WHEREAS it seems advisable to the Governor to establish in Horawala village in Iddagoda pattuwa of Pasdun korale west in the District of Kalutara, Western Province, a general cemetery for the burial or cremation of the dead within the limits hereinafter specified and defined :

And whereas the Governor may under section 6 (3) of "The Cemeteries and Burials Ordinance, 1899," as amended by the Cemeteries and Burials Amendment Ordinance, 1931, exempt any cemetery either wholly or in part from the operation of sections 11, 16, 17, and 24 :

Now know Ye that We, the Governor, by virtue of the powers vested in Us by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931, do hereby under section 6 (1) of "The Cemeteries and Burials Ordinance, 1899," as amended by the Cemeteries and Burials Amendment Ordinance, 1931, establish, as from the date hereof, a general cemetery on the land described in Schedule A hereto for the burial or cremation of the dead within the limits specified and defined in Schedule B hereto.

And We do hereby exempt the said cemetery wholly from the operation of sections 11, 16, 17, and 24 of the said Ordinance.

1. It shall be lawful for every mortgagee of any immovable property situate within the administrative limits of the Council, or for any of the heirs or the legal representative of any deceased mortgagee, to cause any such mortgage to be registered at the office of the Council.

2. Every person desiring to have a mortgage so registered shall forward or cause to be forwarded to the Chairman a statement setting out—

- (1) the name and address of the mortgagee or of any heir or legal representative of the mortgagee, if he is deceased ;
- (2) the name and address of the mortgagor ; and
- (3) a description of the property or such particulars as may be necessary for identifying it.

3. On receipt of such statement and on payment by the applicant of a registration fee, which is hereby fixed at 50 cents, the Chairman shall cause the names and addresses and necessary particulars to be entered in the register kept for that purpose in the office of the Council.

In the event of any seizure, in execution for the recovery of rates, taxes, or charges due to the Council, of any property concerning which any mortgage and names and addresses may have been registered as aforesaid, the Chairman shall, at least 14 days before advertising such property for sale, serve or cause to be served on the person or persons whose names and addresses have been so registered, a notice in writing of the seizure, the date fixed for the sale, and the amount for the recovery of which the seizure was effected.

5. If at any time before the sale, the amount specified in the notice is paid to the Council, the property shall be released from seizure.

All householders shall deposit or cause to be deposited the dust, ashes, sweepings, rubbish, and other refuse from their premises in cylindrical galvanized wrought iron bins which they shall provide, and they shall place these bins daily on the edge of the road outside their premises between the hours of 6 A.M. and 11 A.M., and remove them or cause them to be removed within the space of half an hour after the same shall have been emptied by the scavengers.

2. The bins shall—

- (a) be constructed in such a manner and be of such weight that the whole receptacle with its contents can be easily lifted and emptied into the scavenging cart ;
- (b) they shall be provided with covers and convenient handles ;
- (c) they shall have the owner's name or tenement number painted outside ; and
- (d) they shall be kept clean by the owners.

3. No person shall place or cause to be placed dust, ashes, sweepings, rubbish, or refuse on any part of a road, except in bins as aforesaid, at the times specified, provided that the Chairman may authorize a householder to use instead of a bin as aforesaid such other covered receptacle as may be approved by him, if he is satisfied that, owing to poverty, the immediate provision of such a bin would press harshly on the householder.

4. Any person committing a breach of the above by-laws shall be guilty of an offence and shall on conviction be liable to a fine not exceeding Rs. 10, and in the case of a continuing offence to an additional fine not exceeding Rs. 5 for every day during which the offence is committed after conviction or written notice from the Chairman of such contravention.

MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

THE COLOMBO MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

General Meeting.

Wednesday, April 5, 1933, at 3 p.m.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice, dated March 29, 1933.

