REGULATIONS.

1. In these regulations the expression "camp area" shall mean the space within the boundaries specified in the schedule hereto

and "Assistant Government Agent" shall mean the Assistant Government Agent of the Puttalam and Chilaw Districts.

2. No person shall camp in any place within the camp area where camping is prohibited by special or general order of the Assistant Government Agent.

3. No person shall ease himself within the camp area, except at the places provided for that purpose by, or with the approval of the Assistant Government Agent.

4. No person shall deposit any liquid or solid refuse or any rubbish within the camp area, except in the places or receptacles provided for that purpose by, or with the approval of the Assistant Government Agent.

5. (a) No cattle shall be kept within the camp area, except those brought there for slaughter and those permitted by special or general order of the Assistant Government Agent to be kept within such area.

(b) No cattle shall be kept in the vicinity of the camp area, except at a place especially appointed as a cattle gala or at a place approved for such use by the Assistant Government Agent.

(c) The person in charge of the cattle shall cause their droppings to be removed to the nearest place provided therefor, and shall at all times keep clean the place occupied by his cattle.

6. All prepared foods sold within the camp area shall be protected from flies and dust by being (a) wrapped in or covered with clean paper or cloth, or (b) kept in closed glass cases, or (c) kept in other covered containers approved by the Medical Officer, or by the Sanitary Officer in charge of the camp area.

7. No person who is likely to affect prejudicially the cleanliness of the camp area, and no person who is suffering from an infectious disease shall be permitted to enter the camp area.

8. In the event of an epidemic breaking out in the camp area during the festival, the Assistant Government Agent may direct the pilgrims to leave the place of pilgrimage, and may prescribe the routes and methods for their conveyance.

9. (a) Every person within the camp area who is suffering from an infectious or a contagious disease; and (b) every person who resides with him knowing that he is so suffering shall report the case to the Medical or Sanitary Officer in charge of the camp area.

10. When any tank or well within the camp area is set apart for any particular purpose, and a notice to that effect is exhibited on the spot, no person shall use the tank or well for any purpose other than that for which it is set apart.

11. No person shall keep bakeries, aerated water manufactories, or galas within the camp area without previously obtaining a licence from the Assistant Government Agent, permitting him to do so. The licence shall be issued free of charge.

12. No person shall, without the previous sanction of the Assistant Government Agent, construct any booth, or extend any building within the camp area so as to encroach on the main or other streets of the camp.

13. No person shall, without the previous sanction of the Assistant Government Agent, discharge fireworks and firearms within the camp area, or within a radius of one mile from the boundaries of such area.

14. No person shall slaughter animals within the camp area, except in the place provided for the purpose by, or with the approval of the Assistant Government Agent, and every person slaughtering animals in such a place shall be responsible for its cleanliness.

KANDY MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

The Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on May 20, 1933, at 8.30 a.m. in accordance with the notice dated May 15, 1933.

Present: Mr. H. P. Kaufmann, Chairman; Mr. Haji M. S. Usoof Ismail; Mr. Walter Beven; Dr. J. W. S. Attygalle; Dr. L. C. Wijesinha; Mr. O. T. Nettelton; Mr. Geo. E. de Silva.

1. The Minutes of proceedings of the meeting held on April 22, 1933, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

1A. The Chairman tabled a letter of excuse from Mr. Wijayatilake regretting his inability to attend the meeting owing to ill-health.

2. The following documents were submitted :—

- (a) Statement of receipts and disbursements from close of 1932 to April 30, 1933, on account of the Municipal Fund.
- (b) Progress report of works brought up to March 31, 1933.
- (c) Health Officer's report for April, 1933.
- (d) Statement of cases instituted by the several Inspectors and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of April, 1933.
- (e) The reservoir readings for the week ended May 20, 1933.

Resolved that the statement (a), together with the minutes of proceedings of this meeting, as required by section 83 of "The Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910," be forwarded to the Commissioner of Local Government for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table :—

Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, standpipes, and house service taps inspected during April, 1933.

3A. (1) Mr. de Silva referred to the model tenements now in course of construction at Deyannawela and suggested that the Council might consider whether brick work should be substituted for concrete blocks as a means of relieving local unemployment.

