A PROCLAMATION.

GRAEME THOMSON.

WHEREAS it seems advisable to the Governor to establish in Talahitimulla village in Katugampola korale south, in Katugampola hatpattu of the District of Kurunegala, North-Western Province, a general cemetery for the burial or cremation of the dead within the limits hereinafter specified and defined:

And whereas the Governor may under section 6 (3) of "The Cemeteries and Burials Ordinance, 1899," as amended by the Cemeteries and Burials Amendment Ordinance, 1931, either wholly or in part exempt any cemetery from the operation of sections 11, 16, 17, and 24:

Now know Ye that We, the Governor, by virtue of the powers vested in Us by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931, do hereby, under section 6 (1) of "The Cemeteries and Burials Ordinance, 1899," as amended by the Cemeteries and Burials Amendment Ordinance, 1931, establish, as from the date hereof, a general cemetery on the land described in Schedule A hereto for the burial or cremation of the dead within the limits specified and defined in Schedule B hereto.

And We do hereby exempt the said cemetery wholly from the operation of sections 11, 16, 17, and 24 of the said Ordinance.

SCHEDULE.

By-laws.

By-law relating to the definition of "bakery" and by-laws 2 (a) and 2 (b) relating to bakeries and also by-law 3 and by-law 20 relating to eating-houses, of Chapter XI. of the by-laws of the Municipal Council of Colombo dated August 22, 1930 (*Gazette* No. 7,799 of August 22, 1930), are hereby revoked and the following substituted therefor:—

BAKERIES.

Definition of Bakery.—"A bakery includes any building or part of a building used for any process connected with the baking of bread or the making of cakes or of biscuits for sale. Provided, however, that the term bakery shall not be deemed to include:—

- (a) any private residence or any other place where any process connected with the baking of bread or the making of cakes or of biscuits takes place not for sale but for the purpose of consumption on the premises.
- (b) any place where any process connected with the baking of bread or the making of cakes or of biscuits takes place and where the bread or cakes or biscuits so made are sold mainly, if not, wholly for consumption on the premises. Provided also that in the latter case it shall be lawful for the Chairman to authorize the use of such premises for the baking of bread or the making of cakes or of biscuits and to cancel such authorization if the bread or cakes or biscuits so made are not mainly sold for consumption on the premises."

(I.) *Conditions of Issue of Licence.*—"2. (a) That the room in which kneading takes place has a superficial floor space of not less than 180 square feet with a clear space of not less than 2 feet round the main kneading table and that the lower 5 feet of the internal surface of the walls is covered with glazed tiles or is plastered with cement and that the kitchen is not less than 80 square feet in area and is provided with an efficient smoke vent except when cooking is done by gas or electricity."

"2. (b) That there is a free external air space not less than 7 feet wide on at least one of the sides of the kneading room which contain doors and windows, but if there is a free external air space only on one side that there is provided an extractor fan or satisfactory opening in the roof for ventilation."

EATING-HOUSES.

(I.) *Conditions of Issue of Licence.*—"3. That if any food is cooked on the premises such premises shall include a kitchen having a minimum superficial area of 80 square feet, an efficient smoke vent, and at least one window capable of being opened. Such window when open shall have an area of not less than 1/15th of the superficial floor space. But no smoke vent shall be deemed necessary where gas or electricity is used for cooking."

(II.) *Regulations for licensed Eating-houses.*—"20. The licensee of an eating-house shall not permit the floor of the licensed premises, on which the meal-rooms and kitchen are situated, to be used for the purposes of any other business. Provided, however, that it shall be lawful for the Chairman to sanction the use of such floor for any business which does not injuriously affect the hygienic conditions of the licensed premises."

