first Auditors of the Company shall be Messrs. Ford, Rhodes, Thornton & Co. of Colombo, and they shall hold office until the first General Meeting unless previously removed by a resolution of the Shareholders in General Meeting in which case the Shareholders at that meeting may appoint Auditors.
- (3) If any casual vacancy occurs in the office of any Auditor, the surviving Auditor or Auditors (if any) may act, but if there is no surviving Auditor the Directors shall forthwith call an Extraordinary General Meeting for the purpose of supplying the vacancy or vacancies in the Auditorship.
- (4) Any Auditor, on quitting office, shall be eligible for re-election.

154. The remuneration of the Auditors shall be fixed by the Company in General Meeting except that the remuneration of any Auditors appointed before the first Ordinary Meeting or to fill any casual vacancy may be fixed by the Directors.

Remuneration of Auditors.

155. (1) Every Auditor of the Company shall have delivered to him a list of all books kept by the Company and shall have a right of access at all times to the books and accounts and vouchers of the Company and shall be entitled to examine the Directors and officers of the Company for such information and explanations as may be necessary for the performance of the duties of the Auditors.

Rights and duties of Auditors.

(2) The Auditors shall make a report to the Shareholders on the accounts examined by them and before the Company in General Meeting during their tenure of office and the report shall state:—

- (a) Whether or not they have obtained all the information and explanations they have required; and
- (b) Whether in their opinion the Balance Sheet referred to in the report is properly drawn up so as to exhibit a true and correct view of the state of the Company's affairs according to the best of their information and the explanations given to them and as shown by the books of the Company.

156. Every account of the Directors when audited and approved by a General Meeting shall be conclusive except as regards any error discovered therein within three months next after the approval thereof. Whenever any such error is discovered within that period the account shall forthwith be corrected and thenceforth shall be conclusive.

When accounts to be deemed finally settled.

#### NOTICES.

157. A notice may be served by the Company upon any member either personally or by sending it through the post in a prepaid envelope or wrapper addressed to such member at his registered place of address.

How notice to be served on members.

158. Each holder of registered shares shall from time to time notify in writing to the Company some place in the Island of Ceylon to be registered as his address and such registered place of address shall for all purposes be deemed his place of residence.

Members to register address.

159. As regards any member who has not notified in writing to the Company some place in the Island of Ceylon to be registered as his address, a notice posted up in the registered office shall be deemed to be well served on him at the expiration of twenty-four hours from the time when it is so posted up.

As to members not registering address

160. Any notice required to be given by the Company to the members or any of them and not expressly provided for by these presents shall be sufficiently given if given by advertisement.

When notice may be by advertisement.

161. All notices shall with respect to any registered shares to which persons are jointly entitled be given to whichever of such persons is named first in the register, and notice so given shall be sufficient notice to all the holders of such shares.

Notices to joint-holders.

162. Any notice sent by post shall be deemed to have been served on the day following that on which the envelope or wrapper containing the same is posted, and in proving such service it shall be sufficient to prove that the envelope or wrapper containing the notice was properly addressed and put into the post office and a certificate in writing signed by any Director or other officer of the Company that the envelope or wrapper containing the notice was so addressed and posted shall be conclusive evidence thereof. Any notice given by advertisement shall be deemed to have been given on the day on which the advertisement shall first appear.

When notice deemed to be served.

163. Every person who by operation of law, transfer or other means whatsoever shall become entitled to any share shall be bound by every notice in respect of such share which previously to his name and address being entered on the register shall be duly given to the person from whom he derives his title to such share.

Transferees, &c., bound by prior notice.

164. Any notice or document delivered or sent by post to or left at the registered address of any member in pursuance of these presents shall, notwithstanding such member be then deceased and whether or not the Company have notice of his decease, be deemed to have been duly served in respect of any registered shares whether held solely or jointly with other persons by such member, until some other person be registered in his stead as the holder or joint-holder thereof and such service shall for all purposes of these presents be deemed a sufficient service of such notice or document on his or her heirs, executors, or administrators and all persons, if any, jointly interested with him or her in any such share.

Notice valid though member deceased.

How notice to be signed.

Service of process in winding up.

165. The signature to any notice to be given by the Company may be written or printed.

166. In the event of a winding up of the Company every member of the Company who is not for the time being in the Island of Ceylon shall be bound, within eight weeks after the passing of an effective resolution to wind up the Company voluntarily or the making of an order for the winding up of the Company, to serve notice in writing on the Company appointing some householder residing in Colombo upon whom all summonses, notices, process, orders, and judgments in relation to or under the winding up of the Company may be served and in default of such nomination the liquidator of the Company shall be at liberty on behalf of such member to appoint some such person, and service upon any such appointee whether appointed by the member or the liquidator shall be deemed to be good personal service on such member for all purposes, and where the liquidator makes any such appointment he shall with all convenient speed give notice thereof to such member by advertisement in some daily newspaper published in Colombo or by a registered letter sent through the post and addressed to such member at his address as mentioned in the register of members of the Company, and such notice shall be deemed to be served on the day following that on which the advertisement appears or the letter is posted. The provisions of this clause shall not prejudice the right of the liquidator of the Company to serve any notice or other document in any other manner prescribed by the regulations of the Company.

