pension of $1/720$ th of his salary for each month of his service counting for pension with an addition to such service of one month for each completed period of two months' service, the addition in no case exceeding 60 months.

If the officer has not completed 120 months' gross service he may be granted a gratuity of $1/12$ th of a month's salary for each month of service counting for pension, plus an addition of 50 per cent. thereon. In no case shall the number of months to be added to the actual service exceed that which, if added to the age of the retiring officer, would make that age up to sixty.

11. If any person being in receipt of any pension or long service allowance from the Panadure Urban District Council shall be convicted of any offence in any Court of Justice in the Island for which he shall be sentenced to death or to any terms of imprisonment with hard labour exceeding six months such pension or long service allowance shall forthwith determine and cease to be payable, unless such person shall, within three months after his conviction, receive free pardon or unless the Council shall otherwise order.

12. Officers on the fixed establishment of the Panadure Urban District Council may be required to retire on or after attaining the age of fifty-five, upon the receipt of twelve months' notice to that effect, but they may continue in office till sixty years of age with the consent of the Council.

13. (1) Every officer who is transferred to or from the service of the Council from or to any other public service and whose aggregate service would have entitled him, had it been wholly under the Council, to a pension under these rules, shall on his ultimate retirement from service, if he has served for a period of at least 12 months under the Council, be entitled to a pension which shall bear the same proportion to that to which he would have been entitled had the whole of his service been under the Council as the aggregate amount of the salary which he has drawn from the Council bears to the total sum made up of such aggregate amount and the aggregate of the amounts received by him in the course of his public service elsewhere than under the Council.

Provided, however, that in the case of an officer who is transferred to the service of the Council after other public service in which the rules regulating pensions do not offer the same privileges to an officer transferred from the Council to such public service as are accorded under these rules to an officer transferred from such public service to the Council and whose aggregate public service under the Council and elsewhere would have entitled him, had it been wholly under the Council, to a pension under these rules, such officer may with the sanction of the Council on his ultimate retirement from public service (provided such retirement takes place from the Council and that he has served for a period of at least five years under the Council) be entitled to receive from the Council, in lieu of a pension calculated in the manner prescribed in the preceding paragraph, a pension representing the difference between the pension or pensions earned by such officer in respect of his public service elsewhere and a pension calculated as if his public service had been wholly under the Council.

(2) For the purposes of this section, the expression "public service" includes employment under the Crown or any Local Government public body or bodies.

14. Should an officer who retires on pension find after such retirement an employment under the Council or under the Government or under another semi-official body on a salary equal to or higher than that which he drew from the Council at the time of his retirement, his pension shall be suspended so long as such employment continues. If he draws a less salary he shall be entitled to only so much of his pension as when added to the salary of the new appointment will make his total emoluments equal to the salary last drawn by him previous to his retirement.

15. Employees on the fixed establishment of the Panadure Urban District Council drawing salaries of less than Rs. 360 per annum and retiring on account of age or infirmity after serving continuously for a period of fifteen years and upwards may, if the Council be satisfied that they are unfit, owing to age or infirmity of body or mind, further to discharge efficiently the duties of their offices, be granted such long service allowances not exceeding Rs. 7.50 per mensem in each case as the Council may award. Persons in receipt of daily pay, who have completed a period of fifteen years of continuous service, retiring under similar circumstances may be awarded gratuities calculated at the rate of one-eighteenth of a month's pay drawn at the time of retirement for each completed month's service.

* The term "aggregate" salary is to be interpreted as the amount of the aggregate salary of the substantive post held by an officer in the course of his career; disregarding extra emoluments such as duty allowances, and regarding leave on half pay or without pay as leave on full salary.

REGULATIONS.

1. From and after December 15, 1932, no live sheep or goats shall be landed at any port or place in Ceylon from any vessel save under a licence issued by, or under the authority of, the Minister for Agriculture and Lands.

2. Application for such licence shall be made in the first instance, in Colombo to the Veterinary Surgeon of the Colombo Municipal Council, in any other place to the Government Agent or the Assistant Government Agent; and any licence that the Minister may decide to issue will be forwarded to the applicant through the officer to whom the application was made.