Dr. Attygalle agreed with Mr. de Silva and stated that this should be considered when the next set of buildings is to be taken in hand.

The Chairman explained that work has already been started in respect of the buildings recently tendered for, and concrete blocks had already been constructed in very large numbers. The suggestion to use bricks could only be considered in connection with the remaining blocks of buildings. Any one wishing to pursue the suggestion could bring it up when the building of the remaining blocks come up for consideration.

(2) Mr. Boven drew Chairman's attention to the nuisance created by the presence of tea carts on road sides and particularly referred to two carts near the United Services Library and one by the Motor stand. He also observed that the portion of Ward street between Ward statue and the United Services Library was being used as a motor stand which should be stopped.

The Chairman explained that with regard to tea carts a number of such cases has been reported to him. In respect of the two carts near the United Services Library prosecution has already been entered in one case after several warnings to the defaulter. On the question of cars parked on the Library side of the Ward statue the Chairman stated that this had been allowed with the approval of the Council as it appeared less objectionable to park cars in this area than between the statue and the turn to Torrington road.

(3) Mr. Ismail inquired whether Mr. Kaimal, Waterworks Inspector, had recently closed the standpost opposite the Singer Sewing Machine Co.'s Office in Trincomalee street, and if so, whether he acted with the Chairman's approval.

The Chairman explained that the standpost had been constantly interfered with by some person or persons unknown and it was closed on the Municipal Engineer's orders for a short period in pursuance of a regulation of Council.

4. Petitions :—

Mr. Ismail presented a petition signed by A. Cader Meera Saibo, occupier of stall No. 13 in the public market, praying that he be given a licence to run a tea kiosk in the stall.

The Chairman undertook to look into the matter referred to in the petition.

5. Pursuant to notice Mr. Ismail asked—(1) What the total reduction allowed on objections to assessment is ? (2) What are the total proceeds of the rates in respect of assessment for 1932 and 1933 ?

6. Recommendations of Standing Committees :—

Extract from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects held on April 22, 1933.

(1) Papers *re* claim in respect of damage alleged to have been done to Mrs. A. V. Perera's land known as Welikanda estate in connection with the opening of Lady Manning's Drive, and report of interview given by the Chairman to Mrs. Perera's lawyers and Mr. A. V. Perera on the subject.—Recommended that a final offer be made to Mrs. Perera, without prejudice, the terms of the offer to be :

- (a) The Council to maintain baffle wall and stepping stones of drain already built and to maintain the drain up to the point where the stepping stones end ; (b) Council to pay Rs. 600 as compensation for road and reservation ; (c) Council decline to divert footpath ; (d) Mrs. Perera to give the Council a full and clear discharge in respect of all claims for alleged damages of whatever description arising from or connected with the opening of the road.

Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation held on April 22, 1933.

(2) Papers *re* question raised at the last meeting of the Markets Committee as to the possibility of altering the present policy followed by the Council in the matter of the transfer of Market Stalls and Spaces, to obviate any possible abuse of the privilege by Stall and Space Holders in the Market.—Recommended.

- (a) Present practice as regards transfer of Spaces and Stalls, other than meat stalls, to be recognized as a general principle, the Council, however, reserving its right to refuse any application based on this principle for good reason ; (b) Premia charged to be equivalent to four months' rent instead of a flat rate ; (c) Meat stalls to be distinctly excluded and vacancies occurring to be filled by the Council after careful consideration of all claims.

(3) Letter of January 15, 1933, from Mr. T. D. David, the licensee of Stall No. 58B, Public Market asking that the name of Mr. S. M. Adumai be entered in the licence as his partner in the business.—Recommended.

(4) Papers regarding petition from Mr. P. G. Mendis Appuhamy asking that the half share of the unpartitioned Spaces Nos. 72 and 75, Small Market, held by Cornelis Silva as its co-licensee with him, which the latter is proposing to transfer to an outside party, be transferred to him.—Recommended to transfer the half share to Mr. Mendis Appuhamy

GALLE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Special General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held at the Municipal Office on Saturday, May 27, 1933, at 9.30 a.m., pursuant to notice dated May 20, 1933.

