**Deaths.**—The total deaths registered were 105 (3 Burghers; 64 Sinhalese, 15 Tamils, 19 Moors, 3 Malays, and 1 Other). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 18.8, as against 23.2 in the previous week, 18.1 in the corresponding week of last year, and 25.2 the weekly average for last year.

**Infantile Deaths.**—Of the 105 total deaths, 14 were of infants under one year of age, as against 31 in the preceding week, 20 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 29 the average for last year.

**Stillbirths.**—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 6.

**Principal Causes of Death.**—1. (a) Nine deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 6 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), 2 in San Sebastian and 1 in Wellawatta South, as against 17 in the previous week and 17, the weekly average for last year.

(b) Nine deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 2 each in St. Paul's and Slave Island and 1 each in San Sebastian, Kotahena North, New Bazaar, Maradana hospitals, and Wellawatta North, as against 5 in the previous week and 10 the weekly average for last year.

#### ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION OF UNITED DAIRIES, LIMITED.

1. The regulations contained in the Table marked "C" in the schedule in the Company's Ordinance No. 4 of 1861 (hereinafter called Table "C") shall apply to the Company and be deemed to be incorporated herewith except so far as they are herein expressly or by implication modified or excluded or declared not to apply and in the construction of these presents words importing the masculine gender only shall include the feminine gender and the words importing the singular number only shall include the plural number and *vice versa*, and words importing persons shall include corporations.

2. Regulation 24 of Table "C" is expressly excluded and the following regulation substituted therefor namely "Subsequent General Meeting shall be held at least once in every year at such time and place as may be determined by the Directors".

3. A quorum at any General or Extraordinary General Meeting of the Company shall consist of not less than 3 Shareholders and regulation 32 of Table "C" is modified accordingly.

4. Regulations 39, 42, 43, and 44 are expressly excluded and the following regulations substituted therefor namely:—

(a) On a show of hands every Shareholder present in person or represented by attorney or by proxy shall have one vote and upon a poll every member present in person or represented by attorney or by proxy shall have one vote for each share of which he is the holder.

(b) No Shareholder shall be entitled to vote at any General Meeting unless all calls or other sums presently payable by him in respect of shares in the Company have been paid and until he has been possessor of such shares for a minimum period of three months.

(c) The instrument appointing a proxy shall be in writing under the hand of the appointor or of his attorney duly authorized in writing or if the appointor is a corporation either under the common seal or under the hand of any officer or attorney so authorized.

(d) The instrument appointing a proxy and the power of attorney or other authority (if any) under which it is signed or a notarially certified copy of that power or authority shall be deposited at the registered office of the Company not less than 48 hours before the time for holding the meeting at which the person named in the instrument proposes to vote and in default the instrument of proxy shall not be treated as valid. No instrument appointing a proxy shall be in force for more than one month from the date of its execution.

(e) An instrument appointing a proxy may be in the following form or in any other form which the Directors shall approve:—

5. Regulation 45 Table "C" is expressly excluded and the following substituted therefor namely:—

#### DIRECTORS.

(45a) The number of Directors shall never be less than two or more than five but this regulation shall be construed as being Directory only and the continuing Directors or Director may act notwithstanding any number of vacancies.

(45b) As remuneration for their services the Directors shall each be entitled to appropriate such sum as shall be provided for by the Company in General Meeting.

6. Regulation 46 of Table "C" is expressly excluded and the following substituted therefor namely:—

(46) Leo Matcher (who is herein referred to as the Life Director) shall (subject to the provisions of regulation 48) be entitled to hold office so long as he lives. The said Leo Matcher and Peter Wilberforce Robinson shall be the First Directors of the Company. The Ordinary Directors (which term shall mean the Directors for the time being of the Company other than the life Director and any alternate Director appointed by a life Director) shall hold office until the First Ordinary General Meeting of the Company when they shall retire but shall be eligible for re-election.

(46a) A Life Director shall subject to the provisions of regulation 48 have power to appoint any member of the Company or any other person to be an alternate Director during his absence from Ceylon and such appointment shall have effect and such appointee while he holds office shall be entitled to notice of meetings of Directors and to attend and vote thereat accordingly and generally to exercise all the rights and functions of such absent Director subject to any limitations or restrictions in the instrument appointing him but he shall not require any qualification and he shall *ipso facto* vacate office if and when his appointor returns to Ceylon or vacates office as a Life Director. An appointment under this regulation shall be effected by an instrument in writing under the hand of the appointor and any appointment so effected can be cancelled by the appointor by an instrument in writing under his hand and such alternate Director shall vacate office as soon as notice in writing of the execution of such instrument of cancellation shall be received at the office of the Company such alternate Director may be one of the Ordinary Directors of the Company in which case he shall be entitled to vote in both capacities but one person holding the office of Ordinary Director and alternate Director shall not be quorum under regulation 56. An alternate Director shall in the absence of a direction to the contrary in the instrument appointing him be entitled to receive notice of and to vote at General Meetings of the Company on behalf of his appointor and generally to represent his appointor in the same manner as if he had been appointed by a general proxy under the provisions of these regulations.