3. Such licence shall prescribe the number of sheep or goats, or of both sheep and goats, that may be landed, during the period mentioned therein, from any vessel coming from any specified port or place and shall also indicate the port or place in Ceylon at which such animals may be landed.

4. No licence shall be issued save in accordance with such restrictions as to the numbers that may be landed (a) at any specified port or place in the Island or (b) from any specified vessel or line of vessels, or (c) from any vessel coming from any specified port or place of embarkation, and save in accordance with such conditions as to the fitness of the animals for human consumption and their freedom from infection or disease of any kind, as the Executive Committee of Agriculture and Lands may by resolution from time to time impose.

5. The decision of the Executive Committee of Agriculture and Lands in any of the matters aforesaid shall in all cases be final and conclusive.

6. Every such decision of the Executive Committee shall be published by the Minister by a notice in the *Gazette* and in one at least of the newspapers appearing in the English, Sinhalese, and Tamil languages.

7. The Minister shall, upon application made in that behalf as aforesaid, issue special licences for the landing of animals intended for the purposes of breeding stock, and such animals may in his discretion be in addition to the numbers permitted for purposes of slaughter.

The Manager, in consultation with the Inspector, shall decide in what manner the school will be divided and in what respects the ordinary curriculum requires modification.

Clause 26A.—After clause 26 insert a new clause as follows:—

26A.—The Director shall have the power to pay from funds provided for this purpose, the salaries of the approved staff in all schools taken over from private parties or in schools partly or wholly erected by Education District Committees. The Director shall also appoint Managers for such schools. The teachers of all schools dealt with under this regulation shall in other respects come under the regulations affecting teachers in assisted schools.

Clause 31A.—Add new provisos numbered 3 and 4 as follows: (Those at present numbered (i.) and (ii.) to be renumbered 1 and 2)—

3. Double schools which have an average annual attendance of not more than 80 eligible pupils for the whole school will be allowed to count one teacher for every 23 units of average attendance.

For the units of average attendance over 80 units, one teacher will be allowed for every 25 units of attendance for the first 100 units, and one teacher for every 30 units of the remainder.

Fractions of over one-half the quota shall count for an additional teacher.

4. The vacancy must be filled by the appointment of a teacher who is already employed by the Manager in a school where the number of teachers eligible for grant is still governed by clause 31 and who has been eligible for grant in the past school year. Only when a suitable teacher is not available will the appointment of a teacher not already employed by the Manager be approved for purposes of grant. All private schools in a division will be regarded for purposes of this clause as being under one management.

Clause 39.—Add a note as follows:—

Note: The word "nineteenth" in clause 39 (a) may at the end of the first school year after this rule comes into force be altered to "eighteenth".

Salary Scales.—Add a note to the Salary Scales as follows:—

An additional non-pensionable increment of Rs. 60 per annum may be paid to the Head Teacher who is in charge of a double school.

Clause 39A.—The present conditions to be numbered 1. Insert new provisos as follows:—

2. The number of teachers eligible for grant in a double school will be one teacher for 36 units of average attendance of the whole school.

Fractions of over one-half the quota shall count for an additional teacher.

In a Bilingual Non-boarding school one extra teacher may be allowed. In a Bilingual Boarding school two extra teachers may be allowed.

3. The vacancy must be filled by the appointment of a teacher who is already employed by the Manager in a school where the number of teachers eligible for grant is still governed by clauses 37-39 and who has been eligible for grant in the past school year. Only when a suitable teacher is not available will the appointment of a teacher not already employed by the Manager be approved for purposes of grant. All private schools in a division will be regarded for purposes of this clause as being under one management.

Clause 53.—Add a note as follows:—

Note: The word "eighteenth" in clause 53 (a) may at the end of the first school year after this rule comes into force be altered to "seventeenth".

Clause 53 (g).—Delete.