Present: Mr. W. L. Murphy, B.A., C.C.S., Chairman; Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader; Dr. E. V. Ratnam; Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando; Dr. E. A. Coorey; Mr. G. W. Dodds; Mr. N. R. Blande; Mr. M. L. M. Reyal; Dr. S. Muttiah; Mr. T. C. Dyball; Mr. F. Dadabhoy, J.P.; Mr. A. E. Goonesinha, M.S.C.; Mr. Aelian W. Pereira; Mr. A. R. A. Razik; Dr. S. T. Gunasekera; Mr. G. K. Thornhill; Mr. H. K. de Kretser; and Mr. T. W. Hockly.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of March 1, 1933, having been previously printed and copies thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read.

Resolved that the Minutes of the General Meeting of March 1, 1933, be confirmed.

1A. The Chairman made the following statement:—

(1) Certain action taken by the Member for Kotahena and the two other Members of the Sub-Committee of the Special Committee regarding Relief to Ratepayers, which Members will have observed in the Press, has made it necessary for me to make a personal statement to the Council.

(2) In the first place I wish to state that I have never opposed the suggestion that the Council's Leave By-laws required amendment; any statements that have been made to the contrary rest on a complete misapprehension of my attitude. I thought it was clear to the Members of the Relief Committee from previous discussions that I shared their views with regard to this and I may say at once that I agree in principle with the motion standing in the name of Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando in to-day's agenda.

(3) The difference of opinion between the Member for Kotahena and myself at the last meeting of the Four Standing Committees arose out of the proposed arrangements for carrying on the work of the Treasurer's Department during Mr. Saunder's absence on leave. The arrangements contemplated are that the work should be carried on with one staff officer less during the Treasurer's absence, the remaining officers continuing to attend to their present work with certain additional duties imposed in each case. No order has yet been made regarding acting pay and it is perhaps hardly necessary for me to assure the Council that any order for additional remuneration to the officers concerned will be made in accordance with whatever decision the Council arrives at on the motion standing in the name of Mr. Fernando in to-day's agenda and this, of course, applies to other departments as well where acting arrangements may be in force or contemplated. The arrangement indicated was considered to be preferable to having a general post in the department by relieving each staff officer of his present duties and assigning to him the duties of the officer next above him in seniority as each officer is in charge of different branches of the department and each is familiar only with the work of his own branch.

(4) In stating my objections to the latter arrangement that was suggested at the meeting, I emphasized my expression of opinion with the remark that I could not remain responsible for the administration under such an arrangement, or words to that effect. This remark has apparently been construed as implying an intention of refusing as Chief Executive Officer to carry out a decision of Council, and as implying a claim to be independent of the Council's control in matters affecting the administration of the departments. Nothing so unconstitutional ever occurred to my mind; if the Council decided to adopt the arrangement referred to or any other arrangement it choose, that decision of course would be binding and would have to be carried out whether I personally accepted responsibility for its soundness or not. In the circumstances, I can only say that I very much regret having used words that seem to have created such an erroneous impression at least in the minds of the three members of the Sub-Committee.

(5) Since my assumption of duty as Chairman I have endeavoured to the best of my ability to co-operate with the members of this Council in discharging our joint responsibility to the City. I readily acknowledge their co-operation and the valuable assistance and advice that I have received from them at all times. It has been a pleasure to me to feel that our relations were harmonious, and no one regrets more than I do the situation that has arisen in the last few days as a result (I still feel) of an unfortunate misunderstanding.

(6) I trust that in view of this statement the incident may be regarded as closed and that I may once more count on the confidence and on the co-operation of all members in the work of the City. Let me finally assure the three members of the Sub-Committee of the Relief Committee in particular that when they send in their report on the Treasurer's Department, as I trust they will now decide to do, it will so far as I am concerned be given a fair field and unbiassed consideration. In conclusion let me assure you, gentlemen, that it is my earnest desire no less than yours to preserve the rights and dignity of the Council unimpaired.

