SCHEDULE.

Rule 4A of section (iii.) of the rules dated August 6, 1930 (Gazette No. 7,797 of August 8, 1930), is repealed and the following is substituted therefor:—

Section (iii.) Rule 4A (i.).—It shall be the duty of—

- (a) the master, or person in charge, or owner, or agents of the owner, of any vessel within the harbour from which any article, likely to cause damage to the port or damage or obstruction to shipping, has dropped or has been washed or blown overboard, and
 - (b) the tindal, or the owner, or the agent of the owner, of any boat, barge, or lighter which has sunk in the harbour, to report such occurrence immediately to the Master Attendant, either by telephone or oral message and confirm the same in writing at the earliest opportunity stating the nature of the article or boat, barge, or lighter and the place where it fell or sank; and further to take the necessary steps for the immediate recovery of the lost article or boat, barge, or lighter, and in the event of its recovery to report such recovery to the Master Attendant in the manner above described.
- (ii.) It shall be the duty of the tindal or person in charge of any boat, barge, or lighter receiving or discharging cargo alongside any vessel within the harbour, to report to the Master Attendant as soon as possible after the occurrence all instances of cargo dropping overboard from the vessel's slings in the act of being lowered into or hoisted out of his boat.
- (iii.) Any default in carrying out the duties described in the foregoing paragraphs (i.) and (ii.) of this rule shall be an offence punishable under section 34 of the Ordinance.
- (iv.) If the lost article or boat, barge, or lighter is not recovered within 48 hours by the master or other person in charge or the owner or owner's agent as aforesaid, the fact should be reported to the Master Attendant who may take steps for its recovery.
- (v.) In the case of a boat, barge, or lighter, all expenses incurred by the Master Attendant in the process of locating and raising it, shall, whether it is brought up or not, be defrayed by the master, owner, or owner's agent.
- (vi.) In the case of any other article the loss of which has been duly reported to the Master Attendant, the master, owner, or owner's agent shall be liable to make good the expenses incurred, only if such article is recovered by the Master Attendant and only to the extent of one-third of the value of the article.
- (vii.) Where the loss of the article has not been reported to the Master Attendant the master, owner, or owner's agent shall, if the Master Attendant succeeds in recovering it, be liable to pay the full amount of the expenses incurred by the Master Attendant.

GREETING.

WHEREAS We deem it expedient that a Commission should issue to inquire into and report upon the operation of shipping conferences generally, and more especially into the system of deferred rebates, and whether such operations have caused, or are likely to cause, injury to shippers or producers in Ceylon, and if so, what remedial action, if any should be taken by legislation or otherwise.

IT is hereby notified that Regulations 145 and 146 of the Public Service Regulations published by Notification dated June 30, 1931, in the *Government Gazette Extraordinary* No. 7,865 of June 30, 1931, are amended as follows :—

Regulation 145.—Add “This regulation applies to every acquisition of land by way of purchase or gift by a Public Officer whether in his own name or in that of any other person, including the members of his family, and also to every such acquisition made by the wife of a Public Officer as her own separate property.”

Regulation 146.—Delete the first sentence (lines 1 to 5). In line 5 delete the words “But they have” and substitute “The last preceding regulation has”. In line 6 insert the word “dowry” after the word “inheritance” in both places where the latter word occurs.

THE ORDINANCE RELATING TO PILGRIMAGES,
No. 13 OF 1896.

REGULATIONS under section 1 of Ordinance No. 13 of 1896 entitled "An Ordinance relating to Pilgrimages" as amended by Ordinance No. 7 of 1897, made by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931, in anticipation of the customary pilgrimage to Kataragama for the Esala Festival, 1932.

REGULATIONS.

1. (a) The duration of the Kataragama Esala Festival, 1932, and of the stay of pilgrims at Kataragama shall be and it is hereby limited to fifteen days, namely, July 4 to July 18, 1932, inclusive.

(b) Pilgrims arriving before the day first named or staying beyond the period here prescribed shall be guilty of an offence.

2. The camp shall be under the general control of the Government Agent, Province of Uva, and under the immediate supervision of an officer designated the "Supervising Officer" who shall be assisted by a Medical Officer and by a Police Officer.

3. In the event of an epidemic breaking out at Kataragama during the festival, it shall be lawful for the Supervising Officer to declare the festival at an end, and to direct pilgrims at once to leave the village and proceed to their homes, and to prescribe the roads by which they have to travel.