Present:—Mr. J. D. Brown, Chairman; Mr. J. E. Perera; Mr. A. M. Saheed; Dr. H. E. Ekanayaka; Mr. F. Magdon Ismail; Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka; Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya; Mr. E. M. Karunaratna; Mr. R. L. Ephraums; and Mr. A. C. Mohammedo.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of May 13, 1933, were amended by the substitution of the word "monthly" for the word "general" in item 5, by the deletion of the words "belonging to or" in item 7 and by the deletion of the amendment proposed by Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka as regards extract 3 of item 11.

2. To consider the Chairman's statement about the outbreak of smallpox in Galle town.

The Chairman first explained that when in the 6th paragraph of his report he stated that smallpox was actually in Galle at the end of December or early in January he really meant "Galle and its vicinity" and he hoped that there would be no misunderstanding on this point.

After a lengthy discussion Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya moved that the Provincial Surgeon be requested to obtain from the Medical Officer of Health, Southern Province, a full report on the recent outbreak of smallpox in Galle and its vicinity for the information of the Council. Mr. E. M. Karunaratna seconded.—Carried.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held at the Municipal Office on Saturday, May 13, 1933, at 9.30 a.m., pursuant to notice dated May 6, 1933.

Present:—Mr. J. D. Brown, Chairman; Mr. J. E. Perera; Mr. A. J. R. Scharenguivel; Mr. A. M. Saheed; Mr. F. Magdon Ismail; Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka; Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya; Mr. E. A. Paulas; Mr. E. M. Karunaratna; Mr. R. L. Ephraums; and Mr. A. C. Mohammedo.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of April 1, 1933, were amended by the substitution of the words "who had taken shares in this particular firm" for "who had an interest in this particular firm" in item 6 and by the insertion of the name of Mr. F. Magdon Ismail as having voted for the amendment proposed by him as regards item 18 (5).

The Minutes, as amended, were taken as read, and confirmed.

2. With regard to item 6 of the Minutes the Chairman made the following statement:—

"In connection with the remarks of the Member for Ward 2 when moving his motion at the last meeting I am not aware of the facts which justify the insinuations made against the numerous officials who dealt with the application for the lease.

"I have asked the Member to give me particulars which will enable me to investigate the truth of his allegations, but he has declined to do so. In the absence of such particulars it is impossible to answer vague accusations. I consider that it is his clear duty either to justify his insinuations or to withdraw them.

"I would point out that tenders were duly called for by Government and the Engineering firm in question put in the highest tender which was accepted."

3. Pursuant to notice Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka asked:—(1) How many registered dairies are there within the Municipal limits? (2) How many dairies outside the Municipal limits have been given vendors' cards to sell milk within the Municipality? (3) How many cows are there in each of the registered dairies within the Municipality? (4) What is the average yield per day from each of the registered dairies within the Municipality? (5) Is the Chairman aware that there are some dairies within the Municipality which are supplying daily to consumers more milk than their daily yield? If not, will the Chairman be pleased to cause inquiries to be made? (6) Is the Chairman aware that vendors' cards have been issued to milkmen who have been convicted on charges of selling adulterated milk? (7) Is the Chairman aware that some of the registered dairymen adulterate their supplies of milk by adding buffalo milk, young coconut water, rice water, coconut milk, and liquidized sago? (8) Are the officers of the Health Department of the Municipality qualified to detect such adulteration? (9) How many times does the Medical Officer of Health visit each of the registered dairies within a period of one month, and at what time of the day does he visit dairies? (10) Does the Medical Officer of Health periodically examine cows in registered dairies to ascertain whether there are cows suffering from tuberculosis? (11) Is the Chairman aware that cattle awaiting slaughter in the cattle pound are half starved and that water is poured down their throats in large quantities to give them the appearance of well-fed animals shortly before they are "passed" as suitable for slaughter by the Medical Officer of Health? (12) Will the Chairman be pleased to state why two street lights at the junction of Rampart street and Middle street in the Fort are partially shaded? (13) Has it not been done at the request of an individual who presumably likes to be in the dark? (14) Will the Chairman be pleased to order the removal of these shades immediately so that the public may enjoy the full benefit of these two lamps?