(46b) One or more of the Directors may be appointed by the Director to act as Secretary, Manager, or Managing Director or Managing Directors Financial adviser and (or) Agent or Agents of the Company visiting agent or superintendent for such time and on such terms as the Director may determine or may fix by agreement with the person or persons appointed to the office and they

may from time to time revoke such appointment and appoint another or other Secretary Manager Managing Director or Managing Directors and (or) Agent or Agents of the Company visiting agent or superintendent. The Directors may confer on the Managing Director or Managing Directors all or any duties and powers that might be conferred on any manager of the Company. If any Director shall be called upon to perform any of the above or extra services the Directors may arrange with such Director for such special remuneration for such services either by way of salary commission or the payment of a lump sum of money as they shall think fit.

(46c) A Director may with the consent of his Co-Directors be absent from the meetings of the Directors for such period or periods as the remaining Directors shall think fit.

(46d) Each Director shall have the power with the consent of the majority of the Directors to appoint in writing any person whether a Shareholder of the Company or not to act as Deputy Director in his place during his absence or inability to act as Director and at his discretion to remove such Deputy Director.

(46e) A meeting of the Directors for the time being at which a quorum of two is present shall be competent to exercise all or any of the authorities powers and discretions by or under the regulation of the Company for the time being vested in or exercisable by the Directors generally.

(46f) A resolution in writing signed by all of the Directors shall be as valid and effectual as if it had been passed at a meeting of the Directors duly called and constituted and every such resolution shall be as soon as practicable entered on the minutes of the Directors' Meetings.

(46g) The Directors shall have power to procure from time to time in the usual course of business such temporary advances on the produce in hand as they may find necessary or expedient. (c) If he becomes bankrupt or insolvent or suspends payment or files a petition for the liquidation of his affairs or compounds with his creditors

(d) If by reason of mental or bodily infirmity he becomes incapable of acting

(e) If he ceases to have his ordinary place of residence in Ceylon or is absent from Ceylon without leave from the Board for a period of three consecutive months provided that the office of Life Director shall not be vacated by reason merely of absence from Ceylon for any period.

No Director shall be disqualified from holding office by reason of entering into any contract with or doing any work for the Company or by reason of his being a member of any corporation Company or firm which has entered into any contract with or done any work for the Company or by reason of his being Agent or Secretary or Solicitor or being a member of a firm who are Agents or Secretaries or Solicitors of the Company nevertheless he shall disclose to the Directors his interests in any contract work or business in which he may be personally interested and shall not vote in respect of any matters connected with any such contract work or business.

8. Regulation 64 of Table "C" is expressly excluded and the following substituted therefor namely:—

(64a) The Directors may at such times as the circumstances of the Company warrant the same declare Dividends to be paid to the Shareholders in proportion to the number of their shares and the amount paid up or deemed to be paid thereon respectively

(64b) The Directors may if they shall think fit declare from time to time such interim dividends as in their opinion the position of the Company justifies.

(a) The timber will be put up either singly or in lots to suit buyers at a rate per cubic foot, and no advance of less than 10 cents per cubic foot or Re. 1 per log will be recognized.

(b) The highest bid will be accepted, subject to the approved price fixed by the Conservator of Forests. The highest bidder, on being declared the purchaser, shall sign his name in the register of sale in admission of such purchase and deposit the necessary amount.

(c) Twenty-five per cent. of the bids to be deposited immediately after acceptance of the bids. The balance should be paid within 20 days of the date of sale, when a permit for removal will be issued.

(d) The measurements as recorded by the Divisional Forest Officer must be accepted, but prior to date of auction any prospective bidder is at liberty to check the measurements, and to represent any difference promptly.

(e) Prospective purchasers must before bidding for any timber satisfy themselves as to the quality and conditions of the timber for which they offer and that no representations as to quality and condition of the timber will be entertained after bid or an offer has been accepted for the same.