4. The Supervising Officer shall have power on the line of march to and from Kataragama and at Kataragama—

- (a) To appoint particular places to be exclusively used by the pilgrims for washing and bathing, for drawing water and drinking and for natural offices;
- (b) To appoint places for the occupation of each class of pilgrims;
- (c) To prescribe routes for the journey of any body of pilgrims;
- (d) To regulate the distribution of all food given to pilgrims;
- (e) To fix separate places of abode for pilgrims who fall ill, to prohibit communication with them and to detain them if unfit to travel.

Any person disobeying any lawful order given for any of these purposes by the Supervising Officer shall be guilty of an offence.

5. For the purpose of these rules camp shall mean the area within half a mile of the Maha Dewala in every direction.

6. The Police are empowered and required to seize and destroy all food condemned as unwholesome on the march or in the camp, by the Supervising Officer or by the Medical Officer or in their absence by the chief officer of Police; and any person resisting or obstructing the Police in the discharge of this or of any other duty prescribed by these rules shall be guilty of an offence.

7. Any person bringing any cattle or cart-bulls within one quarter of a mile of the camp without a permit from the Supervising Officer or any person authorized by him to issue such permits shall be guilty of an offence.

8. The issue of such permits shall be subject to compliance by the permit-holder with such conditions as may be imposed by the Supervising Officer for the purpose of enforcing sanitation, maintaining the health of the camp, and regulating traffic.

9. (1) (a) Any person exposing commodities of any description for sale in camp in any other place than that assigned for the purpose by the Supervising Officer shall be guilty of an offence.

(b) Any person selling food condemned as unwholesome by the Supervising Officer or by the Medical Officer, or in their absence, by the chief officer of Police shall be guilty of an offence.

(2) (a) All eating houses and tea and coffee boutiques shall be kept clean and sanitary to the satisfaction of the Supervising Officer.

(b) No waste tea, coffee or milk, or remnants of food, cooking waste or refuse shall be thrown on the ground but shall be collected in a proper receptacle ready for removal by the sanitary authorities.

(c) No foodstuffs shall be exposed to the contamination of flies.

10. Any person who shall, during the occupation of the camp, use any other place for offices of nature than that provided for the purpose by Government, or shall fail to cover the deposit with earth or sand, and any person who shall during the same period bathe in or enter the river above the spot appointed by the Supervising Officer shall be guilty of an offence.

11. Any person suffering from an infectious or a contagious disease and not reporting the same to the Supervising Officer, to the Medical Officer or the chief officer of Police, and any person aiding or abetting in the concealment of such disease shall be guilty of an offence.

12. All persons shall take up the quarters assigned to them by the Supervising Officer or the chief officer of Police at the halting places and in the camp, and any person declining or neglecting to do so shall be guilty of an offence.

13. Any person who, without the previous sanction of the Supervising Officer, constructs any booth or extends any building so as to encroach on the main streets of the camp shall be guilty of an offence.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended May 7, 1932.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 165 (18 Burghers, 91 Sinhalese, 25 Tamils, 21 Moors, 5 Malays, and 5 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1932, viz., 291,260) was 29·6, as against 28·5 in the preceding week, 29·9 in the corresponding week of last year, and 31·1 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 129 (1 European, 3 Burghers, 81 Sinhalese, 24 Tamils, 18 Moors, and 2 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 23·2, as against 20·8 in the previous week, 20·6 in the corresponding week of last year, and 25·2 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 129 total deaths, 31 were of infants under one year of age, as against 25 in the preceding week, 18 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 29 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 6.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Seventeen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 11 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents), 3 in Kotahena North and 1 each in Kotahena South, New Bazaar, and Maradana East, as against 11 in the previous week and 17 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Five deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 1 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena North, Kotahena South, New Bazaar, and Slave Island, as against 7 in the previous week, and 10 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Three deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 2 in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident) and 1 in New Bazaar. The number registered during the preceding week was also 3 and the weekly average for last year was 5.

2. (a) Ten deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 6 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), 2 in Kotahena North and 1 each in Slave Island and Wellawatta South. The number registered during the preceding week was also 10 and the weekly average for last year was 12.

(b) Three deaths from *Phthisis*, of residents of Colombo Town, occurred at the Anti-Tuberculosis Hospital, Ragama, during the week.