2. Pursuant to notice, Mr. A. E. Goonesinha presented a petition from the residents of Mount Pleasant, Baseline road, praying for the installation of gas or electric lights on their road, and requested that it be referred to the appropriate Committee.

2A. With the permission of Council, Mr. A. E. Goonesinha presented a petition from the residents of Yakbedde road and lane, Colombo, praying that the name of this road and lane be altered, suggesting the name "Gotami" for substitution as a fit designation to this road and lane, as both the road and the lane lead to the Buddhist Temple bearing the name Gotami, and requested that the petition be referred to the appropriate Committee.

2B. With the permission of Council, Mr. A. E. Goonesinha presented a petition from the licensed eating house-keepers of the Maradana Ward regarding the notices served by the Waterworks Engineer requesting them to take steps within seven days of receipt of the notices to have meters fixed to their respective premises, and requested that it be referred to the appropriate Committee.

3. Pursuant to notice, Mr. A. R. A. Razik asked the following questions which the Chairman answered:—

(1) Q.—Does the Council get any rent for the buildings given over to the Refreshment Club? A.—No.

(2) Q.—Has any furniture been donated to the Club by the Council? A.—No.

(3) Q.—Is the water used by the Club charged for, if so, at what rate? A.—No.

(4) Q.—Besides the supply of refreshments, is a general trade in food, provision, and liquor, carried on? A.—The caterer employed by the Club, besides supplying refreshments at the premises, also takes orders for groceries, rice, and other foodstuffs at the Club but delivers them direct to the member's residence.

(5) Q.—Are the Club accounts of the employees deducted from salaries and paid to contractor? A.—Yes, but paid through the Club.

(6) Q.—How many officers of the Council are members of the Club? A.—All officers in the permanent establishment are eligible for membership. There are 247 standing members.

(7) Q.—If concessions are granted by the Council, what control does the Municipality exercise over the Club? A.—None. Similar concessions are granted to the staffs in several Governments Departments like the Police, Railway, the General Post Office, and the Electrical Department, but no control is exercised over them by the departments concerned.

4. Pursuant to notice Mr. A. R. A. Razik asked the following questions which the Chairman answered:—

(1) Q.—Since the Engineer, Mechanical, took over the supervision of the Gas Department of the Council, did he or the Gas Inspector carry out tests of the illuminating quality of gas? If so, when, and if not, why? A.—No. It was not considered necessary.

(2) Q.—What steps were taken against the City Analyst for his failure to test and report on the illuminating quality of gas in his report in 1931? A.—None, tests were carried out as required.

(3) Q.—Without testing for the illuminating quality of gas, from where did the City Analyst get the particulars that 463 B. Th. U. was 11 and 12 per cent. above contract standard? A.—Presumably by means of a Dr. Boy's Calorimeter.

(4) Q.—Not having reported even on the pressure conditions in the districts, is the City Analyst justified in remarking "the gas is in accordance with specifications and up to contract standard"? A.—Yes. Pressure tests were carried out on distributing mains at the Works.

(5) Q.—Is the Chairman aware that the Manager of the Gas Company, reading a paper before the Institution of Gas Engineers about five years ago stated “The price the Company obtains for coke and tar practically pays for all the coal we use”? A.—I believe the statement was referred to in the course of the proceedings of the Special Committee of the Council regarding the supply of gas. Under present conditions, I am told, it is no longer the case.

(6) Q.—Will the Chairman call for a report from the Municipal Engineer of the various building operations carried out by the Gas Company at their Pettah premises during the past 10 years, and state, if any, or all had been approved by Council? A.—This has been done.

(7) Q.—Is it a fact that the Gas Company's Meter Testing Room was built in 1932, without a permit from Council? A.—Yes.

(8) Q.—Are the lamps in Galle Face drive similar in size and make, and consuming the same quantity of gas per hour as those in Galle road, Colpetty? A.—Yes.