(f) All timber sold and the full price bid of which has been paid must be removed from the depot within 20 days of date of sale, and will be at the risk of the purchaser until removed. A charge of Re. 1 per log or per lot of timber per week or part of a week is liable to be made for any logs not removed within 20 days of sale. Logs not removed from the depot within one month is liable to be forfeited to the Crown.

(g) Should any person to whom a lot is knocked down refuse to take it over at the full price bid, or refuse or fail to sign the sale book and pay 25 per cent. of his bid, and refuse or fail to remove the timber within the time specified in clause (f) above, the lot will again be put up for auction; and the original purchaser or bidder will be held liable for any loss to Government owing to a lower price being realized at the resale, while, if an enhanced price is realized at such resale, he shall, however, have no claim to the profit which shall accrue to Government.

(h) Agents bidding for others will be required to produce written authority from the firm or person for whom they bid; such authority will be retained by the Divisional Forest Officer, and will hold good only at the particular sale at which it is produced.

**WRITTEN** offers are invited for the purchase of timber, firewood, &c., described in the annexed schedule.

2. Offer should be made subject to the following conditions by letter, preferably under sealed and registered cover, addressed to the Divisional Forest Officers concerned and posted or handed over personally not later than midday on Monday, June 20, 1932, the envelope being marked on the left hand top corner "Offer for Purchase of Timber, &c.," and signed by tenderer.

3. Lump sums offers should be made for each item in the schedule and be written both in words and figures. Offers may be made for more than one item in the same letter, but should be quoted for each item separately.

4. In the case of offers which in the aggregate exceed Rs. 20, tenderers may remit Rs. 5 either with their offers or within two days of their offers to the Divisional Forest Officer of the Division concerned. This sum will be returned if their offers are rejected. The purchaser will be given credit for the amount in the final payment for the timber. Where the *bona fide* of any tenderer are in the opinion of the Divisional Forest Officer or the Conservator of Forests doubtful, his tender may not be entertained unless the required money deposit is made, if and when demanded by the Divisional Forest Officer.

5. The species, measurements, cubic contents, &c., of the material appearing in the schedule are to be regarded as only approximate, and intending tenderers are presumed to have inspected the timber before they make their offers and they should bring to the notice of the Divisional Forest Officer any serious discrepancies which they may notice. They should also satisfy themselves by personal inspection as to the condition of the timber they offer for.

6. Any tenderer whose offer is accepted shall, within three days of notification of acceptance of his offer, pay the full purchase amount in the case of offers aggregating to Rs. 20, and as follows in the case of offers exceeding Rs. 25 in the aggregate :—

Over Rs. 20 up to Rs. 100, 50 per cent. ; and over Rs. 100, 25 per cent. ; the balance being paid within a fortnight of the previous payment. In the event of failure to complete the purchase, all amounts previously paid shall be forfeited and the timber, &c., revert to the Crown, and be liable for resale at the risk of the original purchaser.

Should any successful tenderer decline or fail to pay any sum or sums as above stipulated for, he shall further be pecuniarily liable for any resultant loss to Government.

The Conservator of Forests reserves however the discretionary power to enforce, modify, or waive any of the provisions in this clause to such extent as he may consider the circumstances justify.

7. The Conservator of Forests reserves to himself the right, without question, of rejecting any or all offers and of accepting any offer.

8. All materials shall be removed by purchaser within one month of completion of purchase when a permit for removal will be issued. Extension of time will not be granted except under exceptional circumstances.

9. All materials purchased shall be at the risk of the purchaser until its removal by him on a permit.

10. The buyer, his agent, or his representative shall be liable for punishment under the Forest Ordinance for commission of any Forest Offence in the course of completing the transaction.

11. Any purchaser violating the conditions of purchase shall be liable to a fine not exceeding 25 per cent. of purchase amount, and to be included in the list of persons to whom no permit will be issued.

The Forest Department will not be liable to compensate purchasers for any expense in connection with the materials offered for sale.

*Abstract*.—When the material first enters the dryer it comes in contact with the drying fluid when this has a comparatively low temperature and high humidity, it can therefore be fed rapidly without danger of overheating: its temperature is thus raised rapidly which is said to be desirable in order to arrest fermentation. In the second stage when the drying is being completed it is desirable that the material should not be heated so strongly. To produce this result hot dry air is fed at the middle of the drying conveyor and passes in the same direction as the material, hence heat exchange and moisture exchange is comparatively slow: at the exit of the material the drying medium, now somewhat cooler and more moisture laden passes to a reheater when its temperature and relative humidity are raised. It now enters the dryer at a point in advance of the previous one and moves against the direction of the stream of material to be dried: the heat and moisture exchange is now relatively rapid. A suitable mechanism is described.