3. (a) One death from *Enteric Fever* was registered in Maradana hospitals, as against 5 in the previous week, and 3 the weekly average for last year.

(b) One death from *Enteric Fever*, of a resident of Colombo Town, occurred at the Infectious Diseases Hospital Angoda, during the week.

4. One death from *Plague* was registered in Pettah, as against nil in the previous week and 1 the weekly average for last year.

5. Ten deaths from *Enteritis* were registered, 9 from *Debility*, 3 from *Dysentery*, 2 each from *Diarrhoea*, *Worms*, and *Accidents*, 1 each from *Infantile Convulsions*, *Tetanus*, and *Puerperal Septicaemia*, and 61 from *Other Causes*.

6. **Reported Cases.**—Seventeen cases of *Chickenpox*, 7 of *Whooping Cough*, 4 of *Measles*, 4 of *Enteric Fever*, 4 of *Mumps*, and 1 of *Plague* were reported during the week, as against 17, 6, 5, 2, nil, and 1, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 82·9°, against 81·8° in the preceding week and 82·0° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·834 in., against 29·884 in. in the preceding week and 29·791 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0·74 in., against 0·29 in. in the preceding week and 5·44 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

General Meeting.

Wednesday, April 6, 1932, at 3 p.m.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice, dated March 30, 1932.

Present.—Mr. W. L. Murphy, B.A., C.C.S., Chairman; Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader; Dr. E. V. Ratnam; Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando; Dr. E. A. Coorey; Mr. N. R. Blands; Mr. A. H. G. Dawson; Mr. M. L. M. Reyat; Dr. S. Muttiah; Mr. T. G. Dyball; Mr. F. Dadabhoy, J.P.; Mr. J. S. Collett; Lieut.-Colonel N. W. Napier-Clavering, D.S.O., R.E.; Mr. A. E. Goonesinha, M.S.C.; Mr. Aelian W. Pereira; Mr. T. A. Owles; Dr. H. U. Leembruggen; and Mr. H. L. Grocock.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of March 2, 1932, having been previously printed and copies thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read.

Resolved that the Minutes of the General Meeting of March 2, 1932, be confirmed.

1 A. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader, on behalf of himself and other Members of the Council, extended a hearty welcome to Mr. W. L. Murphy, on his assuming the duties of Mayor of Colombo, and Chairman of the Council. He assured the Chairman that he could always expect from every Member of that Council their co-operation in the discharge of his duties.

The Chairman thanked Mr. Abdul Cader and the Council very much indeed for the kind welcome extended to him and said it would always be his endeavour to give of his best in the service of the Council and he looked forward with very pleasurable anticipation to his period of service as Chairman.

2. Pursuant to notice, Mr. M. L. M. Reyat presented a petition from the rice dealers of the Municipal grain shops of Gasworks street, and 5th Cross street, praying that relief be given by reducing the rent of the premises now occupied by them, and moved that the matter be placed before the appropriate Standing Committee and the Relief Committee and that the petitioners be asked to come before the Committee. Mr. A. E. Goonesinha seconded.—Carried.

3. Pursuant to notice, Mr. M. L. M. Reyat presented a petition from the dairy owners of Colombo protesting against the method adopted by the Municipal Inspectors in examining milk for the purpose of testing its purity, and moved that it be placed before the Relief Committee and that the petitioners be afforded a chance of appearing before that Committee. Mr. A. E. Goonesinha seconded.—Carried.

4. Mr. M. L. M. Reyat, on behalf of Mr. A. R. A. Razik, who was absent, asked the following questions which the Chairman answered:—

(a) Q.—Does the Gas Company pay any fee as licence for the extensive operations they carry on in the city, if so how much? A.—No.

(b) Q.—Does the Municipality control and regulate the price of gas for purposes other than lighting? If not, why? A.—No. The contract specifies the rate to be charged for gas supplied to private consumers. The contract does not specifically provide any means by which the Municipality can enforce a breach of this term of the contract. The Municipality does not control the price of gas supplied to private consumers for the reasons given.

5. Mr. M. L. M. Reyat, on behalf of Mr. A. R. A. Razik, who was absent, asked the following questions which the Chairman answered:—

(1) Q.—In view of the prevailing depression, has the Council made any effort to retrench in respect to gas lighting, under the following heads:—(a) Municipal markets, (b) other Municipal buildings? A.—The possibility has been looked into, but no saving has been found practicable as the buildings in question are already supplied only with the minimum of lighting essential for their purposes.