(9) Q.—During which years did the Council pay directly and indirectly higher rates for the lighting of these Galle Face Drive lamps, and why? A.—Until February, 1929. Originally the lamps on the Galle Face were of a different type from those on other roads and for this reason special rates had to be arranged.

(10) Q.—During which years was the payment of Rs. 100 made monthly (directly and indirectly) for lighting and extinguishing of street lamps, while gas contracts were definite in the maintenance rates including cost of lighting and extinguishing? A.—From November, 1908.

(11) Q.—Why was the draft copy of the 1929/1933 contract altered in respect of the rates fixed for the lighting of street lamps? A.—An inclusive rate was adopted, covering all services, with the 1929 contract.

(12) Q.—Why were the two “extra” payments in respect of the Galle Face Drive lamps and “lighting and extinguishing” cost of street lamps, deleted from gas bills from February, 1929, and street lamp rates increased all round in the same month? A.—See answer to the previous question.

(13) Q.—Why were three different ascending rates paid all round on street lamp lighting, between January and April, 1929, when the new contract started in January of that year? A.—Rates for January, 1929, were on the basis of the contract just expired, the rates for the new contract not having been settled. Rates for February were under the new contract and in April there was a rise in the price of gas to Rs. 3.25.

(14) Q.—Why did Council pay extra for lighting of certain street lamps which the Gas Company found themselves unable to extinguish owing to floods? A.—It was in accordance with the usual practice.

(15) Q.—During which years did the Council pay the Gas Company compensation for not having lighted the number of lamps contracted, and how much was paid annually? A.—From about 1918 to 1921. Between Rs. 9,000 and Rs. 10,000 per annum.

(16) Q.—Does the Municipal contract cover price of gas to private consumers for the purpose of cookers and other heating appliances? If not, why was this overlooked? A.—No. This is a contract for lighting only.

(17) Q.—If the price fixed is the same as for lighting, why at such a liberal price to the Gas Company, when the Company's advertised price to private consumers was, and is, much less than the price fixed by Council? A.—See reply to the previous question.

(18) Q.—For the maintenance of adequate gas pressure, are pressures read at consumers' burner and meter points, or are other means adopted? A.—Until recently, no. Now pressures may be read at the town limits.

(19) Q.—In view of the following written statements from the Manager of the Gas Company, and the Engineer, Mechanical, re the consumption per hour of the No. 3 Kern Burner, what justification was there for the Council to have paid more for the lighting of these burners, as from January, 1929? Engineer, Mechanical, on December 16, 1927—“Each burner consuming 4 cubic feet per hour, this may be correct, it may be too much or it may be too little.” Manager, Gas Co., January 15, 1928—“The figure is really nearer 5 cubic feet than 4.” Manager, Gas Co., November 28, 1929—“The figure of 4 cubic feet is quite wrong. They are consuming over 70 per cent. more than this calculated basis.” A.—The Council did not pay more as stated. They paid less.

(20) Q.—Public Latrine Supervisors having reported in 1927 that the lamps in the Women's Section were put off at 9 and 10 P.M. each night, why did the Engineer, Mechanical, fail to have the gas bills rectified accordingly? If this has since been done please state when? A.—The matter was reported by the Mechanical Engineer, and after consideration it was decided to make no change in the system pending the next contract. In the 1929-33 contract, these lamps were brought into line with street lamps.

(21) Q.—Please table statement of the actual consumption of gas per hour per burner of the various types of street lamps, when passing gas of the quality contracted, and were these consumption rates the same during the past 10 years? A.—(1) A statement is tabled. (2) Yes.

(22) Q.—Why was the Lighting Chart referred to in Clause 6 of 1921/1923 contract specifying the candle powers which the various types of street lamps should give, omitted in later contracts? A.—I cannot say.

(23) Q.—Does not the present contract clause reading “That all street lamps shall maintain their rated candle power” refer to the candle powers specified in the Lighting Chart in 1921/1923 contract? If not, what is meant by “rated candle power”? A.—I cannot say. It is not clear at this date what was intended by “rated candle power”.