The Chairman replied as follows:—(1) 9. (2) 11. (3) (1) 6, (2) 23, (3) 6, (4) 23, (5) 23, (6) 6, (7) 3, (8) 12, (9) 6. (4) (1) 22, (2) 85, (3) 10, (4) 65, (5) 25, (6) 20, (7) 32, (8) 16, (9) 30 bottles per day. (5) No. I am prepared to see if any inquiries are likely to be useful. (6) Yes. There are no by-laws forbidding vendors' cards being issued to milk vendors of dairies, the owners of which have been prosecuted and convicted for selling adulterated milk. (7) No. There has not been a single instance of such a report being received from the Council's analysts. (8) No. The by-laws re the adulteration of milk require that qualified analysts' reports should be produced as proof in a prosecution that the milk has been adulterated. (9) The Medical Officer of Health does so as often as possible. No definite figure can be given. He visits dairies usually in the morning. (10) No. (11) If there are half starved animals, the Medical Officer of Health does not pass them for slaughter. Regarding the second half of the question, animals treated thus to give them the appearance of being well-fed are detected by the Medical Officer of Health who rejects such animals. (12) To prevent them from being an intolerable nuisance to the upstairs portion of Mr. Steiger's bungalow. (13) I do not feel called upon to inquire into the predilections of individuals. (14) No. An inspection of the lamps has shown me that any complaint that may have been made about the effect of the shades is ludicrous.

4. Pursuant to notice Mr. A. C. Mohammedo asked:—(1) Whether any measures were taken by the Council's Medical Officer of Health to prevent infection being brought to Galle when the smallpox epidemic was raging in Colombo? (2) If so, will he kindly ask the Medical Officer of Health to state in detail for the information of the rate-payers what measures were adopted? (3) If sufficient steps were taken to prevent infection being brought from Colombo, will he kindly state what the history and cause of the outbreak in Galle were? (4) Is it the fact that a smallpox patient was allowed to be brought to Galle from Ambalangoda? Was this done with the knowledge of the Medical Officer of Health? (5) How many female vaccinators have been employed by the Council for the purpose of vaccinating Muslim ladies? (6) What has it cost the Council so far towards the necessary steps now being taken to stamp out smallpox? (7) Are there sufficient copies of the by-laws kept at the Municipal Office and available for sale to the public if not, will he kindly take the necessary steps to have a sufficient number of them published?

The Chairman replied as follows:—(1) Yes. (2) (a) Vaccination; (b) Police were directed to watch buses coming into town; (c) An Inspector (Municipal) was detailed off to watch passengers alighting from Colombo trains; (d) All reported cases of illness were immediately investigated by the Medical Officer of Health; (e) Headmen were directed to keep the Inspectors informed of the presence of visitors from Colombo and the Inspectors instructed to vaccinate these visitors and the people with whom they were staying, and also to keep the inmates of such houses under observation for a certain length of time; (f) The Headmen were also directed to report immediately the occurrence of any infectious diseases

in their areas, and to be on the keen lookout for such cases; (g) The Inspectors, during the course of their inspections, made inquiries for cases of illness. (3) In reply to this question and also for the information of members, the Chairman made the following statement about the outbreak of smallpox in Galle:—

“Information reached the Kachcheri on April 11, that five cases of smallpox had been discovered in Ukwatta, a village situated near the road leading from Gintota bridge towards Wakwala.

“At much the same time it was ascertained that a man named Ossen Mahadun had died of this disease on April 5.

“As the result of a thorough search of the neighbourhood over a wide area, and of questioning a chain of people who were known to have been contacts of the first five discovered cases, or people who had been contacts of Ossen Mahadun, or people who had attended Ossen's funeral, many other cases were discovered. Six of these were within the limits of the Municipality, two in Ossenagoda, and four in Gintota. Twenty were in villages outside, but adjacent to the Municipality. These figures make a total of thirty-one. A man of Gintota died. Besides the case of Ossen this is the only death which is known to have occurred from smallpox, though a member of the family to which the five cases reported on April 11 belonged is said to have died of childbirth. The cause of death may or may not have been smallpox.

“The last case occurred in Boosa. It is rather problematic as to where he got infected, but he is known to have hawked young coconuts round Gintota, and it is surmised that he caught the infection there.