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended April 16, 1932.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 135 (2 Europeans, 8 Burghers, 78 Sinhalese, 20 Tamils, 20 Moors, 3 Malays, and 4 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1932, viz., 291,260) was 24.2, as against 26.4 in the preceding week, 23.8 in the corresponding week of last year, and 31.1 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 103 (2 Burghers, 56 Sinhalese, 20 Tamils, 14 Moors, 6 Malays, and 5 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 18.5, as against 21.9 in the previous week, 18.4 in the corresponding week of last year, and 25.2 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 103 total deaths, 19 were of infants under one year of age, as against 24 in the preceding week, 11 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 29 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 13.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Fourteen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 12 in Maradana hospitals (including 7 deaths of non-residents), and 2 in Slave Island, as against 10 in the previous week, and 17 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Five deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 2 each in San Sebastian and Kotahena South, and 1 in Slave Island, as against 6 in the previous week, and 10 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Seven deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 2 each in Maradana hospitals, Maradana South, and Slave Island, and 1 in St. Paul's. The number registered during the preceding week was also 7, and the weekly average for last year was 5.

2. (a) Eight deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 5 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents) and 1 each in Kotahena North, New Bazaar, and Slave Island, as against 16 in the previous week, and 12 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Two deaths from *Phthisis* of residents of Colombo town occurred at the Anti-Tuberculosis Hospital, Ragama, during the week.

3. Six deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 5 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents) and 1 in Slave Island, as against 5 in the previous week, and 3 the weekly average for last year.

4. One death from *Plague* of a resident of Colombo town, occurred at the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Angoda, during the week. No deaths were registered within the city.

5. Four deaths from *Enteritis* were registered, 3 each from *Dysentery*, *Worms*, *Tetanus*, *Debility*, and *Accidents*, 1 each from *Diarrhoea* and *Infantile Convulsions*, and 42 from *Other Causes*.

6. *Reported Cases*.—Thirty-two cases of *Chickenpox* (including 2 in port), 11 of *Whooping cough*, 9 of *Enteric Fever*, 8 of *Measles*, and 1 of *Plague* were reported during the week, as against 33, 5, 10, and nil, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 80·7°, against 82·6° in the preceding week and 81·2° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·893 in., against 29·857 in. in the preceding week, and 29·882 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. D., Colombo, and posted to reach the office of the Divisional Forest Officer, Colombo, not later than midday on Thursday, May 5, 1932, the envelope being marked on the left hand top corner "Offer for the Purchase of Timber and Firewood, Western Division" and signed by the tenderer. Alterations must be initialled, otherwise the offers may be treated as informal and rejected.

3. A deposit of Rs. 20 is required and should be forwarded with the offer by a money order in favour of the Divisional Forest Officer, Colombo.

4. The tenderers should satisfy themselves by inspection before tendering as to the acreage and contents of the demarcated coupe referred to in the annexed schedule, as the figures given therein are estimated only and their correctness is in no way guaranteed. The boundaries of the coupe will be pointed out by the Forest Ranger, Waga.

5. The successful tenderer will be required to execute a purchase agreement. A copy of this agreement can be seen at the Office of the Divisional Forest Officer, Colombo.

6. Before execution of the agreement, the purchaser will be required (a) to pay the full purchase amount or, if payment by instalments, 50 per cent. thereof, (b) to deposit as security for the efficient and punctual fulfilment of the agreement 5 per cent. of the full purchase amount offered by him or Rs. 100 whichever is greater. If payment is made by instalments the balance of 50 per cent. shall be paid by the purchaser in one instalment in accordance with clauses 3 and 4 of the special conditions set out below in this notice.

7. After payment of the purchase price, deposit of the security, and execution of the agreement, the purchaser will be entitled on application to refund of his tender deposit. Should the successful tenderer fail to carry out the requirements of clauses 5 and 6 of this notice, within 14 days of receiving notice in writing from the Divisional Forest Officer, that his tender has been accepted, the Rs. 20 deposited will be forfeited to the Crown.

8. Tenderers should make offers, written both in words and figures, for the timber and firewood contained in the coupe.

9. No tender will be considered unless the procedure laid down has strictly been complied with. The Conservator of Forests reserves to himself the right, without question, of rejecting any or all tenders, and of accepting any portion of a tender.

10. The special rules for felling, conversion, and removal which the agreement will require to be observed are specified in the special conditions advertised below. Nothing of these special conditions shall render the purchaser in any way exempt from liability under the Forest Ordinance of 1907, should he be responsible for the commission of Forest offence outside the boundaries of his purchased coupe.