Clause 60 (a).—Add a new paragraph as follows:—

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended May 28, 1932.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 149 (2 Europeans, 10 Burghers, 77 Sinhalese, 26 Tamils, 23 Moors, 5 Malays, and 6 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1932, viz., 291,260) was 26.7, as against 23.0 in the preceding week, 27.7 in the corresponding week of last year, and 31.1 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 124 (3 Europeans, 2 Burghers, 63 Sinhalese, 23 Tamils, 17 Moors, 4 Malays, and 7 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 22.3, as against 25.1 in the previous week, 21.8 in the corresponding week of last year, and 25.2 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 124 total deaths, 30 were of infants under one year of age, as against 23 in the preceding week, 29 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 29 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 8.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Ten deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 5 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths from non-residents), 3 in Kotahena North, and 1 each in Kotahena South and Maradana South, as against 15 in the previous week, and 17 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Ten deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 3 in St. Paul's, 2 each in Kotahena South and Slave Island, and 1 each in San Sebastian, Kotahena North, and Wellawatta South. The number registered during the preceding week as also the weekly average for last year was 10.

(c) Seven deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 1 each in St. Paul's, San Sebastian, New Bazaar, Maradana hospitals, Maradana North, Maradana South, and Slave Island, as against 2 in the previous week, and 5 the weekly average for last year.

2. (a) Seven deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 5 in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident) and 1 each in St. Paul's and Maradana North, as against 14 in the previous week, and 12 the weekly average for last year.

(b) One death from *Phthisis*, of a resident of Colombo town occurred at the Anti-Tuberculosis Hospital, Ragama, during the week.

3. (a) One death from *Plague* was registered in Maradana hospitals, as against nil in the previous week, and 1 the weekly average for last year.

(b) One death from *Plague*, of a resident of Colombo town, occurred at the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Angoda, during the week.

4. Eight deaths from *Debility* were registered, 6 from *Enteritis*, 4 each from *Diarrhoea* and *Accidents*, 2 each from *Infantile Convulsions* and *Puerperal Septicaemia*, 1 each from *Dysentery*, *Worms*, and *Tetanus*, and 60 from *Other Causes*.

5. **Reported Cases.**—Nine cases of *Chickenpox*; 7 of *Enteric Fever*, 7 of *Whooping Cough*, and 2 of *Plague* were reported during the week, as against 11, 3, nil, and nil respectively, of the preceding week.

State of Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 81.4° against 80.6° in the preceding week, and 81.2° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean

atmospheric pressure was 29.810 in., against 29.803 in., in the preceding week and 29.862 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 4.16 in., against 5.13 in. in the preceding week and 3.55 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 108 total deaths, 19 were of infants under one year of age, as against 30 in the preceding week, 29 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 29 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 4.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Seven deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 4 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents), 2 in Kotahena South, and 1 in Maradana South, as against 10 in the previous week, and 17 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Three deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 1 each in New Bazaar, Maradana hospitals (of a non-resident), and Maradana South, as against 7 in the previous week, and 5 the weekly average for last year.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 82.3° against 81.4° in the preceding week and 81.2° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.881 in., against 29.810 in. in the preceding week and 29.862 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0.47 in., against 4.16 in. in the preceding week and 3.55 in the corresponding week of the previous year.

GALLE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held at the Municipal Office on Saturday, February 13, 1932, at 10 a.m., pursuant to notice dated February 6, 1932.

Present :—Mr. J. D. Brown, Chairman ; Mr. C. E. de Vos ; Mr. J. E. Perera ; Mr. D. I. Durham ; Mr. C. L. Wickremasinghe ; Mr. T. Amarasuriya ; Dr. S. P. Joseph ; Mr. P. R. Gunasekara ; Mr. A. J. R. Scharenguivel and Mr. A. M. Saheed.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of January 16, 1932, a copy thereof having been furnished to each member, were taken as read and confirmed.

2. Pursuant to notice, Mr. J. E. Perera asked :—In view of the wrong impression created in the minds of the general public by the contents of the petition presented to His Excellency the Governor at Galle by the Secretary of the Galle National League, and published in the newspapers, regarding the increased taxes in certain parts of Wards No. 4 and 5, and the number of properties gazetted for sale for arrears of assessment rates, will the Chairman make a statement explaining the circumstances under which the taxes had to be increased, and giving the facts regarding the number of houses actually sold for non-payment of taxes during the past year ?