(24) Q.—When the cost of electricity for street lighting was being considered, why did the Engineer, Mechanical, mislead the Municipal Engineer and the Director of Electrical Undertakings by stating in his memo. and schedule on July 2, 1928, that street lamps range from 60 to 800 candle power, when actually they were far from this standard of illumination? A.—There was no misleading.

(25) Q.—Please state costs separately of converting to electric lighting public markets and latrines, wherever mains are available? A.—The information is not at present available and it would take some time to prepare. Unless and until the Council desires seriously to consider such a proposal, I do not intend to order the Municipal Engineer to prepare these estimates.

(26) Q.—In October, 1928, both the Gas Company as well as the Engineer, Mechanical, having stated in writing that under the then proposed reduced rates for 1929/1933 contract, the Council would save Rs. 40,000 to Rs. 50,000 per annum, as against 1928 cost, will the Chairman please state how much was saved each year from 1929 to 1932? A.—The saving was represented by extra illumination.

(27) Why did the Gas Company fail to maintain the illuminating standard of gas specified in the Municipal contract? A.—It cannot be said that the Gas Company failed to do so.

(28) In view of the refusal of the Gas Company to disclose the monthly gas leakage figures in the supply area, will the Chairman please obtain this information through the Honourable the Minister for Health? A.—It is not clear to me that the Minister for Health is in a position to obtain the information which has been withheld from this Council. If the member will inform me what benefit to the public is likely to accrue from the use of this information when obtained I will consider what further steps are practicable in order to obtain it.

(29) Why are shipping documents and Customs papers of Calorimeter ordered by Council in 1930 withheld from me in spite of my repeated requests for same? A.—As the member has already been told in answer to his question No. 26 of January 11, 1933, all the available documents have been sent to him.

5. Pursuant to notice, Mr. Aelian W. Pereira moved—“This Council considers that in order to break up the beef combine in the Wellawatta Market and enable the residents of Wellawatta to obtain their beef supplies at much cheaper rates than they can at present at the hands of this combine, a licence to sell beef be granted to P. D. Cyril.” Mr. A. E. Goonesinha seconded.

Dr. E. A. Coorey moved, as an amendment, that the Council approves the action of the Sanitation Committee in cancelling the beef licence in Pork Stall and that the question of taking steps to break the combine in all markets of the City be referred to the Four Standing Committees. Mr. N. R. Blande seconded.

Mr. A. R. A. Razik wished to know whether the Council could not fix the price of beef and mutton.

The mover and seconder of the motion having accepted the amendment, the Chairman put it to the meeting and it was carried.

6. With the permission of Council Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando was to move:—“That in the case of acting arrangements for officers on long leave Government practice be followed in the construction of section 25 (i.) and (ii.) of the Municipal Leave By-laws.”

Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando stated that in view of the Chairman's statement he would not ask the permission of Council to move the above motion.

7. Pursuant to notice, the Chairman moved—That the Council should resolve itself into a Committee of the whole Council to consider the following extracts from the proceedings of the Committees annexed to the agenda. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried.

Council in Committee—

The following Extract from the Minutes of the Relief of Distress Committee of March 15, 1933, was considered.

(2) To consider a memorandum of the Chairman, dated March 4, 1933, regarding Work for the Unemployed. Registered No. 389.—Recommended that Schemes C and D outlined in the memorandum of Chairman, dated March 4, 1933, be adopted.

The following Extract from the Minutes of the Relief of Distress Committee of March 18, 1933, was considered.

(Adjourned Meeting.)

(1) To consider Schemes B and E outlined in the memorandum of Chairman, dated March 4, 1933, regarding Work for the Unemployed. Registered No. 389.—Recommended that Scheme B be adopted.

Resolution of Council in Committee.