11. Should any offer be accepted and should the successful tenderer after due notification decline or fail to pay any sum or sums stipulated for and to enter into the necessary contract within the time allowed, or in reasonable time, he will be held pecuniarily liable for any resultant loss to Government. Offers are made and received on this distinct understanding. The Conservator of Forests reserves the discretionary power to waive the terms of this clause in any decree as he may consider the circumstances justify.

12. The estimated *in situ* value of the timber and firewood described in the service is Rs. 1,125, and any offers below this figure are liable to rejection. This will, however, not prejudice the Conservator of Forests right to reject any offers even though they may be above *in situ* value.

13. For any further information, application should be made to the Divisional Forest Officer, Colombo.

Special Conditions.

On payment of the full purchase amount the purchaser will be entitled to fell and remove on or before October 15, 1932, in the manner specified below, all the firewood and timber contained in the purchased coupe. Any firewood or timber not removed by the expiry date shall *ipso facto* revert to the Crown. Under no circumstances will extension be granted.

(2) The purchaser shall agree to commence felling along the full length of the southern boundary of the coupe and to progress this felling line in the direction of the northern boundary, always keeping it parallel to the southern boundary along with felling commences.

(3) If the purchaser desires to pay by instalments payment of a first instalment of 50 per cent. of the full purchase price of the coupe shall entitle him to fell and remove all the trees in an area not exceeding one-half of the total area of such coupe. Payments of the balance 50 per cent. of the full purchase price by means of a second instalment shall entitle the purchaser to fell and remove all the trees in the other half of the total area.

(4) If paying by instalments, the purchaser shall pay the second instalment within three months of the date of execution of the agreement.

Should the purchaser fail to pay either instalment when due it shall be within the discretion of the Divisional Forest Officer to cancel the agreement as from the date of such default, and to declare same null and void. Any unremoved or unfelled timber or firewood lying or standing in the coupe shall unconditionally revert to the Crown as from the date of such cancellation, and the purchaser shall have no further claim thereto.

(5) Should the purchaser fell or remove trees or firewood from any area of the coupe he has not paid for, or from any area of forest outside the demarcated boundaries of his coupe nothing in the agreement shall exempt him from liability to punishment for illicit felling and removal under the provision of the Forest Ordinance, No. 16 of 1907, and the rules framed thereunder.

(6) The Range Forest Officer, Waga, or the Beat Forest Officer concerned shall measure up the timber which is ready for removal and shall issue the necessary removal permits or timber cart notes on the spot immediately after and in accordance with the said measurement. That no fuel or timber is to be removed without a removal permit or a timber cart note.

(7) The purchaser shall agree that for each and every infringement of the above conditions he shall become liable to a fine not exceeding Rs. 100, to be imposed by the Divisional Forest Officer in writing at his discretion, and to be recovered from the purchaser's security money.

(8) The purchaser shall agree that, in the event of security money having become exhausted, it shall be within the discretion of the Divisional Forest Officer either (a) to accept a further security deposit amounting to 10 per cent. of the full tendered purchase price, or (b) to cancel the agreement and to refund to the purchaser such balance of the paid purchase money, if any, as remains after deducting the value of firewood removed by the purchaser on the date of such cancellation. For the purpose of this clause the value of each removed cubic yard of firewood shall be reckoned at full royalty rates.

(9) The purchaser shall have the right of appeal to the Conservator of Forests in the event of enforcement of any of the penalties specified in these conditions, and the purchaser shall agree to accept the Conservator's decision as final and binding.

(10) All trees whether utilizable or otherwise and unless marked for retention as standards which are over 24 inches in girth shall be felled within 12 inches of the ground.

MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

The Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on March 19, 1932, at 8.30 a.m., in accordance with the Notice dated March 15, 1932.