The Chairman replied as follows :—Since the Police limits of Galle were defined in 1911, the area lying between Richmond Hill road, Kumbalwella road, Elliott road, Hume road and Cripps road has become much more developed, and now forms one of the best residential parts of the Town. Many large houses have been erected in recent years. Water and electric light are already provided along Richmond Hill road and Wakwella road, and extension of these services to Elliott road is being taken in hand. In January, 1931, Council resolved that this area should be included in the Police limits and the rates increased accordingly and that water and electric light be provided along Elliott road. The proposal to re-define the Police limits was approved by the Governor, and the extended limits were proclaimed in May, 1931. On September 12, 1931, Council resolved to levy a rate of 17½ per cent. on the annual value of all property within the Police limits for the year 1932. A large number of properties were advertised for sale every quarter for arrears of rates, but very few are actually sold as the rates are recovered within the month which elapses between the date of advertisement and date of sale. For the four quarters 3rd quarter, 1930 to 2nd quarter, 1931, the mesne profits of 38 properties were sold for periods between one and 10 years, and 13 properties were bought on behalf of the Council, and further time allowed to the owners for the payment of arrears.

3. The next item on the agenda was a motion by Mr. P. R. Gunasekara. With the consent of Mr. Gunasekara the item was postponed until the end of the meeting.

4. Pursuant to notice, Mr. J. E. Perera moved.—Whereas the postponement of the consideration of constitutional reforms in the Galle Municipality pending experience of the effect of the reforms that are to be introduced in the Colombo Municipality seriously impedes the constitutional progress and the good government of the Town of Galle, this Council resolves (1) that an application be made to His Excellency the Governor to alter the number of the divisions of this Municipal Town from five to seven, by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 5 of the Municipal Council Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, by subdividing each of the divisions of Kaluwella and Galupiadde into two ; (2) that it be recommended to His Excellency the Governor to declare, in terms of section 11 (4) of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, that as regards the Town of Galle the sums of fifteen rupees and one hundred and eighty rupees mentioned in 2 (g), 2 (h), and 3 (a) of the said section 11 be reduced to five and sixty rupees respectively.

Mr. P. R. Gunasekara seconded, and Mr. C. E. de Vos supported the motion.

Mr. C. L. Wickremasinghe and Mr. T. Amarasuriya agreed to the second part of the motion, but thought there should be a re-division of the whole town, not alone of Wards 2 and 3.

The Chairman moved as an amendment—That a committee of the house be appointed to make an early report as to the best method of dividing the Municipality into seven wards, and that the recommendation of the Committee, after consideration and revision by the Council, be forwarded to His Excellency the Governor, with a view to action being taken under section 5 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910.

The mover and seconder accepted the amendment, which was put to the meeting and carried unanimously.

The following were appointed a Committee :—The Chairman, the five elected members and Mr. A. M. Saheed, with Mr. P. R. Gunasekara as convener.

The second part of the motion was then put to the Meeting and carried unanimously.

5. To consider the adjustment of the accounts for 1931 by the transfer of expenditure votes :—Resolved that the excess expenditure for 1931 under heads 9, 14, 17, 19, 20, 25, 26, 27, 32, 50, 56 and 59 be met from the saving under heads 7, 18, 21, 22, 23, 31, 46, 57, and 60 as per details in the statement submitted.

6. To consider the Supplemental Budget for 1931 :—Resolved that the Supplemental Budget for 1931 be passed.

7. To approve, in terms of section 24 of the Council's leave Regulations that 14 days' leave granted to the Secretary in 1931, owing to ill-health, be not deducted from the 52 days' leave for which he would be eligible on retirement:—Resolved that 14 days' sick leave in 1931 be not deducted from the Secretary's retirement leave.

8. To consider an application for one month's leave from the Medical Officer of Health:—The Chairman moved that the leave be allowed and that the Council do pay the substitute a salary of Rs. 250 for the month and the Medical Officer's Car allowance. Mr. D. I. Durham seconded.—Carried.