#### SECRECY CLAUSES.

Secrecy clause.

167. Every Director, manager, auditor, trustee, member of a committee, officer, servant, agent, accountant, or other person employed in the business of the Company shall, if so required by the Directors before entering upon his duties, sign a declaration pledging himself to observe a strict secrecy respecting all transactions of the Company with its customers and the state of accounts with individuals and in matters relating thereto, and shall by such declaration pledge himself not to reveal any of the matters which may come to his knowledge in the discharge of his duties except when required so to do by the Directors or by any meeting or by a court of law or by the person to whom such matters relate and except so far as may be necessary in order to comply with any of the provisions in these presents contained.

Members not entitled to information.

168. No member or other person shall be entitled to enter upon the property of the Company or to inspect or examine the Company's premises or properties or the books or accounts of the Company without the permission of the Directors of the Company for the time being or to require discovery of or any information respecting any detail of the Company's trading or any matter which is or may be in the nature of a trade secret, mystery of trade, or secret process or of any other matter whatsoever which may relate to the conduct of the business of the Company and which, in the opinion of the Directors, it will be inexpedient in the interest of the members of the Company to communicate.

#### WINDING UP.

Distribution of assets.

169. If there be a voluntary or other winding up of the Company, the assets available for distribution amongst the Shareholders shall be applied:—

- (1) To the payment off of the capital paid upon the said 1,000 Cumulative Preference shares with arrears of dividend thereon whether declared or not up to the commencement of the winding up.
- (2) To the payment off of the capital paid upon all the remaining shares and any dividend on the said shares up to the date of the winding up in accordance with these Articles.
- (3) To the division among the Shareholders other than the holders of the said 1,000 Preference shares in proportion to the number of shares held by each of them of any balance remaining after payment of capital and dividend as provided in sub-sections 1 and 2 of this Article.

Member may purchase at sale.

170. Any Shareholder, whether a Director or not, and whether alone or jointly with any other Shareholder or Director, and any person not a Shareholder, may become the purchaser of the property of the Company or any part thereof in the event of a winding up or a dissolution, or at any other time when a sale of the Company's property or effects or any part thereof shall be made by the Directors under the powers hereby or under the Ordinance conferred upon them.

Distribution in specie.

171. (1) If the Company shall be wound up, whether voluntarily or otherwise, the liquidator may, with the sanction of an Extraordinary Resolution, divide among the contributories in specie any part of the assets of the Company, and may with the like sanction vest any part of the assets of the Company, in trustees upon such trust for the benefit of the contributories as the liquidator with the like sanction shall think fit.

(2) If thought expedient, any such division may be otherwise than in accordance with the legal rights of the contributories (except where unalterably fixed by the Memorandum of Association), and in particular any class may be given preferential or special rights, or may be excluded altogether or in part, but in default of any such provision the assets shall, subject to the rights of the holders of shares issued with special rights or privileges or on special conditions, be distributed rateably according to the amount paid or credited as paid up on the shares; but in case any division otherwise than in accordance with the legal rights of the contributories shall be determined on, any contributory who would be prejudiced thereby shall have a right to dissent and ancillary rights as if such determination were a Special Resolution passed pursuant to the sections 234 and 243 of the Companies Act of 1929, in England but for the purposes of an arbitration as in the sub-section 6 of section 234 provided the provisions of the Ceylon Arbitration Ordinance, 1866, and of the Ceylon Ordinance No. 2 of 1889, shall apply in place of the English and Scotch Acts referred to in the said sub-section 6 of section 234 of the aforesaid Companies Act and the said sections 234 and 243, save as herein excepted, shall be deemed to be part and parcel of these present Articles.

(3) In case any of the shares to be divided as aforesaid involve a liability to calls or otherwise, any person entitled under such division to any of the said shares may, within ten days after the passing of the Extraordinary Resolution, by notice in writing, direct the liquidator to sell his proportion and pay him the nett proceeds, and the liquidator shall, if practicable, act accordingly.

**KANDY MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.**

The Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on March 25, 1933, at 8.30 a.m., in accordance with the notice dated March 20, 1933.

Present:—Mr. H. P. Kaufmann, Chairman; Mr. Haji M. S. Usoof Ismail; Mr. W. A. B. Soysa; Dr. J. W. S. Attygalle; Mr. Walter Beven; Dr. L. C. Wijesinha; Mr. O. T. Nettelton; Mr. Geo. E. de Silva.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on February 18, 1933, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted:—

- Statement of receipts and disbursements from close of 1932 to February 28, 1933, on account of the Municipal Fund.
- Progress report of works brought up to January 31, 1933.
- Health Officer's report for February, 1933.
- Statement of cases instituted by the several Inspectors and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of February, 1933.
- The reservoir readings for the week ended March 25, 1933.