The Chairman moved that in view of the difficulty that has arisen in continuing the Relief Work now in hand at the Buller's road Swamp, the balance of the sum of Rs. 25,800 voted by the Council for the relief of the men employed there be expended on the improvement and extension of the road known as Peter's lane to provide access to Wanathamulla hamlet. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried.

The following Extract from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects of March 18, 1933, were considered.

WATERWORKS DEPARTMENT.

(2) With reference to the resolution of the Sanitation Committee of November 14, 1932, regarding the scale of charges for water supplied to cattle galas and private laundries, to consider:—(a) The report of the Waterworks Engineer, dated February 14, 1933, supporting the recommendations of the Acting Waterworks Engineer, in his reports, dated October 13, 1932, and October 26, 1932, and recommending the substitution of a new scale of charges for water supplied for petty trade purposes in place of that sanctioned by Council on March 4, 1925, and also the question whether the concession of a free supply of water allowed to dairies under Regulation No. 30 should be withdrawn. (b) That registered dairies be not in future exempt from the operation of Section 1 of Regulation No. 30 under Ordinance No. 18 of 1907.

Improvements relating to the manufacture of rubber sheet from coagulated latex.

Abstract.—An improved rubber sheeting machine which consists of a series of pairs of pressing rolls, all of which move with the same number of revolutions per unit time and are so constructed as to make variable surface speeds possible. Each pair of rolls is coupled together by toothed wheels revolved by worms on a single shaft running the length of the machine. The diameters of the successive rolls are progressively decreased to compensate for both the elongation of the coagulated strip and the slip which occurs while the strip is passing through the rolls.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended May 27, 1933.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 165 (11 Burghers, 93 Sinhalese, 30 Tamils, 17 Moors, 11 Malays, and 3 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1933, viz., 292,200) was 29·4, as against 29·8 in the preceding week, 26·7 in the corresponding week of last year, and 30·3 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 138 (8 Burghers, 79 Sinhalese, 22 Tamils, 20 Moors, 3 Malays, and 6 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 24·6, as against 24·6 in the previous week, 22·3 in the corresponding week of last year, and 24·5 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 138 total deaths, 26 were of infants under one year of age, as against 40 in the preceding week, 30 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 29 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 12.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Thirteen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 8 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), 2 in St. Paul's, and 1 each in Kotahena South, Maradana North, and Maradana South, as against 12 in the previous week, and 15 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Three deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 2 in Slave Island, and 1 in Kotahena South, as against 7 in the previous week, and 8 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Ten deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 4 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), 3 in Maradana East and 1 each in San Sebastian, New Bazaar, and Kollupitiya, as against 2 in the previous week, and 3 the weekly average for last year.

2. (a) Twenty deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 11 in Maradana hospitals (including 5 deaths of non-residents), 2 each in Kotahena North, New Bazaar, and Maradana North, and 1 each in Fort, Pettah, and Wellawatta North, as against 15 in the previous week, and 11 the weekly average for last year.

(b) One death from *Phthisis*, of a resident of Colombo town occurred at the Anti-Tuberculosis Hospital, Ragama, during the week.

3. Four deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 3 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), and 1 in San Sebastian, as against 1 in the previous week, and 3 the weekly average for last year.

4. Eight deaths from *Debility* were registered, 5 from *Enteritis*, 4 each from *Diarrhoea* and *Dysentery*, 3 each from *Infantile Convulsions* and *Puerperal Septicaemia*, 2 from *Worms*, 1 each from *Tetanus* and *Accidents*, and 57 from *Other Causes*.

5. *Reported Cases.*—Thirteen cases of *Chickenpox*, 10 of *Measles*, 6 of *Enteric Fever*, and 2 each of *Mumps* and *Whooping Cough* were reported during the week, as against 13, 12, 8, nil, and 1 respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 81·7°, against 80·9° in the preceding week and 81·4° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·788 in.; against 29·833 in. in the preceding week and 29·810 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 2·35 in., against 4·59 in. in the preceding week and 4·16 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