The following extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committees were laid before the Council:—

9. *Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of January 30, 1932.*

(2) To consider the following estimates:—(a) Rs. 22,000 for maintenance of roads. (b) Rs. 12,000 for converting 219 miles of metalled road into metalled and tarred roads. Resolved that the Superintendent of Works should split up the cost of maintenance (Rs. 700 a mile) into labour, metal, tar and sand, and the papers be referred back to the Provincial Engineer who, in view of the above remark will re-scrutinize details of arrears to be converted into fully tarred roads. (c) Rs. 3,500 for maintenance of the Hiyare Service road. (d) Rs. 2,000 for maintenance of Victoria park, the esplanade, and public seats. (e) Rs. 540 for weeding the catchment area of Bikke Reservoir. (f) Rs. 600 for weeding the margin of Hiyare Reservoir. (g) Rs. 500 for examining and clearing the Fort sewers. (h) Rs. 3,000 for clearing the elms. (i) Rs. 500 for the improvement of Hume road. (j) Rs. 490 for draining the Fort public latrine. Recommended that the above estimates (c) to (j) be passed. (k) Rs. 2,600 for building a public latrine for males and females at Mahamodera.—Recommended that the estimate be reduced to Rs. 2,325 and passed: (1) Rs. 700 for building an outlet drain from culvert No. 74/7 (Magalla) to the sea. (m) Rs. 180 for building a culvert along Wakwella road. (o) Rs. 135 for a water cart for the Hiyare Service road.—Recommended that the above estimates (l), (m) and (o) be passed.

(3) To consider 8 applications for water service.—Recommended.

(4) To consider an application from A. L. A. Abdul Careem Hadjiar to erect a building at No. 33 Galle-Matara road, a portion of which will come within the street lines:—(a) Considered together with the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects. (2) The Committees decided that this is a matter which is purely within the jurisdiction of the Chairman.

Resolution.

With regard to item (2) (k) resolved that tenders be invited.

The recommendations of the Standing Committee with regard to the remaining items were adopted.

10. *Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment of January 13, 1932.*

(2) To waive the Assessment rates of the 3rd and 4th quarters of 1931 on houses which were evacuated in the plague area in Wards 2 and 3 as per statement.—Recommended that the rates be waived.

(3) To consider a resolution of the Poddala Mahajana Sabha recommending the reduction of the annual tax on bicycles to Re. 1.—Recommended that the request of the Sabha be refused with regret.

(4) Application from the widow of R. L. P. Siyadoris, Overseer, Works Department, for a gratuity.—Recommended (1) that under section 24 of the Council's Pension Rules, the widow be granted a gratuity of Rs. 157.50, and each of the four minor children a gratuity of Rs. 52.50; (ii.) that the gratuity of the minor children be deposited in the Savings Bank for one year.

(5) List of demolished buildings in Ward No. 2.—Recommended that the rates be struck off.

(6) Wages of canal labourers.—Recommended that the wages of K. G. William be calculated at Rs. 19.50 per mensem, and the wages of S. Pedris and K. G. Siyaneris at Rs. 16.50 each per annum.

Resolution.

With regard to item (2) resolved to substitute "written off" for "waived."

The recommendations of the Standing Committee with regard to the remaining items were adopted.

11. *Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation of January 30, 1932.*

(2) To consider a report on the conservancy of public latrines.—Recommended that two whole time labourers who should undertake no other duties, Municipal or private, during the hours specified below, should be employed at (a) the Customs latrine and (b) the sea beach latrine; one labourer to be on duty between 7 A.M. and 4 P.M., and the other between 4 and 10 P.M.; the former to be paid Rs. 1.25, and the latter 75 cents per diem respectively. The additional monthly cost will be Rs. 75.

(3) To consider an application for a licence to open a pork stall at Havelock road.—Recommended that a special licence be granted subject to the proviso that the licensee shall display a notice that the Council does not guarantee the freedom of the meat from infection.

Resolution.

Resolved that the above recommendations of the Standing Committee be adopted.

(4) To consider the draft by-laws relating to bakeries, eating houses, tea and coffee boutiques, dairies and aerated water factories.—Recommended that the draft by-laws be adopted, and that they be circulated in the meanwhile.

Resolution.

With regard to item (4), resolved that consideration be deferred until the next meeting, and the papers be re-circulated in the meanwhile. Suggestions to be sent by the members one week before the meeting. The recommendations of the Standing Committee with regard to the remaining items were adopted.

13. Relief to rate payers:—The Chairman moved the Council into Committee to consider what action is called for to grant relief to owner of properties who, by reason of their poverty, are unable to pay rates.

After an informal discussion in Committee, the Chairman moved that Council do resume.