Resolved that the statement (a), together with the Minutes, of Proceedings of this meeting, as required by section 83 of "The Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910," be forwarded to the Commissioner of Local Government for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table:—Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, standpipes, and house service taps inspected during February, 1933.

3A. Mr. de Silva having inquired what progress has been made in investigations connected with the (River) Pumping Scheme, the Chairman stated that the pumping plant arrived on March 18, and was assembled on the same day. The work of excavating the well was resumed on March 24, and it is anticipated that the sinking operations will take about three weeks.

4. Petitions:—Mr. Ismail presented (1) petition signed by Rahmeth Umms objecting to the transfer of Market spaces Nos. 44 and 45 to the nominee of P. M. Mahideen and requesting that they be transferred in her favour, and Mr. Soysa presented (2) petition signed by M. O. Ossein Saibo & Co. and some other traders of Colombo street praying that their sale in sprats be not included in the term "Dry Fish" and they be allowed to carry on their trade without licences under the Dry Fish regulations. The Chairman undertook to look into the matters referred to in the petitions.

5. Pursuant to notice Dr. Attygalle moved—"That a Special Committee of this Council be appointed to investigate and report (1) whether any steps are necessary to co-ordinate relief granted by various charitable institutions in Kandy and the Council, and (2) whether such relief adequately meets the situation, and if not, in what manner further relief can be granted to the unemployed and poor in the town." Mr. Soysa seconded.

On the Chairman explaining that it was proposed to allot the Municipal lands in Nittawela and Mavilmada to about 40 families among the unemployed, for purposes of cultivation, in addition to the lands already allotted, Dr. Attygalle withdrew his motion with permission to bring it up again if and when necessary.

5A. Pursuant to notice Mr. de Silva moved—"As it is detrimental to the interests of the town of Kandy to allow the Circus known as "Happyland" to continue, that the permission granted to the proprietor of the said Circus be withdrawn immediately." Mr. Soysa seconded.

Dr. Attygalle, Mr. Beven, and the Chairman spoke against the motion.

It was put to the House and declared lost by 6 to 2.

For the Motion.—Mr. de Silva, Mr. Soysa.

Against.—Dr. Attygalle, Mr. Ismail, Mr. Beven, Mr. Nettelton, Dr. Wijesinha, the Chairman.

6. Papers re claim in respect of damage alleged to have been done to Mrs. A. V. Perera's land known as Welikande estate in connection with the opening of Lady Manning's Drive.

Resolved that the following recommendation of the Law Committee on the subject be adopted:—"Recommended that the Chairman be authorized to negotiate with claimant and offer up to Rs. 500 as compensation for land taken for the road and in discharge of all liabilities, at the same time denying any liability for alleged damage."

7. Papers re proposed terms for the settlement of the encroachments made by private parties on the Nittawela Trenching Ground and for the disposal of the encroachments on private lands made by the Council.

Resolved that the terms of settlement as proposed in Secretary's memo. of September 5, 1932, be approved.

8. To consider recommendations made by the Chairman for combating the vagrancy and beggar nuisance in Kandy.

The Chairman, after explaining the proposals, moved "That in conformity with correspondence between the Chairman of the Municipal Council, Kandy, and the Superintendent of Police, Central Province (letters O. 78 of February 22, 1933, and M. A. 1505/32 of March 3, 1933), this Council do resolve (1) to appoint a special officer on a temporary basis to expel beggars and vagrants from the public market and roads immediately adjoining its 4 sides, in terms of by-law 88 (b), on a salary of Rs. 25 per mensem; (2) to vote a sum of Rs. 2,500 towards the cost of dealing with the vagrant nuisance under Ordinance 5 of 1907, during the period April 1 to December 31, 1933, such sum to be devoted exclusively to action in connection with vagrants, other than Indian Immigrant Vagrants, on the understanding that Indian Immigrant Labourers becoming vagrants within Municipal limits will be dealt with by the Police without expense to the Municipal Council. Dr. Attygalle seconded.—Carried.

Resolution on item (13).—Resolved that the Chairman be asked to investigate the possibility of compensating Mr. de Moor for loss of leave preparatory to retirement.

Resolution on item (19).—Resolved that the Manager of the Hotel be informed that the Council has no objection to the building of a boat-house subject to approval of plans and details, and to the use of two skiffs for hotel visitors on payment of the usual licence fees for the boats and rent for the boat-house.

Resolution on item (22).—Resolved that the recommendation be adopted subject to the word "Morris" being substituted for the word "Ford."

Further resolution on item (31).—Resolved that the contract for railing for the esplanade be given to B. William, who made the design on a job agreement at a cost not exceeding the amount estimated for the work, viz., Rs. 1,974.