“I have done my utmost to try and ascertain the cause of events prior to April 11. To be able to state facts is a different matter from weaving plausible stories. A great handicap is the unreliability of the oral evidence available.

“In conversation yesterday, the Medical Officer of Health, Southern Province, stated that he was satisfied that at least sixteen people had contracted the disease prior to the five cases reported on April 11. He would add the further case of one Shareebu of Gintota to whom he ascribes the whole trouble of this outbreak. This man was known to have been in Colombo in December, and it may be that smallpox was actually in Galle at the end of December or early in January. It can at any rate be said with a degree of probability amounting to certainty that Galle and its vicinity were infected by the end of January or early in February.

“For the information of Council I am able to say that the organization of preventive measures by the various Medical Officers of Health and their staffs has been perfect since the presence of the disease was once known.

“Action is being taken to have prosecutions entered against persons who concealed or failed to report cases. As Government Agent I am investigating the conduct of some Headmen who appear to have been remiss in their duties.”

With the permission of Council Mr. A. C. Mohammedo thereupon moved that a Special General Meeting of the Council be held on Saturday the 27th instant, to consider the above report of the Chairman and also to investigate the history and cause of the outbreak of smallpox in Galle. Mr. A. M. Saheed seconded.—Carried.

(4) Yes. This was done on March 6, 1933. (5) No vaccinators are employed by Council. When the Medical Officer of Health needed the services of vaccinators the Provincial Surgeon kindly loaned the services of some of his male and female vaccinators. At present the vaccinators (male and female) of the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services' Department are carrying out vaccinations in the town. (6) The member will receive information on this matter when the Council deals with item 8 of the agenda. (7) There are 15 copies of the by-laws available for sale at the Municipal Office. The price of each copy is Rs. 4.

5. The following motions stood in the name of Mr. E. M. Karunaratna:—(a) In the opinion of this Council the site of the Infectious Diseases Hospital at Dadalla is highly undesirable, and even positively dangerous to the health of the town and its suburbs. (b) If it is a fact that the Sanitation Department of the Government has absolute control of the said Infectious Diseases Hospital, this Council requests the Government to abolish the said Infectious Diseases Hospital and to establish one instead in a suitable locality outside the Municipal limits of Galle. (c) If the Government desires to maintain an Infectious Diseases Hospital within the Municipal limits of Galle, such an institution should be either under the absolute control of the Municipal Council, or at least, under the joint control of the Sanitation Department and the Municipal Council.

In view of the statement made by the Chairman Mr. Karunaratna asked the leave of Council to move these motions at the next monthly meeting.

The leave of Council having been granted the motions were accordingly deferred till the next meeting.

6. To consider the recommendations of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment of March 18, 1933, on the question of water supply to mosques.

Mr. F. Magdon Ismail opposed the recommendation of the Standing Committee and moved as an amendment that the Council do pass a by-law providing that no charge be made for the supply of water to mosques. Mr. A. C. Mohammedo seconded.

Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka suggested that the matter be referred back for further consideration to the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment and Law and General subjects with Mr. A. C. Mohammedo as co-opted member. This was agreed to.

7. To consider the recommendations of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment of February 25, 1933, with regard to the taxation of properties appertaining to Buddhist temples.

Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka moved as an amendment that this Council do move the Executive Committee of Local Administration to get the Municipal Councils Ordinance amended so as to exempt from assessment rates all lands and buildings attached to religious, educational, and charitable institutions. Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya seconded.

Mr. J. E. Perera suggested that this matter be deferred for consideration by the Committee for Finance and Assessment.

The mover and seconder agreed to the suggestion which was put to the meeting and adopted.

Resolved that the recommendations of the Committee be adopted.

8. To submit the Audit Report for the year ended December 31, 1932.—Submitted.

9. To sanction a supplemental vote of Rs. 6,000 to meet expenses in connection with the outbreak of smallpox in town.

The Chairman informed the Council that he was not in a position to state what sum of money would actually be required, but he enumerated the various heads of expenditure and said he thought a sum of Rs. 6,000 would be sufficient.

Mr. J. E. Perera moved that a supplemental vote of Rs. 6,000 be passed.—Mr. R. L. Ephraums seconded.—Carried.