Council resumed and the Chairman moved—That the Chairman be asked to consider the financial status of the owner of all properties paying rates up to 49 cents per quarter, and that he do prepare lists of properties belonging to owners who, by reason of their poverty as the result of the present depression, are unable to pay rates. These lists to be submitted to the Council with a view to Council taking such action to afford relief to the poor as may appear desirable. Mr. J. E. Perera seconded. Carried unanimously.

14. Pursuant to notice Mr. P. R. Gunasekara moved—That the old rate of 7 per cent. be continued to be charged in the new area brought within the Police limits by proclamation of the Governor dated May 16, 1931, until such time as water and electric lighting are provided along Elliott road. Mr. J. E. Perera seconded.

The mover asked the leave of Council to defer his motion until the next meeting, on the understanding that the Chairman obtain the opinion of Mr. E. J. Samarawickrema on the subject.

The leave of Council having been given, the motion was deferred until the next meeting.

15. The Chairman moved the Council into Committee to consider the behaviour of Inspector Haniffa and de Silva.

The Inspectors appeared before the Council in Committee and the Chairman explained the charges against each.

The Council resumed, and resolved that the inspectors should be given a severe and final warning, and that the Chairman do take steps to determine their term of office if any further cause of complaint arises.

16. Time of meetings—Resolved that in future the meetings of the Council and Standing Committees be held at 9.30 A.M.

17. Retirement of the Secretary—Mr. C. E. de Vos moved that the Council do place on record their appreciation of Mr. Arndt's able services as Secretary. Mr. J. E. Perera seconded, and the Chairman associated himself with what the speakers had said. The motion was carried unanimously.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of February 13, 1932, a copy thereof having been furnished to each member, were taken as read and confirmed.

2. Mr. P. R. Gunasekara presented a petition from certain residents of Kumbalwella in Ward 4 asking that a new culvert be constructed on the Wakwella road. The petition was tabled and the Chairman said it would be considered by the Standing Committee on Municipal Works.

3. The following motion stood in the name of Mr. P. R. Gunasekara:—That the old rate of 7 per cent. be continued to be charged in the new area brought within the Police limits by proclamation of the Governor dated May 16, 1931, until such time as water and electric lighting are provided along Elliott road.

The Chairman explained that, in view of the opinion expressed by Mr. E. J. Samerawickreme, K.C., to the effect that it would not be competent for the Council to levy in the new area a lower rate than that decided upon under section 113 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, the motion would be *ultra vires*.

The mover, thereupon, with the leave of Council, withdrew the motion.

4. Pursuant to notice Mr. T. Amarasuriya moved—That a temporary levy be taken from the salaries of Members of the Municipal Staff during the prevalence of the present financial depression, as is being done in the case of other public servants, with a view of giving some relief to the rate payers. Mr. J. E. Perera, in seconding the motion, suggested that the matter be referred to the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment for full investigation and report. The mover agreed to the suggestion.

The Chairman then moved that the matter be referred to the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment. Mr. J. E. Perera seconded.—Carried.

At this stage Mr. P. R. Gunasekara asked that item 5 and 6 on the agenda be taken up. This was agreed to.

5. To consider the payment of a commuted travelling allowance to the Secretary—Resolved that the question be referred for consideration to the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment.

6. To consider the report of the Special Committee appointed on February 13, 1932, to make an early report as to the best method of dividing the Municipality into 7 wards.

Mr. P. R. Gunasekara, as convener of the meetings of the Special Committee, explained that the report would be ready in time to be considered at the April meeting of the Council, and consideration was accordingly deferred.

7. To consider tenders for the extension of electric lights along Elliott road and Kumbalwella road—Resolved that in view of the fact that the estimate submitted by the Superintendent of the Electricity Department was lower than the tenders received, the work be carried out departmentally.

Abstract.—The conveyor from the spreader consists of a number of pivoted members adapted to be retained in a horizontal position or to be allowed to tilt and so deposit the material on the trays below. Each pivoted member has attached to it a member having both a flat surface and a slot.

In addition a grid frame or crosshead is disposed alongside the conveyor and is adapted to be moved automatically by the conveyor at predetermined periods at right angles to the direction of motion of the conveyor.