Present:—Mr. H. P. Kaufmann, Chairman; Ratwatte Adigar; Mr. Geo. E. de Silva; Mr. Haji M. S. Usoof Ismail; Mr. S. A. Wijayatilake; Mr. W. A. B. Soysa.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on February 20, 1932, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted:—

- Statement of receipts and disbursements from close of 1931 to February 29, 1932, on account of Municipal Fund.
- Progress report of works brought up to the same date.
- Health Officer's report for February, 1932.
- Statement of cases instituted by the several Inspectors and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of February, 1932.
- The Reservoir Readings for the week ended March 19, 1932.

Resolved that the statement (a), together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this meeting, as required by section 83 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910, be forwarded to the Commissioner of Local Government for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table:—Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies standpipes, and house-service taps inspected during February, 1932.

3A. The Chairman tabled a comparative statement giving the figures of daily consumption of water from the reservoir for the periods January 21 to March 16, 1931, and January 21 to March 16, 1932, and indicated that this year during the period in question the average daily consumption had decreased by 83,358 gallons, a state of affairs which in his opinion was reassuring in respect of any immediate shortage in the supply.

Mr. Beven drew attention again to the unsightly tea kiosks round the lake, near the Suisse Hotel and on the Esplanade facing the Queen's Hotel. He suggested that the Esplanade should be enclosed by a railing with a gate giving admission to it from the Ward street side. He also suggested that the Council's Lawyer be consulted with the view of enacting a by-law for dealing with tea kiosks, as it seemed to him that the Council did not at present have the necessary powers.

The Chairman outlined the action he had so far taken with the object of suppressing those tea kiosks, and indicated that he proposed shortly to ask for the Council's sanction to prohibit certain roads to tea kiosks. He would circulate to the Council a sketch of the proposed roads.

In regard to the enclosure of the Esplanade, the Chairman said he would place the suggestion before the Works Committee.

Mr. de Silva complained that the Council's decision to give relief work to the unemployed on the Deyannawela Housing Scheme, as a means of relieving unemployment in Kandy, had not been put into effect yet, although the Council had made that decision six months ago.

The Chairman said that about 100 of the unemployed were given work daily, without cessation, in connection with the preparation of the bridge and approach roads to the site.

Of the two tenderers whose tenders had been accepted for building two sets of dwellings, one had already signed the contract, while the other had backed out of it at the last moment. His proposal to accept the next lowest tender had been circulated to the Council and approved. That tenderer would sign the contract on that day, and he would personally see that the contractors started work expeditiously, and completed the buildings within the prescribed time.

Mr. de Silva drew the Chairman's attention to the fact that provision dealers in Kandy had increased the prices of all provisions by 2 or 3 cents on the plea that they had to pay increased import duty, even in the case of food stuffs which were not affected by the increased import duty. As this caused considerable hardship to the poor, he desired the Chairman to look into the matter.

4. Petitions:—(1) Mr. Geo. E. de Silva presented a petition from the residents of Peradeniya, Eriyagama, Ratmale, Pallegama, and Gannoruwa protesting against the extension of the Municipal limits, so as to include their areas.

(2) Ratwatte Adigar presented a petition from the Incumbent of the Adahana Maluwa Gedige Vihare stating that the absence of a water supply in the vihare for purifactory purposes, for the Bhikkus and lay Buddhists who came to the vihare for worship, was causing considerable hardship, and asking the Council to allow a water supply to the vihare.

(3) Mr. W. A. B. Soysa presented a petition from certain shopkeepers in Ward street, Kandy, complaining of over-assessment of their premises this year. (4) Mr. S. A. Wijayatilake invited the Chairman's attention to the petition he had forwarded earlier from the Space and Stall holders in the public market begging that they be allowed to pay their arrears of rent in monthly instalments, and he asked the Chairman to view the request with sympathy. The Chairman undertook to look into the matters referred to in the petitions.

5. Correspondence:—(1) Letter No. 1959 of March 7, 1932, from Dr. W. E. de Silva resigning office as a nominated member of the Council. Read.

Ratwatte Adigar moved—"That this Council do place on record its high sense of appreciation of the valuable services rendered by Dr. W. E. de Silva to the Council as a nominated member of the Council." Mr. Geo. E. de Silva seconded.