The following extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committees were laid before the Council:—

10. *Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of May 6, 1933.*

(2) To consider five applications for water service.—Recommended that the applications be allowed.

(3) To consider the following estimates:—(a) Rs. 119.36 from the Factory Engineer for supplying 800 enamel plates for bicycles for 1934.—Recommended. (b) Rs. 2,000 for repairs to the cart shed roof.—Recommended (1) that tenders be invited for the materials and that the work be done departmentally on check roll; (2) that the Superintendent of Works be instructed to forward for approval a schedule of the rates of pay.

(4) To consider tenders for—(a) Building a public latrine at Kaluwella.—Recommended that the lowest tender, viz.: Rs. 2,543.75 by R. B. de Silva be accepted. (b) building a bucket depot on Lighthouse street, Fort.—Recommended that the lowest tender, viz.: Rs. 479.50 by M. H. Jarnis Appu be accepted.

(5) To consider Mr. E. A. Paulas' motions of March 11, 1933, viz.:—(a) That the rates in the schedule of rates of works be reduced by 25 per cent. (b) That the reduced rates be applied to all the works that are to be carried out in 1933.—Recommended that consideration be deferred. (c) That the rate of an unit of electricity be reduced to 40 cents.—(1) Considered together with the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment. (2) Recommended that no reduction be made.

With regard to item (5) (c) Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka moved as an amendment that the rate of an unit of electricity be reduced to 40 cents. Mr. E. A. Paulas seconded.

Mr. J. E. Perera opposed the amendment and supported the recommendation of the Standing Committee.

The amendment was put to the meeting and declared lost, 3 voting for and 6 against.

Mr. Dahanayaka called for a division which resulted as follows:—*For*.—Messrs. S. H. Dahanayaka, E. A. Paulas, and A. C. Mohammedo. *Against*.—Chairman, Messrs. J. E. Perera, A. J. R. Scharanguivel, Thomas Amarasuriya, A. M. Saheed and R. L. Ephraums.

Messrs. E. M. Karunaratna and F. Magdon Ismail declined to vote.

Resolved that the above recommendations of the Standing Committee be adopted.

11. *Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment of May 6, 1933.*

(2) To consider Mr. E. A. Paulas' motion of March 11, 1933, viz., that the rate of an unit of electricity be reduced to 40 cents.—(1) Considered together with the Standing Committee on Municipal Works. (2) Recommended that no reduction be made.

(3) To consider Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka's motion of January 14, 1933, viz.: that seven collectors be appointed to collect rates and conservancy fees in the seven wards of the Municipality on condition that they reside in their respective wards.—Recommended that no change be made in the present system.

(4) To authorize writing off a further sum of Rs. 20·50 being arrears of conservancy fees still outstanding for 1931.—Recommended that the sum of Rs. 20·50 being arrears of conservancy fees still outstanding for 1931, be written off as irrecoverable.

(5) To consider an application from G. Carlinahamy, widow of H. M. Karnelis Appu, late conservancy labourer, for a gratuity under the Municipal Pension Rules.—Recommended, in terms of Rule 24 of the Municipal Pension Minutes the payment of a gratuity of Rs. 67·50 being three months' pay of the office, and in addition one months' pay (Rs. 22·50) for the minor child.

(6) To consider the rate of payment for the destruction of stray dogs within Municipal limits.—Recommended that, irrespective of the number of dogs shot, payment be made at the rate of Re. 1·50 per dog.

"The Dog Registration Ordinance, 1901."

BY-LAWS made by the Kotte Urban District Council, under sections 5 and 6 of the Dog Registration Ordinance, No. 25 of 1901 and section 245 of the Local Government Ordinance, No. 11 of 1920.

BY-LAWS.

1. In respect of every dog or bitch kept within the limits of the Urban District Council of Kotte, the person having custody or possession of it shall pay an annual registration fee of Re. 1. For the purpose of this rule a year shall be computed from April 1 of one year to March 31 of the year following.

2. The occupier of every house within the town shall, before January 31 in each year, furnish to the person appointed by the Chairman of the Urban District Council to collect the registration fee (hereinafter called the Collector) particulars required in the annexed form A in respect of each dog or bitch kept within such house or its premises.