(2) Q.—How much has the Council paid to the Gas Company:—(a) For gas fittings and installations, (b) for gas supplied to the Council—during the years 1928 to 1931 respectively, under the above-mentioned two heads (separately)? A.—A statement is tabled giving the approximate figures.

(3) Q.—Why did the Council repair and consolidate the Galle road section across 13th Lane, Bambalapitiya, which the Gas Company had broken up for the purpose of laying their main, and which section was left in bad order by this Company? A.—The laying of mains in 13th Lane was on Council's instructions and was paid for by Council. In such circumstances, road replacements are done at the Council's expense.

(4) Q.—In terms of section 9 of Ordinance No. 1 of 1869, are the Council's roads, which are broken up by the Gas Company, kept in good repair and maintained by the Gas Company for the prescribed period? A.—Yes.

(5) Q.—Have public streets been broken up without the superintendence of the Council's Officers, and without due notice of the Company's intention to break up such streets for gas operations, as required by section 7 of Ordinance No. 1 of 1869? A.—No.

(6) Q.—Do the Gas Company effectually repair reported gas leaks, within twenty-four hours, in terms of section 20 of Ordinance No. 1 of 1869. A.—Yes.

(7) Q.—Is not rule No. 9, as printed on the Gas Company's bills, regarding discontinuation of gas supply *without notice* to the consumer, contrary to provision in section 14 of the same Ordinance. A.—Yes; but the Gas Company states that notice is invariably given to defaulters in accordance with the requirements of the Ordinance.

(8) Q.—Is not rule No. 8, as printed on the Gas Company's bills, regarding disputes as to the accuracy of a meter, contrary to provision in section No. 15 of the same Ordinance? A.—The matter seems open to question, but so far no appeal has been made to the Council by any consumer.

(9) Q.—What is the amount now held by the Gas Company by way of deposits from gas consumers? A.—The information is not available.

(10) Q.—In view of the present lighting contract with the Gas Company, which expires at the end of next year, has the Council considered the possibility or otherwise of converting the street and public building lighting to electricity; if so, when will steps be taken to make a start in this direction? A.—The possibility has been considered from time to time prior to the renewal of previous contracts with the Gas Company and will presumably be re-considered prior to the expiration of the present contract. Any action to be taken will depend on the decision which may be arrived at.

6. Pursuant to notice, Mr. Aelian W. Pereira, asked the following questions which the Chairman answered:—

(1) Q.—In view of the Chairman's inability to table the Gas Company's annual reports, will the Chairman be pleased to state on what basis the price of gas is controlled and regulated by the Council? A.—The Gas Ordinances do not vest control of prices of gas either in the Chairman or in the Council. The Member is referred to the reply to question No. 4 (b) of the Agenda.

(2) Q.—What were the dividends paid by the Gas Company to its shareholders during the years 1918 to 1931, inclusive?

(3) Q.—What quantities of gas were manufactured by the Gas Company during the years 1918 to 1931, inclusive?

(4) Q.—What quantities of gas have escaped through the Company's mains, services, meters, &c., except through consumer's fittings, as recorded by the Company during the years 1918 to 1931, inclusive? A.—(2), (3), and (4) the information is not available.

(5) Q.—Are there any meters which were tested and sealed by the Council's Inspectors which have been used in the Urban District Council area of Dehiwala-Mount Lavinia? If so, has this Council received any consideration on this account either from the Gas Company or from the Dehiwala-Mount Lavinia Urban District Council? A.—(a) Yes. (b) No.

(6) Q.—Pursuant to the answer given to question 8 of my list of questions submitted at the last meeting, what are the "certain other purposes" for which the Gas Company uses dry meters? A.—(a) For gauging consumption of gas appliances. (b) For registering consumption of gas at installations.

(7) Q.—Under what authority does the Gas Company use this type of meter at all? A.—By authority of the Gas Meter Ordinance, No. 3 of 1871.

(8) Q.—Has the Council's Inspector tested and sealed such meters? If so, under what regulations or rules were these meters tested and sealed? A.—Yes. Under sections 8 and 9 of the Gas Meter Ordinance.

(9) Q.—Are 5 and 10 lt meters which are fixed to cookers, liable to register less gas than is actually passed or consumed? A.—All meters are liable to register incorrectly, but only within the margin of error ascertained when they were tested and stamped. In this connection the Member is referred to section 7 of the Gas Meter Ordinance.