The Chairman associated himself with the expression of appreciation and the resolution was passed unanimously.

(2) Letter No. M. 16/32 of February 29, 1932, from the Superintendent of Police, Central Province, inquiring whether the Council would grant an annual subsidy in the event of a Police Brass Band being formed for Kandy. Read.

It was resolved to inform the Superintendent of Police that the Council is not in a position to consider the grant of an annual subsidy at present, but will consider the matter in connection with the Budget for next year.

6. Mr. de Silva obtained the leave of the Council to move the following motion, which stood in his name, at the next meeting of the Council:—"That the Pumping Scheme which has been under consideration be undertaken without any further delay."

7. To sanction the following leave taken by officers in excess of six weeks:—

General Office.—Mr. M. C. Abdul Jawad, 59 days; Mr. E. R. Abeygunasekera, 15½ days; Mr. L. B. Abeykoon, 14 days; Mr. A. J. K. Marikar, 7 days; Mr. A. E. Ratnayake, 15 days; Mr. A. Vaidialingam, 134 days.

Electricity Department.—Mr. G. B. M. Hay, 2½ days; Mr. B. A. Wimaladharna, 11 days; Mr. R. V. Selliah, 1 day; Peon, Bahardeen, 15½ days; J. H. Ratnaik, 25½ days; E. W. D. S. Appuhamy, 6 days.—Resolved that the excess leave be sanctioned.

8. To sanction the payment of an annual rent of Rs. 2·50 for the lease of the right of way for the water main laid under the level crossing gate at Asgiriya.—Resolved that the payment be sanctioned.

9. Recommendations of Standing Committees:—

Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects held on February 20, 1932.

(1) Draft of by-law proposed to be enacted in place of repealed by-law 157 authorizing the Chairman to have meters fixed at premises at which water is shown to be unduly consumed or wasted, and to recover charges in respect of such excess consumption or waste.—Recommended.

(2) Memorial dated February 1, 1932, from Mr. C. J. Ratnayake, ex-Distraining Inspector, begging that the civil action now pending against him for the recovery of the sum of Rs. 2,098·70 be withdrawn and his father be released from the security bond in view of the expense and suffering he has undergone.—Recommended that the law should take its course.

Extract from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation held on February 20, 1932.

(3) Tender of Lily Nona applying for the use of Spaces A and B in the Railway approach road granary as a tea kiosk.—Recommended that the tender be rejected.

(4) Application from Mr. G. F. Buultjens, retired Superintendent of Municipal Works, for a refund of the sum of Rs. 202·87 appropriated by the Council from the fee of Rs. 405·73 paid to him by the Municipal Education District Committee for supervising the building of the Lady Gordon's road Tamil School in 1927.—Recommended to reply that it is regretted the matter cannot be reconsidered.

11. To obtain sanction for revotes for 1932 amounting to Rs. 92,073·14.—Resolved that the revotes be sanctioned.

12. Application from the Secretary, Municipal Council, asking that he may be allowed to retire at the end of 1933.—Resolved that the Secretary be allowed to retire at the end of 1933.

The material moves round on the top disc till it reaches a hole in the side wall where a scraper transfers it to the disc below. Pipes above the discs allow solvent to trickle through the material to a trough below. Solvent from the lowest trough is pumped to the disc second above, and so on.

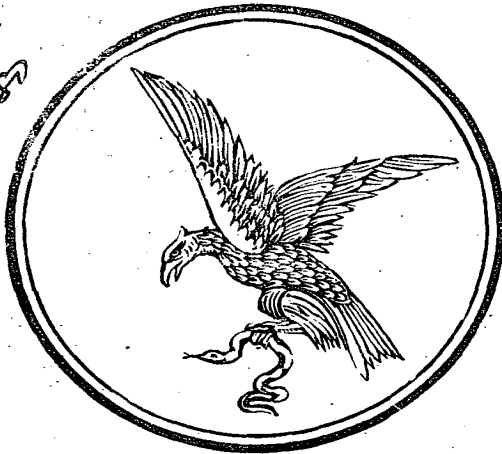