3. A certificate of registration in the Form B shall be issued on payment of the prescribed fee to the aforesaid Collector or to the Secretary of the Urban District Council.

4. The Collector or Secretary (1) may refuse to issue a certificate of registration for any dog or bitch (a) which, in his opinion, is so diseased as to be a source of infection to other dogs, or (b) which, by reason of age, illness, or injury, is in his opinion unfit to live; or (2) the Collector or Secretary may issue such certificate subject to any conditions he may consider suitable. Any owner dissatisfied with such refusal or conditions may appeal to the Chairman of the Urban District Council, who may confirm, modify, or cancel the same.

5. Every certificate of registration shall have the following conditions printed on it, viz. :—

This certificate is liable to be cancelled by the Chairman of the Urban District Council,—

- (a) Should the dog become so maimed or diseased as to be in the opinion of the Chairman unfit to live; or
- (b) Should the Chairman be satisfied that the dog is habitually ill-treated or neglected by its owner; or
- (c) Should the dog be permitted by its owner to associate with dogs belonging to others at a time when it is suffering from any infectious or contagious disease.

6. The person having the custody or possession of a dog or bitch in respect of which (a) a certificate is refused or (b) its certificate is cancelled because a condition attached thereto has not been complied with, shall, on being noticed to do so, produce the dog at the Urban District Council Office, at the time stated in the notice, and there deliver it to an officer of the Urban District Council authorized to take charge of it. Such dogs shall then be dealt with in the manner determined by the Chairman.

7. The by-laws made by the Sanitary Board of Colombo District under the Dog Registration Ordinance, No. 25 of 1901, dated February 3, 1916 (Gazette No. 6,777 of February 11, 1916), are repealed so far as the Urban District Council of Kotte is concerned.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended June 17, 1933.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 176 (10 Burghers, 115 Sinhalese, 22 Tamils, 21 Moors, 4 Malays, and 4 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1933, viz., 292,200) was 31·4, as against 28·4 in the preceding week, 25·3 in the corresponding week of last year, and 30·3 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 156 (6 Burghers, 101 Sinhalese, 22 Tamils, 19 Moors, 2 Malays, and 6 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 27·8, as against 26·8 in the previous week, 19·0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 24·5 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 156 total deaths, 28 were of infants under one year of age, as against 23 in the preceding week, 28 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 29 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 9.

Principal Causes of Deaths.—1. (a) Fourteen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 9 in Maradana hospitals (including 4 deaths of non-residents) and 1 each in Kotahena South, Maradana East, Maradana South, Slave Island, and Kollupitiya, as against 17 in the previous week and 15 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Fifteen deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 5 in New Bazaar, 3 each in Kotahena South and Slave Island, 2 in San Sebastian and 1 each in Maradana North and Wellawatta South, as against 9 in the previous week and 8 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Seven deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 2 each in Maradana hospitals (of non-residents), and Maradana South and 1 each in Kotahena South, New Bazaar, and Slave Island, as against 4 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

2. Fifteen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 9 in Maradana hospitals (including 7 deaths of non-residents), 2 in Maradana North and 1 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena North, New Bazaar, and Slave Island, as against 20 in the previous week and 11 the weekly average for last year.

3. Three deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered in Maradana hospitals (of non-residents), as against 5 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

4. Six deaths from *Debility* were registered, 5 from *Diarrhoea*, 4 from *Accidents*, 3 each from *Enteritis*, *Infantile Convulsions*, and *Worms*, 2 from *Dysentery* and 1 each from *Tetanus*, *Suicide*, *Homicide*, and *Puerperal Septicæmia* and 72 from *Other Causes*.

5. **Reported Cases.**—Ten cases of *Chickenpox*, 5 of *Enteric Fever*, 3 of *Measles*, 2 of *Smallpox*, and 1 each of *Mumps* and *Plague* were reported during the week, as against 9, 6, 6, nil, 2, and nil, respectively of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 81·1°, against 81·8° in the preceding week and 81·7° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·835 in., against 29·894 in. in the preceding week and 29·855 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 1·47 in., against 0·74 in. in the preceding week and 0·46 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