(10) Q.—Does the Municipal Council possess a gas-testing apparatus in the Council's premises? If so, on what date was it installed? A.—A Calorimeter was re-installed in the Council's premises in February, 1932. The Council possesses no other testing apparatus.

6A. With the permission of Council the Chairman moved that this Council do place on record its high appreciation of the services rendered to this Council and the ratepayers of the City by Mr. W. J. Thornhill who was first nominated a Member of this Council on December 4, 1924, and who has continued as such, when not on leave, and has served on the Council and on the Standing Committee on Municipal Works, the Special Committee regarding the Building of the Town Hall and the Special Committee regarding Relief to Ratepayers." Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried unanimously.

7. Pursuant to notice, the Chairman moved—That the Council should resolve itself into a Committee of the whole Council to consider the following report and extracts from the proceedings of the Committees annexed to the Agenda. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried.

Council in Committee—

To consider the report of the Special Committee appointed by Council on November 4, 1931, "to inquire into the working of the Charity Commissioner's Department, also as regards the continuance of the post of Charity Commissioner and of the emoluments which should be attached thereto."

Dr. E. A. Coorey moved that the question of laying down a definite scheme of work with the salary attached to the post be referred to the Four Standing Committees. Dr. E. V. Ratnam seconded.

Mr. F. Dadabhoy moved, as an amendment that the report of the Special Committee be adopted, but that the salary and the allowance of the Charity Commissioner do remain as at present. Mr. J. S. Collett seconded.

The Chairman supported at length the amendment and asked that the mover and seconder of it should consent to an addition to their amendment suggested by him. The amendment with the addition to read as follows:—

That the report of the Special Committee be adopted, but that the salary and the allowance of the Charity Commissioner do remain as at present and that in regard to the suggested provision of funds for disbursement by the Charity Commissioner, the Council do reserve its decision pending the submission to it of detailed proposals by the Committee which it is proposed to appoint.

This was agreed to by the proposer and seconder of the amendment.

Mr. A. E. Goonesinha supported the motion and opposed the amendment.

Dr. S. Muttiah spoke against the amendment.

Mr. Aelian W. Pereira also opposed the amendment and supported the motion.

Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando opposed the motion and amendment.

Mr. M. L. M. Reyal spoke to the motion and amendment.

Mr. N. R. Blande supported the amendment.

Dr. E. A. Coorey replied to the objections to the motion.

The amendment with the addition by the Chairman was then put to the meeting and carried.

VETERINARY DEPARTMENT.

(6) To consider the Government's proposals for prohibiting the importation of goats. Registered No. 417.—Recommended that the Hon. the Minister of Agriculture and Lands be informed that the Council agrees with the proposals set forth in the memorandum of the Government Veterinary Surgeon forwarded with his letter of December 7, 1931, subject to the following modifications:—

(1) In view of the fact that Ceylon goats weigh on the average much less than Indian goats, the first restriction should be to 5,000 goats and not 4,000 as suggested by the Government Veterinary Surgeon.

The Chairman declared Dr. H. U. Leembruggen duly elected for the Sanitation Committee and Mr. H. L. Groocock for the Municipal Works Committee.

(11) To appoint a member in place of Dr. L. A. Prins, I.S.O., resigned, for the Special Committee regarding Public Library.

The Chairman moved that Dr. H. U. Leembruggen be appointed. Mr. A. E. Goonesinghe seconded.—Carried.

(12) To appoint a member in place of Mr. W. J. Thornhill, resigned, for the Special Committee regarding relief to ratepayers.

The Chairman moved that Mr. H. L. Groocock be appointed. Mr. A. E. Goonesinghe seconded.—Carried.

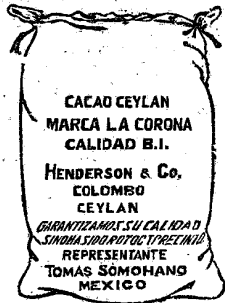

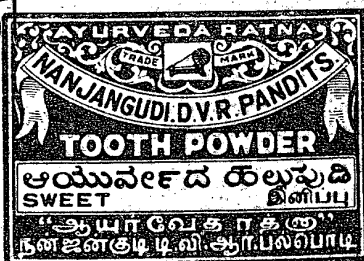
